MSU Set to Face Non-Conference Road Test at Akron

Game to be played at InfoCision Stadium; will be broadcast live on WEEA-88.9FM

GAME TIME

Morgan State will face Akron on the road in a non-conference matchup on Saturday (Sept. 9). Kickoff is scheduled for 6 p.m. at InfoCision Stadium-Summa Field in Akron, Ohio. The game will air on ESPN+. The game will also be broadcast by WEEA, 88.9FM.

THE SERIES

- Saturday marks the fourth meeting in the series that began with a 41-0 Akron win on Sept. 1, 2009 in the grand opening of InfoCision Stadium.
- The Zips hold a 3-0 advantage in the series vs. MSU.
- In the team's last meeting on Sept. 8, 2018, sophomore QB Kato Nelson, threw for 232 yards and three TDs to lead Akron to a 41-7 win over the visiting Bears at InfoCision Stadium - Summa Field.

QUICK HITS

- The 2023 Morgan State Bears will be under the leadership of second year head coach **Damon Wilson**. Wilson, the 23rd coach in school history, previously served 13 seasons as the head football coach at Bowie State. There, he achieved three straight Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA) conference championships, in 2021, 2019 and 2018; five NCAA playoff berths; and three CIAA Coach of the Year honors.
- The Bears played a pair of QBs in their season-opener upset against #16 Richmond. **Carson Baker** started the game and completed 5 of 8 passes for 68 yards, including a pick and was sacked three times. ODU transfer **Dominique Anthony** finished with 31 yards in the air on 2 of 5 completions.
- Despite the loss of All-**MEAC** RB Alfonso Graham, the Bears will look for **Jabriel Johnson** and Norfolk State transfer **J.J. Davis** and **Myles Miree** to carry the load this season. Davis led the Bears in Richmond with 12 carries for 73 yards (6.1 avg) and Johnson pounded out 44 yards on nine carries and scored the Bears go-head touchdown to seal the win at Richmond.
- The Bears return veteran wideouts **Andre Crawley** (22 rec., 336 yds, 2 TDs), **Daymond "DJ" Hamler** (25 rec., 256 yds) and **Tyler Wilkins** (12 rec., 139 yds, 2 TDs).
- Morgan has a number of offensive linemen as they enter the 2023 season ... The Bears have 19 OL listed on the roster and will be led by veteran All-**MEAC** G **Marvin Atuatasi** (6-1, 305) and **TDexter Carr Jr.** (6-3, 295).
- DL **Elijah Williams**, a Preseason All-American, emerged as a force on the defensive line for the Bears last season. The New Jersey product registered 60 total tackles (33 solo, 27 assisted) last season, including a league-high 19.0 tackles for loss (ranks No. 5 in FCS) and nine sacks (T-No. 13 in FCS). He opened the season with 8 tackles, 2 TFLs and a QB hurry at Richmond.
- DB **Jae Veyon Morton** is on the official watch list for the 2023 Black College Football Player of the Year Watchlist, the Black College Football Hall of Fame ... The 2022 All-**MEAC** selection started in every game (11) and his season totals include 34 tackles (25 solo, 9 assisted), 10 pass breakups (T-No. 24 in FCS), and three picks.
- RS **Keith Jenkins Jr.** was one of the top return specialists in the nation as a freshman last year ... The speedster finished the season with two kickoff returns for touchdowns (T-No. 2 in the FCS) ... he is expected to add some time in the backfield this fall.

Morgan State was a power as a former member of the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA). The Bears posted 173 wins between 1929 and 1959 when **Edward P. Hurt** was the head coach and the Bears

won 14 CIAA championships. **Earl Banks** added to the championship collection by winning four titles during the 1960s and a MEAC title in 1971. **Clarence Thomas** led the Bears to a MEAC title in 1979...and now - after a 35-year drought - head coach **Lee Hull** has added a MEAC title following a thrilling and historical 2014 season. Other MSU highlights:

SCOUTING THE ZIPS

• Akron finished the 2022 season with an overall mark of 2-10 and went 1-7 in conference play.

They capped the season with a 23-22 heartbreaking loss against Buffalo.

- Akron was predicted fifth in the East Division MAC preseason Coaches' Poll .
- Eight Zips were named to Phil Steele's 2023 preseason All-Mid-American Conference teams. Earning preseason first-team All-MAC was junior WR **Alex Adams**. Named to the preseason second-team All-MAC was redshirt senior TE **TJ Banks**, while redshirt seniors QB **DJ Irons** and WR **Daniel George** garnered third-team preseason laurels and redshirt senior RB **Lorenzo Lingard**, senior DL **Ryan Johnson** redshirt senior DB **Nate Thompson**, and junior KR **Blake Hester** were preseason fourth-team All-MAC selections.
- The Zips elected seniors QB **DJ Irons**, WR **Daniel George**, DL **Ryan Johnson** and DB **KJ Martin** as captains for Akron for the 2023 campaign.
- Akron is set to return eight offensive starters and seven defensive starters from a year ago.
- Akron returns its top-three tacklers in; **Nate Thompson** (73 tackles, 38 solo, 35 assists, 2 TFL) **Darrian Lewis** (56 tackles, 30 solo, 26 assists, 3/5 TFL) **KJ Martin** (53 tackles, 30 solo, 23 assists, 3 TFL).
- Akron returns its top-two quarterbacks in; **DJ Irons** (253-379-7, 2,606, 10 TD) **Jeff Undercuffler** (70-120-5, 791 yards, 5 TD).
- Akron returns top-two leading rushers in; **DJ Irons** (133 carries, 314 yards, 4 TD) **Clyde Price III** (99 carries, 309 yards, 7 TD).
- Akron Returns four of top-five leading receivers in; **Alex Adams** (63 catches, 856 yards, 9 TD) **Daniel George** (67 catches, 793 yards, 2 TD) **Clyde Price III** (31 catches, 139 yards, 1 TD) **TJ Banks** (21 catches, 175 yards, 0 TD).
- Temple mounted a nine-play, 50-yard drive, culminating in a one-yard touchdown reception from to with 14:52 left in the ballgame, as Akron lost 24-21

in heartbreaking fashion to the TEM on Saturday afternoon at Lincoln Financial Field. **DJ Irons** led Akron's passing attack with 205 yards through the air, tossing two touchdowns and one interception. Temple outgained Akron 353-279 in the contest. The Zips managed only 41 yards in the second half after gaining 238 in the first.

- MSU's last game against Akron was on Sept. 8, 2018 at InfoCision Stadium – Summa Field under Bears head coach Ernest T. Jones ... Sophomore quarterback Kato Nelson, threw for 232 yards and three TDs to lead Akron to a 41-7 win over Morgan. The Bears' quarterbacks had a rough day in the office. Junior DeAndre Harris threw for 73 yards and completed 7-of-14 passes, while DJ Golatt Jr. didn't have it any easier. The redshirt-freshman was held to 5 yards passing (1 of 8). Both quarterbacks tossed an interception apiece.

NOTING THE BEARS

PRESEASON PICKED FOURTH

Morgan State was picked to finish fourth (4th) in the MEAC standings, according to the poll of the conference head coaches and sports information directors. North Carolina Central has been picked to defend its MEAC Football Championship as the Eagles topped the league's annual preseason poll for 2023.

PRESEASON ALL-MEAC PLAYERS

Six (6) Bears were named to the MEAC preseason team at the 2023 MEAC Football Press Luncheon in Norfolk, Va. Senior linebacker **Lawrence Richardson**, senior defensive back **Jae'Veyon Morton**, junior defensive lineman **Elijah Williams**, and sophomore return specialist **Keith Jenkins Jr.** were first-team selections. Senior offensive lineman **Marvin Atuatasi** and junior linebacker **Erick Hunter** were second-team picks.

BEARS OPEN 48th SEASON IN MEAC

The Bears will open its 48th season in the MEAC when they host Norfolk State for the conference opener on Oct. 8 ... it will also mark Morgan's Homecoming.
 • The Bears opened the 2022 MEAC schedule with a 24-21 loss against Norfolk State (Oct. 8) at Hughes Stadium.
 • The Bears kicked off its first season in the MEAC in 1971. Morgan State withdrew from the conference at the end of the 1979-80 fiscal year, before returning to the MEAC in 1984.

BEARS OPEN 124th SEASON OF FOOTBALL SINCE 1898

MSU enters its 124th season of football and will open the 2023 campaign under second year head coach **Damon Wilson**.

RETURN MEN

The 2023 Morgan State Bears return 16 starters - 8 on offense, 8 on defense and 1 on special teams.

CAMPAINING FOR SUCCESS

The Bears enter the 2023 season looking to post their first winning season since going 6-5 in 2009. MSU's 7-6 record in 2014 was vacated.

NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

The Bears will open the 2023 campaign with two of its first three non-conference matchups coming on the road. MSU opens the season at Richmond (Sept. 2), followed by a game at Akron (Sept. 9). The Bears will host Towson (Sept. 16) and Albany (Sept. 23), before traveling to face Yale (Sept. 30). The Bears round out non-conference play when they host Stony Brook (Oct. 7) for homecoming.

MSU LEGEND EARL BANKS

Earl "Papa Bear" Banks was a legendary head coach at Morgan State University,
 • In 1960, Banks took over the head coaching position at Morgan State from 2011 Trailblazer Award winner, **Edward Hurt**.

• In his 14 seasons as head coach, he would lead the Bears to six CIAA titles, one CIAA Northern Division championship and one Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference title. Banks had an overall record of 96-31-2 after he retired from coaching 1973 and produced three undefeated seasons from 1965 through 1967.

• He guided Morgan State to four bowl games, winning the 1965 Orange Blossom Classic and the 1966 Tangerine Bowl.

• He was named the American Football Coaches Association's recipient of the 2018 Trailblazer Award. The award was presented, posthumously, at the 2019 AFCA Convention in San Antonio, Texas.

BEARS NAME TEAM CAPTAINS

The MSU Bears wrapped up the preseason by naming the team captains for the 2023 season. Three seniors and a junior make up the leadership group. ... offense - **Jabriel Johnson** (Baltimore, Md.), **Dexter Carr Jr.** (Stafford, Va.) ... defense - **Lawrence Richardson** (Philadelphia, Pa.) and **Carlvaisky Decius** (New Carrollton).

HEAVY ON UPPERCLASSMEN

At the start of training camp, Morgan State had 18 seniors and six graduate students on the roster.

Morgan State has just five senior starters and two graduate students on offense – QB **Carson Baker**, RB **Jabriel Johnson**, OL **Marvin Atuatasi**, OL **Dexter Carr Jr.**, Y **Anthony James**, WR **Treyveyon Pratt** and WR **Avery Jones** – and five on defense – Senior LB **Lawrence Richardson**, S **Jordan Toles**, NT **Sean Morris** and graduate students DB **Jae'Veyon "Knock" Morton** and DE **Noah Washington**.

• DE **Nana Asante**, LB **Erick Hunter**, LB **KJ Scott**, DL **Darius Outlaw** and DL **Reginald Barnes** add experience to a talented defensive unit. CB **Brandon Savage**, FS **Quincy Johnson**, S **Josh Graham** and LB **Sam Alsheimer** are prepared to play "The Reliever" when called upon.

• Morgan State's opening day roster included 22 juniors and 25 in the sophomore class.

ROLLING WITH THE O-BLOCK

MSU's offense rolled up almost 3,000 yards of offense a season ago. However, the Bears return a mix of experienced veterans and a very young, but talented offensive line for the 2023 campaign.

• The O-line's, aka. "O-Block", veteran leadership will come from preseason All-MEAC second team selection **Marvin Atuatasi** at left guard, senior **Dexter Carr Jr.** will handle chores at center, and **Treyvon Branch** will play right tackle.

• **Kahari Finley** will be the starting left tackle for the newest members of the trenches ... the Bears will depth will also be provided by freshmen: **Harrison Anthony**, **Shane Marks**, and **Noah Gebremedhin**.

• The Bears offense finished the 2022 season ranked No. 3 in rushing (147.2/g) and averaged 270.2 total yards of offense per game (No. 5 in MEAC).

• The Bears key loss in the trenches included: tackle **Chris Anthony**.

FORMER BEARS ON COACHING STAFF

Three of **Damon Wilson's** coaching staff are former Morgan players and coaches.

• **B.T. Sherman** - was a standout for the Bears on special teams and as a receiver. He ranked as one of the top returners in the nation by averaging a league-best 30.1 yards per kickoff return. He was also the team's second-leading receiver as he helped the Bears post a 7-5 record, the school's first winning season in 23 years.

• **Harold 'Sport' Benton** - was a fixture in Morgan athletics. The veteran coach served 19 years at Morgan State in a pair of capacities, including 13 as the special teams coordinator/tight ends coach. He also served six years as the linebackers coach for Morgan beginning in 1998.

• **Melvin Coleman** - was named Black College All-American in 2000 and earned his Bachelor of Science degree in 2001.

2023 SCHEDULE NOTE

The Bears open the 2023 season with a pair of road games. On Sept. 2, Morgan will travel I-95 south to face the Richmond Spiders. They last met on Nov. 29, 2014 in the first round of the FCS Playoffs.

• Morgan will travel to Ohio for an FBS matchup against the Akron Zips on Sept. 9. It will mark the fourth meeting between the teams. The last being a 41-7 Akron win on Sept. 8, 2018.

• On Sept. 16, Morgan's home-opener will be against the Towson Tigers in the 'Battle for Greater Baltimore' at Hughes Stadium. The game will mark the first of back-to-back home games for the Bears.

• Morgan will then host the Albany Danes on Sept. 23. The Danes lead the series 2-0 and recorded a 41-14 win at Tom & Casey Stadium in their last matchup on Nov. 13, 2021.

• The Bears will travel north to take on the Yale Bulldogs on Sept. 30. It will be only the

second meeting between the teams. Yale shutout Morgan 41-0 in 1984.

- Morgan will complete its non-conference slate when its hosts Stony Brook for Homecoming on Oct. 7. The Seawolves kicked a game-winning field goal to hold off the Bears 24-22 in last season's game at LaValle Stadium.

- The Bears will be coming off of a bye week when they open conference play at home on Oct. 21 against reigning MEAC and Celebration Bowl champion North Carolina Central.

- Morgan will then hit the road to take on the Spartans of Norfolk State on Oct. 28, before wrapping its home slate on Nov. 4 when it hosts the Delaware State Hornets.

- The Bears conclude the regular season on the road against the South Carolina State Bulldogs on Nov. 11, followed by a trip to face Beltway rival and the reigning MEAC Co-Champion Howard Bison on Nov. 18.

A LOOK AHEAD

- Saturday, Sept. 16th will mark the 28th meeting in the series that began with a 34-7 Morgan State win at Towson on Sept. 1, 1979.

- The Tigers hold an 21-6 advantage in the series vs. MSU.

- The Tigers have won 9 of the last 10 meetings against Morgan State since 2005, including the last four matchups.

- Towson handed the Bears a 29-21 loss at Johnny Unitas Stadium on Sept. 10, 2022. Towson quarterback Tyrrell Pigrome helped the Tigers pull out a 29-21 victory in front of 9,784 fans in attendance at Johnny Unitas Stadium. Pigrome went 14 of 25 for 157 yards, including three touchdowns as Towson rallied to beat the Bears. **Carson Baker** had a solid night as the Bears starting signal-caller. He went 10 of 24 for 152 yards and threw a pair of touchdowns and an interception for Morgan. Alfonso Graham led the Bears with 89 yards on 17 carries and scored two touchdowns.

The Bears earned a nationally ranked upset and their first season-opening win since 2012. **Jabriel Johnson's** 10-yard touchdown run with 6:27 left broke a 10-10 tie, and it was set up one play earlier by defensive end **Noah Washington's** fumble recovery following linebacker **Erick Hunter's** strip sack of Richmond's Kyle Wickersham. The MEAC squad, which finished 4-7 in coach **Damon Wilson's** first season last year, limited Richmond to 264 yards of offense, forced four turnovers and had five sacks.

- Hunter, a junior linebacker from Capitol Heights, Md., showcased his talent and resilience on the field, leading the Bears to an impressive 17-10 upset road victory over #18 Richmond at Robins Stadium.
- He recorded 11 tackles, four solo, with 1.5 sacks for a four-yard loss and collected a huge strip-sack on Spiders quarterback Kyle Wickersham to help setup the final score of the night and seal the victory.

WILLIAMS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

Elijah Williams was named to The Bluebloods 2023 preseason third-team All-American.

- Williams, a junior defensive end from Jersey City, N.J., registered 60 total tackles (33 solo, 27 assisted) last season, including a league-high 19.0 tackles for loss (ranks No. 5 in FCS) and nine sacks (T-No. 13 in FCS).
- Williams' long list of accolades includes being named to the All-MEAC First Team, HERO Sports 2022 FCS Sophomore All-American selection, Phil Steele All-MEAC First Team, Blue Bloods All-MEAC First Team, and BOXTOROW All-America Honorable Mention.
- Williams led Morgan's defense to one of the top in the conference in 2022. The Bears ranked in the top 3 in six major defensive categories, including leading the MEAC in scoring defense and sacks. Morgan also ranked third in total defense, rushing defense, opponent 4th down conversions and interceptions.
- He collected eight tackles, 2 TFLs and a QB hurry during the Bears upset victory at No. 16 Richmond.
