• No. 15 Michigan State men's soccer begins post-season action, hosting its first-ever Big Ten Tournament game on Sunday, Nov. 6 at 1 p.m. at DeMartin Stadium. The fourth-seeded Spartans host fifth-seed Penn State in the second meeting of the teams this season. The Nittany Lions won the first meeting, 1-0, in overtime in University Park.

The Spartans are currently 12-4-1 this season after finishing conference play with a 4-3-1 mark. MSU had one three-straight games before losing in the regular-season finale to No. 10 Indiana on Oct. 30. Penn State is 8-7-2 overall this year and 4-4-0 in league play. The game will be televised on BTN Plus.

SCOUTING REPORT: PENN STATE

Penn State comes in to the Big Ten Tournament with an overall record of 8-7-2, and a mark of 4-4-0 in the Big Ten. The Nittany Lions are 3-1-1 in their last five games, including a 1-0 double overtime victory of Michigan State on October 15. Last time out, Penn State fell to Northwestern 1-0 on Oct. 30 in their final regular season match up. Penn State has not won an away game this season for a combined road record of 0-5-1.

Senior Connor Maloney leads the team with seven goals and five assists for 19 points. Two of Maloney's games this year have been game-winners. Sophomore Dayonn Harris and junior Aymar Sique are next on the Nittany Lion's list with three goals each. Harris has also added two helpers for a combined eight points.

Redshirt junior Evan Finney has occupied the most time in the net for Penn State, logging 1,116:01 minutes. Finney has only allowed nine goals for a goals against average of 0.73 ranking him second in the Big Ten.

SPARTANS-NITTANY LIONS SERIES

Penn State holds a 22-13-2 series lead over Michigan

State, including a 1-0 overtime win over the Spartans on Oct. 15 at University Park. Michigan State is 5-8-2 at DeMartin Stadium against Penn State. After MSU won three-straight games in the series, the Nittany Lions have come back to win the last two. Both losses were by one goal in overtime.

BIG TOURNEY UNDER RENSING

Michigan State is 7-5-1 in the BIG Tournament under head coach Damon Rensing, advancing to the semifinals in the last three seasons, as well as the finals in 2012 and 2013, winning the 2012 BIG Tournament title.

BIG TEN TOURNAMENT HISTORY

The Spartans are making their 26th BIG Tournament appearance in program history, toting an 19-21-3 overall BIG Tournament ledger. The Spartans have an 11-9-1 quarterfinal record, a 5-9-2 semifinal mark and a 3-2 record in the finals. Michigan State has advanced to the semifinals in three of the last four seasons, as well as the championship match in two of the last four seasons and three in the last eight.

Grand Park – The Sports Campus at Westfield, Indiana – will serve as host for the 2016 and 2017 Big Ten Men's Soccer Tournaments. This marks the first time the Big Ten Men's Soccer Tournament will be held at a neutral location in addition to being Grand Park's first collegiate soccer tournament. Following preliminary round play on campus sites, the semifinals and finals of the 2016 Big Ten Men's Soccer Tournament will occur at Grand Park on November 11 and 13.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

This season despite the goal production from sophomore forward Ryan Sierakowski, Michigan State has spread the wealth this season. Nine different Spartans have found the back of the net for MSU in 2016.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS

Forward Ryan Sierakowski has suffered no sophomore slump this season. In two seasons in the Spartan Green and White, he has 15 career goals. He is also tied for first in the Big Ten in game-winning goals with six. He passed his 2015 point total of 15 last season with his game-winning goal against Northwestern on Oct. 22.

DEFENDING DEMARTIN

Michigan State has been stellar at home this season with an 8-0-1 record at DeMartin Stadium in 2016. Last season, MSU was 5-4-1 at home. The Spartans tied for the most ever had at home with the 2010 team that went 8-2-0. This was the first time since 1975 that MSU went undefeated at home. In that season, the Spartans were 5-0-0.

AROUND THE BIG TEN

Top-ranked Maryland clinched its second outright Big Ten title in three seasons last week. Michigan State is currently in second place with one BIG remaining. Sophomore Ryan Sierakowski is tied for fourth in the league in points scored with 19. Senior Andrew Herr and freshman Giuseppe Barone are tied for ninth in assists with four apiece. Redshirt-sophomore goalkeeper Jimmy Hague is second in the Big Ten in goals against average (0.67) and second in save percentage (.820).

SPARKLING SEASON

Jimmy Hague is having an amazing season in his first season as a starter in goal for the Spartans. After

17 games this season, Hague has a goals against average of 0.75. Hague is third in the Big Ten in GAA behind Wisconsin's Phillip Schilling (0.65) and Penn State's Evan Finney (0.73).

GETTING IN THE CARDIO

Junior defender Jimmy Fiscus is the only Spartan to have played every minute this season, logging in 1,566 minutes. Ten players have played at least 1,100 minutes this season, including defenders Michael Wetungu and Dewey Lewis who both have played nearly 1,500 minutes. The Spartan conditioning seems to be paying off, as MSU has had the same starting 11 in 11 of the 17 games season.

2015 BIG TOURNEY FLASHBACK

Eighth-seeded Michigan State men's soccer dropped a close 2-1 overtime battle with ninth-seeded Penn State in the first round of the Big Ten Tournament at Jesse Owens Memorial Stadium in Columbus, Ohio on Saturday afternoon.

MSU ends the season 8-9-2, while Penn State improves to 7-7-3. The Nittany Lions will now face top-seeded Ohio State on Sunday, Nov. 8.

"I am very proud of this team. We tried to play the game the right way; we competed hard. Our younger players have really developed because of how our seniors led and showed them how we should play. We didn't execute everything perfectly, and we didn't win every game, but I think we were doing things that are going to make us better in the future," MSU head coach Damon Rensing said.

FAMILIAR FACES

Michigan State had the same starting lineup for the first 11 games of the season. In MSU's 2-1 win over No. 23 Akron, the Spartans had two changes with sophomore midfielder DeJuan Jones and redshirt-junior midfielder Ryan Scott both making their first starts of the season.

BIG TEN OPENERS

Michigan State is 4-2-2 in the first match of Big Ten play under head coach Damon Rensing. The Spartans have won three of their last four BIG openers, picking up wins against Northwestern in 2013 and Maryland in 2014, before tying Maryland last season along with defeated Rutgers, 4-0, on Sept. 9.

This was the Spartans earliest Big Ten opener since opening the season against Northwestern on Sept. 3, 1994. Prior to that the earliest BIG game was also against Northwestern on Sept. 8, 1996. This was also the first time that MSU has opened league play against the Scarlet Knights.

YOUNG GUNS

Sixteen of the Spartans' 23 goals this season have been scored by underclassmen. Sophomore Ryan Sierakowski is first on the team with nine goals. Sophomores DeJuan Jones, Giuseppe Barone and Hunter Barone have all scored two goals this season. MSU has started five underclassmen this season, including freshmen Michael Wetungu, Michael Pimlott and Giuseppe Barone. Sophomores Hunter Barone and Jones have come off the bench. Freshman Michael Beckett scored his first goal of the season in MSU's 1-0 win over No. 12 Notre Dame on Oct. 25.

O CAPTAIN! MY CAPTAIN!

Michigan State has three captains this season in seniors Andrew Herr and Dewey Lewis, along with junior Jimmy Fiscus.

SPARTANS HONORED WITH POST-SEASON AWARDS

Eight different Michigan State men's soccer players were honored when the Big Ten postseason awards were announced by the league on Friday.

Sophomore forward Ryan Sierakowski was named to the first-team All-Big Ten squad. Michigan State has had at least one first-team selection every season since 1999. Last season, defender Zach Carroll was the lone Spartan on the first-team list. Overall, Sierakowski is the 34th MSU player to earn first-team honors.

Sierakowski, a native of McHenry, Illinois, is second in the Big Ten in goals scored with nine. He is also tied for third in the league in points with 21. The sophomore forward is tied for first in the conference and first on the team with six game-winning goals. Last season, Sierakowski was named to the All-Freshman team.

Michigan State had three players named to the second-team, including redshirt-sophomore goalkeeper Jimmy Hague, junior midfielder Ken Krolicki and junior defender Jimmy Fiscus. This was the first time since 2010 that MSU has had three players on the second team. That season Domenic Barone, Kevin Cope and Avery Steinlage earned honors.

Hague, a native of Walled Lake, Michigan, has had a breakout season in goal for MSU. Hague is third in the Big Ten in goals against average (0.75) and save percentage (.797). Krolicki, who hails from Plymouth, Michigan, is tied for second on the team in scoring with three goals and two assists for eight points. Fiscus, a native of Novi, Michigan, is the only Spartan to have played every minute this season. He is part of the tenacious MSU backline that has allowed only 13 goals in 17 games this season. All three are first-time selections.

Freshman midfielder Giuseppe Barone was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year. He is the second

Spartan to ever earn the honor and the first since Kevin Cope in 2009. Barone, who hails from Grandville, Michigan, is tied for second on the team in scoring with two goals and four assists for eight points.

Along with Barone, freshmen defenders Michael Pimlott and Michael Wetungu were both named to the All-Freshman team. Pimlott, a native of Farmington Hills, Michigan, has started 16 games this season during his rookie campaign. Wetungu, who hails from Rochester Hills, Michigan, has started every game this season as part of the fierce MSU backline. Both Barone and Wetungu were unanimous selections.

HERR AND CENTALA EARN ACADEMIC HONORS

Michigan State men's soccer players Andrew Herr and Brad Centala were named first-team Academic All-District Team on Thursday, Oct. 27. Both were recognized as a part of NCAA Division I District 5 by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

Herr, a native of Millersville, Pennsylvania, owns a 3.98 GPA in packaging. This is the second-straight Academic All-District honor for the senior midfielder. He follows in the footsteps of midfielder Ryan Keener who earned first-team Academic All-America honors in 2014.

This season, Herr has started 14 of the Spartans' 16 games. He is tied for first with four assists this season to go along with his first career goal against Yale on Oct. 19. For his Spartan career, Herr has played in 77 games, starting 76. He has one career goal and seven assist for nine points.

Herr earned Academic All-Big Ten honors as a sophomore and a junior. He was also named a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar as a redshirt-freshman.

Centala, a native of Grosse Pointe Woods, Michigan, earned his first All-District honor with a 3.85 in kinesiology.

The junior defender has started all 16 games this season for the Spartans, scoring the game winning-goal against in-state rival Michigan on Sept. 18. Centala has played over 1,300 minutes this season, as part of the Michigan State defense that has allowed only 11 goals in 16 games.

MICHIGAN STATE NOTES

- Michigan State men's soccer was picked sixth in the Big Ten Preseason Coaches Poll. The Spartans ended the 2015 campaign with an 8-9-2 overall record and a 2-4-2 Big Ten mark. Two-time defending Big Ten Tournament champion, Maryland was picked first despite finishing tied for third in the regular season in 2015. Indiana was voted to finish in the No. 2 spot, followed by 2015 regular season

champs Ohio State at No. 3. Rutgers checked in at the No. 4 followed by Michigan at the No. 5 position and Michigan State at No. 6. Wisconsin was voted to finish in the No. 7 spot followed by Penn State (No. 8) and Northwestern (No. 9).

- The 2016 Big Ten Tournament will begin on Sunday, Nov. 6 at the top four seeds' home sites. The semifinals will follow on Friday, Nov. 11 and the championship will be held on Sunday, Oct. 13. The Big Ten semifinal and championship will be played at Grand Park in Westfield, Indiana.

- MSU returns seven starters from last season's team that finished the season 8-9-2 overall and 2-4-2 in Big Ten action. The Spartans return two of their top three scorers in sophomore forward Ryan Sierakowski and junior midfielder Ken Krolicki. Sierakowski led the team in scoring with seven goals and three assists for 17 points. He was also named to the Big Ten All-Freshman squad. Krolicki was third in scoring with two goals and three assists for seven points.

TOPDRAWER PRESEASON HONORS

The junior duo of defender Jimmy Fiscus and midfielder Ken Krolicki were named to the Preseason Top 100 Players Rankings by TopDrawerSoccer. Freshman midfielder Giuseppe Barone was tabbed to the TopDrawerSoccer Freshman First Team.

BARONE BUNCH

Freshman Giuseppe Barone became the fourth member of the Barone family to don the Green and White. He joins current Spartan Hunter as well as former MSU players Mark (2008-11) Domenic (2008-12).

LAST TIME OUT

In its regular-season finale, the No. 13 Michigan State men's soccer team had its three-game winning streak halted by No. 10 Indiana, 2-1, at Bill Armstrong Stadium in Bloomington on Sunday.

With the loss, the Spartans conclude the regular season with a 12-4-1 overall record and 4-3-1 in the Big Ten. Indiana improves to 10-1-6 overall mark and 3-0-5 in the Big Ten.

"I kind of thought that it was a tale of two halves with two very good college teams. Indiana came out and played with very good energy and created some chances, and got up 1-0. I think, to be honest, we were lucky to be tied at halftime. In the start of the second half, we really settled in and were unfortunate not to be up a goal. Tanner Thompson, who is an All-American, had a great individual effort to win the game," MSU head coach Damon Rensing said.

HEAD COACH DAMON RENSING

Former MSU soccer standout Damon Rensing became the fifth head coach in Spartan history on January 1, 2009 after taking over for the legendary Joe Baum, who guided MSU for 32 seasons. The 2015 campaign is Rensing's seventh as head coach, after serving as an assistant coach for 10 seasons at his alma mater. In seven years, Rensing has compiled an impressive 77-53-29 record (.575).

Rensing was named MSU's head coach designate on Aug. 14, 2008 after Baum decided to make 2008 his final season as head coach.

Rensing has spent nearly half his life in the Green and White with four years as varsity letterwinner, one season as an assistant with the women's program and 10 seasons in his previous position.

In his first seven years as head coach, the Spartans have made five NCAA tournament campaigns, including a run to the Elite Eight in 2013 and 2014. The Spartans ended the 2014 season with a 12-5-6 record overall and were 4-2-2 in Big Ten action.

The 2013 season also saw Rensing named the NSCAA Regional Coach of the Year, while Kevin Cope earned All-America honors and was eventually selected as the 25th pick in the MLS Super Draft. Fatai Alashe was selected as the fourth pick overall by the San Jose Earthquakes in the 2015 MLS SuperDraft. His selection in the first round of the draft marks the highest-ever in school history, surpassing first-round pick Doug DeMartin in 2009.

In 2012, he guided MSU to its third Big Ten Tournament title in school history as the Spartans topped Michigan in overtime, 2-1. Under Rensing's leadership, the Spartans have received 20 All-Big Ten and 14 NSCAA All-Region selections, in addition to nine players that were named to the Big Ten All-Tournament Team.

The Spartans' performance in the classroom during Rensing's tenure has been equally impressive. Over the last six years, MSU has received 60 Academic All-Big Ten selections and 27 Big Ten Distinguished Scholar selections.

During his 10 years as an assistant at Michigan State, Rensing helped lead the Spartans to the 2004 and 2008 Big Ten Tournament championships as well as the 2008 conference regular-season crown.

During his time as an assistant, Rensing tutored 15 different First Team All-Big Ten performers and nine different NSCAA-All Region honorees. Rensing also worked with three NSCAA All-America selections - Ryan McMahan (2005), Doug DeMartin (2008) and Jay Chapman (2014).

Seven players Rensing has recruited and coached, including John Minagawa-Webster (2005), McMahan (2006), Kevin Reiman (2008), Rauwshan McKenzie (2008), DeMartin (2009), Cope (2013) and Alashe (2014) have been drafted by MLS teams.

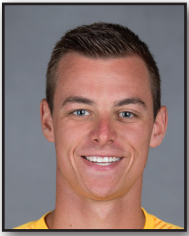

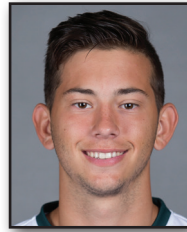

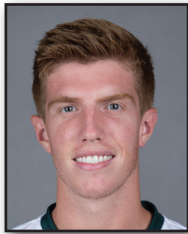
