As this publication went to press this summer, a total of five former Blue Raiders were in National Football League training camps.

Don Griffin, who played for MTSU from 1982 through 1985 and was the Ohio Valley Conference Defensive Player of the Year as a senior, was starting his seventh season with the San Francisco 49ers. He was the NFC Rookie of the Year in 1986 and has been named to several All-Pro squads since that time.

Running back-receiver-kick returner Dwight Stone, a record-setting rusher and scorer with the Blue Raiders in 1985 and 1986, was set to open his sixth season with the Pittsburgh Steelers.

Kenny Tippins, Blue Raider defensive end from 1985 through 1988, was opening his third season with the Atlanta Falcons. It was his fourth season in the NFL, after spending his rookie year with the Dallas Cowboys.

Marty Carter, who finished a brilliant career as a Blue Raider free safety in 1990, was opening his second season at the same position with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

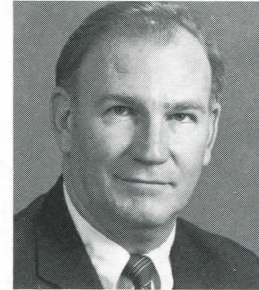
Two MTSU stars from last season, both having gone in the sixth round of last spring's draft, seemed to have solid chances of making other NFL clubs: All-American tailback Joe Campbell was trying to make the grade as a running back-flanker with the Los Angeles Rams and Chris Burns was vying for a spot on the Cincinnati Bengals' roster as a defensive lineman.

Here is your copy of the 1992 Blue Raider Football Media guide, which we trust will be helpful to you in your coverage of the MTSU football program this season. Please direct all requests for credentials, scouting passes, information or photographs concerning Blue Raider football to Ed Given, Sports Information Director, MTSU Box 20, Murfreesboro, Tennessee 37132.

Credentials

All credentials, including scouting passes, should be requested well in advance from Sports Information Director Ed Given. No credentials will be mailed, unless you specifically request such service -- your credential can be picked up at the "Will Call" window as you come to the stadium on game day. Parking space can be reserved, provided your request is made far enough in advance (and with today's mail service, that needs to be WELL in advance!).

Access to the press box will be granted only to authorized persons with press box tickets for that specific game. Each ticket will carry a seat or booth assignment and will entitle the authorized bearer to the full courtesies and complete services of the press box. Spouses, dates, children, and other non-workers are not permitted in the working media areas.

Photographers

Photographers wishing admittance to the press box will need a press box ticket. Sideline passes will be issued to authorized personnel representing news media on the field and must be displayed at all times. No free-lance photographers will be admitted to the sidelines, unless they can present, in advance, a written assignment from a certified news outlet.

Radio

Radio broadcast permission must be obtained, in advance, from Sports Information Director Ed Given, along with press box reservations. Arrangements for installation of broadcast loops should be made well in advance with South Central Bell Telephone Company.

Fax/Telephones

The University will have a fax machine and several telephones available in the press box for your convenience. However, if you plan to file copy and/or stats via the fax machine, it will be necessary to notify the Sports Information Office in advance to assure its being available. It will be available to visiting media personnel on a first-come, first-served basis.

Press Box Services

The Sports Information Office will furnish programs, pre-game notes, updated season statistics and other information prior to the game. Game service will include play-by-play, halftime and final statistics for both teams and individuals. Coffee, soft drinks and other refreshments will be available for working media personnel.

Wanted: Linemen, Experience Preferred



Middle Tennessee State University Football Coach Boots Donnelly and his staff lost 10 starters from a '91 football team that went 9-4-0, placed second in the Ohio Valley Conference, played in the NCAA Division I-AA Playoffs for the third straight year and finished well up among the Division's Top 10 teams in every national poll.

Ten is not an inordinate number of starters to lose, although that particular statistic is strictly a case of "less is better."

However, the loss of even that number of starters is significant in MTSU's case, since seven of the 10 missing players started on either the offensive or defensive interior line.

"The line -- on either side of the ball -- is the engine that makes the team go," says Donnelly. "and we've got a lot of experience and skill to replace up front.

"Linemen's techniques seem to come more slowly than those at some of the so-called 'skill' positions, so it usually takes a little longer to replace somebody up there.

"We are fortunate, though, in that we have some pretty talented youngsters moving in behind the starters we lost," Donnelly explains. "But they'll still have to build their own backlog of practice reps and game competition before they can become as effective as the more experienced players they're replacing."

Both offensive guards, Mike Nihill and Chris Smith are gone, along with tackle Tony Gaines. Nihill was a three-year starter, Smith a regular for about two and a half seasons and Gaines moved into the starting rotation last fall.

Centers Tracy Majors and Mike Gibson, who alternated as starters for three seasons, are both gone, along with Andy Patterson, the squad's long snapper for four straight years. There is virtually a total absence of game experience at that vital offensive position.

This year's offensive line will have to rally around the lone returning starter, tackle Steve McAdoo.

He's a 6-4, 282-pound senior who has been named to at least one first-team All-America berth in each of the past two

seasons, so he's perfectly capable of providing splendid leadership.

Anthony Crabtree, a 6-2, 220-pound junior, could be the heir-apparent at center, while Pat Hicks (6-2, 275, sophomore) and David Watson (6-4, 235, sophomore) should be prominent in the picture at the guard positions. Onesimus Leslie (6-5, 285, junior) and Melvin Stevenson (6-6, 297, sophomore) could vie for the tackle slot opposite McAdoo, although there are some other capable youngsters awaiting the chance to give a challenge there, as well.

On the other side of the ball, both Chris Burns and Bryan Faulkner are gone from the defensive tackle slots they've occupied for more than two years, along with guard Lem Collins.

Another guard, Barry Benham, who had been in and out of the starting lineup for most of his career, has moved on, too.

Guard Randy Houston (6-2, 240, senior) is the only returning interior defensive starter. Also waiting in the wings are guard James McKenzie (6-3, 270, sophomore) and tackles Montrell Toney (6-2, 232, junior) and Mike Jordan (6-4, 215, junior), among others.

There are at least three other spots where some sizeable shoes are left to fill because of the absence of senior starters from a year ago.

For example, the school's most productive ball-carrier ever, Joe Campbell, is absent from his tailback slot for the first time in four seasons. He reigns as the Raiders' all-time career leader in rushing yards (3,823), touchdowns (45) and scoring (272 points).

And those totals don't even include another 581 yards, five TDs and 32 points racked up during NCAA Division I-AA Playoffs.

Campbell's absence, though, might be a little less painful because of the return of his understudies for the past couple of years. Walter Dunson (5-9, 170) will be a senior this fall after rushing for 621 yards and scoring 13 TDs in 1991, all as back-up to Campbell.

And he'll be pushed relentlessly by two other very capable running backs in Kippy Bayless (5-9, 180, sophomore) and Scott Dirkson (5-10, 180, junior). Starting fullback Walt Crowder (5-9, 190, senior) is also back to give MTSU another running threat, as well as a solid blocker.

Starting flanker Greg James is missing after starting for two seasons, but the Blue Raiders have a bevy of capable receivers returning. They're led by lightning-quick split end Vince Parks (5-9, 160, senior), tight end Steve Dark (6-2, 230, senior) and wide-out Curt Watkins (6-1, 180, junior).

The third most noticeable niche to fill, outside of the offensive and defensive lines, is the hole left by the departure of linebacker Scott Boykin. He led the team in tackles for each of the past two seasons and always seemed to be wherever there was an opposing player holding a football.

Jabbar Troutman (5-11, 230), who started nearly all last year as a freshman, returns to man the other linebacking slot, but the rest of the contenders are virtually without experience.

Despite Donnelly's well-known penchant for taking a much-more-than-cautious view of any upcoming season, even the 15-year veteran of OVC coaching might occasionally flash a furtive smile when it comes to his team's quarterback situation.

Depth there could be a problem, but compared to 1991, the Raiders' field general picture is as bright as a politician pretends to be in an election year.

Going into last season, Donnelly had absolutely NO experienced quarterbacks and the only two candidates with any playing time at all were question-marks due to previous injuries.

In stepped Kelly Holcomb, then a 6-3, 175-pound freshman, to banish all doubts and fears. He completed 130 of 209 passes for 1,763 yards and five touchdowns, all with only four interceptions. That's the third-best single-season passing performance in the entire history of Blue Raider football.

MTSU should have considerable strength in the defensive secondary. All five starters on the defensive perimeter are back: Danny Lawrence (5-10, 190, sophomore) and Mike Caldwell (6-2, 222, senior) return at defensive ends, Jamie Redmond (5-9, 178, senior) and Adrian Owens (5-11, 180, junior) at cornerbacks and Andre Boykin (6-4, 205, senior) at free safety.

The kicking prospects are completely turned around from a year ago. Place-kicker Garth Petrilli (5-9, 150) and punter Joel Alsobrook (6-2, 190) both performed with solid consistency as freshmen last fall.

Petrilli was named All-OVC as he hit on 39 of 40 PATs and 9 of 15 field goals, including a last-gasp boot that brought a win over Western Kentucky.

Alsobrook averaged 38.7 yards per punt and booted 12 out of bounds or dead inside the opponents' 20-yard line.

"We have the experience nearly everywhere except in the two lines," sums up Donnelly, "but, unfortunately, it takes solid line play to allow your other talents to reach their potentials. We've got some youngsters we feel can play coming into the offensive and defensive line -- we'll just have to see how quickly they can become effective.

"Then, too," he adds, "we're in the same position we find ourselves in most seasons: almost all our depth will have to come from young players with little, if any, experience. And you always have to wait to find out how they react to being thrown in the fight.

"It looks as though it's going to be another exciting year!"

The "Blue Raider" Nickname

In the early days of MTSU football, the teams were known by several nicknames. Among these were Teachers, Normalites and Pedagogues.

In 1934, it was decided that the school needed a specific nickname, and during the football season of that year, the Murfreesboro *Daily News Journal* held a contest to name the team.

Charles Sarver, then a Middle Tennessee football player and later principal at White County High School in Sparta, Tenn., won the \$5 prize for his entry of "Blue Raiders." Sarver later indicated he had "borrowed" the nickname of the Colgate Red Raiders, but substituted MTSU Blue for Colgate Red.

Ever since that time, Middle Tennessee athletic teams have been known as the Blue Raiders.

The symbol of Confederate General Nathan Bedford Forrest on a horse was first used about 1945, when MTSU President Q. M. Smith instructed Public Relations Director Gene Sloan to begin using the figure in conjunction with the nickname.

In 1965, the Student Government Association established strict specifications as to what size the student must be who would emulate Forrest. This was done, it is believed, because there was only one uniform available and a "good fit" was desired.

The current "unofficial" mascot for the Blue Raiders is a costumed, cartoon-like dog. A reasonable facsimile of a blue tick hound, the affable character has been named "Ole Blue."

Jones Field

Johnny (Red) Floyd Stadium

Middle Tennessee's Blue Raiders play their home games on Horace Jones Field in Johnny (Red) Floyd Stadium, on the University campus.

The stadium was first constructed in 1933 and was enlarged first in 1950 and again in 1968. It presently seats 15,000 fans and has an outstanding lighting system, up-dated in 1991.

On Nov. 3, 1979, the stadium was named in honor of the late Raider head football coach, Johnny (Red) Floyd, one of the University's most notable leaders.

The actual playing field is named for the late Horace Jones, an individual who led Middle Tennessee through the early years of athletic competition. Jones was the head of the math department in the 1920's and became interested in the school's blossoming athletic program. He, in fact, was a one-man athletic committee for years, until a formal Faculty Athletic Committee was formed. He was then named chairman of that committee.

The field was named Jones Field in the 1930's, but was renamed Horace Jones Field in the 1960's to clarify for whom it was named. The playing surface is AstroTurf, the latest version of which was installed in 1989.

A Chance to Play:

“Walk-Ons” CAN Make It!

Every season there is a special group of athletes who make up a very vital part of Middle Tennessee State University's football team. They're the “walk-ons” — those players who “walked-on” to the practice field without benefit of a grant-in-aid and played their way into a spot in the Blue Raider lineup.

The “open-door” policy of Head Coach Boots Donnelly and his staff, the determination to give every youngster who's willing to pay the price a chance to play, has paid off handsomely for MTSU.

“There is absolutely no way than any coaching staff can sign — or even contact, for that matter — every player with the capabilities of playing college football,” says Donnelly.

“We'd be kidding ourselves if we thought we could. And we'd be missing out on a lot of fine football players.”

This year's Blue Raider team is typical. At least five players who were originally “walk-ons” were slated for starting assignments when fall practice opened: offensive guard David Watson, flanker Curt Watkins, defensive tackle Montrell Toney, linebacker Shingo Weems and defensive

guard Randy Houston.

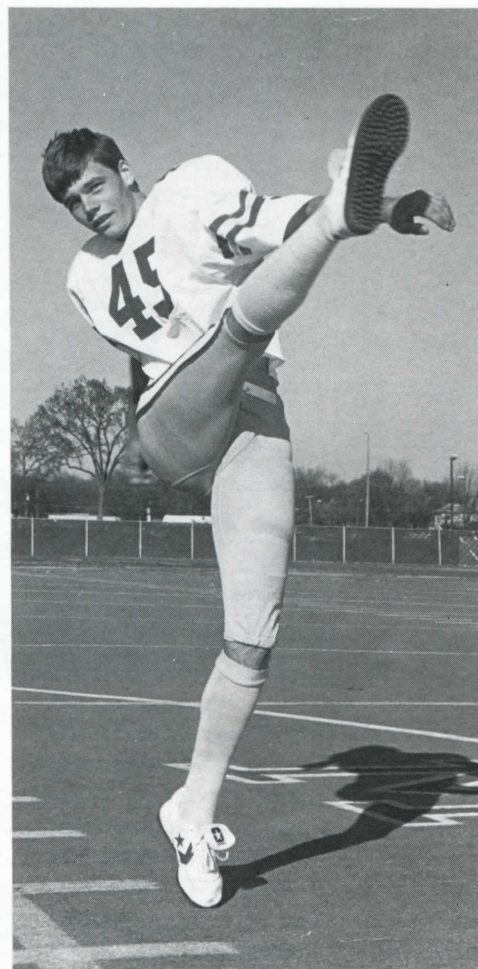
At least five other “walk-ons” were listed on the pre-season two-deep, including receiver Raymone Shockley, flanker Finess Brown, defensive guard Caneil Kimpson and linebackers Randall Forsha and Anthony Mitchell.

One of the Raider All-Americans was a “walk-on.” Franklin's Kelly Potter graduated after making the Kodak/American Football Coaches Association All-America team in 1984.

All told, more than 40 per cent of the players on the Blue Raiders' 1992 pre-season roster came to the MTSU campus on their own, wanting no more than an opportunity to make the team and play collegiate football. They obviously found what they were looking for.

“We can't afford to miss out on an outstanding prospect just because he wasn't already on a scholarship when he came into our program,” Donnelly reflects.

“For example, linebacker Robbie Ridings, one of our leading tacklers the first four years we coached here at MTSU, was a ‘walk-on.’ If we had assumed that somebody would already have signed him if he

could really play, we would have lost one of the finest defensive players the Ohio Valley Conference had seen in years.”

Ridings, incidentally, got his degree at MTSU and is now a successful high school coach in Georgia.

Donnelly takes his philosophy one step further: “I think maybe there is something really special about the athlete who comes out for the team even though a lot of folks think he's been passed over. He has to have a special kind of mental toughness and discipline.”

Those are two characteristics that played key roles in Donnelly's own development as both a player and a coach. They will continue to be a major part of his football program at MTSU, as will those special people, the “walk-ons.”

A Consistent Winner:

Head Coach Boots Donnelly



James (Boots) Donnelly has become a name synonymous with winning football. He has developed a winning program everywhere he has served as head coach.

The 1992 season will mark his 14th as head coach at Middle Tennessee State University, where he was an outstanding player himself in the mid-1960s. When the '65 MTSU grad returned to his *alma mater* in December, 1978, he took over the reins of a once-proud football tradition that had fallen on hard times. The Blue Raiders had not had a winning season since 1972.

Donnelly warned Blue Raider alumni and supporters that the job would not be done overnight, but it **WOULD** be done. He was proved right on both counts.

In his first season, 1979, MTSU posted only a 1-9 record, but the Raiders did cap the season with a win over arch-rival Tennessee Tech. In 1980, Donnelly's team inched up to 2-8, wins over Akron and Tech, before turning the corner with a winning season — 6-5 — in 1981. The highlight of that first winning campaign was the upset of Murray State, the nation's top-ranked Division I-AA team at the time.

In 1982, the Blue Raiders continued their climb toward the mark of excellence typical of Donnelly's teams by putting to-

gether a sparkling 8-3 record and tying for third place in the Ohio Valley Conference.

The following year, 1983, the Blue Raiders went 8-2 and tied for second place in the OVC. Then, in 1984, the Raiders very nearly hit the jackpot. Despite being nosed out for the OVC title because of a pair of mid-season upset losses, MTSU won an at-large bid to the NCAA Division I-AA national playoffs with a regular-season record of 9-2.

The Blue Raiders went all the way to the national semifinal game before being eliminated by Louisiana Tech, after earlier playoff wins over OVC champ Eastern Kentucky and fourth-seeded Indiana State. All told, MTSU had 11 wins against 3 losses, the most victories ever for a Blue Raider team.

Donnelly was named Kodak Coach of the Year for NCAA Region 3 by vote of members of the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA).

Things got even better in 1985. The Blue Raiders were a perfect 11-0, won their first OVC title since 1965 and were ranked No. 1 in the national I-AA poll over the final five weeks of the season. Even though they were knocked from the playoffs by eventual national champion Georgia Southern (a team

MTSU had beaten soundly earlier in the season), honors came to the Raiders in bunches.

Donnelly was named OVC Coach of the Year for the third time in his career. His freshman quarterback, Marvin Collier, was voted the league's Offensive Player of the Year and senior safety Don Griffin was named OVC Defensive Player of the Year. Donnelly was again voted Coach of the Year for NCAA Region 3 by his coaching peers across the nation.

In 1986, the Raiders shook off a rash of early-season injuries to overcome a four-game losing streak and bounce back to wind up at 6-5, the sixth straight winning season at MTSU. At the same time, MTSU tied for third place in the OVC standings behind co-champions Murray State and Eastern Kentucky in one of the league's best balanced races ever.

Four of the five teams that held wins over the Raiders (Murray State, Eastern Kentucky, Tennessee State and Georgia Southern) were chosen for the 16-team field in the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

The Blue Raiders of '87 duplicated both the 6-5 record and the third-place finish of the '86 team.

In 1988, a superb defense, led by OVC Player of the Year Don Thomas, paced the Blue Raiders to a 7-4 record and a near-miss for another playoff berth.

The '89 Blue Raiders bounced back from a grueling non-league schedule that left them 3-3 at mid-season to put together a win streak that yielded a perfect 6-0 OVC mark, the league title and Coach of the Year honors for Donnelly again.

MTSU defeated Appalachian State in the NCAA Playoffs, before being sidetracked by eventual national champion Georgia Southern.

The 1990 Raider team finished 11-2, copped a share of the OVC championship (along with Eastern Kentucky) and was knocked out of the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs in the quarter-final round, after taking a first-round win over Jackson State.

The Raiders finished the season as the No. 1 team in the official NCAA I-AA poll, but their chances for a national title were severely crippled when they lost not one,

but two, quarterbacks to injuries over the final three weeks of play.

The '91 Blue Raiders finished at 9-4, with half of the losses coming to Division I foes Florida State and Cincinnati. They returned to the NCAA playoffs once again, being eliminated in the second round of play by Eastern Kentucky after knocking off highly-regarded Sam Houston in the opening round.

Donnelly's record at MTSU stands at 95-55-0 (.633) for 13 seasons. His career record, spanning 15 years, is 109-62-0 (.637).

In addition to his winning or sharing OVC Coach of the Year honors four times and garnering similar honors for NCAA Region 3 twice, Donnelly was the 1989 recipient of the "Contributions to Football Award" from the Middle Tennessee Chapter of the National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame.

Prior to his return to MTSU, Donnelly was head coach at Austin Peay State University in 1977 and 1978, leading the Governors to their first-ever OVC title in '77 and being named the league's Coach of the Year. His two-year record at Austin Peay was 14-7.

Before moving to Austin Peay, Donnelly was an assistant coach at Vanderbilt for one season, where he first began to gain a solid reputation as an outstanding recruiter.

His coaching career began at Nashville's Father Ryan High School, where he had been a top-flight, all-around athlete. He was an assistant coach there for eight years before becoming head coach in 1974, leading Ryan to a 21-1 record over two seasons, including a perfect 13-0 mark and the Tennessee Class AAA title in '74.

Donnelly had been the Nashville Interscholastic League's Player of the Year in 1960, before enrolling at MTSU, where he played as a defensive back for three seasons. He passed up his final year of eligibility with the Blue Raiders in 1965 to complete his degree. He added the Master's degree from MTSU in 1966.

Nearly all of Donnelly's leisure time is devoted to Blue Raider football, but he is a highly popular figure at a number of charity golf tournaments in the late spring and summer.

Boots is also in considerable demand as a clinic speaker.

He is married to the former Carole Holzapfel of Nashville. They have three daughters, Bunny, Helen and Lauren.

Ed Bunio

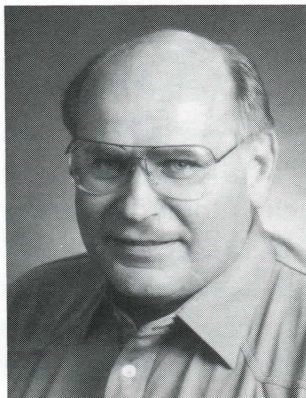
Defensive Coordinator

Offensive Coordinator

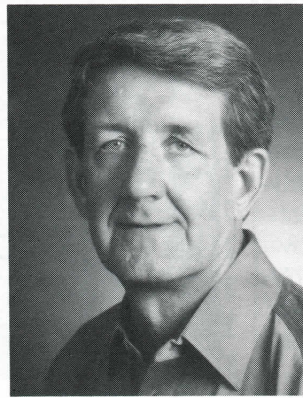
Charlie (Wildcat) Butler rejoined the coaching staff at his *alma mater* in the spring of 1987.

Ray Barnes

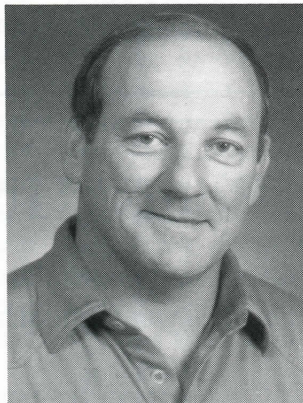
Defensive Line

E. J. (Doc) Kreis joined the MTSU staff in the summer of 1986 as the football program's first strength and conditioning coach.

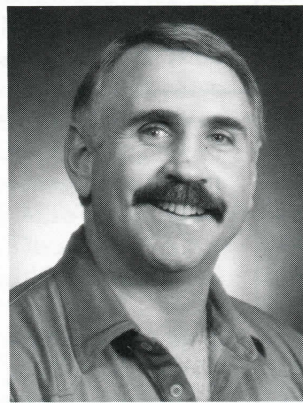
He brought with him a solid reputation of success in that field following five years in a similar position at Vanderbilt University.

Defensive Secondary

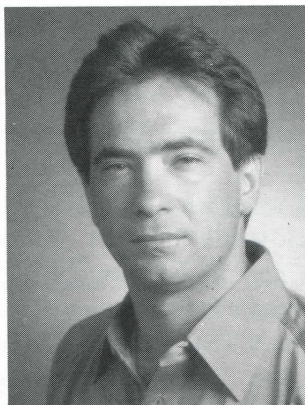
Preston O'Neal joined the MTSU coaching staff in the spring of 1986 after two years as a graduate assistant at the University of Tennessee.

Alex Robins

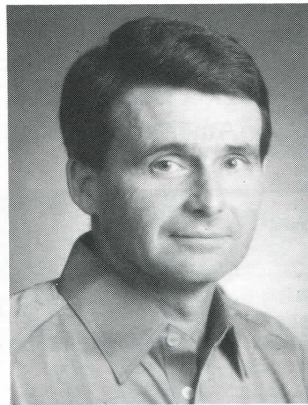
Quarterbacks

Receivers

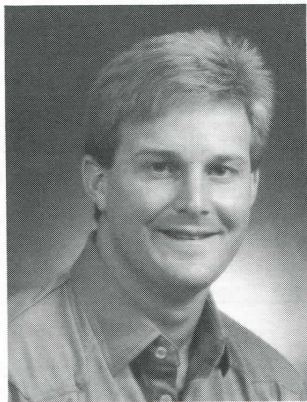

Floyd Walker joined the Blue Raider staff in the spring of 1992, after four years as student or graduate assistant on the heels of his playing days as an MTSU running back.

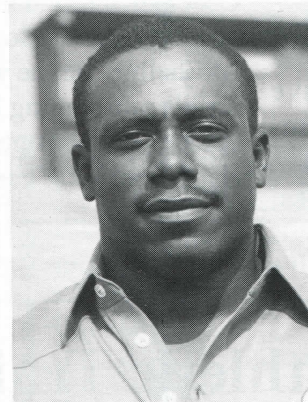

Athletic Director John Stanford



When John Stanford became Middle Tennessee State University's athletic director in July, 1987, he brought with him an impressive talent for getting things done. That sometimes surprises people who are familiar only with Stanford's low-key, relaxed manner of going about his business.

But his record as baseball coach of the Blue Raiders for the 14 seasons between 1974 and 1987 was anything but low-key. He is one of only a handful of collegiate baseball coaches who have compiled more than 400 career victories, showing an overall record of 402 wins against only 272 losses and 4 ties, a winning percentage of .596.

He led the Blue Raiders to Ohio Valley Conference championships four times and won the league's Southern Division title on five other occasions. He took MTSU to the NCAA Tournament four times, making it to the championship round of the Midwest Regional in 1982, only one victory away from a coveted berth in the College World Series.

By vote of his coaching peers in the OVC, he was selected the league's Coach of the Year in 1976 and the co-winner of that honor in 1981, 1982, 1983 and 1987. He was also selected South Region Coach of the Year in 1982 by the American Association of College Baseball Coaches.

A native of Opelousas, La., Stanford coached at Shelbyville (Tenn.) Central High School and at Motlow State Community College in Tullahoma, Tenn., before joining the MTSU staff in 1974.

He won Tennessee Junior College Coach of the Year honors for each of his three seasons at Motlow State, 1971-73. At Shelbyville, he was known not only for his outstanding high school squads, but he also put together four divisional champion American Legion teams.

Stanford played two years in the Washington Senators' farm system following his graduation from MTSU in 1962. He received his master's degree from MTSU in 1964. As a member of the Blue Raider squad during his undergraduate days, he was one of the OVC's winningest pitchers for each of his four seasons.

Stanford was the spearhead of a building and fund-raising program that has given the Blue Raiders one of the finest baseball facilities to be found on a college campus anywhere in the nation. MTSU's Reese Smith Field is fully lighted, completely enclosed, has outstanding press box and grandstand facilities and an immaculate natural grass playing surface.

Stanford built a reputation as a top-flight recruiter and developer of talent. Many of his players were drafted into the professional ranks.

His administrative skills have been evident in the fact that MTSU teams have won or tied for at least one OVC championship in five men's and three women's sports since he took over the reins as AD. The MTSU women won the OVC All-Sports trophy in 1990-91.

He and his wife, Nancy, have one daughter, Maureen.

Head Athletic Trainer George Camp

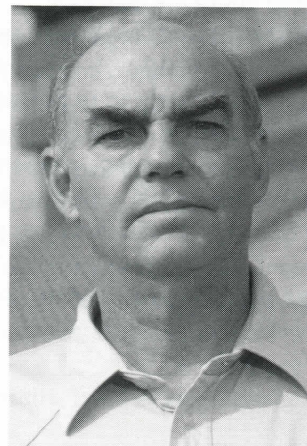
George Camp has been at MTSU since 1969 when he became the University's first full-time athletic trainer.

Originally from Chagrin Falls, Ohio, Camp and his wife, Cindy, have two daughters, Andrea Louise and Caralynn.

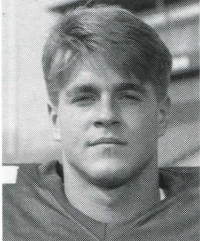

1956

Refrigerator Bowl (Evansville, Ind.)

Sam Houston 27, MTSU 13

The Raiders carried an Ohio Valley Conference championship and a 7-2 record into the first bowl game in the school's history, but the occasion was ruined by a powerful Bearcat team from Sam Houston.

Led by Little All-American fullback Terry Sweeney, the Raiders ground out 290 yards of total offense, but mistakes killed the Raiders' hopes for a win.

MTSU lost three fumbles and had three passes intercepted by the alert Bearcat defense.

1960

Tangerine Bowl (Jan. 1 - Orlando, Fla.)

MTSU 21, Presbyterian 12

Bucky Pitts scored two touchdowns, one on a beautiful punt return, to pace the '59 MTSU team to its first bowl win in school history.

Pitts, the littler speedstar from Fayetteville, had 59 yards in nine rushes to lead a Raider infantry attack that ground out 240 yards.

MTSU built a 14-6 halftime lead, then had to stave off a tremendous rally led by Presbyterian quarterback Bob Waters, later of the San Francisco 49ers and destined to become head coach at Western Carolina prior to his untimely death.

Waters passed for 197 yards and two touchdowns, but the Raider defense was tough when it had to be.

1961

Tangerine Bowl (Orlando, Fla.)

Lamar Tech 21, MTSU 14

Making their second Tangerine Bowl appearance in three seasons, the Raiders fell to another bunch of tough Texans.

It was an even battle for the nearly the entire game, before a freak play decided the issue.

A Lamar field goal attempt fell short of the mark, but was inadvertently touched by a Blue Raider and a Tech player fell on it in the end zone for a touchdown.

Once again, mistakes hurt the Raiders badly, as they lost three fumbles and had two passes intercepted.

1964

Grantland Rice Bowl (Dec. 12 - Murfreesboro, Tenn.)

MTSU 20, Muskingum 0

A rugged defense paced the OVC champion Blue Raiders to a 20-0 win in the first Grantland Rice Bowl ever played, with the site being MTSU's own Horace Jones Field.

The Raider defense held Muskingum to only 72 yards in total offense and scored a touchdown themselves on a 99-yard fumble return by end Ray Neal with only 44 seconds left in the game.

MTSU's other scores came on a one-yard dive by fullback David Petty in the first quarter and a five-yard run by quarterback Teddy Morris in the last period.

It was the final collegiate game as a player for current Blue Raider Head Coach Boots Donnelly.

Ray Neal Award

The Ray Neal Memorial Trophy is awarded annually to the senior who, in the opinion of the coaches, shows the most improvement over his four-year career.

Neal was a defensive end for the '64 MTSU team that defeated Muskingum in the initial Grantland Rice Bowl, returning a fumble for a 99-yard touchdown and establishing a record that still stands.

Less than two weeks later, he was killed by a shotgun blast in a tragic accident that put a damper on what had been a great season.

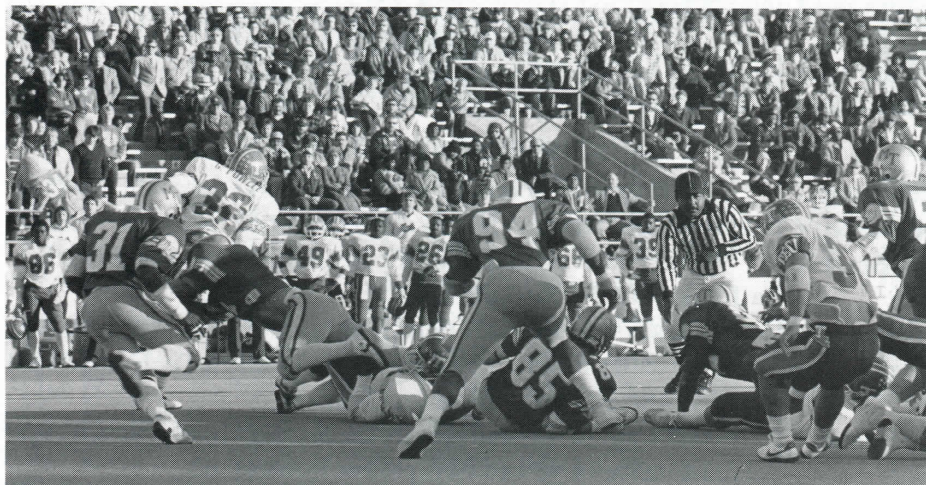

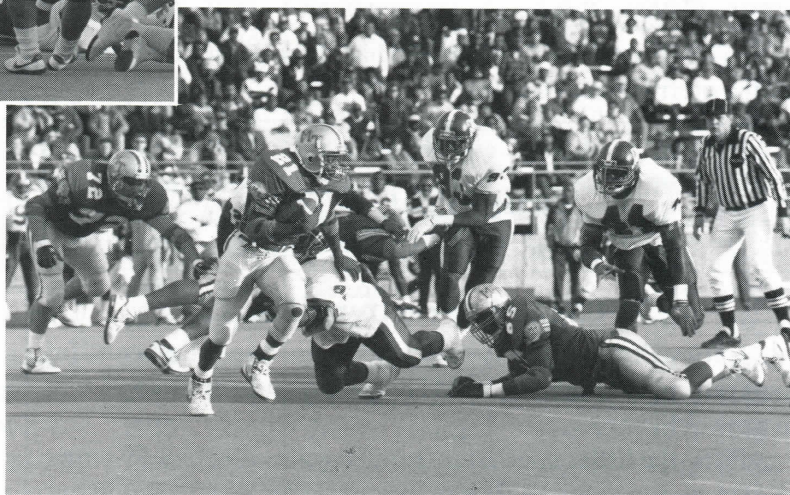
Blue Raiders in the NCAA Division I-AA Playoffs

Five Appearances: Won 5, Lost 5 (.500)

1984

First Round: MTSU 27, Eastern Kentucky 10

MTSU entered the national championship playoffs as an at-large entry after finishing with a 9-2 overall record and trailing only champion Eastern Kentucky in the final OVC standings. The first-round game sent the Blue Raiders to Richmond, Ky., for the second time in the season, where they had taken a 22-10 win from the Colonels in early October.

This time, MTSU prevailed over the league titlists, 27-10, as tailbacks Vince Hall and Gerald Anderson teamed up for three TDs (two for Anderson and one for Hall) and 325 yards in rushing (202 for Hall and 123 for Anderson). MTSU kept the ball for nearly 40 minutes as Hall and Anderson combined for 55 carries.

The defense was paced by tackles Kenny McDaniel and Greg Casteel, with 11 stops each, and end John Garrett, with 10.

Quarter-Finals: MTSU 42, Indiana State 41 (3 OTs)

The Blue Raiders again hit the road to take on highly-regarded Indiana State at Terre Haute. In one of the most memorable games in Division I-AA playoff history, MTSU broke on top 21-0 in the first quarter. Mickey Corwin hit Tony Burse for a six-yard TD pass, then Vince Hall scored from 80 yards out and Mike Clark snagged a 25-yard scoring pass from Corwin. The latter two scores came in a breathless 18-second span sandwiched around an ISU fumble.

The Sycamores fought back to tie the game at 21-all and send it into overtime, where each team scored on its first three possessions. However, after ISU tallied its third overtime TD to make the score 42-41 for MTSU, the Sycamores went for a two-point conversion off a fake kick. The play was smothered by the right side of the Blue Raider line to send MTSU into the semifinals.

Semifinals: Louisiana Tech 21, MTSU 13

Back home for the first time in the playoffs, the Blue Raiders found themselves locked in a struggle between two very well-coached and gutsy football teams. Tech took an early 7-0 lead on a blocked punt, but MTSU battled back on a 33-yard field goal by Kelly Potter and a two-yard plunge by Gerald Anderson to forge a 10-7 lead in the third quarter.

Tech came right back six minutes later to go ahead, 14-10, on an 11-yard pass play from Kyle Gandy to Todd Breske. MTSU chalked up another field goal by Potter, this one a 35-yarder, to cut the lead to 13-14, only to see David Green ramble 80 yards on Tech's very next play for a 21-13 lead.

The Raiders began to move the ball steadily on their next possession, but a fumble well inside Tech territory ended their title hopes, 21-13.

Hall rushed for 533 yards in the three post-season games to shatter all existing NCAA Playoff records. Corwin's 27-for-41 passing gave him a .659 percentage for the playoffs, a record that still stands.

1985

Quarter-Finals: Georgia Southern 28, MTSU 21

MTSU entered the playoffs as OVC champions and the top seed after a perfect 11-0 regular season and being ranked the No. 1 team in the nation over the final half of the season. That earned the Raiders a first-round bye and host role against Georgia Southern, a team MTSU had beaten, 35-10, early in the season.

Early in the second quarter, Southern's eventual national champs had built a 21-0 lead, only to see the Raiders cut it to 21-14 late in the third period. Another Eagle tally made it 28-14, but Dwight Stone ran for his second TD of the game to cut it to 28-21 with five minutes to play, but the Raiders could get no closer.

1989

First Round: MTSU 24, Appalachian State 21

The Raiders, as newly crowned OVC champs, had to pull out all stops to beat the Mountaineers of Appalachian State at Jones Field.

ASU had a slight edge in both total offense yardage and first downs, but the Raiders had a vital advantage in turnovers and the ability to score at the decisive moment.

MTSU's TDs came on a 36-yard scamper by tailback Joe Campbell, a five-yard return of a blocked punt by Jimmy McCamey, and a one-yard plunge by Phil Ironside.

Senior place-kicker Joe Lisle not only added all three extra points, but he provided the winning margin with a 17-yard field goal in the game's waning seconds. The winning kick had been set up by a remarkable catch of an Ironside pass by junior split end Kenny Donaldson, putting the ball at the Appalachian State one-yard line.

Quarter-Finals: Georgia Southern 35, MTSU 3

For the second time during the fall, the Blue Raiders fell victim to Georgia Southern in Statesboro.

In contrast to the regular-season loss to GSC, which was played in the driving rain of Hurricane Hugo, the playoff contest was played out under brilliant blue skies -- but the outcome still went solidly in favor of the Eagles.

A Lisle field goal provided the only scoring MTSU was able to muster for the afternoon, while the Raider defense could never provide any consistent deterrent to the Georgia Southern offense.

1990

First Round: MTSU 28, Jackson State 7

After tying for the OVC title and top-seeded for the playoffs after a No. 1 NCAA ranking at season's end, MTSU had little trouble eliminating Jackson State in the first round at Jones Field.

Playing without starting quarterback Phil Ironside, an All-OVC pick who suffered a season-ending back injury in the regular-season finale against Tennessee Tech, the Raiders got a brilliant performance from his understudy, O. J. Smith. Smith rushed for 70 yards and one TD and completed two of three passes for eight yards, one a scoring strike to Vince Parks.

Joe Campbell (89 yards in 16 carries) and Wade Johnson (50 yards in 10 tries) also ran for Raider touchdowns.

An alert MTSU defense picked off five Tiger passes, two interceptions coming from linebacker Scott Boykin.

Quarter-Finals: Boise State 20, MTSU 13

Already crippled by the loss of Ironside, the Raiders lost his back-up, O. J. Smith, to a knee injury late in the first-quarter of a battle with a very sound Boise State team on the Broncos' home turf.

Even so, MTSU fought back from a 10-3 halftime deficit to take a 13-10 lead in the third quarter and find itself tied at 13-all going into the fourth period.

A gutsy fourth-down pass off a fake punt gave the Broncos the impetus they needed for a late TD. The Raiders could not make a first down on their ensuing possession and saw their title hopes dashed.

Campbell led all rushers with 102 yards in 21 carries, but the injury-riddled Raider offense could muster only 168 yards in total offense.

1991

First Round: MTSU 20, Sam Houston 19 (OT)

The Blue Raiders found their hands full with a tough bunch of Sam Houston Bearkats who brought an excellent football team to Jones Field.

The Texans ran out to a 13-3 halftime lead on two short touchdown runs by Curtis Thomas and one of two extra points from the toe of Mark Klein. The only MTSU points of the half came on a 42-yard field goal by freshman Garth Petrilli.

The Blue Raider defense shut down the Bearkat offense in the second half, while the MTSU attack got another field goal (33 yards) from Petrilli in the third quarter and late fourth-quarter TD from tailback Joe Campbell to bring on a 13-13 tie and the second overtime playoff game in MTSU history.

Thomas scored from one yard out on Sam Houston's first overtime possession, but Klein's PAT attempt hit the goal post's right upright and caromed back into the playing field. On the Raider possession, it took only three plays for Campbell to score from the 10-yard line and Petrilli's extra point kept MTSU alive in the Playoffs.

Quarter-Finals: Eastern Kentucky 23, MTSU 13

MTSU suffered only one loss to a Division I-AA football team during the 1991 regular season, a 10-point defeat (17-7) at the hands of Ohio Valley Conference rival Eastern Kentucky in Richmond. Another loss at Richmond, by an identical margin, knocked the Blue Raiders out of the NCAA Playoffs.

Eastern shut down the MTSU running attack as nobody had all season, giving the Raiders only 77 total rushing yards. Middle Tennessee was shut out until the fourth period, when freshman quarterback Kelly Holcomb passed for a pair of TDs, one of 19 yards to Steve Dark, the other of four yards to Curt Watkins.

The EKU scores came on a 57-yard screen pass to Markus Thomas, a 38-yard pass from Vincent Ware to Kenny McCollum, a five-yard run from Tim Lester and a 22-yard field goal by Todd Duffy.

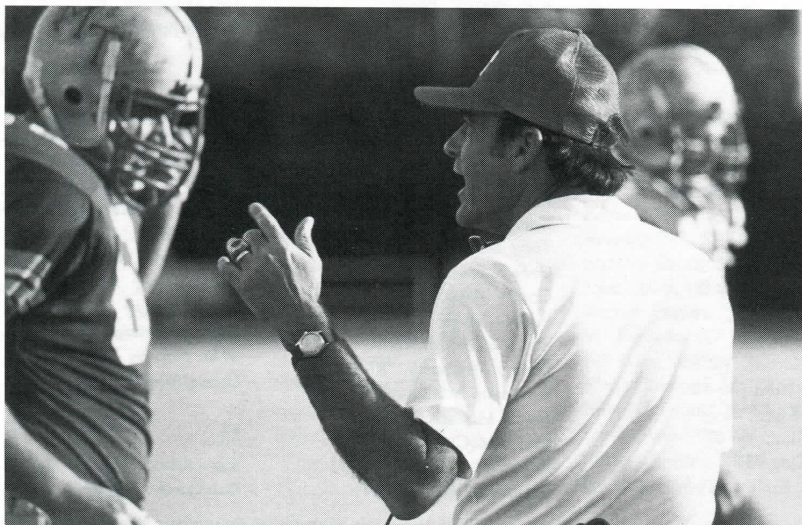

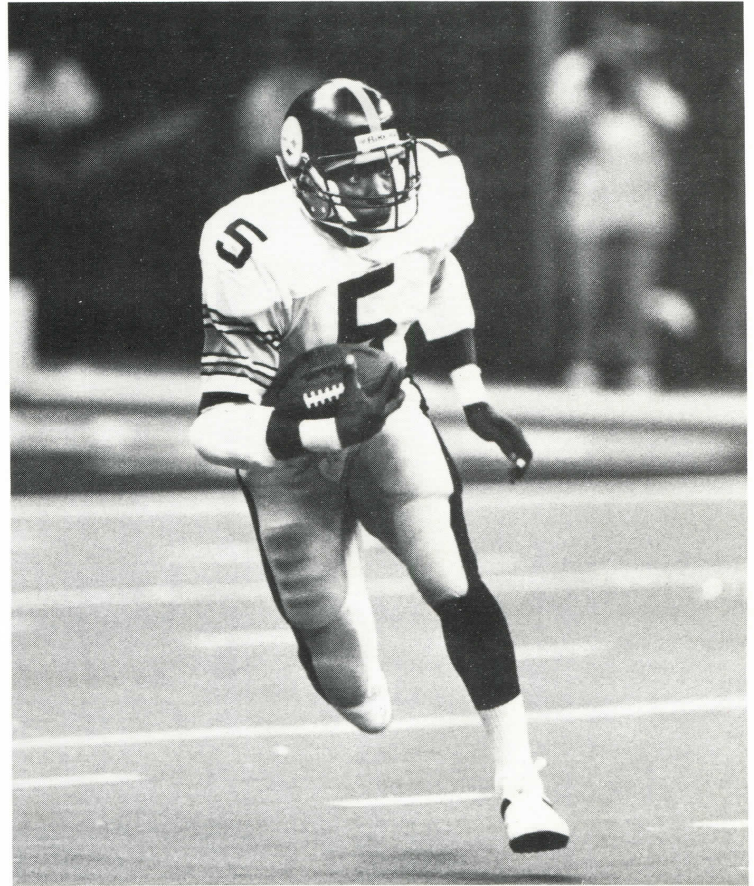
