SEC WEEKEND NO. 8 — The **Baseball Bulldogs** (18-26, 6-15 SEC) begin a season-longest eight-game road run and a 12-game May schedule with this weekend's three-game Southeastern Conference series at **Auburn** (24-22, 8-12 SEC). Game times at **Plainsman Park** are set for 6 p.m. CDT both Friday and Saturday and 2 p.m. Sunday. The radio broadcasts of all three games will be carried on the statewide **MSU Baseball Radio Network** and available online to subscribers of "Maroon to the Max", the premium extension of the official MSU athletics web site, www.MStateAthletics.com.

SOLID FINISH TO A TOUGH APRIL — After several close encounters over the first six weekends of league play, the Bulldogs registered their first SEC series win last weekend with a 2-1 showing against SEC East foe **Tennessee**. State needed 12 innings to best the Vols 4-3 in Friday's series-opener, dropped a 12-9 decision on a soggy Dudy Noble Field Saturday and then clinched the series with a 7-3 Sunday win in a game that was halted by weather in the bottom of the eighth inning.

In April the Diamond Dogs were 7-11, including a 4-4 mark at Dudy Noble Field and 4-8 SEC record. **MSU VS. AUBURN** — A three-game series sweep of the Tigers in last year's series at Dudy Noble Field extended State's all-time series lead over Auburn to 87-76-1 in a rivalry that spans 164 games and dates back to 1908. Auburn holds a solid 44-28 edge in games played at Auburn. The series has been contested at 12 different sites, including Hoover, Montgomery and Opelika in Alabama.

RON POLK VS. AUBURN — Mississippi State baseball coach **Ron Polk**, in his 29th and final season as MSU skipper, has compiled a 75-57 all-time coaching mark against Auburn. That record includes a 4-3 record during a two-year stint as head coach at Georgia. Polk-coached MSU teams have won 10 of 19 series and compiled a 25-29 record at Plainsman Park.

A CROWDED DL — Mississippi State has endured more than its share of injuries throughout the 2008 campaign and enters the weekend with three key performers on the disabled list. Sophomore second baseman **Brandon Turner**, the SEC's No. 2 hitter in 2007, continues to mend an injured hamstring that has limited him to just eight games (seven starts) in 2008. Also sidelined by a hamstring injury is sophomore third baseman **Connor Powers**, the team's home run and RBI leader and third-leading hitter at the time of his injury Apr. 13. Freshman outfielder **Ryan Collins**, the team's top hitter, sustained a season-ending arm injury in last Friday's series-opening win over Tennessee.

For the third straight weekend and the fourth time in eight weeks of league play, State will have all three of its regular starting rotation pitchers available. Senior **Justin Pigott** returned from a month's absence (shoulder) at Alabama (Apr. 20) while junior righty **Chad Crosswhite**, who missed his first three SEC starts (hip), is in his fourth weekend back in the rotation.

Also back after missing a month with a shoulder ailment is junior relief ace **Aaron Weatherford**, who has two wins, two saves with 31 strikeouts in nine post-injury appearances (15.2 IP).

ON DECK — MSU's eight-game road run continues with a pair of midweek matchups with **Middle Tennessee State** in Winchester, Tenn., (May 6-7) and next weekend with a three-game series at **LSU** (May 9-10).

MSU SKIPPER RON POLK — Ron Polk, who has piled up more wins than any coach in any sport in the history of the Southeastern Conference, is in his 29th season as head baseball coach at Mississippi State University. He announced March 27 that the 2008 season will be his last as MSU's head coach.

The MSU skipper began the 2008 campaign with a 1,116-55-2 overall and 410-303 SEC record in 28 seasons at State. He first joined the MSU coaching staff in 1976, guiding MSU to an 888-422 record, 15 NCAA regionals and five College World Series appearances before retiring from coaching following MSU's 1997 advancement to the CWS.

After two years in administration at State, he returned to coaching as head coach at Georgia, guiding the UGA Bulldogs to the 2001 SEC title and a berth in the CWS.

The Boston native returned to Starkville as head coach in 2002, and has guided State to NCAA tournament berths the last five seasons, including a return trip to the College World Series in 2007.

An inductee into four coaching halls of fame, Polk has in 34 seasons as a head coach compiled a 1,350-667-2 mark. He ranks fifth in wins among current NCAA Division I head coaches and seventh among the division's all-time leaders in wins. Twenty-three of his 34 teams at Georgia Southern, Georgia and Mississippi State have advanced to NCAA postseason play, with eight of those teams advancing to the CWS. He is one of only three coaches in college baseball history to direct three different programs to the College World Series.

Some 30 players and coaches associated with Polk entered the 2008 season as baseball head coaches on the collegiate or high school level, including six that will be coaching opposite Polk this season.

PRESEASON RANKING — Three national polls included Mississippi State in their preseason rankings. The USA TODAY/ESPN coaches poll ranked MSU as No. 23, the NCBWA writers poll placed State at No. 24 and Collegiate Baseball ranked State 27th in its preseason poll. A 1-2 showing at North Florida on opening weekend helped bounce MSU out of the rankings.

PRESEASON HONORS — Sophomore second baseman **Brandon Turner** (Cleveland, Tenn.) and junior relief pitcher **Aaron Weatherford** (Crystal Springs, Miss.) began the season on the receiving end of several impressive honors. Turner, who as a rookie compiled the SEC's second-highest batting average in 2007 (.399), was among 75 players named to the initial watch list for the prestigious **Golden Spikes Award**. In December Turner and Weatherford were named to the watch list for another national player of the year award, the **Brooks Wallace Award**.

The NCBWA named both Turner and Weatherford to its **second-team preseason All-America team** while **SEBaseball.com** tabbed accorded the duo first-team preseason All-SEC selections. **CollegeBaseballInsider.com** rated Turner as on the top three pure hitters in the SEC.

Weatherford, who tallied five saves and a 1.82 earned run average after a midseason move to the bullpen last spring, is on the initial watch list for the 2008 **Stopper of the Year Award** presented by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA).

A total of 11 players took the field for their first collegiate competition for State in the first week of the 2008 season, eight of them as starters. Making their Diamond Dog debuts were c-**Johnny Allen**, p-**Michael Busby**, ph-**Will Coggin**, of-**Ryan Collins**, c-**Cody Freeman**, of-**Grant Hogue**, 1b-**Forrest Moore**, c-**Tyler Moore**, dh-**Jason Nappi**, 2b-**Ryan Powers** and p-**Jared Wesson**.

TEAM CAPTAINS — For the first time in school history State has three team captains. Following fall practice, senior pitchers **John Lalor** of Germantown, Tenn., and **Justin Pigott** of Picayune, Miss., and junior hurler **Chad Crosswhite** of Brandon, Miss., were elected captains by their teammates last fall. Among other duties, a captain accompanies head coach **Ron Polk** to the home plate area prior to each game for the exchange of lineups and meeting with the umpires.

REUNION GAMES — In 2008, Mississippi State faces five teams whose head coaches once served on the coaching staff at MSU --- **Air Force** (Mike Hutcheon), **Baylor** (Steve Smith), **UAB** (Brian Shoop), **Kentucky** (John Cohen), **University of Memphis** (Daron Schoenrock) and **UAB** (Brian Shoop). A sixth opponent, Super Bulldog Weeked foe **Georgia**, is skippered by **David Perno**, who served on Polk's Georgia staff in 2000 and 2001.

CURRENT DOGS IN THE DRAFT — Three current members of the Mississippi State baseball team have been had their names called in past Major League Baseball drafts --- freshman pitcher **Forrest Moore**, junior first baseman **Tyler Moore** and senior outfielder **Andy Rice**. Tyler Moore, in fact, is a two-time draftee and was chosen by the same team, the **Washington Nationals**, in 2005 and 2006.

RADIO VOICE OF DIAMOND DOGS

JIM ELLIS IN 30TH SEASON — Veteran MSU sportscaster **Jim Ellis** is in his 30th season as the radio voice of Mississippi State baseball. The West Point, Miss., native and 1969 MSU grad began his affiliation with MSU baseball in 1979 and is largely responsible for the creation and growth of the **MSU Baseball Radio Network**, one of the nation's largest and oldest college baseball radio networks. The network, with nearly two dozen affiliates across the Magnolia State, features a 40-game broadcast schedule of weekend conference games and selected non-conference contests. The 40-game network schedule and the 16 non-network broadcasts are broadcast on **WFCA-FM**, the 100,000-watt flagship radio station for MSU athletics.

PAPELBON RETURNS FOR 2008 FIRST PITCH CELEBRATION — Former Mississippi State pitching standout **Jonathan Papelbon**, who helped pitch the **Boston Red Sox** to the championship of the 2007 World Series, was the featured speaker at the 11th annual "First Pitch/Meet the Team" baseball celebration Feb. 28 on the MSU campus.

Papelbon, from Jacksonville, Fla., pitched at Mississippi State from 2001 to 2003, registering nine wins, 13 saves and a 2.90 earned run average in 61 relief appearances. He led the MSU bullpen in saves both his sophomore and junior seasons before concluding his MSU career with 13 saves, seventh-most in school history.

He was drafted in the fourth round by Boston in the 2003 Major League draft and made a rapid ascent through the Red Sox system. He made his debut in Major League Baseball in July 2005. Papelbon recorded his first career save on the second day of the 2006 season and went on to register one of the most dominant seasons ever for a rookie reliever, tallying 35 saves (a Red Sox rookie season record) with an 0.92 ERA while holding opponents to a miniscule .167 batting average. For his efforts, he was named to the **2006 American League All-Star** team and finished second in the balloting for the AL Rookie of the Year award.

Papelbon's resume grew considerably in 2007 when he finished the season with 37 saves, becoming the youngest Boston hurler on record to post back-to-back 30-save seasons. For the second consecutive year he was named to the **American League All-Star** team and was honored as the 2007 recipient of the "DHL Presents the Major League Delivery Man of the Year Award". The hard-throwing righty was deadly in postseason competition. He did not allow a run in his seven postseason outings and converted all four of his save opportunities. The last two of those saves came against Colorado in the World Series, including a series-clinching Game 4 performance against the Rockies.

The event drew more than 500 fans to the Griffis Boardroom/Palmeiro Center.

Papelbon, who makes his off-season home in Hattiesburg, Miss., with his wife, Ashley, joined an impressive array of previous guest speakers for MSU's "First pitch" event. That group includes MSU standouts **Jeff Brantley**, **Will Clark**, **David "Boo" Ferriss**, **Alex Grammas**, **Burke Masters**, **Jay Powell**, **Nat Showalter**, **Bobby Thigpen** and **Dan Van Cleve**, best-selling author and MSU alumnus **John Grisham** and former Los Angeles Dodgers manager **Tommy Lasorda**.

NAPPI BREAKS SEC RBI RECORD — Redshirt freshman **Jason Nappi** made the most of his first game playing in his hometown as a Mississippi State Bulldog. In a Mar. 18 contest at UAB, Nappi belted a school-record tying three home runs and drew a pair of bases-loaded walks en route to an 11-RBI performance. That remarkable performance bettered the SEC single-game RBI mark of 10 RBI shared by eight players, including a pair of former Mississippi Staters --- **Rafael Palmeiro** (10 RBI vs. Jackson State in 1984 and **Bruce Castoria** vs. UNLV in 1981).

Nappi, who prepped at Birmingham's **Mountain Brook High School**, opened his RBI parade with a bases-loaded third-inning walk that helped State cut into a 6-0 UAB lead. Two innings later Nappi made an entry in the NCAA record book with a pair of home runs, a three-run blast that closed the UAB lead to 8-5. He stepped to the plate a second time in the inning, this time with the bases full, and smacked his second home run of the day to close out the 11-run, 16-batter frame for State. The seven RBI in an inning set an SEC record and tied an NCAA mark for the second-most RBI in an inning.

Nappi drew a bases-loaded walk to plate another run in the sixth and added his school record-tying third home run of the game in the seventh inning. Nappi, a starter in left field in the game though used primarily as the Bulldogs' DH, game within a few feet of a school-record fourth home run when his ninth inning fly ball to right was reeled in at the fence.

The Bulldog rookie joined six other MSU players with three-home run games: **Brad Jones** (vs. USM, 2004), **Tommy Raffo** vs. Delta State, 1990), **Dan Paradoa** (vs. Miss. College, 1986), **Rafael Palmeiro** (vs. Jackson State, 1984), **Del Bender** (vs. Birmingham-Sou., 1978) and **Del Unser** (vs. Mississippi, 1965).

The grand slam was Nappi's second and the team's fourth this year. His first career home run was a grand slam against the same UAB team Feb. 26 in State's 2008 home opener.

RECORD-MATCHING HOME RUN NIGHT — While **Jason Nappi** grabbed the headlines for his SEC record-setting RBI night at UAB's Young Memorial Field, the Bulldog team finished the night with an MSU record -matching six home runs. Sophomore third baseman **Connor Powers** played a big role in that mark, belting a pair of round trippers along with a double in a 3-for-5 performance. Powers, from Naperville, Ill., collected a career-high five RBI. It was Powers' second two-home run game. He belted a pair against Florida last March 17 in Gainesville, Fla.

State wrapped up its home run barrage in the eighth inning when junior first baseman **Jeff Flagg** of Jacksonville, Fla., went yard with a two-run blast, his first of the year and sixth of his career. It was the third hit of the year for Flagg, all three going for extra bases (double, triple and home run).

CATCHER CORPS — The MSU roster lists five catchers, and all five of those receivers have seen playing time in 2008, four of them as starters. MSU used a three-catcher rotation through much of the first month of the 2008 season --- freshman **Cody Freeman**, junior **Johnny Allen**, and sophomore **Ryan Duffy**. Freeman has drawn 17 starts, Duffy 19 and Allen six. Junior **Brooks Lewis** drew his first two career starts Apr. 15 (vs. UM) and Apr. 19 (at Alabama). Another junior catcher, **Scott DeLoach**, has also seen playing time behind the dish.

MSU faced just the opposite situation behind the plate in 2007 when **Edward Easley**, a 2007 sandwich round pick of the **Arizona Diamondbacks** and the recipient of last year's **Johnny Bench Award**, started all 60 games.

TICKET SALES UPDATE — MSU baseball fans have for the seventh consecutive season eclipsed the 5,000 mark in baseball season tickets. As of Mar. 30, the MSU Athletic Ticket Office had processed orders for 5,358 baseball season tickets, with sales continuing on into the season. It's the fourth-highest sales mark at MSU, 15 away from last year's mark. MSU averaged a school-record 6,939 in paid home attendance in 2007.

HITTING STREAKS — Junior outfielder **Grant Hogue** enters the Auburn series riding a team-best 12-game hitting streak, his second double-digit hitting streak of the season and the team's fourth in 2008. **Russ Sneed** opened the year with hits in 12 straight games and **Jason Nappi** pieced together hits in MSU's first 10 games. Hogue had an 11-gamer from Feb. 23 to Mar. 12.

Hogue has now hit safely in 34 games, with Sneed next at 33 and **Tyler Moore** right behind with 30

POWERS SHUFFLE — An injury to one Powers (Connor) has led to another Powers (Ryan) moving into the Bulldogs' starting lineup. Sophomore third baseman **Connor Powers** (.348) of Naperville, Ill., the team leader in home runs (11) and RBI (38), sustained a hamstring injury in the Apr. 13 series finale against **Vanderbilt**, and is expected to miss most of State's remaining 2008 games.

Sophomore **Russ Sneed**, State's season-long starting shortstop, has moved to third base to replace Powers. Sneed's shortstop position is being handled by redshirt freshman **Ryan Powers** of Beacon, N.Y. He had started six games at second base earlier this season before drawing his first career start at shortstop in State's Apr. 15 win against Mississippi. Since joining taking over the shortstop position Powers has hit at a .250 clip and has committed but two errors in 42 chances (.952) while assisting with eight double plays.

MOORE POWER — The Diamond Dogs' lineup also at times includes a pair of Moores.

Junior **Tyler Moore** (.286) of Brandon, Miss., the **2005 Mississippi High School (Northwest Rankin HS) Player of the Year** and the **2007 NJCAA (Meridian CC) Division II Player of the Year**, has started all 44 games at first base.

True freshman **Forrest Moore**, a left-handed pitcher from Baton Rouge, La., has taken the mound to join **Tyler Moore** in the MSU lineup 16 times this season. The son of former MSU kicking specialist **Dana Moore**, has thus far made 13 relief appearances and three starts. Moore picked up the win in his debut as a starter against **UAB** (Feb. 26).

WEATHERFORD BACK IN THE BULLPEN — MSU junior relief ace **Aaron Weatherford** (2-0, 4 saves, 0.00 ERA), sidelined by tendonitis for a month since earning his second save of '08 against **Air Force** (Mar. 1), is back and thriving in the MSU bullpen.

The hard-throwing righty fanned 10 of the 15 batters he faced in three relief appearances last week, picking up his second win of the season in Friday's 4-3 12-inning win over **Tennessee** and closing out State's series-clinching 7-3 Sunday win over the Vols.

His saves have come against **UAB** (Feb. 26), **Air Force** (Mar. 1), at **Kentucky** (Apr. 5) and at **Alabama** (Apr. 19), while he's earned wins against **Mississippi** in the Governor's Cup game (Apr. 15) and Friday against **Tennessee** (Apr. 25) at Dudy Noble Field.

The Fairhope (Ala.) HS standout has allowed one unearned run and five hits in 21.0 innings (12 appearances), striking out 44 of the 77 batters he has faced. He's limited those hitters to a remarkable .075 batting average.

In 44 career relief appearances (84.1 IP) -- which excludes his eight starts --- Weatherford has compiled a 7-1 record with 11 saves, (14 runs, 11 earned runs, 24 walks, 112 strikeouts) and a sterling 1.17 ERA (.164 opp. BA).

He is positioned to become a high draft pick in Major League Baseball's June draft.

Weatherford is 1-0 with a save and a 3.24 ERA in three career appearances against Auburn (12 hits, six strikeouts) --- (W, 5.1 IP April 15, 2006 at Auburn; Sv, 2.0 IP May 4-2007 at Starkville; ND, 1.0 IP May 6, 2007 at Starkville.)

HOGUE OFF AND RUNNING — Junior outfielder **Grant Hogue**, the Bulldogs' lead-off hitter in all 37 of his starts, continues to lead the SEC in stolen bases. The Hattiesburg, Miss., product has now pilfered 22 bases in 26 attempts, bettering **Jeffrey Rea's** team-leading 13 stolen bases from 2007. Hogue now ranks seventh among MSU's single season leaders in stolen bases, and his 22 pilfers stands as the most in a season by a Bulldog since **Jon Shave** swiped 24 sacks in 1990.

WANTED: CLUTCH HITS — Mississippi State has done a good job of getting runners on base but has come up short in getting them to home plate. The Bulldogs have stranded 392 base runners (8.9 per game) in 2008, 167 in April and 99 in their last nine games (38 at Alabama, 25 at USM and 23 vs. UT).

ALL ABOARD — Mississippi State got at least one runner on base in each of the 27 innings of the three-game series at Alabama Apr. 19-20. State had a runner on base in the last six innings of the **Apr. 15 Governor's Cup** game against **Mississippi** in Pearl, Miss., and in the first three innings of the series-opener Apr. 22 at Southern Miss, giving MSU a run of 36 consecutive innings with a runner on base.

Polk, in his 29th season as MSU skipper and his 35th as a collegiate head coach, has compiled a **1,368-693-2** career record at Georgia Southern, Georgia and Mississippi State (thru 40 games), and stands as the seventh winningest coach in NCAA Division I history.

VARIETY IN MSU'S STARTING LINEUPS — Thanks in part to the youthfulness of the 2008 MSU team and a host of injuries, State has used a variety of starting lineups (*pitchers not included*) in 2008. MSU has used **29 different starting lineup** in 44 games.

2008 MISSISSIPPI STATE BASEBALL NOTES — AUBURN SERIES (MAY 2-4)

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS — Both on the road and at Dudy Noble Field, Mississippi State head baseball coach **Ron Polk** will meet with the media in the press box immediately following his postgame radio show (about 15 or 20 minutes after the game).

The visiting media relations contact will coordinate postgame player and coach interviews with the visiting. Those most likely will take place on the field.

IN THE BIG INNING — Mississippi State turned in its top two innings with regard to run production in a 24-10 win at UAB Mar. 18. State trailed 8-2 in the contest before sending 16 batters to the plate and scoring 11 runs in the fifth inning against UAB. An inning later 11 more batters stepped to the plate in a seven-run burst. State tied a school record with six home runs in the game, a school-record matching three by **Jason Nappi**, who that night set the SEC RBI mark with 11.

Alabama took advantage of two big innings --- an eight-run burst and a six-run uprising to top the Bulldogs 21-7 in the opening game of the MSU-UA series Apr. 19 in Tuscaloosa. The Tide piled up 21 runs on 22 hits, the most runs and hits allowed by the Diamond Dogs in 2008.

MSU SECOND IN SEC WEST IN COACHES POLL — The SEC baseball coaches tabbed Mississippi State for a second place Western Division finish in the 17th annual preseason **SEC Baseball Coaches Poll**. Vanderbilt, the defending SEC Eastern Division and overall league champion, and Ole Miss were the coaches' picks to win their respective divisions. The Bulldogs, picked a year ago by the league coaches to finish sixth in the SEC West and at the bottom of the conference, took runner-up honors in the SEC West and went on to be the league's lone representative in the NCAA College World Series.

ALABAMA BULLDOGS — Mississippi State's 25-player travel roster for the Auburn series includes two players who are native Alabamians and list hometowns in Alabama ---- sophomore pitcher **Ricky Bowen** (Jasper - Sumiton Christian School) and sophomore outfielder **Jason Nappi** (Birmingham - Mountain Brook High School). Nappi and Auburn freshman right-hander **Chris O'Neil** attended the same high school.

Bulldog senior lefty **Andy Wilson** hails from Columbus, Ga. (Columbus High School), roughly an hour east of the Auburn campus. Auburn redshirt freshman pitcher Ty Kelley is a graduate of Columbus High School.

MSU VS. ALABAMA TEAMS IN 2008 — This weekend the Diamond Dogs make their third visit to neighboring Alabama and face their fourth Alabama-based opponent with the series at Auburn.

State swept two games from UAB (9-2 in Starkville and 24-10 in Birmingham), split one-run games at home against South Alabama (5-6 and 7-6), and claimed one of three games in an SEC weekend series at Alabama (7-21, 6-4 and 3-4). The Bulldogs are 4-3 in those games, 2-2 in Alabama.

Next year's MSU-Auburn baseball series is scheduled Apr. 3-5 at Dudy Noble Field.

WALKS IN THE PARKS — After ranking among the nation's leaders with a 2.8 walks-per-game average in a College World Series season in 2007, Mississippi State's pitching staff endured its struggles with walks this year. Diamond Dog hurlers have issued 216 walks through 44 games, an average of 4.9 per game. Twice MSU pitching has reached double digits in walks in a game --- 10 at Southern Miss (Apr. 22) and a school-record 17 against Baylor (Mar. 9). MSU pitchers have issued four or fewer walks in 25 of the 44 games.

Mississippi State's 1997 College World Series issued a school-record 268 walks.

RON POLK SALUTE MAY 17 — MSU skipper **Ron Polk**, who is stepping down as head coach following this, his 29th season as head baseball coach at State, will be honored by Mississippi State **Saturday, May 17** in ceremonies prior to MSU's regular season home finale against **Arkansas**. The 3 p.m. game will be regionally televised by **FOX Sports Net** as the SEC Game of the Week.

Nearly every team faced by Mississippi State since Polk's Mar. 27 retirement announcement has honored the MSU coach --- SEC opponents **Alabama**, **Georgia** and **Kentucky** and non-conference teams **Memphis** and **Southern Miss**. Auburn has scheduled a ceremony prior to Friday's series-opening at Plainsman Park.

UNLIKELY HERO — Freshman pitcher **Michael Busby** became the hero of the game in MSU's 4-3, 12-inning win last Friday against Tennessee. The Vicksburg, Miss., product made his first career appearance at shortstop as a late-game sub for starter **Ryan Powers**. He reached on an infield single in his first career at-bat and, with the bases loaded and the score tied in the 12th inning, delivered the game-winning hit in his second plate appearance.
