
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About MSUB

Montana State University Billings is a comprehensive public four-year higher education institution located in Montana's largest population center, whose faculty is actively engaged in teaching, research, creative endeavors and public service. The University opened in 1927 and was initially called Eastern Montana State Normal School at Billings and was established to prepare teachers for elementary schools in Eastern Montana. MSU Billings has grown, with the city of Billings and Yellowstone County, into the major urban comprehensive higher education center of south central Montana. The University consists of five colleges on two campuses: the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Business, the College of Education, the College of Allied Health Professions and City College, which serves the comprehensive two-year mission of the University on a campus seven miles west of the University Campus. MSU Billings offers a full complement of one- and two-year certificate programs, associate degrees, and bachelor and master degrees, as well as pre-professional academic offerings in nearly 100 academic areas; and features 23 programs that are totally available online.

Several academic programs are unique to the Montana University System. MSU Billings Extended Campus also maintains a presence in Downtown Billings through outreach education to underserved populations, GED preparation, summer programs for children and short-term training/conference space.

MSU Billings is accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges & Universities. The MSU Billings College of Business is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business, whose standards are used as the basis to evaluate a business school's mission, operations, faculty qualifications and contributions, programs, and other critical areas. The MSU Billings College of Education is accredited by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education for preparing elementary and secondary teachers and school counselors through the Bachelor of Science and Master of Education degrees, and the Master of Science in Special Education degree. MSU Billings is also accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music, the National Association of Schools of Art and Design, the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education, and the Council on Rehabilitation Education. City College



programs are approved by the National Institute for Automotive Excellence and the Montana Board of Nursing.

Public service is integral to the mission of the University. Its two primary public service entities are KEMC/Yellowstone Public Radio and the Montana Center for Inclusive Education, a comprehensive education, rehabilitation, and diagnostic center serving Montanans with disabilities.

About MSUB Yellowjacket Athletics

Home of the Yellowjackets, the Montana State University Billings department of intercollegiate athletics supports 17 men's and women's varsity sports throughout the fall, winter and spring seasons. More than 250 student-athletes compete on MSUB's teams, and members of Yellowjacket teams posted a collective 3.21 grade point average during the 2013-14 academic year.

MSUB-sponsored varsity sports include men's and women's teams in basketball, cheer/stunt, cross-country, golf, soccer, tennis, indoor and outdoor track & field, as well as baseball, softball, and women's volleyball.

Most recently, the MSUB women's basketball team made history by winning the 2013-14 Great Northwest Athletic Conference regular season title and advancing to the NCAA Division II west regional championship game. Senior All-American Bobbi Knudsen closed her career as the GNAC all-time leader in points (1,831) and assists (532) and finished No. 2 in the MSUB record books in each of those categories.

MSUB's 2013-14 women's basketball team joined the Yellowjackets' 1998-99 squad as the only two in program history to advance to the NCAA regional title game. The latter continued on to the Elite Eight, marking the furthest-advancing MSUB team in the school's history.

Senior baseball standout Brody Miller became the first All-American in team history a season ago, after garnering GNAC Player of the Year honors and batting .392 as a junior in 2014.

In 2012, the MSUB softball team won the GNAC regular season title with a 32-18 overall record and earned hosting privileges for the 2013 conference softball tournament.

The 2012 Yellowjacket men's basketball team also earned a conference title, defeating the University of Alaska Anchorage 74-70 in the GNAC tournament championship game.

Formerly known as Eastern Montana College, MSUB athletics stem back to the 1927-28 season, the year in which the university was founded. The Yellowjackets have competed in a number of different conferences throughout the years, and prior to the 1980-81 season the athletic department transitioned from the NAIA to competing at the NCAA Division II level.


The MSUB Hall of Fame and Distinction inducted its inaugural class in 1990 and serves as a tribute towards influential figures on and off the court, in both current and retired sports.



26th season





A former cross-country and track runner at the University of Northern Iowa and University of Montana, Coppock has produced 17 all-conference (track & field) and four NCAA all-region runners in cross-country. He has coached 10 NCAA DII National Track & Field Championships qualifiers, two NCAA DII all-region track performers, and two former cross-country runners (Sarah Graves and Heidi Reider Schuette) were U.S. Olympic marathon trials qualifiers.

In 2012, after being picked 10th in the GNAC preseason coaches' poll, the Yellowjacket men had a school-record finish at the GNAC Cross Country Championships in third place. The Yellowjackets had an average time of 26 minutes over the 8,000-meter course. MSUB racked up 103 points, behind Alaska Anchorage and Western Washington, but ahead of the host school, No. 20 Western Oregon. The MSU Billings men finished ahead of regionally-ranked No. 4 Western Oregon, No. 8 Seattle Pacific, and No. 10 Northwest Nazarene.

Clint Choquette was named the conference's Newcomer of the Year after finishing 14th in the conference championship meet. Robert Peterson crossed the line right behind in 15th place and was named the GNAC Freshman of the Year.

In 2006, the Yellowjacket women won the Heartland Conference Championships and four men and women were named to the all-conference teams. The 2006 women were also ranked as high as 10th in the NCAA South Central Region.

His teams over the years have placed as high as second in the Pacific West Conference (twice) and fifth in the NCAA West Region. Under Coppock's guidance, the Yellowjackets have also been ranked as high as No. 16 in the nation.

In addition to the success Coppock's teams have had on the course, they have also been among the most successful teams in the nation in the classroom. Both the women's and men's programs have perennially been named to the NCAA Division II Cross Country Coaches Association All-Academic teams and have maintained one of the highest team grade point averages in the nation.

A 1979 graduate of Montana with a degree in geology, Coppock still runs competitively. He was named the 2006 Heartland Conference Women's Coach of the Year and has been named the Montana USATF Road Racer of the Year two times.

Men's Season Preview



After starting out with some great results last season, but finishing just out of a trip to nationals, the Montana State University Billings men's cross country team is back to being ranked in the West Region, and is looking at some great events this season.

After being ranked as high as No. 5 in the West Region last season, the men's cross country team finished out of the top-six at the west region championships. This year, the team starts out ranked No. 8 in the West Region and head coach Dave Coppock is looking forward to a fresh start.

"We lost some depth from last year, but have three, very strong runners returning with Robert Peterson, Michael Luhr and Jamon Rodrigues," said Coppock. "They look to be in even better shape than last year, as well. Josh Panasuk will also fill out our top-5 runners and has made a lot of really good progress over the summer. A lot of our success will depend on those numbers 4-7 runners and how they progress during the season."

The MSUB men's team is also ranked at No. 4 in the Great Northwest Athletic Conference and welcomes back top runners Luhr, Peterson, and Rodrigues. Peterson, a junior, was the 2012 GNAC Freshman of the Year and had three first-place finishes for MSUB last season. Peterson finished second at the GNAC Championships last year. Luhr, a senior and former GNAC Athlete of the Week, finished first for MSUB at last year's GNAC event and had two first-place finishes for the Yellowjackets last season.

Rodrigues, a freshman last year, had one first-place finish for MSUB last season at the Montana Invite, and finished third at the GNAC meet. Rodrigues was a top-5 finisher in all seven of the events MSU Billings competed in last year.

Also returning this season are juniors Panasuk and Jacob Marshall, along with sophomore Garrett Love. New to the team this season are freshmen Jorey Egeland, Mark Hovland, and Liam McKay. Egeland and Hovland are local talent, from Billings Senior High School and Billings West High School respectively. McKay is from Surrey, British Columbia.

"I'm hoping our freshmen will be able to adapt to the longer training and racing distances this fall," Coppock said.
"They're all very good middle distance runners and we've had to step up their mileage from what they were used to in high school. We have an unusually long season this year, so that may help give them some time to adapt. They're talented, so the potential is definitely there."

With three solid returners along with some talented newcomers, the MSU Billings team is ready for two in-state events to start its season off.

"With our main focus on regionals two months from now, we are taking this time to maintain some pretty high mileage weeks and build our endurance," Coppock said regarding his team's preseason preparation. "We want to run through some of these early meets without sacrificing the training we'll need to carry us through late November, so we're not really tapering off much for the first two meets. They're both competitive meets and we want to use them to begin working on a little sharpness and transition from the long, summer training to the heart of the racing season."



Women's Season Preview

A strong core of four returning senior runners will provide the Montana State University Billings women's cross country team with the experience and depth for a strong push into the west regional championships at Amend Park in Billings on Nov. 22.

"I think our women's team will be much stronger than the preseason polls indicate," said head coach Dave Coppock. "The women have a great mixture of returning student-athletes, combined two senior red shirts, two transfers and another Billings standout freshman newcomer in West graduate Bailey Bomar. I think redshirt Nocona Frame was overlooked as one of our newcomers and she could potentially be one of the strongest runners we've ever had here."

The returners include seniors Renae Hepfner, Nocona Frame, Taylor Condon, and Theresa Lombardi. Hepfner traded first and second place finishes for the Yellowjackets last year with junior Jinise Osborne. At the Great Northwest Athletic Conference Championships last year, Hepfner was the first-place finisher on the women's side and is No. 6 in the record books at MSUB in the women's 5,000 kilometers.

Melanie Bock and Frame did not run for the cross country team last season, as both student-athletes redshirted their seasons last year. Frame did run for the track and field team last spring and is the current MSUB record

holder in the women's 1500m.



Condon and Lombardi both ran consistently last year. Condon was the fourthplace finisher for the Yellowjackets at the GNAC Championships last year.

Along with Osborne, transfers Brielle Davis and Jordan Donaghy will add depth to the experienced runners. Davis had two very successful seasons competing for Gillette College. She helped her team to a third-place finish at the nationals for the NJCAA. Overall Davis finished 18th in the country and was an All-American athlete with a cumulative GPA of 4.0.

Like Nocona Frame, Donaghy is a transfer from the University of Mary. All three juniors on the team will provide quality and experience to the team.

"Rio and Nocona Frame, Renae and Jinise are returning after a very strong track season last spring," said Coppock. "Most of them were able to continue to build on that over the summer and are starting off in much better shape than last year."

Bomar comes to MSUB from Billings West High School. As a Golden Bear, Bomar helped her team to two second-place state finishes and one fourth-place result.

"Rio has really developed into a strong distance runner over the past year," said Coppock. "She now holds school records in the 3,000 and 5,000 meters and is poised to be one of our top runners this fall. Bailey is talented as well and we'll just have to see how she progresses during her freshman season. She's actually a better long distance runner than what she was able to run in the shorter high school distances."

After the meets at Carroll and MSU, the team heads to the Roy Griak Invitational hosted by the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis.

"We're going to keep our training volume fairly high this first month and run through these early meets and just focus on developing endurance," Coppock said regarding the early portion of the team's schedule. "With the exception of Griak, we want to focus on the long-term goals which are the championship meets in November. We want to have a good showing at Griak, however, where a lot of nationally-ranked schools will be competing, so we may back off the mileage a bit for that one. Griak will give us some big-meet experience with race fields of over 300 runners."

Following their big meet in Minneapolis, the team returns home to host the Yellowjacket Invitational at Amend Park on Oct. 3. The early October meet will serve as a preview of the NCAA Div. II West Region Championships hosted by Montana State University Billings on Nov. 22 at the same site.

In between the two home meets MSUB will travel to Black Hills State for a meet in the middle of October and then head to the GNAC Championships in Monmouth, Ore., hosted by Western Oregon University.

"The West Region Championships will be our primary focus this fall, but we want to run as well as we can at the GNAC Championships in the process," Coppock said. "As far as goals for the meet are concerned, we'd like to finish at least third in the men's race and at least fourth in the women's races. We want to use the momentum from a good conference showing to carry us into the West Region Championships three weeks later."

This is the first time MSU Billings will host the West Region cross country championships. The NCAA awarded MSUB hosting privileges for the 2014 and 2016 events and the team and coach couldn't be more excited to host such a prestigious event.

"We're very excited to have the opportunity to host an NCAA championship event," commented Coppock. "We've had a lot of great local support from the Billings Chamber, Billings School District 2, the Big Sky State Games and the Yellowstone Rimrunners. I think our teams will have a huge advantage here not having to travel and being able to sleep in their own beds without the hassle of travel logistics which can take its toll on performance. We're also fortunate to have six national qualifying berths out of this championship, the most of all except one other region in the NCAA. Only the South Central region in the NCAA has that many qualifying spots, so we're fortunate to be in a tough region. If we're going to get to nationals, this would be the year to do it."




