Morgan Gears Up for a Clash with Delaware State

Kickoff is set for 1 p.m. at Alumni Stadium; will be broadcast live on ESPN+ and WEEA-88.9 FM

GAME TIME

As Morgan State prepares to take on Delaware State on Saturday, Nov. 9, the stakes are high for both teams at Alumni Stadium. With a record of 4-5 and a conference standing of 1-1, the Bears are eager to build momentum. Conversely, the Hornets, struggling with a record of 1-8 and still searching for their first conference win at 0-2, are looking to turn their season around. Kickoff is set for 12 p.m. at Alumni Stadium. The game will air on ESPN+ and will also be broadcast by WEEA, 88.9FM.

THE SERIES

- Saturday will mark the 68th meeting between the two schools.
- Morgan leads the series against Delaware State with an overall record of 40-27.
- The Bears have won 13 of the last 15 meetings since 2008, including a current string of 5-straight (2018-2023).
- In their last meeting on Nov. 4, 2023, true freshman quarterback Tahj Smith threw two touchdown passes in his first career start, and J.J. Davis added 75 yards and a score to lead Morgan to a 24-17 win over Delaware State at Hughes Stadium.

QUICK HITS

- The 2024 Morgan State Bears are under the leadership of third year head coach **Damon Wilson**. Wilson, the 24th coach in school history, previously served 13 seasons as the head football coach at Bowie State. There, he achieved three straight Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA) conference championships, in 2021, 2019 and 2018; five NCAA playoff berths; and three CIAA Coach of the Year honors.
- Sophomore QB **Tahj Smith** entered the season as the Bears' starter. Smith's emergence comes after a freshman season in which he appeared in five games and started in the last four games of the season. He completed 29-of-71 passes (40.8 pct) for 426 yards and three touchdowns. He was also the team's third leading rusher, accumulating 159 yards on 4.1 average carries and scoring two TDs.
- Last season, **J.J. Davis** emerged as Morgan's clear-cut starting running back, playing nearly two times as many snaps as any other Bear at the position and finished with 116 carries, 584 yd, 2 TDs in 10 games played.
- Morgan has a number of offensive linemen as they enter the 2024 season ... The Bears have 19 OL listed on the roster and will be led by veteran Preseason All-MEAC First Team **Treyvon Branch**. (6-3, 290).
- DL **Elijah Williams**, is on the official watch list for the 2024 Black College Football Player of the Year Watchlist, was a defensive standout in the trenches for the Bears in 2023. The New Jersey product registered 50 total tackles, including 31 solo tackles. His ability to penetrate the offensive line and disrupt plays was unmatched, as evidenced by his league-leading 11.0 tackles for loss... He recently broke Morgan's sack record and has **29 career sacks** for his career.
- The Morgan State defense and special teams unit overcame early issues with the offense and fought back from an early three touchdown deficit to overwhelm Norfolk State 38-37 in overtime to win their first MEAC game of the season on Nov. 2nd at Hughes Stadium. In a thrilling turn of events during the first play of overtime, **Tahj Smith** showcased his pinpoint accuracy and poise under pressure. He found an open **Jaden Coffen** streaking down the field, delivering a crisp 25-yard touchdown pass that ignited the crowd.

Morgan State was a power as a former member of the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA). The Bears posted 173 wins between 1929 and 1959 when **Edward P. Hurt** was the head coach and the Bears won 14 CIAA championships. **Earl Banks** added to the championship collection by winning four titles during the 1960s and a MEAC title in 1971. **Clarence Thomas** led the Bears to a MEAC title in 1979...and now - after a 35-year drought - head coach **Lee Hull** has added a MEAC title following a thrilling and historical 2014 season. * **Damon Wilson** enters his 3rd season as Morgan's head coach. He previously spent 13 seasons as the head coach at Bowie State University where he achieved three straight Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA) conference championships.
* **Lee Hull** (Holy Cross, '88) was introduced as the 24th head coach in team history on Dec. 20, 2022. A former MEAC champion head coach, Hull brought more than 25 years of coaching experience at the professional and NCAA Division I levels to the position. Hull most recently served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at rival Howard University since 2020.

SCOUTING THE HORNETS



- Delaware State finished the 2023 season with a 1-10 overall record and posted a 0-5 mark in MEAC play and went 1-4 at home.
- DSU was picked to finish last in the MEAC Preseason Coaches Poll.

Three Hornets earned recognition on the 2024 Preseason All-MEAC Second Team. Tight end **Edward Core**, defensive linemen **Darren Cook** and **Eric Montes**.

- QB **Marqui Adams** ranks No. 3 in the league in passing (170.7 avg) and has completed 59% of his throws (92-156) for 1,024 yards, a league high 7 TDs with three INTs ... he also ranks No. 8 in the league in rushing with 264 yards and two TDs.
- Last time out - Ja'Shawn Scroggins threw four touchdown passes, ran for another and Howard shut out Delaware State 38-0 on Saturday in Washington, D.C. Three of Scroggins' scoring passes came in the first half when the Bison built a 24-0 lead. Scroggins was 24-of-41 passing for 304 yards. Two of his touchdown passes went to Kasey Hawthorne, who finished with 105 yards on nine catches. Breylin Smith and Montrell Walker had the other TD catches.
- **C.J. Henry** was just 6-of-20 passing for 44 yards with two interceptions for the Hornets, who lost their seventh straight game.
- RB **Jaden Sutton** ranks No. 2 in the MEAC in rushing with 822 yards on 125 carries, including eight TDs ... he's currently averaging 6.6 yards per carry.
- Junior **Kahleef Jimmison** and redshirt junior **Barry Wagner** are two of the top defenders in the conference. Jimmison has 47 stops and a sack, including 6.0 tackles for loss. Wagner ranks No. 9 in tackles (45) with six passes defended (No. 7).
- DSU ranks among the league leaders in a number of statistical categories: No. 1 in PATs (20-20), No. 3 in punting (40.8), No. 4 in pass offense (156.8), and No. 4 in run offense.
- **Lee Hull** was named Morgan State's head coach on January 8, 2014 and his first team went 7-5 and won a share of the MEAC championship and also played in the Bears' first-ever appearance in the NCAA FCS Playoffs.

DATING GAME

- Morgan's last contest played on Nov. 9 was in 2019, vs. #14 N.C. A&T, the Bears stunned the Aggies, No. 14 in the STATS FCS Top 25, by defeating them 22-16 in a MEAC matchup. Morgan's defense bent, didn't break, and held the Aggies, who averages 34.5 points per game, to a single touchdown. The Bears also collected eight tackles for loss, five QB hurries, two sacks and a pair of interceptions. Head coach Tyrone Wheatley said the game could have been put out of reach sooner if the Bears defense did not let the Aggies convert six crucial third downs. "If we get those third downs back, I think the game is put a little bit more out of reach," Wheatley said. The Aggies converted eight of 17 third downs, in addition to converting on two of three fourth downs attempts.

NOTING THE BEARS

PRESEASON PICKED THIRD

Morgan State was picked to finish third (3rd) in the MEAC standings, according to the poll of the conference head coaches and sports information directors. North Carolina Central has been picked win the MEAC Football Championship as the Eagles topped the league's annual preseason poll for 2024. Returning MEAC champion Howard was picked to place 2nd.

PRESEASON ALL-MEAC PLAYERS

Eight (8) Bears were named to the MEAC preseason team at the 2024 MEAC Football Press Luncheon in Norfolk, Va. Senior OL **Treyvon Branch**, senior DL **Elijah Williams**, senior LB **Erick Hunter**, junior RS **Keith Jenkins Jr.** were first-team selections. Sophomore QB **Tahj Smith**, senior DL **Nana Asante**, senior DB **Carlvainisky Decius**, and sophomore DB **Ja'son Prevard** were second-team picks.

BEARS OPEN 49th SEASON IN MEAC

The Bears will open its 49th season in the MEAC when they travel to face North Carolina Central for the conference opener on Oct. 26.

- The Bears opened the 2023 MEAC schedule with a 16-10 loss against North Carolina Central (Oct. 19) at Hughes Stadium.
- The Bears kicked off its first season in the MEAC in 1971. Morgan State withdrew from the conference at the end of the 1979-80 fiscal year, before returning to the MEAC in 1984.

... mark MSU's first conference home win since defeating Delaware State 37-7 on Nov. 12, 2022.

BEARS OPEN 125th SEASON OF FOOTBALL SINCE 1898

MSU enters its 125th season of football and will open the 2024 campaign under third year head coach **Damon Wilson**.

RETURN MEN

The 2024 Morgan State Bears return 18 starters - 7 on offense, 8 on defense and 3 on special teams.

CAMPAIGNING FOR SUCCESS

The Bears enter the 2024 season looking to post their first winning season since going 6-5 in 2009. MSU's 7-6 record in 2014 was vacated.

NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

The Bears will open the 2024 campaign with three of its first seven non-conference matchups coming on the road. MSU opens the season at Hampton (Aug. 31), followed by a game at Towson (Sept. 6) and Ohio (Sept.14). The Bears will host Virginia Lynchburg (Sept. 21), before traveling to face Stony Brook (Sept. 28). The Bears round out non-conference play when they host Lincoln (Pa.) (Oct. 5) and Merrimack (Oct. 12).

MSU LEGEND EARL BANKS

Earl "Papa Bear" Banks was a legendary head coach at Morgan State University,

- In 1960, Banks took over the head coaching position at Morgan State from 2011 Trailblazer Award winner, **Edward Hurt**.
- In his 14 seasons as head coach, he would lead the Bears to six CIAA titles, one CIAA Northern Division championship and one Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference title. Banks had an overall record of 96-31-2 after he retired from coaching 1973 and produced three undefeated seasons from 1965 through 1967.
- He guided Morgan State to four bowl games, winning the 1965 Orange Blossom Classic and the 1966 Tangerine Bowl.
- He was named the American Football Coaches Association's recipient of the 2018 Trailblazer Award. The award was presented, posthumously, at the 2019 AFCA Convention in San Antonio, Texas.

At the start of training camp, Morgan State had 18 seniors and seven graduate students on the roster.

Morgan has just one senior starter on offense – OL **Treyvon Branch** – and five seniors and one graduate on defense – Senior DL **Elijah Williams**, NT **Melteen Davis**, LB **Erick Hunter**, DB **Josh Graham**, CB **Carlvainsky Decius** and graduate student DE **Joseph Murray**.

• DE **Chibuikem Oguayo**, NT **Reginald Barnes**, DE **Nana Asante**, LB **KJ Scott** and LB **Keith Joseph-Clark** add experience to a talented defensive unit. CB **Jadon Carter**, FS **Jordan Johnson**, S **Gregory Young II** are prepared to play "The Reliever" when called upon.

• Morgan's opening day roster included 32 juniors and 30 in the sophomore class.

ROLLING WITH THE O-BLOCK

MSU's offense rolled up a little over 2,500 yards of offense a season ago. However, the Bears return a mix of experienced veterans and a very young, but talented offensive line for the 2024 campaign.

• The O-line's, aka. "O-Block", veteran leadership will come from preseason All-MEAC first team selection senior **Treyvon Branch** at right guard, junior **Daniel Casillas** will handle chores at center, and sophomore **Kahari Finley** will play left tackle.

• R-junior **Da'Jour Dixon** will be the starting right tackle and sophomore **Kris Boyd** will take the left guard position in trenches ... the Bears will depth will also be provided by freshmen: **Darius Mosley**, **Kadin Zlacki-Johnson**, **Shane Marks**, **Evan Rawlick** and **Blake Scriber**.

• The left side of the Bears' Oline is held down by freshmen: LT **Kahari Finley** (6-5, 285, Fr.) and LG **Mosula Tapusoa** (6-0, 310, Rfr.).

• The Bears offense finished the 2023 season ranked No. 5 in rushing (112.7/g), No. 5 in passing (138.1/g) and averaged 250.8 total yards of offense per game (No. 6 in MEAC).

• The Bears key loss in the trenches included: guards **Marvin Atuatasi** and **Dexter Carr Jr.**



FORMER BEARS ON COACHING STAFF

Two of **Damon Wilson's** coaching staff are former Morgan players and coaches.

• **Harold 'Sport' Benton** - was a fixture in Morgan athletics. The veteran coach served 19 years at Morgan State in a pair of capacities, including 13 as the special teams coordinator/tight ends coach. He also served six years as the linebackers coach for Morgan beginning in 1998.

• **Melvin Coleman** - was named Black College All-American in 2000 and earned his Bachelor of Science degree in 2001.

• Morgan will follow with a pair of road games. On Sept. 7, Morgan will face the Towson Tigers in the 'Battle for Greater Baltimore' at Johnny Unitas Stadium.

• Morgan will then travel to Athens, Ohio for an FBS matchup against the Ohio Bobcats on Sept. 14. It will mark the first meeting between the teams.

• On Sept. 21, Morgan's home-opener will be against Virginia University of Lynchburg for 'Bear Family Day' at Hughes Stadium. Morgan overwhelmed the Dragons 44-10 in their last meeting (Oct. 1, 2022) and leads the series 3-0.

• Morgan will continue its non-conference slate when it travels to Stony Brook for a Sept. 28 matchup. In their last meeting (Nov. 5, 2022), the Seawolves kicked a game-winning field goal to hold off the Bears 24-22 at LaValle Stadium.

• The Bears will celebrate Homecoming when they welcome Lincoln (Pa.) to Hughes Stadium on Oct. 5. As a result of last year's cancelled homecoming game against Stony Brook, this will be the Bears' first homecoming since 2022.

• The Bears will host Merrimack in a first-time meeting, before they open open conference play on Oct. 26 at North Carolina Central.

• Morgan will then host the Spartans of Norfolk State on Nov. 2, before wrapping its road slate on Nov. 9 when it travels to Delaware State.

• The Bears conclude the regular season with a pair of home matchups.

Morgan will face the South Carolina State Bulldogs on Nov. 16, followed by the regular season finale against Beltway rival and the reigning MEAC Champion Howard Bison on Nov. 23.

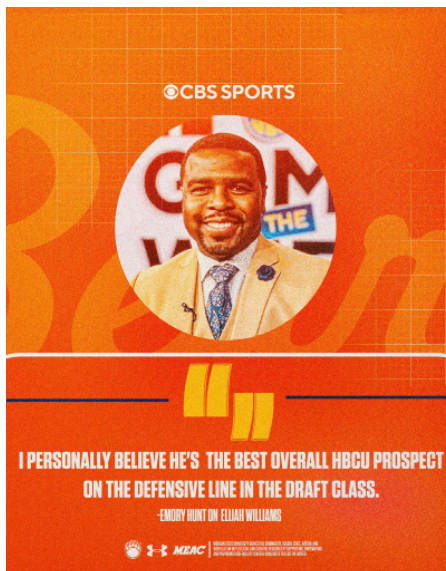

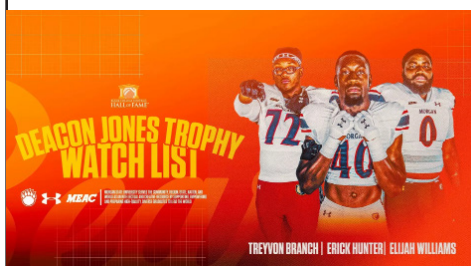

- As one of just 13 players selected for the preseason watch list, Messenger stands out among a pool of highly skilled punters. His consistent ability to execute precise and long-distance punts has earned him recognition as one of the most promising punters in the FCS.
- The FCS Punter of the Year Award winner will be determined by the FCS Punter of the Year Award national voting body which consists of FCS sports information directors and national sports writers.
- In his inaugural season as a collegiate athlete, Messenger quickly established himself as a formidable punter in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC). The Alexandria, Va. native averaged 34.2 yards on 46 punts, accumulating a total of 1,574 yards. Messenger's consistency was highlighted by his ability to pin opponents deep in their own territory, with 15 punts landing inside the 20-yard line. Additionally, he showcased his touch and control, placing 11 punts within fair-catch range, including two impressive punts that traveled over 50 yards.
- The Message is clear ... this young man will be key component to the Morgan's success as the program moves forward.



AGENT ZERO

Morgan's opposing offenses have to account for the Bear sporting the No. 0 jersey. He's not hard to find, because more than likely he'll be in the backfield wreaking havoc. His name is **Elijah Williams**.



- "Agent Zero's" impactful performance vs. Norfolk State solidified his place in Morgan's defensive history. With a sack in overtime, he surpassed Christopher Robinson to claim the No. 1 spot on the school's all-time sacks list ...he has currently accounted for an impressive **29** throughout his career... and counting.
- For the 2023 season, Williams registered 50 tackles (31 solo), 11 tackles for loss (No. 1 in MEAC), 7.0 sacks (No. 1) and a forced fumble.
- Williams was also named Phil Steele's 2024 MEAC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year.
- The New Jersey City product broke out as a dominant player as a sophomore during the 2022 season, racking up 60 tackles to go with a league-high 19 tackles for loss (No. 5 in FCS) and nine sacks (T-No.13 in FCS).
- His 2022 accolades included: being named to the All-MEAC First Team ... HERO Sports 2022 FCS Sophomore All-American selection ... Phil Steele All-MEAC First Team DL ... Bluebloods All-MEAC First Team DL ... BOXTOROW All-America Honorable Mention.
- Morgan hasn't seen this dominant of an edge rusher since Malachi Washington (2015-19) who finished his career with 116 tackles, 38 tackles for loss, 20.5 sacks with three fumble recoveries, two forced fumbles and an interception.

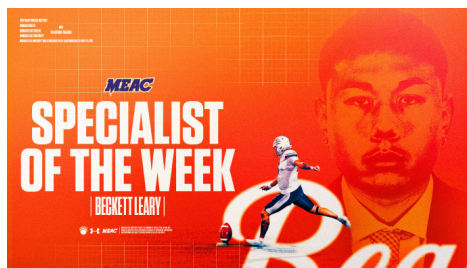
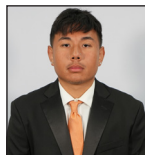

On Monday, (Sept. 2), senior PK **Beckett Leary** became the first Morgan Bear to earn MEAC weekly honors, being named Special Teams Player of the Week. He made his presence felt in Morgan's season-opener debut against Hampton on Saturday night and delivered a 23-yard field goal in his first attempt of the season. He was also successful on three of his point-after kicks. His contributions set the stage for a promising season for the veteran kicker.



- Leary has made 18-of-27 field goals since joining the Bears as a transfer from the University of New Haven in 2022.
- He began his college career as a freshman at Juniata in 2021 where he connected on 7-of-11 field goals.
- During the 2023 season, Leary converted 7-of-12 field goals, including a career-high 39-yarder at Yale on Sept. 30...he also finished 18-for-19 on PATs in 10 games.
- Leary was a 4-sport athlete at Reservoir High where he was not only a standout kicker and punter for the Gators, he also played varsity soccer and lacrosse for two years, in addition to varsity tennis for one year.

interceptions and a fumble recovery.

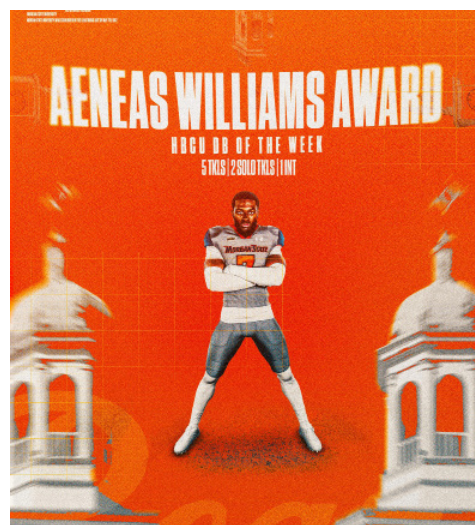
- The Bears opened the scoring with a pick-6 by **Carlvainisky Decius** vs. Virginia-Lynchburg in Week 4.

BLOCK PARTY STARTER

Nana Asante made headlines last weekend with his special teams performance at Stony Brook, showcasing his defensive prowess by blocking a pair of extra points.



- This achievement not only highlights Asante's skill but also places him in a unique category within the annals of Morgan football history – he becomes the first player since Colby Warrior to block two kicks in a single game, a feat accomplished during the 2018 season against Howard.
- With five blocked kicks (T-No. 1 in FCS) now under his belt in his collegiate career, Asante continues to solidify his reputation as a disruptive force on special teams.

POUND THE GROUND

Morgan State ranks No. 4 in the MEAC in rushing yards per game (145.6 avg), thanks to a stable of talented running backs, who have racked up 1,310 total yards and 16 TDs in the first seven games.

- Redshirt freshman **Jason Collins** leads the Bears with 345 yards (No. 10 in MEAC) and 5 TDs, followed by senior RB **Myles Miree** (331 yds, 3.8 avg, 7 TDs) and grad student **J.J. Davis** (252 yds, 4 TDs).

SIDELINES TO CENTER STAGE

Duce Taylor stepped into the spotlight as the starting quarterback for the Bears' Week 5 matchup against Stony Brook, marking a significant return after a hiatus since his last start on September 16, 2023, against Towson.



- The redshirt junior showed flashes of solid production during the game, completing 11 of 17 passes for a total of 70 yards and was sacked twice. Additionally, two fumbles added to his struggles.
- Despite the setbacks, Taylor's perseverance and drive moving forward will play a critical role as the Bears grind through the remainder of the season. In just two games this season, Taylor has thrown for a total of 129 yards.
- He completed 17 of 24 attempts, including a touchdown pass in Week 4 against Virginia-Lynchburg.
- In his third consecutive start of the season, Taylor completed 24-of-31 passes for 186 yards in Week 7 against Merrimack.
- He had a rough game against Norfolk State, where he completed 2-of-3 passes for 40 yards, but was benched after committing three fumbles.

COLLINS JR. ENTERS JERRY RICE WATCH LIST SPOTLIGHT

Redshirt freshman **Jason Collins Jr.** has been selected as one of 30 FCS players named to the in-season watch list of the Stats Perform 2024 Jerry Rice Award, which honors the FCS freshman player of the year in college football's Division I subdivision.



- The Rice Award, now in its 14th season, is named after legendary Hall of Fame wide receiver Jerry Rice. Past recipients include Cooper Kupp, Chase Edmonds, Trey Lance, Cam Ward and Shedeur Sanders.
- Collins has been a vital asset for his team, making his mark by participating in every game this season so far. Currently, with nine games under his belt, he has established himself as a reliable rusher, ranking first on the roster currently with an impressive 66 carries for 345 yards. His ability to find the end zone has not gone unnoticed, as he has already crossed the line three times this season on runs of 41, 32, 9, 2 and 1 yards.
- Hailing from Washington, D.C., Collins is making a name for himself with an outstanding average of 6.2 yards per carry. Each time he touches the ball, he poses a significant threat to defenses, as he continues to elevate his team's performance with every game.
- Collins is the only player from the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference to be named to the list and is the first Bear honored since Lawrence Forbes in 2013 and Elandon Roberts in 2012.
- The 2024 Jerry Rice Award recipient will be announced on Dec. 4 and honored at the Stats Perform National Awards Banquet on Jan. 4 in Frisco, Texas. Other awards at the banquet are the Walter Payton Award (FCS Offensive Player of the Year), Buck Buchanan Award (FCS Defensive Player of the Year), Eddie Robinson Award (FCS Coach of the Year), Urban Edge Network HBCU+ Player of the Year and FedEx Doris Robinson Scholar-Athlete of the Year.



MAD MATTOCKS

Arturo Mattocks delivered a standout performance in the recent matchup against #20/21 N.C. Central, further solidifying his reputation as a rising star in the linebacker position.



- He finished with eight tackles and a interception return for 18-yards against the Eagles as the junior linebacker continues to impress as the season moves along.
- Mattocks is the team's leading tackler and currently ranks No. 6 in the MEAC with 59 tackles (29 solo), to go along with three tackles for loss, a forced fumbles and a fumble recovery.
- He posted a season-high 13 tackles with a forced fumble at Stony Brook on Sept. 28.

STUKES RISING

Senior safety **Bryan Stukes** has emerged as a critical defensive player this season.



- Currently, he stands third on the team with 38 tackles. He has also contributed two pass breakups and a forced fumble.
- He posted a season-high eight tackles and snagged an interception in Week 3 at Ohio.
- Stukes blocked a field goal in the 3rd quarter vs. Norfolk State that was scooped up and returned for a TD by Jadon Carter.
- As the season progresses, Stukes' will continue be vital for the team's success.

FRESHMAN KICKER NAMED MEAC ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Morgan kicker **Sahr Gbundema** has been named Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Rookie of the Week, the league announced Monday. Gbundema scored eight points kicking in the Bears' 38-37 overtime win versus Norfolk State on Saturday.



- Gbundema converted two of three extra point attempts on Saturday and matched and had two field goals made. The walk-on freshman connected from 35 yards to tie the game at 3-3 in the first quarter, and added a clutch 47-yard field goal with 22 seconds remaining to help send the game into overtime tied at 31 apiece.
- Gbundema also averaged 54.1 yards on seven kickoffs.

LIMITED LAUNDRY

Damon Wilson's Bears are the second least penalized team in the MEAC (50 in 9 gms). This achievement is no small feat, as pre-and-post snap penalties are often a significant challenge for many teams - and right now Morgan has demonstrated they are the best at minimizing costly mistakes. This disciplined approach is not merely a statistic but a reflection of the culture Wilson has fostered within the program. As the season progresses, Morgan's reputation as a well-disciplined squad continues to grow.
