• Fresh off a last-second victory at Maryland to start the Big Ten season, Michigan State returns home to face Prairie View A&M on Saturday, Sept. 14 at 3:40 p.m. in Spartan Stadium. The game will be televised on the Big Ten Network with Mark Followill (play-by-play), Anthony Herron (analyst) and Dannie Rogers (sidelines) on the call. Saturday's game marks the first-ever meeting between Michigan State and Prairie View A&M.

• MSU improved to 2-0 on the season with a 27-24 win at Maryland last Saturday in the Big Ten opener. Down 24-17 with 4:22 left in the game, sophomore quarterback **Aidan Chiles** found freshman **Nick Marsh** for a 77-yard touchdown to tie it at 24, and **Jonathan Kim** hit a 37-yard field goal with one second remaining to put the Spartans on top, 27-24.

• After falling in the season opener at home to Texas Southern, 27-9, Prairie View A&M responded with a 37-31 road win at Northwestern State last Saturday to improve to 1-1.

• **Nick Marsh** was named the Shaun Alexander Award National Freshman of the Week and the Big Ten Freshman of the Week after catching eight passes for 194 yards – the 10th-highest single-game total in Spartan history – in the victory over Terrapins. It also marked the second-most receiving yards in a game by a Spartan freshman. Marsh's first career touchdown, a 77-yarder that tied the game in the fourth quarter, was MSU's longest TD reception since Jayden Reed had an 85-yard touchdown catch vs. Youngstown State on Sept. 11, 2021. In the fourth quarter alone, Marsh had four receptions for 151 yards. Marsh was also named the 247Sports True Freshman of the Week for his performance at Maryland. He currently ranks third in the Big Ten with 102.5 receiving yards per game (nine catches for 205 yards), and is also third in the FBS among freshmen and 24th overall in receiving yards per game.

• Michigan State University will induct six individuals and a trailblazing pair of teams into its Athletics Hall of Fame for the 2024 Class on Friday, Sept. 13. **Jessica (Beech) Bograkos** (softball), **Anson Carter** (hockey), **Darqueze Dennard** (football), **Laura (Kueny) Smith** (women's golf), **Beth (Rohl) Saylor** (women's track & field) and **Paul Terek** (men's track & field) will be joined by the 1965-1966 football teams, who become the first teams inducted into the Hall of Fame. There will also be a special recognition at halftime for the 2024 Class.

• First-year head coach **Jonathan Smith** is off to a 2-0 start leading the Spartans. Smith became only the second MSU head coach to win his Big Ten debut in his first season, joining John L. Smith in 2003 (vs. Iowa). Hall of Fame Coach Biggie Munn won his first Big Ten game vs. Iowa in MSU's first season in the Big Ten in 1953, which came in Munn's seventh season overall.

### PRESS BOX

- The Spartan Stadium press box, located on level eight, is the working press deck for reporters that features 193 seats and three radio broadcast booths. Level six is the television camera deck as well as the broadcast location for national telecasts. Admission to the press box is through Gate F on the west side of the stadium. All press personnel are subject to search prior to entering Spartan Stadium.

### POST-GAME PRESS CONFERENCES

- Post-game press conferences from both head coaches are conducted in the media center on the lower level of the north end zone facility at Spartan Stadium. Reporters can access the media center from the concourse. Selected Spartan players will also be available for interviews following the game. Quotes from both coaches and selected players will be posted online at msuspartans.com approximately one hour after the game.

### MEDIA INTERVIEWS

- Outside the weekly press conference, interviews during the week with coaches or any Spartan players should be arranged through the MSU Athletic Communications Department. The best time for player interviews is following practice on Tuesday. All player interviews should be completed by Wednesday. Please contact the MSU Athletic Communications Department for all player interview requests at least 24 hours in advance.

#### SPARTAN MEDIA NETWORK

Michigan State Athletics and Playfly Sports announced in August 2020 a rebrand of the statewide Spartan Sports Network as the Spartan Media Network. In addition, long-term extensions were announced with the three flagship stations that anchor the network: Detroit's WJR 760-AM, Lansing's WVFN 730/WJIM 1240-AM and 94.9 WMMQ-FM. The Spartan Media Network is the largest and most expansive radio network in the State of Michigan and extends its programming nationally and worldwide via partnerships with SiriusXM and TuneIn radio.

#### JONATHAN SMITH SHOW

The Spartan Media Network produces and distributes Jonathan Smith's weekly radio program Wednesdays from 7-8 p.m. ET (note: show is on Tuesdays from 7-8 p.m. when MSU plays on Friday nights). Spartan play-by-play announcer George Blaha hosts this live show, featuring insight from coaches, players, special guests, features and phone calls. The radio show can be heard statewide as well as locally on flagship station WJIM Radio (AM 1240) and WMMQ (FM 94.9) and on msuspartans.com.

#### SPARTAN ALL-ACCESS

Spartan All-Access is a sports docu-series providing an exclusive look into Michigan State Athletics, its student-athletes, coaches and the people that make the Michigan State Athletics family what it is. ## TEAM NOTES: OFFENSE

### ► KAY'RON LYNCH-ADAMS, NATHAN CARTER LEAD SPARTANS ON THE GROUND

• Sixth-year graduate **Kay'ron Lynch-Adams** leads the Spartans in rushing after two games, averaging 73.5 yards per game (19 carries for 147 yards; 7.7 avg., 1 TD), which ranks 11th in the Big Ten. He surpassed the 2,000-career rushing milestone with 46 yards on 10 carries at Maryland; he now has 2,035 career rushing yards in 50 collegiate games.

- Redshirt junior co-captain **Nathan Carter** has a team-high 30 carries for 107 yards (53.5 ypg; 3.6 avg.).
- Lynch-Adams and Carter have combined for 73 percent of the team's rushing attempts (49 of 67).

### ► AIDAN CHILES SHOWS IMPROVEMENT IN PASSING GAME

• Sophomore quarterback **Aidan Chiles** ranks sixth in the Big Ten with 238.5 passing yards per game. After throwing for 114 yards in his first career start in Week 1 against Florida Atlantic, Chiles passed for 363 yards in the win at Maryland, the eighth-highest single-game total in MSU history and the most by a Spartan QB since Brian Lewerke threw for 400 in a win against Penn State in 2017.



## TEAM NOTES: DEFENSE

### ► SPARTANS AMONG BIG TEN LEADERS IN SACKS, TACKLES FOR LOSSES

• The Spartans rank tied for second and tied for sixth in the FBS with eight sacks through the first two weeks of the season (seven vs. FAU; one vs. Maryland).

• MSU has recorded 17 tackles for losses in the first two games, second most in the Big Ten (10.0 vs. FAU; 7.0 vs. Maryland).

• Michigan State recorded seven sacks, 10 tackles for loss and had two interceptions in the season-opening win over Florida Atlantic while holding the Owls to 248 total yards and 10 points. MSU's seven sacks tied for the second most by any team in the FBS in Week 1.

### ► TAKEAWAY TIME

• Michigan State has recorded three interceptions in the first two games (**Nikai Martinez** and **Angelo Grose** vs. FAU; **Charles Brantley** vs. Maryland), tied for fourth most in the Big Ten.

### ► ANGELO GROSE LEADS TEAM, RANKS FIFTH IN BIG TEN IN TACKLES

• Fifth-year graduate senior defensive back **Angelo Grose** leads the team and ranks fifth in the Big Ten with 17 tackles (10 solo, 7 assists). Grose has started 37 career games for the Spartans, tied for the most among active players, along with fifth-year graduate senior linebacker **Cal Haladay**.

### ► LINEBACKER CAL HALADAY EXTENDS STARTING STREAK TO 25 STRAIGHT GAMES

• Fifth-year graduate senior linebacker **Cal Haladay** has started 25 consecutive games, the longest active streak on the team. He is currently third on the Spartan defense with 11 tackles; his 318 career tackles rank 16th most in MSU history.

### ► KHRIS BOGLE, JORDAN TURNER TIED FOR BIG TEN LEAD IN TACKLES FOR LOSS

• Sixth-year graduate senior defensive lineman **Khris Bogle** and fifth-year senior linebacker **Jordan Turner** have both collected 3.5 tackles for loss in the first two games of the season, tied for the most in the Big Ten. Bogle also leads the team and ranks tied for third in the Big Ten with 2.5 sacks.



## TEAM NOTES: SPECIAL TEAMS

### ► RAY GUY AWARD CANDIDATE RYAN ECKLEY LEADS BIG TEN IN PUNTING

• Redshirt sophomore **Ryan Eckley**, a candidate for the Ray Guy Award, ranks tied for first in the Big Ten in punting with his 50.1-yard average. Eckley is tied for first in the conference with four punts of 50-plus yards. Last season, Eckley was named a Freshman All-American after averaging 46.8 yards per punt, the fifth-longest average in school history.

### ► JONATHAN KIM KICKS GAME-WINNING FIELD GOAL AT MARYLAND

• Sixth-year graduate senior **Jonathan Kim** kicked a 37-yard field goal with one second remaining to push Michigan State past Maryland, 27-24, in Week 2. Kim also connected on a 50-yarder as time expired in the first half.

• Kim has made five field goals in the past two seasons of 50-plus yards, including a career-long 58-yarder at Iowa last season, which was a Kinnick Stadium record.

### ► SPARTANS 8-0 ALL-TIME VS. TEAMS FROM NCAA FCS

- Saturday's game also marks just the ninth time in school history that MSU has played an opponent from the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). MSU is 8-0 all-time against FCS opponents, with its last victory arriving in 2023, a 45-14 win over Richmond. Michigan State has outscored its FCS opponents, 332-81 (average score of 42-10), in the eight previous meetings.

### ► A QUICK GLANCE AT PRAIRIE VIEW A&M (1-1, 0-1 SWAC)

- Prairie View A&M is located in Prairie View, Texas, and is a member of the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC), playing in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS).

- The SWAC is considered one of the premier HBCU conferences in the country and currently ranks among the elite in the nation in terms of HBCU alumni playing with professional sports teams.

- The Panthers tote a 1-1 overall record to East Lansing for Saturday's match-up with the Spartans. PVAMU is coming off a thrilling 37-31 win over Northwestern State Saturday night in Natchitoches, Louisiana, in the first-ever meeting between the Panthers and Demons, withstanding a goal-line stand as time expired.

- After NSU took a 21-20 lead early in the third quarter, PVAMU countered with a 4-yard TD pass from junior quarterback Cameron Peters to senior wide receiver Shemar Savage with 6:05 left in the third quarter and the Panthers never trailed again, adding a 41-yard field goal by graduate placekicker Guillermo Garcia Rodriguez with 25 second left in the stanza for a 30-21 lead heading to the final quarter.

- NSU had a 16-yard interception return for a TD to close to 30-28 early in the fourth, but PVAMU countered with a 5-play, 70-yard drive capped by an 18-yard TD run by graduate running back Lamagea McDowell at the 12:02 mark of the fourth for a 37-28 advantage.



- The Demons got within 37-31 with a field goal, and later forced a Panther punt in the final minute, but sophomore punter Efen Jasso's 53-yard punt pinned the opposition at the NSU 1-yard line with 1:19 remaining. Northwestern State drove down to the PVAMU 1 after a pass play and a person foul penalty, before redshirt-senior linebacker Jeremiah Harris stuffed the NSU quarterback on a QB sneak on the final play of the game.
- Prairie View A&M had a massive edge in total offense, out-gaining NSU, 468-282, including 280-177 in the passing yards column, despite getting out-gained in rushing yards, 184-98.
- Peters finished 18-of-33 for 280 yards passing with two TDs and two INTs, and was also sacked twice, ending with seven rushing for 13 yards.
- Savage had six catches for 133 yards and a TD, while senior wideout Trejon Spiller also had six receptions for 55 yards. Junior running back Connor Wisham led the PVAMU rushing attack with 22 carries for 83 yards and one TD, while McDowell finished with 12 carries for 53 yards and the TD.
- Redshirt-sophomore linebacker Jayven Jackson led the PVAMU defense with seven stops, including one tackle for loss, while redshirt-freshman linebacker Ayden Jones had five tackles to go with one interception and one pass break-up.
- Garcia Rodriguez was 3-for-3 on field goals, making from 34, 22 and 41 yards, adding 4-of-4 on PATs.
- For the season, the Panthers are being out-scored by the opposition, 29.0-23.0, after losing their season opener, 27-9, at home to Texas Southern on Aug. 31.
- Prairie View A&M is averaging 354.0 yards per game on offense, which ranks 38th in FCS, with 249.5 ypg passing, ranking 22nd in the FCS, as well as 19th in FCS in passing yards per completion (13.86), adding 104.5 ypg rushing. The Panthers are being out-scored by the opposition, 29.0-23.0, after losing their season opener, 27-9, at home to Texas Southern on Aug. 31.
- The Panthers are 32nd in FCS in third-down conversion percentage (.400), while the Prairie View A&M defense is 19th in FCS in third-down conversion percentage defense (.286)
- The PVAMU defense is yielding 314.0 ypg of total offense to the opponents through two games, ranking 23rd in FCS, with 135.5 ypg rushing (39th in FCS) and 178.5 ypg passing (33rd in FCS).
- Peters is 28-of-53 (.528) for 391 yards (195.5 ypg) with two TDs and two INTs for the season. Graduate quarterback Lucas Coley is 8-of-20 (.400) for 108 yards with no TDs or INT in the season-opener.
- Wisham has 26 carries for 98 yards (3.8 ypc/49.0 ypg) with one TD through two games, while McDowell has 17 rushes for 68 yards (4.0 ypc/34.0 ypg) with one TD.
- Savage has 12 catches for 238 yards (19.8 ypc/119.0 ypg) with one TD after two games, leading the SWAC in both overall receiving yards and receiving yards/game, while ranking sixth in the FCS in ypg and seventh in receiving yards. While Savage is in the only Panther receiver with over 100 yards through two games, 13 other players have at least one catch, including six others with two or more receptions.
- Jackson leads the PVAMU defense with 12 tackles through two games, with 1.0 TFL and adds one blocked kick.
- Turner adds 11.0 total stops with 0.5 TFL, while Jones has 10 tackles with 0.5 TFL, along with one interception and a pass break-up. Senior safety Terrell Coleman Jr. has 2.0 tackles for loss out of his six total stops, adding a PBU.
- Senior safety Cameron Franklin and redshirt-senior defensive lineman Steven Shaw Jr. are tied for 15th in the FCS in forced fumbles with one each, while senior linebacker Warren Shankle is tied for seventh in FCS with one fumble recovery.
- Garcia Rodriguez is 6-of-6 on field goals with a long of 54 yards, adding 4-of-4 on PATs. He shares the FCS lead for field goals/game (3.0) and field goal percentage (1.000), while eighth in FCS in scoring (11.0 ppg).
- Jasso has 13 punts for a 44.5 ypp average with a long of 67 yards, one of four punts of 50+ yards and has three inside the 20. He is 28th in FCS in punting average
- Prairie View A&M head coach is former NFL All-Pro Bubba McDowell, who is in his third season at the helm of the Panthers' program with an overall record of 13-12. McDowell is in his 11th season overall on the PVAMU coaching staff after eight years as an assistant coaching the Panther cornerbacks, including four seasons as assistant head coach. McDowell played college football for the Miami Hurricanes, helping them to the 1987 National Championship as a standout safety, before a seven-year career in the NFL with the Houston Oilers and Carolina Panthers.

## LAST TIME OUT: MICHIGAN STATE 27, MARYLAND 24

### ► QUICK RECAP

- Sixth-year graduate senior **Jonathan Kim** kicked a 37-yard field goal with one second remaining to lead the Spartans past Maryland, 27-24, last Saturday at SECU Stadium.
- The Spartans outgained the Terrapins, 484-339, led by standout offensive performances from freshman wide receiver **Nick Marsh** and sophomore quarterback **Aidan Chiles**.
- Marsh had eight catches for 194 receiving yards, the 10th most by a Spartan in a single game and the second most by a true freshman, including a 77-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter that tied the game at 24 with 4:11 in the game.
- Chiles was 24-of-38 passing for 363 yards, three touchdowns and two interceptions. The 363 passing yards were the eighth most by a Spartan quarterback in a single game.
- Defensively, fifth-year senior captain linebacker **Jordan Turner** led MSU with seven tackles and two tackles for loss, while fellow linebackers **Wayne Matthews III** and **Cal Haladay** each had six stops.
- Kim was 2-for-2 on field-goal attempts, including a 50-yarder as time expired in the first half.

### ► SCORING SUMMARY

- Maryland opened the game with a 14-play, 75-yard scoring drive capped by a 15-yard TD grab by Tai Felton, but the Spartans answered with a touchdown on their first drive, as Chiles found Foster in the end zone on a 9-yard slant with 5:17 left in the first.
- Maryland regained the lead in the last minute of the first quarter, taking advantage of a Chiles interception. The Terrapins took over on the MSU 17-yard line and scored two plays later as quarterback Billy Edwards Jr. had a 7-yard rushing TD to make it 14-7.
- The Spartans responded once again on their third drive, going 75 yards on 11 plays, to tie the game at the 10:07 mark in the third. Chiles hit Glover on a deep 34-yard pass in the end zone for his first career TD reception.



► *Nick Marsh had eight catches for 194 yards in the win at Maryland, the second-most ever by a Spartan freshman and 10th-most overall by a Spartan in a single game.*



• MSU took over on its own 12-yard line with just 2:20 left in the half, but drove 56 yards on 12 plays to get into field-goal position, and Kim drilled a 50-yard field goal as time expired to give MSU a 17-14 lead going into the break. Kim originally missed a 55-yarder, but a Maryland offsides penalty gave Kim a second chance.

• Maryland took advantage of another Spartan interception to start the third quarter, and tied the game on a 45-yard Jack Howes' field goal to make it 17-17 at the 8:18 mark.

• The Terrapins took their third lead of the game at 24-17 on Dylan Wade's 28-yard TD catch on the first play of the fourth quarter.

• Howes missed a 41-yard field goal that would have put Maryland up by 10 points with 4:22 left, giving the Spartans an opportunity to tie the game on the ensuing drive. On the next play, Chiles connected on a 77-yard touchdown to Marsh that made it 24-24 with 4:11 remaining.

• The Spartans then forced a punt to set up their game-winning drive. MSU took over at its own 16-yard line and went on a 13-play, 65-yard drive, setting up Kim for his game-winning 37-yard field goal. Maryland had one last chance with one second remaining, but Haladay made the game's last tackle to seal the win for MSU.

## ► OFFENSIVE NOTES

• Sophomore quarterback **Aidan Chiles** was 24-for-38 passing for 363 yards and three TDs, all new career highs . . . the 363 yards passing was MSU's top single game performance against Maryland, bettering the 342 by Brian Lewerke in 2019 . . . Chiles was 13-of-23 for 154 yards with two TDs in the first half and 11-of-16 for 209 yards with one TD in the second half . . . the 363 passing yards were the eighth most by a Spartan quarterback in school history and the most since Brian Lewerke threw for 400 yards in a win over Penn State in 2017.

• The 9-yard TD pass in the first quarter from Chiles to senior wide receiver **Montorie Foster Jr.** was Chiles' first TD pass of his Spartan career, after rushing for his first score last week against Florida Atlantic.

• Freshman wide receiver **Nick Marsh** snared eight catches for 194 yards, including a 77-yard TD catch from Chiles in the fourth quarter, in just his second collegiate game . . . the 194 receiving yards was not only the best MSU single-game receiving total against Maryland, but only the second 100-yard receiving outing against the Terps, topping the previous top mark of 114 yards by Jayden Reed on eight catches in 2021 . . . it was also the 10th most receiving yards in a single game by a Spartan, and the second most by a true freshman (Ricky White with 196 vs. Michigan in 2020).

• Foster's 9-yard TD catch in the first quarter was his first TD reception of the season and sixth of his career . . . it was also Foster's first catch of the game, which extends his streak of at least one reception to 15 straight games and in 25 of his last 37 career games.

• Redshirt sophomore wide receiver **Jaron Glover** snared his first career TD with his 34-yard scoring catch in the second quarter . . . Glover finished with career highs for both catches (6) and yards (84).

## ► DEFENSIVE NOTES

• The Spartan defense snared their third interception of the season with redshirt junior defensive back **Charles Brantley's** interception in the fourth quarter; it was Brantley's third career pick.

• Senior linebacker **Jordan Turner** matched his jersey number with a team-high seven tackles, including 2.0 tackles for loss.

• Redshirt junior linebacker **Wayne Matthews III**, who is from Largo, Maryland, also tallied six stops . . . Matthews served as the team's game captain against Maryland.

## ► SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

• Graduate placekicker **Jonathan Kim** split the uprights from 37 yards out with one second left in the game for the game-winning score . . . Kim also connected on a 50-yard as time expired in the first half . . . it was Kim's fifth career FG of 50-plus yards . . . he was also 3-of-3 on PATs and is now 25-of-25 on extra points for his career.

• Redshirt sophomore punter **Ryan Eckley's** 61-yard punt in the third quarter was a season long and his fifth career punt of 60-plus yards . . . Eckley added a 51-yarder in the fourth quarter and now has four punts of 50-plus yards this season.

## 2024 COACHING STAFF



• **Jonathan Smith**, who led Oregon State to new heights during his tenure over the past six seasons (2018-23), was named Michigan State University's 26th head football coach on Nov. 25, 2023.

• Named the 2022 Pac-12 Co-Coach of the Year, Smith built Oregon State into one of the top teams in the conference. He led the Beavers, who were ranked as high as 11th in the College Football Playoff rankings in 2023, to an 8-4 record in the regular season and their third straight bowl appearance, a first for the program since 2006-09. OSU went 25-13 in 2021-23 under Smith, including a No. 17 ranking in 2022 and a win over Florida in the Las Vegas Bowl. He also has experience coaching in the College Football Playoff as an offensive coordinator at Washington in 2016.

• Known for developing talent, the 45-year-old Smith coached six All-Americans during his OSU tenure, including five his last two seasons (OL Taliese Fuaga, OL Tanner Miller and DB Kitan Oladapo in 2023; WR/PR Anthony Gould, LB Jack Colletto and Fuaga in 2022). In addition, Colletto was named the 2022 Paul Hornung Award winner for the nation's most versatile player, marking Oregon State's fourth major award winner in school history. Smith also coached two Pac-12 Freshman Offensive Players of the Year in Jermar Jefferson (2018) and Damien Martinez (2022) and four Freshman All-Americans overall. OSU tallied 74 All-Pac-12 selections during Smith's six seasons in Corvallis.

• Eight Beavers were drafted under Smith's tutelage, and an additional 17 signed as undrafted free agents. Tight end Luke Musgrave became the highest-drafted OSU player in nine years as he was picked in the second round (No. 41 overall) of the 2023 NFL Draft by the Green Bay Packers.

• Off the field, Smith led a culture of success in the classroom with a total of 168 Pac-12 Academic Honor Roll selections in his six seasons.

• Six of Smith's assistants at Oregon State joined him in East Lansing: secondary coach **Blue Adams**, assistant head coach/running backs coach/co-special teams coordinator **Keith Bhonapha**, offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Brian Lindgren**, offensive line coach/run game coordinator **Jim Michalczyk**, defensive line coach **Legi Suiaunoa** and tight ends coach/recruiting coordinator **Brian Wozniak**. Smith also hired **Joe Rossi** as the program's defensive coordinator/linebackers coach, **Chad Wilt** as the co-special teams coordinator/rush ends coach and **Demetric Martin** as the cornerbacks coach, while wide receivers coach **Courtney Hawkins** enters his fifth season as an assistant at MSU.



• **Blue Adams**, who brings nearly 15 years of coaching experience with him to East Lansing, including stints at both the collegiate and NFL levels, is the program's secondary coach.

• Adams spent five seasons (2019-23) on Smith's staff as the secondary coach at Oregon State. Adams also coached four seasons as an assistant coach with the Miami Dolphins (2012-15) before returning to the college ranks at West Virginia (2016) and South Florida (2017-18).



• **Keith Bhonapha** (BONE-uh-fuh) has 20 years of collegiate experience, most recently with Smith at Oregon State in 2023.

• An assistant head coach, Bhonapha is the running backs coach and will also serve as the program's co-special teams coordinator and hold play-calling responsibilities for that unit.

• By helping Oregon State to an 8-4 record in 2023 to become bowl eligible, Bhonapha has coached 15 teams to a bowl game as a coach and was a part of two bowl games as a player while at Hawai'i.



- Courtney Hawkins returns for his fifth season as Michigan State's wide receivers coach.
- A nine-year NFL veteran, Hawkins has helped develop NFL Draft picks Jayden Reed (Packers) and Jalen Nailor (Vikings) during his time in East Lansing.
- Hawkins came to MSU in 2020 after serving as the head football coach and athletic director at his alma mater, Beecher High School, in Flint, Michigan, for 15 years.



- Offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Brian Lindgren** spent the past six seasons (2018-23) in the same role at Oregon State.
- A two-time nominee for the Broyles Award, Lindgren helped build the Beavers into one of the most consistent offensive teams in the Pac-12.
- He coached six NFL Draft picks and multiple All-Americans and first-team All-Pac-12 honorees during his Oregon State tenure.



- Former Spartan **Demetric Martin** was named cornerbacks coach on Jan. 17, 2024, to complete Smith's on-field coaching staff.
- A four-year letterwinner at MSU from 1992-95, Martin has been a collegiate coach for more than 20 years, most recently as the cornerbacks coach and passing game coordinator at Oregon the past two seasons. He has also coached at USC (2006-07), Washington (2009-11), UCLA (2012-17), Arizona (2018-19) and Colorado (2020-21).



- **Jim Michalczyk** (muh-hall-CHECK), who has more than 30 years of coaching experience at both the collegiate and NFL levels, joined the Michigan State staff in December 2023 as the Spartans' offensive line coach/run game coordinator. Most recently, Michalczyk was with Smith at Oregon State the past six seasons (2018-23). Michalczyk was a nominee for the 2023 Broyles Award, which honors college football's top assistant coaches. His offensive lines at Oregon State were named semifinalists twice for the Joe Moore Award (2021, 2023).



- Secchia Family defensive coordinator/linebackers coach **Joe Rossi** spent the past six seasons (2018-23) at Minnesota, where he helped build the Gophers into one of the best defenses in the Big Ten as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach.
- Minnesota's defense ranked among the top 10 in the FBS in total defense three times (No. 3 in 2021, No. 8 in 2022, No. 10 in 2019) and scoring defense twice (No. 4 in 2022, No. 6 in 2021) under Rossi's direction.
- The two-time Broyles Award nominee coached 30 All-Big Ten honorees, two first-team All-Americans and 10 NFL Draft picks during his time in Minneapolis.



- A collegiate coaching veteran of more than 20 years, **Lawrence "Legi" Suiaunoa** (Leng-ee SOO-ee-ow-noah) joined the Michigan State staff as the Spartans' defensive line coach in December 2023.
- Suiaunoa spent the past six seasons (2018-23) on Smith's staff at Oregon State, and he also coached with Smith at Montana in 2011.



- **Chad Wilt** is in his first season as Michigan State's co-special teams coordinator/rush ends coach.
- Wilt, who has more than 20 years of collegiate coaching experience, most recently spent the past two seasons (2022-23) as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Indiana. He also spent two years (2020-21) as the defensive line coach at Minnesota under current Spartan defensive coordinator Joe Rossi.



- **Brian Wozniak** (Wahz-nee-ack), who was on Jonathan Smith's staff the past six seasons at Oregon State, joined the MSU staff as the Spartans' tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator in December 2023.
- After helping Oregon State to an 8-4 record in 2023 to become bowl eligible, Wozniak has guided three teams to a bowl game as a coach and four as a player while at Wisconsin.

### #2 AIDAN CHILES • SO. • 6-3 • 217 • CO-CAPTAIN

Long Beach, Calif./Oregon State/Downey High School

**2024: 2 games/2 starts, 34-of-62 passing (.548), 477 yards, 3 TDs, 4 INTs**

• Sophomore quarterback Aidan Chiles ranks sixth in the Big Ten with 238.5 passing yards per game. After throwing for 114 yards in his first career start in Week 1 against Florida Atlantic, Chiles passed for 363 yards in the win at Maryland, the eighth-highest single-game total in MSU history and the most by a Spartan QB since Brian Lewerke threw for 400 in a win against Penn State in 2017.

• Chiles was 24-of-38 passing for 363 yards, three TDs and two interceptions at Maryland.

• Chiles started his first collegiate game in the win over Florida Atlantic. Ranked the No. 2 transfer portal quarterback in the nation and eighth-best player overall in the transfer portal, according to 247Sports, Chiles gained valuable experience in a backup role at Oregon State last season behind starter DJ Uiagalelei.

• Chiles was 10-of-24 passing for 114 yards, two interceptions and no touchdowns in his first start vs. FAU. He also rushed six times for 28 yards, including an 11-yard TD.

• Chiles was a consensus four-star prospect in the Class of 2023 and rated one of the top 10 quarterbacks in the nation coming out of high school by 247Sports.



### #10 TOMMY SCHUSTER • GR.-6 • 6-0 • 200

Macomb Township, Mich./North Dakota/Chippewa Valley High School

• Sixth-year graduate transfer Tommy Schuster played high school at Chippewa Valley in Macomb Township, Michigan, and led the Big Reds to the state title as a senior in 2018 while being named the AP Player of the Year in the state of Michigan.

• He played five seasons (2019-23) at North Dakota and holds school career records for passing yards (9,075), passing completions (843) and touchdown passes (63).

• Schuster started the last 42 games of his UND career at quarterback and appeared in a total of 45 games for the Fighting Hawks, completing 67 percent of his passes (843-for-1,252) for 9,075 yards and 63 touchdowns during his time in Grand Forks.

He surpassed the 2,000-career rushing milestone with 46 yards on 10 carries at Maryland; he now has 2,035 career rushing yards in 50 collegiate games.

• In his Spartan debut, Lynch-Adams led MSU on the ground with 101 yards on just nine carries (11.2 avg.), including a 63-yard touchdown run in the second quarter, and was named the Spartan Offensive Player of the Week.

• Lynch-Adams, who has a wealth of experience with 50 collegiate games under his belt at both Rutgers (2019-20) and UMass (2021-23), has rushed for 2,035 yards and 17 TDs in his career.

• **Mark Dantonio**, the winningest coach in Michigan State football history, was elected to the College Football Hall of Fame Class of 2024. He was also named to the Class of 2024 for the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame.

• After a storied 13 seasons as head coach of the Michigan State football program, Dantonio retired as the winningest coach in Spartan history on Feb. 4, 2020. Dantonio finished his career with a record of 114-57 (.667) in East Lansing and 132-74 (.641) in 16 seasons overall (2004-19). During his time at the helm of the Spartan program from 2007-19, Dantonio compiled an impressive list of accomplishments, including three Big Ten Championships (2010, 2013, 2015), two victories in the Big Ten Championship Game (2013, 2015), victories in the 2014 Rose Bowl and the 2015 Cotton Bowl, and an appearance in the 2015 College Football Playoff.

• Beyond his record for most victories at MSU, Dantonio won more Big Ten Championships (three) and bowl games (six) than any other coach in school history, while also ranking first with 12 bowl appearances. His .639 (69-39) winning percentage in Big Ten games is a school record, while he stands tied for first in AP Top 25 finishes (seven) and second in Big Ten wins (69), home wins (67) and AP Top 25 wins (21).

• Dantonio is the fifth former Michigan State head coach to be selected for the College Football Hall of Fame, joining Clarence “Biggie” Munn (1959), Charles Bachman (1978), Duffy Daugherty (1984) and Frank “Muddy” Waters (2000).

• Dantonio will be officially inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame at the National Football Foundation College Football Hall of Fame’s 66th Annual Awards Dinner Dec. 10 at the Bellagio Resort & Casino in Las Vegas. The inductees will also be recognized at their respective collegiate institutions with NFF Hall of Fame On-Campus Salutes, presented by Fidelity Investments, during the 2024 season. Dantonio’s On-Campus Salute is scheduled for Saturday, Sept. 28 vs. Ohio State.

# HEAD COACH JONATHAN SMITH



**Jonathan Smith, who led Oregon State to new heights during his tenure over the past six seasons, was named Michigan State University's 26th head football coach on Nov. 25, 2023.**

Smith held his introductory press conference in front of Spartan supporters, athletics staff and media from around the state of Michigan on Nov. 28, 2023, inside the Hall of History at the Breslin Center.

Named the 2022 Pac-12 Co-Coach of the Year, Smith built Oregon State into one of the top teams in the conference. He led the Beavers, who were ranked as high as 11th in the College Football Playoff rankings during the 2023 season, to an 8-4 record in the regular season and their third straight bowl appearance, a first for the program since 2006-09. OSU went 25-13 the past three seasons under Smith, including a No. 17 ranking in 2022 and a win over Florida in the Las Vegas Bowl. He also has experience coaching in the College Football Playoff as an offensive coordinator at Washington in 2016.

Known for developing talent, the 45-year-old Smith coached eight All-Americans during his OSU tenure, including five his last two seasons (OL Taliiese Fuaga, OL Tanner Miller and DB Kitan Oladapo in 2023; WR/PR Anthony Gould and LB Jack Colletto in 2022). In addition, Colletto was named the 2022 Paul Hornung Award winner for the nation's most versatile player, marking Oregon State's fourth major award winner in school history. Smith also coached two Pac-12 Freshman Offensive Players of the Year in Jermar Jefferson (2018) and Damien Martinez (2022) and four Freshman All-Americans overall. OSU tallied 74 All-Pac-12 selections during Smith's six seasons in Corvallis.

Eleven Beavers were drafted under Smith's tutelage, and an additional 20 signed as undrafted free agents. Offensive tackle Taliiese Fuaga became the highest-drafted OSU player in 10 years as he was picked in the first round (No. 14 overall) of the 2024 NFL Draft by the New Orleans Saints.

Smith helped create one of the toughest home atmospheres in all of college football, as Oregon State compiled a 16-2 record at Reser Stadium over his last three years (2021-23). Off the field, Smith led a culture of success in the classroom with a total of 168 Pac-12 Academic Honor Roll selections in his six seasons.



"Jonathan has a proven track record of success, building the Oregon State program from the ground up by implementing a plan resulting in sustained historic success for the Beavers," said Michigan State Vice President/Director of Athletics Alan Haller. "He's been a part of championship staffs, coached in the College Football playoff, and understands what's required to be successful at the highest level, learning from some of the game's most successful coaches."

"On the field, his teams are tough and physical, yet innovative. (In 2023), Oregon State controlled the line of scrimmage on both sides of the ball, ranking among the nation's leaders in both rushing offense and rushing defense. He's shown not only the ability to recruit talented student-athletes who fit his system, but also to develop and maximize players once they're in the program. At his core, he's a quarterbacks coach, and throughout his career he's been instrumental in the development of young quarterbacks, which is essential in today's college football landscape."

"Beyond the football field, the Smith family will be an excellent addition to the entire Michigan State University community. Jonathan and Candice are excited to be invested community members and realize that Spartan football is just one part of the University's larger mission."

"My family and I are excited to join the Michigan State football family," said Smith upon his hiring. "I'm thankful to Alan Haller and the university leadership for entrusting me to lead a Spartan football program which possesses both an excellent tradition and all the resources needed to compete at the highest level in college football today. There are no shortcuts, and we will be a program that's willing to do the work required to experience sustained success."

Oregon State was ranked in the AP Top 25 the first 12 weeks of the 2023 season, a first in program history, including two victories over ranked opponents (No. 10 Utah, No. 18 UCLA). The Beavers had one of the best defenses in the country, ranking seventh in the FBS in sacks (3.00 per game), 17th in rushing defense (104.1 ypg) and 18th in interceptions (12) during the regular season.

On the offensive side of the ball, Smith mentored quarterback D.J. Uiagalelei to a career high in passing yards (2,638; 219.8 ypg) in addition to his 21 touchdown passes. The Beavers averaged 33.8 points per game during the regular season, good for fourth in the Pac-12 and 26th in the FBS, and ranked 36th in the country in total offense (426.9 ypg). Sophomore Damien Martinez, a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award, led the Pac-12 in

rushing yards (1,185; 98.8 ypg) in the regular season and was helped by an offensive line that was named one of 12 semifinalists for the Joe Moore Award. That group was anchored by junior first-team All-American offensive tackle Taliiese Fuaga, who was one of seven semifinalists for the Outland Trophy, and guard/center Tanner Miller, who earned second-team All-America honors from ESPN.com.

Smith was named the Pac-12 Co-Head Coach of the Year and the AFCA Region 5 Coach of the Year in 2022 after leading Oregon State to 10 wins for just the third time in program history. The Beavers (10-3, 6-3 Pac-12) finished No. 17 in both the AP and Coaches Poll following a 30-3 win over Florida in the Las Vegas Bowl. OSU ranked No. 1 in the Pac-12 in scoring defense (20.0 ppg), rushing defense (108.2 ypg), total defense (332.8 ypg) and pass efficiency defense (114.1 rating).

Smith led the Beavers to their first winning campaign and bowl appearance in eight years during the 2021 season as Oregon State went 7-5 in the regular season and earned a berth to the Jimmy Kimmel LA Bowl. The offense was the key to OSU's resurgence, setting a program record with 6.4 yards per play while averaging 31.2 points per game and gaining 5,581 total yards. In addition, B.J. Baylor became the first Beaver to lead the Pac-12 in rushing (1,337 yards) since 2003.





# 2024 SPARTAN FOOTBALL GAME NOTES



During the shortened 2020 season, Jermar Jefferson earned All-America honors for the second time in his career and was tabbed the Co-Offensive Player of the Year by The Associated Press. A member of Smith's first recruiting class, Jefferson closed his OSU career ranked fifth in school history in rushing yards (2,923), rushing touchdowns (27) and 100-yard games (15). He was also selected as a Freshman All-American and the Pac-12's Freshman Offensive Player of the Year in 2018. Jefferson was one of three players to earn first-team All-Pac-12 accolades, becoming the first Beavers to earn first-team all-league honors since 2013.

In just his second season in Corvallis in 2019, Smith nearly led the Beavers to a bowl game, coming up just short at 5-7 while still tying for second place in the Pac-12 North (4-5). The beginning stages of his program development were on display with statistical improvements on both sides of the ball while also winning three road league games for the first time in six seasons. Redshirt junior linebacker Hamilcar Rashed Jr. led the nation with an OSU school-record 22.5 tackles for loss with 14 sacks to earn first-team All-America honors.

Smith returned to his alma mater as head coach on Nov. 29, 2017, following a highly successful four-year stint as offensive coordinator at Washington. He inherited a program that went from winless in the Pac-12 the year before his arrival as head coach to one of the top teams in the conference and consecutive Top 25 rankings six seasons later.

A four-year letterwinner at quarterback for the Beavers from 1998-2001, Smith helped lead OSU to its greatest season in school history in 2000 with a school-record 11 wins, No. 4 ranking in the AP Poll, and a 41-9 victory over Notre Dame in the Fiesta Bowl. He was named the Fiesta Bowl Offensive MVP for his three-touchdown, 305-yard performance against the Fighting Irish.

Smith finished his career as the all-time leader in school history in passing yards (9,680), touchdown passes (55), single-game passing yards (469 vs.

Washington in 1998) and single-season passing yards (3,053). He also left OSU ranked No. 3 in conference history for passing yards and total offense, and his 9,680 passing yards are still third in school history. Smith was named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week multiple times during his career and he earned honorable mention all-league honors twice.

Smith – who joined Oregon State as a walk-on – earned his first career start midway through his freshman season in 1998, and the two-time captain held that position the rest of his time in Corvallis, spanning a total of 38 games.

Following his prominent collegiate career, Smith entered the coaching ranks as a graduate assistant at OSU under National Championship-winning coach Dennis Erickson in 2002. He also was a GA under Mike Riley, the winningest coach in Oregon State history, in 2003. During his time as a graduate assistant, Smith helped the Beavers to the 2002 Insight Bowl and the 2003 Las Vegas Bowl and worked with longtime NFL quarterback Derek Anderson.

Smith landed his first full-time coaching position as the quarterbacks coach at Idaho in 2004, and in his final season with the Vandals in 2009, the team ranked ninth in the nation for total offense (451.4 yards per game), 12th for passing offense (286.7 yards per game) and 20th in scoring (32.7 points per game).

He then spent two seasons (2010-11) as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Montana. During the 2011 season, the Grizzlies posted one of the best offenses in the country and advanced to the FCS semifinals.





Smith made the jump to FBS in 2012 and joined Chris Peterson's staff at Boise State as the quarterbacks coach for two seasons (2012-13). The Broncos won a share of the Mountain West Conference title in his first season at BSU and also posted a win over Washington in the Las Vegas Bowl.

Smith then followed Peterson to Washington to be the program's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, and the Huskies quickly turned into a national power.

Smith helped the Huskies to one of their best seasons in school history in 2016, when UW won 12 games, claimed the Pac-12 title, earned a berth in the College Football Playoff, and finished No. 4 in the national polls. He mentored quarterback Jake Browning, the Pac-12 Player of the Year, to a record-setting career in Washington. Browning set a school record with 43 touchdown passes as a sophomore in 2017 while throwing for 3,430 yards. The Huskies won 10 games in 2017 and advanced to their second straight New Year's Six bowl game with an appearance in the Fiesta Bowl.

Smith was a three-year starting quarterback at Glendora (Calif.) High School before his record-setting career at Oregon State, where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in liberal studies in 2001.

**EAST LANSING, Mich.** -- Michigan State defeated Florida Atlantic, 16-10, in the 2024 season opener before a crowd of 70,271 at Spartan Stadium in the Spartan head coaching debut of Jonathan Smith.

The Spartan defense recorded seven sacks, 10 tackles for loss and had two interceptions in the win. MSU also held FAU to 2-of-15 on third-down conversions and made three fourth-down stops.

Fifth-year graduate senior defensive back Angelo Grose led the Spartans with a game-high 12 tackles; he also forced a fumble and returned an interception 15 yards. Seven different Spartans contributed on the sacks.

Offensively, sixth-year graduate Kay'ron Lynch-Adams became the fourth consecutive transfer running back to rush for 100 yards in his Spartan debut, compiling 101 yards on just nine carries, including a 63-yard touchdown in the second quarter.

Making his first career start, sophomore quarterback Aidan Chiles was 10-of-24 passing for 114 yards and two interceptions, while also rushing for an 11-yard score.

The Spartans drove the ball into the red zone four times, but only converted once.

After a Ryan Eckley punt that was downed at the 1, the Spartans took advantage on the next play as D'Quan Douse sacked FAU quarterback Cam Fancher in the end zone with 7:49 left in the first quarter.

Following a Nikai Martinez interception he returned 41 yards to the FAU 18-yard line, the Spartans scored their first touchdown of the season at the 11:15 mark in the second quarter on Chiles' 11-yard scamper into the end zone to go up, 9-0.

MSU extended its lead to 16-0 as Lynch-Adams busted loosed for a 63-yard touchdown, his first career TD as a Spartan and the second-longest of his career, with 9:07 left in the first half. The Owls got on the board with a 43-yard field goal by Morgan Suarez before halftime.

FAU scored its only touchdown of the game on a fourth-and-1 at the end of the third quarter as Cam Fancher found Jayshon Platt in the end zone for a 10-yard TD pass.

Neither team scored in the fourth quarter. The Owls turned the ball over on downs all three of their possessions in the final 15 minutes, including their last possession with just 1:23 left in the game.

MSU ran out the clock to preserve the win, MSU's 24th consecutive over a nonconference opponent in a home opener.

### POST-GAME NOTES:

- Michigan State opened the Jonathan Smith era and its 128th season of football with a 16-10 Victory for MSU over Florida Atlantic on Friday night at Spartan Stadium.
- MSU moved to 10-0 in home Friday night games since 2011 and 12-0 overall under Friday night lights during that same time span, with all 12 contests being season openers for the Spartans ... the 2024 edition was its fourth straight Friday night game to open the season and third straight at home.
- MSU improved to 88-37-3 (.699) all-time in season openers, including a 23-3 (.885) mark in its last 26 lid-lifters.



Graduate defensive back Angelo Grose (15) posted his third straight game with double-digit stops and his seventh career contest with 10+ tackles after logging a game-high 12 stops Friday night. Grose tallied 10 tackles in each of the last two games to finish 2023 season (Indiana on Nov. 18 and Penn State on Nov. 24), as part of the fourth time in last six games played, also tallying 10 tackles at Minnesota (Oct. 28). It was Grose's second season opener with the double-figure tackles in the last three years, posting 11 stops vs. Western Michigan in the 2022 opening game (Sept. 2, 2022).

**COLLEGE PARK, Md.** -- Michigan State sixth-year graduate senior Jonathan Kim kicked a 37-yard field goal with one second remaining to lead the Spartans past Maryland, 27-24, on Sept. 7 at SECU Stadium.

Michigan State improved to 2-0 on the season as head coach Jonathan Smith won his Big Ten debut, while the Terrapins fell to 1-1.

The Spartans outgained the Terrapins, 484-339, led by standout offensive performances from freshman wide receiver Nick Marsh and sophomore quarterback Aidan Chiles.

Marsh had eight catches for 194 receiving yards, the 10th most by a Spartan in a single game and the second most by a true freshman, including a 77-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter that tied the game at 24 with 4:11 in the game.

Chiles was 24-of-38 passing for 363 yards, three touchdowns and two interceptions. The 363 passing yards were the eighth most by a Spartan quarterback in a single game.

Defensively, fifth-year senior captain linebacker Jordan Turner led MSU with seven tackles and two tackles for loss, while fellow linebackers Wayne Matthews III and Cal Haladay each had six stops.

Kim was 2-for-2 on field-goal attempts, including a 50-yarder as time expired in the first half. Maryland opened the game with a 14-play, 75-yard scoring drive capped by a 15-yard TD grab by Tai Felton. The Terrapins were 4-for-4 on third-down conversions on the drive while scoring in 6:30.

The Spartans answered with a touchdown on their first drive, as Chiles found Foster in the end zone on a 9-yard slant with 5:17 left in the first.

Maryland regained the lead in the last minute of the first quarter, taking advantage of a Chiles interception. The Terrapins took over on the MSU 17-yard line and scored two plays later as quarterback

Billy Edwards Jr. had a 7-yard rushing TD to make it 14-7.

The Spartans responded once again on their third drive, going 75 yards on 11 plays, to tie the game at the 10:07 mark in the third. Chiles hit Glover on a deep 34-yard pass in the end zone for his first career TD reception.

MSU took over on its own 12-yard line with just 2:20 left in the half, but drove 56 yards on 12 plays to get into field-goal position, and Kim drilled a 50-yard field goal as time expired to give MSU a 17-14 lead going into the break. Kim originally missed a 55-yarder, but a Maryland offside penalty gave Kim a second chance.

Maryland took advantage of another Spartan interception to start the third quarter, and tied the game on a 45-yard Jack Howes' field goal to make it 17-17 at the 8:18 mark.

The Terrapins took their third lead of the game at 24-17 on Dylan Wade's 28-yard TD catch on the first play of the fourth quarter.

Howes missed a 41-yard field goal that would have put Maryland up by 10 points with 4:22 left, giving the Spartans an opportunity to tie the game on the ensuing drive. On the next play, Chiles connected on a 77-yard touchdown to Marsh that made it 24-24 with 4:11 remaining.

The Spartans then forced a punt to set up their game-winning drive. MSU took over at its own 16-yard line and went on a 13-play, 65-yard drive, setting up Kim for his game-winning 37-yard field goal.

Maryland had one last chance with one second remaining, but Haladay made the game's last tackle to seal the win for MSU.



*Freshman wide receiver Nick Marsh snared eight catches for 194 yards, including a 77-yard TD catch from Chiles in the fourth quarter, in just his second collegiate game. The 194 receiving yards was not only the best MSU single-game receiving total against Maryland, but only the second 100-yard receiving outing against the Terps, topping the previous top mark of 114 yards by Jayden Reed on eight catches in 2021. It was also the 10th most receiving yards in a single game by a Spartan, and the second most by a true freshman (Ricky White with 196 vs. Michigan in 2020).*

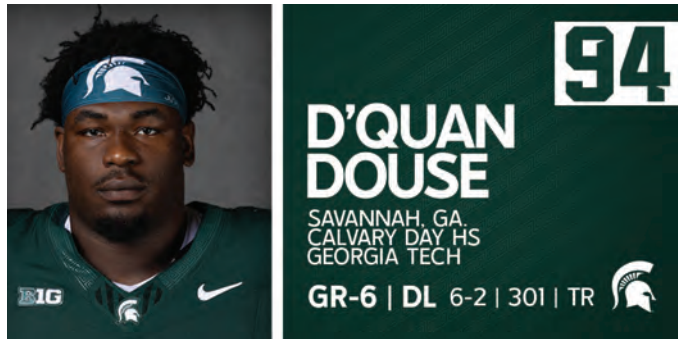

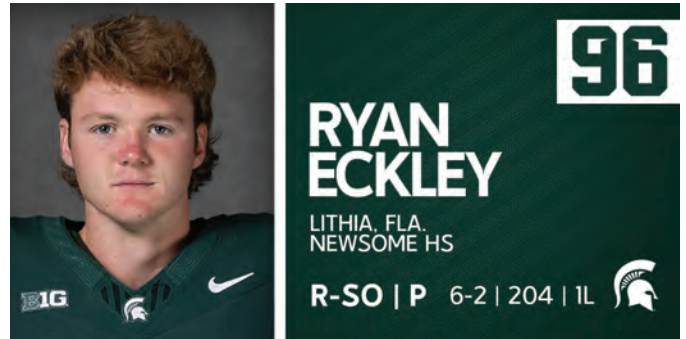

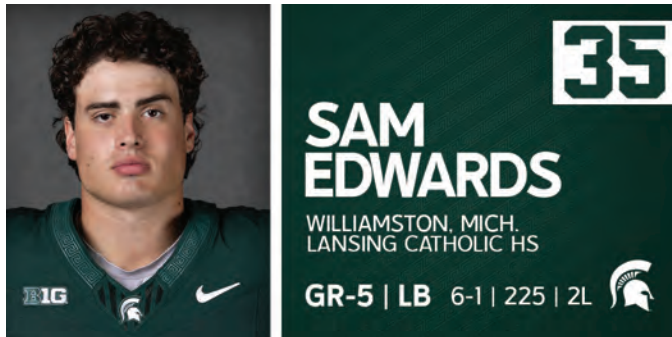
