About MSUB

Montana State University Billings is a comprehensive public four-year higher education institution located in Montana's largest population center, whose faculty is actively engaged in teaching, research, creative endeavors and public service. The University opened in 1927 and was initially called Eastern Montana State Normal School at Billings and was established to prepare teachers for elementary schools in Eastern Montana. MSU Billings has grown, with the city of Billings and Yellowstone County, into the major urban comprehensive higher education center of south central Montana. The University consists of five colleges on two campuses: the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Business, the College of Education, the College of Allied Health Professions and City College, which serves the comprehensive two-year mission of the University on a campus seven miles west of the University Campus. MSU Billings offers a full complement of one- and two-year certificate programs, associate degrees, and bachelor and master degrees, as well as pre-professional academic offerings in nearly 100 academic areas; and features 23 programs that are totally available online.

Several academic programs are unique to the Montana University System. MSU Billings Extended Campus also maintains a presence in Downtown Billings through outreach education to underserved populations, GED preparation, summer programs for children and short-term training/conference space.

MSU Billings is accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges & Universities. The MSU Billings College of Business is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business, whose standards are used as the basis to evaluate a business school's mission, operations, faculty qualifications and contributions, programs, and other critical areas. The MSU Billings College of Education is accredited by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education for preparing elementary and secondary teachers and school counselors through the Bachelor of Science and Master of Education degrees, and the Master of Science in Special Education degree. MSU Billings is also accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music, the National Association of Schools of Art and Design, the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education, and the Council on Rehabilitation Education. City College

programs are approved by the National Institute for Automotive Excellence and the Montana Board of Nursing.



Public service is integral to the mission of the University. Its two primary public service entities are KEMC/Yellowstone Public Radio and the Montana Center for Inclusive Education, a comprehensive education, rehabilitation, and diagnostic center serving Montanans with disabilities.

About MSUB Yellowjacket Athletics

Home of the Yellowjackets, the Montana State University Billings department of intercollegiate athletics supports 17 men's and women's varsity sports throughout the fall, winter and spring seasons. More than 250 student-athletes compete on MSUB's teams, and members of Yellowjacket teams posted a collective 3.21 grade point average during the 2013-14 academic year.

MSUB-sponsored varsity sports include men's and women's teams in basketball, cheer/stunt, cross-country, golf, soccer, tennis, indoor and outdoor track & field, as well as baseball, softball, and women's volleyball.

Most recently, the MSUB women's basketball team made history by winning the 2013-14 Great Northwest Athletic Conference regular season title and advancing to the NCAA Division II west regional championship game. Senior All-American Bobbi Knudsen closed her career as the GNAC all-time leader in points (1,831) and assists (532) and finished No. 2 in the MSUB record books in each of those categories.

MSUB's 2013-14 women's basketball team joined the Yellowjackets' 1998-99 squad as the only two in program history to advance to the NCAA regional title game. The latter continued on to the Elite Eight, marking the furthest-advancing MSUB team in the school's history.

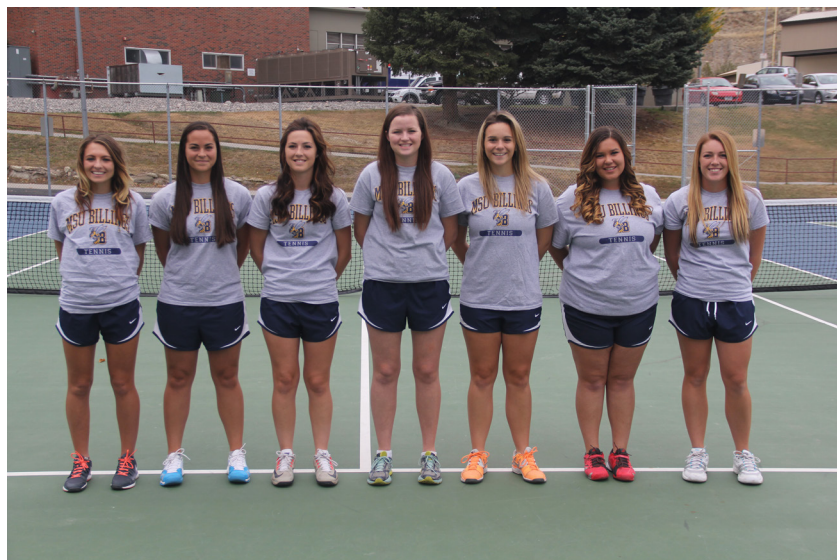
Senior baseball standout Brody Miller became the first All-American in team history a season ago, after garnering GNAC Player of the Year honors and batting .392 as a junior in 2014.

In 2012, the MSUB softball team won the GNAC regular season title with a 32-18 overall record and earned hosting privileges for the 2013 conference softball tournament.

The 2012 Yellowjacket men's basketball team also earned a conference title, defeating the University of Alaska Anchorage 74-70 in the GNAC tournament championship game.

Formerly known as Eastern Montana College, MSUB athletics stem back to the 1927-28 season, the year in which the university was founded. The Yellowjackets have competed in a number of different conferences throughout the years, and prior to the 1980-81 season the athletic department transitioned from the NAIA to competing at the NCAA Division II level.

The MSUB Hall of Fame and Distinction inducted its inaugural class in 1990 and serves as a tribute towards influential figures on and off the court, in both current and retired sports.

1st season



Becky King begins her first season as head men's and women's tennis coach in 2014-15.

King is originally from Billings, graduating from Billings Central High School in 2002. She played varsity tennis all four years and was a state qualifier three of the four years.

King attended Carroll College in Helena, Mont., where she studied elementary education and physical education. She continued to play tennis and ran the intramural tennis program for the college students at the Helena Tennis Center. While in Helena, King coached the Helena High junior varsity boys and girls for four years (2003-2007) and was the assistant varsity coach (2007-2008).

In 2008 King moved back to Billings where she took a job as the Director of the Tennis Center at MSU Billings. With this job King worked closely with the Billings community tennis players, creating leagues, lessons, workshops, camps and clinics. As the director King also helped run the junior lessons offered at the center and worked closely with the head coach and college teams.

She continued coaching as the assistant girls' varsity coach at Billings Central (2009-2011). King is in her seventh year of employment at MSUB.



Assistant Coach Kavindu Gamage 1st season

After graduating from MSUB last year, Kavindu Gamage begins his first season as the assistant tennis coach for the Yellowjackets in 2014-15.



Gamage participated in tennis for four seasons at MSUB, and earned numerous accolades throughout his career. As a senior in 2014, Gamage was a team captain and was picked as the Yellowjackets' men's tennis Athlete of the Year.

Gamage was a 2014 Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference academic all-league pick, was named the 2014 Outstanding Student-Athlete of the Year, and earned MSUB's Athletic Leadership award.

His senior year, Gamage set a new standard for most singles and doubles victories in a single season, and he has the second-most career victories in MSUB tennis history. He was also an RMAC all-conference selection four times in both singles and doubles.

Graduating from MSUB with a degree in business management, Gamage earned Dean's List honors throughout his career.

A native of Melbourne, Australia, Gamage attended Rosehill Secondary College prior to his time at MSUB.



2014-15 Men's Season Preview

A young Montana State University Billings men's tennis squad will look to provide fresh energy for the 2014-15 season, and help the Yellowjackets improve on last season's 4-9 finish.

In her first season, Becky King will begin her career as a head coach, looking to turn around a men's program that finished with a 2-4 record in Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference play a season ago. "We have a very young team, but we are very skilled and athletic," King commented on her team. "Our goal is for each of our players to play at the highest level they can, and they all need to have belief in themselves that they can compete in the RMAC."



Junior Brandon Beardsley

One of the Yellowjackets' key returners is Brandon Beardsley, who teamed up with fellow returnee Josh Hedderig as the No. 1 team in doubles a season ago. "Brandon is in his third season with us, and he played one and two pretty consistently for us in doubles and singles last season," said King. "He is a hard worker who is motivated to do well."

Hedderig, another junior, is also slated to provide leadership as an upperclassman on this year's team. "Josh is another hard worker for us, and I can tell that both he and Brandon have made a lot of progress over the summer," said King. "Josh is coming off a little bit of a disappointing end to the season, but he will use that as a key tool to come off stronger this year."

Austin Kische and Daniil Gorkov are two more juniors who figure to compete for court time this season as well.

A key addition for the Yellowjackets is Santiago de la Rosa Mora, who transferred to MSUB from Colorado Christian University.

"Santiago is in his second season playing, and coming to us from another RMAC school he has that experience already," commented King. "He is definitely someone who will give some depth to our ladder, and he is a fast-moving, agile player on the court."

Joining MSUB for his first collegiate season is freshman Robert Pike, who is a 2014 graduate of Bozeman High School. "Robbie is a year-round player, which is hard to find in Montana," King said. "He should have a huge year in terms of growth and experience, and we will rely on our older players to show him what tennis is like at the college level."

"We ended in fifth place in conference last year which is definitely lower than where we wanted to be," King said. "That's the motivation for our guys to come out strong this year. I can already see the fire and the hard work they are putting into this season."

2014-15 Women's Season Preview

A balanced lineup of upperclassman leadership and young talent has the Montana State University Billings women's tennis team set for a progressive season in 2014-15.

First year head coach Becky King inherits a program that finished the 2013-14 season with a record of 3-9 overall and 2-3 in Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference action. "The women's team finished ranked fifth in the RMAC last year and was 2-3 by the end of the season," King said. "That's not too bad of a finish, but with the team we have this year we can do much better. We have struggled a bit in the past in terms of depth to our lineup, and this year I can see that we have that depth we have been looking for."



Senior Captain Emily Paffhausen

Paving the way for the Yellowjackets will be senior Emily Paffhausen, who has been a staple within the program over the past three seasons. "Emily will be our captain this year, and she has been at the top of our doubles line," King said. "She is a very hard-working student-athlete both on and off of the court. She has shown great leadership and communication skills, and with a young team she is the one senior that we have. I am excited for her to display her qualities to the team this season."

Also back for the 'Jackets is sophomore Morgan Opp, who played a key role for MSUB during the 2013-14 season. "Morgan went strong all season for us, and she was in a tough position at number one as a freshman," King said. "She is definitely going to be huge at the top of the ladder for our doubles and singles teams, and she has already shown her strength by playing against tough opponents as a number one player last season."

Juniors Mary Conwell and Hannah Shephard also return to MSUB's lineup this year, each bringing two seasons of experience within the program to the

2014-15 squad.

Providing young energy for King's team this season will be a pair of local freshmen from Billings West High School in Jade Goodyear-Anderson and Riquel Ramsbottom. "Both Jade and Riquel will play for us this season, and will certainly provide our ladder with some depth," King said. "Both are hard hitters, are quick on their feet, and I expect them to push some of the returning players for time. I'd like to get them some college experience and to the point where they're playing every day, and I'm excited to see what both of them are capable of."

"We have a very young team, and we just need some experience and leadership to have success this year," King said. "We are starting off our season really early, and it is a good way to see where our team is at."

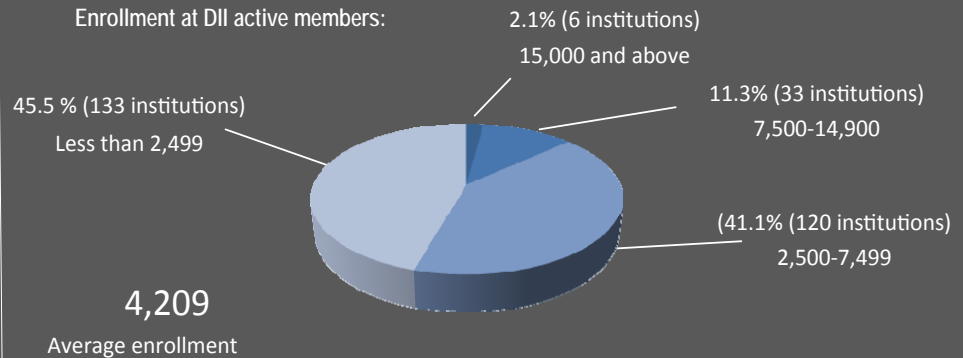
