### MISSISSIPPI STATE ADVANCES TO HOST TCU IN SECOND ROUND OF INAUGURAL WBIT

- Mississippi State advances to host TCU in the second round of the inaugural Women's Basketball Invitation Tournament (WBIT) inside Humphrey Coliseum on Sunday at 2:00 p.m. CT, aired on ESPN+.
- Mississippi State is one of three teams from the SEC in the inaugural tournament and were joined by Florida and Arkansas - SEC was one of four conferences with three teams. The Bulldogs are only SEC team remaining after the first round. The SEC totaled 11 postseason bids this season, the fifth time 11 teams have made postseason play.
- Mississippi State makes its second overall postseason appearance in as many seasons under head coach Sam Purcell. Mississippi State played in the 2023 NCAA Tournament in the debut season under Purcell, where it became the first team in NCAA women's basketball history to advance to the Round of 32 after starting in the First Four round. It also marks the first back-to-back postseason appearances for Mississippi State since 2018 and 2019.
- It will be the first meeting between the two programs since Nov. 25, 2005, the first inside Humphrey Coliseum and only the third overall with the series tied at one.
- This will be a top-50 NET matchup per the final NET rankings between Mississippi State (47) and TCU (46).
- TCU will be the first Big 12 team that Mississippi State has faced this season and under Purcell.
- Purcell is the first head coach in school history to have consecutive 20-plus win seasons to start their career. He is one of 11 SEC head coaches all-time to notch 20 or more wins in each of their first two seasons and one of five since 2000. Purcell's 44 overall wins, 17 SEC wins and two NCAA Tournament wins also leads all head coaches in program history through their first two seasons.
- Mississippi State is 12-5 this season, 26-7 under Purcell and 474-215 all-time inside Humphrey Coliseum. With the 12 wins this season, the Bulldogs extended its streak of double-digit home wins to 12 of the last 13 seasons. Mississippi State is outscoring opponents 77.6-59.6 (+18.0) at home this season.
- Mississippi State earned its largest margin of victory in a non NCAA-tournament (NWIT/WNIT/WBIT) postseason event with the 37-point win over Georgia Tech on Thursday. All nine players scored and played 19-plus minutes. Freshman guard Jasmine Brown-Hagger finished with a career-high and team-high 17 points, in addition to five rebounds, four assists and two steals in 24 minutes. Behind Hagger's 17, Mississippi State outscored Georgia Tech 41-6 in bench points.

### MISSISSIPPI STATE IN POSTSEASON TOURNAMENTS

- It is the 20th overall postseason tournament appearance (12 NCAA Tournaments, 24-12, 8 NWIT/WNIT/WBIT, 8-8) for Mississippi State with an overall record of 32-20. Head coach Sam Purcell is the first coach in program history to lead their team to a postseason tournament in each of their first two seasons (2023 NCAA Tournament, 2024 WBIT).
- With a win on Sunday, Mississippi State would match its farthest run in a non-NCAA Tournament postseason event, which is the Quarterfinals of the 1987-1988 NWIT and 2000-01/2013-14 WNIT. Mississippi State made consecutive NCAA Championship appearances in 2017 and 2018.

### NUMBERS TO KNOW

20+

Head coach Sam Purcell is the only head coach in program history to record back-to-back 20-plus win seasons in their first two years. He has surpassed the most overall wins, most SEC wins and most NCAA tournament wins recorded by a head coach in their first two seasons at Mississippi State. He is also the only coach to play in a postseason tournament each of their first two seasons.

Graduate student center Jessika Carter will play her 150th game at Mississippi State when she takes the court on Sunday, which will break the program career record for most games played. She is currently tied with Teaira McCowan's 149 games played from 2015-19.

**JESSIKA CARTER - BEST POST IN THE COUNTRY**

• Graduate student center Jessika Carter was named to the Second Team All-SEC for the third time in her career and is posting a double-double average with 14.6 points and 10.0 rebounds in 31.6 minutes per game this season. She would be the first Bulldog to average a double-double and post a 10-plus rebound average since Teaira McCowan did both in 2018-19. Her 10.0 rebounds per game ranks fifth in the SEC, 31st nationally and is the seventh-best single season mark in program history.

• Carter has played 149 career games at Mississippi State and will set the program record - passing Teaira McCowan's 149 games played from 2015-19 - when she takes the court against TCU on Sunday.

• Carter was awarded the 2024 Gillom Trophy on March 11 - award to the best women's basketball player in the state of Mississippi - and is a three-time finalist for the award.

• Carter has led the team in blocks in 19 games, rebounds in 17 games, points in 10 games and minutes in nine games.

• Carter has 41 career double-doubles which ranks second among active SEC players and third in program history. The Bulldogs are 10-3 this season and 20-3 overall when she achieves the feat. Her 13 double-doubles this season eclipses her previous best total of 10 in 2022-23, and she is one of six SEC players with 10-plus this season.

• Carter has recorded five 20-plus points and 10-plus rebounds performances this season - four in SEC play - and 14 for her career; the Bulldogs are 13-1 in those games.

• Her career-high 42 minutes at Kentucky on Feb. 1 was the fourth time in her career that she has played 40-plus minutes and the second this season.

• Carter's 1,712 career points are sixth in program history, while her 1,104 rebounds and 235 blocks are each third. Her career rebounding total leads all active SEC players, blocks are second and points are fourth. With five more rebounds, she would surpass LaToya Thomas for second in program history.

• Carter became only the third player in program history this season - joining Teaira McCowan and Latoya Thomas - with 1,500 points and 1,000 rebounds for her career.

• She earned SEC Co-Player of the Week honors two times this season on Dec. 19 and Jan. 16. She was named one of USBWA Players of the Week on Dec. 19. She is one of four players in the SEC with multiple POTW honors this season.

• Carter posted a career-high 31 points on 14-19 from the field with 13 rebounds vs. Kennesaw State on Dec. 11. The 14 made field goals also marks a career high.

• She earned a spot on the 2024 Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 Watch List, Lisa Leslie Award Preseason Watch List, Preseason All-SEC First Team (coaches), Second Team (media).

**STATE AMONG WINNINGEST PROGRAMS IN DIVISION I SINCE START OF 2016-17**

• Since the start of the 2016-17 campaign, Mississippi State owns 200 wins, which is the 11th-most in Division I.

• In the stretch, State went to two national title games, three consecutive Elite Eights and won three SEC Championships.

• With 34 wins in 2016-17, the Bulldogs recorded a program-record 37 victories during the 2017-18 season. MSU followed that with 33 wins in 2018-19 and 27 in 2019-20.

**2 EASY FOR JERKAILA JORDAN**

• Senior guard Jerkaila Jordan announced that she was coming back for her fifth season of eligibility on Tuesday.

• Jordan was named to the 2024 Second Team All-SEC after posting career-best marks in rebounds, assists, and minutes with 5.9 rebounds and 2.4 assists in 30.6 minutes per game this season. She is also averaging team-high marks in points and steals with 15.7 points on 44.4 percent from the field and 2.1 steals per game.

• She leads the team in free throws made and attempted (90-114) on a career-best 78.9 percent from the free throw line.

• Jordan has scored 10-plus points in nine of her last 13 games and in 25 games this season.

• Jordan posted 12 points and 10 rebounds at Auburn on Feb. 29 for her seventh double-double of the season and 11th of her career. She entered the season with four double-doubles over three seasons.

• One of the defensive anchors of this team, Jordan is averaging 2.1 steals per game, which ranks fifth in the SEC. She has recorded three-plus steals in 12 overall games this season. Her 2.1 career steals average is the fifth-best mark in program history.

• Jordan has led the team in points in 15 games this season and 47 times for her career - 31 times at Mississippi State.

• Jordan remains the only Bulldog to start every game this season. She has started all 122 games of her career.

• She is rebounding incredibly well from the guard spot and is tied for second on the team with a career-best 5.9 rebounds per game. She has recorded five-plus rebounds in 19 games and has seven games of 10-plus rebounds this season.

• She was named SEC Co-Player of the Week on Jan. 30 after 24 points, five steals, four rebounds and two assists in 32 minutes in the win over No. 9/9 LSU on Jan. 29. She has had 20-plus points in nine games this season and four SEC contests.

**PARK-LANE MADE HISTORY ... AGAIN.**

• Graduate student guard Lauren Park-Lane broke the program single-season assist record of 202 set by Jazzmun Holmes in 2018-19 with her sixth assist vs. Georgia Tech in the WBIT First Round on March 21.

• Park-Lane also became one of five players - one of two active with Iowa's Caitlin Clark - in NCAA women's basketball history to amass 2,000 career points and 900 career assists vs. Georgia Tech.
