About MSUB

Montana State University Billings is a comprehensive public four-year higher education institution located in Montana's largest population center, whose faculty is actively engaged in teaching, research, creative endeavors and public service. The University opened in 1927 and was initially called Eastern Montana State Normal School at Billings and was established to prepare teachers for elementary schools in Eastern Montana. MSU Billings has grown, with the city of Billings and Yellowstone County, into the major urban comprehensive higher education center of south central Montana. The University consists of five colleges on two campuses: the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Business, the College of Education, the College of Allied Health Professions and City College, which serves the comprehensive two-year mission of the University on a campus seven miles west of the University Campus. MSU Billings offers a full complement of one- and two-year certificate programs, associate degrees, and bachelor and master degrees, as well as pre-professional academic offerings in nearly 100 academic areas; and features 23 programs that are totally available online.

Several academic programs are unique to the Montana University System. MSU Billings Extended Campus also maintains a presence in Downtown Billings through outreach education to underserved populations, GED preparation, summer programs for children and short-term training/conference space.

MSU Billings is accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges & Universities. The MSU Billings College of Business is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business, whose standards are used as the basis to evaluate a business school's mission, operations, faculty qualifications and contributions, programs, and other critical areas. The MSU Billings College of Education is accredited by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education for preparing elementary and secondary teachers and school counselors through the Bachelor of Science and Master of Education degrees, and the Master of Science in Special Education degree. MSU Billings is also accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music, the National Association of Schools of Art and Design, the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education, and the Council on Rehabilitation Education. City College programs are approved by the National Institute for Automotive Excellence and the Montana Board of Nursing.



Public service is integral to the mission of the University. Its two primary public service entities are KEMC/Yellowstone Public Radio and the Montana Center for Inclusive Education, a comprehensive education, rehabilitation, and diagnostic center serving Montanans with disabilities.

About MSUB Yellowjacket Athletics

Home of the Yellowjackets, the Montana State University Billings department of intercollegiate athletics supports 17 men's and women's varsity sports throughout the fall, winter and spring seasons. More than 250 student-athletes compete on MSUB's teams, and members of Yellowjacket teams posted a collective 3.21 grade point average during the 2013-14 academic year.

MSUB-sponsored varsity sports include men's and women's teams in basketball, cheer/stunt, cross-country, golf, soccer, tennis, indoor and outdoor track & field, as well as baseball, softball, and women's volleyball.

Most recently, the MSUB women's basketball team made history by winning the 2013-14 Great Northwest Athletic Conference regular season title and advancing to the NCAA Division II west regional championship game. Senior All-American Bobbi Knudsen closed her career as the GNAC all-time leader in points (1,831) and assists (532) and finished No. 2 in the MSUB record books in each of those categories.

MSUB's 2013-14 women's basketball team joined the Yellowjackets' 1998-99 squad as the only two in program history to advance to the NCAA regional title game. The latter continued on to the Elite Eight, marking the furthest-advancing MSUB team in the school's history.

Senior baseball standout Brody Miller became the first All-American in team history a season ago, after garnering GNAC Player of the Year honors and batting .392 as a junior in 2014.

In 2012, the MSUB softball team won the GNAC regular season title with a 32-18 overall record and earned hosting privileges for the 2013 conference softball tournament.

The 2012 Yellowjacket men's basketball team also earned a conference title, defeating the University of Alaska Anchorage 74-70 in the GNAC tournament championship game.

Formerly known as Eastern Montana College, MSUB athletics stem back to the 1927-28 season, the year in which the university was founded. The Yellowjackets have competed in a number of different conferences throughout the years, and prior to the 1980-81 season the athletic department transitioned from the NAIA to competing at the NCAA Division II level.

The MSUB Hall of Fame and Distinction inducted its inaugural class in 1990 and serves as a tribute towards influential figures on and off the court, in both current and retired sports.

Head Coach Lisa Axel

3rd Season

Lisa Axel returns for her third year as the head volleyball coach at Montana State University Billings. In her first two seasons as a collegiate head coach, she has guided the Yellowjackets to



an 18-35 record. Last season, Axel and MSU Billings finished eighth in the Great Northwest Athletic Conference.

During her tenure as a head coach, the Yellowjackets have had eight student-athletes honored as all-GNAC Academic selections and two student-athletes have been named as all-GNAC first team members.

In 2012, Axel was named the 13th head volleyball coach at MSUB. Axel came to MSUB after spending six seasons as the top assistant at Metro State where she led the Roadrunners to six NCAA Division II tournament appearances, including six NCAA tournament wins.

During her tenure, she served as the team's recruiting coordinator and also oversaw student-athlete academics. In 2010 Axel was a recipient of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) Thirty Under 30 Award. The Roadrunners were 130-57 (.695) during her six seasons at Metro State.

Prior to her time at Metro State, Axel spent two seasons as the first assistant coach at Division I North Dakota State University and also served as the interim head coach of the Bison from January-May of 2006. As the first assistant, she served as the recruiting coordinator, coordinated the scouting of opponents, and planned travel arrangements.

A native of Buffalo, Minn., Axel was a four-year starter the University of Minnesota, where she led the Golden Gophers to the school's first and only Big Ten championship in 2002, her senior year. She participated in four NCAA Division I tournaments which included making three Sweet 16 appearances.

She received her Bachelor of Science degree from Minnesota in biology and was a three-time academic all-Big Ten selection (2000-02). She was also an Intercollegiate Athletic Scholar all four years of her collegiate career.

In high school, Axel was named Ms. Minnesota Volleyball in 1998 and was named the Gatorade Circle of Champions Minnesota High School Volleyball Player of the Year that same year. She was a three-time all-state selection (1996-98), a five-time all-conference selection (1994-98) and was a two-time conference player of the year her junior and senior seasons (1997-98).





Assistant Coach Jodi Alexander

1st season

Jodi Alexander comes to MSUB as a local former standout athlete with a wealth of coaching experience.



She was a 1994 graduate of Billings West High School where she played volleyball for the Golden Bears. She was a first team all-conference middle blocker and a second team all-state middle blocker.

After graduation, Alexander was recruited to play at Montana State University where she redshirted for a year before transferring to the University of Montana Western. At Western, Alexander played from 1995-1998. Her freshman year she was named the Player of Week in the NAIA and finished as the Outstanding Front Row in the NAIA with 162 kills and 91 blocks.

Alexander then headed to MSUB to finish out her degree, graduating with a Bachelor of Science in business in 1999.

In 1995, while at Western, Alexander started her coaching career at the junior high level in Dillon, Mont.

In 2009, she re-entered the coaching sphere by becoming the head coach at Joliet High School. In her two years with the J-Hawks, Alexander increased Joliet's winning percentage from .412 to .833. She led the team to its first state appearances in 21 years and its first back-to-back state appearances in school history. Under Alexander's direction, the 2010 volleyball team also became the first in the school's history to take the championship trophy for both district and divisional tournaments.

In 2011, Alexander became the assistant coach at Billings Senior High School and in 2012 took over partway through the season to become the head coach at Red Lodge High School. She has also been active at the club level. In 1998 and 2011 she coached the Juniors Club and in 2013 the Central Spikers.

"Volleyball and family is my shared passion," Alexander said. "Joining coach Lisa Axel is a fabulous opportunity. I am extremely excited to work and learn from her this fall season. I believe we complement each other well, and I know Lisa will encourage me to improve upon myself daily. I am extremely excited to work with the athletes she has meticulously recruited and the level of play they bring to the game will be exciting."

Alexander is married to Curtis Alexander and they have two children, Keevyn (12) and Kaiden (11).



Head Coach Lisa Axel is looking forward to a very competitive season; 2014's squad will be a team that gained valuable experience last year, and be punctuated by the return of four seasoned veterans.

The 35th season of official play for MSUB will open with a home tournament that runs two days: Friday Sept. 5 through Saturday Sept. 6. Before that, the Yellowjackets will head to the Fortin Center to play Rocky Mountain College in an exhibition match.

Last season, MSU Billings finished eighth in the conference with a 7-20 overall record, 4-14 in the Great Northwest Athletic Conference, and this year the team begins the season ranked eighth

overall in the conference preseason coaches' poll. This season in the GNAC, almost every team in the conference will return most of their key players. Western Washington University, who won the conference title last year, is ranked first in the preseason coaches' poll released on Tuesday.

The 2014 volleyball season at Montana State University Billings will begin with an exhibition match at cross-town rival Rocky Mountain College on Tuesday, Sept. 2 at 7 p.m.

"I am very excited to be heading into my third season," head coach Lisa Axel said. "We have a great returning lineup from last fall and with the addition of our four freshmen we have the most competitive gym since I have been at MSUB. We have a lot of depth at each position which pushes everyone to become better. I see us getting better and better as the season progresses."

The Yellowjackets return four upperclassmen to their 2014 roster. Monica Grimsrud returns to the squad the lone all-conference player. Grimsrud was a first-team selection last season and led the team in kills (359) and points (405). Playing in 96 sets last season, Grimsrud was ranked No. 2 in the conference in kills and No. 5 in points. In the MSU Billings record books, Grimsrud is currently ranked No. 6 in career kills with 1,079.

Chelsey Walter, a middle hitter and another returning senior, was ranked No. 7 in the conference in hitting percentage with .275. Walter was second on the team in kills last season (268) and led the team in total blocks with 80. She is the only returning player that was ranked last season in the conference in blocks at No. 16 (.82 avg/set).

Junior Kyndal Williams returns to the 'Jackets squad as the team leader in assists last season (993). Williams was ranked No. 4 in the GNAC for 2013 in assists with 10.24/set. As a junior Williams is already ranked No. 3 all-time in assists at MSUB with 1,954. Last season she entered the top-10 in assists in a single game with 65.



Rounding out the upperclassman, senior Krista Norris will be a solid presence on the court with her experience and versatility.

Last season Norris appeared in 23 of the team's 27 matches. She had career highs of 14 kills against Seattle Pacific and 18 digs against Rocky Mountain College.

"Our upperclassmen have really set the standard this season to make our year successful," Coach Axel said about her returning players. "They have done an outstanding job of raising the bar and making our gym competitive each and every practice."



All five of Axel's sophomores from last season's team saw playing time in their inaugural season. Returning for their second season Ashlynn Ward, Stormy Siemion, Julia Anderson, Kierney Findon, and Kimmy Kirk all hope to continue their progress as they get set for a competitive year.

"Our sophomore class gained valuable experience last season," Axel said. "Their confidence grew throughout the fall and are a big reason we had such a successful spring season."

An outside hitter, Ward returns to the team having started nine matches last season. She was third on the team in total kills (196) and No. 22 in the GNAC in kills per set with 2.33. Ward had a career high 18 kills last season against Central Washington. Siemion started 23 matches and played in all 27 contests for MSUB. She set career highs with 22 kills and 36 digs last season. Siemion had a streak of six double-doubles and as a freshman finished the season ranked No. 16 in the GNAC in digs per set and No. 27 in kills per set.

Anderson played in 14 matches as a freshman. As a middle blocker Anderson averaged almost a block a set. She had a career high of six blocks against Rocky Mountain College.

Last season both Findon and Kirk played an important role in the back court. Findon played in 19 matches her inaugural season with a total of 98 digs. She ended the season ranked No. 15 in service aces in the GNAC with 12 in 49 sets. Kirk played in 25 of 27 matches. She recorded 159 digs and 22 assists on the year.

Added to the roster this year are four talented newcomers, all who could see playing time on the court.

"Our four freshmen have the opportunity to make an immediate impact on our team," Axel commented on the team's incoming class. "They have all come from very successful programs and have played at a high level. All four will transition nicely to the collegiate level."

Mataia Roderick comes to MSU Billings from the same high school as Ashlynn Ward. The addition of Roderick and Haley Wells will provide depth and presence in the libero and setter positions. In the setter position, Roderick led her high school team to a state runner-up championship and Wells led her high school team to back-to-back state championships. Both players have also seen time as the libero on their respective club teams.

Andrea Bowers joins the Yellowjackets as the third member on the MSUB team from Billings Senior High School. Bowers joins Walter and Findon who were also products of Jeff Carroll's Broncs program. Bowers is an outside hitter who could have an impact anywhere on the front row. Alaina Gentili will provide depth as a middle hitter and blocker. With Bowers, Gentili will also be able to provide coverage to the front line.

The 2014 volleyball team will follow up its opening exhibition game against Rocky with the first MSUB-hosted home tournament since 2009. The Sept. 5-6 tournament will feature five teams including MSUB. Traveling to the tournament will be Black Hills State University, Minot State University, Chadron State College, and the University of Mary. All teams will play once against each other. The tournament kicks off the start of official competition Saturday, Sept. 5 at 9 a.m. in Alterowitz Gymnasium.

The second weekend in September the team will travel to a GNAC/PacWest crossover tournament hosted by Dominican University (CA). The Yellowjackets will get a chance to play four in-region PacWest opponents: host-school Dominican, Chaminade University, Fresno Pacific University, and Academy of Art.

The MSUB team will have a quick turn-around period as three days following the tournament, the Yellowjackets will open conference play at home against Western Oregon on Sept. 16 at 7 p.m. In the preseason coaches' poll, Western Washington (8), Alaska Anchorage (1), and Northwest Nazarene (1) all received first place votes. Coming in at No. 12 nationally, Western Washington was the lone school to be ranked in the AVCA preseason poll.

This year's GNAC schedule will be a condensed season with MSUB playing six games in the first 12 days of conference play. In October and November the Yellowjackets will return to two games a week. The final home game and Senior Night for MSU Billings will be on Nov. 8 against Central Washington.

Think Pink Night

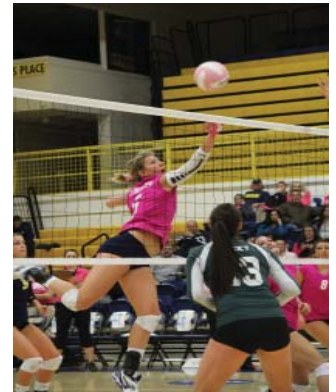


Every season MSUB designates one of its home matches as “Think Pink Night,” in support of the campaign against breast cancer. Matches across the country at all levels join the cause during the month of October, and the Yellowjackets work with the EVA Project that is run through St. Vincent Healthcare. The project provides free mammograms to women over the age of 40 who are uninsured and in need of the yearly screening. The mammograms are provided at the Yellowstone Breast Center and on the Mobile Digital Mammography Coach. The Coach travels to rural areas that do not have the ability to provide mammograms.

This season’s Think Pink night will be the game against Rocky Mountain College on October 28 at 7 p.m. Fans are encouraged to wear pink in support of Breast Cancer awareness.



In past years, half of the proceeds from 50/50 tickets sold at the match were donated to the EVA Project. Pink shirts and raffle items were sold at the match as well, and various other promotional items such as “Think Pink” towels have been distributed at the match.

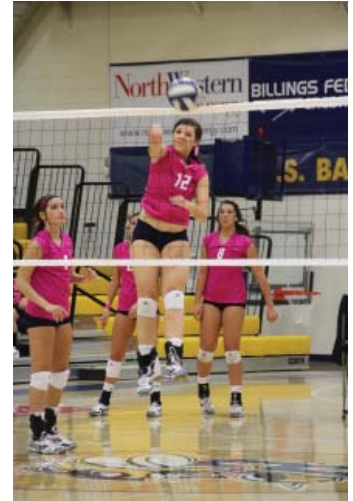

Alterowitz Gymnasium

Alterowitz Gymnasium, a 2,330 seat facility, is home to the Yellowjackets' men's basketball, women's basketball, and women's volleyball teams. The facility is part of the Physical Education building, which houses the athletic department offices,



training room, team locker rooms, workout facilities, and classrooms. During the summer of 2011, the seating areas were given a face-lift with all-new stadium seating installed to give patrons a more comfortable way to watch home Yellowjacket athletic events.

The venue is named after Dr. Harold "Shorty" Alterowitz, who was inducted into the MSUB Hall of Fame in 1995 for his 40 years of leadership as a coach and athletic director. Alterowitz was a track, tennis, golf and basketball coach, assistant football coach, and AD from 1952-

67. He has received numerous teaching awards and has been a frequent featured speaker at local, regional and national meetings. After his retirement, he founded the Eastern Montana College Forum for Excellence in 1986.

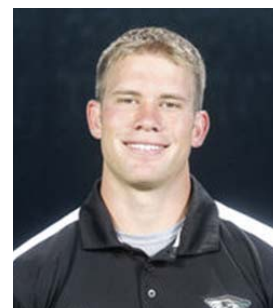

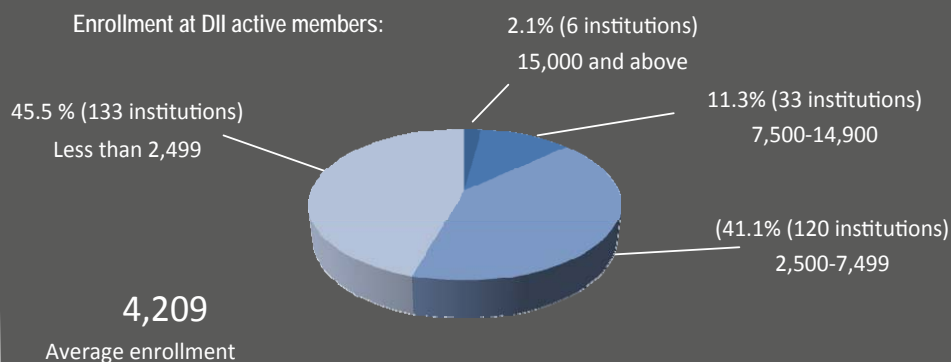
