THE OPENING TIP

Michigan State's men's basketball team hits the road for the first time this season, traveling to New York City to play No. 9/9 Kentucky in the Champions Classic on Tuesday, Nov. 18 at the World's Most Famous Arena, Madison Square Garden ... The Spartans opened the season with three-straight wins at home, beating Colgate in the opener (80-69), following that up with a thrilling 69-66 win over then-No. 14 Arkansas and posting up San Jose State (79-60) last Thursday ... Senior forward Jaxon Kohler has two double-doubles in three games (16pts/15 reb. vs. Colgate - 17pts/18 reb. vs. SJSU), junior forward Coen Carr is averaging 11.7 ppg, 5.0 rpg & 3.3 apg and redshirt sophomore guard Jeremy Fears Jr. has at least nine assists in all three games ... MSU has five players scoring in double figures, including freshman forward Cam Ward (10.0 ppg), who had 18 points and 10 boards in the Arkansas win ... The Spartans played a pair of exhibition games ahead of the season opener, beating Bowling Green, 75-66, at home on Oct. 23, before falling to preseason No. 4 UConn, 76-69, on Oct. 28 in Connecticut.

THE STARTING FIVE

1. Champions Classic

Michigan State is 5-9 all-time in the Champions Classic ... In last year's Champions Classic at State Farm Arena in Atlanta, Michigan State lost to then-No. 1 Kansas, 77-69, with Frankie Fidler leading the Spartans (15 points) ... Kansas has a 9-5 record all-time in the Champions Classic, Duke is 8-6 and Kentucky has a 6-8 record.

2. Spartans Outlast Spartans, 79-60

No. 17 Michigan State opened up a 23-point lead at halftime and San Jose State cut the lead to 10 points in the second half before MSU pulled away for a 79-60 win last Thursday night at home ... Jaxon Kohler led four players in double figures, scoring 17 points and grabbing 18 rebounds for his second double-double this season ... Carson Cooper added 17 points and seven rebounds and Jeremy Fears Jr. added 15 points, nine assists and five rebounds.

3. Izzo Enters 31st Season at Michigan State

Michigan State Head Coach Tom Izzo enters his 31st season at the helm of the program he has been with for more than 40 years, including his time as an assistant coach ... In the last four years, Izzo has continued to add to his legacy with landmark wins ... When the Spartans beat Maryland on March 6, 2022, the win gave Izzo 663 overall wins for his career, passing Bob Knight of Indiana for the most overall wins by a Big Ten Head Coach ... On Jan. 30, 2024, the Spartans beat rival Michigan, 81-62, as Izzo became the first Big Ten head coach to reach the 700-win milestone at one school and the 38th Division I coach to reach 700 wins ... And on Feb. 15, 2025, MSU beat Illinois, 79-65, on the road for Izzo's 354th Big Ten Conference win, passing Knight for the most conference wins in league history ... In addition to leading the Spartans to a record 27-straight NCAA Tournament appearances, Izzo has guided MSU to eight Final Four appearances, 11 Big Ten regular season championships and six Big Ten Tournament titles.

4. About the Spartans

Michigan State finished the 2024-25 season with a 30-7 overall record, including a 17-3 mark in the Big Ten Conference, winning the league's regular season title by three games ... It was the 11th time Big Ten regular season title under Head Coach Tom Izzo ... The Spartans were selected to the NCAA Tournament for the 27th-straight season and advanced to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament for the 11th time, finishing the year ranked No. 7 in the Associated Press Top 25 ... The Spartans have opened the season with wins over Colgate (80-69), No. 14 Arkansas (69-66) and San Jose State (79-60).

5. MSU Welcomes Six Newcomers

MSU added four transfers in the off-season – senior guard Trey Fort (Samford), junior forward Kaleb Glenn (Florida Atlantic), sophomore guard Divine Ugochukwu (Miami) and graduate guard Denham Wojcik (Harvard) – and two freshmen ... Fort started all 33 games at Samford last year, led the team in scoring (14.6 ppg) and was a Second Team All-Southern Conference selection ... Ugochukwu transferred from Miami, where he started 16 of 28 games as a freshman, averaging 5.3 points and 2.3 assists ... Wojcik, the son of MSU associate head coach Doug Wojcik, played three years at Harvard before sitting out last year following off-season surgery ... Glenn, who was an American Athletic Conference Second Team All-Conference pick at FAU, suffered an injury during summer workouts and is expected to miss the season ... A pair of freshmen from the Washington, D.C. area are expected to contribute right away, forward Jordan Scott (Reston, Va.) and forward Cam Ward (Largo, Md.) ... Ward, the No. 50 player in the class of 2025 per 247Sports.com, was the two-time Gatorade Player of the Year in Maryland and broke the state's scoring record as a senior ... Scott, the No. 86 prospect in the ESPN Top 100, helped lead South Lakes to back-to-back state titles in Virginia and was selected to play in the Capital Classic All-Star Game and the Allen Iverson Classic.

ABOUT THE WILDCATS

- » Kentucky enters the game on Tuesday night with a 3-1 overall record following a 99-53 win over Eastern Illinois on Friday night.
» The Wildcats, under the direction of second-year head coach Mark Pope, were picked to finish in second in the Southeastern Conference and are coming off a 24-12 record and a Sweet 16 appearance in 2024-25.
» The Wildcats have five players scoring in double figures, led by senior transfer Denzel Aberdeen (Florida), who is averaging 15.3 ppg.
» Senior guard Otega Oweh, who was the SEC's pick for Preseason Player of the Year, is second on the team with 13.0 ppg.
» Junior forward Mouhamed Dioubate is third on the team with 12.0 ppg and has connected on 67.9 percent of his field goals (19-of-28).

AGAINST KENTUCKY

- » Michigan State and Kentucky meet for the 27th time in program history on Tuesday, Nov. 18.
» Kentucky leads the head-to-head series, 14-12, including a 2-2 mark in Champions Classic games.
» The Spartans have won three of the last five meetings, including an 86-77 double overtime win on Nov. 15, 2022 at the Champions Classic in Indianapolis, and five of the last eight overall.

SPARTANS VS. THE SEC

- » The game against Kentucky will be the 92nd all-time for Michigan State against a team that currently makes up the Southeastern Conference.
» The Spartans have an all-time record of 58-33 record against teams from the SEC. ... The game with Kentucky will be the second this season against a team from the SEC, the ohter a 69-66 win over then-No. 14 Arkansas last week.
» Tom Izzo has an all-time record of 24-8 against teams from the SEC.

ANYONE, ANYWHERE

- » Tom Izzo has consistently played one of the toughest schedules in America ... With a willingness to play at home, on the road or a neutral site, his list of regular-season non-conference opponents reads like a who's who of top college basketball programs.
» The 2025-26 home schedule is arguably the best in program history, with home non-conference games against Arkansas (Nov. 8) and Duke (Dec. 6) in addition to 10 Big Ten contests, Michigan State will host 12 power conference opponents for the first time in the Izzo Era.
» The Spartans played at Connecticut in an exhibition game (Oct. 28), play Kentucky Tuesday in the Champions Classic at Madison Square Garden in New York City (Nov. 18) and will play North Carolina on Thanksgiving Day (Nov. 27) in the Fort Myers Tip-Off.

Michigan State Head Coach Tom Izzo

On what's different now since the Elite Eight loss to Auburn...

I think I have gradually, hopefully defied time. I am more energized, I think I know some of the reasons. I think there's things that are here that are better, I think there's things I got off my plate that are better. I still think I'm frustrated with the same things. I'm just trying to grow up and learn how to deal with them a little bit better. It's exciting that Michigan State gets to be in this thing for, what, 14, 15? I don't know how many years? 15. It's always one of the most watched nights of basketball, and I look at that as a privilege. I mean, yeah, we had to earn it, but it's still a privilege to play in it, so I'm excited to go to New York. I'm excited to see where we are. We are not great by any means yet, and that's why I said that the other night, and I hope you didn't take it wrong, because I got calls from NFL guys and people all over. You do have to push people. That doesn't change. If you're a parent, if you're a teacher, if you're a coach, that doesn't change. If that changes, I won't be here. Sometimes I get upset with some questions because I feel like you're their mama talking.

On what he's seen from the team when they're good versus not as good...

I mean, when you don't shoot the ball well, that affects everybody. It's like trying to live with your defense in football. The Pittsburgh Steelers, you can play great defense. Sooner or later, the offense, it just bombs you down, and it makes you. And I think that happens to us a little bit. What happened the other night was surprising to me, because some of my key guys came out, and I loved to death, and I believe it. And they just didn't have a zip to them and then it changed quickly, some of it's understandable if we'd had accomplished something. I just want to make sure you know, our fans know and my players know that beating Arkansas - nope, nobody hung a banner up for that. It was a good win. John (Calipari) wasn't happy with his team. But we didn't accomplish anything, and I'm not saying that for coach speak or anything else. But it's amazing. I'm never on Twitter. I will never be on Twitter. But I got a lot of people that call me and tell me fans are upset about this. Why can they be upset and I'm not allowed to be? I'm upset but I'm gonna hold them accountable to what I think they want to be. And that's why, like Jeremy (Fears Jr.), I mean, if you look at Jeremy, our relationship with Jeremy is 20 times better than it was. And that's normal. He's really been here for a year, year and a half, because the injury and that. Doesn't understand and then finally figures out, "Hey, that idiot wants me to be good, too." And when that happens, it's the same thing that happened with many other players over my career. I thought the last two days, what we kind of understood what we didn't do. Why we didn't. I talked to my seniors. I talked to my staff, and I took the blame myself because eventually, I'm the one that's got to get that done.

On what he's seen from Kentucky...

I told you that I thought Arkansas was one of the most talented teams I saw, and I did. But they had some younger guys. They didn't have as much experience. Kentucky's even more athletic and tougher. I think they really pushed the ball. Arkansas had one guy that really pushed the ball. Kentucky's got multiple guys that pushed the ball. They've got more than a couple of shooters, and they can shoot it from deep, deep. And they're big inside, and those two guys inside complement each other, they kind of play about 22, 18 minutes, so they're usually fresh. They're well-coached. Again, I think we're gonna hit some of the better teams in the country, and they're one of them.

On how much more ceiling there is for redshirt-sophomore guard Jeremy Fears Jr. ...

Jeremy has been really good. I mean, he's still not 100 percent back that he trusts himself and trusts his own leg. But, so much better, so much better. He doesn't get as frustrated and he's been really good and I think he's running the team, I think he's playing with a confidence. I think he's feeling better and better about his shot, which I think just gives him more freedom to do more things. So that's been a big plus, because the head, when the head goes, the body goes, when the head dies, the body dies. I think Jeremy is maybe improved as much as anybody, right now.

ABOUT THE SPARTANS

» The Spartans are replacing three starters and four letterwinners who accounted for 63.5 percent of the team's scoring last year, 41.8 percent of the team's rebounds and 52.3 percent of the team's assists ... Notable losses included guards Jaden Akins (All-Big Ten Third Team, All-Defensive Team) and Jase Richardson (All-Big Ten Third Team, All-Freshman Team).

» The cupboard is not bare, by any stretch, as the team returns junior forward Coen Carr, senior center Carson Cooper, redshirt sophomore point guard Jeremy Fears Jr. and senior forward Jaxon Kohler, a quartet that has combined for more than 300 games played at MSU and serve as captains.

» Through three games, the Spartans have five players scoring in double figures and eight players averaging at least 13 players averaging at least 13 minutes per game.

» Kohler leads the team with 14.3 points per game and 13.3 rebounds, which is tops among all players in the Big Ten ... Kohler, who has two double-doubles, grabbed 18 rebounds against San Jose State, the most by an MSU player since Miles Bridges had 21 against Savannah State in 2018.

» Fears, who leads the team with 33.0 minutes played, is fourth on the team with 11.0 ppg and is handing out 9.3 assists per game, leading the Big Ten Conference.

» Carr, one of the most athletic players in all of college basketball, is third on the team with 11.7 ppg, 5.0 rpg and 3.3 apg (and 3 blocks) in 29.3 mpg.

» Cooper is playing a career-high 25.3 minutes, is second on the team with 12.0 ppg and third with 6.0 rpg.

» Sophomore guard Kur Teng, who scored 10 points against San Jose State, is averaging 5.3 points ... Freshmen forward Cam Ward is fifth on the team with 10.0 ppg, second with 6.0 rpg and classmate Jordan Scott, who is fifth on the team in minutes per game at 18.7, is averaging 4.0 ppg and 4.3 rpg.

WHAT'S NEW

» While the Spartans return just two starters (Jeremy Fears Jr. and Jaxon Kohler) from last year, the team entered the season with experienced players on the team.

» A quartet of transfers – guards Trey Fort, Divine Ugochukwu and Denham Wojcik and forward Kaleb Glenn – come to East Lansing with a combined 222 games played and 88 starts.

» Fort has more career starts than any player on the roster (41), including 33 last year at Samford when he averaged 14.6 ppg and hit 80 shots from 3-point land.

» Glenn, who will miss the season following a summer injury, was an American Athletic Conference (AAC) Second Team All-Conference selection, after averaging 12.4 ppg and 5.4 rpg, while shooting 53.3% from the floor.

» Ugochukwu started 16 of 28 games at Miami as a freshman, averaging 5.3 ppg and 2.3 assists, while Wojcik, the son of associate head coach Doug Wojcik, appeared in 64 games and started 16 during three years at Harvard.

MSU IN NOVEMBER

» Michigan State has an all-time record of 163-47 in games played in the month of November ... This includes a 107-4 mark at home.

» When James Madison beat MSU in the season opener of the 2023-24 season (79-76 in overtime), it was the first loss at home since 1986, when a David Robinson-led Navy squad that bested the Spartans, 91-90, in overtime on Nov. 29, 1986.

» Head Coach Tom Izzo is 85-1 all-time at home in November, 128-43 for the month overall.

» The Spartans went 6-2 in November last year.

IZZO NAMES TEAM CAPTAINS

» Michigan State Head Coach Tom Izzo announced the team's captains on the first official day of practice in late September.

» Seniors Carson Cooper and Jaxon Kohler, as well as junior forward Coen Carr and redshirt sophomore guard Jeremy Fears Jr. will serve as the team's captains.

» This is just the fifth time (1998-99, 2004-05, 2005-06), and the first since 2009-10, that the Spartans will have four captains in Izzo's 31 seasons at the helm of the MSU program.

COEN CARR NAMED TO JULIUS ERVING AWARD PRESEASON WATCH LIST

» Junior forward Coen Carr was one of 20 Division I men's basketball players selected to the watch list for the 2026 Julius Erving Award, announced by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame on Oct. 29.

» The annual Julius Erving Award, named after the Class of 1993 Hall of Famer and 17-year professional basketball player, celebrates its 12th year by recognizing the top small forwards in Division I men's college basketball.

» One of the team's quad-captains, Carr appeared in all 37 games last season, when the Spartans won the Big Ten regular season title and reached the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament ... He finished fourth on the team in scoring with 8.1 points per game, while adding 3.6 rebounds (fourth on the team), was second on the team with 28 blocked shots and fifth in the team in minutes played (771, 20.8 per game).

» Carr, who scored in double figures 12 times, shot 61.1 percent from the floor (113-of-185), including 33.3 percent (5-of-15) from 3-point land and hit 70.1 percent of his free throws (68-of-97). He averaged 7.2 points and 2.8 rebounds in Big Ten games.

» During the team's postseason run, Carr averaged 10.2 points and 5.7 rebounds while shooting 55.0 percent from the floor (22-of-40), including 11.3 points and 5.5 rebounds while shooting 59.3 percent from the floor (16-of-27) during the NCAA Tournament ... He scored a career-high 18 points and grabbed nine rebounds with two assists and a block against Bryant (3/21) in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

- » Michigan State's win over then-No. 14 Arkansas in the second game of the season gave the Spartans a non-conference win over a ranked opponent for the ninth-straight season.
- » Since the start of the 2015-16 season, the Spartans have 12 regular season non-conference wins against ranked opponents, which is the second-most in the B1G and tied for ninth-most in D-I in that time.
- » Michigan State has 34 regular-season non-conference wins since the start of the 1995-96 season, (Izzo's 1st season), which is the most ranked wins vs. non-conference opponents in the regular season in that time.

DEFEND, REBOUND AND RUN

- » One of the staples of Tom Izzo-coached teams in his 30-plus years at the helm of the Michigan State program are to defend, rebound and run.
- » The team's win over then-No. 14 Arkansas on Nov. 8 was a good example of that principle, as the Spartans had a +12 advantage (45-33) in rebounds, a +18 advantage in points in the paint (46-28) and scored 14 points on the fast break.
- » Michigan State, with the exception of the 2023-24 season, has been +3.0 per game or better in rebounding margin over the last 20 seasons, with their +6.6 rebounding margin per game total in that time being the 2nd-best in Division I in that time.
- » The Spartans have a +7.4 paint point per game differential since the start of 2023-24, which is also the best in the B1G during that time.
- » MSU is also a team that likes to get out and run and the Spartans are averaging 15.7 fastbreak PPG since the start of last season, which is the sixth-highest mark in Division I in that time.

SUTON RETURNS TO THE SPARTANS

- » Former Michigan State men's basketball standout Goran Suton returned home to his alma mater in August and is in his first year as a graduate manager for the Spartans.
- » Suton is one of three former graduate managers who returned to work for Head Coach Tom Izzo, joining current assistant coaches Jon Borovich and Austin Thornton
- » Suton played at Michigan State from 2005-09 and is one of eight players all-time in program history to score at least 1,000 points and grab at least 800 rebounds.
- » As a senior in 2008-09, he was an All-Big Ten Second Team selection after averaging 10.4 points and 8.4 re-bounds in 32 games ... Suton helped lead the Spartans to the 2009 Final Four, was named the Most Outstanding Player of the NCAA Tournament Midwest Regional, averaging 19.5 points and 9.5 rebounds, and was selected to the Final Four All-Tournament Team, averaging 10.5 point and 9.0 rebounds.
- » Suton was selected by the Utah Jazz in the second round (No. 50) of the 2009 NBA Draft ... He played professionally overseas for 10 seasons, including stops in Russia, Italy, Croatia and Spain.
- » He earned his bachelor's degree from Michigan State in 2009 in retail.

AGENT 99

- » When the NCAA allowed players to wear jersey numbers that featured numbers higher than 5, college basketball started to see unique jerseys.
- » Last year, the Spartans had a roster that included No. 7 Gehrig Normand and No. 8, Frankie Fidler.
- » This year, sophomore guard Divine Ugochukwu, a transfer from Miami, is wearing No. 99.
- » Per my research, Ugochukwu becomes the first player in Michigan State history to wear No. 99 (that wasn't hard), but he is one of only eight players at the Division I level to sport double 9's, joined by Devin McGlockton (Vanderbilt), Achor Achor (Mississippi State), Jordan Burks (UCF), Iaroslav Niagu (Jacksonville State), Paulo Semedo (Arkansas), Curtis Williams (Tulene) and San Jose State's Sadraque NgaNga.
- » Further, Ugochukwu is one of five players from a Power Four program to wear a number in the 90s, including Houston Mallette from Alabama (95).

» Michigan State men's basketball head coach Tom Izzo has announced the signing of Julius Avent, Jasiah Jervis, Carlos Medlock Jr. and Ethan Taylor, who will join the program for the 2026-27 school year.

"I think we just came off one of our better recruiting classes in years and years and years, and I give a lot of credit to my entire staff," MSU Head Coach Tom Izzo said. "Everybody kind of joined in, everybody had their own guy, and everybody connected with the families. In this day and age of transactions, Michigan State is still trying to be a relationship-based organization, program, whatever you want to call it. But I'm excited that the parents of these kids had just as much influence on our decision as the kids did."

"We think we hit a home run because we think we got players we need, in positions we need. We got the kind of people we need, 'Our Kind of Guys,' and we got guys that our players really enjoyed on the visit and helped recruit them. So, I just want to publicly thank everyone that was involved, from our video crews, to our trainers and strength coaches, to my assistant coaches, to all of the wives that helped on the visits; this was a family affair in a day and age that is not necessarily that way. So, I'm happy to say it's still that way at Michigan State."

Julius Avent (6-7, 220, Forward – Oradell, N.J. / Bergen Catholic)

A four-star recruit who is ranked No. 78 overall, No. 15 among power forwards by 247 Sports and No. 2 in the state of New Jersey ... Averaged 14.5 points, 5.1 rebounds, 1.3 blocks and 1.3 assists last year as he helped Bergen Catholic to a Non-Public A state boys' basketball championship ... Averaged 14.0 points and 6.0 rebounds during the 2025 EYBL summer for the PSA Cardinals ... His father, Anthony, played basketball at Seton Hall and helped lead the Pirates to the 1989 Final Four before playing in the NBA for six years.

Jasiah Jervis (6-4, 190, Guard – Bronx, N.Y. / Archbishop Stepinac)

A four-star recruit from New York City who plays at Archbishop Stepinac in White Plains, N.Y.... Ranked No. 38 nationally by 247 Sports, No. 3 among shooting guards and No. 2 in the state ... Helped lead Archbishop Stepinac to a 26-4 overall record and to the 2025 New York City Championship – CHSAAA vs. PSAL "AA" City Champions, the third in his career ... First player of the class to commit to Michigan State ... A four-star recruit who ranked among the top guards in Michigan ... Currently attends Link Academy in Missouri ... Rated as the No. 66 overall player in his class and No. 7 among point guards ... Helped lead Wayne Memorial to their first-ever Division I championship game appearance in 2025 ... Averaged 24.9 points and 4.8 assists as a junior at Wayne ... Scored 30 points in the state playoffs against U-D Jesuit, followed by 29 points against Flint Carman-Ainsworth in the semifinals ... Helped lead Wayne to a 25-4 record last season ... His father, Carlos Sr., played basketball at Eastern Michigan ... Teammates at Link Academy with fellow MSU signee Ethan Taylor.

Ethan Taylor (7-1, 244, Center – Shawnee, Kan. / Link Academy [Mo.]

Ranked No. 23 nationally overall and the second-ranked center in 2026 by 247 Sports ... Transferred this summer from Shawnee Mission Northwest High School to Link Academy in Missouri ... Coach Izzo

In his 31st year, Tom Izzo (Northern Michigan, '77) is 740-302 (.710), and 360-173 (.675) in the Big Ten, as the head coach of the Michigan State basketball program. He ranks as the winningest coach in Michigan State history, having passed his mentor, Jud Heathcote, with his 341st career victory on Nov. 28, 2009. In his 30-plus seasons as a head coach, Izzo has captured eight National Coach of the Year awards, including the Clair Bee Award in 2005 and NABC honors in 2001 and 2012. In 1999, Izzo was named National Coach of the Year by Basketball Times, while earning similar honors from The Associated Press, Basketball News and the USBWA in '98. He also earned National Coach of the Year accolades from CBSSports.com in 2012. He earned Big Ten Coach of the Year honors in 1998, 2009, 2012 and 2025. Izzo was enshrined in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on September 9, 2016, cementing his status as one of the game's all-time greats.

Among The Big Ten's Best

Tom Izzo's .675 winning percentage in Big Ten games ranks fourth all-time among league coaches with at least 10 years of service, behind former Wisconsin coach Bo Ryan (.717), former Indiana coach Bob Knight (.700), and former Purdue coach Ward Lambert (.685). In all games, Ohio State's Thad Matta ranks first at .748, followed by Ryan (.737), Knight (.734), Wisconsin's Walter Meanwell (.712), Izzo (.710) and Lambert (.709). Michigan State won at Illinois, 79-65, on Feb. 15, 2025, giving Izzo his 354th conference victory, moving him past Knight for the all-time lead in Big Ten history. When MSU beat Maryland on March 6, 2022, Izzo reached 663 wins, passing Knight (662) for most overall wins as a head coach at a Big Ten school, and 700 wins when the Spartans beat Michigan on Jan. 30, 2024.

Izzo Among Best Ever

Through his first 30 seasons, Tom Izzo won 737 games, ranking fourth in college basketball history for most wins by a college coach in his first 30 years.

Final Fours

Tom Izzo led MSU to eight Final Four appearances between 1999 and 2019, becoming just the fourth school in college basketball history to do it in any 21-year span, including just the third since the tournament field expanded to 64 teams in 1985. Izzo's eight Final Fours are the most by any coach since his first season in 1996 and he ranks fifth all-time, including third among active coaches. The eight Final Fours are also the most by any Big Ten coach.
