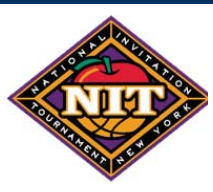

## MSU PREPS FOR NIT - FIRST SINCE 1996

The Murray State Racers (23-8) are set for their first appearance in the National Invitational Tournament since 1996 Tuesday when they travel to Springfield, Mo., to face the Missouri State Bears in a 7 p.m. tip off at the JQH Arena. The Racers will be facing the Bears for the first time since 1952. MSU is in the NIT after they won their second straight Ohio Valley Conference regular season championship with a 14-4 mark. MSU last played in the NIT in 1996 when they played at Missouri and dropped an 89-85 decision.



## TOURNAMENT TIME IN UNPREDICTABLE

In a post-season that has seen more than a few No. 1 seeds not win their conference tournaments, the Racers know the feeling all too well after they stumbled and lost in the OVC Tournament semifinals (March 4). MSU had a poor shooting night in a 64-59 loss to Tennessee Tech, a team they had defeated twice in the regular season by an average of nine points. In the end, the one stat that doomed the Racers was their 33 percent rate from the field (17-51) and 17% from three-point range (3-18). Still, MSU had a chance to tie inside a minute left and came up short of their 15th trip to the NCAA Tournament.

## WRAPPING UP THE REGULAR SEASON

The regular season was good to the Racers who posted the program's 24th 20-win season. MSU won the OVC regular season championship for the 22nd time, the best in the league and are back-to-back champions for the first time since 2000 when they ended a string of seven straight titles. MSU also has 24 straight winning seasons, fourth-best in the nation with UConn. Syracuse has the best streak at 41, while Kansas has 28 and Arizona has 27.

Billy Kennedy is the first Murray State coach to win back-to-back OVC Coach of the Year awards. After winning an OVC-record 31 games last year and topping Vanderbilt in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, Kennedy's team finished strong going 19-3 over its final 22 games.

The Racers also saw sophomore guard Isaiah Canaan earn All-OVC First Team honors while senior guards B.J. Jenkins and Isacc Miles each were named to the All-OVC Second Team.

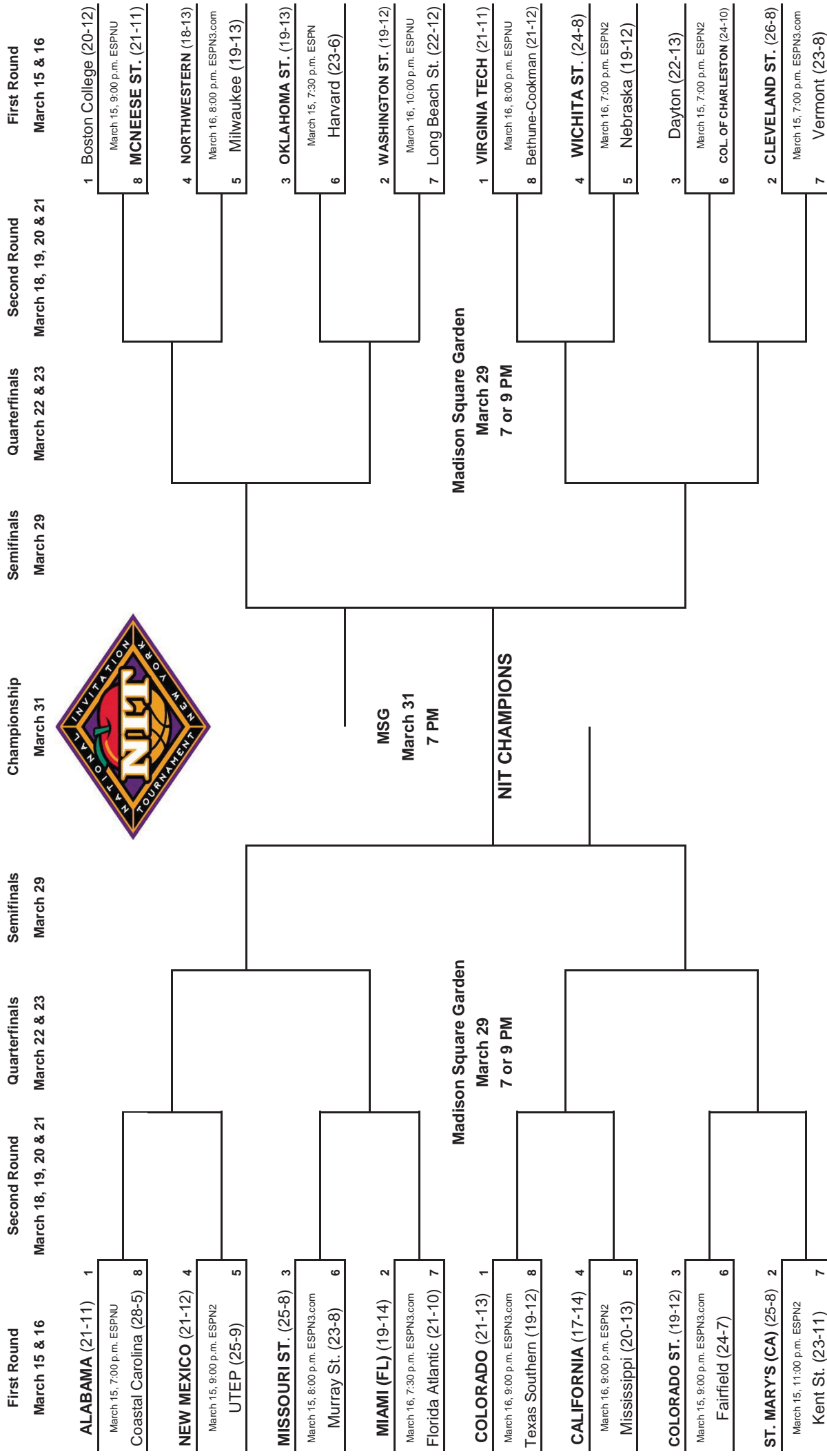

**MSU NIT HISTORY:** The Racers haven't played in the NIT since a 1996 game at Missouri. MSU is 2-6 all-time in the NIT. Here are all of MSU's games in the event starting with the first one in 1980 against Jacksonville.

**NIT MEMORIES:** Here are some notes and highlights from Murray State's NIT games of the past.

**1996 (Missouri)** - In Columbia, Mo. at the Hearn Center OVC Player of the Year Marcus Brown and All-OVC pick Vincent Rainey nearly led MSU to an upset of the favored Tigers. Brown scored 30 points, while Rainey added 24 and 15 rebounds. The Racers trailed 52-47 at the half. There were 86 free throws taken in the game with Mizzou taking 50 and the Racers 36.

**1994 (Bradley)** - The Braves held Brown to 11 points and beat the Racers 66-58 at Carver Arena after leading the game at halftime 32-19. Marcus Jones led MSU with 20 points with Michael James grabbing seven rebounds. MSU had 11 steals.

**1989 (Penn State)** - Two-time OVC Player of the Year Jeff Martin pumped in 27 points while playing all 40 minutes of the game. All-OVC selection Don Mann scored 19 points but it wasn't enough. MSU trailed 33-32 at half but was outscored 57-40 in the second half. The game was played in State College, Pa., which was MSU's first trip to the state since a game at Duquesne in 1972.

**1983 (Wake Forest)** - In the only home game in MSU's NIT history, the Racers played the Demon Deacons in a packed house in Racer Arena. Ricky Hood led MSU with 23 points and 15 rebounds, while Glen Green added six assists. MSU dropped an 87-80 loss.

**OVC IN THE NIT:** Only three other current members of the OVC have participated in the NIT: Austin Peay, UT Martin and Tennessee Tech. Former Members Middle Tennessee and Western Kentucky competed. Here is a breakdown of the current members in the NIT.

**RACERS VS BEARS:** The Racers have met only twice and it has been a long time since they've met.

Both games were played in Kansas City in the NICA and then NAIB Tournament.

**SCOUTING THE BEARS:** Missouri State is 25-8 and won the Missouri Valley regular season title for the first time with a 15-3 mark. The Bears made it to the championship game of the MVC Tournament but lost to Indiana State 60-56.

Missouri State junior Kyle Weems was named the MVC Larry Bird Player of the Year. Weems, also an All-MVC first-team selection this year, ranks among the Valley's top 10 players in 11 of 13 statistical categories.

Three other Bears were named All-MVC including: Jermaine Mallett (All-MVC second team and the All-Defensive Team), Will Creekmore (All-MVC second-team).

Nathan Scheer was named to the MVC All-Freshman Team.

Missouri State's Cuonzo Martin is the Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year. Martin is in his third season with MSU is the first Bears coach to win a coach of the year the award since Charlie Spoonhour earned Mid-Continent Coach of the Year laurels in 1988.

Missouri State is 34-3 at JQH Arena the past two seasons.

**RACERS-BEARS PART-2?:** Murray State and Missouri State have already met once this season...in football and played perhaps the most famous FCS game in history.

In MSU's Oct. 9 homecoming game, the two teams combined to score 131 points in the highest scoring game in FCS history as the Racers rallied to outscore the Bears 27-7 in the fourth quarter and win the game 72-59.

Will the basketball teams from these two schools combine for that many points? Only time will tell!

**OVC POSTSEASON:** Three other teams from the OVC are enjoying being in post-season play.

**Morehead State** won the OVC Tournament and is in the NCAA Tournament as a 13-seed against 4-seed Louisville. That game is Thursday in Denver, Colo., in the Southwest Region.

**Austin Peay** accepted an invitation to play in the College Basketball Invitational. Their opponent is Boise State with the game day and site to be determined.

**Tennessee Tech** will travel to Western Michigan on Wednesday to be part of the Collegelinsider Tournament.

**REGULAR SEASON:** Murray State comes into the NIT as back-to-back regular season champions of the OVC, the first for the Racers since they ended a string of seven straight titles in 2000.

**OVC COACH OF THE YEAR:** Billy Kennedy was honored as the OVC Coach of the Year in voting by the league's head coaches and sports information directors. Kennedy is the first MSU coach to earn the award in back-to-back seasons.

**BACKTOBACK:** The Murray State Racers have pulled off back-to-back Ohio Valley Conference regular season championships for the first time since they finished the last of seven straight titles in 2000.

MSU Head Coach Billy Kennedy has two titles in five seasons with the Racers and is the first to get back-to-back titles since Tevester Anderson in 2000. Mark Gottfried is the last Racer coach to win three straight from 1995-98, while Steve Newton is the only MSU coach to win four straight (1987-1992).

MSU's first back-to-back instance was under head coach Ron Green from 1981-83.

**KENNEDY MILESTONES:** Coach Billy Kennedy reached career win 100 in the Racers' win at Tennessee State (Feb. 3). He scored his 200th win overall with MSU's win at Tennessee Tech (Jan. 15).

**HOME COURT STREAK:** The Racers had the fourth-longest home winning streak in the nation when it ended at 25 with a 66-64 loss to Austin Peay (Jan. 8). It was MSU's first loss in 679 days since dropping the BracketBusters game to Louisiana Tech Feb. 21, 2009. MSU's longest streak was 47 from 1998-2000.

The 25-game streak is the best in 13 seasons in the CFSB Center.

**DYNAMIC DUO:** Senior guards Isacc Miles and B.J. Jenkins have been such a big part of the MSU mix that each has started every game of their MSU careers. Miles has a streak of 97 straight starts and Jenkins has 66.

**QUITE A NIGHT:** Isaiah Canaan became the first Racer since 2007 to hit six three-point baskets in a game when he did the trick against UT Martin (Jan. 29). Tyler Holloway (vs Eastern Illinois 2007) and Damell Hopkins (vs Eastern Illinois 2006) were the last two to do it.

Canaan's 6-of-6 game was two off the MSU single game record of 8-of-8 set by James Singleton also against Eastern Illinois in 2003.

**SLAMMING THE DOOR:** When the Racers have a chance late in the game to get a win, they usually do. Since the 2008-09 season MSU is 62-2 when they have the lead with 5:00 remaining in the second half. MSU had won their last 51 games in this situation since their last loss Dec. 6, 2008 at Morehead State 79-75, that is until they dropped a 61-60 game (Jan. 20) to Eastern Illinois.

The Racers' streak 24 straight wins in games that they have a lead of less than 10 points at the five-minute mark of the second half ended in the same EIU loss.

MSU has claimed a couple of recent wins when they found themselves trailing in that same situation. Dec. 2 of this season MSU erased a two-point deficit for a 74-72 win at

Eastern Kentucky and they also did it last spring at the NCAA Tournament against Vanderbilt. MSU trailed by one with five minutes left and won the game on a buzzer shot by Danero Thomas to give the Racers their first NCAA win since 1988.

**REESE LEAVES TEAM:** Forward Jeff Reese left the squad (Jan. 6) and plans to transfer to Arkansas Tech in Russellville, Ark.

**ROAD WARRIORS:** MSU's six-game road trip early this season meant they traveled more than 6,000 miles to Anaheim, Calif. (for three games at the 76 Classic), Richmond and Morehead, Ky., and Chattanooga, Tenn. MSU managed wins over Stanford, Eastern Kentucky and Chattanooga, but had losses to UNLV, Oklahoma State and Morehead State. The six-game trip was the longest in Billy Kennedy's five seasons as Racer head coach and the longest since the 2003-04 squad played games away from home against Pittsburgh, Georgetown College, Delaware State, Louisville, Morehead State and Eastern Kentucky.

**PRESEASON PICKS:** Murray State was the top pick for the first straight year in the OVC Preseason Poll. The poll was released Oct. 25, during the OVC's annual media day at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn.

**PUT ON NOTICE:** After putting together the best season in the history of the program in 2009-10, with a 31-5 record and a win over Vanderbilt in the NCAA Tournament, the Racers were very much in the national conversation among national media. MSU received votes in both the Associated Press and ESPN-USA Today preseason polls.

The Racers were also selected fifth in the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top-25 Poll (They finished sixth last season), 35th by The Sporting News, 37th by SportsBank.net, 41st by CollegeHoops.net and 47th by CollegeInsider.com.

**FOOD DRIVE:** Murray State Athletics held its annual food drive in December. All 300+ Racers' student-athletes participated in drive for the Needline of Murray-Calloway County Christmas Baskets. MSU collected 5,275 food items and raised \$600 to purchase 600 dozen eggs for a total of 5,875 items

**SHOTS FROM THE HEART:** Murray State Head Men's Basketball Coach Billy Kennedy and assistant coach Amir Abdur-Rahim were selected to participate in 'Shots from the Heart,' a project sponsored by CollegeInsider.com which is designed to help raise awareness of the growing problem of heart disease.

Coaches competed against one another in a free throw shooting tournament, which benefited the American Heart Association. There is a tournament bracket for head coaches and one for assistant coaches.

Coaches didn't actually compete against each other on the same court. Each coach took 25 freethrows and turned in his scores. Shots 1-20 were worth one point, shots 21-24 worth two points and shot 25 was worth three points.

Too bad for the MSU coaches, but they were both eliminated in the first round. Kennedy hit 17-25 shots for a total of 19 points, while Texas Tech Coach Pat Knight hit 21-25 for 27 points.

Abdur-Rahim was knocked out by Iowa State assistant Elwyn McRoy. Abdur-Rahim hit 21-25 for 26 points, but McRoy hit 24-25 and won with 30 points.

The MSU coaches were pleased to be part of the fundraising effort to fight heart disease.

**BANNER YEARS UPDATE:** Banner Years, Chronicling Murray State Basketball is an upcoming book that is due to be available in July.

## RACERS DARING TO DREAM BIG IN NIT

B.J. Jenkins knows one fix for that sick feeling that has taken residence in his gut since regular-season champion Murray State fell in the Ohio Valley Conference semifinals last week.

A trip to Madison Square Garden would certainly do the trick.

"To win the NIT national championship in the mecca of college basketball would be crazy," the Racers' senior guard said earlier this week as his team prepared to refocus on plan 'B' with its NCAA tournament dreams dashed.

"That would be great. That would make it so when we look back at that banner, we'd say 'Remember when we lost to Tennessee Tech, but we won that national championship?' That would make it all better."

First thing's first, however, for the Racers, and the last thing head coach Billy Kennedy wants is for his club to get ahead of itself.

On paper, Murray State will be one of the least likely squads in the 32-team National Invitational Tournament field to step foot inside New York City's hallowed basketball grounds for the semifinals and finals of the event. Most predictions have the Racers as an eight-seed matched up against a one-seed, likely one of the first four teams left out of an NCAA tournament bid, in the first round.

Murray State will learn its NIT destination Sunday night at 8 p.m. via a selection show on ESPNU, then the Racers will play either Tuesday night or Wednesday night on the home floor of their opponent.

"There is still some pain, but we need to look forward to the opportunity to play in a special tournament," Kennedy said Thursday. "It's not like we're playing in the CBI or the College Coaches Insider tournament. This is the NIT. This is something we've earned, and we've got to embrace it and look forward to it."

Though NIT matchups are even more difficult to speculate than NCAA pairings, and this weekend's conference tournament games will likely have a bearing on things, potential foes for the Racers within an eight-hour radius include UAB, Alabama, Missouri State, Georgia and Memphis.

Asked if he felt an eight-seed in the NIT would be disrespectful to his squad, Kennedy said a chance to play a No. 1 seed is something his team would

relish.

"We want to be on the road playing a good team," he said. "We look forward to that opportunity. I'd love to have them play a No. 1 seed in a big-time environment. I think that would be great for our program."

The Racers engaged in two "hard" practices on Monday and Tuesday, then took Wednesday off before having a more laid-back shooting-focused practice on Thursday.

"We're trying to make it different to keep them fresh, because this time of year, nobody's excited about practice," Kennedy said.

The coaching staff has also been recording games from other conference tournaments this week, attempting to get as many potential NIT opponents on tape as possible.

As soon as they learn their fate on Sunday night, Kennedy and his staff will go into preparation mode immediately, putting together scouting reports and strategizing against their opponent.

The experience will be similar to getting ready for an NCAA tournament game, only the window for preparation will be one or two days instead of three or four.

The NCAA, which operates the NIT, will have prepared travel logistics for its competing squads ahead of time, Kennedy said.

The fifth-year head coach spoke earlier this week about possibly altering his lineup, but said Thursday that he expected things to remain as they have been with a starting five consisting of seniors Isacc Miles, Jenkins and Jeffery McClain as well as Jewuan Long and Ed Daniel.

Kennedy praised Long and fellow junior Donte Poole for "understanding what's at stake," and said he hoped some of his younger players, many of whom had not experienced a failure such as last weekend's, to learn from the experience.

"Donte and Jewuan have done a good job leading the team," he said. "They've been even-keel with their attitude and their effort."

"They probably haven't had the great years they anticipated, but those two guys have done a good job."

## SHOCKER: ICE-COLD RACERS FALL TO OPPORTUNISTIC TTU IN SEMIFINAL UPSET

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - The telling moments happened throughout Friday night's Ohio Valley Conference semifinal.

Tennessee Tech knocked down big shot after big shot. Murray State's three guards, the heart and soul of a team projected to be one of the best in school history, were simply off on the night which they most needed to be on.

But no sequence was more telling than the one that ultimately led to four-seed Tennessee Tech tossing a shocking loss on the Racers and sending MSU's back-to-back NCAA tournament hopes to a crashing end with a 64-59 defeat.

With 24 seconds left and Tennessee Tech clinging to a two-point lead, Golden Eagle point guard and Georgia transfer Zac Swansey launched a quick three-pointer from the wing, delivering what seemed as if it would be a dagger to the Racers.

Murray State had one more chance to tie the game, however, thanks to a missed TTU one-and-one free-throw opportunity, but an open three from Miles near the top of the key clanked off the rim, just as so many other MSU shots had throughout the evening.

Game, set, match. The regular-season champion Racers were one-and-done in the tournament.

"We didn't make shots, and they made tough shots," said MSU senior guard Isacc Miles. "They came in ready to play. We had our chances. I had five turnovers. You can't have five turnovers in a tournament game."

After leading three of the Racers' most complete efforts of the year down the regular-season stretch run, seniors Miles, B.J. Jenkins and Jeffery McClain were unable to carry the load on Friday.

At halftime, Miles had scored just three points while Jenkins had none. Together, they had gone a combined 1-for-8 from the field. Miles finished with 11 points but went 2-for-11 and turned the ball over five times. Jenkins had just six points and went 2-for-10.

"It's disappointing for our seniors," head coach Billy Kennedy said. "Without them and their ability to make shots and defend the last few games, we wouldn't

have a chance to be in this position. But that's what tournament play, March Madness, is all about. One off game, and good teams can beat you."

In the stead of Miles and Jenkins, sophomore post Ivan Aska and junior guard Donte Poole were largely responsible for the Racers having a chance to win the game down the stretch.

Aska played 26 minutes, the most he had seen since Dec. 11, after starter Ed Daniel picked up his fourth foul at the 18-minute mark of the second half. He poured in a team-high 15 points and brought down five rebounds while going 9-for-13 from the free-throw line.

But it was Aska who missed the two most crucial free-throws of the night, missing out on a chance to tie the game at 57 with 53 seconds left. After the misses, Swansey delivered his momentum-snatching three.

Poole was Murray State's biggest perimeter scoring threat on the evening, delivering eight points and hitting two three-pointers.

The Racers were sullen in the postgame press conference, but no one seemed more downtrodden than Jenkins. When asked about his team's hopes for another NCAA tournament trip, the senior simply responded, "We're not going."

He also put most of the blame for the loss on himself and his senior teammates.

"Donte, Ivan and Jewuan (Long), they had a good night," he said. "It was the seniors, we didn't come through. We couldn't throw the ball in the ocean. But you can't take anything away from those guys. I know I couldn't come through. I was airballing. But we were all trying."

The Racers' season isn't over, as the team will receive an automatic bid to the NIT by virtue of their first-place regular-season finish.

Kennedy said he was thankful for the opportunity to be involved in postseason play, but that he couldn't say he was excited for his team to be where it is. Murray State will learn its NIT fate after the NCAA pairings are announced March 13.

While Murray State's players missed plenty of open shots Friday, Kennedy and his players did credit a tight zone defense from Tennessee Tech for making things difficult.

"You've got to give Tennessee Tech a lot of credit," Kennedy said. "They changed defenses some in the first half and their guard play was outstanding. Their top three players (Swansey, Kevin Murphy and Jud Dillard) combined for 44 points, and that's too many points."

The Racers fell behind by 10 with 10:53 left to play, but battled back to within three at the 9:33 mark. Murray State seized a brief lead on two free throws by Miles around the three-minute mark, but TTU scored the next two baskets, reclaiming the lead on a Dillard dunk.

Murray State would tie the game one last time with 1:42 left on a jumper by Jenkins, but Dillard sank two free throws, then Aska missed two to set up the finish.

Murphy, who torched the Racers for 31 points in Cookeville in January, finished with a game-high 19 while Dillard had 14 and Swansey scored eight. All three players will return for the Golden Eagles next season.

Asked to reflect on their Murray State careers, the Racers' three seniors were pleased with the success with which they'll leave, but regretful over Friday's performance.

"We've been through it all together," said McClain, who scored four points and had three rebounds. "There were great moments, especially last year and that season. That's a lot to look back on, and it was a great point in our careers. I just wish we could have gotten it done tonight."

Shawn Jackson was the last Murray State player to emerge from the locker room Thursday night, meandering across the court at the CFSB Center. His teammates were long gone.

Dressed in dark jeans, a black unbuttoned Nike letterman jacket and a bare head, Jackson was strolling toward the exit when Mary Kennedy started yelling for him.

Kennedy, the wife of Racer head coach Billy Kennedy, already had her long black coat on and buttoned, and was helping daughter Anna Cate into her coat. A wild look of a mother's panic appeared on her face as she watched Jackson walk away.

"Shawn! You're riding with us!" Mary Kennedy said, trying to convince him with details about how cold it was that night. It was about 6 degrees when Jackson was thinking about making the trek back to his dorm room.

Jackson just smiled, waved her off, and tried to refuse. Then Billy Kennedy came around the corner as his family started walking toward the door and toward Jackson.

"You're from Florida," Kennedy said. "You can't handle this cold." And with that, the Kennedy clan, now including the 6-foot-9 Jackson, who hails from Live Oak, Fla., left the building.

The Racers, like most college athletic teams who spend so much time together practicing and traveling to play games, function as a family.

They live together, eat together, recreate together, poke fun at each other, aggravate each other and counsel each other.

Just before leaving Thursday night, Racer senior guard B.J. Jenkins posed for a goofy picture with the Kennedys' daughter, posting the picture of the pair wearing silly glasses on Twitter.

There seems to be some extra love for the Florida kids, coming to western Kentucky and the recent harsh winters. Tallahassee native Chris Griffin came to Murray without a winter coat. Jenkins gave him one of his.

"I'm surprised it fit, but it did," said Griffin, who is 7 inches taller and 25 pounds bigger than Jenkins, Murray's point guard.

The family members all have different roles.

"I think we all look at each other like brothers," senior Isacc Miles said. "And me, B.J. and Jeff the older brothers and everybody else the younger brothers."

Billy Kennedy is obviously the father-figure, helping the players stay humble and mature outside of basketball. Miles said the assistant coaches are more similar to older brothers.

Whether it's a coat, a ride home, a meal or a locker room conversation, the family is linked for life.

"We just try to build that bond about caring for each other on and off the court and in the future," Miles said. "So we just take this as a brotherhood and try to build off it so we can be a better team."

## RACERS FIND BALANCE IN ACADEMICS, BASKETBALL

On Friday in a hotel in snowy Morehead, senior Jeffery McClain spent the afternoon studying. Junior Ivan Aska did the same thing.

The two post players for the Murray State University men's basketball team had played a physical basketball game the night before at Eastern Kentucky, traveled two hours on a bus that day, and still had practice and a team dinner to go through before a game on Saturday. All this sandwiched between two six-hour bus rides to start and end the road swing.

Yet finals loomed this week.

"It's just stressful this being the most important road games and having finals and not having a lot of time to study for it," said McClain. "And we missed a review for being on the road. You just got to make some phone calls and e-mails and make it happen."

Such is the life of a student athlete. Racer athletes in all sports have to find enough balance in their life for practice, games, and school work.

"We be on the road, we have practice, meetings, film at night, then we have our school work," said Aska. "It's hard to really keep your grades up and really focus on the court."

Murray State athletes have help, though. There is study hall that's one part mandatory and one part voluntary. Matt Kelly, the associate athletics director for internal operations, oversees more than 300 MSU athletes and helps with their academic endeavors.

Within the men's basketball team, assistant coach Steve Prohm prods, pokes and pushes the players to open their books.

He said Aska is a good example of the evolution of a student athlete.

"From his freshman year to his junior year now, the responsibility level I got to stay on him every day is a lot less than it was two years ago," Prohm said. "So as they get older it gets much easier. Some of those guys you have to stay on them every day."

Aska came from a magnet program in high school, and said he currently has mostly As and Bs, though he has to limit his activities outside of school and

### SOMETIMES ROCKY, RACER SEASON ENDS WITH TITLE

The Racers clinched the regular season Ohio Valley Conference championship outright on Saturday evening against Eastern Kentucky giving them their 21st regular season championship and 36th conference title.

We started the Racer Insider 15 years ago. Marcus Brown was a senior, Mark Gottfried was in his first year as head coach and Murray State won a championship.

Here we are, 15 years later and the Racers are still winning championships.

Head coach Billy Kennedy has now won consecutive outright conference crowns. The last coach to do that was Steve Newton. Kennedy deserves tremendous credit for the job he has done despite inheriting a mess when he took over five years ago.

#### MOREHEAD WIN

Thursday night's game against Morehead was the biggest game in the history of the CFSB Center. A share of the regular season title was on the line, the game was nationally televised on ESPNU, and ESPN writer and commentator Pat Forde was there. It was just a huge game and the atmosphere was electric.

The crowd of 6,096 wouldn't have been able to fit in old Racer Arena. And the Eagles had a player in Kenneth Faried that may be the best to ever wear a Morehead uniform. Four NBA scouts were at the game just to watch him play. The Racers really stepped up to the challenge too. After trailing 20-14 they went on a 31-4 run to seize a 45-24 advantage six minutes into the second half. It may be the best they have played all year and that might be the biggest run in the history of the building.

B. J. Jenkins was fantastic as he scored 25 points, making 6-of-10 field goal attempts, 4-of-6 three-pointers and 9-of-11 free throws. He also grabbed seven rebounds which is quite a feat for a 6-0 guard.

But he didn't do it alone. Murray State hit 9-of-17 three-pointers as a team and held Morehead to 36.5 percent shooting overall and 25.9 percent from beyond the arc.

#### SENIOR SEASON

You have to love the way the seniors stepped up after the disappointing loss at Southeast Missouri. They didn't flinch, they didn't make excuses, and they haven't lost since.

Think for a moment about what they've done for the program.

Isacc Miles transferred in from Creighton and gave the Racers the best point guard they've had in a decade. His quickness and defensive tenacity set him apart. Acknowledging that he isn't a pure shooter he put in the effort to make himself a consistent threat from the perimeter. And this year he is shooting a career best 41.4 percent from three-point range.

Miles is two points shy of 1,000 in his career at Murray State and is a cinch to reach that mark before the season ends.

Jenkins transferred from Liberty and sat out a year and he's played a big role in the success this team has enjoyed the last two seasons. He's made big shots, been a good leader, and a good spokesman for the program. When he is stroking it he has as pretty a shot as you'll ever see.

Miles and Jenkins have been billed as one of the best guard tandems in the country and they've earned that. Their statistics aren't gaudy but that's due to the balanced scoring that Kennedy favors. They are winners and they are certainly among the best to ever play the position at MSU.

Jeff McClain has been rock solid tough for three years. He has a big, strong body and he's the kind of player Kennedy loves. He's playing especially well down the stretch this year and it's great to see a local kid have the kind of success that he's had.

Picasso Simmons is a great young man who has worked hard in practice every day despite knowing that he isn't going to play much. You have to admire the way he has committed himself to the success of the team.

As a group, I think these seniors really appreciate what it means to wear a Murray State uniform. They never took it for granted and they were as proud to be Racers as anyone who has ever played here. Jenkins put it this way in an interview with the Paducah Sun's Dusty Luthy Shull,

"We had a lot of hype coming in. Then we had a lot of doubt. And we just stuck together and faced adversity. I'm just proud, proud to be a part of this team and proud to be a part of the tradition Murray State has."

And who can forget what Miles said a year ago, "We're Murray State. We're big time. If you don't have some swagger about you then something's wrong." It's obvious they got it.

These seniors bought into the team concept to the point that they didn't worry about how many points they scored. They put in the hard work getting in the kind of shape it takes to win a championship. They also embraced Kennedy's defensive mindset and that's easier said than done. Most players don't play a lot of defense in high school or on the AAU circuit. But you have to do it if you want to win a championship at the Division I level.

But it hasn't just been the seniors. Everyone on the team has contributed.

Ed Daniel has stepped into the starting lineup. He rebounds well, blocks shots and plays with great energy.

Isaiah Canaan and Ivan Aska have accepted coming off the bench.

Donte Poole has been up and down but he's had some huge games.

### NUMBERS ALONE DON'T TELL MCCLAIN'S VALUE

Jeff McClain is one of those players whose impact is hard to measure. He isn't flashy, rarely dunks the ball, and is averaging just 6.0 points and 4.4 rebounds.

And yet head coach Billy Kennedy will tell you that he's one of the most important players on the team.

"He has been our most consistent post player," Kennedy said. "He does the little things that don't show up on the stat sheet. He always gives us effort and energy. That's why we recruited him and he's never disappointed us."

Of course that might make you wonder what those "little things" are and why there isn't a stat for them.

Ever curious, I took a look at what Kennedy has said about McClain over the last three years to see if I could figure out what it is that he does so well.

This is what I discovered...McClain doesn't always look to score.

He's consistent; he's one of the better passers on the team; he's strong; he's a good leader; and he always plays hard. If only there was a way to quantify all that. Well, as it happens, there is.

You won't find it on the Ohio Valley Conference website but McClain is among the top-10 in the league in five different statistics. He is eighth in plus/minus, seventh in plus/minus average, 10th in Roland rating, fourth in plus/minus wins, and sixth in plus/minus winning percentage. Plus/minus is the difference between the number of points a team scores while a player is on the court minus the number of points the team's opponent scores while a player is on the court.

The other statistics are related to the plus/minus rating and they can all be found at Statsheet.com.

McClain grew up in the shadow of MSU in nearby Fulton County. His uncle, Jerome Warren, played football for the Racers and two of his aunts graduated from MSU.

"Murray State was a big part of my family but I never followed the basketball team," he admitted. "Honestly I never thought I'd come to school here."

McClain started playing basketball at a young age but he didn't really become serious about the game until he was in the seventh grade.

"I started seeing my skills develop and seeing myself get better and better," he said. "And I knew I had a chance to be pretty good someday. When I played in youth league I was always the only good player on my team. My friends were always on other teams and they would brag about beating us. But I would get nearly as many points by myself as their whole team."

McClain played at Fulton County High School for head coaches Shane Midget and Gary Meredith but he credits assistant coach Bradley Nanney with having the most influence on his game.

"He played at Fulton City and he also played college basketball," McClain noted. "And although I played at Fulton County which is in Hickman I lived in Fulton and he lived there too. So we developed a good relationship."

McClain was a three-time Paducah Sun All-Purchase selection and the KABC Region-I Player of the Year as a senior. He is also the top scorer in FCHS history with 1,610 points and is its all-time leading rebounder. As a senior he averaged 20 points and 12 rebounds.

"The biggest highlight of my high school career came in a game against Lake County," he noted. "We came down on a fast break and one of our guards took a shot from the corner. Well I was coming down the middle and the ball bounced off the rim and came right to me. I grabbed it in the air and dunked it backwards over my head. I have no idea how I wound up with my back to the basket."

Following high school McClain signed with Three Rivers Community College in Poplar Bluff, Mo.

"I felt like my game wasn't developed enough to play Division I basketball," he said. "And I wasn't getting the kind of offers out of high school that I wanted. I had some Division I offers but not from any school that I was really interested in. So I thought junior college would be the best thing for me and it worked out well."

While at Three Rivers, McClain played for Gene Bess who with over 1,000 victories has more wins than any other college coach at any level. After a single year at TRCC he signed with Murray State.

"Coach Jamal Walker recruited me," McClain recalled. "He knew coach Bess and he'd imitate his voice. It was hilarious. I had some other schools telling me if I would wait a year that they would offer me – Oklahoma State, Oklahoma, Baylor and a few more. So it wasn't an easy decision but in the end I decided to come to Murray State."

McClain started every game for the Racers as a sophomore. McClain averaged 6.4 points and 5.3 rebounds and the Racers finished 19-12 overall and 13-5 in OVC play.

As a junior McClain found himself coming off the bench. But he continued to give it everything he had and averaged 3.8 points and 4.2 rebounds as Murray State rolled to a 31-5 record, an OVC title, and a first round NCAA tournament victory over Vanderbilt.

"It was definitely a magical year," he said with a grin. But at the time we didn't realize we were making history. We just tried to dominate everyone we played every night. We had a special team. And when we beat Vandy it couldn't have felt any better if I had hit the winning shot myself. It was a great feeling. I was under the basket when Danero (Thomas) took the shot and I could tell it was going in so I just started jumping up and down."

Much was expected of McClain and the Racers this season.

All summer long they were the focus of both local and national media. But they struggled early, winning just four of their first eight games.

"You always like attention from the media," he said. "But we tried to keep it in perspective and we never felt any pressure. It just took us a while to put the

pieces together and get the chemistry right. It just takes time to do that.”

The Racers have won 11 of their last 13 games and McClain is shooting a career high 59.2 percent from the field.

But, inexplicably, the two losses came against two of the worst teams in the league – Eastern Illinois and Southeast Missouri.

“We didn’t bring it in those games,” McClain said. “You take a night off and anybody can beat you. It was just a lack of focus on our part. And the game against SEMO, they had a lot to play for. They knew if they didn’t win they might not make it into the OVC tournament.”

With three straight wins down the stretch and a regular season OVC championship McClain is confident the Racers are back on track.

### FROM JOY TO SORROW AND BACK

The high of winning two Ohio Valley Conference championships and a game in the NCAA tournament last season came with one of the deepest lows in Isacc Miles' life.

While Miles, now a senior guard for the Murray State men's basketball team, was riding the tidal wave of success of the 2009-10 season, his mother, Carol Castell, was dying of breast cancer.

Only Castell shielded her son from any distraction or pain of his own, choosing not to tell him about her fight. It's a decision that haunts the Kansas City, Mo., native, who at his mom's behest, even went on a spring break trip after the tournament before learning the terrible news. He made it home before she died, but not before radiation treatments had robbed her of much of her spirit.

"My mom, she was the type of person she didn't want me to worry about anything," Miles said. "She wanted me to focus on ball and school and she always said she'd be OK and great.

"It was sad when I found out because she was just talking to me about the game against Vanderbilt and said I did great and can't wait to watch me play again. And then the Butler game, when we lost, she was the first person that called and said, 'That's OK baby, you be good, can't wait till next year.'"

As a team, the Racers had already suffered a loss when they mourned the death of Picasso Simmons' mother just before the Vanderbilt game.

"I called my mom when I found out that Picasso's mom had passed," Miles remembered. "I told her I loved her because Picasso said he couldn't tell his mom that he loved her.

"It was a sad ending. I know she and Picasso's mom are in a great place and they're watching over us."

Miles has had to push forward. He said the first month after her death was the hardest, not able to call her and share details of his life with his best friend.

Watching his grandmother, Julia Benson, bury her daughter — his mother — inspires him to be the man of the house. And get back on the basketball court.

"She wanted me to keep pushing at my goals which was playing basketball,

and hopefully get another chance to play basketball after," Miles said.

But even the court hasn't been as kind to Miles yet this year. Miles, a fifth-year senior who transferred out of Creighton his freshman year, was projected as a starter and one of the best returning guards for the Racers' encore season.

In preseason practice, Miles conked knees with fellow guard Isaiah Canaan, leaving his mobility in question. An MRI showed Miles had a deep knee bruise which has left him a step behind to start the season, although relieved it's not more serious.

His teammates treat the three-year starter, known as "Rico" amongst them, with reverence and respect.

"Rico came a long way with family issues, basketball, he's fighting pain," junior forward Ivan Aska said. "If I could have Rico (as a teammate) for my senior year, I wish I could. I know he's got things to do, but he's a good point guard. That's one of the players I really look up to."

Racer coach Billy Kennedy calls Miles their hidden engine and said he is one of the best defensive players on the team.

"Isacc just wants to win," Kennedy said. "And I don't think he gets enough respect because he doesn't care about the hype. He just cares about winning and he's been a hidden leader by example on the floor because he brings it every day."

Miles — mature, saddened, but hopeful — won't let anything stop him from his dreams.

"Life is ups and downs and when you focus and you got one main goal and that's winning another championship and cutting down the nets," Miles said, "it's all you can worry about."

### CHANNELING HIS INNER PICASSO

One of William Shakespeare's most famous lines from arguably his most famous tragedy asks readers what is, exactly, the importance of a name? If Shakespeare had known Picasso Simmons when he penned Romeo and Juliet, he might have thought twice before writing that line.

For Simmons, Murray State's senior walk-on, the answer is everything. Picasso Simmons knows he'll never make an All-Ohio Valley Conference team. He doubts Murray State fans will remember his time on campus for what he did on the basketball court in the rare occasions he finds his way into the closing minutes of a blowout.

So Simmons figures they may as well remember him for something, which is why he takes being named to college basketball's all-name team by ESPN.com writer Pat Forde as such a high honor.

Forde placed Simmons among the top five names in college basketball prior to the 2010-11 season alongside Brigham Young's Jimmer Fredette and Delaware State's Alibaba Odd, among others.

But what is the story of Simmons' name, and why is a basketball player channeling one of the world's most famous artists?

The story begins, ironically, at Murray State, where Simmons' parents, Mark and Freeda, met during their time as students in the early 1980s. Mark played football for the Racers under now-Virginia Tech head coach Frank Beamer while Freeda ran track and field and cross country.

In her spare time, Freeda babysat for the Beamer family and penned drawings and caricatures of players and coaches for the athletic department to use in game programs and other publications.

"My mom was really into art," Simmons says. "She was a nurse, but she did art in her free time."

Mark, a black man, and Freeda, a white woman, decided that when they had children, they wanted to give them unique names so people would not stereotype their kids into one race or the other.

"We're mixed, and we look like kind of a different ethnicity," Picasso says. "My mom said she wanted to hide our ethnicity with our names and just keep it a guess so people wouldn't know what we were." Freeda's love affair with art seemed like a natural place to begin choosing names.

Picasso has four siblings, none of whom have what most folks would call a "normal" name, though not all are art-related.

There's his younger sister, Galileo, who followed in her mother's footsteps as a current track and field athlete for Murray State competing in the OVC Indoor Championships this weekend.

He has another sister named Aloha Ola ("hello" and "goodbye" in the native Hawaiian language), as well as brothers Luciano, Gauguin Van Gogh (a combination of well-known artists Paul Gauguin and Vincent Van Gogh), and Michaelangelo.

Picasso and Galileo, at least, have embraced the uniqueness of their names, though Galileo can repeat the routine she hears regularly at track meets and in classrooms.

"The first thing is, 'Stop playing, is that really your name?'" she says. "Professors say 'Where's Galileo?' on the first day of class. I raise my hand and they're looking for a boy. ...My mom was really artistic, she could draw anything, and so all these names came out."

When you're named after a historical figure, it probably makes sense to learn as much as you can about that person, and that's exactly what Galileo has done.

She believes she is similar in many ways to the Italian physicist often referred to as the father of modern science. Spunky and willing to stand up for her beliefs, she says she's a bit of a revolutionary herself. Picasso?

"I feel like Picasso is (like the artist)," she says. "He's got an abstract mind, and he's kind of simple. If you study, you'll find out Picasso got along with

everybody. Everybody liked Picasso. And I feel like that's the same with him."

The worst day of Picasso Simmons' life came shortly prior to one of the best last March.

Less than 24 hours before the Racers were set to fly to San Jose, Calif., for their NCAA tournament matchup against Vanderbilt, Picasso learned his mom had been killed in a car crash near his hometown of Gallatin, Tenn., a Nashville suburb.

In the wake of such heartbreaking news, Picasso hadn't even considered continuing with his plans to travel with the team. It was a given he would stay home and be with his family.

Galileo, who lives with her brother in an on-campus apartment, stepped in and told him he wouldn't be staying.

"I wanted to be there for my family, but my sister was like, 'Your mom wants you to go no matter what,'" he remembers. "I thought about that, and it's true. Around Christmas, there were times I could have stayed home a little bit longer because I'm a walk-on and the team didn't need me, but mom would say, 'You need to get your butt back over there and help them out.' It was a no-brainer going to California after that because I was doing it for my mom."

In fact, most anything Picasso does these days, he's doing it for Freeda. He says he always thinks about her before entering games and has dedicated every precious bit of playing time he receives to his mother.

That playing time isn't much, but it has provided Picasso with two unforgettable memories this season. Against Bethel on Dec. 15, he hit a turnaround fadeaway jump shot, which he calls his favorite play of his career.

Then, in a win over Southeast Missouri on Jan. 22, he sank a last-second three-pointer, to which he responded by running around the court with arms out mimicking a jet airplane, something he says was the object of jokes from his teammates for the next week.

After that shot, Galileo came bounding out of the stands to meet her brother on the court. Earlier in the day, she had won the 800 meter in a track competition.

"It was a big day for the family," she says with a smile."

After leaving Station Camp High School in Gallatin, Picasso went to prep school for a year in hopes of garnering a Division I basketball offer. He managed to hook several Division II and III programs, but the big-time offer he had hoped for never came.

So, following his mother's suggestion, he enrolled at the family alma mater and, when basketball season rolled around, went to an open tryout. Out of the 20 players present that day, Murray State's coaching staff took none. But they did invite Simmons back for a private tryout the next season, and this time, offered him a spot on the team as a walk-on.

Picasso admits to having grand aspirations for his career as a Racer, aspirations that haven't worked out the way he had plotted in his dreams.

He has played in just four games in this, his senior year, and he's recently come to the realization that he may not see the court again unless the Racers are fortunate enough to blow out Eastern Kentucky in tonight's Senior Night game.

But his role, serving as an emotional support to his teammates as well as playing a little defense during practice, is one he's come to accept.

Affable and genuinely interested in the lives of others, Simmons is an easy match for just such a role. He is universally referred to as a "great teammate" by the rest of the Racers, some of whom even say they think

he has what it takes to play Division I basketball.

But that ship has sailed, and that's fine with Picasso.

"When I first came here, I thought I could actually play if I just kept working hard, working hard," he says. "At the beginning of this year, I think I realized maybe this is not for me, but I need to cheer my teammates on and support them.

"I was going to finish basketball regardless of whether I had a different role from them. I accepted that role, and at first, it was kind of hard, but I'm used to it. I need to do my job, and I'm happy with it."

For Galileo, that statement reminds her of someone. Picasso the artist? Maybe, but she's thinking of someone a little more dear to her heart.

"My brother takes a lot after my mom," she says. "Picasso has my mom's personality and spirit. He's just so joyful and happy and smiley. After he hits a shot, he's always like, 'Did you see that?!' I'm like, 'Yeah, it was so cool. I'm so happy, so proud.'"

Just a hunch, but mom probably is, too.
