Volleyball Closes Out Non-Conference Schedule This Weekend In D.C.

The Morgan State volleyball team will close out its non-conference schedule this weekend when it travels to the Nation's Capital to compete in the Hoya Invitational (Sept. 20-21), hosted by Georgetown University. On Friday, the Lady Bears square off against the host Hoyas at noon, and will meet Florida International at 3 p.m. Morgan State concludes the tournament on Saturday with an 11 a.m. contest against Binghamton. All three matches will be played at McDonough Arena in Washington, D.C.

MSU AGAINST THE FIELD: The Lady Bears will meet the host Hoyas in the opener for the second consecutive year in a tournament hosted by Georgetown. The Hoyas lead the all-time series, 5-0. Morgan State and FIU will meet for just the second time with the Lady Bears winning the lone meeting in 1995. Binghamton won the lone meeting with Morgan State in 2009.

LAST WHISTLE: Morgan State dropped all three of its matches last week during the Les Schwab Rose City Showdown (Sept. 13-14) in Portland, Ore. The Lady Bears fell to host Portland State, 3-2 in the opener, before falling to Cal State Northridge and Nevada in three.

NEXT UP: Morgan State will return home for the first of four consecutive home contests when it welcomes the University of Maryland Eastern Shore on Friday, Sept. 27 at 7 p.m. at Hill Field House. It will be the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference opener for both teams.

MCBRIDE NAMED TO THIRD STRAIGHT ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM: Zoe McBride was named to the Les Schwab Rose City Showdown All-Tournament Team (9/14) at Portland State. The honor marked her third consecutive all-tournament team selection in as many weeks. McBride, who was born in Portland, Ore., finished the weekend with 48 kills, 32 digs, three blocks, an ace and one assist. She began the week with 24 kills and 17 digs to earn her fifth double-double of the season. She concluded the first day with 12 kills, nine digs and a block against Cal State Northridge. McBride wrapped up the tournament with 12 kills, six digs, two blocks and an assist in the finale against Nevada.

TRACKING WALLACE TO 3,000 ASSISTS: Roi Wallace has recorded 344 assists during the first three weeks of the season and is now 120 assists away from becoming just the third Lady Bear to reach 3,000 career assists. Wallace entered the season with a total of 2,536 career assists, which ranks third on the Morgan State charts. She currently has 2,880.

HUBBARD CLOSING IN ON 1,000 DIGS: Senior Jasmin Hubbard picked up a total of 16 digs over the weekend against Portland State (6), Cal State Northridge (2) and Nevada (8), giving her 993 career digs and is now seven away from reaching the 1,000-digs plateau. The Reno, Nevada native entered the 2019 campaign with 974 career digs and is currently fifth all-time at Morgan State.

HOMEcoming: Sophomore Zoe McBride got to return to Portland, Ore. when Morgan made the program's first-ever trip to Oregon for the Les Schwab Rose City Showdown (Sept. 13-14). McBride was born in Portland and lived there for 2 1/2 years, before moving to Washington State. Her father Tim played football at Portland State.

BOZIER ONE SHY OF 460: Morgan State head coach Ramona Riley-Bozier entered the 2019 season six wins shy of career victory No. 460. Following a 5-2 start, she is now one win away from victory No. 460. Riley-Bozier, who is the all-time winningest coach at Morgan State in any sport with 459 career victories as the volleyball coach, is also the softball program's all-time career leader with 161 victories in nine seasons at the helm. Riley-Bozier began 2019 ranked 33rd in career wins among active coaches on the NCAA's Division I coaching list.

MCBRIDE, WALLACE, BROWN EARN MEAC HONORS: Zoe McBride was named MEAC Co-Player of the Week, while Roi Wallace earned MEAC Setter of the Week and Sara Brown garnered MEAC Defensive Specialist of the Week honors (9/9). It was the second straight weekly honors for McBride and Wallace, who were also recognized (9/3). McBride concluded the week averaging 5.1 kills, 4.0 digs and a .253 attack percentage and had three double-doubles, including 20 kills and 10 digs, while hitting .432 against Siena. Wallace averaged 31.6 assists per match. She recorded her lone double-double of the week, finishing with 31 assists and 10 digs, while adding two kills, two blocks and an ace. Brown totaled 12 blocks, 17 kills and three digs for the week. She totaled a career-high five blocks, five kills with no errors to set a career-high .714 attack percentage against Quinnipiac.

LADY BEARS FALL SHORT AGAIN: For the second consecutive week the Lady Bears dropped a tournament final, this time falling to Quinnipiac in the title match of the Knights Fall Classic (9/7), hosted by Fairleigh Dickinson. It would be Morgan State's lone loss, while Quinnipiac finished 3-0. A week earlier, again by chance of the schedule, the Lady Bears entered its final contest of the Morgan/Towson Invitational against rival Towson, and suffered its lone loss, while the Tigers went unbeaten to capture the title.

BLOCK PARTY: Sara Brown recorded a team-leading 12 blocks and Zoe McBride added 10, to help the Lady Bears, who recorded 40 blocks as a team, to a 3-1 week (9/3-7). McBride set a career-high six blocks against Quinnipiac (9/7), while Brown set a career-high five blocks, also against Quinnipiac.

MCBRIDE, ROBERSON NAMED TO ALL-TOURNEY TEAM: Zoe McBride and Tylar Roberson were named to the All-Tournament Team at the Knights Fall Classic (9/7). McBride totaled a team-best 41 kills, 38 digs, finished second on the team with 10 blocks and had two double-doubles. Roberson notched 32 kills, 24 digs, two service aces, a block and a double-double in three matches.

BEST START EVER: The Morgan State volleyball team's 5-1 mark was its best start in school history through the first six matches, after going 2-1 in the Knights Fall Classic (Sept. 6-7). Twice the program has began a season with a 4-2 record (1982, 94).

MCBRIDE NAMED MEAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Zoe McBride was named MEAC Player of the Week (9/3) for her opening week performances, which helped the Lady Bears to a 2-1 start. A native of Ridgefield, Wash., McBride hit .268, recorded two double-doubles in three matches and averaged 4.62 kills and 2.4 digs per set. She hit .383 with a career-high 30 kills and added 13 digs and three blocks in the opener against Seton Hall. She followed that up with an 18-kill, 10-dig performance against William & Mary.

WALLACE NAMED MEAC SETTER OF THE WEEK: Wallace averaged 9.85 assists per set for the week. The San Dimas, Calif. native, collected 58 assists against Seton Hall - two shy of her career high and added seven digs, two kills and a service ace. She then recorded her first double-double of the season with 49 assists and 14 digs against William & Mary.

PLAY LIKE IT'S 1999: The Lady Bears began this season winning their first two contests with victories over Seton Hall and William & Mary on the opening day of the Morgan/Towson Invitational (8/30). It marked the first 2-0 start for the Lady Bears since 1999, when that squad went a perfect 10-0 in the MEAC and reached the title match.

MCBRIDE, SANTOS EARN ALL-TOURNAMENT HONORS: Sophomore outside hitter Zoe McBride and junior libero Jennevy Santos were named to the Morgan/Towson Invitational All-Tournament Team (8/31). McBride finished with a combined 60 kills, 31 digs, four blocks, two assists, an ace and had a .268 hitting percentage with two double-doubles. McBride tallied a career-high 30 kills and added 13 digs in the season opening win over Seton Hall. Santos tallied 49 digs and 10 assists in three matches. She collected 18 digs and three assists in her Morgan State debut against Seton Hall, before posting 22 digs and five assists in the win over William & Mary.

OPENING SERVE: MSU improved to 9-18 in season openers since 1993, after it defeated Seton Hall, 3-2 in the opener of the Morgan/Towson Invitational (8/30). The Lady Bears, who prior to the victory lost seven consecutive season openers, had last won on opening day in 2011 when they defeated Saint Peter's 3-0 at the La Salle Invitational (8/26/11).

MORGAN PICKED THIRD IN MEAC NORTH: Morgan State was picked to finish third in the northern division of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) preseason poll, as voted by the league's head coaches and sports information directors. Last year, the Lady Bears were picked to finish third and went 13-15 overall, 5-5 in the MEAC for fourth.

BOZIER ENTERS 32ND SEASON: Morgan State head coach Ramona Riley-Bozier is in the midst of her 32nd season at the helm of the Lady Bear program. The all-time winningest coach at Morgan State (459), Riley-Bozier guided the Lady Bears to 88 consecutive MEAC Northern Division wins between 1994-2003. She has led MSU to five MEAC Championships, three NCAA Tournament appearances and earned MEAC Coach of the Year honors five times. Bozier also coached the softball team at MSU for nine seasons and in 1999 led the team to its only MEAC title game appearance. A native of Kansas City, Mo., Bozier, is a graduate of Morgan State, where she was a two-sport star in volleyball and track. She is one of 11 players in the history of the program to have registered 1,000 career kills. On the track, Bozier was a three-time All-American and one of the top triple jumpers at Morgan. She still holds the UMBC meet record in the 60 meter dash (1983) and ran the first leg of the 4X100 relay, which in 1986 set the school record in a time of 44.47 seconds, which also still stands. That squad would also win the Penn Relays and finished second that year at the Division I National Championships. Bozier was inducted into the Morgan State Hall of Fame in 2003.

NEW FACE ON THE SIDELINE: Sanky Sanny will begin his first season as the Lady Bears assistant coach. Sanny spent the past two seasons as a volunteer assistant coach at Holy Family University in Philadelphia, Pa., where he helped the team compile a combined 52-16 overall record and 33-5 in the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference. Last season he helped the Tigers to a 31-6 record and 18-1 in league play, as they captured the program's first-ever CACC title and advanced to the NCAA Division II East Region championship match. Sanny spent his collegiate career as a member of Temple's men's club team, helping the Owls earn their first Atlantic Collegiate Volleyball Conference title in 2015. He would earn a Bachelor of Science degree in athletic training from Temple in 2017.

UNBEATEN STREAKS ON THE LINE: Morgan State will look to extend its winning ways, as it enters the season unbeaten against three its opponents: Florida International (1-0), North Carolina Central (2-0) and South Carolina State (22-0). The Lady Bears will face FIU on Sept. 20 on the first day of the 2019 Hoya Invitational. Morgan State will host North Carolina Central on Oct. 4 for Alumni Night and will welcome South Carolina State to Baltimore for its Go4Goal event on Oct. 25.

SOMEONE NEW: Morgan State will square off against three first-time opponent this season, in Cal State Northridge, Nevada and Portland State. The Lady Bears will face all three opponents during the third weekend of the season in Portland, Ore. in the Les Schwab Rose City Showdown (Sept. 13-14).

RIVALS TO HOST MORGAN/TOWSON INVITATIONAL: This season the Lady Bears and crosstown rival Towson will co-host the 2019 Morgan/Towson Invitational (Aug. 30-31) to kick of the season. All matches will be played at Hill Field House on the Morgan State campus. This will mark the second straight season the Lady Bears have hosted a tournament. Last season they co-hosted the Charm City Classic with Coppin State in a cross divisional match-up between members of the MEAC Northern and Southern Divisions.

2019 LEADERS ANNOUNCED: Senior Roi Wallace and junior Mykaela Ross will serve as the team's 2019 leaders.

SEVEN NAMED TO MEAC ALL-ACADEMIC TEAMS: Morgan State had seven players named to the 2018 MEAC Volleyball All-Academic Team, based on their academic success during the 2017-18 school year. Five of the seven recognized (Shadae Debraux, Jasmin Hubbard, Mykaela Ross, Trinit Smith and Roi Wallace) return for the 2019 season, while Monette Daniels and Kheanna Landrum both graduated. Debraux, Hubbard, Smith and Wallace along with former Lady Bears Kalyssia Bates, Daniels and Landrum were also named to the MEAC Commissioner's All-Academic Team for maintaining a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better during the 2018-19 academic year.

TOURNAMENT EXPOSURE: Morgan will face just one opponent this season (Howard) that reached the NCAA Volleyball Tournament in 2018. The Lady Bears will face the four-time defending MEAC champion Howard Lady Bison on Oct. 8 in Washington, D.C. and again on Nov. 1 in Baltimore.

WELCOME TO THE CAVE: The Lady Bears welcome the addition of five newcomers to the 2019 squad, two of which are freshman and three junior transfers. Those newcomers are freshmen Melanie Battle (La Plata, Md.) and Mason Creery (Richmond, Va.), along with junior transfers Sophie Pajevic (Arandelovac, Serbia), Tylar Roberson (Elkhart, Ind.) and Jennevy Santos (Kissimmee, Fla.).

SAYING GOODBYE: Morgan State will say goodbye to its seniors, Jasmin Hubbard and Roi Wallace prior to its regular season finale 'Senior Day' match against Norfolk State on Nov. 3 at Hill Field House.

2019 MEAC CHAMPIONSHIP: This year's 2019 MEAC volleyball championship will take place November 22-24 in Washington, D.C. at Howard University's Burr Gymnasium.
