About MSUB

Montana State University Billings is a comprehensive public four-year higher education institution located in Montana's largest population center, whose faculty is actively engaged in teaching, research, creative endeavors and public service. The University opened in 1927 and was initially called Eastern Montana State Normal School at Billings and was established to prepare teachers for elementary schools in Eastern Montana. MSU Billings has grown, with the city of Billings and Yellowstone County, into the major urban comprehensive higher education center of south central Montana. The University consists of five colleges on two campuses: the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Business, the College of Education, the College of Allied Health Professions and City College, which serves the comprehensive two-year mission of the University on a campus seven miles west of the University Campus. MSU Billings offers a full complement of one- and two-year certificate programs, associate degrees, and bachelor and master degrees, as well as pre-professional academic offerings in nearly 100 academic areas; and features 23 programs that are totally available online.

Several academic programs are unique to the Montana University System. MSU Billings Extended Campus also maintains a presence in Downtown Billings through outreach education to underserved populations, GED preparation, summer programs for children and short-term training/conference space.

MSU Billings is accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges & Universities. The MSU Billings College of Business is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business, whose standards are used as the basis to evaluate a business school's mission, operations, faculty qualifications and contributions, programs, and other critical areas. The MSU Billings College of Education is accredited by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education for preparing elementary and secondary teachers and school counselors through the Bachelor of Science and Master of Education degrees, and the Master of Science in Special Education degree. MSU Billings is also accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music, the National Association of Schools of Art and Design, the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education, and the Council on Rehabilitation Education. City College programs are approved by the National Institute for Automotive Excellence and the Montana Board of Nursing.



Public service is integral to the mission of the University. Its two primary public service entities are KEMC/Yellowstone Public Radio and the Montana Center for Inclusive Education, a comprehensive education, rehabilitation, and diagnostic center serving Montanans with disabilities.

About MSUB Yellowjacket Athletics

Home of the Yellowjackets, the Montana State University Billings department of intercollegiate athletics supports 17 men's and women's varsity sports throughout the fall, winter and spring seasons. More than 250 student-athletes compete on MSUB's teams, and members of Yellowjacket teams posted a collective 3.21 grade point average during the 2013-14 academic year.

MSUB-sponsored varsity sports include men's and women's teams in basketball, cheer/stunt, cross-country, golf, soccer, tennis, indoor and outdoor track & field, as well as baseball, softball, and women's volleyball.

Most recently, the MSUB women's basketball team made history by winning the 2013-14 Great Northwest Athletic Conference regular season title and advancing to the NCAA Division II west regional championship game. Senior All-American Bobbi Knudsen closed her career as the GNAC all-time leader in points (1,831) and assists (532) and finished No. 2 in the MSUB record books in each of those categories.

MSUB's 2013-14 women's basketball team joined the Yellowjackets' 1998-99 squad as the only two in program history to advance to the NCAA regional title game. The latter continued on to the Elite Eight, marking the furthest-advancing MSUB team in the school's history.

Senior baseball standout Brody Miller became the first All-American in team history a season ago, after garnering GNAC Player of the Year honors and batting .392 as a junior in 2014.

In 2012, the MSUB softball team won the GNAC regular season title with a 32-18 overall record and earned hosting privileges for the 2013 conference softball tournament.

The 2012 Yellowjacket men's basketball team also earned a conference title, defeating the University of Alaska Anchorage 74-70 in the GNAC tournament championship game.

Formerly known as Eastern Montana College, MSUB athletics stem back to the 1927-28 season, the year in which the university was founded. The Yellowjackets have competed in a number of different conferences throughout the years, and prior to the 1980-81 season the athletic department transitioned from the NAIA to competing at the NCAA Division II level.

The MSUB Hall of Fame and Distinction inducted its inaugural class in 1990 and serves as a tribute towards influential figures on and off the court, in both current and retired sports.

Part of our mission as a department is to strive for the continual growth, improvement, and development of our student-athletes as individuals. I am proud of the citizens that our student-athletes develop into during their time as Yellowjackets, and am once again thrilled to witness their extraordinary contributions to our teams and the Billings community again this year.

Here's to another outstanding year of MSUB athletics, and I am looking forward to seeing you on our campus throughout the 2014-15 academic year.

Head Coach Alex Balog

4th season - 2nd as head coach

Alex Balog is in his fourth year with the MSUB men's soccer program and second year as head coach.



In 2013, Balog's Yellowjackets received the Team Academic Award from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America.

In 2012, Balog led the Yellowjackets to an 11-5-2 overall record and a fourth place GNAC finish.

Prior to his time at MSUB, Balog was at NAIA soccer powerhouse Auburn University Montgomery (AUM) in Montgomery, Ala., where he was an assistant coach to Wulf Koch for two seasons (2009-10).

While in Alabama, Balog also coached for the Olympic Development Program and was the Director of Goalkeeping for the FC Torjager club based in Montgomery. He was also a head coach at Lamp High School where his team went 17-3, and was involved in numerous camps throughout the country.

Prior to his time at AUM, Balog played and coached at Christian Brothers University in Memphis, Tenn. He played two seasons for the Buccaneers and then worked with the women's program for one season as the goalkeeper coach.

Balog has played soccer in Belgium, Hungary, Greece and England.

In the summers of 2012 and 2013, Balog was an assistant coach for the Colorado Rapids Women. The W-League team finished both seasons ranked 4th in their conference and the Super 20's won the National Championship in 2012.

Being part of the local community is also important for Balog. He is active with the Magic City Soccer Club in numerous capacities. In 2012 he helped coach the U-16 Boys to a Montana state championship. Balog is also the Director of Goalkeeping for the club.

He holds a BA in social sciences from HIRL in Belgium and has completed two Master's degrees. He holds a Master of Education from Christian Brothers University and a Master of International Relations from Auburn University Montgomery.

Balog holds several NSCAA and USSF coaching licenses.





Assistant Coach Conner Moe

2nd season, 1st as assistant

Former Montana State Billings men's soccer standout Conner Moe joins the Yellowjackets as an assistant coach for the 2014 season after serving as a volunteer assistant in 2013.

Moe, a former first-team all-Great Northwest Athletic Conference soccer player in the Yellowjackets' program, is set to join the staff in a full-time role.



Prior to his time as a volunteer assistant, Moe was a 3-year captain for the Yellowjackets, and was a 3-time all-GNAC selection. Moe also earned Dean's List honors two times during his career, and he started 53 of 54 games during his tenure.

A native of Snohomish, Wash., Moe attended Bellevue College for one season prior to his career at MSUB. Moe helped the Bulldogs to the NWAACC title during his one season at BC.

Moe was a two-sport athlete at Snohomish High School, where he participated in soccer for four years and football for one. Moe's roots as a captain trace back to his high school career, as he was a team captain for the Panthers as well as a first-team all-WESCO North selection.

A 2014 graduate of MSUB, Moe earned his bachelor's degree in history with a teaching licensure option.



Graduate Assistant Thomas Chameraud

2nd season, 1st as graduate assistant

Thomas Chameraud begins his first year as the graduate assistant for the men's soccer program after serving as the assistant coach in 2013. Chameraud, who is an MSUB graduate and men's soccer alumnus, will begin pursuit of a master's degree in public relations.

Chameraud earned a bachelor's degree in liberal studies from MSUB, after completing a bachelor's in sports commerce in France.

During his senior year as a Yellowjacket, he recorded one of the best individual seasons in the program's history. His 11 assists and 21 total points rank first and eighth in their single season respective categories. Chameraud finished his career with 18 career assists, which ranks No. 2 all-time in MSUB men's soccer history. In 2012 he earned first team all-GNAC and Daktronics all-West Region honors, second team NSCAA all-West Region honors, and all-academic GNAC honors.

In 2011 Chameraud started all 18 contests and recorded seven points on seven assists, which tied for fourth in the GNAC. He earned second team all-GNAC honors and Player of the Week honors for the week of Oct. 31- Nov. 6 with a game-winning assist against Rocky Mountain College.

Prior to MSU Billings at ESC Chambéry-Savoie, Chameraud helped his high school team to the 2006 French high school championship. He also earned two CFA2 Championships in 2007 and 2009.

Chameraud also holds a NSCAA Advanced Regional Coaching Diploma, and an USSF E License.



Volunteer Assistant Tyler Moriarty 2nd season

Tyler Moriarty returns to the MSUB coaching staff for his second season as a volunteer assistant in 2014. He majored in health and human performance at MSUB, and since graduating, Tyler has become a personal trainer.



In his playing time as a Yellowjacket, he appeared in 30 games while starting 16 as a junior...finished tied for fourth on the team in goals with three...tallied seven points which was good for sixth on the team...fired 10 shots with four on goal and recorded one game winner...recorded 1,131 minutes...tallied the lone goal in a 1-0 victory at Saint Martin's (Sept. 26)...one of a league-best seven Yellowjackets named to the GNAC academic all-conference team...one of eight 'Jackets named to the all-conference team as he received honorable mention honors.

As a sophomore...tallied his first goal as a Yellowjacket in a 4-2 win at Seattle Pacific (Nov. 6) in his lone start of the year...tallied four shots with three on goal.

A native of Bozeman, Mont., Moriarty previously attended Whitworth College, after graduating from Bozeman Senior High School.

2014 Season Preview



With a strong core of seniors and a reloaded cast of new faces by his side, head coach Alex Balog and the Montana State University Billings men's soccer team are poised for a turnaround season in 2014.

The Yellowjackets welcome back seven starters from last season's squad, and a group of 16 newcomers figures to provide fresh energy for the program.

"We are very excited about the upcoming season," said Balog. "We believe with a strong group of returners and the new group of student-athletes we have brought in that all the ingredients are there to have a successful 2014 season."

Among MSUB's returners are seniors Kyle Emerick and

Matt Brink, a formidable duo that provides the squad with leadership on offense and defense. As an attacking midfielder last season, Emerick contributed a pair of goals and three assists while seeing action in all 18 games. Helping anchor the back line, Brink tallied more than 1,200 minutes and contributed to the Yellowjackets' five shutouts.

"To have these two local guys be the leaders of the team is great to see, especially because they have been with the program through thick and thin since their freshman seasons," Balog commented. "Both Kyle and Matt will bring a wealth of experience and passion to the team in their senior year. They both want to go out on a high note and know what it means to fight for the school and for the program."

Along with the leadership of Emerick and Brink, MSUB also welcomes back its top goal scorer from 2013 in Thorje Jess. Jess found the net a team-high five times as a freshman, and also contributed an assist for 11 total points. A native of Kiel, Germany, Jess's ability to get on the end of an attack makes him one of the top weapons in Balog's arsenal.

"Thorje had a bumpy first year because of a recurring ankle injury," Balog said, adding, "nevertheless, he was a major threat for us up top, and I expect him to be exactly that this year. Thorje has a nose for goals and a natural feel to get himself into the right spot."

Defensively, MSUB returns three more solid players with size and technical ability across the back line. The experience of Sam Butterworth, Cameron Lee, and Thomas Saltwell gives each a leg up towards joining



Brink on defense. Lee has turned in two solid collegiate campaigns thus far, proving his durability by starting 35 of 36 games in his first two seasons. A year ago, the South African contributed his first career assist and played 1,607 minutes.

"Cameron will again be one of our captains on the team, although he is not the type of player who needs an arm band to lead by example," Balog commented with a nod towards Lee's natural leadership. "Cameron truly is the dream of every coach as he is their extension on and off the field."

Bursting onto the scene for MSUB was Saltwell, whose 6' 3" presence along the defensive line will be a fixture for the remainder of his career. As a freshman in 2013, he notched an assist and was a regular starter when healthy.

Occupying another defensive spot last season was Butterworth, who served as somewhat of a hybrid within his ability to drive forward and provide offensive support. His two goals and single assist out of the back last year suggest he will continue to provide an extra offensive boost for the Yellowjackets this season.

“Sam has gone through a tremendous growth both on and off the field since the start of his freshman year,” said Balog. “He is one of those student-athletes that a coach takes a lot of pride in when looking at his development as a person, as a student, and as an athlete. Sam is quite the character, and very much liked by his teammates. I very much look forward to seeing what Sam will be able to bring to the team this fall.”

Also scoring two goals a season ago was Jesper Fries, who returns to MSUB’s midfield for his sophomore campaign. Fries started 11 contests and played in all 18, filling roles as a center mid and late-game offensive addition.

Other returners for the Yellowjackets include seniors Grady Bryson and Cameron Stanek, junior Garret Robinson, and sophomore Daragh Kavanagh. Bryson saw action in a dozen games during his junior campaign, and figures to factor into the midfield equation during his final collegiate season.

Stanek is one of three ‘Jackets competing for the starting goalkeeper job this season, and Robinson will look to build off of his 786 minutes of experience as a regular contributor in 2013. Joining Kavanagh in the midfield will be Ecuadorian redshirt junior Andres Moreano-Enriquez, who previously attended the University of Texas-Permian Basin.

“With 16 newcomers, there will be plenty of competition for playing time,” Balog commented. “Several members of this group are expected to have an immediate impact and contribute to the projected turnaround.”

Competing with Stanek for the task of manning the pipes will be Tom Lohmann and Joe Scott. Lohmann is a sophomore from Berlin, Germany who previously attended Nyack College. A native of Edwall, Wash., Scott is a transfer from fellow Great Northwest Athletic Conference school Concordia University.

The Yellowjackets, which were picked to finish fifth in the GNAC preseason coaches’ poll, open with an exhibition game against Carroll College on August 24 at 2 p.m. on the Yellowjacket Soccer Field. MSUB will be tested on the road in early September against Upper Iowa and the University of Illinois-Springfield, before returning home to host the MSUB Rimrock Classic sponsored by TNT Automotive & Marine.

MSUB kicks off its 14-game GNAC schedule on the road against Northwest Nazarene on Sept. 20 in Nampa, Idaho.

“Our student-athletes and coaching staff have worked very hard in the off-season to be ready for the 2014 campaign,” Balog said. “At this point, I feel we are ready. The first couple of games, just like last season, will show us where we are and which direction this team will go. I am very excited to see the diligent work that we’ve put in during the spring, the off-season and during preseason pay off.”

2013 Season Review

Record: 3-10-5, 3-7-4 GNAC – 6th

The 2013 season featured numerous close matches, hinting that MSUB is on the cusp of breaking through and becoming one of the top teams in the Great Northwest Athletic Conference.

Four of MSU Billings' first six matches of 2013 were decided in overtime, as the Yellowjackets became regulars in matches extending past 90 minutes. MSUB lost by more than one goal only once during its first eight matches of the season. The Yellowjackets proved they could remain competitive, but struggled finding clutch goals to close out games. Overall on the season 12 of MSUB's games were decided by one goal or less, with two of its victories coming by two goals or more.

MSUB's best string of the season came in October, when it won three out of four matches and drew the other for a four-game unbeaten streak. The 0-0 double overtime draw against Northwest Nazarene marked the first time in 2013 that GNAC scoring leader Fredy Razo had been held scoreless, as the Yellowjackets' back line shut down the dangerous striker.

Thorge Jess topped the Yellowjackets offensively last year, turning in five goals and an assist to give him 11 points on the season. Haley Klarich earned GNAC Player of the Week honorable mention after a two-goal performance, and contributed four goals total in his first collegiate campaign. Defensively, Michael



Aringer and Cameron Lee were MSUB's rocks, with Aringer being the only field player to start all 18 games. The junior from Germany also turned in a goal and a pair of assists, and earned GNAC Defensive Player of the Week honors.



Kyle Emerick served as an anchor for MSUB in the midfield, and Matt Brink was a key part of the Yellowjackets' back line that consistently kept the team close in games.

Head coach Alex Balog produced a competitive squad in his first collegiate season as a head coach, and will look to build off the mindset of staying close throughout games. MSUB lost just a pair of seniors to graduation, and the experience the team's younger players gained in 2013 should prove to be invaluable for the 2014 campaign.
