QUICK HITTERS

- Mount St. Mary's faces a ranked team for the 16th time in program history as the welcome the #25 ranked Fairfield Stags. A victory will be the first in program history against a top 25 squad.
- Taking on a daunting road slate with back-to-back trips to Connecticut and upstate New York, the Mountaineers answered the call with a pair of wins against Quinnipiac and Canisius. Offense led the charge with a season-high 16 goals against the Bobcats, and defense allowed a season-low five goals versus the Golden Griffins.
- The two wins pull the Mount to .500 in MAAC play and locked them into a tie for fourth place in the conference. If the season ended today, they would be the #5 seed for the postseason due to Niagara winning the tiebreaker because of their head-to-head matchup.

INSIDE THE SERIES

>>> In addition to the tough challenge of facing a Top 25 team, the Mount is also looking to reverse a four game slide against the Stags. Fairfield holds a 5-3 leads in the series and has won every contest since 2006. The last Mount win was a 12-7 on March 18 of that year.

MAAC PRESEASON POLL

>>> In the coaches' vote released on February 7, the Mount was slated for a fifth place prediction before the start of the season. The Mountaineers received a total of 57 points in the poll. Fairfield, the defending champion, was picked as the preseason favorites.

BE ON GUARD!

>>> The departure of Madison Bradley from the team has opened up a competition for starting goalkeeper entering the season. There are four members of the team vying for a spot, with Kaitlin Price and Delaney LaRose returning from last year's squad, along with transfer Ashlyn Watkins from Bryant and incoming freshman Camille Thomas.

>>> So far, Watkins serves as the primary starter, appearing in all but one game. Camille Thomas has played in three contests and Kaitlin Price in one.

ALL-AROUND OFFENSIVE EFFORT

>>> Needing to find new ways to generate offense entering the 2024 season, the Mount is spoiled for choice as a healthy numbers of teammates have pitched in on the offense side. 12 Mountaineers scored at least one goal so far this year, with eight of them also contributing assists. Leading goal scorer Mackenzi Furlong has the most goals with 28, assists at nine, and points at 37.

HOME VS. ROAD

- >>> The 2024 schedule tilts slightly towards being away from Emmitsburg, with the Mount playing eight on the road and seven at home. There is also a neutral match March 8 versus High Point at the US Lacrosse Headquarters in Sparks, Maryland.
- >>> In 2023, Mount St. Mary's won three of its four games at home, finishing with a 3-5 record. Away from home, they were 1-8 with their lone road victory coming against Marist on April 15.
- >>> So far, the Mount has earned one win in Emmitsburg and three wins away from home (Bucknell, Ouinnipiac, Canisius).

CHAMPIONSHIPS - 2021 (NEC) - 2022 (NEC)

Former U.S. National Team player Lauren Skellchock (née Schwarzmann) was named the ninth head coach in Mount St. Mary's women's lacrosse program history on July 8, 2014.

Guiding the Mountaineers to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances, Skellchock has raised the bar for defining success within the program. Going 15-5 in her eighth season at the helm, including 7-1 in the NEC, the Mount once again took the conference tournament crown with wins over Wagner and Bryant. Offense and defense continued to provide a mutual force with a goal differential of +86 (257-171).

Skellhock was the Northeast Conference (NEC) Coach for the third year in a row in 2021, as she lead to the lead the team to their first NEC title since 2005, defeating Wagner 9-8 in overtime. She led the Mountaineers to another historic season, which included a fourteen game winning streak breaking 2019's win streak. The Mountaineers posted their fifth perfect NEC record in program history as they earned an NCAA Tournament bid. The Mount ranked fifth in the country in scoring defense allowing only 8.41 goals per game, while scoring 15.06 goals a game to rank tied for 14th in the country. The Mountaineers ranked 10th in the country in save percentage with a 49.3 percentage.

On May 19, 2017, Skellchock was honored with induction into the Carroll County Sports Hall of Fame. Skellchock was a member of Century High School's first graduating class in 2004 after transferring to the school as a sophomore in 2002. She led her squad to a state finals appearance in their first year as a varsity program, before following up by winning the state title the following season.

In late May of 2016, Skellchock was named an assistant coach for the Baltimore Ride of the United Women's Lacrosse League (UWLX), the first-ever professional women's lacrosse league in the world. Skellchock joined her younger sister, Katie, who was selected as the first overall pick by the Ride in the inaugural UWLX draft.

During her first season at the helm of the Mount in 2015, Skellchock guided the Mountaineers back to the Northeast Conference Semifinals and doubled the team's win total from the previous season. Finishing 6-11 overall, the Mount posted a 5-2 NEC mark to tie for second place in the regular season standings.

Prior to taking over the Mount St. Mary's program, Skellchock gained experience through assistant coaching positions at Cincinnati, San Diego State and Stanford. The Sykesville, Md. native joined the coaching ranks following a standout career as a midfielder on the Johns Hopkins women's lacrosse team.

Skellchock graduated from Johns Hopkins in 2008 with a degree in public health studies and has completed coursework toward her master's degree in public health from the University of Cincinnati.
