#4 Mavericks Battle #20 Argonauts Saturday in NCAA Championship Game Kickoff is Scheduled for 2:00 p.m. (CST)

MANKATO, Minn. --- With its 58-15 win over Slippery Rock, the #4 Minnesota State football team has advanced to the NCAA Championship game this Saturday where it will square off with #20 West Florida in McKinney, Texas. Kickoff is scheduled for 2:00 p.m. (CST).

Our History: The 2019 season marks the school's 93rd season playing football. The Mavericks are 478-385-28 (.552) in 891 games since their inception as a varsity sport in 1922. Minnesota State is in its 11th season in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference and owns a 114-13 (.897) record in league action. Over the course of its history, MSU has claimed 23 conference championships, including 14 NIC titles and seven NSIC championships. The Mavericks are making their 12th appearance in the NCAA Tournament this season. MSU owns a 14-11 overall record in NCAA postseason play.

Grabbing the Reins: The 2019 season marks the 10th season with Head Coach **Todd Hoffner** on the sidelines. During his 10 seasons at Minnesota State, Hoffner has compiled a 106-21 (.834) record, including six NSIC Championships and seven trips to the NCAA Tournament in 2008, 2009, 2014, 2015, 2017, 2018 and 2019.

Recently, he was named the *AFCA Region 5 Coach of the Year*. This marks the third time that he has received the award, with the first two instances coming during the 2014 and 2018 seasons.

All-Americans: Minnesota State seniors **Alex Goettl**, **Nate Gunn** and **Shane Zylstra** have all claimed All-American honors for their efforts this season.

Concerning the Mavericks: Minnesota State improved to 14-0 last weekend as it bested Slippery Rock 58-15 in the semifinals of the NCAA Tournament. The Mavericks will now advance to the NCAA Championship game for the second time in program history. MSU reached the NCAA Championship game back in 2014 where it fell to CSU-Pueblo 13-0.

As a team, MSU is averaging 48.0 points and 514.6 yards of offense a game this season. The Mavericks are averaging 293.1 rushing yards a game, while allowing just 71.3 rushing yards a game.

Senior **Nate Gunn** leads the Maverick rushing attack with 1,611 yards and 29 touchdowns, while freshman **Kaleb Sleezer** has tallied 704 yards and seven touchdown carries.

Senior **Ryan Schlichte** has thrown for 1,532 yards and 16 touchdowns, while junior **JD Ekowa** has thrown for 1,242 yards and 10 touchdowns.

Senior **Shane Zylstra** is pacing the Maverick receiving corps with 70 catches for 1,513 yards and 17 touchdowns. Senior **Justin Arnold** has tallied 40 catches for 520 yards and two touchdowns also.

The Maverick defense has allowed just 12.9 points and 247.2 yards of offense per game this season. Opposing teams own a 26% conversion rate on third down this season and have reached the red zone just 21 times. As a unit, MSU has notched 47 sacks, while giving up 14.

Senior **Zach Robertson** is leading the MSU defense with 73 tackles, including

13.5 for a loss and 5.5 sacks. Junior **Cole Schroedermeier** has tallied 58 tackles and five interceptions, while junior **Cade Johnson** has tallied 58 tackles and four interceptions. Junior **Brayden Thomas** has notched 55 tackles, including a team-leading 19.5 for a loss and 11.0 sacks.

Concerning the Argonauts: West Florida enters the weekend the owner of a 12-2 record, including four consecutive playoff victories on the road. Last weekend, USF bested #2 Ferris State 28-14. This will be the Argonauts second trip to the NCAA Championship game, with the first coming in 2017 where they lost to Texas A&M-Commerce 37-27.

As a team, UWF has averaged 35.7 points and 401.3 yards of total offense a game this season. The Argonauts are averaging 137.7 rushing yards and 263.5 passing yards a game this season.

Anthony Johnson leads the UWF rushing attack with 633 yards and eight touchdowns. Jervon Newton has tallied 501 rushing yards and four touchdown carries also.

Austin Reed has thrown for 3,561 yards and 34 touchdowns this season, compared to 10 interceptions.

Tate Lehito leads the UWF receiving corps with 82 catches for 981 yards and five touchdowns. Quentin Randolph has caught 48 passes for 915 yards and nine touchdowns as well.

On defense, UWF opponents have averaged 18.2 points and 340.6 yards of total offense per game this season. The Argonauts have allowed 168.6 rushing and 171.9 passing yards a game.

Chanler Ferguson leads the UWF defense with 88 tackles, while Trent Archie has tallied 85 tackles, including 10.0 for a loss and 5.5 sacks. Kedrick Bradley has notched 77 tackles also.

Football Luncheon: The Minnesota State football luncheons will take place the day before each home game at 11:45 a.m., at the Loose Moose. The luncheons will feature a coach's presentation, Q&A with Maverick student-athletes and a video. The luncheons are open to the public.

NCAA Playoff History: The Mavericks own a 14-11 all-time record in the NCAA Tournament, including an 11-6 mark at Blakeslee Stadium. MSU defeated CSU-Pueblo (35-7), Texas A&M-Commerce (42-21) and Slippery Rock (58-15) in the tournament this season.

What a Stretch: Minnesota State's 40-game NSIC winning streak came to an end as it fell to Winona State 31-27 in 2015

Head Coach Todd Hoffner

Todd Hoffner enters his 10th season as head coach of the Minnesota State football program.

Over the course of 10 seasons, Hoffner has led Minnesota State to seven NCAA playoff appearances (2008, 2009, 2014, 2015, 2017, 2018 & 2019) including an appearance at the NCAA National Championship game in 2014. The Mavericks also advanced to a Mineral Water Bowl game in 2011. He owns an overall record of 106-21 at Minnesota State.

Under Hoffner, the Mavericks have won six NSIC Championships (2011, 2014, 2015, 2017, 2018 & 2019) and eight NSIC South Division Championships (2008, 2009, 2011, 2014, 2015, 2017, 2018 & 2019).

In 2008, Hoffner transformed a team that finished 4-7 the year before into a team which finished 9-3, won the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference South Division, and qualified for the NCAA tournament for the fourth time in school history. The Mavericks finished the season ranked #23 in the nation, marking the third time in school history that the Mavericks were ranked at the conclusion of the season by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA).

In 2009, Minnesota State played to a 10-2 record and was named the NSIC South Division champions. The Mavericks qualified for their second straight NCAA appearance and hosted the first playoff game in the history of Blakeslee Stadium. The Mavericks finished the year ranked #12 in the AFCA coaches poll.

In 2010, the Mavericks finished 6-5, securing the 45th winning season in program history and marking the first time since 1991-94 that MSU has recorded three straight winning seasons.

The 2011 season saw the Mavericks finish with a 9-3 record, including a 28-14 win postseason over Northeastern State in the Mineral Water Bowl. With its 9-3 record, MSU recorded its fourth straight winning season. The Mavericks earned a share of the NSIC Regular Season Championship and the NSIC South Division Championship.

The 2014 season proved to be one for the record books as Hoffner guided the Maverick football program to a 14-1 record, en route to its first appearance in the NCAA National Championship game. The Mavericks finished the season #2 in the AFCA coaches poll.

MSU would keep things rolling with home field advantage in the NCAA Tournament as it defeated Pittsburg State (24-21 OT), Minnesota Duluth (44-17) and Concord (47-13) to advance to the NCAA Championship game against CSU-Pueblo.

MSU would establish several program records during its historic season including points scored (600), rushing yards (3,625), total offense (6,704) and all-purpose yards (8,103). The Maverick offense averaged 40 points per game, while the defense allowed just 12.9 points per contest as opposing offenses managed to score just 193 points in 15 games.

The 2015 season saw the Mavericks three-peat as NSIC Champions as they finished the season with a 10-2 overall record. MSU also advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the fourth time during his tenure at MSU where if faced Emporia State in the first round. A total of five Mavericks received at least one All-American honor as well, while 12 Mavericks received All-NSIC honors.

Highlights from Minnesota State's 2015 season would include the Mavericks' home opener against Minnesota Duluth where the Mavericks erased a 17-point deficit to defeat the Bulldogs 20-17 in front of 6,378 fans. The Mavericks would then go on to set a Blakeslee Stadium attendance record of 7,187 fans who witnessed MSU's 35-27 homecoming victory over Augustana.

The 2016 season saw the Mavericks finish their season with an 8-3 record, marking the seventh time the Mavericks have finished their season with a winning record under Hoffner. In total, eight Mavericks went on to receive All-NSIC honors and five would claim Don Hansen All-Central Region accolades. Zach Dodge would go on to receive Don Hansen All-American honors as well.

Highlights from the 2016 season include MSU's 45-12 road victory over St. Cloud State, which included a 28-point effort in the second quarter. MSU followed up with another 45-point performance two weeks later as the Mavericks defeated Concordia-St. Paul 45-10 in their annual homecoming game, marking Hoffner's sixth homecoming victory. Minnesota State then went on to spoil the homecoming festivities at Augustana as the Mavericks defeated the Vikings 42-35.

The 2017 season saw the Mavericks return to dominance in the NSIC as they finished the regular season with an 11-0 record, to go along with an NSIC Championship and an NSIC South Division Championship. Highlights of Minnesota State's regular season include its 38-23 win over #20 Minnesota Duluth on the road, MSU's 42-21 win over Augustana during its annual Homecoming Game and its 27-23 road victory over #13 Sioux Falls during the regular season finale. A total of 16 Mavericks would receive All-NSIC honors for their efforts and three of them, Casey Bednarski, Evan Perrizo and Jake Porter would go on to claim All-American accolades.

Behind their 11-0 record, the Mavericks made their fifth appearance in the NCAA Tournament under Hoffner. MSU would open the tournament against #20 CSU-Pueblo in a rematch of the 2014 NCAA Championship. The ThunderWolves were able to jump out to an early 10-0 lead, but the Mavericks responded two field goals and touchdown to take a 13-10 lead with just over 13 minutes to go in the game. CSU-Pueblo was able to knot up the score at 13-13, but MSU prevailed in overtime as Casey Bednarski drilled a 37-yard field goal to give MSU the 16-13 win. MSU followed with a dominating 63-21 win over #5 Midwestern State in the second round of the tournament, before falling to Texas A&M-Commerce 31-21 in the third round of the NCAA Tournament.

The Mavericks kept their dominant run in the NSIC going in the 2018 season as they once again finished with an 11-0 regular season record for the third time under Hoffner. With its 11-0 record, MSU claimed an NSIC South Division Championship and a share of the overall NSIC Championship. MSU's first two road wins of the season at Augustana (38-36) and Winona State (31-21) saw the Mavericks rally in the second half to claim the wins. MSU would also claim its eighth straight Homecoming victory as it defeated St. Cloud State 45-10 in front of an attendance of 6,111 at Blakeslee Stadium. A total of 13 Mavericks would go on to claim All-NSIC honors and six would later garner All-American accolades.

Heading into the NCAA Tournament, the Mavericks received the No. 1 seed and a first-round bye. MSU would host #9 CSU-Pueblo in the second round of the tournament, marking the second straight season that they have met in the NCAA Tournament. As they had in 2017, the Mavericks came out on top as they bested the ThunderWolves 24-10 after scoring the game's first 24 points. Round three of the NSIC Tournament saw the weather play a factor as snow covered the field at Blakeslee Stadium during MSU's game vs. #6 Tarleton State. Trailing 10-0 and with the snow continuing to fall the Mavericks began their second drive of the third quarter on their own three yard line with 11:19 to go in the third. MSU then went 97 yards in 27 plays, while taking 12:09 off the clock. The drive culminated in a touchdown pass from Ryan Schlchte to Shane Zylstra on a fourth and goal from the five. With just under two minutes to go in the game, Nate Gunn, who set an MSU single-game record with carries, raced into the end zone from 13 yards out to give the Mavericks the 13-10 win. MSU eventually fell to #2 Ferris State in the semifinals by the score of 42-25.

In nine seasons under Hoffner, 134 Mavericks have earned All-NSIC South Division honors, including 13 during the 2018 season. In 2009, Hoffner was named the NSIC Coach of the Year and the AFCA Region 5 Coach of the Year. He would be named the AFCA Region 5 Coach of the Year again in 2018. Hoffner has also seen five of his players receive extra recognition from the NSIC including NSIC Defensive Newcomer of the Year Junior Aumavae in 2009, NSIC Defensive Player of the Year Joshua Gordon in 2014 & 2015 and NSIC Offensive Newcomer of the Year Nick Pieruccini in 2014. In 2017, Shane Zylstra was named the NSIC Offensive Player of the Year and Nate Gunn was named the NSIC Offensive Newcomer of the Year.

During his time at Minnesota State, Hoffner has seen two players earn invitations to NFL training camps in Junior Aumavae (Dallas Cowboys) and offensive lineman Adrian Battles (Minnesota Vikings). Following his release from the Vikings, Battles signed with the Green Bay Packers as a practice squad player where he eventually went on to win a Super Bowl ring in 2011. Some of Hoffner's first recruits in the summer of 2008 include Adam Thielen and Chris Reed, who have both continued on to the NFL. Ricky Lloyd signed a free agent contract with the BC Lions of the CFL in April of 2018.

During his nine years at MSU, 105 Mavericks have earned Academic All-NSIC honors and seven went on to claim CoSIDA Academic All-American honors, including Alex Goettl, Josh Meeker, Justin Otto, Jake Porter, Jeffrey Raymond, Connor Thomas and Shane Zylstra. The Mavericks have also been active in the community as they have participated in youth reading programs, the Million Tree Project.

Gimme' Twelve: With its 14-0 record this season, Minnesota State has now strung together 12 winning seasons in a row. MSU's 12 winning seasons in a row are the most in program history.

All-NSIC: A total of 15 Mavericks received All-NSIC honors for their efforts this season, including seven who claimed

All-NSIC First Team honors. Seniors **Evan Heim**, **Nate Gunn**, **Tyler Schmidt** and **Shane Zylstra**, along with sophomore **Jared Gossen** received first team honors on offense, while seniors **Jack Curtis** and **Zach Robertson** received first team honors on defense.

NSIC Players of the Week: Senior **Nate Gunn** was named the NSIC Offensive Player of the Week after he tallied 242 rushing yards and three touchdowns against Southwest Minnesota State during week one.

Gunn would claim NSIC Offensive Player of the Week honors for a second time this season after he posted 254 rushing yards and six touchdowns against Sioux Falls.

Senior **Shane Zylstra** was named the NSIC Offensive Player of the Week after posting 220 receiving yards and three touchdowns against Minnesota Duluth during week five.

Senior **Parrish Marrow** was named the NSIC Special Teams Player of the Week after returning a punt 92 yards for a touchdown against the University of Mary during week seven.

In the Trenches: Minnesota State has rushed for 4,103 yards this season, while its opponents have tallied 998 rushing yards. Maverick running backs are averaging 6.1 yards per carry.

Air Traffic: Maverick quarterbacks have thrown for 3,101 yards this season. Maverick receivers are averaging 16.8 yards per catch.

On Third Down: Minnesota State is 82-of-172 (48%) on third down conversions this season. Its opponents are 49-of-190 (26%) on third down.

Offensive Onslaught: As a team, MSU has posted 514.6 yards of offense a game this season, including 293.1 yards on the ground. In comparison, its opponents have posted 247.2 yards of offense, including just 71.3 rushing yards.

On Defense: MSU is allowing 12.9 points per game this season and 247.2 yards of offense, which ranked second and first in NCAA Division II, respectively.

Southern Domination: During the last five seasons, NSIC South Division teams put together a combined record of 109-51 against NSIC North Division opponents.

Since the 2012 season, Minnesota State has put together a 32-2 record against north division opponents.

On Fourth Down: The Mavericks are 11-of-19 (58%) on fourth down attempts this season.

Several Targets: Twelve Mavericks have caught at least one pass this season, including senior **Shane Zylstra** who leads the team with 70 catches for 1,531 yards and 17 touchdowns. Senior **Justin Arnold** has caught 40 passes for 520 yards and two touchdowns as well.
