**SERIES SETUP:** Northwestern is back on the road this weekend as they prepare to take on the Michigan State Spartans in a three-game series in East Lansing.

- This weekend is the third of the Wildcats' four road conference matchups.
- Michigan State leads the all-time series against Northwestern 101-55-1. The last time the teams met was almost exactly one year ago, when the 'Cats took two of three from the Spartans at Miller Park.
- Northwestern last visited McLane Stadium in 2019. Michigan State took two of three in that series.
- Each of the last three series between Northwestern and Michigan State - 2019, 2021 and 2022 - has featured a Saturday doubleheader.

THE STARTING SLATE: The Wildcats will send out a rotation of Matt
McClure, Sam Garewal and Luke Benneche against the Spartans this
weekend

- McClure will make his team-leading eleventh start of the season on Friday. He has taken the ball in seven of the Wildcats' ten series openers this season, including each of their four conference series. His 6.38 ERA is first among Wildcat starters (min. three starts) and he leads the staff in strikeouts, with 31.
- On Saturday, Garewal will return to the weekend rotation for the first time since April 1. The first-year has split time between the rotation and the bullpen so far this year, making four starts in 11 appearances. He has gone 0-1 with a 2.03 ERA (3ER/13.1IP) as a starter, including three scoreless innings in his most recent start, which came against NIU on April 18. Garewal's start against the Spartans will be his second in conference play this season after he went four innings and gave up three runs all unearned at Purdue.
- The Sunday starting assignment will go to Benneche for the fourth week in a row. The junior has seen some time in the bullpen, but has made five of his nine outings from the rotation, including each of his last three.

SETTING THE TONY: Junior Tony Livermore has been unstoppable in the batter's box lately, collecting multiple hits in five of his last six games. After going 3-for-5 on Tuesday against Milwaukee, the infielder is hitting .542 (13-for-24) with five RBI and seven runs scored over those six games. He has doubled, homered, taken a walk and been hit by a pitch, giving him a team-leading 1.306 OPS since April 16. As he has throughout the season, Livermore has put the ball in play; he has struck out just once in his last six games and only 12 times in 34 games all year. At around one strikeout per nine at-bats, Livermore comes into the weekend as the fourth toughest player in the Big Ten to punch out.

BIG RELIEF: Tuesday afternoon was a bullpen game for the 'Cats and the relievers stepped up in a big way, limiting the Panthers to just two hits in a combined eight-inning shutout. The group has been locked in lately, and - including Ben Grable, who started Tuesday's game - they have allowed just seven earned runs in their last 22.0 innings. That's good for a 2.86 ERA during that span, which began last Friday against Rutgers. The run has included seven individual scoreless performances and only one outing by one reliever who allowed more than two runs. Kellen Pate, David Utagawa, Nolan Morr and Ryan Keenan all pitched perfect innings their last time out, and Grable came close, with just one baserunner allowed in his 2.1 innings on Tuesday.

FIRST IMPRESSIONS: The Wildcats have a lot of new faces on the team this season, with 16 of 35 rostered players suiting up for their first season as Wildcats. The group is made up seven first years and nine transfers and includes eight pitchers, a catcher, three infielders and four outfielders. The coaching staff is also made up entirely of newcomers, with Head Coach Jim Foster and all of his assistants in their first season in Evanston. Volunteer assistant Adrian Santiago started the season with the 'Cats, while assistant coaches and former Big Leaguers Dennis Cook and Brian Anderson were added during the first month of play.

**COACH FOSTER:** Jim Foster joined Northwestern baseball this season after six years at Army West Point, where he coached the Black Knights to four conference titles and four straight NCAA Tournament appearances. Foster owns a 437-398-3 record as a head coach after guiding the Rhode Island Rams to seven winning seasons between 2006 and 2014 and the Black Knights to four winning seasons in six years (including the pandemic-shortened 2020 season). He took over for interim head coach Josh Reynolds, who led the 'Cats to a 24-27 record in 2022, just shy of qualifying for the Big Ten Tournament.

#### **FAST FACTS:**

- All nine starters reached base safely at least once in Tuesday's game against Milwaukee, eight of the nine collected at least one hit and five of those eight had multi-hit games.
- The 'Cats stole four bases on Tuesday, which is their most in a game this season.
- Tuesday's game was Northwestern's first shutout win of the season. It came after they limited the Panthers to just two hits, which was a season low for the Wildcat pitching staff.
- Luke Tanner enters play this weekend on a career-high six-game hitting streak. He has hit .400 (6-for-15) with two doubles and six RBIs during that span.
- Evan Minarovic extended his hitting streak on Tuesday as well and has now hit safely in five straight. That ties for the longest hitting streak of his career.
