Bill Arliss, Men's Golf, 1989-92

First Team All-American in 1991 and a first team all-conference winner in 1990 ... helped the golf team win three NCAA National Championships.

Greg Bailey, Track & Field, 2008-11

8-time national qualifier ... 4-time All-American ... 3 school records (*as of June 2022* – 200m indoor and outdoor, 4x100m relay outdoor) ... 5-time conference champion and 1st-team all-conference ... 3-time 2nd-team all-conference and 2-time 3rd-team ... 2011 Mason Dixon Conference outdoor track athlete of year.

Tyrone Bennett, Men's Basketball, 1993-97

Three-year starter at center... Helped lead Methodist to a 22-8 mark in the 1996-97 season, including the conference regular season and tournament championships and "Elite Eight" appearance in the NCAA Division III National Tournament... Ranks third all-time at Methodist in blocked shots and fourth in rebounds... Two-time All-Conference selection.

Ruby Blackwell, Track & Field, 2010-12

3-time NCAA champion (outdoor) – 200m (2010 and 2011), 4x400 relay (2011) ... 7-time national qualifier ... 6-time All-American ... 4 school records (*as of June 2022* – 200m indoor and outdoor, 400m indoor, 4x400 relay indoor) ... 14-time conference champion and 1st-team all-conference ... 2-time 2nd-team all-conference ... 2011 USTFCCA women's track athlete of year ... 2010 Mason Dixon Conference indoor track athlete of year.

Nick Bova, Men's Golf, 2004-08

Three-Time First-Team All-American (2005-06, 2008) ... Two-Time USA South Player of the Year (2007-08) ... Three-Time First-Team All-USA South selection (06-08), Second-Team all-conference once (2005) ... member of four USA South conference championship teams ... tied for 14th at the 2005 NCAA Championships, 5th in 2006 and T-10th in 2008.

Jonathan Byrd, Football, 2001-05

Two-time second team all-conference selection (03, 04) ... named to USA South 50th Anniversary Team.

Paige Caldwell, Women's Golf, 2008-11

Three-time All-American (2009-2nd team, 2010-1st team, 2011-1st team) ... Individual national champion (2011) ... Won five of her 10 tournaments during her senior year, tied for the most in a single season in program history.

Kelsie (Carralero) Warren, Women's Golf, 2011-14

Four-time All-American (2011-2nd team, 2012-1st, 2013-HM, 2014-2nd) ... National All-Scholar Team (2013, 2014) ... Ninth lowest career scoring average (78.49) in program history. Second most individual victories (7) in program history.

Leon Clark, Football, 1993-96

1996 College Football Chronicle Honorable Mention "Unsung Hero" National Award Winner...1996 Arthur Ashe Jr. Scholar-Athlete Award Winner...One of only six players in school history to score a defensive touchdown off of a fumble recovery.

Melody Dark, Women's Basketball, 1999-02

Played three seasons after transferring from UNC-Pembroke ... helped lead the team to two conference championships and one NCAA Appearance... Named first team all-conference in 2000-01 ... Methodist's career (148) and single-season leader (64) in blocked shots ... Led the team in scoring (10.7 ppg) and rebounding (8.0 rpg) in 2000-01.

Dorian Droege, Women's Tennis, 1989-92

Three-time first team all-conference pick in singles (1989, 1990, 1991) and a three-time selection in doubles (1990, 1991, 1992) ... registered then-records of 62 singles wins (still in the top-10) and 56 doubles victories (records not broken for 16 years) ... Played No. 1 singles and doubles while leading teams to conference championships in 1989, 1990, 1991 and 1992 ... led team into the NCAA tournament in 1990 and 1991 ... Named in 2014 to the USA South Athletic Conference 50th Anniversary Women's Tennis Team.

Kaitlin Flaherty, Women's Tennis, 2008-11

Two-time USA South Women's Tennis Player of the Year (2009, 2010) and the 2008 USA South Women's Tennis Rookie of the Year ... Four-time First Team All-USA South ... helped lead the Monarchs to four regular season conference championships, three conference tournament championships and three NCAA appearances ... First all-time in doubles win (75) ... Third all-time in singles win (74) ... Third all-time in doubles winning percentage (75-13/.852).

Chris Fletcher, Men's Tennis, 2005-08

2008 First-Team All-American ... Four-Time First Team All-USA South (04-08) ... part of three USA South conference championship teams and one NCAA Championship appearance (2007) ... tied for eighth in program history with 43 career singles wins and ranks seventh in win percentage (74.1%) ... sits sixth with 42 career doubles wins.

Harry Flipping, Men's Basketball, 1972-74

Started two seasons at Methodist for head coach Gene Clayton following two seasons at Chowan... Started and excelled at center despite being only 6-foot-1... Most Valuable Player of the 1973 Conference Tournament after leading the Monarchs to the championship.

Dan Glies, Baseball, 2000-2003

Second team All-American (2002) ... USA South player of the year (2002), and rookie of the year (2000) ... Two-time all-region selection ... First team all-conference (2000, 2001, 2002), second team all-conference (2003) ... Second in program history in career total bases (360, third in hits (243) ... Third in program history for single-season batting average (.439) and fifth in hits (79).

James Green, Men's Basketball, 1980-84

A four-year letterwinner and four-year starter at Methodist under head coach Joe Miller... A two-time All-Conference selection... Holds the Methodist record for most career field goals with 715... Also ranked second all-time in points scored and seventh in steals.

Melissa Hay, Cheerleading/STUNT, 2005-12

Coached squad to pair of conference championships (2009, 2011) ... 3rd place at NCA College Nationals Division II Intermediate Division ... started STUNT at MU and hosted inaugural STUNT Game (vs. UNC) in 2011 ... established many of the pre-game traditions still used today.

Amy Hoke, Women's Golf, 1993

NCAA Individual Champion and First-Team All-American in 1993.

Gayna (Holcomb) Paul, Cheerleading, 2003-06

2006 Collegiate All-Girl Stunt Group Champion at Canam Nationals ... 2005 All-Girl Partner Stunt Champions at COA Nationals ... 2004 All-Girl Partner Stunt Champion at Canam Nationals ... 2004 All-Girl Partner Stunt Champion at COA Nationals

Sammy Hudson, Men's Golf, 1993-96

1993 Conference Champion...Earned All-American honors in 1994...Member of three NCAA Division III National Championship teams... Member of four conference championship teams ... two-time first team all-conference

Jamie Hurless, Men's Golf, 1993-96

One-time All-American...1994 Gordin Classic Champion...Member of three NCAA Division III National Championship teams...Member of four conference championship teams.

Rich Jinnette, Football, 1990-92

First football player to receive All-American honors in Methodist football history... Named Second Team All-American by Champion as Return Specialist... Holds record for punt returns season yardage (433) as well as season and career touchdowns (2)... Also ranks fourth in career punt return yardage (441).

Ruth Keegan, Women's Soccer, 1992-95

Second Team All-American (D) in 1995 as MU advanced to the NCAA Championship game ... 1995 Conference Player of the Year and a four-time First Team All-Conference pick ... part of three conference championship teams that made three NCAA appearances ... 1995 NCAA Final Four All-Tournament Team.

Glen Kitner, Men's Tennis, 2000-03

First-Team All-USA South selection at No. 1 singles (2002) ... Second-Team All-USA South at No. 2 doubles (2002), No. 2 singles and No. 1 doubles (2003) ... part of three league championship teams.

Keri LaSalla, Women's Soccer, 2000-03

Third Team All-American as a goalkeeper in 2003 with a GAA of 1.03 and six shutouts ... Three-time First Team All-Conference ... Methodist career leader in saves (401), second all-time in shutouts (27) and third in goals-against average (0.98) ... led MU to 2003 regular season conference championship.

Daryl Lawrence, Football, 2004-07

2007 USA South Defensive Player of the Year at linebacker ... Two-time first team all-conference selection ... Fourth all-time at Methodist in tackles (296).

Emily Lewis Van Vliet, Women's Tennis, 76-78

Member of 1977 squad that finished season ranked No. 5 in NCAA Division III.

Jena (Mammon) Morcelle, Cheerleading, 2003-05

2005 All-Girl Partner Stunt Champions at COA Nationals ... 2004 All-Girl Partner Stunt Champion at Canam Nationals ... 2004 All-Girl Partner Stunt Champion at COA Nationals.

Heather Martin, Women's Golf, 04-07

Helped lead the MU women's golf team to four NCAA Championships ... earned one First Team, two Second Team and one Honorable Mention All-America awards.

Fernando Martinez, Men's Soccer, 88-91

Outstanding soccer career during the "Alan Dawson Years" contributing with regards to assists... Two-time All-Conference selection... Ranks in the top ten for season assists, season points, career goals (ranked third), career assists (ranked second), and career points (ranked third).

Kathi (Mason) Calloway, Cheerleading, 2002-07

2006 Collegiate All-Girl Stunt Group Champion at Canam Nationals ... 2005 All-Girl Partner Stunt Champions at COA Nationals ... 2004 All-Girl Partner Stunt Champion at Canam Nationals ... 2004 All-Girl Partner Stunt Champion at COA Nationals.

Jennifer Maurer, Women's Soccer, 1993-96

Second Team All-American in 1995 (GK) as MU advanced to the NCAA Championship game ... Three-time First Team All-Conference (1993, 1995, 1996) and a second team pick in 1994 ... MU career leader in victories (53), shutouts (41), and goals against average (0.66) ... Her 18 wins in 1995 are the most victories in a single-season... 15 shutouts in 1993 is tied for the most in a single-season in school history... Her 0.28 goal against average, in 1993, is the second-lowest in a single-season at MU... 1995 NCAA Final Four All-Tournament Team.

Michelle Meadows, Women's Golf, 1999-2003

Two-time First-Team All-American (2002, 03) and Second-Team All-American (2001) ... 2003 NGCA Division III Player of the Year ... part of four NCAA Championship teams.

Jordan (Mercer) Murray, Cheerleading, 2004-08

2006 Collegiate All-Girl Stunt Group Champion at Canam Nationals ... 2005 All-Girl Partner Stunt Champions at COA Nationals ... 2004 All-Girl Partner Stunt Champion at Canam Nationals ... 2004 All-Girl Partner Stunt Champion at COA Nationals

Kim Miller, Volleyball, 1991-94

Three-time First-Team All-DIAC (1992, 1993, 1994), and second team in 1991 ... Fourth in program history with 1,241 career digs, and sixth in assists with 1,661.

Brittanie Morris, Track & Field, 2011-12

5-time national qualifier ... 4 school records (*as of June 2022* – 60m hurdles indoor, 400m hurdles outdoor, 4x400 relay indoor and outdoor) ... 10-time conference champion and 1st-team all-conference ... 2-time 3rd-team all-conference.

Britt Morton, Football, 1991-94

Top defensive player for the Monarchs in the early 90s... Ranked fourth in season sacks with 8.5 in 1994... Third team All-American as a senior in 1994.

Phil Mullen, Baseball, 1971-75

1972 Honorable Mention All-Conference...1973 first team All-Conference...1973 Most Valuable Player...Signed professional baseball contract with Chicago White Sox...1980 Massey Hill Teacher of the Year...First director of NCPTA (North Carolina Pupil Transportation Association)... Piloted TIMS computerized transportation system for state of North Carolina...Member of Cumberland County Parks & Recreation Advisory Board.

Joe Myrtle, Baseball, 1990-1993

Third team All-American (1991) ... Third team CoSIDA Academic All-American (1993) ... Two-time all-region selection (1991 & 1993) ... First team all-conference (1991, 1992, 1993), second team all-conference (1990).

Jim Nickerson, Men's Golf, 1992-95

2-time All-American...Member of three Conference Championship teams...Member of three NCAA Division III National Championship teams.

Jennifer Patrick-Swift, Softball, 2001-04

First team all-conference in 2003 and 2004, second team in 2002 ... MU career leader in triples (21), total bases (304) and put-outs (1,159), and also ranks in the top seven in hits, doubles, batting average, home runs and RBIs ... MU single-season leader in put-outs (290), second in triples (8), and fourth in hits (62) and runs (46).

Jim Percherke, Men's Golf, 1987-90

1990 Conference Champion...Member of school's first-ever men's golf national championship team...1990 Academic All-American...1990 All-American.

Sam Porter, Men's Basketball, 2003-05

Only played two years at MU, but was a two-time first team all-conference selection ... named the USA South Player of the Year in 2004-05 ... Holds the fifth-best single-season number at 291.

Max Reber, Football, 2011-14

Two-time first-team All-USA South (2013, 2014), second team in 2012 ... two-time MU Sykes Cup awardee (2014, 2015) ... Career program leader in passing yards (8,868) and TDs (81) ... single-season program leader in passing yards (2,998 in '13)... also owns No. 4 and No. 6 single-season totals in passing yards ... owns single-game program passing record in TDs (6, twice in '14) ... tenth in program for career rushing yards (1,456), and was teams leading rusher (644 yds.) in 2013 season.

Dennis Roberts, Multi-Sport, 1981-85

A rare three-sport letterwinner at Methodist in men's basketball, men's soccer and men's track and field... Played point guard in basketball, sweeper in soccer and threw the javelin in track and field... Holds the single-season Methodist men's basketball record for assists and is ranked third all-time at Methodist in assists.

Anna Rodriguez, Women's Golf, 1992-95

Helped lead the team to four National Championships ... was a three-time First Team All-American.

Josh Schrader, Men's Golf, 2008-10

Three-time First-Team All-American (2008, 2009, 2010) ... 2010 USA South Individual Conference Champion ... 2009 USA South Player of the Year ... Three-time First-Team All-USA South (2008, 2009, 2010) ... Member of the 2010 NCAA National Championship team, finishing fourth individually at 287 (78-69-68-72).

Randy Shaw, Men's Golf, 1986-90

First-Team All-American and USA South Individual Champion in 1987 ... two-time First-Team All-USA South (1987, 1990) ... part of 1990 NCAA National Championship team ... member of three conference championship teams.

Pierson Singleton, Track & Field, 2009-12

3-time national qualifier ... 3-time All-American ... school record-holder in long jump (outdoor; *as of June 2022*) ... 7-time conference champion and 1st-team all-conference ... 3-time 3rd-team all-conference.

Jenny Smith, Women's Tennis 2005-08

Three-time first team all-conference selection (2005-07) and second team all-conference in 2008 ... Ranked sixth all-time at Methodist in singles wins (65) and T-13th all-time in doubles wins (53) ... Played at No. 1 doubles and Nos. 1 and 2 doubles ... Helped lead the team to three regular-season conference championships, two conference tournament titles and two NCAA appearances.

Stacey Smith, Women's Golf, 1996-2000

2000 NCAA Individual Champion and NGCA Player of the Year... Two-time First Team All-American (1998, 2000)... Helped team to three National Championships ... ranked seventh in single-season wins (2) ... Averaged 81.24 strokes for her career.

Mike Townsend, Men's Golf, 2002-05

Two-time First Team All-American (2002, 2005) ... Named the 2002 USA South Rookie of the Year and was a two-time first team all-conference pick (2004, 2005) and a two-time second team all-conference pick (2002, 2003) ... led MU to a trio of conference championships (2003, 2004, 2005)

Hope Thomas, Women's Golf, 2001-04

Helped lead the team to four NCAA Championships ... was a three-time Second Team All-American and also earned honorable mention accolades once ... ranks tenth at MU in career rounds played (77) ...

Tiffany Tucker, Women's Tennis, 2005-08

Four-time first team all-conference selection ... graduated ranked 10th in doubles wins (58) ... Played at No. 1 doubles all four years and was the primary No. 1 singles player for all four years as well ... Helped lead the team to three regular-season conference championships, two conference tournament titles and two NCAA appearances.

Tiffanie (Wagner) Woods, Cheerleading, 2005-10

2006 Collegiate All-Girl Stunt Group Champion at Canam Nationals

Clarence Wiggins, Men's Basketball, 1976-79

All-district in 1977 and 1978...All-conference in 1978 and 1979... 7th all-time in rebounding in Methodist history... Led team to 55-44 record during his career... Played and coached professionally in England.

Triba Williams, Women's Basketball, 1996-2000

Two-time All-Conference selection finishing with First Team honors for the 1999-00 season... Holds the Methodist record for career field goal attempts (1,214) while ranking in the top ten for career scoring (third), field goals (second), three-point field goals (fourth), steals (second), assists, blocks and season steals.

Traci Wilson, Women's Soccer, 1988-91

Second Team All-American and First Team All-Region in 1991 as MU captured the conference title ... Two-time First Team All-Conference

Bryan Wright, Men's Golf, 1994-97

1996 Conference Champion...Two-time All-American and two-time all-conference...Member of four Conference Championship teams... Team won NCAA Division III National Championship all four years.

Named First-Team All-USA South three times (2006, 2007, 2008) ... Third-Team All-USA South in 2009 ... USA South Rookie of the Year in 2006 ... Named to the USA South All-Tournament Team four times (2006-09) ... Ranks third in points (159), goals (64), and assists (31) in program history ... Owns the school record for most assists in a single-season (16) ... Tied for the program record for most assists in a single-game (4)

Sean MacDonald, Men's Soccer, 2012-14
