STORYLINES

- Making its second-straight NCAA Tournament appearance, the 14-seed Montana State Bobcats will take on the 3-seed Kansas State Wildcats in Greensboro, N.C. on Friday, March 17 at 9:40 p.m. local time. The game will be televised on CBS with Ian Eagle, Jim Spanarkel and Evan Washburn on the call.
- Montana State is coming off winning back-to-back Big Sky Conference Tournament titles for the first time in school history. Under fourth-year head coach Danny Sprinkle, this year is the fourth-straight season with a winning record and the first back-to-back 25-win season since 1927-29. Winners of the past eight games, MSU enters the NCAA Tournament with the 12th-longest win streak in the nation.
- The Bobcats are the Big Sky's first repeat champion since Montana went back-to-back from 2017-19. MSU is 0-4 all-time in the NCAA Tournament, but will look to snap the Big Sky's 17-year drought since its last tournament win. The last time a Big Sky school won an NCAA Tournament game was 2006, when 12-seed Montana upset 5-seed Nevada. Coincidentally, current MSU assistant coach Andy Hill was an assistant on Larry Krystkowiak's staff during that Montana upset.
- The Bobcats are 81-42 during Sprinkle's four-year tenure. His .658 winning percentage over the past four years is second in program history to the Bobcats' win percentage of .854 from 1926-30.
- MSU's league-leading defense helped the Bobcats go 15-3 in conference play. Against Big Sky opponents, the Bobcats ranked first in points per game allowed (64.3), first in turnover margin (+3.61), first in steals per game (6.94), second in blocks per game (3.11) and third in field goal percentage defense (43.9%). MSU's offense wasn't too shabby either, as it ranked second in the Big Sky in field goal percentage (46.8%) and fourth in free throw percentage (76.0%).
- Friday's game will be the first meeting between Montana State and Kansas State since Nov. 30, 1974, when the Wildcats beat the Bobcats 96-73 in Manhattan, Kan. MSU has a 1-3 record all-time against the Wildcats, with its only win being a 45-38 victory in Bozeman on Dec. 22, 1942.
- Kansas State is the second Big 12 school MSU has played in the NCAA Tournament. Last year as the 14-seed, MSU fell 97-62 to 3-seed Texas Tech in the first round.
- Nine members of the current roster — Jubrile Belo, Tyler Patterson, Nick Gazelas, RaeQuan Battle, Patrick McMahon, Great Osobor, Sam Lecholot, Carter Ash and Patrick McMahon — are the only Bobcats in history to make multiple NCAA Tournament appearances during their playing careers. They are second only to Danny Sprinkle, whose two appearances as a head coach and another as a player on the 1996 NCAA Tournament team is the most in MSU history.
- Transfers Darius Brown II (CSUN), Robert Ford III (Idaho State) and Caleb Fuller (UC Davis) are making their first NCAA Tournament appearances, along with freshmen Luca Colceag and Jed Miller.
- First Team All-Big Sky Selection RaeQuan Battle leads the Bobcats on offense by averaging 17.4 points per game on 46.7% shooting from the field. In MSU's last outing against Northern Arizona, he led all scorers with 25 points en route to being named the Big Sky Tournament MVP. He is the second-straight Bobcat to win tournament MVP, joining Xavier Bishop, who won it last year.
- Montana State had four individuals recognized by the Big Sky Conference earlier this month as the league announced its award winners. RaeQuan Battle earned First Team All-Big Sky honors, Jubrile Belo became the first player in conference history to earn all-conference honors for the fourth time by making the Second Team, plus Darius Brown II earned a spot on the Third Team while also earning Big Sky Defensive Player of the Year honors. Great Osobor rounded out the individual awards by being named the Big Sky's Top Reserve. This year marks the second-straight season in which MSU has had a First Team All-Big Sky selection, the conference's Defensive Player of the Year and the Top Reserve.
- Belo and Osobor combine for one of the biggest one-two front-court punches in all of mid-major basketball. Belo is one of five active Division I players to amass over 1,500 career points, 700 rebounds and 150 career blocks, joining Trayce Jackson-Davis (Indiana), Armando Bacot (North Carolina), Jake Stephens (Chattanooga) and Grant Basile (Virginia Tech). Osobor, on the other hand, averages 10.0 points and 4.5 rebounds per game in a mere 18.7 minutes per game.
- MSU's stint in Greensboro is a full-circle moment, of sorts, for the program. During Sprinkle's first year in 2019-20, the Bobcats won three games in UNC Greensboro's Spartan Invitational — highlighted with a half-court buzzer-beater from Harald Frey to beat the Spartans.

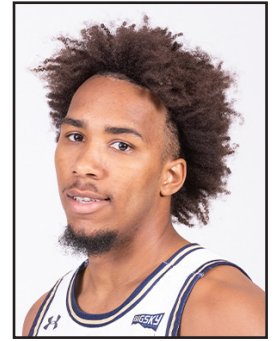

PRESEASON OUTLOOK

■ The Bobcats are led by fourth-year head coach Danny Sprinkle, who starred on the 1995-96 Montana State men's basketball team that made the NCAA Tournament. Over 20 years later, Sprinkle brought Montana State back to the NCAA Tournament as the Bobcats were outright Big Sky Champions in 2022. MSU has had a winning record in all three seasons under Sprinkle. He was unanimously named the Big Sky Conference's Coach of the Year last season, and was a finalist for the Hugh Durham award, an award honored to the top mid-major head coach in Division I.

■ MSU was picked to repeat as conference champions in the Big Sky Conference Preseason Media and Coaches' Polls.

■ This year marks the first time that MSU's men's and women's basketball teams were picked atop the Big Sky Conference's preseason polls. Additionally, both Big Sky Preseason Players of the Year were Bobcats: Jubrile Belo was the men's MVP and guard Darian White was named the women's MVP.

ROSTER

■ The Bobcats will replace three starters from last season: First Team All-Big Sky point guard Xavier Bishop, Honorable Mention selection Amin Adamu and Abdul Mohamed. Bishop led the team with 13.9 points

and 4.7 assists per game and earned Big Sky Tournament MVP honors after averaging 15.7 points, 4.0 rebounds and 4.3 assists during the Bobcats' postseason run. Adamu, a 1,000-point scorer, averaged 11.4 points and 4.7 rebounds per game for Montana State; whereas Mohamed was the team's second-leading rebounder at 6.5 per game.

■ The other returning starter from last season is Tyler Patterson, who averaged 7.1 points in 22.7 minutes per game last year. The sharpshooting wing connected on 37.6% of his three-pointers and he led the team with 64 made threes.

■ The Big Sky's Co-Reserve of the Year RaeQuan Battle will look to improve on his solid first season in a Montana State uniform. Last year, the Washington transfer made the most of his 17.3 minutes per game, averaging 8.5 points and 2.4 rebounds while coming off the bench in all 35 contests.

■ Other returners from the 2021-22 roster this season are Carter Ash, Nick Gazelas, Great Osobor, Sam Lecholat and Patrick McMahon. Osobor blossomed into an ideal backup for Belo by averaging 6.0 points and 4.2 rebounds in 15 minutes per game while playing at the five. Gazelas provided shooting off the bench, while Lecholat, a true freshman last season, saw time at power forward.

Ash and McMahon both played reserve roles.

■ The Bobcats have five newcomers on the roster — three of whom were key contributors on their previous teams. Darius Brown II (Cal State Northridge) and Robert Ford III (Idaho State) will look to fill the void at point guard left by Xavier Bishop.

■ Brown II averaged 9.2 points, 3.9 rebounds and 4.5 assists during four seasons at CSUN, the most recent of which was curtailed due to an injury. Brown II was an All-Big West selection during the 2020-21 season, when he averaged 10.5 points, 4.8 rebounds and 5.3 assists per game. He comes to Montana State with two years of eligibility remaining.

■ Ford III is a familiar face to the Bobcats after transferring from Big Sky program Idaho State. Ford III was an honorable mention all-conference selection as a junior in 2020-21; he played nine games last season before redshirting due to an injury.

■ UC Davis transfer Caleb Fuller rounds out the newcomers, averaging 7.8 points and 3.1 rebounds per game in his four years as an Aggie.

■ MSU's remaining two newcomers are freshmen: guard Jed Miller and forward Luca Colceag. The true freshmen,

who are roommates, took starkly different paths to Bozeman: Miller prepped at Southern California Academy this past year after a decorated high school career at Agoura Hills High School. Colceag was a mainstay on Romania's U18, U20 and local professional teams.

■ The Montana State men's basketball roster once again has a British flair, mostly due to Assistant Coach Chris Haslam. Haslam, who is from Southport, England, has helped bring three Englishmen to Bozeman: Belo (London), Fuller (Ipswich) and Osobor (Bradford).

TRENDS

■ On offense, the Bobcats have been led by RaeQuan Battle, who averages 17.4 points per game. The reigning Co-Big Sky Reserve of the Year has finished in double-figures 30 times, including nine 20-point outings and two 30-point nights. Going into this season, Battle's career-high was 19 points; he has surpassed that 11 times this year. Battle also scored his 1,000th collegiate career point in the Big Sky Quarterfinal game against Northern Colorado on March 5.

■ As a team, the Bobcats have had a balanced offensive attack. Twelve different Bobcats have had double-digit scoring outings this year and five different players have led MSU in scoring (RaeQuan Battle, Jubrile Belo, Great Osobor,

Patrick McMahon and Darius Brown II). Additionally, eight of the 14 players on the roster have set new career-high scoring nights this season.

■ Darius Brown II has shown off his versatility in his first year in Bozeman. The redshirt junior point guard is the one of two players in the Big Sky to have double-digit scoring (multiple times), rebounding (11 vs. Eastern Washington) and assist (two times) nights. Cedric Coward of Eastern Washington is the other player to accomplish this feat; he did so with a 10-point, 13-rebound, 10-assist triple-double against Northwest Indian College. This season, he has surpassed 1,000 collegiate career points and 500 collegiate assists.

■ Montana State has one of the Big Sky Conference's best all-around players in fifth-year senior forward Jubrile Belo. The London, England native became one of three players ever in Big Sky Conference history to win the conference's MVP and Defensive MVP awards in the same season last year. Belo averaged 12.8 points (on 57.9% shooting) and 6.7 rebounds per game while also leading the Big Sky with 60 blocks. Earlier this fall, he was named the Big Sky Preseason MVP and was a unanimous selection to the Preseason All-Conference team.

■ Against Northern Arizona on February 2, 2023, Belo broke

Montana State's career blocks record with two rejections in the first half. His 150th career block on NAU guard Jalen Cone moved him ahead of Dwayne "Dewey" Michaels' mark of 149, which he accumulated from 1991-95.

■ One week later against Weber State, Belo became one of five active Division I players with 1,500 points, 700 rebounds and 150 career blocks. The others are Indiana's Trayce Jackson-Davis, North Carolina's Armando Bacot, Virginia Tech's Grant Basile and Chattanooga's Jake Stephens.

OCTOBER

■ In its lone exhibition game, Danny Sprinkle's Montana State Bobcats hosted MSU Hall of Fame inductee Mick Durham and his Montana State University Billings Yellowjackets on Oct. 30. Although the game was a rust-buster for both squads, it marked the first time Durham — who coached Sprinkle from 1995-99 — made his return to Worthington Arena. The Bobcats would prevail 56-49 in the defensive slug-fest.

■ Montana State's exhibition against MSU Billings would end up pitting two NCAA Tournament teams against each other, albeit from different divisions. Mick Durham went on to lead the Yellowjackets to the NCAA Division II Men's Basketball Tournament for the first time since 2012.

NOVEMBER

■ MSU kicked off the season with a three-game road trip at Grand Canyon, Long Beach State and Oregon — three teams that won 20 or more games last season. Montana State's non-conference schedule features five teams that made the postseason last year: Long Beach State (NIT), Oregon (NIT), UNC Greensboro (CBI), Middle Tennessee State (CBI) and Arizona (Sweet Sixteen).

■ With the 106-point outing at home against Warner Pacific, the Bobcats have scored 100 or more points in a game at least once in the last three seasons.

■ A challenging three-game stretch in Montreal, Canada for the Northern Classic tested the Bobcats earlier this year. Playing against three quality mid-major schools in UNC Greensboro, Quinnipiac and Middle Tennessee State — all of whom showed vastly different styles of play — the Bobcats went 0-3 over Thanksgiving Week.

■ The final game, a 72-71 heartbreaker against Middle Tennessee State, was historic for the Bobcats. Not only was this the first-ever meeting between the two teams, but the game also featured a 16-assist outing from redshirt junior point guard Darius Brown II. This effort was not only a career-high for Brown, but also

tied for the single-game record in Montana State history. Brown II leads the team with 5.2 assists per game and his 16-assist night is the best so far amongst Big Sky players.

■ The Bobcats capped off the five-game road trip with a thrilling 86-83 win at former Big Sky opponent Southern Utah on Nov. 30. RaeQuan Battle played the hero by scoring eight of MSU's final 10 points — including the game-winning steal and go-ahead layup with less than three seconds to go to seal the win.

■ Battle's game-winner was the second of his MSU career. His first was a buzzer-beating three from the logo that downed Northern Colorado in the home finale last year.

DECEMBER

■ Against St. Thomas on Dec. 8, the Bobcats recorded their third-straight game in which they shot better than 50% from the field. The 82-65 win was an all-around effort: 10 different Bobcats scored and six finished in double-figures. Defensively, the Bobcats held the Tommies — who once were in the nation's top-10 in field goal percentage and three-point shooting — to a season-low 27.6% from the field.

■ Two days later against Omaha, the Bobcats earned their biggest win over a Division I opponent in the 82-54 rout of

the Mavericks. For the third-straight game, the Bobcats scored more than 80 points, plus 10 of 14 Bobcats who saw the floor scored. Great Osobor was the catalyst in the win, leading MSU with a season-high 18 points on 7-for-9 shooting off the bench.

■ For the second-straight season, the Bobcats broke their single-game scoring record with a 144-59 win over Northwest Indian College. Seven different Bobcats finished in double-figures and all 14 players contributed points to the record-setting night. MSU also made 53 field goals — including 23 threes — and shot 67.1% from the floor, all of which rank second-all time.

■ Montana State gave No. 5 Arizona its best shot for 25 minutes during its 85-64 loss in the non-conference finale on Dec. 20. Jubrile Belo led the way with 18 points (on 7-for-8 shooting) against Arizona's vaunted front-court, plus RaeQuan Battle (17 points) bounced back after getting an elbow to the face early in the first half. The Bobcats pulled within nine points of the Wildcats midway through the second half, but poor free-throw and three-point shooting led to the loss.

■ The game at Arizona was MSU's first against an AP Top 25 opponent since opening the 2019-20 season at No. 19 Utah State.

THE STORY SO FAR — LATE DECEMBER BRINGS THE START OF BIG SKY PLAY

■ Due to its difficult non-conference schedule, the Bobcats led the Big Sky in the final NET Rankings before league play. MSU ranked 124th out of 363 Division I teams in the final NET rankings before conference play, while also having the best win percentage at .538 (7-6).

■ Entering conference play, Montana State rode a 13-game winning streak in Worthington Arena, which dates back to Jan. 1, 2022. This streak is the second-longest in program history, trailing the 15-game home win streak set during the 1986-87 season.

■ Montana State extended its home win streak to 14 with a 72-58 conference-opening win over Idaho on Dec. 29. At the time, the Bobcats were 6-1 against the Vandals under head coach Danny Sprinkle, plus they are 5-1 in their last six Big Sky Conference home openers.

■ Tyler Patterson was the hero against the Vandals, pouring in 17 points off the bench (on 6-for-11 shooting) — 14 of which came in the first half. His five made threes were also a season-best.

■ In the win over Idaho on Dec. 29, the Bobcats held Big Sky leading scorer Isaac Jones to six points on 3-for-6 shooting. Divant'e Moffitt tied Jubrile Belo for the game-high with 19 points, yet he did so on

8-for-20 shooting. As a team, MSU limited the hot-shooting Vandals — who came into the game shooting 50.2% from the field — only made 40% of their field goals.

■ Darius Brown II led the way for the Bobcats with an 18-point, 11-rebound double-double in a 70-67 home loss to Eastern Washington on New Year's Eve. Brown II helped spark the MSU offense by scoring 12 of his points in the second half — most of which were on threes. His 18 points and 11 rebounds were season-highs, plus it was the third double-double of his career.

■ Going into the Eastern Washington game, the Bobcats were riding a 14-game home win streak, which was the second-longest in program history. The Bobcats also went 366 days between home losses (Dec. 30, 2021 through Dec. 31, 2022).

JANUARY

■ The Bobcats kicked off 2023 by handing Northern Colorado a thorough beat-down in a 77-56 road win on Jan. 5. MSU's defense held former Big Sky leading scorer Dalton Knecht to eight points on 4-for-11 shooting — well off his 25.5 points per game average in conference play — and Daylen Kountz to seven points on 2-for-9 shooting. Northern Colorado didn't make a three in the first half and finished

4-for-17 (23.5%) from beyond the arc.

■ MSU's front-court was the difference in the win. Jubrile Belo led the way with a team-high 17 points and 8 rebounds, plus Great Osobor chipped in 15 points and 5 rebounds off the bench. Sam Lecholot re-entered the starting lineup in Caleb Fuller's stead and contributed with seven points and a career-high nine rebounds.

■ MSU held Northern Colorado to a mere 20 points in the first half and maintained a 20-point lead for most of the game. The 20 first-half points allowed ties the team's season-best, which occurred in the first half against Idaho on Dec. 29.

■ The win at Northern Colorado marked the first of two milestones of the week for Darius Brown II, who dished out his 500th collegiate career assist in the win. Brown II finished with 10 points, seven assists, three rebounds and two steals.

■ With the win over the Bears, head coach Danny Sprinkle picked up his 65th win, tying Brian Fish for 10th all-time at Montana State.

■ The Bobcats wrapped up their first conference road trip with a 69-54 win at Northern Arizona on Jan. 7. Although NAU pulled within eight points three times in the second half, a late run sparked by Darius Brown II put NAU away.

■ The win at Northern Arizona had another milestone for Brown II, who scored his 1,000th collegiate career point with a long three in the second half.

■ For the second-straight game, MSU's defense put the clamps on one of the Big Sky's leading scorers. This time, Jalen Cone — who came into the game averaging 17.8 points per game on 42.5% shooting — only managed 12 points on 2-for-10 (20%) shooting against the Bobcats.

■ The win at Northern Arizona also marked another big game for Tyler Patterson, who scored 15 points, went 5-for-8 from the field and grabbed a career-high six rebounds. The sharpshooter from Snoqualmie, Wash. has connected on 38.9% of his threes in Big Sky play.

■ Northern Arizona marked Danny Sprinkle's 66th win as a head coach, bringing him to a tie for 9th all-time at MSU with Bruce Haroldson (1978-82).

■ Montana State returned to Brick Breeden Fieldhouse for their first home conference games of the new year and rolled past Idaho State in an 81-68 win on Jan. 12.

■ For the third-straight game, the Bobcat defense put the clamps on another one of the Big Sky's top scorers. This time the victim was Brock Mack-

enzie, who came in averaging 14.1 points per game, but only managed four points on 2-for-6 shooting.

■ The Bobcats turned around their free-throw shooting woes against the Bengals by making their first 10 free throws and finishing the game going 25-for-28 from the charity stripe. MSU made all six of its free throws in the final 90 seconds as ISU tried mounting a comeback.

■ RaeQuan Battle put on a show against the Bengals, as he scored a game-high 19 points off a flurry of dunks in the second half. He was the beneficiary of two alley-oops in the second half, which fired up the crowd of 2,000.

■ The win over the Bengals marked another notable night for Darius Brown II, who has quickly become one of the conference's most efficient scorers. Brown II scored 18 points on 6-for-10 from the field, plus 2-for-3 from three.

■ Exacting revenge for a home loss at the hands of Weber State last season, Montana State held the Wildcats to a season-low 52 points in a 67-52 home win on Jan. 14. Jubrile Belo's 17-point, 12-rebound double-double led the way for the Bobcats, RaeQuan Battle scored the bulk of his 12 points on highlight-reel dunks, plus Darius Brown II nearly had

his second-career triple-double with nine points, eight assists and seven rebounds.

■ After the Weber State win, the Bobcats rose up to 107th in the NCAA's latest NET rankings — the highest finish for MSU since the statistic was implemented in 2018.

■ Playing in the team's third game in five days, Montana State fell 74-70 at Idaho on Jan. 16. The Bobcats trailed throughout the entire game, yet nearly completed the comeback several times in the last two minutes. RaeQuan Battle led the Bobcats with 22 points for his seventh 20-point outing of the year, while 11 of Jubrile Belo's 15-point, 11-rebound double-double came mostly from the charity stripe.

■ Winning in Dahlberg Arena for the first time since 2010, Montana State held on for a 67-64 win against Montana in the teams' first Brawl of the Wild game of the year on Jan. 21.

■ Combined with the women's team's 72-63 win, Jan. 21 was the fourth time that both Bobcat basketball programs swept the Grizzlies on the road.

■ In his first Brawl of the Wild game, Darius Brown II led all scorers with 23 points — on an efficient 9-for-13 showing — plus added two steals and two assists. His 23 points were not

only a season-best at the time, but also were three off tying his career record of 26.

■ RaeQuan Battle added 18 points for the Bobcats for his first win in Missoula during his college career. His three free throws in the final minute ended up giving MSU the lead for good; he finished 4-for-4 from the charity stripe and shot 7-for-12 from the field.

■ The Brawl of the Wild win marked head coach Danny Sprinkle's first win in Missoula as a head coach. As a player, he had a 5-4 record against the Griz.

■ Montana State used 19 points from RaeQuan Battle, a season-high 18 from Caleb Fuller, plus a 17-point, 11-rebound double-double to pull away from Portland State on Jan. 26.

■ Fuller's 18-point night was his career-best in a Montana State uniform and the sixth time this season he has finished in double-figure scoring.

■ Great Osobor's 17-point, 10-rebound double-double was his second of the season and invaluable, as Jubrile Belo only played 13 minutes in the win.

■ The win at Portland State win marked the 70th in Danny Sprinkle's head coaching career.

■ Montana State wrapped up its longest road swing of Big Sky Conference play by beating Sacramento State 72-65 on Jan. 28. The Bobcats handed the Hornets their first home loss of the season; Sacramento State was 8-0 heading into the game against MSU.

■ In that game, RaeQuan Battle had a career-night with 32 points — including 10 in the final four minutes — which was bolstered by a perfect 12-for-12 showing from the charity stripe. Battle's 12 made free throws were a single-game program record for most free throws without a miss.

FEBRUARY

■ Montana State clawed back to beat Northern Arizona on a go-ahead layup from Great Osobor with 3.8 seconds left in a 69-68 win on Feb. 2. It was the first time all season that MSU trailed at halftime and won.

■ The win was historic for Jubrile Belo, whose two blocks in the first half gave him the Montana State all-time career record with 150 blocks. Belo also notched a 19-point, 10-rebound double-double in the win.

■ The Feb. 2 win over the Lumberjacks was head coach Danny Sprinkle's 72nd win as a head coach, matching the number of wins he had as a player from 1995-99.

■ Montana State picked up win no. 10 in Big Sky Conference play with a wire-to-wire, 75-62 win over Northern Colorado on Feb. 4. Jubrile Belo's 19 points led the way, while Tyler Patterson scored 15 points — all of five three pointers, which ties his season high. RaeQuan Battle chipped in 15 points, while Darius Brown II dished out 12 assists to go along with his two points.

■ The Bobcats also got valuable minutes from Robert Ford III, who scored a MSU-career-high 12 points off the bench.

■ Montana State suffered a setback in a 73-63 loss at Weber State on Thursday, Feb. 9. The Bobcats had a five-point lead at halftime but gave up a 12-0 run midway through the second half that became the knockout blow. The game was just the second time MSU has lost after leading at halftime this season.

■ Great Osobor came off the bench to lead the Bobcats with 15 points on an efficient 6-for-9 shooting — bolstered by making his first four field goal attempts. Defensively, he added a pair of steals and blocks.

■ One bright spot from the Weber State game was senior forward Jubrile Belo eclipsing the 1,500-point threshold and moving up to eighth on MSU's all-time leading scorer list. The player he passed, coincidentally, was current Montana State

head coach Danny Sprinkle, who scored 1,497 points from 1995-99.

■ With that feat, Belo became one of five active Division I players with 1,500 points, 700 rebounds and 150 career blocks. The others are Indiana's Trayce Jackson-Davis, North Carolina's Armando Bacot, Virginia Tech's Grant Basile and Chattanooga's Jake Stephens.

■ The Bobcats bounced back with a low-scoring, 58-52 win over Idaho State on Feb. 11. MSU made four of its eight second-half field goals in the final five minutes, plus Darius Brown II was a perfect 10-for-10 from the charity stripe to help seal the deal.

■ Brown II showed why he is one of the best defenders in the Big Sky against the Bengals. His four steals led to four MSU field goals in the first half. He finished with 14 points, six rebounds and a game-high four steals.

■ Continuing his recent stretch of solid play, Great Osobor notched his third double-double with 14 points and 12 rebounds off the bench.

■ In front of a crowd of 6,696 people, Montana State beat Montana 72-68 on Feb. 18 for the program's first Brawl of the Wild sweep over the Grizzlies since 2010. With the women's

basketball team also sweeping the Lady Griz, this season marks the first time since 1999 that MSU basketball has gone 4-0 against Montana.

■ RaeQuan Battle led the Bobcats in scoring against the Griz with 19 points on an efficient 6-for-12 shooting, plus he added five rebounds, two assists and two steals.

■ In one of the more interesting stat lines achieved all year, Great Osobor tallied 14 points on 1-for-1 shooting from the field and 12-for-14 shooting from the free-throw line against the Griz. He also had three rebounds, two assists and a block while drawing nine fouls. Osobor's 12 made free throws is tied for eighth-most in a single game in MSU history.

■ Quickly becoming one MSU's more memorable figures in the Brawl of the Wild series in recent memory, Darius Brown II added 14 points, three assists and three pivotal steals against the Griz. Late in the first half, Brown II caused back-to-back turnovers — including helping lock down the Griz on a shot clock violation — that gave the Bobcats momentum.

■ Montana State picked up its 20th win in a 60-56 victory over the Sacramento State Hornets on Feb. 23. The win marked the first time the Bobcats have notched back-to-back seasons since 1994-96

■ Jubrile Belo led the team with 17 points, a season-high four blocks and three steals, while his younger counterpart Great Osobor chipped in 15 points, three rebounds and three blocks off the bench.

■ Osobor's transition scoring would spark the Bobcat offense on multiple occasions in the low-scoring game, as his plays helped the team overcome several long stretches without a made field goal. He also drew a flagrant foul on a breakaway layup attempt with 3.8 seconds to play and split a pair of free throws to seal the win.

■ The win over Sacramento State was a rare occasion in which MSU lost the battle of the boards, was out-shot, scored 60 points or fewer and still won the game.

■ With the win, Eastern Washington's win and Weber State's loss on Thursday, Montana State sealed its status as the 2-seed in the Big Sky Conference Championships, held in Boise, Idaho.

■ Following the close home win over Sacramento State, the Bobcats sent seniors Jubrile Belo and Caleb Fuller off on a high note with a 91-78 win over Portland State on Feb. 25. In front of a crowd of over 4,000 fans, the Montana State offense had its highest scoring output against Division I com-

petition with 91 points despite only going 3-for-5 from the three-point line.

■ Jubrile Belo led the team with 21 points and 11 rebounds — his 20th career double-double — in his final game in Worthington Arena. He also leapt up to sixth all-time on MSU's career scoring list with 1,544 points in the win.

■ RaeQuan Battle notched his seventh 20-point scoring night of the season with 20 points, while Great Osobor added 14 points and eight rebounds off the bench. Not to be overlooked, Darius Brown II flirted with a triple-double with 14 points, seven assists and seven rebounds.

■ The win over Portland State marked the second time in the last three games in which MSU made 32 free throws. The Bobcats got the bulk of their offense from drawing fouls in the month of February, as MSU went 32-for-41 from the charity stripe against Montana on Feb. 18. MSU went 32-for-43 against Portland State.

■ Montana State capped off the regular-season slate with a 79-74 win at Eastern Washington on Feb. 27. This marked the team's first win in Cheney, Wash. since 2011.

■ Darius Brown II led MSU with 18 points — including two late threes that beat the shot

clock — while Jubrile Belo and RaeQuan Battle added 16 points apiece. Yet Robert Ford III's 12-point, 10-rebound double-double with a late offensive rebound to seal the game was the most consequential performance down the stretch.

■ MSU's win at Eastern Washington gave the team at least one win over every other Big Sky Conference team this season.

MARCH

■ Montana State opened the Big Sky Conference Tournament with an 84-73 win over Northern Colorado in the quarterfinal round on Sunday, March 5.

■ Caleb Fuller had one of the best games in his MSU career to spark the Bobcats. Playing in his first Big Sky Tournament game, the UC Davis transfer finished with 18 points — including tying his career-high with 14 made threes — to help the Bobcats gap the Bears in the first half.

■ Jubrile Belo also chipped in 18 points and eight rebounds, while his younger counterpart Great Osobor added 15 points off the bench, proving why he was named the Big Sky's Top Reserve.

■ RaeQuan Battle scored 21 points to lead MSU. Battle scored his 1,000th career point in the first half on a mid-

range floater.

■ The quarterfinal win, plus Eastern Washington's upset loss, moved MSU into #25 in the College Insider Mid-Major poll for the first time this season.

■ In the semifinals on March 7, Montana State outlasted Weber State 60-58 in a double-overtime, defensive slug-fest. Redshirt junior point guard Darius Brown II found junior guard RaeQuan Battle for a lob with less than two seconds to play to pull ahead for good.

■ The semifinal game was MSU's first multi-overtime game since losing to Southern Utah 109-105 in triple overtime in the 2017 league tourney. It was also the lowest scoring multi-overtime game for MSU since beating Nevada 58-57 in 3OT on Jan. 16, 1948.

■ Battle shook off early shooting woes to lead MSU with 17 points, Great Osobor chipped in 16 points off the bench while having the toughest defensive assignment of the night, Weber State forward Dillon Jones. Darius Brown II finished with four points, a MSU-career-high 11 rebounds and six assists while only turning the ball over two times in 49 minutes.

■ Less than 24 hours after the Weber State win, the Bobcats won back-to-back Big Sky Con-

ference Tournament titles for the first time in program history with an 85-78 win over 9-seed Northern Arizona on March 8.

■ The win gave Danny Sprinkle a 13-4 record in the Big Sky Tournament as a player and as a head coach. Sprinkle boasts an 8-1 record as a head coach in his first three Big Sky Tournaments. All other MSU coaches have posted a combined 11-11 record in the conference tournament.

■ RaeQuan Battle led all scorers with 25 points on 11-for-14 shooting to earn Big Sky Tournament MVP honors. This marks back-to-back years in which a Bobcat has won the award; last year, senior guard Xavier Bishop was the Big Sky Tournament MVP.

■ With 14 points in the title game, Jubrile Belo set the school scoring record in the conference tournament with 122 points. Belo also made the All-Big Sky Tournament team.

■ Montana State's back-to-back titles gave the Big Sky its first repeat champion since Montana did so in 2018-19.

■ Making its fifth NCAA Tournament appearance in program history (1951, 1986, 1996, 2022, 2023), the Bobcats earned a 14-seed in the East Region on Selection Sunday. This Friday, March 17, they will play 3-seed Kansas State for

just the fourth time ever in the Greensboro Coliseum at 9:40 p.m. ET.

Head Coach Danny Sprinkle

Fourth Season

Hometown: Helena, Mont.

Alma Mater: Montana State, 2000

Danny Sprinkle, one of Montana State's most accomplished basketball players during his career in the late 1990s, was appointed the program's 23rd men's basketball coach on April 4, 2019. Sprinkle, in his third season at the helm of the program during the 2021-22 slate, guided the Bobcats to heights they hadn't seen this century.

Montana State wrapped up a 27-8 overall record with a loss to No. 3 Texas Tech in the West Region First Round of the NCAA Tournament on March 18. MSU's trip to the NCAA Tournament was just its fourth ever appearance and first in 26 years. The 27 victories were the most for the program since the Golden Bobcats era which saw the 1928 and 1929 teams each go 36-2, while the 1927 squad went 30-7.

Sprinkle was honored for his 2021-22 squad's achievements with the Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year award. He also was named a Hugh Durham award finalist, presented annually to the top Division I mid-major coach in college basketball. MSU also finished the season in the Collegiansider.Com Men's Mid-Major Top 25 poll for the first time in 20 years.

The program saw plenty of in-season achievements over the course of the 2021-22 campaign. The Bobcats went 16-4

during Big Sky Conference play which featured four more victories in league action ever recorded by a Montana State team.

An 11-game winning streak during the regular season boosted the Bobcats up the Big Sky standings. The streak was MSU's longest overall span of wins in a row in 22 years while it stands as the second longest stretch in the program's Division I history.

The Bobcats won both the Big Sky's regular season and tournament titles. It served as just the second time the program has ever achieved both (joining the 1995-96 team) while the tournament championship was just MSU's third ever (1985-86 and 1995-96).

Three Bobcats ended the 2021-22 schedule as career 1,000 point scorers in Amin Adamu, Jubrile Belo and Xavier Bishop. Belo was a unanimous choice to the First Team All-Big Sky squad. He collected Big Sky Most Valuable and Defensive Player of the Year accolades to add to his resume. Bishop earned his First Team All-Big Sky selection as well. Adamu, the 40th member of MSU's 1,000-point club, was an honorable mention. Joining them with Big Sky honors was newcomer RaeQuan Battle who was the Big Sky Top Reserve honoree.

Sprinkle's squad continued to break the program's norms of late. MSU's 13-1 mark in its home confines was its third best ever record since Worthington Arena opened in 1957. The 'Cats completed a 9-6 road mark (excluding a neutral record of 5-1) which was just the program's fourth positive winning percentage in true away contests since 1963.

The team came together early in the season and it shaped a squad that became one of the best in a majority of statistical categories in the Big Sky Conference.

MSU led the league in scoring margin (7.2), field goal percentage defense (42.8%) and blocked shots per game (3.7). The Bobcats finished second in the Big Sky in scoring defense (69.3), free throw percentage (75.4%), rebound margin (4.1) and assists per game (13.2).

The 2021-22 season culminated with Sprinkle's head coaching record standing at 56-33. Sprinkle recorded the most



victories within his third season guiding the program since Schubert Dyche won 66 contests in a span from 1928-31. His .629 winning percentage is the second best for a Bobcat coach with over 40 victories trailing only Ott Romney's .829 mark he accumulated over six seasons in the 1920s.

Sprinkle's history-making 2021-22 squad was built off the success and foundation that was built in his first two seasons as head coach at Montana State.

His second-year squad achieved a variety of accomplishments over the course of the 2020-21 campaign. MSU achieved consecutive winning seasons for the first time in 19 years with its 13-10 overall record, while the team's winning percentage was its best since the program's last Big Sky regular season conference title won in 2002. The Bobcats' two straight years of top-five finishes in the Big Sky standings and spots in the Big Sky Tournament quarterfinals were the first time MSU completed the feat since the 1998 and 1999 seasons.

The Bobcat head coach became just the second individual to lead the program to winning records in their opening two seasons leading the men's program during MSU's Big Sky era. Sprinkle joined the likes of Bruce Haroldson (1978-80) with back-to-back opening winning seasons. His overall winning percentage (.537) over the two seasons narrowly trailed Haroldson's (.558).

Montana State's recent rise among its Big Sky peers was on display to end the 2020-21 season as the Bobcats returned to the Big Sky Conference tournament championship game for

the first time in 12 years. Sprinkle became the first Montana State head coach to lead the program to the Big Sky Championship game during his opening two seasons at the helm. The Bobcats had three players selected to All-Big Sky Conference Teams which were the most for Montana State since 2006.

Sprinkle's tenure got off to a strong start as MSU completed its 2019-20 schedule with a 16-15 overall record, its first winning record in 10 years. The 16 wins tied for the most for the program since the 2001-02 season which had been the last year MSU won a Big Sky regular season title. Sprinkle's 16 victories he recorded were the most for a first-year MSU coach since Hank Anderson guided the 1972-73 Bobcat team to 17 wins. He was named a finalist for the 2020 Joe B. Hall Award which is given annually to the nation's top first-year coach in Division I college basketball.

The Bobcats completed several in-season accomplishments under Sprinkle. MSU's first year guided by Sprinkle started off with near fireworks, as the Bobcats went to the wire to open the season against No. 17/19 Utah State. Playing seven newcomers at the Division I level, the Bobcats held a lead with just over five minutes remaining in the Cowan Spectrum before the Aggies took control topping MSU by 8.

MSU's next road trip proved more fruitful. The Bobcats traveled to Greensboro, North Carolina, and went undefeated in three games – which included a victory over host and eventual Quadrant I RPI UNCG – to win the Spartan Invitational. He made history during the regular season become MSU's first coach to ever win his debut at Weber State. Sprinkle spear-

headed one of the more dramatic turnarounds in Division I basketball on the defensive side of the floor during the 2019-20 season.

While MSU's offense continued to be among the top half of programs shooting from the field and at the free throw line, its defense made legitimate improvements. The Bobcats' scoring defense went from 336th in the NCAA to 111th between two seasons. MSU was outshot by opponents in just 11 games during the 2019-20 season as MSU ranked in the top 100 in defensive rebounds per game, field goal percentage defense and 3-point field goal defense.

Worthington Arena played host to one of its best attended seasons in recent memory thanks to Sprinkle as well as a crop of Bobcats. The Bobcats averaged 3,463 fans per contest which was the third highest in the Big Sky Conference and their most in over 10 years. MSU fans were treated to an All-Big Sky First Team season by senior Harald Frey who finished his college career as the third-ranked scorer in program history. Then sophomore Jubrile Belo hauled in Newcomer of the Year accolades from the Big Sky, becoming just the second Bobcat to win the award and the first in nearly 20 years.

A Helena High graduate, Sprinkle's coaching career began as a graduate assistant at Cal State Northridge in 2000-01. He spent all but two of the seasons since then – 2006-08, when he was a Bobcat assistant under Brad Huse – coaching in the Big West Conference. He worked at Cal State Northridge as a

full-time assistant from 2001-06 and 2008-13. He coached at Cal State Fullerton prior to his return to Bozeman.

Sprinkle added duties as recruiting coordinator at each of his coaching stops. He helped lead Cal State Fullerton to the NCAA Tournament in 2017-18 for just the third time in program history and the year before that the Titans competed in the CollegeInsider.com Tournament. He was also part of Cal State Northridge's 2001 and 2009 NCAA Tournament teams, with the Matadors winning the Big Sky regular season crown in 2001 and the Big West title in 2009.

As a Bobcat freshman in 1996, Sprinkle was a starter during the team's magical run to Big Sky regular season and tournament championships, landing All-Big Sky Tournament honors for his 30-point performance in the Championship. Sprinkle earned Big Sky Freshman of the Year honors in 1996 and was an all-league three consecutive seasons, including his first team selection in 1997. He held the MSU career and season three-point records upon graduation and remains the eighth-leading scorer in school history. Sprinkle is a member of the 1996 team that was inducted into the Montana State Athletics Hall of Fame in 2006 and will formally be inducted for his individual efforts in 2021. Born in Pullman, Wash., Sprinkle enjoyed an outstanding career at Helena High School which included all-state honors twice in basketball, while also competing in football and track. He graduated from Montana State in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in health and human development.





Assistant Coach Chris Haslam

Third Season - Tenth Overall at MSU

Hometown: Southport, England

Alma Mater: Wyoming, 1997

Chris Haslam's ninth year on the Bobcat coaching staff during the 2021-22 season, and third as a part of Danny Sprinkle's staff, was the best to date.

The Bobcats finished the 2021-22 campaign at 27-8 overall with a trip to the NCAA Tournament. MSU claimed both the Big Sky Conference, regular season and conference tournament titles, signifying just the second time the program has ever achieved the feat and the first time in 26 years.

Haslam brings a European flair and a big man's presence to the Montana State men's basketball program. The England native mentors MSU's big men while helping bring European talent to the Bobcat program. Haslam has recently played an important role in each facet.

Haslam has played a large role in the development of Jubrile Belo who has earned three straight All-Big Sky Conference selections. Belo was named the 2022 Big Sky Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year. He ranks among the top 10 all-time in program history in field goal percentage and now ranks second in career blocks after the 2021-22 season. Haslam also worked in developing MSU's forward's play and the improvement of freshman Great Osobor who finished the year averaging 6 points and 4.2 rebounds, including scoring double digits in three straight games leading to the conference title game.

The long-time Bobcat assistant has recruited a plethora of international talent to the MSU roster. MSU's roster was made up of 40% of student-athletes from outside the United States in 2019-20, including all-Big Sky First Team selection and captain of the Norwegian national team Harald Frey. In 2020-21, MSU's six international players accounted for 44 points per game, the second most in all of Division I basketball. The 2021-22 team ranked 10th in international scoring in Division I basketball averaging over 42 points per game.

The veteran coach on the Bobcat sideline was recognized by his peers during the 2020 offseason. Haslam was voted as one of the Big Sky Conference's top five assistant coaches by a selection of the league's assistants for Stadium Basketball.

Haslam attended Wyoming during his collegiate career where he started during most of his sophomore and junior seasons before injuries limited him to 18 games as a senior. After completing his career as a Cowboy in 1997, Haslam enjoyed a 13-year professional career in Greece, Italy, Germany, Belgium, the Czech Republic and Great Britain. Haslam played for the British national team for 10 years. He coached at Lamar (Colo.) Community College from 2010-13, helping that program to a Region IX title in 2010-11 and was a player-assistant for the professional Everton Tigers (2008-10) and Everton Academy (2009-10) as head coach. Haslam earned his bachelor's degree from Wyoming in 2010. He and his wife Melanie have two daughters.



Assistant Coach Johnny Hill

Seventh Season - First Overall at MSU

Hometown: Glendale Heights, Ill.

Alma Mater: Purdue, 2016

Johnny Hill joined the Montana State coaching staff in May of 2022 following two seasons on the sidelines at Idaho. Hill has been part of the college basketball landscape over a decade as either a coach or student-athlete.

Prior to tenure with the Vandals, Hill served two years as a Special Assistant to the Head Coach and a season as graduate assistant at Grand Canyon. During his three years with the program, the Lopes had a 55-43 record, including a 27-19 record in Western Athletic Conference games.

Hill began his coaching career as an assistant at the University of Northwestern Ohio, also acting as the head coach of the junior varsity team.

Hill began his collegiate playing career at Illinois State, earning the team's Most Improved Player award. He played two seasons at Texas Arlington, where he was named a team captain and started for the Mavericks. Hill completed his college playing career at Purdue, starting 11 games for a Boiler-maker team which was nationally ranked throughout the year. He helped the team earn a five seed in the 2016 NCAA Tournament.

Hill made the Academic Honor Roll at both Texas Arlington and Purdue. He earned his bachelor's degree from Texas Arlington before obtaining a master's degree in technology leadership and innovation from Purdue.



Assistant Coach Andy Hill

21st Season - First Overall at MSU

Hometown: Spokane, Wash.

Alma Mater: Whitworth, 2000

Andy Hill begins his first year as Montana State men's basketball's assistant coach in 2022-23. He brings nearly 20 years of experience as a Division I men's basketball coach to Bozeman.

Prior to Montana State, Hill served as the assistant coach at New Mexico in 2021-22. During his lone season in Albuquerque, he helped the Lobos see a seven-win improvement, from six wins the year before to 13 wins, despite playing half its games against NCAA and NIT competition. The Lobos, who led the Mountain West in scoring, defeated four NCAA Tournament teams during the season, their most wins over teams in the tournament in seven years. A win over No. 22 Wyoming was the Lobos' first ranked victory in three years.

Hill also served as an assistant coach at Utah for 10 seasons. At Utah, Hill helped lead the Utes to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 2015 and 2016, including a Sweet 16 appearance in 2015. In his tenure with the Utes, Hill also helped guide his teams to three NIT appearances including an NIT runner-up finish in 2018.

During his time at Utah, Hill was part of a staff that developed three, consecutive, first-round NBA Draft picks in Delon Wright (2015 Pac-12 First-Team All-Conference), Jakob Poeltl (2016 Pac-12 Player of the Year) and Kyle Kuzma (2017 First-Team All-Conference). During that stretch, the Utes were the only Pac-12 school to produce a first-round draft pick in three-consecutive years.

Hill helped the Utes to five consecutive 20-plus win seasons while also helping Utah to finish in the top four of the Pac 12 standings five times.

Prior to his tenure at Utah, Hill was an assistant coach at Montana for seven years where he helped lead the Grizzlies to three NCAA Tournament appearances. He was also a member of the 2005-06 coaching staff that helped Montana to its first NCAA Tournament game since 1975.

While at Montana, Hill helped guide the Grizzlies to the Big Sky Conference Tournament Championship game in four of his seven seasons. He helped coordinate Montana's Roundball Club annual coaching clinics and fundraising efforts and was also responsible for scheduling games, camps and recruiting. In addition, he organized community service events with the Missoula community and the state of Montana.

Hill began his coaching career at Whitworth College in Spokane, Wash. from 2000-01 where he worked for legendary coach Warren Friedrichs. Early in his career, he also coached at Lewis-Clark State College (2001-03) where he helped the Warriors to the NAIA National Tournament before serving as a graduate assistant at Eastern Washington (2003-04). The year he was at Eastern Washington, the Eagles won the Big Sky Conference.

The son of a former coach, Hill graduated from Eastern Washington in 2000 with a degree in education. He has one son, Garrett.



Director of Basketball Operations Colin McGettigan

First Season - First Overall at MSU

Hometown: Colorado Springs, Colo.

Alma Mater: Colorado State, 2020

Colin McGettigan begins his first season as Montana State's Director of Basketball Operations during the 2022-23 season.

Prior to Montana State, McGettigan was a graduate assistant for Colorado State's men's basketball team for two seasons. During his time at Colorado State, the Rams went 25-6 and earned an at-large bid to the 2022 NCAA Tournament. The 6-seed Rams bowed out in the first round against 11-seed Michigan.

McGettigan was a student manager during all four of his undergraduate years, and he served as the head manager for his final three years. He assisted with workouts, film duties and assisted the team during home and road games.

Outside of Colorado State, McGettigan spent four years with USA Basketball and helped the 2021 men's gold medal-winning Olympic team as they prepared for the Tokyo Olympics.

McGettigan graduated with a bachelor's degree in economics in 2020.

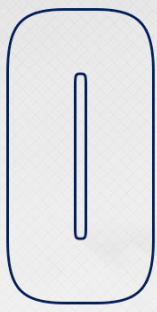
