Notes: The MT-UT game is a battle between the state's two largest universities ... Tennessee will be the highest ranked opponent the Blue Raiders have faced in the I-A era ... WR David Youell has caught at least one pass in 23 straight games ... Brian Kelly has hit 7 of his last 8 field goals and 31 consecutive PATs ... In his last 23 games, Dwone Hicks has scored 41 rushing touchdowns ... Dating back to last season, MT has scored 18 times in its last 21 trips inside the red zone and 14 of those have been TDs ... MT is 11-4 over its last 15 games and three of those losses have come against SEC teams on the road ... In 1995, Andy McCollum was an assistant under Phil Fulmer for seven weeks before taking the defensive coordinator's job at Baylor.

SERIES RECORD

■ Saturday's football game between Middle Tennessee and Tennessee will be the first-ever meeting between the two schools on the gridiron.

MT VS RANKED FOES

■ Since joining the I-A ranks in 1999, the Blue Raiders have faced four teams in the nation's top 25 and this week will be the fifth. Middle Tennessee is 0-4 in those games with losses to No. 19 Arizona in 1999, No. 21 Illinois in 2000, No. 8 Florida in 2000, and No. 20 Mississippi State in 2000. At No. 4, Tennessee will be the highest ranked opponent the Blue Raiders have faced in the I-A era, but is not the highest rated foe MT has gone against on the gridiron. That distinction goes to Florida State, who was ranked No. 1 in the nation when the Blue Raiders played them in 1991.

■ The Middle Tennessee-Tennessee game will be produced by Host Communications/Comcast Sports and will be shown in the state of Tennessee on a Pay-Per-View basis. Please check with your cable system or satellite

PLAYER OF WEEK

■ Sophomore **ReShard Lee** brought home Middle Tennessee's first Sun Belt Conference Player of the Week award this season when he was tabbed the league's Special Team's Player of the Week. Lee had four kickoff returns for a career-best 137 yards against Alabama. It was Lee's second honor of his career and the team's 12th.

BLUE RAIDERS TO BE SEEN

■ A school record seven Middle Tennessee football games will be televised in 2002. All seven games will be televised live, including Kentucky which will be available on ESPN Gameplan.

ON DISPLAY

■ The Blue Raiders have been no strangers to playing before large crowds since making the move to I-A in 1999, but Saturday's game at Neyland Stadium will set a record that may stand

for awhile. With an expected crowd of 107,000 scheduled to see the Blue Raiders take on the nationally-ranked Vols, it will go down as the largest crowd MT has ever played in front of in 87 years of football. With UT not appearing on the Blue Raider schedule anytime soon, it is a record that should stand for a long time.

ON THE ROAD

■ Under Head Coach Andy McCollum, the Blue Raiders have a mark of 4-15 in games played away from Murfreesboro, but have won four of their last eight. Middle Tennessee was 3-3 away from home in 2001 after beginning its I-A era with 11 straight road setbacks.

BLUE RAIDERS VS SEC

■ Middle Tennessee will be playing its ninth game against the SEC since going I-A in 1999. The Blue Raiders will face a total of four teams from the SEC this season after taking on three in 2001. Overall, the Blue Raiders have a mark of 1-19 against teams from the SEC.

HINES TOUGH IN DEBUT

■ Junior **Andrico Hines**, who made his first collegiate start last week at Alabama, proved he will be a special player for the Blue Raiders. The Riverdale, GA, native completed 16 of 24 passes for 165 yards, while rushing for 49 yards on eight attempts. Hines, who led five straight scoring drives against the Crimson Tide, engineered three scoring drives of 75 or more yards.

BLUE RAIDER FIRSTS

■ The Blue Raiders had a total of five players earn their first collegiate starts last week at Alabama. Andrico Hines, ReShard Lee, Will Martin, Tony Sutton, and Brandon Parker all entered the starting lineup for the first time ... MT also had a total of 17 players debut in a Blue Raider uniform on Saturday, including true fresh-

men Jonathan Bonner, Dennis Burke, Devarick Scandrett, Sean Waller, and Sam Williams.

HE MAY DRIVE BUS NEXT!

■ Sophomore **ReShard Lee** showcased his talent and versatility in last week's televised game against Alabama. Lee, out of Brunswick, GA, started the game at quarterback, lined up at tailback, and also returned kickoffs. Lee led the team in rushing with 56 yards, completed his first and only career pass attempt for 37 yards, then added a rushing touchdown and a two-point conversion. If that wasn't enough, he added four kickoff returns for a career-best 137 yards. That effort went down as the third-best single-game total in school history.

STRONG IN THE RED ZONE

■ Over the past 23 games, the Blue Raider offense has performed admirably in the red zone. During that span, the offense has appeared inside the opponents 20-yard line 101 times and have come away with points on 84 occasions. That works out to 83.2 percent. Of the 84 scores, 72 have been touchdowns. At Alabama last week, MT was a perfect 6-for-6 in the red zone with four touchdowns and two field goals.

SOLID ON SPECIAL TEAMS

■ Against Alabama last Saturday, the Blue Raiders clearly won the special teams battle. Middle Tennessee averaged 40.3 yards a punt, made all of its field goals and PATs, put four of five kickoffs in the endzone, averaged 10 yards a punt return, and returned four kickoffs for 137 yards. Also, new deep snapper, freshman **John Crawford**, was perfect on all seven of his tries. Crawford is from Knoxville, TN.

Dick Palmer is in his 22nd season as the Blue Raiders' play-by-play announcer, while former MT assistant coach Preston O'Neal is handling the color analysis for the ninth straight year. MT Marketing and Promotions director, Chip Walters, will be handling sideline commentary and locker room interviews. The Blue Raider Network also features five affiliate stations throughout the mid-state area.

■ Middle Tennessee Head Coach Andy McCollum will hold a weekly football press conference on Mondays at 10:30 AM. The conference will be held in the new meeting room at Floyd Stadium adjacent to the weight room. WHEELER GOES DEEP

■ Redshirt freshman **Paul Wheeler** made a sterling debut for the Blue Raiders last Saturday. The Tullahoma, TN, native placed four of his five kickoffs in the end zone and his average depth was the 0.6 yard line. His five kickoffs resulted in the Crimson Tide starting their drives at the 19.0-yard line. The average drive start for MT's opponents in 2001 was the 28-yard line.

HIGH POWERED 'O'

■ The Blue Raider offense has grabbed the headlines on numerous occasions the past two plus years for their high powered attack. The unit, which ranked No. 5 nationally in total offense last year, has averaged 455 yards a game and 35 points over its past 23 con-

tests. Under Andy McCollum, the Blue Raiders have topped the 40-point mark 10 times and registered 400 or more yards of total offense on 19 occasions. The Blue Raiders are coming off a season where they set seven single-season offense records, including total offense and points scored.

STREAKIN' YOUELL

■ Senior wide receiver **David Youell**, who is coming off his best year as a Blue Raider, enters the Tennessee game riding a streak of 23 consecutive games with at least one reception. Youell's mark stands as the fifth longest in school history and with a catch in all 12 games this year he would move all the way to No. 2. Former MT receiver **Kendall Newson** owns the school mark with 43 straight games with a catch.

HICKS TIES RECORD

■ With two rushing touchdowns against Alabama, senior **Dwone Hicks** equalled Joe Campbell's school record of 44 career rushing touchdowns. Hicks, who needs just one more rushing touchdown to own the school mark by himself, already owns the overall touchdowns scored record with 50.

HICKS ENCORE?

■ Tailback **Dwone Hicks**, who became the first player since 1994 to record back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons last year, is trying to become only the second player in school history to reach that plateau three years in a row. The only player to have three straight 1,000-yard seasons at MT was **Mike Moore** from 1975-77. Only four players in NCAA history have recorded four 1,000-yard seasons (Tony Dorsett, Amos Lawrence, Dennis Manns, and Ron Dayne).

BLOCKS UNDER MAC

■ Under **Andy McCollum** the Blue Raiders have blocked four kicks, and all four have come in the last two years. Under McCollum, Middle Tennessee has blocked two punts (Michael Woods vs Louisiana Tech in 2000, Chris Johnson vs ASU in 2001), an extra point (Kareem Bland vs UL-Monroe in 2001), and a field goal (Kareem Bland vs UConn in 2001).

OUTLAND WATCH

■ Middle Tennessee offensive tackle **Brandon Westbrook** was one of 63 players to make the 2002 Outland Trophy Watch List, which was released in August by the *Football Writers Association of America*. The Outland Trophy is awarded each year to the top interior lineman in college football. Westbrook, a freshman all-American in 2000, was a first team all-Sun Belt selection in 2001 and is also a first team all-preseason pick in 2002. The Cumming, GA, native is in his junior season.

WOODS ON BUTKUS LIST

■ Junior **Michael Woods** is among the 67 players named to the preliminary list for the annual Butkus Award. The award is given each year to the nation's top linebacker.

BILLINGS ON RAY GUY LIST

■ Junior **Robert Billings** has been named to the 2002 Ray Guy Award watch list as a potential candidate for the top collegiate punter of the year. Billings, one of 34 candidates, led the Sun Belt Conference in punting average in 2001.

STORY IDEAS

■ Cornerback **Chris Johnson** is studying to be a minister. The Freeport, FL, native is scheduled to give his first sermon during Middle Tennessee's open week on Sept. 15. Johnson was also recently married and his best man was running back **Dwone Hicks**.

■ Defensive lineman **Demetrios Walker** had his leg broken in four places at the age of 14 when he was run over by a car. After learning how to walk all over again, it's amazing the Kansas City, MO, native is even playing football.

■ True freshmen **Sean Waller** and **Pierre Ingram**, both members of the traveling squad, were state champions in track and field last year. Waller was the Tennessee state champion in the 100-, 200-, and 400 meters, while Ingram was the Georgia state winner in the high jump (6-10).

■ On January 29, lineman **Josh Willoughby** saved the life of a gentleman who was choking on some food at a local restaurant. After a lady had tried unsuccessfully to help the man, Willoughby grabbed him out of the booth and attempted the Heimlich maneuver about 10 times before freeing the lodged food from his throat. At the conclusion of the event, the guy asked Willoughby how he could repay him. Willoughby responded by saying, "just buy season tickets".

■ Starting offensive lineman Kevin Pascoe earned his bachelor's degree in Economics last December and enrolled in graduate school in January. Pascoe is working toward a Master's degree in Business Administration.

■ Middle Tennessee's **Band of Blue** is now the largest college marching band in the state of Tennessee and is tied with Michigan for the sixth largest college marching band in the nation. The Band of Blue's 350 members is larger than the University of Tennessee's Pride of the Southland Band which has 330 members.

■ Sophomore running back **Don Calloway** has 16 brothers and sisters. His brother Selma was a running back at Georgia.

■ Former walk-on **Joey Montalbano**, who was the 2001 and 2002 Lifter of the Year for the Blue Raiders, has his own business called "Campus Times". The company publishes calendars.

■ Starting free safety **Michael Woods**, from Valdosta, GA, is the cousin of current Tennessee Titan linebacker Randall Godfrey.

■ The Blue Raider coaching staff hosts over 500 Boys and Girls Club kids each year for a free clinic at Floyd Stadium. During that same week, Andy McCollum puts on a golf tournament which raised over \$100,000 in 2002 for the club.

ALL-AMERICA WATCH LIST

■ The Football Writers Association of America released its 2002 All-America Watch List in July and four Middle Tennessee players made the squad. Heisman Trophy candidate **Dwone Hicks** (Huntsville, AL), placekicker **Brian Kelly** (Woodstock, GA), punter **Robert Billings** (Collierville, TN), and offensive tackle **Brandon Westbrook** (Cumming, GA) were all recognized by the FWAA. Hicks is the lone Blue Raider senior to be honored.

100-YD RECEIVING GAMES

■ Under Andy McCollum, the Blue Raiders have had 20 100-yard receiving games with 19 of those coming from wide receivers and one from a running back. **Tyrone Calico** has registered five, while **Don Calloway** and **David Youell** have each recorded one.

CALICO TIED FOR SIXTH

■ Senior **Tyrone Calico** enters the Tennessee game tied for sixth on Middle Tennessee's all-time touchdown receptions list. Calico has 13 career scores and stands eight behind record holders Kendall Newson and Herbert Owenby. The Millington, TN, native needs three more scoring grabs to tie George Dykes and G.E. McCormack for fourth place.

HICKS FOR 100

BILLINGS REMAINS STEADY

■ Junior punter **Robert Billings**, a pre-season all-SBC pick, continues to do a solid job kicking the football. The Collierville, TN, native is coming off his best season when he averaged a Sun Belt best 42.3 yards a kick and placed nine of his 35 attempts inside the opponents 20-yard line. Billings, who has booted 13 punts 50 or more yards, enters the Tennessee game ranked 10th in punting yards, 10th in punting attempts, and sixth in career average.

KELLY IS MONEY

■ **Brian Kelly**, who also earned preseason all-SBC honors, has been one of the more consistent kickers in school history. The junior enters the UT game having hit 19 of his 24 field goal attempts and 85 of his 92 PATs. Kelly, who has never missed a field goal in league play, has connected on seven of his last eight attempts. The Woodstock, GA, native heads into the Tennessee game with a career-best 31 consecutive made extra points.

BCS VS NON-BCS

Over the past 23 games, running back Dwone Hicks has proven himself against some of the nation's top teams. During that span, the senior has averaged 109.0 (872) yards rushing in eight games against BCS teams compared to 106.1 (1591) yards in 15 contests versus Non-BCS schools. Hicks' average per carry against BCS members is 6.5 yards (134 att.), while he is gaining 6.3 yards (254 att.) a carry versus the Non-BCS teams. In the eight games against BCS schools, Hicks has topped the 100-yard mark five times. The only teams to keep him below the century mark were Florida (15-64), Alabama (11-42) and Ole Miss, but against the Rebels he left with a hamstring injury during the first drive of the third quarter and never returned. He finished with 79 yards on nine carries in the loss to the Rebels and an impressive 8.8 yards a carry average.

BIGGEST COMEBACK EVER

■ In what was the biggest comeback win in school history, the Blue Raiders came from 24 points down in the fourth quarter to defeat New Mexico State at home in 2001. The Blue Raiders registered 289 total yards of offense in the fourth quarter and scored on four straight possessions (70, 88, 80, and 68 yards). QB Wes Counts completed 13 of 16 passes for 218 yards in the final quarter, while receiver Kendall Newson hauled in seven passes for 119 yards. Defensively, the Blue Raiders held the Aggies to just 47 yards of total offense. The 28 fourth quarter points were the most ever scored in the final period by an Andy McCollum coached team and matched the most scored in any quarter under McCollum.

LOOKING FOR 20

■ Under **Andy McCollum**, the Blue Raiders have compiled a mark of 17-6 when scoring 20 or more points. On the flip side, Middle Tennessee stands 0-11 when scoring less than 20 points for McCollum and Co.

BLUE RAIDERS GET A VOTE

■ For the first time in school history, Middle Tennessee received a vote in the Preseason *Associated Press* College Football Top 25 Poll. The Blue Raiders, who have posted back-to-back winning seasons, earned a total of one vote, which ranked them No. 50 overall in the preseason poll, then jumped to No. 49 in the first regular season poll.

2002 SEASON RECAP AND BOXSCORES

Alabama 39, Middle Tennessee 34
Aug. 31, 2002; Birmingham, AL

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. - Middle Tennessee spotted Alabama 22 points in the first quarter and then came storming back to give the Crimson Tide a fight to the finish in the season opener for both teams at Legion Field.

Alabama held off a furious rally that saw the Blue Raiders pull to within five points or less three times in the game's final nine minutes to secure a 39-34 win in front of 80,091 at Legion Field.

No, MTSU didn't get the quality win it sought, but the Blue Raiders showed fight and determination in a remarkable comeback that earned them the respect they were seeking.

"We wanted to get in the fourth quarter with Alabama at Legion Field and have a chance to win the ball game," MTSU coach Andy McCollum said. "We want to find a way to finish this, but Alabama did a good job making sure we didn't. Losing is not OK at Middle Tennessee, though, and never will be."

The game's outcome wasn't decided until Ahmaad Galloway recovered an onside kick at midfield with 2:16 remaining and, even then, the Crimson Tide needed one more first down to run out the clock. MTSU forced a third-and-4 situation with just under two minutes remaining, but Santonio Beard's 4-yard run provided the necessary new set of downs that enabled Alabama to run out the clock and escape with the narrow win.

"We jumped out on them early and really thought we were going to be able to close the deal there, but I tell you what, they kept fighting," Alabama quarterback Tyler Watts said. "They kept coming back. We were unable to put the ball in the end zone (after the first quarter). We kept fighting, and there in the fourth quarter we were able to pull it out."

Funny hearing Watts, who was 16-of-22 for 236 yards and two touchdowns, talk about fighting for a win because there for awhile it appeared the Crimson Tide was on its way to an easy win. Suddenly, everything changed for the Blue Raiders.

The offense started clicking and the defense rose to the occasion. As a result, MTSU outscored Alabama 34-17 after the first quarter to put itself in position for what would have been an incredible comeback.

"You can't be proud of a loss," MTSU line-

backer Michael Woods said. "We knew we could hang with them coming in, and we know if we didn't give up those 22 points in the first quarter we could have won this game. We know we played a good team (Saturday). We came out and played as hard as we could and it just wasn't enough."

Incredibly, MTSU had the ball at its 38 with 3:07 remaining and down 32-27 with an offense that obviously had found its rhythm behind first-year quarterback Andrico Hines, who debuted by going 16-of-24 for 165 yards and rushing for another 47 yards on seven carries.

"When we took over we believed we were going to drive down the field and score," senior receiver David Youell said. "There was never a doubt at any time, even down 22."

Hines' first pass of the series was intercepted when linebacker Freddie Roach cut in front of a pass intended for Youell and took it 41 yards to the end zone to put Alabama on top 39-27 with 2:56 remaining.

"I didn't even see (Roach)," Hines said. "It was a great play on his behalf. I think they started to anticipate what we were doing. That is a time you wish you had a string on the ball to bring it back. I can't take anything from him. You always want to come out with a win. We came out and gave it our all and just came up short."

Even after the only turnover of the game for either team, MTSU came storming back. ReShard Lee almost took the kickoff return the distance before being forced out of bounds after a 58-yard return to the Alabama 42.

Then Lee took the handoff from Hines on the first play of the drive, pulled up, and the former high school quarterback connected with Wardell Alsop for a 37-yard pass play to the Alabama 5.

MTSU tailback Dwone Hicks, being touted as a Heisman Trophy candidate, scored his second touchdown on the following play and Brian Kelly added the extra point to get MTSU within 39-34.

Hicks was held to 42 yards on 11 carries. Lee led a balanced ground game with 56 yards on 11 carries and a touchdown as the Blue Raiders rushed for 183 yards and got all four touchdowns via the rushing attack.

After narrowing the gap to five, MTSU had a chance to recover Paul Wheeler's perfectly placed onside kick when it took a high hop, but Galloway was able to secure it.

"I admire our kids. They hung in there, and they found a way to win," Alabama coach Dennis Franchione said. "Give Middle Tennessee credit, they played hard. We knew they were a good team and they played like it. We tip our hats to

Middle the way they kept fighting. They stayed after it, but we also admire ourselves for hanging in."
