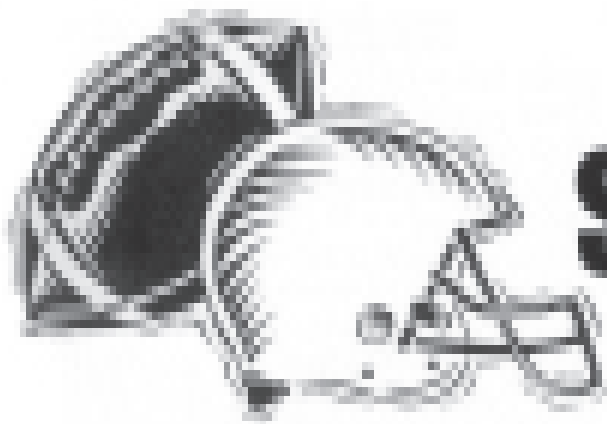

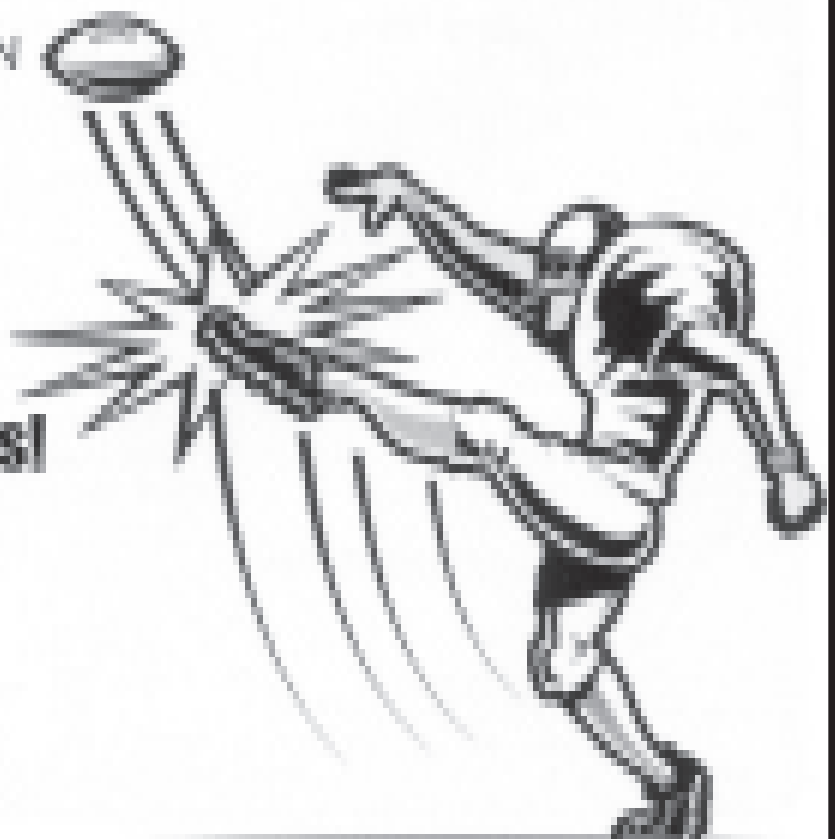

Press Locations

Working press will be admitted to Level 2 of the press box at Monarch Stadium. This includes local newspapers, wire services, national publications, newspapers from the opponent's area and the student newspapers from Methodist and the opponent's schools. Radio and television stations broadcasting either Methodist or the opponent's games will be stationed in the corner booths on Level 1 of the press box.

Credentials

Although the Methodist Sports Information Office does not issue formal media credentials, it is still required that members of the media contact Lee Wright, Sports Information Director, by Wednesday during the week of the game if they plan to be present. All media will be admitted by showing the proper credential of its media outlet.

Telephones

There are three telephone lines located on Level 1 of the Monarch Stadium press box. They are first-come, first-serve use only. Any opponent that uses radio broadcasts is required to contact sports information director Lee Wright by Wednesday during the week of the game.

Statistics/Services

Methodist will provide complete game statistics, including play-by-play, half-time flash stats, complete postgame statistics and, if needed, coach's quotes. These statistics are normally distributed in the press box at half-

time and in the Riddle Center following the game, and additional requests can be easily accommodated. Statistics are delivered to the radio booths throughout the game. Beverages will be available in the press box throughout the game.

Postgame Interviews

After a 10-minute cool-down period, the Methodist lockerroom will be opened to members of the media in compliance to NCAA rules.

Photographers

The sidelines at Monarch Stadium are very restricted and space is limited. Only photographers representing daily newspapers, television stations, student newspapers and the sports information office are allowed on the sidelines. Photographers are restricted to the areas outside the 25-yard lines, and no photographers will be allowed inside the team bench areas in accordance to NCAA regulations.

Practice Attendance

Methodist football practices are open to members of the media, but we request that you call in advance to set up any and all interviews with coaches and players. Interviews with players will be limited to Monday – Thursday and after games on Saturday.

Player Interviews

Methodist players are available for interviews until Thursday after practice on game weeks. Please request interviews with a

2004 Season Preview

A field goal here, and field goal there. Add to that a touchdown off a turnover.

That's how close a good 2003 football season could've been a great football season for the Methodist Monarchs. On the surface, Methodist finished 4-5 overall and 3-3 in the USA South Athletic Conference for a fourth-place finish. But the deceiving part about that was the fact that three of the five defeats were by a combined 13 points.

However, the 2004 campaign could become a breakout season for the Monarchs as veteran head coach Jim Sypult returns nine starters on offense and eight starters on defense. All total, 57 letterwinners, including 16 seniors, are back in the fold for the Monarchs, who aim for their first conference title since the 2000 season. Methodist was picked fourth in the preseason USA South Athletic Conference polls, but with the talent and experience returning, the Monarchs can vision a conference title in their sights.

Sypult points to one particular aspect that different from the last couple of seasons – maturity.

"I can see the maturity. It's a vast difference from a freshman to a sophomore, a sophomore to a junior and a junior to a senior," said Sypult, starting his 13th season at the Monarch helm. "We were very competitive in those games, and most of those players are back this season. That's a positive, however, we are still a new unit and we need to have the best 11 playing on both sides."

OFFENSE

Offensively, the Monarchs could have arguably one of the most feared and dangerous units in the USA South, and perhaps the nation. Methodist averaged 349 yards per game in total offense last season, including 258 on the ground. And for much of the season, the Monarchs were ranked in the Top 15 in the nation in rushing offense.

Spearheading the unit is one of the most talented players in the USA South – junior quarterback Chris Ronchetti. A double-threat with both his feet and arm, the 6-foot, 196-pound Ronchetti threw for 793 yards on 56-for-115 pass attempts, while rushing for 519 yards on 89 carries with a whopping 10 touchdowns. The second team All-USA South performer led the conference in scoring, both in points and touchdowns, while ranking fifth in rushing yards.

Sypult said Ronchetti is as a "complete package" as anyone who's ever stepped under

center for Methodist.

"They don't anticipate his speed and his strength," Sypult said about Ronchetti. "If he's not the fastest player on the team, he's right at the top two or three. On top of that, he has the tremendous athletic ability and great footwork, plus he's one of the strongest quarterbacks you're going to see."

With a more experienced receiving corps this season, the Monarchs will look to open it up more offensively to take advantage of Ronchetti's throwing abilities. Sophomores Chuck Howard (5-6, 172) and Michael Brim (6-2, 195) each played key roles in their first



season, and should show dramatic improvements this season. However, freshmen Christopher Fields (5-9, 175), Jonathan Mularski (6-0, 180) and Jerold Robinson (5-11, 195) have made tremendous strides in preseason.

Junior Jonathan Sherman (6-1, 194) is a good possession receiver, while sophomores A.J. Huddleston (6-5, 210) and Andrew Gurlley (6-2, 231) are in a battle at tight end for the graduated David Foster.

"Those two (Howard and Brim) know the offense better," Sypult said. "They're more into knowing the coverages, and that's where the maturity comes in. The younger players are probably more talented with their speed."

There's never a shortage of running backs at Methodist, and 2004 should be no differ-

ent with the return of the team's top three rushers.

Senior All-USA South halfback Darmarcus Wilson (5-11, 195) is coming off a versatile 2003 season in which he gained 514 yards rushing on 99 carries and six touchdowns, and led the team in receiving with 304 yards on 20 receptions. Wilson is currently third all-time in rushing at Methodist with 1,153 yards. Senior fullback Clarence Latimer (5-10, 205) was well on his way to a banner season with 441 yards rushing in the first four games before going down for the season with a knee injury against Averett. In addition, junior Jeremy McSwain (5-6, 145) gained 227 yards on only 24 carries in a backup role.

Add freshmen Howard Fuller, Mike Hill and Tazz Petty, and the Monarchs have a tremendous future at the halfback position. In addition, freshmen Dedrick Petty and David Leonard will back up Latimer at fullback.

"The thing about those two (Wilson and Latimer) is they have great attitudes and they come to play everyday," Sypult said. "They are warrior players. Clarence has worked hard to rehabilitate the knee and get back to 100 percent where he was last season."

Any of those runners would be secure running behind a veteran offensive line that returns four starters. All-USA South senior Jonathan Byrd (6-0, 290) and senior Eric Pope (6-0, 275) give the Monarchs arguably the best guard combination in the USA South, and Gary Futch (6-5, 283) returns at right tackle, respectively. Junior William Delapp (6-2, 295) has the early advantage at left tackle, while junior Jonathan Willis (6-0, 300) steps in at center.

Depth is key up front, and the Monarchs will look at senior Shaun Forbes (6-5, 298) and sophomore Bennie Boatman (6-2, 288) at tackle, senior Josh Lusk (5-11, 284) and sophomore Max Dinges (6-1, 289) at guard and sophomore Chris Wilder (6-1, 303) at center. Amongst the newcomers, freshmen Vinnie Festa (6-0, 300) and David Idol (6-3, 240) have shown the most promise.

"Byrd, Pope and Futch are our mainstays up front, while Willis and Delapp each have good experience," Sypult said. "Byrd, in my opinion, is the best offensive lineman in the conference, while Pope is a technician who knows what he's doing. They both play up to potential."

DEFENSE

Sypult is doing something he hasn't done

since his days as assistant at Davidson – coordinating the defense. With Ed Holly now at East Mississippi Community College, Sypult takes over and installs a new look to the Monarch eight-man front.

Methodist will deploy at three-tackle, five-linebacker look on defense with more of an emphasis on speed and attack. The Monarchs return eight starters on defense.

"It's not as much the Xs and Os as it is the personnel," Sypult said. "My style has been to blitz and attack using speed. The upside is the kids are making plays, but the downside is the potential to giving up a big play. It's a team defense, meaning the best 11 that play together will be out there.

"Take my word on this – someone will blitz each play. There will be no sitting back and watch."

Up front, senior Lorenzo Sweeney (6-3, 271) is in his third season starting at defensive tackle, while sophomore Kenny Brown (5-10, 312) aims to build off a successful freshman campaign at noseguard. Junior Irrington Roberts (6-2, 230) has had perhaps the best preseason camp of anyone on the defensive line, and appears to be entrenched at the other defensive tackle spot.

Junior Rodney Ray (6-2, 332) sophomore John Northern (5-8, 234) and freshman Christian Perez (6-0, 236) provide the needed depth at noseguard, while senior Justin Howard (6-0, 192) and brothers Lance Wilkie (6-0, 278) and Drew Wilkie (5-11, 254) will see ample action at defensive tackle.

"Once they understood the system, they love it. They're expected to make plays up front and stay active," Sypult said. "Roberts is the right player for this defense. He's strong, can run and is in great condition. More importantly, he has a mean attitude."

The heart-and-soul of the Monarch defense is at linebackers, where there is no shortage of talent and experience. The inside linebacking corps should be strong with seniors John Shaw (5-11, 208) and Craig Underwood (5-9, 210) and sophomore James Ditrillio (5-11, 215). Shaw is in his third season as a starter at inside linebacker, recording 81 tackles last season, while Ditrillio recorded 40 tackles after taking over a starting role midway through the season. Senior Andrew Rusk (5-11, 227) and junior Travis Jean-Claude (5-7, 221) both have talent and experience as backups.

Sophomore R.J. Jones (6-1, 205) moves inside after starting last season at outside linebacker, while senior Andrew Rusk (5-11, 228) and Craig Underwood (5-10, 210) are experienced backups.

On the outside, junior Greg Hyslop (5-9,

197) and sophomore R.J. Jones (6-1, 231) are back. Hyslop led the Monarchs in interceptions last season with three while recording 43 tackles. In addition, junior Max Pope (5-9, 184) also returns with considerable experience, along with redshirt freshman Blake Farrell (6-0, 185).

"We have as many as 14 players that can play at linebacker, so there's not a problem with depth," Sypult said. "John is definitely our leader out there, but they all have their good attributes in the spot they play. We can take one out and substitute another without missing a beat."

The defensive backfield was the youngest area of the Monarch defense last season, and it's still the big question mark on defense as the 2004 season approaches. Senior Jackson Jean (6-0, 175) starts his fourth season at cornerback, anchoring the defensive backfield. Jean recorded 41 tackles last season and broke up three passes. Senior Justin Porter (6-1, 200) steps in at free safety.

In addition, sophomore Chris Gauntlett (6-0, 165) showed flashes last season at free safety with two interceptions, and is now slated at the other cornerback. Junior Sammy Alston (5-11, 160) also has considerable experience in the defensive backfield. After that, however, it's nothing but newcomers.

"My guess is that Jean and Porter won't come off the field. Jackson Jean is our man at corner cover," Sypult said. "After that, the jury is out on the rest."

SPECIALISTS

Sophomore Patrick Larkin (6-5, 202) made huge strides last season as a freshman, connecting on four field goals and 17-for-18 point-after attempts. Larkin has a strong leg with tremendous range, and is a legitimate potential All-USA South performer. However, the Monarchs must replace All-USA South performer Colt Laney at punter. Sophomore Jordan Allen (6-0, 264), who is also a reserve tight end, has the early edge at punter.

"I'm hoping Larkin doesn't suffer the sophomore jinx," Sypult said. "Clearly, he's the kicker. I was very impressed with offseason, especially his work ethic. I would anticipate him to come through for us."

OUTLOOK

The Monarchs once again have a tough



schedule with preseason tilts against Guilford and Salisbury at home and Emory & Henry on the road. Methodist's USA South opener is at conference newcomer North Carolina Wesleyan on Sept. 25.

"Our goal is to win the USA South the North Carolina state championship," Sypult said. "We are capable of that, and, for the most part, the pieces are in place. However, talking won't get it done. We need to bring the heat, and they are determined to do that.

"That's maturity and that's what I expect from this group."

Sypult was selected All-State both in football and basketball at East Fairmont High School in Fairmont, WV. He entered West Virginia University in 1963 and started three seasons at free safety for the Mountaineers. He helped lead West Virginia to the Liberty Bowl in 1964 and was selected team captain in 1966 as a senior.

While at West Virginia, Sypult played for a coaching staff that included both Bobby Bowden (now the legendary head coach at Florida State) and Galen Hall (former Florida head coach and former quarterbacks coach for the Dallas Cowboys).

After receiving his bachelor's degree in physical education 1967, Sypult began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at West Virginia and earned his master's degree in safety education. At the age of 23, he became one of the youngest high school head coaches in the nation when he took over the program at Elkins (WV) High School in 1968. Following three seasons at Elkins, Sypult was head coach for two seasons at Liberty High School in Virginia before turning his attention to the college ranks.

He entered the college ranks in 1973 in his hometown of Fairmont, WV, as defensive coordinator at NCAA Division II Fairmont State. Sypult helped lead Fairmont State to a conference championship that season, and that attracted him to other possible suitors. The next season, he became the defensive coordinator at Middle Tennessee State, where he served for five seasons under head coaches Bill Peck and Ben Hurt. That was followed by 12 seasons as defensive coordinator and administrative assistant at Davidson from 1979 to 1991, where Sypult served under Wildcat head coaches Ed Farrell and Vic Gatto.

In between his stints at Davidson, Sypult took a two-year hiatus to coach professionally in Italy. He led the Bologna Towers from a 2-12 season to the Super Bowl Playoffs in Italy.

Sypult is married to Dr. Sharron Sypult, an assistant professor in English and Communications at Methodist. The Sypults have one daughter, Jill Marcus, who owns a catering business. Recently, she was recognized as one of 25 top business people

Dave Eavenson, a 1996 graduate of Methodist College, enters his fifth year on the Monarch football staff as the offensive coordinator and wide receivers/quarterback coach. This is also his fourth season as Associate Head Coach.

Since returning to Methodist, Eavenson has developed the Monarchs into one of the top offensive teams in the USA South Athletic Conference. Last season, Methodist ranked second in the conference in both total offense and rushing offense, and spent much of the season ranked in the top 15 in the nation in rushing offense. 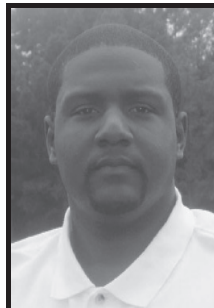
Carl Funderburk enters his second season on the Methodist coaching staff as the offensive line coach. A veteran of seven seasons as an offensive line coach, Funderburk

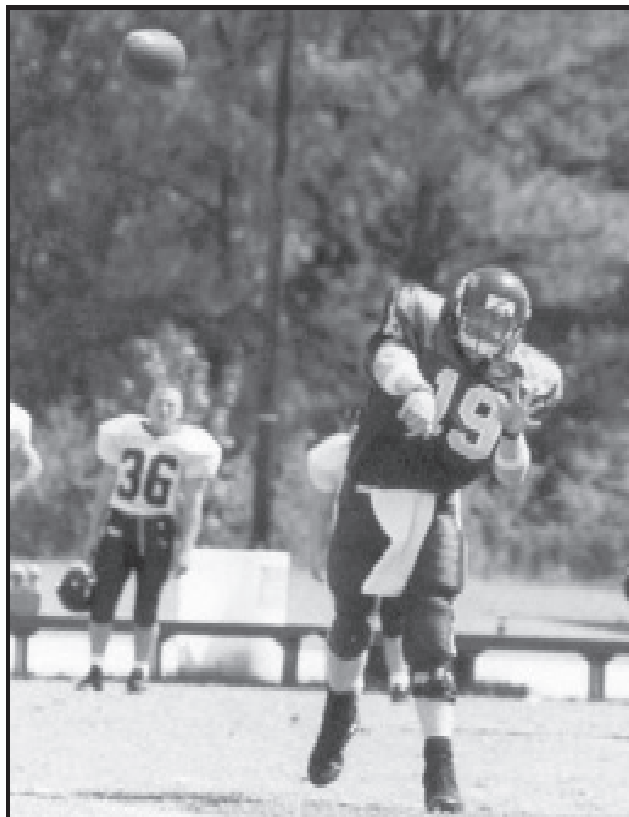

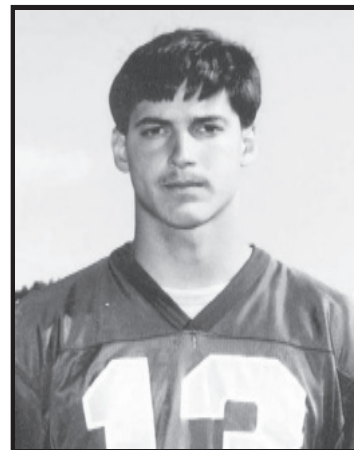

Monarch Stadium

Monarch Stadium, the home of the Monarchs since the football program's infancy in 1989, serves as the center of our 600-acre campus for football, women's lacrosse and track and field. The stadium has a two-story press box, and in 1999 added chair-back seating for 800 fans. An added feature for Monarch fans is the grass hill-side surrounding half of Monarch Stadium.

In the summer of 2000, Methodist resurfaced its track to a modern, rubberized surface. The track & field facility meets all NCAA standards and is one of the top outdoor facilities in NCAA Division III.

Prior to the birth of football at Methodist, the facility served as the home of the Methodist soccer program.

In addition to Monarch Stadium, the Methodist football program has the luxury of the Methodist Football Fieldhouse (right), located approximately 75 yards from Monarch Stadium.

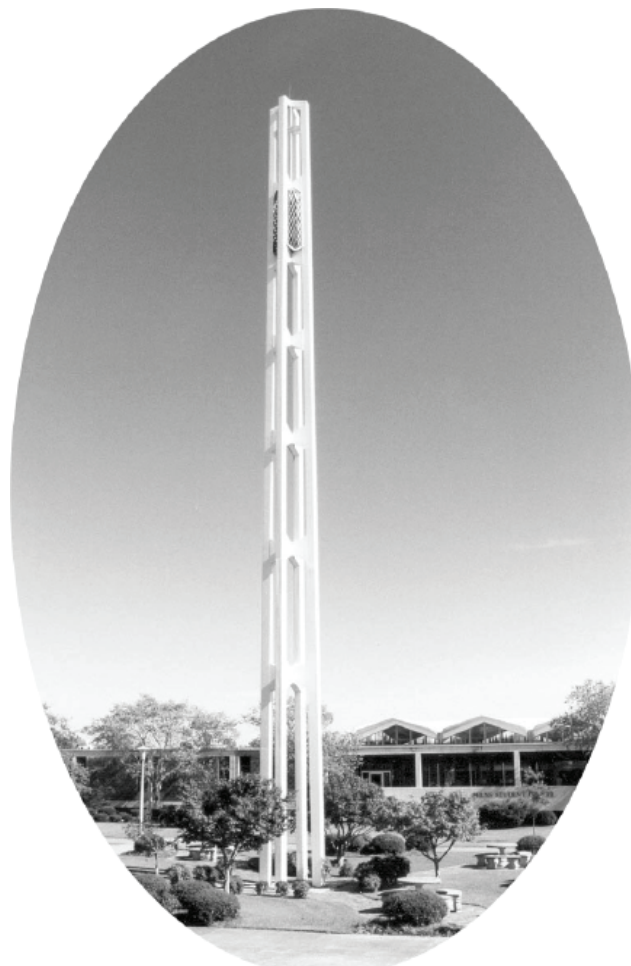

Methodist Administration



Dr. Elton Hendricks - President

In his 20 years as the President of Methodist College, Dr. Elton Hendricks has matured the growth of the small, private school in Fayetteville, N.C., into one of the premier small private colleges in the Southeast. Under his guidance, enrollment has more than doubled, new curriculum and sports have been added and 11 new buildings and facilities have been built on campus. Through Dr. Hendricks' efforts, Methodist has become one of the fastest-growing private colleges in North Carolina.

Prior to assuming the Presidency at Methodist in September of 1983, Dr. Hendricks served six years as Academic Dean at Randolph-Macon College in Ashland, Va. He also taught physics for four years – three at his alma mater, Wofford College in Spartanburg, S.C., and one year at Eisenhower College in Seneca Falls, N.Y., and served two years as Director of Admissions at Wofford. From 1957-1961, Dr. Hendricks was a naval flight officer in the United States Navy.

Dr. Hendricks holds four degrees. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree in history from Wofford, his Master of Divinity degree from Duke University, his Ph.D in physics from the University of South Carolina and an honorary Doctor of Humanities degree from Wofford. Dr. Hendricks is an ordained elder in the United Methodist Church and preaches frequently throughout North Carolina. He and his wife, Jerry, have three grown children: Joyce Lynn, Leslie Patricia and George Elton. They also have three grandchildren.

Bob McEvoy - Athletic Director

In August, 1998, Bob McEvoy assumed the duties of Athletic Director at Methodist College. As Athletic Director, McEvoy is responsible for the overall management of Methodist's 19 varsity athletic teams. During his tenure, the Monarchs have finished in the Top 15 percent of the NCAA Division III Sears Director's Cup All-Sports Trophy for the last six years. McEvoy also serves as Vice President of the USA South Athletic Conference, and is on the National Committee for the NCAA Division III Men's Basketball Championships.



In addition to being Methodist's Assistant Athletic Director from 1995-1998, McEvoy also served seven seasons as the men's head basketball coach from 1992 to 1999. During that period, the Monarchs rose from a struggling program to a championship-caliber program in the Dixie Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.

McEvoy's 1996-97 Methodist squad had the best season in program history, capturing the DIAC regular season and tournament championships and advancing to the "Elite Eight" of the NCAA Division III National Tournament with a 22-8 record.

Prior to his arrival at Methodist, McEvoy was boy's head basketball at Cape Fear High School in Fayetteville following a seven-year stint as men's head basketball coach UNC-Greensboro. McEvoy was part of the Spartans' rise from NCAA Division III to NCAA Division I status, and he led UNC-Greensboro to back-to-back DIAC championships in 1987 and 1988. He is the winningest head coach in UNC-Greensboro men's basketball history.

Other coaching stops for McEvoy include two years as Athletic Director and men's head basketball coach at Mount Olive, two years as assistant men's basketball coach at UNC-Pembroke, four years as boy's head basketball coach at Douglas Byrd High School in Fayetteville, one season as boy's head basketball coach at Cape Fear High School in Fayetteville, and one season as a graduate assistant at East Carolina.

McEvoy earned his Bachelor of Science degree from Kent State in 1973, where he lettered three seasons in basketball for the Golden Flash. McEvoy was team captain as a senior and was selected once as honorable mention All-Mid-American Athletic Conference. He received his master's degree in education from East Carolina in 1976. Bob and his wife, Pam, have two children – Mike and Lindsey. Mike is a junior basketball player at Methodist, while Lindsey is a freshman at Meredith College in Raleigh, N.C.

USA South Athletic Conference

The USA South might be the newest name in Division III athletics, but that doesn't mean the eight-team league is new on the scene. One of the oldest Division III leagues in the nation, the USA South was born as the Dixie Conference in 1963 when six schools with similar philosophies of academics and athletics joined as founding members. Those colleges were: Charlotte College (now UNC Charlotte), College of Charleston (S.C.), Methodist College, North Carolina Wesleyan College, and St. Andrews Presbyterian College. The basis for the new athletic conference was that participation would be strictly amateur, and thus no athletically awarded financial aid or athletic scholarships would be awarded. That philosophy still exists today.

In January 2003, it was announced that the Dixie would change its name to the USA South, a name that is more inclusive to the student-athletes that compete under its banner. The name change was made official on June 18, 2003 and the first USA South championships will be awarded this fall.

The conference was originally affiliated with the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), and remained with that affiliation until 1975. At that time the NCAA formed the Division III concept, which allowed membership for nonathletic scholarship schools only. The Dixie joined this new arrangement, and in so doing became one of the first conferences accepted into Division III. Since the inception of the Division III concept, the USA South Conference has been a leader in many areas, and has gained an outstanding regional and national reputation in a number of sports.

The league sponsored athletic programs for men's sports only until 1983. In that year, the NCAA expanded its sponsorship to include women's sports, and the Dixie followed that lead by including women's sports. Many of the members' teams have gained excellent recognition in this area also. The league had one national champion (Averett golf) and one runner-up (Christopher Newport baseball) in 2002-03.

Each year the conference not only recognizes the participants for outstanding athletic achievements, but outstanding academic ones as well. Those student athletes who maintain academic averages of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale are named to the conference All-Academic team. This group annually averages well over 100 students.

Each year, a President's Cup is awarded to the school that accumulates the most points throughout the academic year in sports that are sponsored by the USA South. Points are awarded on a graduated system, based on the number of teams that sponsor that particular sport. The President's Cup winner for the 2003-04 school year was Christopher Newport University. They are one of just four schools to have ever won the President's Cup.

Presently, the conference features eight schools, four in Virginia and four in North Carolina. Peace College, an all women's institution located in Raleigh, N.C., is the latest addition and they will be competing for championships for the first time this fall. Methodist and North Carolina Wesleyan remain from the original six, while Averett University, Christopher Newport University, Ferrum College, Greensboro College and Shenandoah University have all joined in the interim.

In the fall of 2005, Maryville (Tenn.) College joins the conference as a football-only member.
