### GAME TIME

Morgan State (3-5, 2-3 MEAC) continues the 2012 season play in a Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference matchup against No. 24 Bethune-Cookman on Saturday at 1 p.m. ET at Hughes Stadium. The Wildcats enter the 2012 season under the leadership of third-year head coach Brian Jenkins. The Wildcats (6-2, 5-0) are coming off a 42-17 win against North Carolina Central. The Bears fell short in the final moments against Delaware State 28-23 at Hughes Stadium. This week's game will be broadcast live by WEAA, 88.9 FM.

### THE BEARS-WILDCATS MATCHUP

- The Bears and Wildcats will meet for the **28th** time since 1986. Bethune-Cookman leads the series **18-8**.
- Nov. 5, 2011 - Isidore Jackson rushed for 93 yards and a touchdown, and Jackie Wilson ran for three touchdowns as Bethune-Cookman eased past Morgan State 49-23 before a Homecoming crowd of 9,649 at Municipal Stadium. Wilson finished 10-of-15 for 186 yards for the Wildcats who finished the ballgame with seven rushing touchdowns. **Travis Davidson** had a 44-yard rushing touchdown and rushed for a game-high 133 yards on 17 carries to lead Morgan State.
- The last time the Wildcats played in Hughes Stadium was on Oct. 2, 2010 ... A dominating 69-32 victory over Morgan State extended the Wildcats' record to 4-0 overall and 2-0 in the MEAC. MSU finished the game by committing eight turnovers, four by air (interceptions) and four by ground (fumbles). MSU, held to 247 yards total offense, got touchdowns from **Tyrone Hendrix** on a 93-yard kickoff return and Nico Scott on a 44-yard interception return and trailed 42-26 at halftime.

### QUICK HITS

- **Travis Davidson** currently ranks 2nd in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) in rushing with 794 yards (113.4 avg/g). He also ranks No. 1 the MEAC in scoring (72 Pts).
- QB **Robert Council** started against Delaware State and completed 13-of-19 passes for 68 yards and scored two touchdowns, including a 41-yard touchdown run.
- Cornerback **Joe Rankin** registered his 9th interception of his career, picking off Savannah State quarterback Antonio Bostic in the 1st quarter...He currently leads the MEAC in INTs with four in eight games...he also ranks No. 3 in passes defended (10), while his freshman teammate **DaShaun Summers** leads the league with 1.33 average passes defended.
- Twenty-one (21) Morgan State seniors will be honored before the start of Saturday's game.
- The Bears continue to be among the top scoring offenses in the league, entering Saturday's contest as the MEAC's No. 4 ranked scoring offense (24.9 avg/g).
- True freshman LB **Eldan Roberts** currently ranks No. 2 in the MEAC in tackles by posting 76 tackles so far this season ... he recorded a season-high 16 tackles against Delaware State on Oct. 25.

**BALTIMORE, Md.** – Delaware State's defense stopped the Bears on a fourth down play inside of the Hornets' territory to hold off the Bears tonight 28-23 at Hughes Stadium in front of an ESPNU audience.

Morgan State (3-5, 2-3 MEAC) got on the board early in the first quarter when quarterback Robert Council scrambled and ran 41 yards for a touchdown. The extra point by Earvin Gonzalez gave the Bears a 7-0 lead with 10:50 left.

The Hornets finally got on the board in the second quarter. The duo of quarterback Nick Elko and Travis Tarpley struck when Elko floated a four-yard touchdown pass to Tarpley on a corner route with 13:10 remaining. Mitchell Ward's extra point tied the game at 7.

Elko and Tarpley caused major problems for the Bears defense all night long. At one point, Elko completed a Delaware State record 17 consecutive passes. Elko was 33 of 43 for 398 yards and two touchdowns on the night. Tarpley finished with a game-high 12 catches for 143 yards, including a pair of touchdowns.

Tyrone Hendrix provided an immediate answer for the Bears when he broke out a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown with 12:56 left. Gonzalez' extra point gave the Bears a 14-7 advantage.

The Hornets tied the game up at 14 when the connection of Elko and Tarpley struck again. This time, it was from 13 yards out when Elko found a wide-open Tarpley on a 4th and 4 corner route with 9:30 left.

DSU (5-3, 4-1) took the lead 17-14 on a 31-yard field goal by Ward with 3:51 left. But it could have been worse as a 13-yard TD play from Elko to Justin Wilson was reversed when the officials ruled Wilson's feet out of bounds.

Ward added to the Hornet's lead at the half when he converted a 24-yard field goal. The Hornets went into the intermission with a 20-14 lead.

DSU extended the lead to 28-14 with 8:56 left on a 3-yard touchdown run by Nagee Jackson. The Hornets converted the two-point conversion on a pass from Elko to Josh Bailey.

The Bears offense finally woke up when Council ran the ball into the endzone from 5 yards out. However, Gonzalez' extra point attempt sailed wide left. The Bears cut the deficit to 28-20 with 5:02 left in the third quarter.

MORGAN STATE VS. BETHUNE-COOKMAN THUMBNAILED

• Bethune-Cookman ranks among the nation's top black college football teams. The Wildcats rank No. 2 in the BoxtoRow HBCU Coaches Top 10 Poll, No. 24 in the FCS Coaches Poll, No. 3 in the Sheridan Poll and No. 8 in the HSRN Top 10 Poll.



• The Wildcats enter Week 9 coming off a dominant 42-17 performance against N.C. Central to move into sole possession of first place in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC). The win improved the Wildcats to 6-2 overall and 5-0 in conference play.

• In 2011, Bethune-Cookman finished with a 8-3 overall record and 6-2 in the MEAC.

• Bethune's dual QB threat of **Quentin Williams** and **Brodrick Waters** continue to wreak havoc for defenses this season. Williams, a 6-foot, 190-pounder from Tampa (Fla.) has completed 49 of 83 for 655 yards and six touchdowns with an interception. He currently ranks No. 2 in pass efficiency (146.8 and No. 8 in passing average (109.2/g). Waters, a 5-11, 195-pounder from Sarasota (Fla.) ranks No 8 in pass efficiency having completed 26 of 54 passes for 258 yards and four TDs.

• Bethune-Cookman maintained its status as the national leader in turnover margin with its +2.25 per game total.

• Through the first eight games, RB **Isidore Jackson** (5-10, 205) has been the leading rusher in the Wildcats' high-octane offense. The junior from Mossey Head (Fla.) has recorded 126 carries for 707 yards (5.6 avg), including seven TDs. He rushed for 158 yards and two touchdowns against N.C. Central last Saturday.

• MSU's offense will have to account for the Wildcat's linebacker **Jarkevis Fields**. The junior currently ranks among the league leaders with 63 tackles (ranks 12th), to go along with 3.5 tackles for loss and a sack.

• The Bears' defensive unit will face a Wildcats line that leads the league in rushing by averaging 235.1 per contest.

• Through eight games, the Bethune-Cookman defense ranks 3rd in the MEAC in scoring defense by limiting opponents to 19.9 points per contest and ranks 3rd in total defense (317.8/g).

**COACHING CONTINUITY** ... An overlooked facet of Morgan State's success has been the continuity of its coaching staff. **Donald Hill-Eley** enters his 11th season as the Bears' head coach. Running backs coach **Earl Davis** begins his 24th year on the Morgan State staff, which equals the longest tenure of any Morgan State assistant football coach in school history. In addition, special teams coach and special teams coordinator **Harold 'Sport' Benton** begins his 13th year on the Bears' coaching staff, offensive line coach **Joseph Wright** is in his 10th season, while co-defensive coordinator/asst. head coach **Herbert Parham** begins his 11th season at Morgan State.

**PRESEASON ALL-MEAC PLAYERS** ... Three Morgan State University football players have been singled out for Preseason All-MEAC honors during the 2012 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Football Press Luncheon.

MSU linebacker **Richard Ndubueze** earned first-team honors. Representing Morgan State on the second-team was senior running back **Travis Davidson** and redshirt junior cornerback **Kenneth Ridley**.

Ndubueze started in nine games last season and finished with 32 tackles, 8.5 tackles for a loss of 44 yards, and ranked 2nd on the team with four sacks. The 6-foot-2, 240-pounder is among the league's most consistent linemen and will once again be in the mix for postseason honors.

Davidson, also known as "Juice", enters his second year as the Bears' starting running back. He emerged from the 2011 campaign as one of the league's top talents. He ran for 732 yards and posted seven touchdowns in 10 games and ranked No. 4 in the MEAC in rushing.

Ridley, who was named to the 2012 CFPA Preseason Watchlist, returns as one of the top cornerbacks in the league. He saw action in every game last season and recorded 42 tackles (20 solo) with 10 passes defended. He also ranked No. 2 in the MEAC with four pass interceptions and ranked T-6th with six pass breakups.

**RETURN MEN** ... The 2012 Morgan State return 63 letterwinners, including 14 starters - seven on offense and six on defense. MSU also welcomes back every specialist with the exception of punter Nicholas Adams.

**JUST SCORE BABY** ... The Bears have scored 199 points through eight games, the team's highest point total for an eight-game stretch since scoring 285 points in an eight-game stretch from Week 4-11 in the 2004 season.

**BEARS NAME LEADERSHIP COMMITTEE**

The MSU has turned away from naming captains this season in favor of what has been named The Leadership Committee.

The committee is comprised of two seniors, LB **Tierney Yates**, OL **Karim Barton**; two juniors, CB **Joe Rankin**, WR **Chris Flowers**; two sophomores, SS **Nate Ayers** and QB **Seth Higgins**; along with freshmen LB **Elandon Roberts** and DL **Tyrell Okoro**.

**KICKIN' SPECIALTY** ... **Earvin Gonzalez**.

(Visalia, Calif.) will handle the field goal and punting chores for the Bears this fall. In Week 1 against Sacred Heart, he connected on three field goals and was 3-of-3 on PATs. The senior booted in field goals from 32, 21 and hit a 20-yard field goal in the fourth overtime to give the Bears a season-opening victory. **Gonzalez currently ranks No. 1 in the MEAC and tied for No. 9 in the FCS** by connecting on 11-of-16 field goals and is a perfect 22-of-23 on PATs and booted a career-high 47-yard field goal against N.C. Central.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK ...**

- The Bears rushing for 100 yards or more for the ninth consecutive game and for the 15th straight time since their October 8, 2011 game versus Savannah State.

- The Bears having a 300-yard passing game for the first time since October 8, 2011. In Week 6, Morgan State defeated Savannah State 44-17 and **Seth Higgins**, Nate Furrha and **Robert Council** combined for 16-of-26 passes for 318 yards and five TDs.

- Cornerback **Joe Rankin** registering an interception would mark his fifth of the season and the 10th of his career. He would need to collect six more to surpass Joe Fowlkes for the school record. Fowlkes posted 15 INTs during his career (1975-78).

- Running back **Travis Davidson** rushing for 100 yards or more for the eighth time in his career.

- The Bears recording their 11th interception.

- Wide receiver **Andrew King** registering the third touchdown of his career.

- **Travis Davidson** needs to gain 56 rushing yards to surpass TJ Stallings at No. 10 on the school's all-time rushing list.

- QB **Robert Council** has not thrown an interception since a win versus Howard on Sept. 24, 2011 ... He completed 12 of 18 passes and was picked off by DL Corey Berry.



**YANKEE STADIUM TO HOST NEW YORK URBAN LEAGUE FOOTBALL CLASSIC; HAMPTON UNIVERSITY TO PLAY MORGAN STATE UNIVERSITY**

Yankee Stadium will once again play host to a classic college football matchup, as Hampton University and Morgan State University will meet in the New York Urban League Football Classic on November 17, 2012, at the home of the Yankees. The two-year agreement calls for the two schools to play at Yankee Stadium again in 2013 as well.

The original Yankee Stadium was host to the annual New York Urban League football game from 1968-73 and '76-87. Morgan State played 11 times in the contest, going 1-10 as they faced off against Grambling and head coach Eddie Robinson each time. For Hampton, it will mark their first football game at Yankee Stadium (original or current).

**GOOD COUNCIL ... QB Robert Council** came off the bench and connected on 14-of-29 passes for 251 yards and threw two touchdowns, including the gamewinner to Andrew King with 10 seconds on the clock to beat N.C A&T (9/27) on the road. The South Carolina product made his first career start on Oct. 6 against Savannah State. He completed the night 6-of-10 for 71 yards and was sacked three times. Council currently ranks No. 6 in pass efficiency (120.8) and No. 9 in passing in the MEAC (97.8 avg/g).

**100 PERCENT "JUICE"**

Senior RB **Travis Davidson** (Redford, Mich.) made the most of his opportunity on Sept. 10, 2011 when the Bears took on Bowling Green State. On MSU's second possession of the game, Davidson mishandled a handoff and proceeded to scoop it off the turf and dash 61-yards to paydirt. The 6-foot, 180-pounder finished as the Bears leading rusher and is expected to be one of the top performers in the league. "Juice" rushed for a team-high 732 yards (5.1 ypc) and seven touchdowns last year. He ranked No. 4 in the MEAC in rushing by averaging 73.2 yards per game. Davidson ran for a career-high 136 yards on 26 carries and had two TDs at Buffalo and finished with 77 yards.

**DAVIDSON ECLIPSES 1,000 YARD MARK**

As a result of his 77 yards at Akron, **Travis Davidson** eclipsed the 1,000 yards mark. Davidson currently has 1,537 yards and moved past TJ Stallings for the No. 10 spot on the school's all-time rushing list. He needs 107 more yards to surpass Craig Nelson (1,643 yds) for the No. 9 spot.

**RANKIN FILES ... Senior CB Joe Rankin** is one of the league's premier players. At 5-10, 180 pounds, Rankin runs a 4.45 in the 40, making him one of the fastest athletes on the team. He is one of the Bears' best cover corners and has the opportunity to be one of the top players in the conference. He posted six tackles and had a 70 yard interception return in the season-opener against Sacred Heart ... and recorded two tackles and an interception at Savannah State marking the 9th pick of his career. **He currently ranks T-No. 10 in the FCS in passes defended (6 breakups and 4 INTs).** Check out the a video profile on Rankin at [morganstatebears.com](http://morganstatebears.com) - on the home page click on *Bear Video*.

**THE JUICE FACTORY ...** The Bears line averages a massive 315 pounds and returns four starters, including Taylor Pass who moves to left tackle. That means that senior RB Travis "Juice" Davidson should find the same holes that helped him become the No. 4 leading ground gainer in the MEAC last season. Davidson currently leads the MEAC in rushing averaging 103.3 yards per game.

**PUNT RETURN TEAM ...** Morgan State's punt return unit did not allow a yard off any returns at Buffalo (9/8)...in fact the Bulls finished with -3 yards on two returns. So far this season, the Bears have allowed just 118 punt return yards, or an average of 7.4 yards per return per game.

**A ROOM WITH A VIEW ...** On October 8, 2011 during the Bears Homecoming against Savannah State, **Donald Hill-Eley** did something he hasn't done since he took the helm as MSU's head coach in 2002 -- he moved from the sideline to the pressbox where he called the offensive plays. The Bears posted an impressive 44-17 victory. Said Hill, "You miss a little bit of getting close and personal with the players and working the officials some, but we'd really been struggling offensively and had to do something different." Hill will once again be coaching from the pressbox this season.

**HONOR ROLL ...** Four (4) Morgan State football players were named to the 2012 MEAC Commissioner's All-Academic Team, which requires a grade-point average of 3.00 or better for the past academic year. The seven members included: WR **Yusuf Dosu**, OL **Clarence Swain**, along with former Bears OL Lawrence Brewer and PK Abraham Mercado.

**WE R' THE LITTLES ...** The Bears receiving corps is one of the shortest in the league. MSU has seven receivers who stand under 6-feet tall. "The Seven" includes: **Broderick Gager** (5-11), **Tubotein Taylor** (5-11), **Malcom Sumlin** (5-11), **Chris Flowers** (5-10), **Thomas Martin** (5-10), **Andrew King** (5-9), and **Darrell Green** (5-7).

The only two receivers who stand above 6-feet are **Tyrone Hendrix** (6-1), Yusuf Dosu (6-1) and **Montrel Church** (6-0).

**WER' NOT SO LITTLE ...** The loss of TE Lamont Bryant to the NFL's Carolina Panthers is huge, but so is the return of seniors **Jorge Young** (6-2,285) and **Kristian Johnson** (6-3,255), along with a couple of talented newcomers. Young will give the Bears extra punch in the ground attack, while Johnson will be a big target for QB **Seth Higgins** in the middle of the field. **Eme Akonawe** (6-3,215), **Nate Ingram** (6-3, 245) **Heleaince Gates** (6-5,240) and **Willie Gillus** (6-1,265) will also play a role in the Bears passing attack.

**MANNING-UP ...** Senior RB **Brian Mann** returns to the Bears after suffering an ACL injury after playing in four games last season. The 5-7, 190-pounder has big-play potential and will be a change of pace back when starting RB Travis Davidson in not on the field. Mann's 4.7 ypc in 2010 ranked third among MSU backs. His elusiveness will also be used on special teams where he averaged 12.1 yards per punt return (No. 4 in MEAC) in 2010. He posted a career-high 74 yards on 17 carries and scored a touchdown at Buffalo, and had 41 yards on 10 carries, including a TD at Savannah State. He's currently averaging 27.5 yards per game.

**LOOKING FOR MORE PASS RUSH ...** MSU had been having trouble getting to the quarterback, but has turned it up a notch as of late. To review the stats, MSU has 15 sacks in 295 passing attempts by opponents (or .05 percent of attempts) compared to 26 in 278 opponent passing attempts last year (or .09). The Bears posted a season-high five sacks at Savannah State (Oct. 6) and posted two more in a loss to Delaware State (Oct. 25).

**SOPHOMORE SLUMP? ...** MSU sophomore QB **Seth Higgins** played in eight games as a true freshman last season and started in seven games. He completed 97-of-186 passes for 1,116 yards, including nine touchdowns. The Edgewood (Md.) native started in the first four games of the season. He came off the bench against Savannah State and came off the bench at Delaware State last Thursday where he threw for 67 yards on 4-of-8 passes and ran for 18 yards.

**CBS SPORTS NETWORK AIRED DOCUMENTARY ABOUT FIRST HISTORICALLY BLACK COLLEGE FOOTBALL GAME PLAYED IN NEW YORK CITY**

Last year CBS Sports Network presented 1ST & GOAL IN THE BRONX: GRAMBLING VS. MORGAN STATE 1968, a documentary about the monumental game played between Grambling and Morgan State, the first historically black college football game played in New York City. The one-hour documentary airs on Wednesday, Sept. 28 (7:00 PM, ET), exactly 43 years after the game was played at Yankee Stadium in front of more than 60,000 fans. Actor Keith David narrates the program.

Through the lens of this historic game, this documentary explores the history of black college football and its struggles in segregated America, as well as the political and cultural subtext surrounding this match-up. The show features numerous interviews with players from Grambling and Morgan State including Shack Harris and Raymond Chester, as well as current Grambling coach Doug Williams, Willie Brown, Willie Lanier, Eddie Robinson's widow Doris Robinson and veteran sports columnist Jerry Izenberg, among others. Overall, 31 players involved in the game were drafted to the NFL or AFL.

Rankin, a Germantown (Md.) native, recorded six tackles and had three breakups, but most importantly intercepted a pass and raced 72 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter. It was the first time in two years that the Bears had a player return an interception for a score.

Ridley, a redshirt junior from Hillside, N.J., collected eight tackles and had an interception in the first of four overtimes as the Bears went through four overtimes before pulling out a 30-27 victory at Hughes Stadium.

### DAVIDSON AND FLOWERS RECEIVE CFPA

#### HONORABLE MENTION ACCOLADES

Running back **Travis Davidson** and kick returner **Chris Flowers**, were acknowledged for their individual performances against Buffalo on Sept. 8. Davidson and Flowers received honorable mention accolades by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) as All-Purpose and Kick Returner of the Week, respectively.

Davidson ran for a career-high 136 yards and accounted for two touchdowns in a 56-34 loss against BCS member Buffalo on Saturday night at UB Stadium. It was the second straight game "Juice" had eclipsed the 100-yard mark, and the fourth time in his MSU career.

The senior scored on a 38-yard run in the 2nd quarter and turned a short pass from Robert Council into a 21-yard TD late in the 4th quarter. The pair of scores marked the 10th rushing TD in Davidson's career and his first TD reception.

"Juice" currently leads the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) in rushing and ranks No. 8 in the FCS with 243 yards (121.5 avg/g). He also leads the MEAC in scoring (12 Pts/G).

Flowers, a redshirt junior from Haines City, Fla., had two kick returns for 76 yards, including a 66-yard return that helped setup a touchdown late in the 3rd quarter. Flowers also had a reception for 13 yards against the Bulls.

### ROBERTS SELECTED MEAC ROOKIE OF WEEK 2

Morgan State freshman linebacker **Elandon Roberts** was named the MEAC Rookie of the Week 2. Roberts is off to a great start for his collegiate career. He earned a starting position on defense as a true freshman, recorded double-digit tackles (11) in his season debut against Sacred Heart (Sept. 1), and had another solid effort this past weekend against BCS

member Buffalo.

The Port Arthur, Texas product collected seven tackles and had a tackle for a loss against the Bulls. He also collected his first career interception when he picked off UB standout quarterback Alex Zordich in the 3rd quarter.

Roberts currently leads the team in tackles (18 -T-7th in MEAC) and tackles for loss (3.0).

He is the first Bears to earn conference rookie of the week accolades since **Seth Higgins** claimed the honor last season on Oct. 11, 2011.

### GONZALEZ NAMED MEAC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF WEEK 5

For the second time this season, Morgan State placekicker/punter **Earvin Gonzalez** has been named Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Special Teams Player of the Week.

Gonzalez connected on 6-of-6 point after attempts, and averaged 41.6 punting yards, including a 59-yarder with two inside the 20 and three fair catches in the Bears' win over Savannah State.

His 21-yard field goal in the 3rd quarter added to his percentage this season in which he has converted on a league best 8-of-12 (66.7%) field goals and is a perfect 16-of-16 in point after attempts.

### FLOWERS NAMED CFPA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

MSU's **Chris Flowers** was acknowledged for his individual performance against Savannah State on Oct. 6. Flowers was named the National Kickoff Returner of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA).

Flowers, a product of Haines City (Fla.), is a true special teams asset for Morgan State. Last Saturday night against the Tigers, the redshirt junior scored on an 88-yard kickoff return for a touchdown. His career-high return gave the Bears a 7-6 lead with 8:06 remaining in the first quarter. MSU would go on to outscore Savannah State by a margin of 38-0 as the Bears improved to 3-2 overall and 2-0 in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference, marking the team's best conference start since 2009.

### GONZALEZ AND DAVIDSON RECEIVE CFPA HONORABLE MENTION OF WEEK 6

Two members of the Morgan State football program, punter Earvin Gonzalez and runningback Travis Davidson, were acknowledged for their individual performances against North Carolina Central on Oct. 13. Gonzalez and Davidson received honorable mention accolades by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) as Punter and All-Purpose Player of the Week, respectively.

Gonzalez, a product of Visalia (Calif.), continues his domination as Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference's top kicker. Last Saturday against the Eagles, the senior connected on 2-of-2 point after attempts, and he also punted five times (36.6 avg), including a 40-yarder and one inside the 20. Additionally, he was 2-of-2 in field goals with a career-high 47-yarder in the first quarter and a 34-yard field goal in the 4th quarter.

Davidson, a senior from Redford, Mich., rushed for two touchdowns and gained 105 yards on the ground against NCCU.
