About MSUB

Montana State University Billings is a comprehensive public four-year higher education institution located in Montana's largest population center, whose faculty is actively engaged in teaching, research, creative endeavors and public service. The University opened in 1927 and was initially called Eastern Montana State Normal School at Billings and was established to prepare teachers for elementary schools in Eastern Montana. MSU Billings has grown, with the city of Billings and Yellowstone County, into the major urban comprehensive higher education center of south central Montana. The University consists of five colleges on two campuses: the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Business, the College of Education, the College of Allied Health Professions and City College, which serves the comprehensive two-year mission of the University on a campus seven miles west of the University Campus. MSU Billings offers a full complement of one- and two-year certificate programs, associate degrees, and bachelor and master degrees, as well as pre-professional academic offerings in nearly 100 academic areas; and features 23 programs that are totally available online.

Several academic programs are unique to the Montana University System. MSU Billings Extended Campus also maintains a presence in Downtown Billings through outreach education to underserved populations, GED preparation, summer programs for children and short-term training/conference space.

MSU Billings is accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges & Universities. The MSU Billings College of Business is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business, whose standards are used as the basis to evaluate a business school's mission, operations, faculty qualifications and contributions, programs, and other critical areas. The MSU Billings College of Education is accredited by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education for preparing elementary and secondary teachers and school counselors through the Bachelor of Science and Master of Education degrees, and the Master of Science in Special Education degree. MSU Billings is also accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music, the National Association of Schools of Art and Design, the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education, and the Council on Rehabilitation Education. City College



programs are approved by the National Institute for Automotive Excellence and the Montana Board of Nursing.

Public service is integral to the mission of the University. Its two primary public service entities are KEMC/Yellowstone Public Radio and the Montana Center for Inclusive Education, a comprehensive education, rehabilitation, and diagnostic center serving Montanans with disabilities

About MSUB Yellowjacket Athletics

Home of the Yellowjackets, the Montana State University Billings department of intercollegiate athletics supports 17 men's and women's varsity sports throughout the fall, winter and spring seasons. More than 250 student-athletes compete on MSUB's teams, and members of Yellowjacket teams posted a collective 3.21 grade point average during the 2013-14 academic year.

MSUB-sponsored varsity sports include men's and women's teams in basketball, cheer/stunt, cross-country, golf, soccer, tennis, indoor and outdoor track & field, as well as baseball, softball, and women's volleyball.

Most recently, the MSUB women's basketball team made history by winning the 2013-14 Great Northwest Athletic Conference regular season title and advancing to the NCAA Division II west regional championship game. Senior All-American Bobbi Knudsen closed her career as the GNAC all-time leader in points (1,831) and assists (532) and finished No. 2 in the MSUB record books in each of those categories.


MSUB's 2013-14 women's basketball team joined the Yellowjackets' 1998-99 squad as the only two in program history to advance to the NCAA regional title game. The latter continued on to the Elite Eight, marking the furthest-advancing MSUB team in the school's history.

Senior baseball standout Brody Miller became the first All-American in team history a season ago, after garnering GNAC Player of the Year honors and batting .392 as a junior in 2014.

In 2012, the MSUB softball team won the GNAC regular season title with a 32-18 overall record and earned hosting privileges for the 2013 conference softball tournament.

The 2012 Yellowjacket men's basketball team also earned a conference title, defeating the University of Alaska Anchorage 74-70 in the GNAC tournament championship game.

Formerly known as Eastern Montana College, MSUB athletics stem back to the 1927-28 season, the year in which the university was founded. The Yellowjackets have competed in a number of different conferences throughout the years, and prior to the 1980-81 season the athletic department transitioned from the NAIA to competing at the NCAA Division II level.



field head coach since the program returned during the 2008-2009 season.

A former cross-country and track runner at the University of Northern Iowa and University of Montana, Coppock has produced 17 all-conference (track & field) and four NCAA all-region runners in cross-country. He has coached 10 NCAA DII National Track & Field Championships qualifiers, two NCAA DII all-region track performers, and two former cross-country runners (Sarah Graves and Heidi Reider Schuette) were U.S. Olympic marathon trials qualifiers.

In 2012, after being picked 10th in the GNAC preseason coaches' poll, the Yellowjacket men had a school-record finish at the GNAC Cross Country Championships in third place. The Yellowjackets had an average time of 26 minutes over the 8,000-meter course. MSUB racked up 103 points, behind Alaska Anchorage and Western Washington, but ahead of the host school, No. 20 Western Oregon. The MSU Billings men finished ahead of regionally-ranked No. 4 Western Oregon, No. 8 Seattle Pacific, and No. 10 Northwest Nazarene.

Clint Choquette was named the conference's Newcomer of the Year after finishing 14th in the conference championship meet. Robert Peterson crossed the line right behind in 15th place and was named the GNAC Freshman of the Year.

In 2006, the Yellowjacket women won the Heartland Conference Championships and four men and women were named to the all-conference teams. The 2006 women were also ranked as high as 10th in the NCAA South Central Region.

His teams over the years have placed as high as second in the Pacific West Conference (twice) and fifth in the NCAA West Region. Under Coppock's guidance, the Yellowjackets have also been ranked as high as No. 16 in the nation.

In addition to the success Coppock's teams have had on the course, they have also been among the most successful teams in the nation in the classroom. Both the women's and men's programs have perennially been named to the NCAA Division II Cross Country Coaches Association All-Academic teams and have maintained one of the highest team grade point averages in the nation.

A 1979 graduate of Montana with a degree in geology, Coppock still runs competitively. He was named the 2006 Heartland Conference Women's Coach of the Year and has been named the Montana USATF Road Racer of the Year two times.



Assistant Coach Nick Collins 4th season



Nick Collins begins his fourth season as assistant track & field coach for sprinters and jumpers during the 2014-15 academic year.

Collins is a former decathlete who competed for fellow GNAC institution Central Washington University where he earned his bachelor's degree in 2009 and his master's degree in 2011, both in exercise science.

As a junior in 2008, he finished fourth in the GNAC decathlon while also being named an academic all-conference selection.

After graduation Collins joined the coaching staff for the Wildcats, overseeing the jumping events, including pole vault, as well as the decathlon and heptathlon. He was also in charge of coordinating the strength training programs for the entire track and field team.

Indoor Season Preview

Last year at the 2014 Great Northwest Athletic Conference Indoor Track and Field Championships, the Yellow-jacket men placed sixth overall with 49 points, the most MSUB has ever accumulated at the indoor conference championships.

Junior Robert Peterson returns to the MSU Billings team having won the 1500m at the conference championships, setting a new MSUB record and earning all-conference recognition with his individual title. Peterson also placed fifth in the men's 3,000 earning 14 total points for the Yellowjacket team.

Also earning all-conference at the GNAC meet, the men's distance medley relay team finished third. Returning to the relay team this season are Peterson and sophomore Nate Vanderby.

Dual-sport athlete senior Cameron Stanek was seventh at the GNAC in the men's heptathlon. Last season was Stanek's first year competing for MSUB in track and field.

MSU Billings assistant track and field coach Nick Collins is looking forward to working with his key returners from last year. "We are looking for Cameron to contribute more than just in the multi-events this year," Collins said. "He will also be in the sprints, 60m, 200m, and the 400m. He won't do all of those at the conference meet, but he will be competing in all of them during the season, so we will see where he is at as we get closer to conference."

Stanek, the lone senior on the team, is joined by Peterson, as well as juniors Josh Panasuk, Tyler DiGiovanna, and transfer-student this year, Austin Lindquist as the only upperclassmen on the roster.

DiGiovanna participates in the sprints, Panasuk is a cross-over athlete from cross country and will run in the

Also, crossing over from the cross country season are Jorey Egeland, Mark Hovland, Garrett Love, and Jacob Marshall.

Vanderby, is looking to break the MSUB record in the 400m. Last year, Vanderby was just out of the top-8 at the conference meet at 12th and this year looks to crack into the all-conference ranks.

middle distance races, and Lindquist is a junior transfer from the University of Montana.

Lindquist and sophomore Landon Polkow are both transfers from DI University of Montana. Coach Collins has enjoyed working with both athletes this year and is looking for big things from both of them. "Austin should be one of the top 60m hurdlers in the conference, and he could potentially contribute in all three jumps," Collins said. "Polkow's main event is the 400m hurdles, which is just run during the outdoor season, but he has a lot of talent and speed. He could be a factor for us in the 200m or the 400m and add some points for MSUB in either event."

Indoor Season Preview

The Yellowjacket men are an extremely young team with five juniors, while having 10 sophomores and 13 freshmen. The men's roster is almost entirely comprised of student-athletes from the state of Montana.

Coach Collins is looking at a few of the sophomores and freshmen coming in to contribute to the team in the early going.

Zook, a freshman from Casper, Wyo., is competing in the sprints for the Yellowjackets. "We hope Sam will be a factor in either the 60m or the 200," Coach Collins said. "He has the potential to be in the top-8, but it's a tough conference field in those events."

Freshmen Preston Shubert and Lonis Sherman both had big numbers in the pole vault coming out of Montana high schools. Sherman, from Kalispell, Mont., had last year's Montana high school pole vault record, while Shubert, a graduate of Thompson Falls, Mont., had the best pole vault results two years ago. Coach Collins looks for those kind of marks coming in to put them in the top-5 in the conference. "We were really lucky to get both Loni and Preston at MSUB," Collins said. "With the kinds of marks both of them achieved in high school, and their improvement so far, both of them could be top-3 in the conference." Schubert will also be competing in the jumps and hurdles for the team.

Sophomore Cole Campbell, who also competes in pole vault, will be redshirting the indoor season with an injury. Donald Hamm is back and will be competing in the multi-events and the jumps.

Another freshman, Kail Pope from Charlo, Mont., is making progress in the hurdle events. Chris Lords, a sprinter from Stevensville, Mont., is showing versatility in the early season; he will be competing in the 400m, but also could compete in the 200m and the long jump. Rounding out the MSUB roster in sprints are freshmen Tyler Delaney, Devontae Richardson, and sophomores Cale Howells and Dominique Holt. Nels Flanagon is the lone competitor for MSUB in the throws this indoor season.

"Our freshman class this year has a lot of talent," Coach Collins said. "It is too early to tell where they will end up; however we can see where they are after this first meet."

On the women's side, GNAC champion senior Corrie Holm looks to lead her team out of the bottom spot the

Yellowjackets found themselves in last season at the conference meet.

"We have a small, but very talented women's indoor team," Coach Collins commented on the MSUB women's roster. "The women's team is trying to get out of the bottom spot at conference this year. We don't like being there. The team has the potential to do that, we need to increase the roster size and talent to keep climbing, but still I know this year we have the capability to do some very exciting things."

Holm returns to the Yellowjackets the GNAC champion in the outdoor discus event. At the indoor meets she will be competing in the weight throw. Holm, a Billings West High School product, was also an all-region award winner last season.

Senior Corrie Holm In the sprints, junior Blair Street is redshirting the indoor season, but should be ready to go for the outdoor season. A junior from Havre, Mont., Ashlynn Van Voast will compete in the hurdles and the relays for MSUB. Kaytlin Halle is a junior transfer from the University of Great Falls and will compete in the hurdles and sprints for MSUB.

Crossing over from the cross country team are Melanie Bock, Bailey Bomar, Brielle Davis, Jordan Donaghy, Nocona Frame, Rio Frame, Jinise Osborne, and Taylor Condon.

Last season, sisters Nocona and Rio Frame set new MSUB women's indoor records. Nocona holds the record in the women's mile with a time of 5:15.36 while Rio is now the 3,000m record holder in a time of 10:27.82. Davis is a transfer student from Gillette College and had a very successful two-year career as a Pronghorn. For Gillette, Davis ran the women's mile, the steeplechase, and was on two relay teams. The Skyview High School graduate was also an Academic All-American.

Also setting a new MSUB indoor record last year was Hope Reid. A sophomore from Thompson Falls, Mont., Reid set the 60m hurdles record in 9.36 seconds at the Yellow Jacket Holiday Open last year. At the GNAC Indoor Championships, Reid was fourth in the pole vault. "Hurdles are Hope's main event," Coach Collins said on the sophomore. "She keeps improving in the pole vault so we are expecting her to break into the top-3 this year, but also in the hurdles we think she can be top-8 in the conference."

Courtney Henry is a sophomore and is also a member of the MSUB women's basketball team. Henry will join the track and

field team at the conclusion of the basketball season and will compete in javelin during the outdoor season for the Yellow-jackets.

The freshman class for the women's team includes Bomar, Lacey Waid, Brandi Risa, Amanda Nichols, and Brianna Gray.

Risa and Nichols both compete in the pole vault. Risa is redshirting the indoor season this year. Nichols, a Bella Vista High School graduate has some exciting results coming out of high school. "We expect Amanda to really progress late in the season, and hopefully will be able to come through in the top-3 in the conference," Collins said.

Waid is redshirting the indoor season for the Yellowjackets. Gray, a standout from Park City, Mont., was an all-state honoree in track and Coach Collins is looking for some big things from her in the sprints. "We are definitely expecting great things from Brianna," Collins commented. "Her high school marks already make her competitive in the conference. She will be competing in the 60m and the 200m, but she will also be on the 4x400 relay, which will be great practice for her."

All of the women on the MSUB roster are from the state of Montana. There are three seniors, seven juniors, three sophomores, and five freshmen on the team.

On Jan. 16 the team travels to Montana State University for a competition with the Yellowjackets wrapping up the month of January at the Mountain State Games in Pocatello, Idaho hosted by Idaho State University. The team then has a meet in Gillette, Wyo., on Feb. 6, before the GNAC Indoor Championships Feb. 20, in Nampa, Idaho.

"After the first meet, we will get to see where the student-athletes are in the conference," Coach Collins said. "After the mid-January mark, it will be all about competing with the GNAC schools. We won't get to see any of the conference athletes during the season, so it will be a check-in every week to see where the athletes are. In the meantime, our competition will be DI schools, which is a great opportunity to rise to the occasion and compete against some really quality athletes."
