QUICK HITTERS

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

► After back-to-back weeks on the road, the Blue Raiders return home to face Bowling Green. It marks the Falcons' first visit to Murfreesboro and will be the final non-conference game of the year for MT.

► The 2017 season is the 103rd for Blue Raider football and the 19th at the FBS level.

► Middle Tennessee has won at least eight games in a season three times in the last five years.

► WR Richie James has 100 or more yards receiving nine times in his last 12 games.

► QB Brent Stockstill has thrown at least one TD pass in 18 straight games, which ranks as the second longest streak in the country.

► WR Richie James ranks tied for 13th on the C-USA all-time receptions list with 232 and needs 1 more to move into sole possession of 13th past Darius Johnson (SMU). Five more will put him in 12th past JaJuan Dawson (Tulane).

► WR Richie James ranks 12th on the C-USA's all-time receiving yardage list with 3,177 yards and 31 more yards will move him into 11th.

► WR Ty Lee's 63 receptions led all freshmen nationally in 2016.

► PK Canon Rooker has hit 14 of his last 15 field goals dating back to 2016. He is 1-for-1 in 2017.

► QB Brent Stockstill broke his own school record by throwing for 31 touchdowns in 2016.

► QB Brent Stockstill threw for 3,233 yards in 2016 despite missing three games with an injury. That went down as the most ever by a sophomore at MT.

► QB Brent Stockstill became the first QB in school history to throw for over 400 yards in a game twice in a season when he did it in 2016.

► In MT's last 15 wins it has averaged 573.5 yards of total offense and allowed 393.8.

► Middle Tennessee is 20-6 in its last 26 home games.

► The Blue Raiders have been bowl eligible eight times in 11 years and participated in six bowls during the FBS era.

► Middle Tennessee has 7 players entering the 2017 season with a degree in hand, tied

for 39th in the nation. (Peter Bailey, Alex Dale, Lucas Hamilton, Myles Harges, Max Linder, Brent Stockstill, Shane Tucker).

► MT averaged 47.6 points a game at home and 34.8 on the road in 2016.

► In their last 40 conference games, the Blue Raiders have a mark of 28-12.

► Over the last 59 games, the Blue Raiders have come up with 66 interceptions. The team had 15 picks in 2013 by eight different players, 13 in 2014, 17 in 2015 but only 11 in 2016.

► Consecutive Starts Leaders: Mike Minter (27), Richie James (23), Chandler Brewer (21) and DJ Sanders (16).

► Under Rick Stockstill, the Blue Raiders have been involved in 20 games that were decided in the final minute of regulation or overtime. The team is 12-8 in those games and have won eight of the last 10.

► Head Coach Rick Stockstill is third on the school's all-time wins list with 73 victories.

► In 140 games under Rick Stockstill, the Blue Raiders are +17 in turnover margin.

► Middle Tennessee has scored 30 or more points 63 times under Rick Stockstill. The Blue Raiders had 10 games of 30 or more points in 2016 to set a new single-season high under Rick Stockstill. The previous mark was nine in 2009.

Press Conference

On Mondays at 10:30 AM, in the Kennon Sports Hall of Fame building, selected players and Coach Stockstill meet with the media individually for a press conference. The weekly conferences will be held every Monday before a game. Media can park in the area located between the practice field and the weight room on campus. The Athletic Communications Office will transcribe quotes that will be put on GoBlueRaiders.com and also emailed to the Blue Raiders' primary and football lists. A video feed of Stockstill, along with the players, will be available on Youtube.com/GoBlueRaiders.tv. The Press Conference will be shown live on Facebook Live.

Practice

Members of the media can interview coaches and players on Tuesday and Wednesday of game-week after practice. All practices are closed. Following Wednesday's practice, student-athletes will not be available for interviews until the conclusion of the game on Saturday.

Postgame Interviews

Middle Tennessee's locker room is closed. Media will be asked to submit a list of player requests to Mark Owens at the start of the 4th quarter. During home games, players will be available to the media first in the Murphy Center Green Room (lower level) followed by Head Coach Rick Stockstill.

Photographer Room

A photographer work area is setup prior to each game in the southeast corner of Murphy Center. Tables and internet access will be setup just outside the Green Room for use by all photographers.

A LOOK AT THE SERIES

► This will be just the second meeting between the two schools in a series that began in 2016. The Blue Raiders, in a pouring rain storm, up-ended the Falcons last year in Bowling Green, 35-24.

RAIDERS AT FLOYD STADIUM

► Since Floyd Stadium opened in 1933, the Blue Raiders have compiled an overall mark of 287-119-13 (.700), including a record 31-game win streak from 1987-94.

► Under Rick Stockstill, the Blue Raiders are 39-22 overall at Floyd Stadium and 26-14 in conference games (13-3 vs C-USA). MT has a 20-6 record at home in its last 26 games.

► Since 2007, MT has had home games against Virginia, Maryland, Mississippi State, Minnesota, Georgia Tech, BYU and Vandy. MT hosts Vandy in 2017, Duke in 2019 and Missouri in 2022.

HALL OF FAME GAME

► Prior to Saturday's 6 PM kickoff, Middle Tennessee will induct its 42nd Hall of Fame class. This year's inductees includes Marco Born and Andreas Siljestrom (men's tennis), Wes Counts (football), Chrissy Givens (women's basketball), Rick Insell (women's basketball) and Michael McKenry (baseball).

GIANT KILLERS

► Under Rick Stockstill the Blue Raiders have a knack of knocking off Power 5 opponents. With the win at Syracuse earlier this season, MT now has five wins over Power 5 foes in the Stockstill era. MT has wins over Maryland (2008, 2009), Georgia Tech (2012), Missouri (2016) and Syracuse (2017) with six others being decided by a touchdown or less. The Raiders will have plenty of more chances in the future

JAMES SETS MT RECEIVING RECORD

► With 112 receiving yards on 10 catches against Vanderbilt in the opener, Richie James became the Blue Raiders' all-time leader in receiving yards. James enters the Bowling Green game with **3,177** career yards which broke the 16-year record of 3,074 yards by Kendall Newson (1998-01).

JAMES HAS NEWSON IN SIGHT

► Junior Richie James is well on his way to owning every MT receiving record and another could fall against Bowling Green. James needs just 6 more catches to tie the all-time mark of 238 set by Kendall Newson (1998-01). At Syracuse he tied Newson for the all-time TD receptions mark with his 22nd.

CAPTAINS

► Head coach Rick Stockstill announced early in camp the players who will serve as permanent team captains in 2017. In the

past, Stockstill named captains in December, but for the first time he named them before the season. Captains include redshirt senior Shane Tucker, redshirt junior wide receiver Richie James, redshirt junior quarterback Brent Stockstill, senior linebacker D.J. Sanders and junior Chandler Brewer. All five wear a specially designed patch.

8 TIMES IN 11 YEARS

► In 11 years under Rick Stockstill, Middle Tennessee has reached bowl eligibility eight times and seven times in the last eight years. The Blue Raiders have been bowl eligible under Rick Stockstill in 2006, 2009, 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016. The eight bowl eligible years during the 11-year span is more than any FBS team in Tennessee and equals the most of any program in C-USA.

MR. SENIORITY

► Middle Tennessee Head Coach Rick Stockstill is in his 12th season at the helm of the Blue Raiders. His 12 seasons make him the longest tenured head coach in Conference USA while ranking 6th nationally.

WINNING TURNOVER BATTLE

► Winning the turnover battle is critical in collecting victories in football. Under Rick Stockstill, MT has a mark of 48-13 when winning the turnover battle and is 40-5 during bowl eligible years (2006, 2009, 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016). Over the last 65 games (since 2012), MT is 23-2 when winning the turnover battle.

LOOKING FOR 100

► During its history, Middle Tennessee owns an impressive 166-55-1 (.750) record when a back gains 100 or more yards rushing. Under Rick Stockstill, a Blue Raider has reached the 100-yard mark 52 times and the team has a 44-8 mark in those games.

30 IS MAGIC

► Under Rick Stockstill, the Blue Raiders are 57-6 when scoring 30 points or more. The six losses came at Louisville in 2007 when the Raiders fell, 58-42, at Troy in 2011, 38-35, at home against WKU in 2011, 36-33 (2OT), against Western Michigan in the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl in 2015 (45-31), at home against WKU in 2016 (44-43) and against Hawai'i in the Hawai'i Bowl (52-35).

OFFENSIVE NOTES

THIS 'N THAT

► After averaging 517.7 total yards a game last year, the Blue Raiders have reached the 300-yard mark just once in three games this season.

► MT managed just 215 total yards of offense in the season opener which was its fewest yards in a game since gaining just 205 against North Texas in 2013.

► In 2016, the Blue Raiders set single-season records in total yards, points scored, passing yards, passing yards per game, passing attempts, passing completions, and touchdown passes.

► MT set single-game records in total offense and points scored against FAU in 2016 with 757 yards and 77 points. The team also rushed for a C-USA record 495 yards which went down as the second most in MT history.

► Also against FAU, MT had two 200-yard rushers in I'Tavius Mathers (213) and Richie James (207) for the first time in school history. In fact, they became just the 6th team in NCAA FBS history to accomplish the feat.

► The Blue Raiders ranked 6th nationally last year in red zone offense at 93.2 percent (55-59). Of the 55 scores, 45 were touchdowns which was an impressive 82 percent.

► 21 different players caught passes in 2016 but only 11 have hauled in passes in 2017.

► MT had a 1,000-yard rusher and a 1,000-yard receiver in 2016 for the first time in school history.

► For just the 7th time in NCAA FBS history, MT produced a player (I'Tavius Mathers) with 1,500 yards rushing and 500 yards receiving.

► In 2016, the Blue Raiders ranked 26th nationally in third down conversions at 44.6 percent but are 129th after three games in 2017.

► MT averaged 325.8 passing yards per game to rank 8th nationally last year. That figure easily shattered the Blue Raiders' all-time record of 311.7 set in 2015.

► MT completed a school record 42 passes against WKU on Oct. 15, 2016.

► Over the last 21 home games, MT is averaging 41.9 points a contest (881 points).

► In four years of C-USA action, MT has rushed

for 6,807 yards in 32 league games. That averages out to 212.7 yards a game.

► Rushing National Rankings Last 4+ Years:

► MT has registered over 5,000 yards of total offense in a season seven times in its history and five of those have come under Rick Stockstill.

► Middle Tennessee averaged 517.7 yards per game of total offense in 2016 which was a new school record. The previous all-time mark was 481.4 yards set by the 2001 team that finished 8-3.

► The Blue Raiders scored a school record 67 touchdowns in 2016 to better the previous mark of 58 touchdowns set in 2015.

90-YARD DRIVES

► The Blue Raiders have put together 23 scoring drives of 90 or more yards under Rick Stockstill. MT had four 90-yard or longer drives in 2016. The longest drive under Stockstill

DEFENSIVE NOTES

NEW LOOK D OFF TO GOOD START

▶ Middle Tennessee's new look defense is off to a good start in 2017. Through two games, they are ranked 49th in total defense, 64th in rushing defense and 33rd in sacks. The unit has averaged just giving up 92.7 yards a game in the fourth quarter.

THIS 'N THAT

▶ The Blue Raiders recorded six sacks against Syracuse which was their most in a game since registering six in a win over UAB in 2014 - span of 32 games. It was also the most ever against a Power 5 team under Rick Stockstill.

▶ After a tough first half against Vandy, the Blue Raider defense allowed just 122 yards in the second half, including just 30 in the fourth quarter.

▶ The Blue Raider defense has finished in the top 40 nationally in interceptions three of the last four years.

▶ MT owns two shutouts since entering C-USA play in 2013. MT defeated FIU, 48-0, in 2013 and downed Alabama A&M last year, 55-0.

▶ MT's four interceptions against FAU in 2016 equaled the third most in a game and the most since 2010 against Arkansas State.

▶ MT held North Texas to just 5 total rushing yards in 2016 which equaled the fourth fewest ever allowed in a single game by the Blue Raiders.

▶ The unit ranked 4th nationally in red zone defense at .694 in 2015 and finished 35th in 2016 (.797).

▶ Overall, the Blue Raiders have 66 interceptions over their last 59 games. Middle Tennessee tied for 14th nationally in 2015 with 17.

DEFENSIVE SCORES

▶ Under Rick Stockstill, the Blue Raider defense has scored 25 defensive touchdowns and 20 have come since 2009. Of the 25 scores, 17 have been interceptions and eight have come

yards per game at 296.7.

▶ Had a career-high 434 passing yards against WKU which ranked as the third most in school history for a single-game. Also against the Hilltoppers he set the school record for completions (42).

▶ With 432 passing yards against Hawai'i in 2016, Stockstill became the first multiple 400-yard passer in school history.

▶ Set a new school record when he connected on his first 22 passes in the win over AAMU in 2016. Stockstill broke the previous mark of 19 consecutive completed passes by Logan Kilgore in 2011. The record-breaking 20th straight completion was a 42-yard touchdown pass to Patrick Smith (the first TD of Smith's career).

▶ Has 11 300-yard passing games in his last 18 outings.

▶ His 4,005 passing yards in 2015 was tops in the country among freshmen and was a new MT single-season and C-USA freshman record. He also led all freshmen in touchdown passes with 30.

▶ Stockstill set the new NCAA freshman completions record with 327 (Kentucky's Jared Lorenzen had 321 in 2000) and fell just 53 yards shy of breaking Jameis Winston's NCAA freshman passing record of 4,057 yards.

▶ Had an MT single-season record of eight 300-yard passing games in 2015.

▶ Set a new school record with four straight 300-yard passing games in 2015. Saw streak end at UTSA.

▶ His 31 touchdown passes in 2016 was a new school record and broke the previous mark of 30 set by Stockstill himself in 2015.

▶ His five touchdown passes against Charlotte in 2015 equaled the second most in school history and the most ever by a freshman. He matched that total in 2016 season opener against AAMU.

Richie James

▶ James is the NCAA's active career leader in total catches (232), receptions per game (8.00), and receiving yards per game (109.6).

▶ Only played 10 snaps last week at Minnesota due to an ankle injury.

▶ Broke his own school record for receiving yards in a season in the win over FAU. James had 1,625 yards for the year. Also, his 12 TD catches ranked second on the single-season list.

▶ Became just the 6th player in NCAA FBS history to have 200 yards rushing and 100 yards receiving in the same game when he notched 207 on the ground and 120 receiving against FAU in 2016.

▶ Had 327 all-purpose yards in 2016 win over FAU which was the second most in school history.

▶ Saw his school record streak of six straight 100-yard receiving games come to an end at Charlotte.

▶ Owns 15 career 100-yard receiving games which is a new Middle Tennessee school record

by way of fumble returns. The Raiders had just two defensive scores in 2016.

SANDERS TO THE HOUSE

▶ Senior linebacker DJ Sanders owns three interception returns for touchdowns over his career. That total ranks second all-time behind the four set by Kevin Byard (2011-15) and is the most ever by a linebacker.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

THIS 'N THAT

▶ PK Canon Rooker is a Lou Groza Award candidate while punter Matt Bonadies is on the Ray Guy Award Watch List.

▶ Canon Rooker enters the Bowling Green game having hit five consecutive field goals, including five straight at home.

▶ PK Canon Rooker hit 13 of his last 14 FGs and 16 total in 2016 to rank as the fourth most in a single-season.

▶ PK Canon Rooker's 112 points scored in

2016 was the most ever in a single season by a kicker at MT.

▶ LB DJ Sanders is the only current Blue Raider who owns a blocked kick. Sanders rejected a field goal at Charlotte in 2016.

▶ Under Rick Stockstill, the Blue Raiders have blocked 37 kicks in 141 games (19 FGs, 14 punts, 4 PATs).

PLAYER NOTES

Brent Stockstill

▶ Has **65** career TD passes, owning the Blue Raider all-time mark. He became the all-time leader in just 22 games played.

▶ Needs **8** more TD passes to surpass Patrick Ramsey (Tulane) for 15th on C-USA's all-time list.

▶ Has six career games with four or more touchdown passes.

▶ With **7,714** career passing yards, the junior is currently 7th nationally among active career leaders in the NCAA. He is also 5th in passing

and ranks tied for 5th all-time in C-USA.

RAIDER ROUNDUP

- ▶ The top scoring quarter in the Rick Stockstill era is the second quarter. Here is a combined total for each quarter: 1st - 1006 points; 2nd - 1,147 points; 3rd - 759 points; 4th - 1,009 points, and 56 in overtime.
- ▶ When both teams are held under 20 points, the Blue Raiders are 3-1 under Rick Stockstill.
- ▶ As a FBS (I-A) member (220 games), the Blue Raiders have scored 50 or more points 20 times.
- ▶ The Blue Raiders are 80-14 in the FBS era when leading at the half and are 87-10 when leading a game entering the 4th quarter during that time.
- ▶ When trailing at the half, the Blue Raiders are just 20-90 in the FBS (I-A) era.
- ▶ The Blue Raiders have scored in 244 of their last 250 games and broke a string of scoring in 55 straight when they were shutout at Tennessee in 2011. MT, which has a current streak of 51 games, has been shutout five other times during the FBS era. The Blue Raiders were shutout 10-0 on the road against UL-Monroe in 1999, 55-0 in 2000 at Florida, 59-0 at Oklahoma in 2006, 44-0 at LSU in 2007, and 45-0 at Arkansas State in 2012. MT has scored in 112 straight home games (last shutout was 9/23/1995 vs Murray State).
- ▶ Largest Margin of Victory in the I-A era: 59 points vs Charlotte 9/19/15 (73-14) ... Largest Margin of Defeat in the I-A era: 59 points vs Oklahoma 9/23/06 (59-0).

RAIDERS IN THE NFL

- ▶ MT currently has four players on NFL rosters. Erik Walden (Titans), Benny Cunningham

(Bears), Kevin Byard (Titans), and Maurice Shakir (Ravens).

ACADEMICS ARE A TOP PRIORITY

- ▶ Academic success at MT has been a high priority for 12th year coach Rick Stockstill. Under his reign, the Blue Raiders have seen 187 of 196 (95%) student-athletes earn their degree entering the 2017 season. MT, who has also been impressive with APR scores under Stockstill, has been publicly recognized by the NCAA for APR success twice in the last seven years. Also under Stockstill, the Blue Raiders have taken home six Academic All-District honors and produced an Academic All-American.
- ▶ Middle Tennessee has 7 players entering the 2017 season with a degree in hand to rank 9th nationally. (Peter Bailey, Alex Dale, Lucas Hamilton, Myles Harges, Max Linder, Brent Stockstill, Shane Tucker).

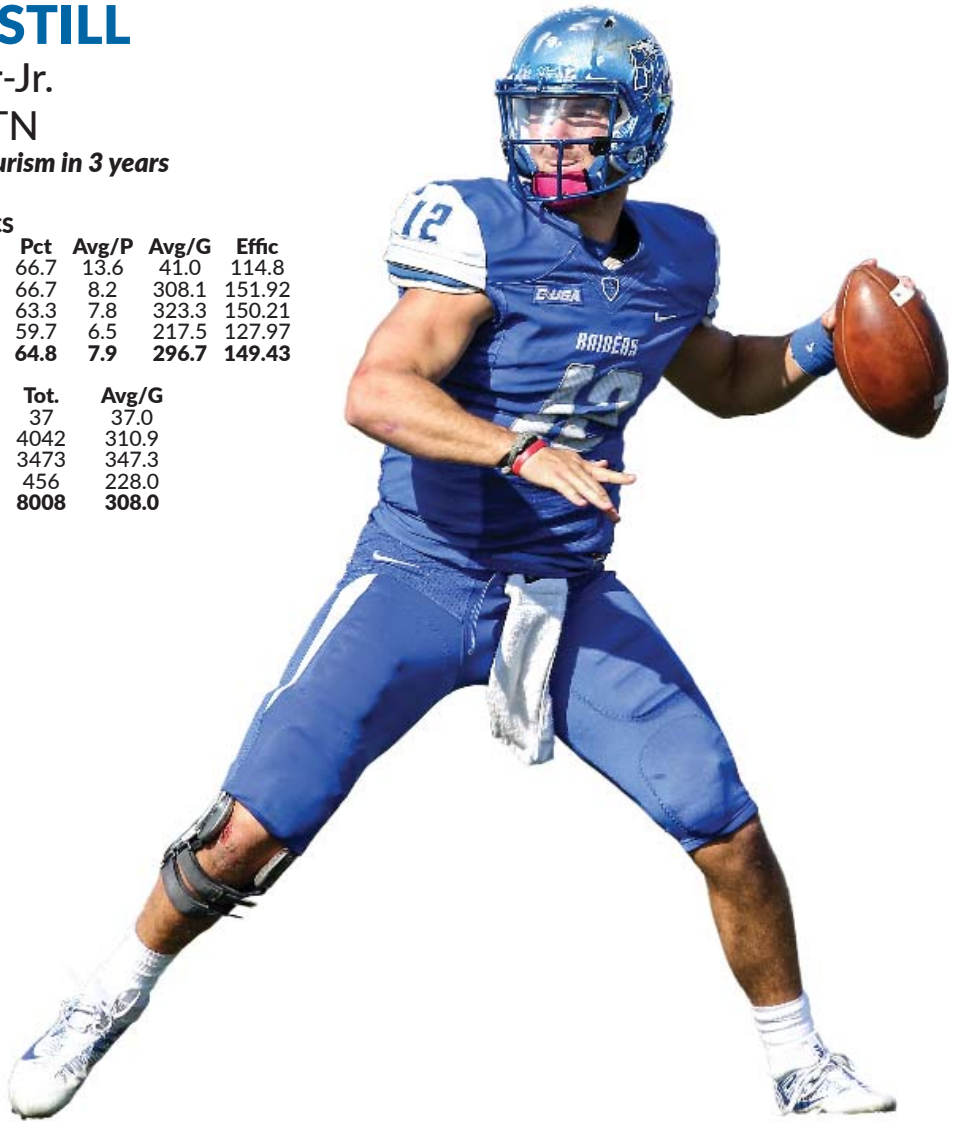

2-Time Coach of the Year

Winning on the field, off the field and having a first-class football program from top to bottom is the goal of any University at the highest level of intercollegiate athletics. That is exactly what Middle Tennessee has as a result of the leadership of Head Coach Rick Stockstill.

In his 12th season at the helm of the Blue Raiders and the sixth longest tenured coach in the country, Stockstill has captured a league title, won the 2009 New Orleans Bowl, made six bowl appearances, been bowl eligible eight times, earned two public recognition awards from the NCAA for APR success, produced six of the top eight crowds in Floyd Stadium history, and had back-to-back eight-win seasons for the first time in 21 years.

Under his watch, the Blue Raiders have also produced eight all-American's, including one academic all-American, three defensive players of the year, and two bowl game MVP's. Middle Tennessee also became the first Sun Belt team to win 10 games in a season, and set the Floyd Stadium single-game attendance record under his leadership. He also has five NFL Draft picks with Erik Walden in 2008, Chris McCoy in 2010, Rod Issac in 2011, Jimmy Staten in 2014 and Kevin Byard in 2016. Byard became the second highest draft pick in school history (3rd round, 64th pick to Titans).

The veteran leader put the Blue Raiders in the 2016 Hawaii Bowl in a year his team overcame a ton of adversity. Prior to the season he lost nearly all his starting receivers to injury, saw his record-setting quarterback go down, along with other key contributors. Through it all he led them to an eight-win season for the third time in five years to go with five first team all-conference picks.

Stockstill, who owns upsets over Maryland (2008 and 2009), Georgia Tech (2012), Missouri (2016) and Syracuse (2017), has also shown a commitment to academics during his tenure. The Blue

Raiders have gone from an APR score of 892 to a very impressive 992, the biggest increase of any program in the country. The Blue Raiders were also crowned with the Sun Belt Conference Academic Award on two occasions (2006-07, 2007-08) and earned two public recognition awards from the NCAA for APR success (2011, 2012).

After 24 years as an assistant, Stockstill was given the chance to run his own program, and all he did was lead the Blue Raiders to a 2006 Sun Belt Conference championship, help set a new single-season attendance record, and take the program to its first postseason bowl game in the I-A era. Taking a Middle Tennessee team predicted to finish sixth in the Sun Belt during the preseason to a league title, Stockstill ended up as the 2006 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year and the Tennessee Sports Writers Association Coach of the Year while also garnering that honor from ESPN.com.

Born Dec. 23, 1957 in Sidney, Ohio, Stockstill grew up in Georgetown, Ky., and then moved to Fernandina Beach, Fla., where he was inducted into the Fernandina Beach Hall of Fame in 2006. He was a three-year letterman at Florida State as a quarterback, where he was team captain and earned Honorable Mention All-America honors in 1981 under Coach Bobby Bowden. During his career at FSU, the Seminoles had two top-10 final Associated Press rankings and had wins over powers Notre Dame, Pittsburgh, Ohio State, and Nebraska. Stockstill, who received his bachelor's degree from FSU in 1982, made three bowl trips with the Seminoles.

Stockstill and his wife, the former Sara Fleischman, have a son, Brent, and a daughter, Emily.

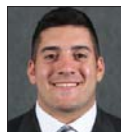

RAIDERS FALL TO 'DORES IN SEASON OPENER

MURFREESBORO - Middle Tennessee's season-opening matchup with in-state foe Vanderbilt didn't go quite as planned for the Blue Raiders inside Floyd Stadium.

The Commodores (1-0) struck early and took the crowd of 26,717 out of the game, then hung on with solid defense to beat the Raiders (0-1) 28-6.

"I'm just disappointed in how we played," MT Head Coach Rick Stockstill said.

"There are some things that we saw that we might be able to expand on a little bit with some personnel ... but there's not a whole lot of positive about this game.

"We've got enough things to get corrected before we play again."

Vanderbilt was effective offensively from its first possession, though it wasn't All-Southeastern Conference running back Ralph Webb who led the way.

Junior quarterback Kyle Shurmur, who threw for just 113 yards against Middle Tennessee in 2016, was the driving force behind the Dores' 14-0 lead at the end of the first quarter that seemed to grab all of the momentum for the visiting team.

He completed 6-of-7 passes in the first quarter for 124 yards and a touchdown, and finished the game with 296 yards on 20-of-28 passing with three scores.

Webb, on the other hand, managed just 21 yards rushing in the first quarter and finished with 49 on 24 attempts. It was a far cry from the 183 yards Vandy's all-time leading rusher averaged on the ground against MT the past two seasons, though he also added 104 receiving yards.

"They knew we would try to load the box, so we expected the pass but more run," senior linebacker D.J. Sanders said. "We have to fix the missing assignments we had, be more consistent, stop the run, fly to the ball and get more takeaways."

While the Blue Raider defense had its hands full with the Commodore passing attack, its offense struggled to find much momentum. And when it finally got moving, miscues led to missed opportunities.

Middle Tennessee's first two possessions ended with an interception and turnover on downs, both on Vanderbilt's side of the field, eliminating good scoring chances that could have swung the early momentum. It was the same problem the Blue Raiders had a year prior in Nashville when they scored just four times while entering Commodore territory on 11 possessions.

The line of scrimmage was where Vanderbilt was most effective in slowing down Middle Tennessee's attack. The Commodores came up with five sacks of quarterback Brent Stockstill, who had defenders in his face seemingly every time he dropped back to pass.

"They're a good defense, and they make life hard on you," the redshirt junior QB said. "Our defense played extremely well ... we just have to score points. I think we'll fix it - we just have to find the right pieces and play hard, play a little tougher with more energy and enthusiasm."

Despite the offensive woes, it was still a night to remember for redshirt junior Richie James. The All-Conference USA wide receiver caught 10 passes for 112 yards and a touchdown, and set a new MT career record for receiving yards (3,083) with a 19-yard catch in the fourth quarter.

James, the NCAA's active leader in receptions and receiving yards per game, was also the recipient of the only score of the game, a 22-yard TD pass just over the goal line to make the score 28-6 with about 12 minutes left in the ballgame.

Brent Stockstill completed 18-of-31 passes for 166 yards, one TD and an interception.

Defensively, junior safety Wesley Bush led the way in the tackle department with eight in his first game as a Blue Raider. Redshirt junior defensive end Walter Brady, also playing in his first game at Middle Tennessee, added five tackles, a sack, one tackle for loss and a pass breakup.

ORANGE CRUSH: RAIDERS UPSET SYRACUSE

SYRACUSE - Middle Tennessee outscored Syracuse 21-10 during a dominant second half to secure a 30-23 road upset inside the Carrier Dome, giving the Blue Raiders their fifth win against a Power-5 team under Head Coach Rick Stockstill. The Blue Raiders (1-1) scored the game-winner when quarterback Brent Stockstill connected with Shane Tucker for a 10-yard touchdown pass to stake Middle Tennessee to a 30-23 lead with 6:46 remaining. It was the third touchdown of the game for Stockstill, who finished the game 22-of-36 for 269 yards. He also rushed for 41 yards. The big story was the play of the Middle Tennessee defense under first-year coordinator Scott Shafer. The Blue Raiders allowed just two touchdowns - one in each half - and slowed the high-octane Syracuse offense. Middle Tennessee held Syracuse (1-1) to 308 yards total offense, with 182 coming through the air and 126 on the ground.

The defense also came up with two turnovers, collecting a fumble and an interception. Linebacker Khalil Brooks had a huge game with a career-high eight tackles, one for loss and he assisted on three tackles for loss. Safety Jovante Moffatt also had eight tackles, including one for loss. Corner Darryl Randolph added seven tackles, including one for loss.

The Blue-clad stop squad was in the Syracuse offensive backfield throughout the game and totaled six sacks. Brooks, DJ Sanders, Walter Brady and Malik Mancel all had solo sacks. Brooks assisted on another. Freshman Reed Blankenship earned his first career start and responded with a fourth-quarter interception.

Richie James had another strong all-around game with eight catches for 96 yards, including a 28-yard touchdown, and Ty Lee also was a multi-purpose performer with seven receptions for 76 yards, including a 48-yard touchdown grab. He added a team-high 50 yards on the ground, including a 14-yard scoring jaunt.

BANGED UP BLUE RAIDERS FALL AT MINNESOTA

MINNEAPOLIS - Middle Tennessee was overcome by a tough Minnesota defense and injuries to its two main offensive weapons Saturday, leading to a 34-3 loss in Minneapolis.

The Blue Raiders (1-2) fought well early, and found themselves tied 3-3 with the Gophers (3-0) after a 45-yard Canon Rooker field goal with 10:53 left in the second quarter.

From there, it was all Minnesota. The home team rattled off 31 straight points thanks to a stingy defense and unrelenting rushing attack.

The Gophers, who average 211 yards per game rushing to rank 42nd in the nation, finished with 221 yards on 47 carries for a 4.7-yard average.

Middle Tennessee tried to make things interesting in the second quarter behind its defense before a turnover all but put things out of reach.

The Blue Raider defenders forced three three-and-outs in a row to end the first quarter and begin the second, but the offense couldn't find rhythm.

After the first of three rushing touchdowns for Minnesota's Kobe McCrary, the Raiders trailed 13-3 with six minutes left in the second quarter and put together a four-minute drive and entered Gopher territory. The score threat was wiped out, though, when redshirt sophomore quarterback John Urzua's pass was intercepted for a 67-yard TD, bringin' the halftime score to 20-3.

Urzua finished 19-of-34 passing for 135 yards and two INTs. He was thrust in the starting lineup for the injured Brent Stockstill, who was forced out due to an ailment from Week 2 against Syracuse.

Not only was the Blue Raider offense missing its starting quarterback, but redshirt junior wide receiver Richie James, the school's all-time leader in receiving yards and co-leader in TDs, also was limited.

Redshirt junior wideout Patrick Smith led the way in the receiving corps, hauling in six catches for 46 yards.

Middle Tennessee's defense was led by 13 total tackles by safety Jovante Moffatt and Darrius Harris, who had 10 tackles, one tackle for loss and a sack.
