KICKIN' IT

- Michigan State women's soccer embarks on its 29th season of Big Ten Conference competition on Sunday, as the Spartans hit the road to take on the Illinois Fighting Illini in a 2 p.m. (ET) kick at Demirjian Park.
- The Green & White return to work following the first ranked victory of the Jeff Hosler era, as the Spartans took down then-No. 19 Colorado by a 4-2 score on Sunday, Sept. 11. MSU's victory was the first ranked win by a Michigan State team since Oct. 22, 2016.
- In the preseason Big Ten coaches poll, the Spartans were tabbed as the No. 6 team in the league behind Penn State, Rutgers, Michigan, Wisconsin and Ohio State. The Spartans were picked to finish 13th in 2021 and ended Hosler's first season in fourth.
- Michigan State has seen a trio of players land a total of four Big Ten women's soccer weekly honors, highlighted by Camryn Evans and Courtney Koehler garnering Co-Offensive Player and Freshman of the Week accolades, respectively, on Sept. 13.

INTRODUCING THE ILLINI

- Veteran head coach Janet Rayfield leads the Illini into league play boasting a 5-2-1 overall record bolstered by a thrilling 1-0 victory over then-No. 17 Butler.
- Illinois was tabbed as the last-place team in the preseason Big Ten coaches poll coming off a 5-11-1 season a year ago that included a 1-8-1 ledger in conference play.
- Senior midfielder Kendra Pasquale leads the team with six total points amassed on a trio of goals, including game-winners against both Toledo and Missouri.
- Eight different players have logged exactly one assist apiece for the Illini.
- Junior goalkeeper Julia Cili watches over the Illinois backfield, recording a whopping 37 saves through this point in the season, needing only nine more to match her 2021 total.

STORY OF THE SERIES

- Michigan State and Illinois prepare for the 27th all-time meeting between the two programs, with Illinois boasting a 21-3-2 edge over MSU since the first contest in the 1997 campaign.
- The Illini own a 13-1-1 lead over MSU in games played in Champaign, with Michigan State's only victory coming by way of a 2-1 overtime result in the series opener.
- MSU's most recent victory over Illinois came in a steady 2-0 result on Sept. 20, 2002.
- The Spartans fell by a narrow 2-1 margin in the most recent contest against Illinois on March 28, 2021, at DeMartin Stadium. Then-freshman Zivana Labovic scored her third goal of the season, but the Illini booked the eventual game-winner in the 84th minute.

UP NEXT

- Michigan State women's soccer returns to the friendly confines of DeMartin Stadium on Thursday, Sept. 22, when the Spartans welcome the Iowa Hawkeyes to Old College Field for a 7 p.m. kick.

THE BIG LEAGUES

- In a preseason poll of the 14 Big Ten women's soccer coaches, Michigan State was selected to finish sixth in the league table in 2022.
- Penn State and Rutgers tied for first place in the preseason poll, with Michigan, Wisconsin and Ohio State rounding out the top five.
- Returning All-Big Ten selections from 2021, Lauren Kozal and Samantha White, appeared on the preseason players to watch list, with graduate transfer Ruby Diodati also making an appearance.
- MSU published a 5-4-1 record in Big Ten Conference play in the 2021 season highlighted by a pair of wins over Wisconsin and Ohio State.

COLORADO ROCKIN'

- Michigan State published its most impressive win of the season to date on Sept. 11, as the Spartans stunned the 19th-ranked Colorado Buffaloes by a 4-2 margin on a rainy Old College Field.
- The Spartans concluded non-conference play by earning the first win over a ranked opponent in the Jeff Hosler era. MSU played three ranked opponents during Hosler's first season in 2021 and was within one score of all three challengers when time expired.
- MSU's victory was the first ranked win by any Spartan team since the Green & White defeated then-No. 16 Penn State on Oct. 22, 2016, in a Senior Day showdown at DeMartin Stadium.
- The Green & White's 4-2 victory featured a dominant shot margin of 25-10 in MSU's favor, while the Spartans nearly doubled the Buffaloes' shots on goal total, winning the battle 13-7.
- Michigan State won the corner kick battle for the seventh time in 2022, compiling a 4-1 edge.

HATS OFF

- In the upset of Colorado, senior forward Camryn Evans led the way with her first career hat trick, publishing a trio of goals with two in the run of play and one more on a second-half penalty kick.
- Evans' three-goal outburst was the first hat trick by a Michigan State player since Gia Wahlberg poured in four scores in a 5-1 demolition of the Marshall Thundering Herd on Aug. 25, 2019.
- The Fenton, Michigan, native recorded only the fifth hat trick on Old College Field since the Spartans began playing there in 1986. Evans joins Wahlberg, Hannah Jones and newly-inducted MSU Athletics Hall-of-Famer Laura Heyboer (twice) as the only Spartans to accomplish that feat.

THE SPARTAN DIFFERENCE

- Through the conclusion of the non-conference portion of the schedule, Michigan State stands in third place in the Big Ten Conference for average scoring margin, publishing a goal differential of 1.88 goals per game.
- MSU's defense ranks third in the league in terms of opponent scoring average. The Green & White yield approximately 0.50 goals per game and trail only Indiana (0.00) and Northwestern (0.38).
- The Spartans also boast one of the most prolific offenses in the nation's premier soccer conference, amassing 2.38 goals per game to place MSU in the top three of the Big Ten.
- Additionally, Michigan State leads the Big Ten in total shot attempts with 158 so far this season, and places second in the league in corner kicks with 58.

BACK LINE? BRICK WALL.

- Through the first eight games of the 2022 campaign, Michigan State has allowed a quartet of scores from an opponent, putting up shutouts against Bowling Green, Cincinnati, Central Michigan, Binghamton and Oakland while allowing goals against Dartmouth, Arkansas and Colorado.
- MSU owns a whopping 158-56 differential in shots over its opponents and has only allowed 24 shots on target all season, resulting in 18 goalkeeper saves and two team saves.
- The Spartans are tied for 20th in the nation in terms of goals-against-average, notching a GAA of .500 through 720 team minutes. Indiana is the only program in the Big Ten and NCAA with a perfect mark of .000.
- The Spartans matched the season-opening shutout record set by the 2018 team, allowing zero scores through four contests. Michigan State went 443 total minutes from the opening kick of the season without allowing an opponent goal.

STARTIN' SPARTAN STRONG

- Michigan State owns a 5-1-2 overall record through the conclusion of non-conference play, only one win shy of matching the team's 2021 non-league victory tally.
- Michigan State allowed four-or-fewer goals through its first eight games in seven seasons before 2022, including all four of the program's NCAA Tournament Seasons in 2002, 2005, 2008 and 2009. The Spartans made the Big Ten Tournament in five of those seven seasons.
- On the seven prior occasions in which the Spartans have yielded four-or-less scores through eight contests, MSU teams average 11.71 overall victories on the season and finish in approximately fifth place in the final Big Ten standings of the year.

7-7-7, LET'S GO

- In Michigan State's home-opening matchup with the Central Michigan Chippewas on Aug. 25, the Spartan offense logged seven goals scored by six different individuals.
- MSU's offensive onslaught in its third game of the season marked the first time any Spartan team recorded seven-or-more goals since a 7-0 demolition of Purdue Fort Wayne on Sept. 19, 2001. The program record for goals in a single game is set at 10, accomplished on four occasions.
- The Green & White accumulated a 29-2 shot margin and a 14-0 differential in shots on goal. Both margins were the highest by a Spartan team since MSU defeated Detroit Mercy 4-0 last season.

TURN THE BEAT AROUND

- In the first year of the Jeff Hosler era, Michigan State recorded the largest single-season increase in victories in program history with nine additional wins. MSU turned a one-win 2020-21 slate into 10 victories in the 2021 fall campaign.
- The Spartans forced 16 more goals and allowed 10 fewer than they did in the previous year.
- MSU tied the program record for the largest jump in year-over-year Big Ten wins with four additional victories in 2021, matching their single-season increase from 11 seasons ago. The Spartans turned a 3-4-3 season in 2010 into a 7-4-0 ledger in 2011.
- Despite being picked to finish 13th in the Big Ten in 2021, the Green & White finished in the top-four of the league table for the first time since booking a 7-4-0 record with a third-place finish in 2011.

KEEPING KOZAL

- Senior goalkeeper Lauren Kozal continues the 2022 season as only the second United Soccer Coaches All-American in program history.
- Kozal earned preseason recognition as a MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List member, joining program legend Laura Heyboer as one of only two Spartans with that accolade.
- In the preseason, Kozal was one of 13 Division I goalkeepers named to the United Soccer Coaches Goalkeepers to Watch list, standing as the lone representative of the Big Ten Conference following her B1G Goalkeeper of the Year recognition last season.
- The Ada, Michigan, native averaged 4.5 saves per game in the 2021 campaign and led the Big Ten in save percentage with an 86.2% success rate in goal.
- Kozal earned her third career Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Week award on August 30, garnering weekly honors following a pair of shutouts against Central Michigan and Binghamton.

REVVIN' EVANS

- Senior forward Camryn Evans leads the Green & White with 13 total points on the season split between six goals and a lone assist on the year.
- After notching her first career hat trick to pave the way for Michigan State's upset of then-No. 19 Colorado, Evans took home Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week accolades on Sept. 13.
- Evans has put up 24 total shots through this point in the season and has built a reputation as one of the most accurate shooters on the roster. Her 16 shots on goal place her atop both the Michigan State team and Big Ten Conference leaderboards in the category.
- The Fenton, Michigan, native averages 2.00 shots on goal per game, the highest mark at both Michigan State and in the Big Ten, clearing Northwestern's Josie Aulicino by 0.12 points.
- Evans stands in a tie for 16th at MSU for career goals scored with 19 through five seasons.

KOHELER'S COURT

- Freshman midfielder Courtney Koehler has stood out as one of the brightest young pieces on the Michigan State roster, currently standing in third on the team with six points split between a pair of goals and two additional assists.
- Her collegiate debut performance against Central Michigan on Aug. 25 saw the first-year player notch a brace in the seven-goal MSU onslaught.
- In the upset of then-No. 19 Colorado on Sept. 11, Koehler put up a pair of assists on both of Camryn Evans' goals in the run of play, helping lead the Spartans to their eventual 4-2 win.
- Following each breakout performance, Koehler took home Big Ten Conference Freshman of the Week accolades according to the league office on Aug. 30, and Sept. 13, respectively.
- Koehler, a native of The Woodlands, Texas, becomes the first Spartan player in program history to win Big Ten Freshman of the Week on more than one occasion.

DEBEAU, DA BEAST

- Senior forward Lauren DeBeau maintains sole possession of second place on the MSU roster in scoring, amassing seven total points with three goals and an assist on the season.
- DeBeau is one of five Spartans with a game-winning goal this year, notching the decisive score in the season opener on the road at Bowling Green on Aug. 18.
- Through the first four games of the season, DeBeau tallied a trio of goals and compiled 10 shot attempts highlighted by four shots on target.
- In the upset of then-No. 19 Colorado on Sept. 11, DeBeau found MJ Andrus for Michigan State's third goal of the game midway through the second half. She also placed three shots on goal in the contest.

WINNING WITH WHITE

- Graduate defender Samantha White continues her fifth season at Michigan State and stands as one of three Spartans who took home All-Big Ten honors a year ago.
- In the preseason, White was named a Defender to Watch by the United Soccer Coaches, joining fellow defender Kelly Severini.
- The McKees Rocks, Pennsylvania, native has anchored the Spartan back line through five shut-outs this year and logged an assist in MSU's rout of Central Michigan on Aug. 25.
- White has started every game of her career in East Lansing, notching 75 starts over the past five seasons. She is tied for eighth place with Erin Doan for most career starts at MSU.

BACK TO THE LAB(OVIC)

- Junior midfielder Zivana Labovic returns to the pitch for MSU as the program's second-leading goal scorer from a year ago.
- The Schererville, Indiana, native accumulated her first two points of the 2022 season in the home-opener against Central Michigan, booking a pair of assists in MSU's seven-goal onslaught.
- The third-year player is currently tied with teammates Ruby Diodati and Courtney Koehler for the team lead in assists with two.
- Labovic notched four goals in addition to two assists in 2021, finishing with the second most points (10) on the roster behind only then-graduate forward Ava Cook.

WHO'S NEW ON THE BANKS

- The Green & White welcome 17 newcomers to the 2022 roster, split between seven transfers and 10 incoming freshmen.
- Michigan State's 17 newcomers account for 42.4% of all Spartan minutes played this season.
- Transfers for the Spartans accumulated three All-Conference team selections in 2021, with Kelly Severini, Mia Hansen and Ruby Diodati earning those honors at their previous institutions.
- Severini, a junior transfer from Hartford, earned a place on the United Soccer Coaches Defenders to Watch list after leading the America East's premier defense in terms of goals against average (0.65).
- MSU signed a versatile recruiting class last November, composed of Isa Agrusso, Ella Alati, Madie Brady, Morgan Gerak, Maggie Illig, Courtney Koehler, Allie Mairn, Ella Osmussen, Emerson Sargeant and Maia Soulis.

HEAD COACH JEFF HOSLER

17TH SEASON, 2ND WITH PROGRAM | ALMA COLLEGE '02

In his first season as head coach for the Green and White, Hosler guided the Spartans to a 10-4-3 record, finishing fourth in the Big Ten regular season with a 5-4-1 mark. The squad made their first Big Ten Tournament appearance since 2011 and were granted the opportunity to host their quarterfinal match, marking the first tournament game in East Lansing since 2002.

After being predicted to finish 13th in the league, the Spartans improved by leaps and bounds to finish within the top five. The Spartans boast the most decorated goalkeeper in the league in Lauren Kozal, and have had a dramatic offensive turnaround compared to last season's 1-10-1 showing. It was the first ten-win season for the team since 2011, the year of their last postseason appearance.

Michigan State received three All-Big Ten selections at the conclusion of the regular season, as Kozal was named to the First Team and Ava Cook and Samantha White garnered Second Team nods. Kozal was also selected as the Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Year, the first-ever Goalkeeper of the Year honor awarded to a member of the Spartans and the first position player of the year award for MSU since 2008.

With Hosler at the helm, Kozal and White also earned recognition on the United Soccer Coaches All-Region team, with Kozal going on to be named a United Soccer Coaches All-American. Kozal held the highest save percentage of any goalkeeper in the Big Ten (.862) during the season. She ranked second in the Big Ten with a goals against average of .0495, allowing just 13 goals to score over 18 games. She also had the second-most saves per game (4.5) and her seven regular-season shutouts were the third-most in the conference.

A total of 18 Spartans earned Academic All-Big Ten honors in Hosler's inaugural year.

Michigan State Vice President and Director of Athletics Bill Beekman announced the hiring of Jeff Hosler as the Spartans' next women's soccer head coach on June 14, 2021.

Hosler succeeds Tom Saxton, who was at the helm of the Spartans for 30 years.

Hosler, who concluded his seventh season as head coach of the Grand Valley State women's soccer team this spring, posted the highest winning percentage of any coach in Laker history, led GVSU to three NCAA Championships, five NCAA title game appearances and reached at least the Elite Eight in six seasons (there was no Division II NCAA Tournament in 2020-21 due to the COVID-19 pandemic). He leaves GVSU with an overall record of 144-12-6, the best winning percentage in all of NCAA Soccer during that span, and a 63-2-2 mark in GLIAC play.

"I'm pleased to welcome Jeff Hosler to the Spartan family as our new women's soccer coach," Beekman said. "He's experienced exceptional success at Grand Valley State, including three national championships, while his student-athletes have been recognized for their performance on the field and in the classroom. Michigan State has a great soccer tradition, and I'm excited to watch Coach Hosler put his own mark on the Spartan program."

"I am so honored and grateful to Athletic Director Bill Beekman, Deputy Athletic Director Jen Smith, head men's soccer coach Damon Rensing and the entire search committee for entrusting me with the opportunity to lead this program," Hosler said. "I also want to thank Tom Saxton, Tammy Farnum and Stacy DeLonge for their dedication, and the incredible example they demonstrated to so many generations of Spartans. The pursuit of excellence for women's soccer in all facets begins now, while competing at the highest level within the Big Ten on and off the field. MSU and this community is a special place with amazing people, and I couldn't be more excited to come home."

With Hosler at the helm, 32 Lakers captured All-America honors and 43 earned All-Region. Twelve different Lakers were honored as CoSIDA Academic All-Americans and 56 Lakers garnered All-GLIAC honors. He also coached three Lakers to National Player of the Year honors, while guiding Marti Corby to the U-23 US Women's National Team camp in 2016.

Under Hosler's leadership, the Lakers dominated GLIAC play, winning six conference regular-season titles and seven GLIAC Tournament championships. The Lakers have also claimed the Midwest Regional title in six seasons and have reached the NCAA Elite Eight in 11 straight seasons.

In 2019, GVSU captured the program's sixth national title, a Division II record. The Lakers went 25-1, matching the single-season wins record, and scored a program-record 117 goals while guiding the nation's top offense.

Prior to GVSU, Hosler spent eight seasons at his alma mater Alma College. During his time, the Scots earned a 91-55-12 overall record, winning their only Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) regular season title in 2010. Alma also claimed the 2011 MIAA Tournament title to make its first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance.

As a two-sport student-athlete at Alma, he was a four-time All-MIAA honoree, earning All-Mideast Region and All-NCAA Tournament honors during the Scots' first trip to the Final Four in 1999. Hosler left Alma as the all-time leader in assists and ranked inside the top five in career points.

He also holds a United States Soccer Federation (USSF) National "B" License and USYSA National "Youth" License.

The East Lansing native earned a bachelor of arts in business from Alma College in 2002. He and his wife, Rochelle, are the parents of two daughters, Charlie and Kennedy, and a son, Steven.
