QUICK HITTERS

• Mount St. Mary's tries for its second win this week when they battle Bucknell Saturday. This past Wednesday, the team defeated Robert Morris 13-8 in Moon Township, Pennsylvania. Defense made a stand in the fourth period, shutting out the Colonials over the final 15 minutes.

• Madison Harmening led the offensive charge in the win over RMU, securing a first half hat trick and tying her career high with four goals.

• The Mountaineers moved back into a tie for first place in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference with Quinnipiac. A 4-1 start would be the program's best since 2020. In addition to the record, Mount's RPI is #13 in the nation, which leads the MAAC.

• Bucknell comes into the contest stands at .500 for the season, defeating Rider in overtime and earning a 17-6 victory over Kent State. Allie Boyce has the highest goal count with nine, while Taylor McClain leads with 11 points.

>>> Goals: Mackenzi Furlong (46); Assists: Mackenzi Furlong (19); Ground Balls: Ashlyn Watkins (48); Caused Turnovers: Molly Molchanoff (21); Draw Controls: Hailey Chester (71); Saves: Ashlyn Watkins (133)

STAT LEADERS FOR 2025

>>> Anna Salerno has the most goals and the most points, finding the back of the net 10 times to help accrue 12 points. Brooke Molchanoff has the highest number of assists with five. Sister Molly Molchanoff has the most caused turnover s with five, and Hailey Chester has secured 15 draw controls.

>>> Camille Thomas has played all four games in the net and garnered her first trio of collegiate wins. She is second in the league for goals against average and for save percentage.

INSIDE THE SERIES

>>> Mount St. Mary's got its first win against Bucknell last year, defeating the Bison in a road contest 14-8. They had dropped the previous five contests in 2002, '03, '11, '16, and '23.

MAAC PRESEASON POLL

>>> In the poll released on February 5, the Mountaineers were selected to finish third in the conference's preseason poll. The team earned 114 points in the tally, including a pair of first place votes.

PRESEASON ALL-MAAC HONORS

>>> Four members of the Mountaineers received Preseason All-MAAC honors, in the same announcement as the preseason poll.

>>> Mackenzi Furlong and Anna Salerno took positions on the offensive list. The duo lead production on the attack for the Mount in 2024. Furlong had the most points with 65, good for seventh-best in the MAAC. The graduate student had 46 goals and 19 assists. Salerno was second in the goal count with 38 tallies.

>>> Mackey Fick and Molly Molchanoff were recipients on the defensive end. Fick had the most ground balls of Mount's field players, with 40 collections behind goalie Ashlyn Watkins' all-time high of 48. Molchanoff had the most caused turnovers, forcing 21 giveaways.

EXPERIENCED ROSTER

>>> Of the 27 players active on the Mount's roster, 19 of them have previous experience with the Mountaineers. In that grouping, 16 of the 19 are either juniors, seniors, or graduate students with more than one year of experience.

>>> Among the eight newcomers, two are transfers from other schools. Maddie Malfa came from Winthrop and Jamie Fedorjaka came from Bucknell.

MINDING THE NET

>>> The Mountaineers have four goalies on the roster - all of which are returnees from the previous season.

>>> Ashlyn Watkins started 17 of 18 games last year, and had the most saves with 133 and the highest save percentage with .445.

>>> Camille Thomas, Kaitlin Price, and Delaney LaRose all saw action during the year. Thomas had the 18th start, and was second in the save count with 13 rejections.

TWO-BID LEAGUE

>>> The MAAC received two bids to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in conference history. Niagara won the automatic qualifier in the upset victory over Fairfield in the MAAC Championship. The Stags - who were ranked at the time of the defeat - was the recipient of an at-large bid. Both teams were defeated in the opening round.

Former U.S. National Team player Lauren Skellchock (née Schwarzmann) was named the ninth head coach in Mount St. Mary's women's lacrosse program history on July 8, 2014.

Guiding the Mountaineers to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances, Skellchock has raised the bar for defining success within the program. Going 15-5 in her eighth season at the helm, including 7-1 in the NEC, the Mount once again took the conference tournament crown with wins over Wagner and Bryant. Offense and defense continued to provide a mutual force with a goal differential of +86 (257-171).

Skellchock was the Northeast Conference (NEC) Coach for the third year in a row in 2021, as she lead to the lead the team to their first NEC title since 2005, defeating Wagner 9-8 in overtime. She led the Mountaineers to another historic season, which included a fourteen game winning streak breaking 2019's win streak. The Mountaineers posted their fifth perfect NEC record in program history as they earned an NCAA Tournament bid. The Mount ranked fifth in the country in scoring defense allowing only 8.41 goals per game, while scoring 15.06 goals a game to rank tied for 14th in the country. The Mountaineers ranked 10th in the country in save percentage with a 49.3 percentage.

On May 19, 2017, Skellchock was honored with induction into the Carroll County Sports Hall of Fame. Skellchock was a member of Century High School's first graduating class in 2004 after transferring to the school as a sophomore in 2002. She led her squad to a state finals appearance in their first year as a varsity program, before following up by winning the state title the following season.

In late May of 2016, Skellchock was named an assistant coach for the Baltimore Ride of the United Women's Lacrosse League (UWLX), the first-ever professional women's lacrosse league in the world. Skellchock joined her younger sister, Katie, who was selected as the first overall pick by the Ride in the inaugural UWLX draft.

During her first season at the helm of the Mount in 2015, Skellchock guided the Mountaineers back to the Northeast Conference Semifinals and doubled the team's win total from the previous season. Finishing 6-11 overall, the Mount posted a 5-2 NEC mark to tie for second place in the regular season standings.

Prior to taking over the Mount St. Mary's program, Skellchock gained experience through assistant coaching positions at Cincinnati, San Diego State and Stanford. The Sykesville, Md. native joined the coaching ranks following a standout career as a midfielder on the Johns Hopkins women's lacrosse team.

Skellchock graduated from Johns Hopkins in 2008 with a degree in public health studies and has completed coursework toward her master's degree in public health from the University of Cincinnati.
