March F. Riddle Center



"Home of the Lady Monarchs"

The home of the Methodist Lady Monarch basketball program is the March F. Riddle Physical Activities Center. The facility, which totals 46,000 feet, was built in 1990. It houses the gymnasium, a racquetball court, six locker rooms, two classrooms, a conference room, a weight room, a laundry room, two athletic training facilities and offices for the Methodist athletics department.

The Riddle Center replaced the fabled "Tin Can," where the Monarchs played from 1963-1990.

The weight room, located in the basement of the facility, contains Nautilus machines as well as free weights. Five certified athletic trainers and their staff enjoy their close proximity to the playing floor. The first class locker rooms provide dressing and shower facilities for varsity teams as well as a study area with game footage review capabilities. Its climate-controlled heating and air-conditioning system provided year-round comfort.

The gymnasium, which was dedicated on October 20, 1990, accommodates 1,200 fans for athletic events and more than 2,000 each spring for graduation ceremonies. The first basketball games took place on Jan. 23, 1990.

Through the years, the March F. Riddle Center has been the site of many postseason basketball tournaments. The facility played host to the Dixie Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Men's Basketball Tournaments in both 1995 and in 2002. In the 2003 season, the DIAC Women's Basketball Tournament was the big draw at the Riddle Center. In addition, the Riddle Center also played host to the 1997 NCAA Division III National Tournament Men's South Regional and the 2004 USA South Athletic Conference Volleyball Tournament.

METHODIST ADMINISTRATION



Dr. Elton Hendricks - President

In his 25 years as the president of Methodist University, Dr. Elton Hendricks has nurtured the growth of the small, private school in Fayetteville, N.C. Under his guidance, enrollment has more than doubled, new curriculum and sports have been added and 11 new buildings and facilities have been built on campus. Through Dr. Hendricks' efforts, Methodist has become one of the fastest-growing private colleges in North Carolina and one of the premier small colleges in the Southeast.

Prior to assuming the presidency at Methodist in September of 1983, Dr. Hendricks served six years as Academic Dean at Randolph-Macon College in Ashland, Va. He also taught physics for four years – three at his alma mater, Wofford College in Spartanburg, S.C., and one year at Eisenhower College in Seneca Falls, N.Y., and served two years as director of admissions at Wofford. From 1957-1961, Dr. Hendricks was a naval flight officer in the United States Navy.

Dr. Hendricks holds four degrees. He received his bachelor's degree in history from Wofford, his master's of divinity degree from Duke University, his doctorate in physics from the University of South Carolina and an honorary doctor of humanities degree from Wofford. Dr. Hendricks is an ordained elder in the United Methodist Church and preaches frequently throughout North Carolina. He and his wife Jerry have three grown children: Joyce Lynn, Leslie Patricia and George Elton. They also have three grandchildren.

Bob McEvoy - Athletic Director

Entering his 11th season as athletic director at Methodist University, Bob McEvoy has helped maintain a level of excellence in making Monarch athletics one of the top NCAA Division III programs in the nation. As athletic director, McEvoy is responsible for the overall management of Methodist's 19 varsity athletic teams.

During his tenure, the Monarchs have finished in the top 15 percent of the NCAA Division III United States Sports Academy Director's Cup All-Sports Trophy for seven of the last eight years. McEvoy has also served as vice president of the USA South Athletic Conference and recently completed his role of president for the 2006-07 athletic season. He is also on the National Committee for the NCAA Division III Men's Basketball Championships.

In addition to being Methodist's assistant athletic director from 1995-1998, McEvoy also served seven seasons as the men's head basketball coach from 1992 to 1999. During that period, the Monarchs rose from a struggling program to a championship-caliber program in the Dixie Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, in which he was a two-time DIAC Coach of the Year selection.

McEvoy's 1996-97 Methodist squad had the best season in program history, capturing the DIAC regular season and tournament championships and advancing to the "Elite Eight" of the NCAA Division III National Tournament with a 22-8 record after accumulating a 20-game win streak during the season.

Prior to his arrival at Methodist, McEvoy was the boy's head basketball at Cape Fear High School in Fayetteville following a seven-year stint as men's head basketball coach UNC-Greensboro. McEvoy was part of the Spartans' rise from NCAA Division III to NCAA Division I status, and he led UNC-Greensboro to back-to-back DIAC championships in 1987 and 1988.

Other coaching stops for McEvoy at the collegiate level include two years as Athletic Director and men's head basketball coach at Mount Olive College, two years as assistant men's basketball coach at UNC-Pembroke and one season as a graduate assistant at East Carolina University.

McEvoy earned his bachelor's degree from Kent State in 1973; where he lettered three seasons in basketball for the Golden Flashes. McEvoy was team captain as a senior and was selected once as honorable mention All-Mid-American Conference. He received his master's degree in education from East Carolina. Bob and his wife, Pam, have two children – Michael, a recent Methodist graduate, and Lindsey, a student at Meredith College in Raleigh, N.C.

Credentials

Although the Methodist Sports Information Office does not issue formal media credentials, it is still required that members of the media contact Kirbie Britt, Sports Information Director, at least a day in advance of the game if they plan to be present. All media will be admitted by showing the proper credential of its media outlet.

Telephones

There are two telephone lines located on press box row. They are first-come, first-serve use only. Any opponent that uses radio broadcasts is required to contact sports information director Kirbie Britt at least three days in advance of the game.

Statistics/Services

Methodist will provide complete game statistics, including play-by-play, half-time flash stats, complete postgame statistics and, if needed, coach's quotes. These statistics are normally distributed at half-time and following the game. Additional requests can be easily accommodated. Statistics are delivered to the radio booths throughout the game.

Postgame Interviews

After a 10-minute cool-down period, the Methodist players and coaches will be available outside the Lady Monarch locker room. The locker room is off limits to the media.

Photographers

Photographers shooting the game for their respected media outlet are free to use the in-line area behind each basket for the best photo opportunities.

Practice Attendance

Methodist basketball practices are open to members of the media, but we request that you call in advance to set up any and all interviews with coaches and players. Players will not be available for interviews on game day until after the game.

Player/Coach Interviews

Methodist players are available for interviews at their convenience. Please request interviews with a minimum 24-hour notice. All interviews are to be directed through the Methodist Sports Information Office. All interviews with head coach DeeDee Jarman should be arranged through the Methodist Sports Information Office.

2008-09 SEASON PREVIEW

Last Season's Taste of Success Not Enough for Returning Lady Monarchs

The 2008-09 Methodist women's basketball team hopes for continued success this season. The returning players had a taste of success finishing second in the USA South, but it has just left them wanting more.

Head coach DeeDee Jarman has a squad with nine letterwinners returning working towards a conference championship. Nine newcomers join the Monarchs, picked fourth in the 2008 USA South Preseason Poll. Last season the team finished 19-8 overall while playing to a 14-4 record in the conference.

Four of the top six scorers return including returning starters Zan Messer and Dezzire Gilliard, but all of the returners were able to gain valuable experience last season. "All were contributors, but I'm looking for everyone to add even more to their game," said Jarman.

Seniors Amanda Underwood and Kristen Whitehurst will join Messer and Gilliard for a class of four seniors. "The seniors are anticipating a lot from this year," Jarman noted. "They have set the tone in practice that they won't settle for less. They want the conference championship."

Messer and junior Michaela Myers will typically run the

point for the Monarchs. This season they could both be on the court at the same time for a more offensive threat. Jarman has confidence with both players acknowledging the intensity they add to the team.

Sophomore Adriana Wilson and Underwood will add to the guard core. "We will still be a team that is a threat from the 3-point line," Jarman added.

The Monarchs have three returners at the post position. In addition to Gilliard and Whitehurst, sophomore Dawn Sanderson should be an impact player this season. "Dawn worked hard in the offseason," Jarman said. "Dezzire continues to be an offensive contributor and Kristen will continue to be a threat inside. Freshman Jordan Tyson is learning the system and perfecting the post moves."

The wealth of newcomers will add to the team's depth as they grow during the season. Defending USA South champion Greensboro College, was picked at the top of the preseason poll, but a number of teams could be contending for the championship. "The USA South is going to be a tight race," commented Jarman. "Some teams are being overlooked, but it should be one of the most competitive seasons we've seen in awhile."

On the sidelines with Jarman will be her valuable assistant, Cheryl McNair. "Once again consistency and stability in an

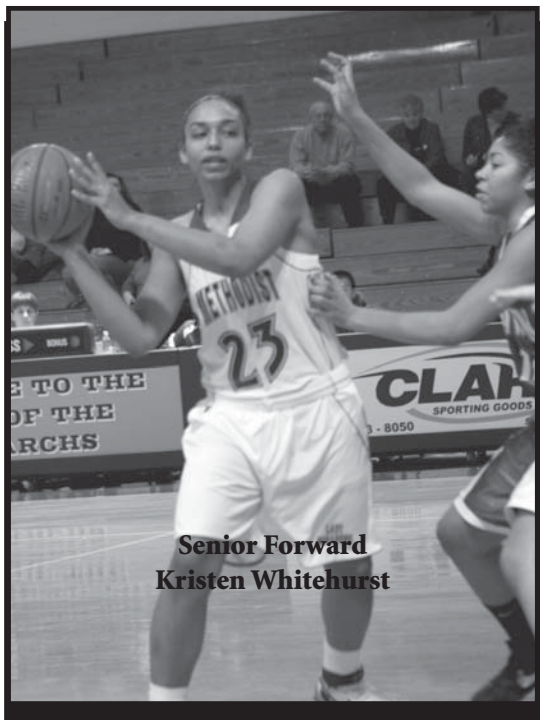

assistant makes our program strong," Jarman said. "Her hardwork in the offseason pays off in our recruiting. During the season the time and energy she devotes to developing players allows them to step in and contribute during their freshman season."

The 2008-09 season features a tough non-conference schedule to prepare the Monarchs for the USA South Athletic Conference. The Monarchs will play seven games during the fall semester before opening USA South Conference play Jan. 3 at Mary Baldwin.

WINNINGEST HEAD COACH IN THE HISTORY OF METHODIST WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

In recent seasons, the Methodist University women's basketball program has reached new heights, and a majority of that success is a credit to head coach DeeDee Jarman. The native of Kinston, N.C., enters her 12th season at the helm of the Lady Monarchs, and her 14th season overall at Methodist. Jarman is also in her 10th year as the Senior Women's Administrator for the Methodist athletic department, and in July 2004, she added Associate Athletic Director to her duties.

In her 11 seasons as head coach, Jarman has amassed a 176-120 record, making her the winningest head coach in the history of Methodist women's basketball. Her Lady Monarch teams have averaged 16 victories a season, and her winning percentage of .595 ranks second amongst any Lady Monarch head coach.

It's the postseason where Jarman has really made her mark in the USA South Athletic Conference. Her Lady Monarchs have advanced to the championship game of the conference tournament in six of her 11 seasons as head coach.

Jarman, who garnered the Dixie Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1999-00, has led her squads to at least a share of three consecutive DIAC regular-season championships, two DIAC Tournament championships and advanced to the NCAA Division III National Tournament twice. Additionally, Jarman directed the Lady Monarchs to a 24-home game winning streak, a streak that spanned three seasons and broke the school record for most consecutive home wins.

The 2001-02 season saw the Lady Monarchs earn the school's first-ever NCAA Division III National Tournament appearance as they earned the DIAC's automatic bid by winning the DIAC Tournament as the third-seeded team. The 2002-03 team overcame a rough start to win their last seven games in the regular season, and then repeat as DIAC Tournament champions as the fifth-seeded team to gain another NCAA Division III National Tournament bid.

During the 2004-05 season, with arguably the youngest team in her tenure, Jarman led a squad that included nine freshmen to the championship game of the USA South Athletic Conference Tournament. That team, which was seeded sixth entering the tournament, upset higher-seeded teams Christopher Newport and Ferrum before falling in a valiant effort to Greensboro in the title game.

Methodist's best season during Jarman's tenure was an impressive 21-5 in the 1999-2000 season. Under her watch, 24 players have received their degrees from Methodist, nine players have garnered All-Conference honors and two have won DIAC Tournament Most Valuable Player awards.

Before taking over the head coaching duties for the 1997-98 campaign, Jarman spent two years as the assistant coach to 11-year Methodist mentor and current USA South Athletic Conference Commissioner Rita Wiggs.

Prior to coming to Methodist, Jarman served as the head women's basketball coach at New Bern (N.C.) High School from 1993-95. During that time, her squads registered a 32-16 record (.667). The Lady Bears advanced to the 1994 Big East Conference Tournament championship game and the NCHSAA (North Carolina High School Athletic Association) Sectional semifinals.

Six of Jarman's New Bern players earned All-Conference status. She compiled eight seasons as both an assistant and a head coach at the high school level.

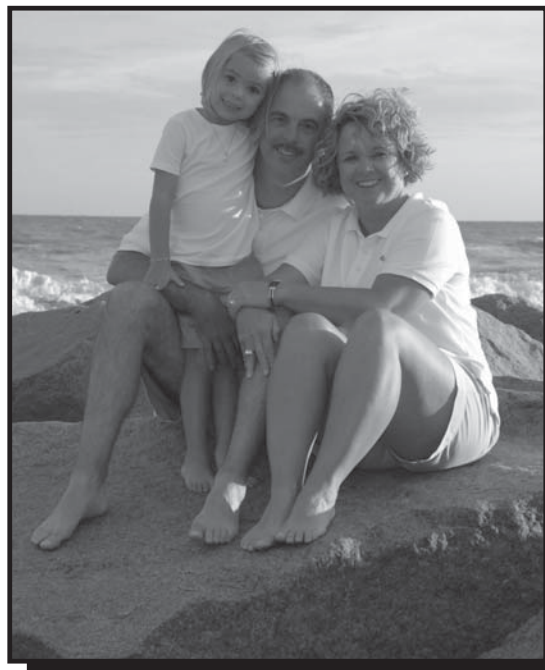
Jarman earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in health and physical education from UNC-Wilmington in 1989, as well as an associate's degree from Mount Olive College, where she played basketball and softball for two years. In the spring of 2003, she earned her Master of Science degree in administration from Central Michigan University.

In September of 2007, Jarman was inducted to the North Lenoir High School Hall of Fame as part of their inaugural class.

Jarman and her husband, Errol, welcomed a daughter, Dawson Michele, to the family on June 2, 2004.



Under the direction of head coach DeeDee Jarman, the Methodist Lady Monarchs have won three Dixie Intercollegiate Athletic Conference regular season championships, two DIAC Tournament championships and have earned two NCAA Division III National Tournament berths.

A mainstay on head coach DeeDee Jarman's coaching staff, Cheryl McNair begins her 12th season as an assistant women's basketball coach at Methodist. With the consistency in this position, McNair provides an abundant amount of knowledge of the game along with enthusiasm and stability. Her presence has become a large part of the program's success over the past decade.

As an assistant, McNair is involved in every aspect of the Lady Monarch program. Her primary duties are implementing the Lady Monarch offensive attack, the breakdown of opponent film and scouting report and on-court coaching. She is at the front line in the recruitment of guards and recently developed a new Lady Monarch website to enhance the recruitment of quality student-athletes. McNair also manages the Lady Monarch Formula, an incentive program for game performance.

Prior to arriving at Methodist in 1997, McNair coached two Brentwood Booster Club Association youth basketball teams for the Cumberland County Parks and Recreation Department.

A native of Fayetteville, N.C., McNair is a 1994 graduate of St. Andrews College in Laurinburg, N.C., with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Allied Health and she was also selected to the Dean's List. McNair lettered four seasons as a guard for the Knights. McNair currently works as a physical therapist technician at Fayetteville Therapy Services.

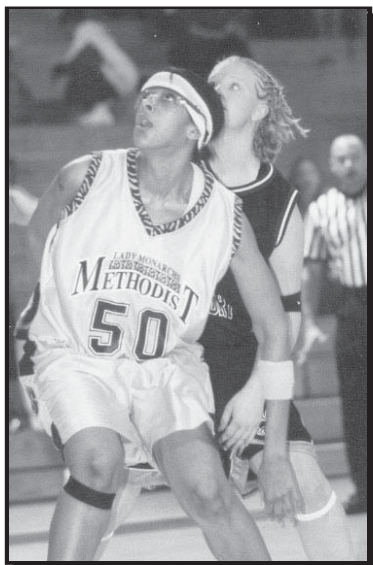

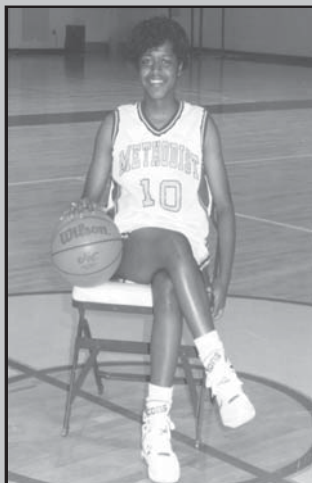

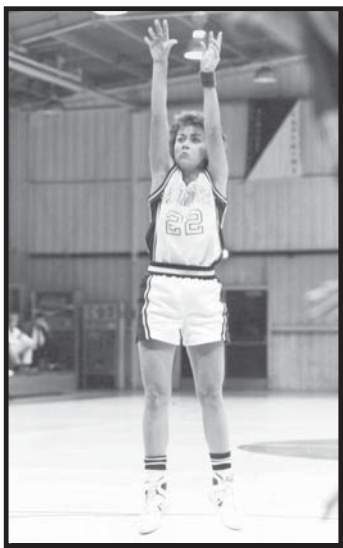

USA SOUTH ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

The USA South Athletic Conference might be one of the newest names in Division III athletics, but that doesn't mean the 11-team conference is new on the scene. One of the oldest Division III conferences in the nation, the USA South was born as the Dixie Intercollegiate Athletic Conference in 1963 when six institutions with similar philosophies of academics and athletics joined as founding members. Those colleges were: Charlotte College (now UNC-Charlotte), College of Charleston (S.C.), Methodist College (now Methodist University), North Carolina Wesleyan College, St. Andrews Presbyterian College, and Lynchburg College. The basis for the new athletic conference was that participation would be strictly amateur, and thus no athletically awarded financial aid or athletic scholarships would be awarded. That philosophy still exists today.

In February 2003, it was announced that the Dixie Intercollegiate Athletic Conference would change its name to the USA South Athletic Conference. The name change was made official on July 1, 2003 and the first USA South Athletic Conference championships were awarded in the fall of that year.

The Conference was originally affiliated with the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and remained with that affiliation until 1973. At that time the NCAA divided into three legislative and competitive divisions, with Division III allowing membership for non-athletic scholarship institutions only. The Dixie joined the NCAA, and in so doing, became one of the first conferences accepted into Division III. Since the inception of Division III, the USA South has been a leader in many areas, and has gained an outstanding regional and national reputation in a number of sports.

The Conference sponsored athletic programs for men only until 1981. In that year, the NCAA expanded its sponsorship to include women's sports, and the Dixie followed that lead by including women's sports. The Conference now sponsors championships in men's and women's cross country, men's and women's soccer, women's volleyball, football, men's and women's basketball, baseball, softball, men's and women's tennis, golf and women's lacrosse for a total of 14 sports.

Each year the Conference not only recognizes the participants for outstanding athletic achievements, but academic excellence as well. Student athletes who maintain academic averages of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale in both academic semesters are named to the Academic All-Conference team. This group annually averages well over 500 students.

Each year, the President's Cup is awarded to the school that accumulates the most points throughout the academic year in sports that are sponsored by the USA South. Points are awarded on a scale from 1-8 with each regular season conference champion receiving one point for every school

sponsoring that sport. In 2004-05, the President's Cup was changed to have one winner for men's sports and one winner for women's. After a one-year hiatus, an overall men's and women's award returned. Christopher Newport won this overall award in 2007-08.

Presently, the Conference features 11 institutions, five in Virginia, five in North Carolina and one in Tennessee. The Tennessee institution, Maryville College, became a competing member of the Conference in the fall of 2005 as a football only member. Averett University, Christopher Newport University, Ferrum College, Greensboro College, Mary Baldwin College, Meredith College, Peace College and Shenandoah University have joined Methodist and N.C. Wesleyan to make up today's Conference membership.
