## **About MSUB**

Montana State University Billings is a comprehensive public four-year higher education institution located in Montana's largest population center, whose faculty is actively engaged in teaching, research, creative endeavors and public service. The University opened in 1927 and was initially called Eastern Montana State Normal School at Billings and was established to prepare teachers for elementary schools in Eastern Montana. MSU Billings has grown, with the city of Billings and Yellowstone County, into the major urban comprehensive higher education center of south central Montana. The University consists of five colleges on two campuses: the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Business, the College of Education, the College of Allied Health Professions and City College, which serves the comprehensive two-year mission of the University on a campus seven miles west of the University Campus. MSU Billings offers a full complement of one- and two-year certificate programs, associate degrees, and bachelor and master degrees, as well as pre-professional academic offerings in nearly 100 academic areas; and features 23 programs that are totally available online.

Several academic programs are unique to the Montana University System. MSU Billings Extended Campus also maintains a presence in Downtown Billings through outreach education to underserved populations, GED preparation, summer programs for children and short-term training/conference space.

MSU Billings is accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges & Universities. The MSU Billings College of Business is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business, whose standards are used as the basis to evaluate a business school's mission, operations, faculty qualifications and contributions, programs, and other critical areas. The MSU Billings College of Education is accredited by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education for preparing elementary and secondary teachers and school counselors through the Bachelor of Science and Master of Education degrees, and the Master of Science in Special Education degree. MSU Billings is also accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music, the National Association of Schools of Art and Design, the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education, and the Council on Rehabilitation Education. City College



programs are approved by the National Institute for Automotive Excellence and the Montana Board of Nursing.

Public service is integral to the mission of the University. Its two primary public service entities are KEMC/Yellowstone Public Radio and the Montana Center for Inclusive Education, a comprehensive education, rehabilitation, and diagnostic center serving Montanans with disabilities.

## **About MSUB Yellowjacket Athletics**

Home of the Yellowjackets, the Montana State University Billings department of intercollegiate athletics supports 17 men's and women's varsity sports throughout the fall, winter and spring seasons. More than 250 student-athletes compete on MSUB's teams, and members of Yellowjacket teams posted a collective 3.21 grade point average during the 2013-14 academic year.

MSUB-sponsored varsity sports include men's and women's teams in basketball, cheer/stunt, cross-country, golf, soccer, tennis, indoor and outdoor track & field, as well as baseball, softball, and women's volleyball.

Most recently, the MSUB women's basketball team made history by winning the 2013-14 Great Northwest Athletic Conference regular season title and advancing to the NCAA Division II west regional championship game. Senior All-American Bobbi Knudsen closed her career as the GNAC all-time leader in points (1,831) and assists (532) and finished No. 2 in the MSUB record books in each of those categories.

MSUB's 2013-14 women's basketball team joined the Yellowjackets' 1998-99 squad as the only two in program history to advance to the NCAA regional title game. The latter continued on to the Elite Eight, marking the furthest-advancing MSUB team in the school's history.

Senior baseball standout Brody Miller became the first All-American in team history a season ago, after garnering GNAC Player of the Year honors and batting .392 as a junior in 2014.

In 2012, the MSUB softball team won the GNAC regular season title with a 32-18 overall record and earned hosting privileges for the 2013 conference softball tournament.

The 2012 Yellowjacket men's basketball team also earned a conference title, defeating the University of Alaska Anchorage 74-70 in the GNAC tournament championship game.

Formerly known as Eastern Montana College, MSUB athletics stem back to the 1927-28 season, the year in which the university was founded. The Yellowjackets have competed in a number of different conferences throughout the years, and prior to the 1980-81 season the athletic department transitioned from the NAIA to competing at the NCAA Division II level.

The MSUB Hall of Fame and Distinction inducted its inaugural class in 1990 and serves as a tribute towards influential figures on and off the court, in both current and retired sports.

# Head Coach Wojtek Krakowiak 4th season | 30-17-7

Wojtek Krakowiak begins his fourth season at Montana State Billings and fourth as head coach of the Yellowjackets. Krakowiak carries an overall record of 30-17-7 during his three years at the helm of the program.



In 2013, the Yellowjackets narrowly missed the Great Northwest Athletic Conference Championships, finishing in fifth place in the regular season standings with a record of 6-8-2. Under Krakowiak's guidance, MSUB has won 12-consecutive National Soccer Coaches Association of America Team Academic Awards.

In 2012, he led MSU Billings to a 13-6-1 overall record and 8-5-1 GNAC record en route to an appearance in the inaugural GNAC Women's Soccer Championships. The Yellowjackets' 9-0 start was the second-best overall start and winning streak in the program's history.

In the Sept. 25 NSCAA/Continental Tire national poll MSUB climbed to a No. 23 national ranking and a No. 3 ranking in the west region. Leading the 'Jackets to an 8-1 record in September, Coach Krakowiak earned the GNAC Coach of the Month award.

For their efforts in 2012, the 'Jackets saw seven student-athletes selected to the all-GNAC team, four NSCAA/Continental Tire all-West Region selections and three Daktronics all-West Region selections.

MSUB also had a program-high 11 student-athletes selected to the 2012 GNAC all-academic list. Jennifer Larsen received 2012 CoSIDA Capital One Academic All-American first team honors, and Jaucelyn Richter received third team NSCAA Scholar All-American honors.

As the interim head coach in 2011 he led the team to an 11-3-4 overall record, 8-2-4 GNAC record and a second-place conference finish. Krakowiak's 2011 results mark the fewest losses and best winning percentage (.722) in the program's history. Six Yellowjackets received all-conference honors during that season.

As an assistant in 2010 Krakowiak helped the Jackets to a 13-6-1 overall record, 9-5 GNAC record, a tie for second in the final conference standings and their first NCAA tournament appearance. MSUB advanced to the second round of the regional tournament, falling to Seattle Pacific 2-0.

Prior to MSUB he served as the head coach at Division III Rutgers – Newark.

Krakowiak, a native of Poland, brings a tremendous amount of experience to the program as a player and a coach. As the head coach at Rutgers-Newark, Krakowiak went 15-20-3. Krakowiak guided the program to its only postseason berth in its brief 10-year history in 2008 when it participated in the ECAC Metro Championship tournament.

Prior to being named head coach for the Scarlet Raiders in November of 2007, Krakowiak was an assistant coach for one year with the men's and women's teams.

As a player, he played at St. John's University and Clemson University during his collegiate career. He was honored as the Soccer America Freshman of the Year at St. John's after helping the Red Storm to the 1996 NCAA Championship. At Clemson, Krakowiak was the 1998 Hermann Trophy recipient (equivalent to the Heisman Trophy) and the ACC Player of the Year, as he scored 31 goals and had eight assists leading Clemson to the NCAA quarterfinals.

After his collegiate career he was drafted 15th overall in the 1999 MLS College Draft by the San Jose Clash. In the 2000 MLS season he played 24 games and scored five goals for San Jose. In 2001 he was picked up by the Tampa Bay Mutiny, but injuries cut short his time there and his professional playing career came to an

Staying active in the local community, Krakowiak has been coaching with the Magic City Soccer Club the past three years and has won the U-14 girls' division 2010 Montana State Cup Championship. He also finished second with his U-16 girls' team in the 2010 Montana State Cup Championship.

Krakowiak, earned his Bachelor of Science in sports management from St. John's University in 2003, and he holds several USSF and NSCAA licenses, including his 'A' license in the USSF. Furthermore, he is fluent in both Polish and Russian.

Krakowiak is married to Maggie Krakowiak and the couple has twin girls, Addison and Emilia.





# Assistant Coach Stephen Cavallo 1st season

Stephen Cavallo comes to MSUB after one season as the assistant men's and women's soccer coach at Emory & Henry College. Before Emory, he spent time at Belmont Abbey College in Belmont, N.C., where he was the goalkeeper coach for the Crusaders' women's team during the spring of 2013.



Prior to his work at Belmont Abbey, Cavallo was the head varsity boys' soccer coach at Allegany High School in Cumberland, Md. In two years at Allegany, his teams posted an overall 21-7-3 record. In 2012, Cavallo led Allegany to an undefeated regular season – the first in school history. Allegany also set school records for wins (15), consecutive wins (11), longest unbeaten streak (16 matches), goals scored in a season (71), fewest goals allowed in a season (5), and shutouts (12). For his efforts, Cavallo was selected the 2012 Pepsi-Cola High School Soccer Coach of the Year.

Cavallo, a native of Charlotte, N.C., has also coached at the club level for Lake Norman Soccer Club and at the high school level as a varsity assistant girls' coach at East Lincoln High School, both in his home state. He was the men's goalkeeper coach at Frostburg State University during the spring of 2012.

Cavallo played for two seasons at Warren Wilson College before transferring to Frostburg State University to finish out his junior and senior years, where he was a two-year starter in goal.

A prep standout at East Lincoln High School in Denver, N.C., Cavallo was named to the all-region team his senior season. He also played for North Meck Soccer Club throughout his high school career.

Cavallo holds a bachelor's degree in geography from Frostburg State, which he completed in the summer of 2012.

### 2014 Season Preview

Returning a strong cast of starters on offense and defense, the Montana State Billings women's soccer team is poised for a return to the Great Northwest Athletic Conference Championships in 2014.

This season's squad features a combination of strong leadership, with the return of captains Chelsea Shuman, Katlyn Lokay, and Haley McFarlane. "We have faith in our captains being great leaders both on and off the field," said fourth-year head coach Wojtek Krakowiak. "With their experience in the GNAC Championships in the 2012 season, they will help us as a unit reach our goal of getting back to the NCAA tournament."

In 2013, Shuman totaled eight points with two goals and four assists in 13 starts as a junior. Shuman is a key contributor to the Yellowjackets' organization as an attacking center midfielder.

"Chelsea plays a big part in this program as she is a senior captain and she will definitely bring experience to the team," said Krakowiak. "She was part of the team in 2012 that was ranked No. 22 in the country and made it to the GNAC final. She's definite-

ly an impact player and can change the game. We are very excited for her senior year, and are looking for her to be a great leader and captain. Chelsea is very competitive on the field, and is also very serious about academics."



Lokay provides Krakowiak with another veteran player, who will be relied on to help coordinate MSUB's midfield and defense. Lokay started all 16 games as a sophomore in 2013, leading the team in minutes played with 1,486. She also scored a goal and contributed an assist, and all three of the shots she took were on frame.

"Katlyn is a very smart player who can play multiple positions," commented Krakowiak. "She's very versatile, a quick learner, and she reads the game very well. Katlyn will definitely lead by example, and she is also a great student. We are confident that she'll do an awesome job as a captain."

Missing the 2013 season due to injury, McFarlane is expected to respond strongly in 2014. As a freshman in 2012, she started 12 contests and logged 1,184 quality minutes as a defender for the 'Jackets.

"We are very happy that Haley will be back on the field and playing," said Krakowiak. "We missed her experience and skill last year. She is an anchor on the back line, she's very intelligent, and can definitely direct younger players. Haley will give

us versatility and confidence in the back."

While MSUB said goodbye to 2013 leading scorer Heidi Greenback, the 'Jackets welcome back a junior with a knack for finding the net in Alisa Sagdahl. As a sophomore in 2013, Sagdahl tallied three goals and a team-high five assists for the Yellowjackets, playing primarily as a forward. Sagdahl started 15 games and tallied more than 1,000 minutes, and led the squad in shots with 35 on the season.

"Alisa is a very dangerous player in the final third," said Krakowiak. "She is very skillful and reads and sees the game very well."

A pair of upperclassmen return along the back line for the Yellowjackets, with seniors Jessie Mancilla and Jennifer Johnson figuring to see extended minutes once again in 2014.

Johnson was a solid defender in 2013, starting 14 games and logging 1,326 minutes. She contributed an assist on the season, and will play a strong role as an outside back. Starting 13 games for the 'Jackets a season ago, Mancilla will look to be a major contributor again as a senior this season. She found the net for a game-winning goal in 2013, and also contributed an assist.

"Jenny and Jess are four-year seniors, and they definitely bring a lot of experience to the team," said Krakowiak. "They're very excited about their senior year and the chance to have a successful season."

Another returner on defense for the Yellowjackets is junior Teegan Koster, who started nine games and logged 907 minutes last season. Koster scored her first collegiate goal as a sophomore in 2013, while playing in 15 of the 16 contests.

"Teegan came in as a midfielder, and went through the transition into defense," Krakowiak commented. "She started some games at the end of the season and did a great job for us. Teegan adds experience and depth to the back line."

Three sophomores provide Krakowiak with young experience and strong depth within the midfield. Ashely Marra and Amanda Perri provide speed and strong technical ability, while Dana Lubieniecki is another reliable returner as an outside mid. Marra started 11 contests and played in all 16 as a freshman, while Perri contributed an assist in her debut collegiate campaign in 2013.

"We are looking forward to having this unit back as it has been through a season in the program," said



Krakowiak. "Dana and Ashely will give us a good work ethic and are dangerous in the final third on the outside. Amanda is a very creative, technical and skillful player who can connect a lot of passes, and she sees the field very well."

Backing up the midfield will be sophomore Brittney Greenback, who started 10 contests and logged 954 minutes a season ago. The younger sister of graduate Heidi Greenback, she figures to compete for major minutes in her second season in 2014. "Brittney is smart defender who's not afraid to tackle and is also good in the air," said Krakowiak. "She had a good freshman year, and she knows the competition and what the expectations are at this level."

Competing for minutes in goal will be returner Krystal Daniels and freshman Jordyn England. In six starts as a junior in 2013, Daniels recorded a goals-against average of 0.48 while making 16 saves.

"There will be a good competition for the starting goalkeeper spot with Krystal returning and Jordyn coming in." said Krakowiak. "Both of them are very athletic."

Returning to the program and bringing in veteran leadership will be a pair of seniors in Agen Heffernan and Sami Hansen. "Agen and Sami are both returning seniors who bring experience and a good attitude to the program," Krakowiak said. "Both are hard workers and bring a good work ethic."

Three transfers will all fit into the mix defensively, with Hali Henwood, Elizabeth Howard, and Kari Kastelic each set to begin their careers as Yellowjackets. Henwood is a senior transfer from Wayne State College (Neb.), who provides size and experience defensively.

Hailing from Bristol, England, Howard comes to MSUB from Arkansas State where she played in 18 of 20 contests as a sophomore in 2013. Rounding out the class of transfers, Kastelic follows former MSUB star and sister Kristen Kastelic in joining the MSUB squad.

Also among MSUB's newcomers is a class of four promising freshman, as Madi Barber, Jessica Spang and Elly Williamson join England in the class of 2018. "We have a versatile group of freshman who we are excited to see compete at the collegiate level," Krakowiak commented on this year's recruiting class. "They are offensively-minded and will add depth and creativity up front."

MSUB's 14-game GNAC slate begins on the road against Western Oregon on Sept. 18 and Saint Martin's on Sept. 20.

This season's GNAC Championships are set for Nov. 6-8 at Starfire Sports Complex in Tukwila, Wash. The top-4 teams from the conference regular season standings will advance to the championship tournament, with the winner earning an automatic berth into the NCAA West Regional Championships.

"We are very excited for the upcoming season, and we definitely want to get back to the conference tournament and push towards the NCAA tournament," said Krakowiak. "We have a solid preseason schedule that will prepare us well for the conference slate, and we have really good returners and new incoming players. As a coaching staff we have high expectations from each player, and are excited to get the season started."

After earning a spot in the inaugural GNAC championship tournament in 2012, Montana State Billings barely missed out on the 2013 championships after finishing the season in fifth place in the conference standings.

Senior Heidi Greenback led the charge offensively, netting seven goals and an assist in her final collegiate campaign. Greenback was named to the NSCAA All-West Region Second Team. Alisa Sagdahl was instrumental for MSUB this season, notching three goals and five assists, and Chelsea Shuman contributed a pair of goals and four assists as well.

Defensively, Jackie Hill anchored MSUB's back line along with Jennifer Johnson. Both started 14 contests for MSUB and fellow

defender Katlyn Lokay started all 16 games and led the team in minutes with 1,486. Goalkeepers Kaylee Kimmett and Krystal Daniels split duties between the posts, with the former recording three shutouts and the latter two. Daniels turned in a solid goals-against average of 0.48.

MSUB started the season strong, going undefeated and outscoring opponents 4-0 through its first four games of 2013. The Yellowjackets had difficulty establishing momentum during GNAC play, as they only won two straight games once all season. Thirdyear head coach Wojtek Krakowiak's record now sits at 30-17-7.




