Press Locations

Working press will be admitted to Level 1 of the press box at Monarch Stadium. This includes local newspapers, wire services, national publications, newspapers from the opponent's area and the student newspapers from Methodist and the opponent's schools. Radio and television stations broadcasting either Methodist or the opponent games will be stationed in the corner booths on Level 1 of the press box.

Credentials

Although the Methodist Sports Information Office does not issue formal media credentials, members of the media are still required to contact Kirbie Britt, Sports Information Director, by Wednesday during the week of the game if they plan to be present. All media will be admitted by showing the proper credential of its media outlet.

Telephones

There are three telephone lines located on Level 1 of the Monarch Stadium press box. They are first-come, first-serve use only. Any opponent who uses radio broadcasts is required to contact sports information director Kirbie Britt by Wednesday during the week of the game.

Statistics/Services

Methodist will provide complete game statistics, including play-by-play, half-time flash stats, complete postgame statistics and, if needed, coach's quotes. These statistics are normally distributed in the press box at half-time and in the Riddle Center following the game, and additional requests can be easily accommodated. Statistics are delivered to the radio booths throughout the game. Beverages will be available in the press box throughout the game.

Post-game Interviews

After the NCAA-mandated 10-minute cool-down period, the Methodist locker room will be opened to members of the media in compliance to NCAA rules.

Photographers

The sidelines at Monarch Stadium are very restricted and space is limited. Only photographers representing daily newspapers, television stations, student newspapers and the sports information office are allowed on the sidelines. Photographers are restricted to the areas outside the 25-yard lines, and no photographers will be allowed inside the team bench areas in accordance to NCAA regulations.

Practice Attendance

Methodist football practices are open to members of the media, but we request that you call in advance to set up any and all interviews with coaches and players. Interviews with players will be limited to Monday – Thursday and after games on Saturday.

Player Interviews

Methodist players are available for interviews until Thursday after practice on game weeks. Please request interviews with a minimum 24-hour notice. All interviews are to be directed through the Methodist Sports Information Office.

2007 MONARCH FOOTBALL PREVIEW

The 2006 Methodist football season did not live up to Head Coach Jim Sypult's expectations. Coming off a USA South Athletic Conference Championship in 2005, the coaches knew there would be necessary adjustments, but a 2-5 conference record was not on the agenda. Sypult hopes the lessons learned last season will translate into greater success in 2007. The Monarchs have been picked third in the USA South Athletic Conference preseason poll behind North Carolina Wesleyan and Christopher Newport. This season he has a wealth of experience returning and is counting on the team to come through with the big plays.

Last season the Monarchs battled through a 4-6 overall record to go along with their 2-5 USA South record ranking them fifth in the conference. All season, Sypult and his staff knew they would have to deal with a rookie quarterback. The Monarchs started the season with Antonio Barteo before turning to Brandon Parks in week three. They lost key starters to injuries including offensive lineman Rhyon Breen. Sypult deemed Breen "our top guy who was also a tremendous leader." Personnel questions aside, Sypult acknowledges, "We had many opportunities in the red zone that we didn't convert into points. Our playmakers didn't make plays."

Sypult has retained a core group of players who played a part of the 2005 Conference Championship and hopes their leadership and experience will help to prepare the team for the upcoming season.

OFFENSE

After enduring 2006 with a rookie quarterback, Sypult is confident in the position this fall. "We have a quarterback with fire under his belt. Parks is our guy." Brandon Parks will return this season as a sophomore and a year of experience. Last year, Parks saw action in all 10 games while throwing for 675 yards. He threw for three touchdowns while scoring four on the run. Sypult is certain sophomore Erik Teague can also step in and play while four newcomers will battle for time.

Waiting on the other end of the pass are senior wide receivers Patrick Doleman and Jonathan Mularski. A USA South Honorable Mention selection last season, Doleman led the team in receptions with 30 for 403 yards. In 2005, Doleman caught seven touchdowns currently ranking him sixth on the career touchdown chart. Sypult heralds Doleman as a "big-play guy." Mularski battled injury last year and still saw action in nine games with 123 yards receiving including a touchdown catch against Maryville College. Mularski

has shown vast improvement throughout his career at Methodist to become a formidable threat at receiver. Newcomers are also expected to be able to step in for the Monarchs.

Methodist tailback Michael Hill already holds the season rushing yardage and season rushing attempts records but will look to take over All-American DeCarlos West's career records this season. Averaging 789 yards in his first three seasons, Hill needs just 392 yards to conquer the career yardage record. The Methodist offense was essentially reduced to Hill last season. "Defenses loaded up on Mike and basically said go ahead, beat us with your rookie quarterback," Sypult said. The coaching staff is bringing in 13 running backs this year with the hope someone can take the heat off Hill.

The Monarchs lost three seniors from the offensive line, but Sypult said he is "really excited about the talent [this year]. They could be as good as we've ever had." The line will be highlighted by youth including sophomore center Joshua Kessler. Kessler spent the offseason working hard to move from 265 to 290 pounds this summer. Returners will combine with 15 freshmen joining the mix.

While the offense is bringing back experienced players, the kicking game is yet to be determined. Patrick Larkin finished his career with the Monarchs last season as the Methodist leader in career points, point after attempts, and field goals. Larkin's replacement will likely be found in one of two strong freshman commitments.

George Sands took over as the return specialist for the Monarchs in 2006. He ran for more than 600

yards in punt and kick returns on his way to be named an Honorable Mention All-American selection by Don Hansen's Football Gazette. Sands completed his eligibility last fall, so the position is wide open entering the 2007 season.

DEFENSE

Sypult's primary defensive goal is to "shore it up in the secondary." Methodist led the conference in rushing defense, but struggled with the long ball. Returning to the team are juniors Antonio Bartee and Christopher Oden along with sophomores Demory Williams, Brian Leary and Koby King. The coaching staff has recruited a wealth of new players to fill in the holes.

Senior Sean Merritt returns for his fifth year and will likely move to the noseguard position in place of All-Conference performer John Northern. Sypult is eager to insert sophomore Eric Wilson into the defensive line. Senior Brandon Hayden will flank Merritt on the other side as an experienced starter.

Linebacker Daryl Lawrence returns for his senior season as one of the team's top athletes. Lawrence led the team in tackles as a sophomore before ranking second on the team in 2006. Last season Lawrence picked up three sacks on the way to a team-high 13.5 tackles for loss. Joining Lawrence will be seniors Philip Burlingame and Jeremy Perkins. When talking about his five defensive seniors, Sypult said, "Coaching those five [Merritt, Hayden, Lawrence, Burlingame, Perkins] is like coaching heaven. All of them are great people, good students who bring leadership and experience to the team."

OVERALL

The 2007 campaign is going to be a team effort on both sides of the ball. The USA South Athletic Conference continues to be competitive with Sypult acknowledging the strengths across the board: "Christopher Newport is always tough while North Carolina Wesleyan is in position to vie for the championship in the program's fourth year." He does not want to underestimate Greensboro and knows Maryville, Shenandoah, Ferrum, and Averett all have the potential to make a run through the conference.

Sypult is surrounded by a talented staff. Michael Maraschiello joins the staff full-time this year, but has been a part of the Monarch program for the past seven years as a student-athlete and student coach. Sypult says, "I couldn't be more blessed to have the coaches I have. They have the experience, they're great recruiters, and they know what needs to be done." Former student-athletes Chris Gauntlett (2003-06), Jeremy Priebe (1999-2001) and Travis Smith (2000-03) are new part-time coaches.

Methodist will open the season at home on Sept. 8 against Guilford College before traveling to Chowan. The team will kick off conference play hosting North Carolina Wesleyan on Sept. 22. Non-conference opponent Emory & Henry will visit to close out September before the Monarchs complete the regular season against the USA South. Homecoming on Oct. 20 will feature the Christopher Newport Captains before finishing the season at home on Nov. 10 against Shenandoah.

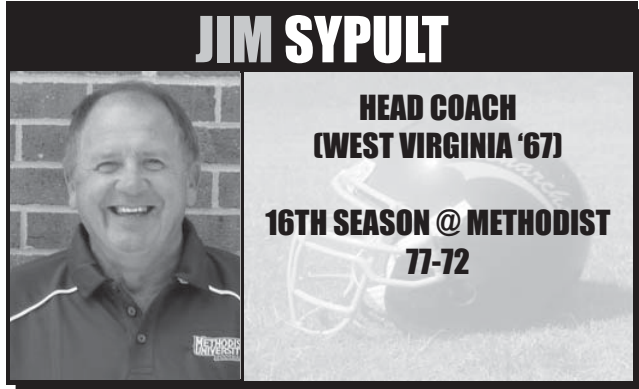

THE "DEAN" OF USA SOUTH ATHLETIC CONFERENCE HEAD FOOTBALL COACHES

Coach Jim Sypult begins his 16th season at Methodist University, a program that he has built into a consistent contender in the USA South Athletic Conference. "We have been very competitive for several years," Sypult said. "We haven't accomplished all of our goals and dreams yet. We still have work to do."

Sypult's philosophies helped garner a share of the 2005 conference championship, but he is not merely concerned with competing on the field. Sypult said "Our players are expected to be the best they can be: on the field, off the field, and in the classroom. In four years, we, as coaches, help them prepare for the next 40 years. They are the future. Coaches and teachers have a huge responsibility."

The victories keep accumulating; Sypult boasts a 77-72 record while finishing nine seasons at .500 or better. Methodist had only two wins in three years before Sypult was hired. In 1997, the Monarchs went 9-1, finishing the season ranked 20th in the country for Division III. The team finished 7-3 in both 2000 and 2004 before finishing at the top of the conference with Ferrum in 2005. "I am excited to be here and will stay as long as they allow me," Sypult said. "Coaching football is my passion."

Sypult, however, has moved away from the past and looks forward to a new year: "Every year is different. It is like a puzzle. We are searching for the right pieces. If everything falls into place, we can be very good in 2007. Methodist has all kinds of potential."

While Coach Sypult has been the head coach at Methodist, 11 Monarch athletes have earned NCAA Division III All-American honors while 28 players have been awarded first team All-Dixie Intercollegiate/USA South Athletic Conference honors. In addition, Sypult has helped to produce one DIAC Defensive Player of the Year and two DIAC/USA South Offensive Players of the Year. In 2000, Sypult was named the DIAC Coach of the Year.

Sypult credits his staff with much of his success: "I am blessed to have these men working with me. Coming to work is pure joy. Each coach has no ego; no chore is beneath him. They are a loyal and cohesive group of demanding and knowledgeable winners."

MONARCH COACHING STAFF

Originally from Fairmont, W.Va., Sypult was selected All-State in football and basketball at East Fairmont High School. He attended West Virginia University, starting two seasons at free safety and one season at wide receiver. In 1964, he helped take the Mountaineers to the Liberty Bowl and eventually was selected captain as a senior in 1966.

Coach Sypult played under a number of prominent coaches including Bobby Bowden (long-time Florida State Head Coach), Galen Hall (Penn State's Offensive Coordinator), Jim Carlen (former Head Coach at the University of South Carolina and Texas Tech) and Marshall Taylor (former Head Coach of the Shreveport Steamers of the old USFL).

Sypult spent a year as a graduate assistant coach at West Virginia while earning his master's degree in safety education. He coached high school for five years before moving to college coaching. In 1973, Sypult returned to his hometown as co-defensive coordinator at Division II Fairmont State and in 1974 moved to Middle Tennessee State as the defensive coordinator under Bill Peck and Ben Hurt.

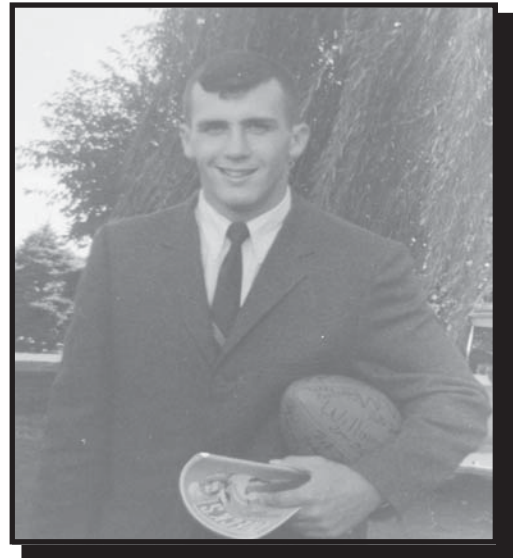
From 1979 to 1991, Sypult spent time as defensive coordinator and administrative assistant at Davidson College. During his time at Davidson, Sypult took a two-year hiatus to coach in Italy, taking a 2-12 team to the Super Bowl Playoffs.

Sypult attributes his own coaching development to the mentors he has had throughout his life. "I have had great people guide me," he said. "Every coach I had influenced me in a positive way. Joe Ross was my first coach in the 6th grade. Jim Priestler and Jimmy Cale in high school were great people as were all of my college coaches. Every young man should be as lucky as I am."

Sypult is married to Dr. Sharron Sypult, an associate professor in Journalism and Communications. The Sypults have one daughter, Jill Marcus, who owns a catering business in Charlotte; and two grandsons, Zachary (11) and Kyle (7).

Dave Eavenson, a graduate of Methodist College, enters his eighth year on the Monarch football staff as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. This is also his sixth season as Associate Head Coach.

Since returning to his alma mater, Eavenson has developed the Monarchs into one of the top offensive teams in the USA South Athletic Conference/Dixie Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. In 2005, Methodist produced 2,000 yards rushing in a season for the third straight year, and the Monarchs set individual records for single season yards rushing, passing completions and passing yards.

Throughout Eavenson's tenure, the Monarch offense has ranked consistently in the upper tier of the conference, and during the 2003 season they spent much of the season ranked in the Top 15 in the nation in rushing offense.

Prior to returning to Methodist, Eavenson coached for four seasons at Brockport State, a NCAA Division III school. Eavenson served the Golden Eagles as the defensive backs coach and was the recruiting coordinator.

Eavenson was a student assistant coach at Methodist from 1993-1996, coaching wide receivers during that period. He received his bachelor's degree from Methodist in 1996, and his master's degree from Brockport State in 1999. Eavenson and his wife Jennifer welcomed their first child (Tyler) this past summer.

Quote from Coach Syput: Dave is my right-hand man. He does everything before I think about it. In Dave's 11 years here, he has grown up with me at Methodist. He's a tremendous recruiter and extremely knowledgeable about offense. He recently became a father, and we are so excited for both Dave and Jen.

Carl Funderburk enters his sixth season on the Methodist coaching staff as the offensive line coach. A veteran of 11 seasons as an offensive line coach, Funderburk has made the Monarch offensive front one of the top offensive lines in the USA South Athletic Conference.

In the last five years, Funderburk has helped the Monarchs to limit the number of sacks allowed. In 2004, Methodist set a USA South mark for fewest sacks allowed in a season with four.

Individually, eight Monarch linemen have been selected All-USA South under Funderburk's direction. In addition, Jon Byrd, Billy DeLapp and Gary Futch have advanced to the professional ranks.

Funderburk joined the Methodist staff after a three-year stint as offensive line coach, recruiting coordinator and special teams coordinator at Bacone College in Muskogee, Okla. Prior to Bacone, Funderburk served as offensive line coach for two seasons at Kemper Junior College in Booneville, Mo.

A veteran of the United States Marine Corps, Funderburk received his bachelor's degree in history from Elon in 1989. Funderburk married Eileen Tully during the spring of 2007.

Quote from Coach Syput: Carl is an ex-Marine and coaches like an ex-Marine. He is extremely demanding, but he is extremely good, and his offensive linemen love him. Carl has great people skills as well. His thoughts on special teams are unique. Carl recently married Eileen on a cruise ship and we are so happy for them.

A coach with familiarity in the USA South Athletic Conference, Tyrone Jones begins his fourth season on the Monarch coaching staff. He will be in charge of the defensive line.

In 2005, three defensive backs were named to the USA South All-Conference second team. Jones' presence paid dividends for the Methodist defensive backfield in 2004. The Monarchs tied for the lead in the USA South with 13 interceptions.

Jones came to Methodist following two seasons at former USA South Athletic Conference rival Chowan. While at Chowan, the Temple Hills, Md., native was the defensive line coach under head coaches Lou Saban and Steve Gill. He also served as special teams coordinator.

Prior to returning to Chowan, Jones served as a graduate assistant at NCAA Division II Eastern New Mexico under head coach Harold "Bud" Elliott, where he helped lead the Greyhounds to two straight Lone Star Conference South Division Championships and berths in the NCAA Division II Playoffs.

A former standout defensive lineman at Chowan from 1993-1996, Jones received his bachelor's degree from Chowan and his master's degree from Eastern New Mexico. Jones holds both the school single-season and career records for quarterback sacks at Chowan. Jones has a three-year-old son named Christian.

Quote from Coach Sypult: Tyrone has an incredible work ethic. He never lets up until he gets perfection. As recruiting coordinator, he has a huge responsibility and is easily up to the task. Tyrone's son Christian is a mainstay in our offices. With Christian around, the coaches are "heads up."

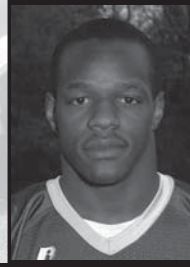

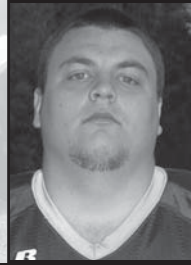

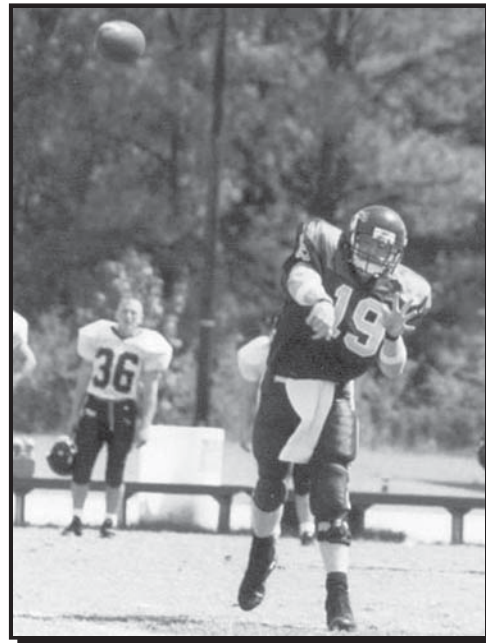

MONARCH FOOTBALL FACILITIES



Monarch Stadium, home of the Monarchs since the football program's infancy in 1989, serves as the center of our 600-acre campus for football, women's lacrosse and track and field. The stadium has a two-story press box and in 1999 added chair-back seating for 800 fans. An added feature for Monarch fans is the grassy hillside surrounding half of Monarch Stadium.

In the summer of 2000, Methodist resurfaced its track to a modern, rubberized surface. The track and field facility meets all NCAA standards and is one of the top outdoor facilities in NCAA Division III.

Prior to the birth of football at Methodist, the facility served as the home of the Methodist soccer program.

In addition to Monarch Stadium, the Methodist football program has the resource of the Methodist Football Fieldhouse (right), located approximately 75 yards from Monarch Stadium. It contains the locker room, weight room and equipment room.

METHODIST ADMINISTRATION



Dr. Elton Hendricks - President

In his 24 years as the president of Methodist College (now Methodist University), Dr. Elton Hendricks has nurtured the growth of the small, private school in Fayetteville, N.C. Under his guidance, enrollment has more than doubled, new curriculum and sports have been added and 11 new buildings and facilities have been built on campus. Through Dr. Hendricks' efforts, Methodist has become one of the fastest-growing private colleges in North Carolina and one of the premier small colleges in the Southeast.

Prior to assuming the presidency at Methodist in September of 1983, Dr. Hendricks served six years as Academic Dean at Randolph-Macon College in Ashland, Va. He also taught physics for four years – three at his alma mater, Wofford College in Spartanburg, S.C., and one year at Eisenhower College in Seneca Falls, N.Y., – and served two years as director of admissions at Wofford. From 1957-1961, Dr. Hendricks was a naval flight officer in the United States Navy.

Dr. Hendricks holds four degrees. He received his bachelor's degree in history from Wofford, his master's of divinity degree from Duke University, his doctorate in physics from the University of South Carolina and an honorary doctor of humanities degree from Wofford. Dr. Hendricks is an ordained elder in the United Methodist Church and preaches frequently throughout North Carolina. He and his wife Jerry have three grown children: Joyce Lynn, Leslie Patricia and George Elton. They also have three grandchildren.

Bob McEvoy - Athletic Director

Entering his tenth season as athletic director at Methodist University, Bob McEvoy has helped maintain a level of excellence in making Monarch athletics one of the top NCAA Division III programs in the nation. As athletic director, McEvoy is responsible for the overall management of Methodist's 19 varsity athletic teams.

During his tenure, the Monarchs have finished in the top 15 percent of the NCAA Division III United States Sports Academy Director's Cup All-Sports Trophy for seven of the last eight years. McEvoy has also served as vice president of the USA South Athletic Conference and recently completed his role of president for the 2006-07 athletic season. He is also on the National Committee for the NCAA Division III Men's Basketball Championships.

In addition to being Methodist's assistant athletic director from 1995-1998, McEvoy also served seven seasons as the men's head basketball coach from 1992 to 1999. During that period, the Monarchs rose from a struggling program to a championship-caliber program in the Dixie Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, in which he was a two-time DIAC Coach of the Year selection.

McEvoy's 1996-97 Methodist squad had the best season in program history, capturing the DIAC regular season and tournament championships and advancing to the "Elite Eight" of the NCAA Division III National Tournament with a 22-8 record after accumulating a 20-game win streak during the season.

Prior to his arrival at Methodist, McEvoy was the boy's head basketball at Cape Fear High School in Fayetteville following a seven-year stint as men's head basketball coach UNC-Greensboro. McEvoy was part of the Spartans' rise from NCAA Division III to NCAA Division I status, and he led UNC-Greensboro to back-to-back DIAC championships in 1987 and 1988.

Other coaching stops for McEvoy at the collegiate level include two years as Athletic Director and men's head basketball coach at Mount Olive College, two years as assistant men's basketball coach at UNC-Pembroke and one season as a graduate assistant at East Carolina University.

McEvoy earned his bachelor's degree from Kent State in 1973; he lettered three seasons in basketball for the Golden Flashes. McEvoy was team captain as a senior and was selected once as honorable mention All-Mid-American Conference. He received his master's degree in education from East Carolina. Bob and his wife Pam have two children – Michael, a recent Methodist graduate, and Lindsey, a senior volleyball player at Meredith College in Raleigh, N.C.



USA SOUTH ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

The USA South Athletic Conference might be one of the newest names in Division III athletics, but that doesn't mean the 11-team conference is new on the scene. One of the oldest Division III conferences in the nation, the USA South was born as the Dixie Intercollegiate Athletic Conference in 1963 when six institutions with similar philosophies of academics and athletics joined as founding members. Those colleges were Charlotte College (now UNC-Charlotte), College of Charleston (S.C.), Methodist College (now Methodist University), North Carolina Wesleyan College, St. Andrews Presbyterian College, and Lynchburg College. The basis for the new athletic conference was that participation would be strictly amateur, and thus no athletically awarded financial aid or athletic scholarships would be awarded. That philosophy still exists today.

In February 2003, it was announced that the Dixie Intercollegiate Athletic Conference would change its name to the USA South Athletic Conference. The name change was made official on July 1, 2003, and the first USA South Athletic Conference championships were awarded in the fall of that year.

The Conference was originally affiliated with the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and remained with that affiliation until 1973. At that time the NCAA divided into three legislative and competitive divisions, with Division III allowing membership for non-athletic scholarship institutions only. The Dixie joined the NCAA, and in so doing, became one of the first conferences accepted into Division III. Since the inception of Division III, the USA South has been a leader in many areas and has gained an outstanding regional and national reputation in a number of sports.

The Conference sponsored athletic programs for men only until 1981. In that year, the NCAA expanded its sponsorship to include women's sports, and the Dixie followed that lead by including women's sports. The Conference now sponsors championships in men's and women's cross country, men's and women's soccer, women's volleyball, football, men's and women's basketball, baseball, softball, men's and women's tennis, golf and women's lacrosse for a total of 14 sports.

Each year the Conference not only recognizes the participants for outstanding athletic achievements, but academic excellence as well. Student athletes who maintain academic averages of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale in both academic semesters are named to the Academic All-Conference team. This group annually averages well over 500 students.

Each year, the President's Cup is awarded to the school that accumulates the most points throughout the academic year in sports that are sponsored by the USA South. Points are awarded on a scale from 1-8 with each regular season conference champion receiving one point for every school sponsoring that sport. In 2004-05, the President's Cup was changed to have one winner for men's sports and one winner for women's. After a one-year hiatus, an overall men's and women's award returned. Christopher Newport won this overall award in 2006-07.

Presently, the Conference features 11 institutions, five in Virginia, five in North Carolina and one in Tennessee. The Tennessee institution, Maryville College, became a competing member of the Conference in the fall of 2005 as a football-only member. Averett University, Christopher Newport University, Ferrum College, Greensboro College, Mary Baldwin College, Meredith College, Peace College and Shenandoah University have joined Methodist and N.C. Wesleyan to make up today's Conference membership.



MONARCH ATHLETIC TRAINING



Brandon Reynolds is entering his ninth year at Methodist University and his sixth as the Head Athletic Trainer. Reynolds came to Methodist in the fall of 1998 as an assistant athletic trainer. He also serves as an assistant professor in both the Athletic Training and Exercise Science Programs. Reynolds works primarily with the football and women's lacrosse teams and oversees all athletic training services for Methodist University.

Prior to joining the Methodist University Athletic Training Staff he was a Graduate Assistant Athletic Trainer at Northwestern State University in Natchitoches, La. where he completed his Masters of Education in Health Promotion in May of 1998. He graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree from Bridgewater College in May of 1996.

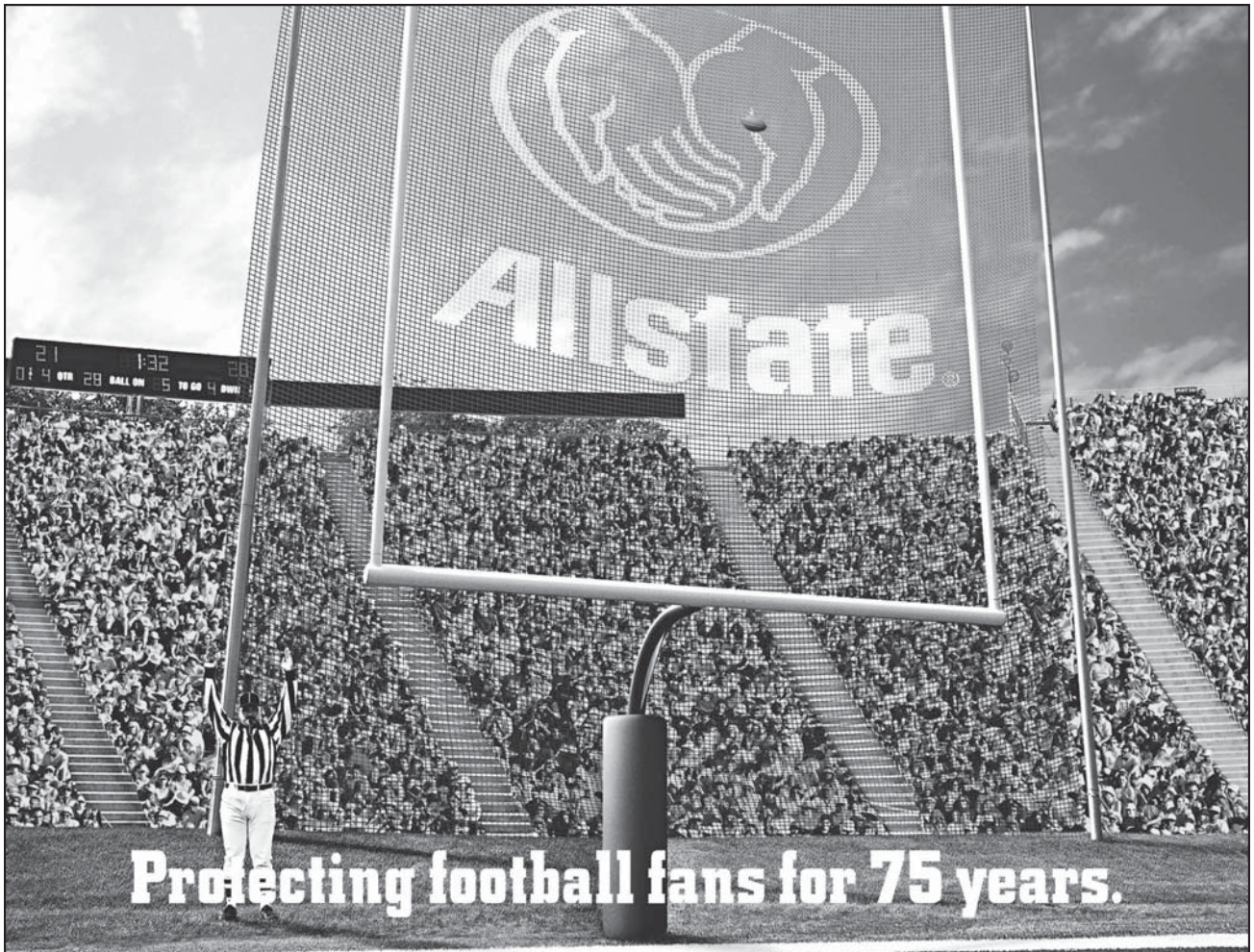
