## About MSUB

Montana State University Billings is a comprehensive public four-year higher education institution located in Montana's largest population center, whose faculty is actively engaged in teaching, research, creative endeavors and public service. The University opened in 1927 and was initially called Eastern Montana State Normal School at Billings and was established to prepare teachers for elementary schools in Eastern Montana. MSU Billings has grown, with the city of Billings and Yellowstone County, into the major urban comprehensive higher education center of south central Montana. The University consists of five colleges on two campuses: the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Business, the College of Education, the College of Allied Health Professions and City College, which serves the comprehensive two-year mission of the University on a campus seven miles west of the University Campus. MSU Billings offers a full complement of one- and two-year certificate programs, associate degrees, and bachelor and master degrees, as well as pre-professional academic offerings in nearly 100 academic areas; and features 23 programs that are totally available online.

Several academic programs are unique to the Montana University System. MSU Billings Extended Campus also maintains a presence in Downtown Billings through outreach education to underserved populations, GED preparation, summer programs for children and short-term training/conference space.

MSU Billings is accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges & Universities. The MSU Billings College of Business is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business, whose standards are used as the basis to evaluate a business school's mission, operations, faculty qualifications and contributions, programs, and other critical areas. The MSU Billings College of Education is accredited by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education for preparing elementary and secondary teachers and school counselors through the Bachelor of Science and Master of Education degrees, and the Master of Science in Special Education degree. MSU Billings is also accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music, the National Association of Schools of Art and Design, the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education, and the Council on Rehabilitation Education. City College programs are approved by the National Institute for Automotive Excellence and the Montana Board of Nursing.



Public service is integral to the mission of the University. Its two primary public service entities are KEMC/Yellowstone Public Radio and the Montana Center for Inclusive Education, a comprehensive education, rehabilitation, and diagnostic center serving Montanans with disabilities.

## **About MSUB Yellowjacket Athletics**

Home of the Yellowjackets, the Montana State University Billings department of intercollegiate athletics supports 17 men's and women's varsity sports throughout the fall, winter and spring seasons. More than 250 student-athletes compete on MSUB's teams, and members of Yellowjacket teams posted a collective 3.21 grade point average during the 2013-14 academic year.

MSUB-sponsored varsity sports include men's and women's teams in basketball, cheer/stunt, cross-country, golf, soccer, tennis, indoor and outdoor track & field, as well as baseball, softball, and women's volleyball.

Most recently, the MSUB women's basketball team made history by winning the 2013-14 Great Northwest Athletic Conference regular season title and advancing to the NCAA Division II west regional championship game. Senior All-American Bobbi Knudsen closed her career as the GNAC all-time leader in points (1,831) and assists (532) and finished No. 2 in the MSUB record books in each of those categories.

MSUB's 2013-14 women's basketball team joined the Yellowjackets' 1998-99 squad as the only two in program history to advance to the NCAA regional title game. The latter continued on to the Elite Eight, marking the furthest-advancing MSUB team in the school's history.

Senior baseball standout Brody Miller became the first All-American in team history a season ago, after garnering GNAC Player of the Year honors and batting .392 as a junior in 2014.

In 2012, the MSUB softball team won the GNAC regular season title with a 32-18 overall record and earned hosting privileges for the 2013 conference softball tournament.

The 2012 Yellowjacket men's basketball team also earned a conference title, defeating the University of Alaska Anchorage 74-70 in the GNAC tournament championship game.

Formerly known as Eastern Montana College, MSUB athletics stem back to the 1927-28 season, the year in which the university was founded. The Yellowjackets have competed in a number of different conferences throughout the years, and prior to the 1980-81 season the athletic department transitioned from the NAIA to competing at the NCAA Division II level.

The MSUB Hall of Fame and Distinction inducted its inaugural class in 1990 and serves as a tribute towards influential figures on and off the court, in both current and retired sports.

Opportunities to host events such as these provide us in the athletics department a chance to serve as ambassadors for our university, and I personally could not be more excited to welcome these signature events to our wonderful community.

Part of our mission as a department is to strive for the continual growth, improvement, and development of our student-athletes as individuals. I am proud of the citizens that our student-athletes develop into during their time as Yellowjackets, and am once again thrilled to witness their extraordinary contributions to our teams and the Billings community again this year.

Here's to another outstanding year of MSUB athletics, and I am looking forward to seeing you on our campus throughout the 2014-15 academic year.

## Head Coach Shawn O'Brien

6th season

Shawn O'Brien begins his sixth year as the head men's and women's golf coach at Montana State Billings.

In 2013-14, O'Brien's women's team finished in second place at the Great Northwest Athletic Conference Championships, and senior Capri Ingram finished fourth individually at the event.

After leading Gage Huft to the Men's NCAA Div. II South Central/West Regional and the Yellowjacket women to a solid finish at the Great Northwest Athletic Conference Championships, O'Brien was named the GNAC Women's Coach of the Year following the 2012-13 season.

In his first year, O'Brien guided the women's golf team to its second-straight NCAA tournament appearance and led the team to the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference tournament title. In addition, O'Brien was named RMAC Women's Golf Coach of the Year.

Under O'Brien the Yellowjackets have recorded 14 combined individual victories and 42 individual top-5 finishes. He has coached 17 all-conference selections and 24 academic all-conference selections.

In 2011, O'Brien coached the male (Brad Harrelson) and female (Melissa Saken) GNAC Freshman of the Year, and in 2012, Cayley Fish and Eric Gravbrot were named the GNAC Female and Male Freshman of the Year.

O'Brien is a member of the National Golf Coaches Association and the Montana Coaches Association.

O'Brien spent two years assisting the women's basketball program at MSUB and previously was an assistant coach for boys' basketball at Belfield High School (N.D.) in 2006-07. He was an assistant coach for the girls' varsity at Campbell County High School (Wyo.) in 2007-08.

O'Brien had an outstanding career as a kicker for the football team at Dickinson State University. In 2004 as a freshman, he set a school and Dakota Athletic Conference record by hitting 17 field goals for the season. O'Brien also had 42 extra points for 93 points and led his team to the quarterfinals of the NAIA National Championships. He earned all-DAC and all-America honors that season. O'Brien was a three-time all-DAC honoree and still holds the school career records for field goals (34) and extra points (109). His 211 points rank among the top-5 in school history.

He is the son of Deb and the late Thomas O'Brien and has a sister, Molly. He has a bachelor's degree in physical education with a minor in coaching from Dickinson State. He earned his master's degree in school counseling from MSUB in 2010.

On Sept. 5, 2009, O'Brien married Kristen Rogers of Colstrip, Mont. The couple and their son Luke reside in Billings.







## Assistant Coach Marcus Drange

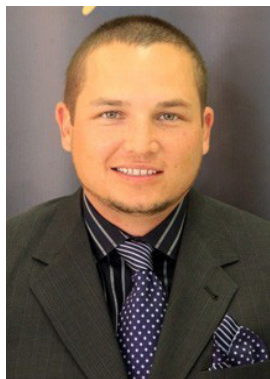
1st season

Marcus Drange begins his first season as interim assistant golf coach after participating in the Yellowjackets' golf program for the past three seasons.

Drange was selected as the team's most improved player during the 2013-14 season, and was the Great Northwest Athletic Conference Newcomer of the Year and all-conference selection in 2011-12. During his career at MSUB, Drange notched three top-5 tournament finishes, and holds a career-low single-round mark of 66.

Prior to MSUB, Drange attended Montana State University in Bozeman from 2009-11. Drange was the Gallatin Valley Open champion in both 2010 and '11.

Drange is a 2009 graduate of Billings West High School, where he was a Montana State AA all-state selection in 2008.



## Volunteer Assistant Rhett Hightower

2nd season

Rhett Hightower begins his fourth season as an assistant golf coach at Montana State Billings. He played collegiate golf for the University of New Mexico from 1997-99.

Hightower resides in Billings and is the father of two children, Austyn (5) and Cullynn (1).

## 2014-15 Men's Golf Season Preview



With an experienced core of senior golfers, the Montana State Billings men's golf team is set to kick off the fall portion of its 2014-15 season in mid-September.

Sixth-year head coach Shawn O'Brien welcomes back a five returners, along with six newcomers who figure to compete for rounds throughout the season.

"We have a very experienced group of young men, who I believe are ready to step up to the challenge and compete at a high level this season," said O'Brien.

Among O'Brien's top returnees is Great Northwest Athletic Conference Newcomer of the Year Austin Westphal, who averaged a single-round score of 75.8 during his first season in the conference in 2013-14. A transfer from North Idaho College,

Westphal competed in all 19 of the Yellowjackets' rounds a season ago, logging one top-5 finish and a low-round score of 71.

"Austin is a very reliable player, he is very consistent with his scoring," said O'Brien. "It is always nice to have a player that consistently provides a countable score."

Three more seniors return for the 'Jackets, including Houston Bradbury, Jake Hedge and Gage Huft. As a junior last season, Huft led the Yellowjackets with an average score of 74.7 over 19 rounds of competition. He racked up four top-10 finishes, three of which placed him in the top-5, and tallied a low-round score of 70 on the season. A three-year letterwinner for the Yellowjackets, Huft is expected to assume a major leadership role in his final collegiate season.

"Gage is a tremendous golfer who has the ability to post very low scores," O'Brien commented regarding his top returner. "Gage will take on a big leadership role this season, as we will look for him to carry our team. He, along with some of his teammates, are going to have the ability to make a run at the GNAC Championships."

Another transfer who had an immediate impact for MSUB last season was Hedge, who logged a pair of top-10 finishes and a low-round score of 67 through his 11 rounds as a junior in 2013-14.

"Jake has the ability to be one of the top golfers in our region," said O'Brien. "He has worked very hard over the off-season to be where he was at while he attended the University of Wyoming. Finishing in the top-5 at the Montana State Amateur tournament this summer, shows that his golf game is where it needs to be as he carries over into our season."

The Yellowjackets' lone returning sophomore, Tanner Berg is back after a solid freshman campaign. In his debut college season, Berg averaged a score of 75.4 over five rounds with a low-round score of 70.

O'Brien and the 'Jackets bid farewell to several key seniors, including Brad Harrelson and new assistant coach Marcus Drange. Both played in all 19 rounds as seniors and were key contributors in 2013-14.

A talented class of five freshmen and one transfer have the 'Jackets restocked and provide significant depth for the program to build upon. Two of O'Brien's new players are the younger siblings of current Yellowjacket golfers, with Austin Berg and Parker Bradbury joining the squad alongside their older brothers.

Dalton Hagadone, Dylan Meccage and Ty Pickel also figure to land in the mix early on, and transfer Connor Miele adds further depth as well.

"We were very happy to have signed six new players, all who have the ability to help our program," O'Brien said on the group of newcomers. "The first couple of weeks will be very interesting, as any one of them will have the opportunity to contribute within our top-5. With three former high school state champions in Austin, Parker and Ty, I am excited for their history of success to carry over into their careers as Yellowjackets."

MSUB begins its 2014-15 schedule at the Saint Martin's Invitational in Lacey, Wash., from Sept. 19-20. The Yellowjackets will host invitational tournaments in the fall (Oct. 2-3) and the spring (March 30-31), each taking place at Pryor Creek Golf Course in Huntley, Mont.

The 2014-15 GNAC Golf Championships are set for April 20-21 at the Coeur d'Alene Resort Golf Course, with all five of the conference schools participating in the event.

"I believe that this year's group could possibly have the best season in program history," O'Brien said. "We have key leadership, stability, and talent moving forward."

## 2014-15 Women's Golf Season Preview

After a second-place finish at the 2013-14 Great Northwest Athletic Conference Women's Golf Championships, the Montana State University Billings women's golf squad has its sights set on another strong performance this season.

"We are very excited to get the season underway, as we have prepared throughout the off-season putting in a lot of dedication and time," commented sixth-year head coach Shawn O'Brien. "With the addition of Sammy Walter and Bailee Dexter, I believe our team will have a strong chance to give Western Washington a run for its money as the Vikings have proven to be the team to beat in the GNAC."

The Yellowjackets lost a trio of seniors who participated at last season's conference championships in Capri Ingram, Melissa Saken and BreAnna Cameron. With seven golfers returning however, the 2014-15 squad is full of experience and veteran leadership.

Among the seniors back for O'Brien is three-year letterwinner and 2014-15 team captain Mariah Cleveland. As a junior, Cleveland shot an average score of 82.5 with one top-5 finish in her 14 rounds of golf.

"Mariah has put in more work than any student-athlete I have coached over the last year," said O'Brien. "I am very excited to see her play and her hard work ethic pay off."

Other key returnees for the 'Jackets include Haley Shackelford and twin sisters Cayley and Katie Fish. Katie Fish was a second-team all-GNAC performer in 2013-14, and boasted the best scoring average on the team at 80.8. She finished in the top-10 at events on three separate occasions, and tallied a team-best low-round score of 73 over 16 rounds.

"Katie is a tremendous player and has not yet peaked on her ability to play golf," commented O'Brien. "It will be nice to have our leader on the golf course back for another season."

Cayley Fish, the 2011-12 GNAC Freshman of the Year, is also an all-conference caliber golfer, who shot an average score of 84.4 with one top-10 finish in 10 rounds as a junior. Both Fish twins were academic all-GNAC selections, holding the top-two grade point averages in the conference at 3.93 and 3.92.

"Cayley brings a tremendous amount of depth to our program," said O'Brien. "I am again excited this season to have Cayley in the mix as she brings a lot of experience to the table."

"We are also going to rely on Haley a lot this season, as she is a tremendous golfer, and I believe that she will help our team very much this year."

Two other notable returners include Carlan Campbell and Carlee Hart. Campbell provides senior leadership, while Hart will return to the greens after her first collegiate season.

"Both Carlan and Carlee bring a lot of hard work and determination to succeed to our team," said O'Brien. "Carlan is a fantastic role model for underclassmen, and Carlee has shown a strong ability to learn and strive towards success."

Making their collegiate debuts in 2014-15 will be Dexter and Walter, who will add depth to the program. Dexter



intends to study biology and is a native of Townsend, Mont., where she graduated from Broadwater High School. Walter is a Billings native, whose older sister Chelsey is a starter on the MSUB volleyball team.

"I am very excited about the incoming freshman class," said O'Brien. "Both Bailee and Sammy have the ability to help our team succeed right away. Both of them do very well academically, and have the potential to have strong careers at MSUB."

MSUB's fall slate gets underway on Sept. 15-16 at the Colorado Christian Invitational at the Raccoon Creek Golf Club in Lakewood, Colo. The Yellowjackets will host invitational tournaments in the fall (Oct. 2-3) and the spring (March 30-31), each taking place at Pryor Creek Golf Course in Huntley, Mont.

The 2014-15 GNAC Golf Championships are set for April 20-21 at the Coeur d'Alene Resort Golf Course, with all five of the conference schools participating in the event.

"Our schedule sets us up to play a variety of different schools, allowing us to see a vast assortment of competition," said O'Brien. "Being able to compete against schools from the RMAC, CCA, and PacWest will allow us to judge how our team will fare come April at the GNAC Championships."

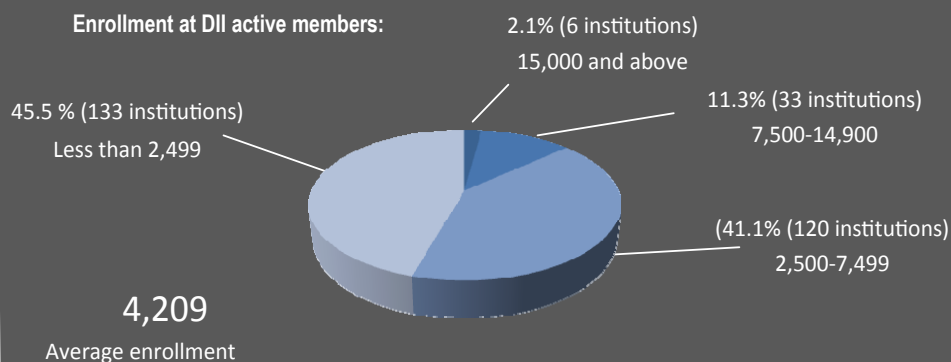
