- Conference play continues to pick up steam in the Big Ten on Friday, as Rutgers returns to action for the first time in two weeks when it opens its league slate at Wisconsin (4:30 p.m. ET on Big Ten Network+). It will be the Badgers' first game since their Big Ten opener at Iowa on Dec. 5.
- Nebraska's Sam Haiby became the third different Big Ten player to score 30 points in a game this season, posting a career-high 33 points in the Huskers' 78-72 win over visiting Illinois Thursday night in the conference opener for both schools. It was the most points for a Nebraska player since Jan. 24, 2016, when Jessica Shepard scored 35 points at Michigan.
- Also in Thursday's matchup in Lincoln, Illinois had five double-figure scorers, the first time the Fighting Illini have done that in a conference game since Feb. 1, 2017, against Michigan.
- Northwestern became the final Big Ten team to open its season on Thursday night with a 93-57 win over Eastern Illinois at Welsh-Ryan Arena. It was the most points scored by the Wildcats since Dec. 17, 2018, when they downed Chicago State, 97-35.
- Michigan is off to its first 5-0 start since 2016-17 following its 93-54 win over Butler on Wednesday at Crisler Center. It's the eighth time in program history, and the third under current head coach Kim Barnes Arico, the Wolverines have opened with five consecutive victories.
- Iowa earned its fifth consecutive win over Cy-Hawk Series rival Iowa State on Wednesday with an 82-80 victory over the No. RV/24 Cyclones at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. It's the longest winning streak for Iowa in the series since the Hawkeyes won 10 in a row from 1982-83 through 1996-97.
- With Wednesday's victory over Iowa State, Iowa extended its home winning streak to 39 games, the second-longest active string in the nation behind Baylor (57). The Hawkeyes' run began on Feb. 4, 2018, with a 92-84 win over Minnesota.
- The Big Ten has the second-best non-conference winning percentage (against D-I opponents) this season, with an .842 (32-6) mark to date. That includes three wins over Top 25 teams — Maryland 115-96 over No. 14 Arkansas on Nov. 29 (a Big Ten record for points against a ranked team); Michigan 76-66 at No. RV/23 Notre Dame on Dec. 3; Iowa 82-80 over No. RV/24 Iowa State on Wednesday.
- The Big Ten continues to share top honors among all conferences with five Top 25 teams in both the Associated Press and Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA)/USA Today polls, plus two others receiving votes. Both polls can be found in full on page 3 of this update.
- Several Big Ten women's basketball games were added to the BTN and the FOX Sports app schedule for the month of December, the network announced. These latest additions include a handful of upcoming conference matchups — Friday (Rutgers at Wisconsin - 4:30 p.m. ET), Dec. 14 (Minnesota at Northwestern - 9 p.m. ET) and Dec. 17 (Northwestern at Purdue - 7 p.m. ET). All Big Ten home games not airing on BTN in December will be streamed live on Big Ten Network+. For the latest Big Ten women's basketball television schedule, visit bigten.org/B1GWBBTV.
- Iowa guard Caitlin Clark was named the Big Ten Player and Freshman of the Week on Monday, becoming the first conference freshman to sweep both honors in the same week since Jan. 30, 2017 (Michigan's Kysre Gondrezick). Clark averaged 26.5 points, 9.0 assists and 4.0 rebounds per game in the Hawkeyes' wins last week at Drake and at home against Wisconsin.
- Maryland made a Big Ten-record 21 three-pointers (tying for eighth on the NCAA Division I single-game

- list) in its 112-78 home-opening win over Towson on Dec. 3. The Terrapins topped the previous conference record of 19 treys, shared by Iowa (at Northwestern, Jan. 29, 2015) and Minnesota (at Illinois, Jan. 7, 2016). In addition, Maryland's 21 three-pointers and .677 three-point percentage in the Towson win are the best by any NCAA Division I program this season.
- Indiana's Mackenzie Holmes' Big Ten record-tying 13-for-13 (1.000) field-goal percentage and seven blocked shots against Eastern Kentucky on Nov. 25 both rank as tops in the nation in those categories this season. In addition, Michigan's Naz Hillmon made a nation-leading 16 field goals in the Wolverines' Nov. 27 victory at Oakland.
 - Indiana junior guard Grace Berger, tallied the first triple-double in Indiana women's basketball history on Nov. 25 with 17 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists. Berger also recorded the 29th triple-double in Big Ten history and first since Jan. 23, 2018 (Illinois' Alex Wittinger at Penn State). Berger is one of two Division I players with a triple-double this year (Taiah Thornton of Saint Peter's did it the same day as Berger [Nov. 25] against NJIT).
 - Michigan's win at Notre Dame on Dec. 5 was the Wolverines' first over the Fighting Irish since Dec. 10, 2008 (63-59 in OT at Crisler Center), and their first over Notre Dame in South Bend since Dec. 8, 1979 (66-60, also in OT).
 - Maryland has scored a combined 227 points in its last two games, tying the school record for points in consecutive games (Dec. 11 & 20, 2017 — 114-45 over Loyola-Md.; 113-49 at Coppin State).
 - On Dec. 3, Indiana shut down Samford in a 71-26 victory, tying for the fifth-fewest points allowed in a game in school history and fewest since the 1973-74 season (a 62-25 win over Ball State). It was also the fewest points allowed by a Big Ten program since Nov. 30, 2019, when Maryland posted a 90-26 win over Belmont at the Daytona Beach (Fla.) Invitational, and the third time in four years a Big Ten team held an opponent to 26 points or fewer (Wisconsin downed Savannah State, 82-24 on Dec. 10, 2017).
 - On Nov. 23, the Big Ten released its 2020-21 conference schedule, which will see schools play 20 Big Ten games, up two from the previous two seasons. Schools will play seven opponents twice (home and away) and the other six once (three at home and three on the road). To account for the additional games and preserve flexibility in the schedule, the Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament has been moved to March 9-13 and will continue to be played at Bankers Life Fieldhouse in Indianapolis.
 - Rutgers head coach C. Vivian Stringer began her 50th season and 26th at Rutgers on Nov. 27 when the Scarlet Knights downed Monmouth, 82-38. The Hall of Famer is the first NCAA women's basketball coach ever to coach 50 seasons and the fourth men's or women's basketball coach in any NCAA division to reach that milestone — the others are Phog Allen (50 seasons at Kansas, Baker, Central Missouri and Haskell from 1906-56), Jim Smith (51 seasons at Division III Saint John's-Minn. from 1965-2015) and Herb Magee, who is in his 54th season at Division II Jefferson, where he took over in 1967-68. Also of note, Harry Statham coached the men's program at NAIA McKendree for 52 seasons (1966-2018).

- Averaged 26.5 points, 9.0 assists, 4.0 rebounds and 2.5 steals per game with a .480 field-goal percentage and a double-double last week, pacing the Hawkeyes to a pair of wins
- Registered 30 points and 13 assists in a Dec. 2 win at Drake, becoming the only NCAA Division I freshman since 2015-16 to have a 30-point, 10-assist game
- Recorded the most points by a Big Ten freshman in a single game since Jan. 31, 2016 (Michigan's Hallie Thome – 31 vs. Minnesota) and most assists by a conference freshman in one game since Feb. 9, 2017 (Maryland's Destiny Slocum – 13 vs. Illinois)
- Added 23 points and five assists on Dec. 5 to help Iowa defeat Wisconsin in its Big Ten opener and extend the Hawkeyes' home winning streak to 38 games (the second-longest active string in the nation)
- Earns the first Big Ten Player of the Week award of her career, the first Big Ten freshman to be named the conference's Player of the Week since Jan. 30, 2017 (Michigan's Kysre Gondrezick)
- Last Iowa Player of the Week: Kathleen Doyle (Jan. 13, 2020)
- Collects the second Freshman of the Week award of her career

But maintaining the conference's standard of competing at the highest level in athletics also endures as an important component of the Big Ten experience. Striking that balance between academics and athletics is integral to the Big Ten's identity. Recognized as one of intercollegiate sports' most successful undertakings, the Big Ten strives for success from its students not only on the field and in the classroom, but around the world as well.

PREMIER ACADEMIC INSTITUTIONS

The Big Ten Academic Alliance is an academic consortium of all 14 Big Ten universities, which is widely considered to be the model for effective and voluntary collaboration among top research universities.

Every Big Ten Academic Alliance institution ranks among the top 70 universities in the nation according to the 2019 Academic Ranking of World Universities, including six in the top 30.

The Big Ten leads all conferences with more than 1,800 Academic All-Americans, including 27 honorees during the 2019-20 academic year.

Big Ten Academic Alliance schools annually conduct \$10 billion in funded research, \$5 billion more than any other conference.

A HISTORY OF ATHLETIC SUCCESS

Big Ten schools have won at least five national championships in 23 of the last 26 years, averaging nearly seven per year over that span.
