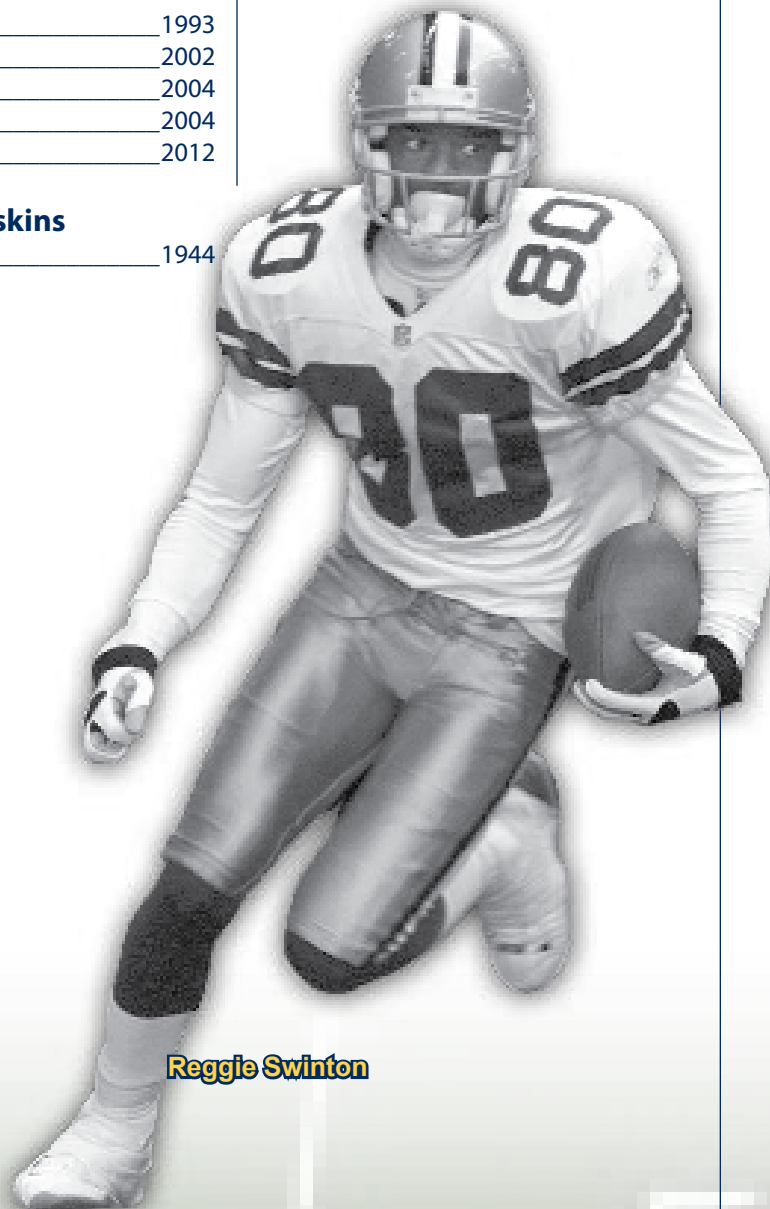

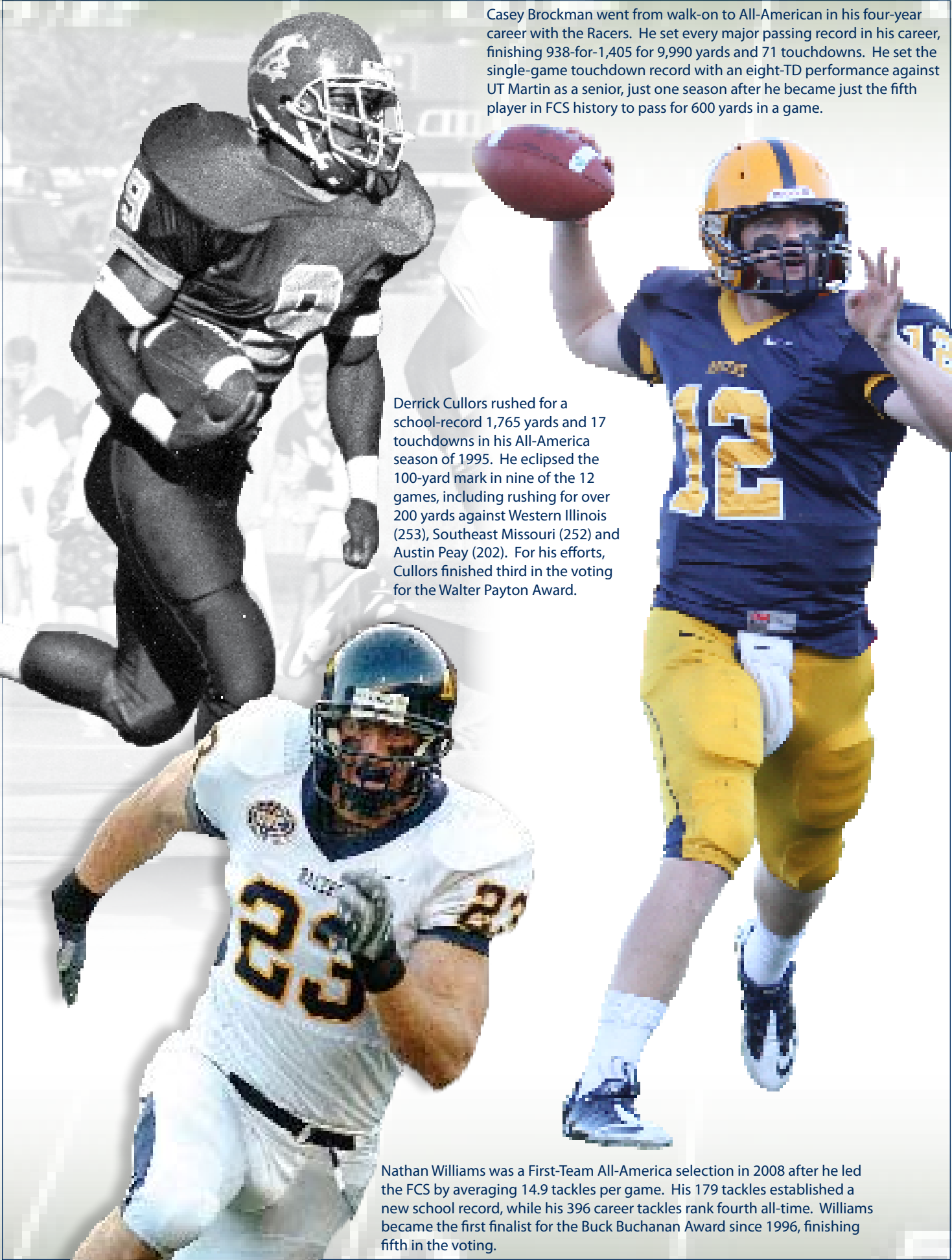

Racer Legends



Casey Brockman went from walk-on to All-American in his four-year career with the Racers. He set every major passing record in his career, finishing 938-for-1,405 for 9,990 yards and 71 touchdowns. He set the single-game touchdown record with an eight-TD performance against UT Martin as a senior, just one season after he became just the fifth player in FCS history to pass for 600 yards in a game.

Derrick Cullors rushed for a school-record 1,765 yards and 17 touchdowns in his All-America season of 1995. He eclipsed the 100-yard mark in nine of the 12 games, including rushing for over 200 yards against Western Illinois (253), Southeast Missouri (252) and Austin Peay (202). For his efforts, Cullors finished third in the voting for the Walter Payton Award.

Nathan Williams was a First-Team All-America selection in 2008 after he led the FCS by averaging 14.9 tackles per game. His 179 tackles established a new school record, while his 396 career tackles rank fourth all-time. Williams became the first finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award since 1996, finishing fifth in the voting.





Larry Tillman's #10 was retired after he rewrote the record books from 1965-68. The 1968 OVC Player of the Year owned 19 Murray State records and a number of OVC records when he graduated.

Tillman ranks four on MSU's career list for passing yards (5,037) and touchdowns (47). He also ranks fifth in attempts (728) and sixth in completions (367).

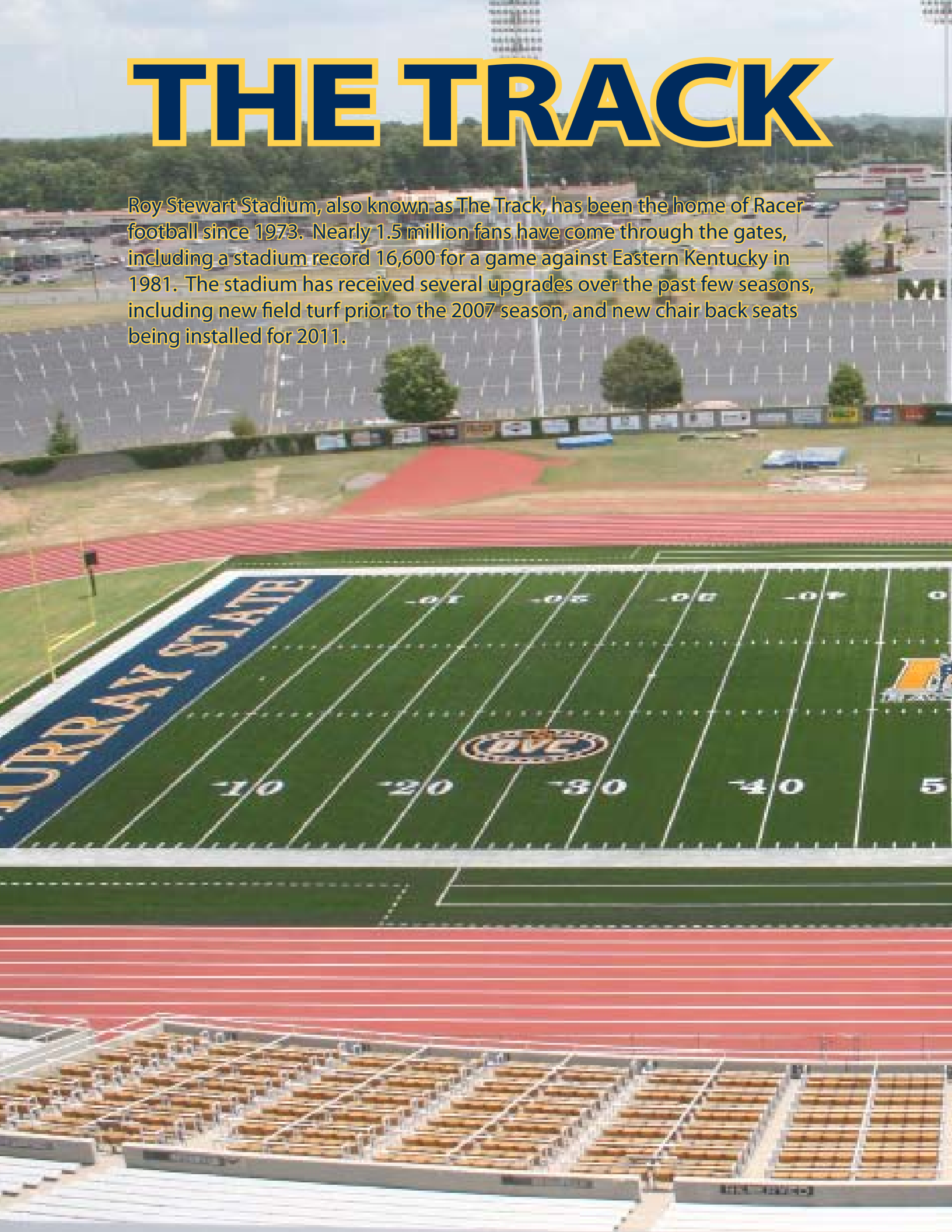


Michael Proctor's #11 was retired after his record-setting four-year career ending in 1989. He was a two-time All-OVC selection, and the 1989 OVC Player of the Year. He held 13 MSU and 11 OVC records when he graduated.

Proctor ranks second all-time in career passing yards (8,632), attempts (1,148) and touchdowns (52), while ranking second in completions (578).

THE TRACK

Roy Stewart Stadium, also known as The Track, has been the home of Racer football since 1973. Nearly 1.5 million fans have come through the gates, including a stadium record 16,600 for a game against Eastern Kentucky in 1981. The stadium has received several upgrades over the past few seasons, including new field turf prior to the 2007 season, and new chair back seats being installed for 2011.





STABLES

The Murray State locker room, which is known as the Stables, received a face lift during the offseason as the area was rearranged to optimize space. The lockers were reconfigured in rows to create room at the entrance, where two big screen TVs were installed. Lockers honoring the two retired jerseys at MSU, No. 10 Larry Tillmand and No. 11 Michael Proctor, were also installed at the end of the two center rows.





HORSESHOE LOUNGE





The Horseshoe Lounge gives the Murray State football team a chance to relax when they are not in class or in meetings or practice. The lounge, which is accessible from the locker room, features a pool table, three big screen TVs, comfortable leather seating, and three computers for research and school work. Each TV is equipped with an XBOX 360 Kinect and Playstation 3.

PADDOCK

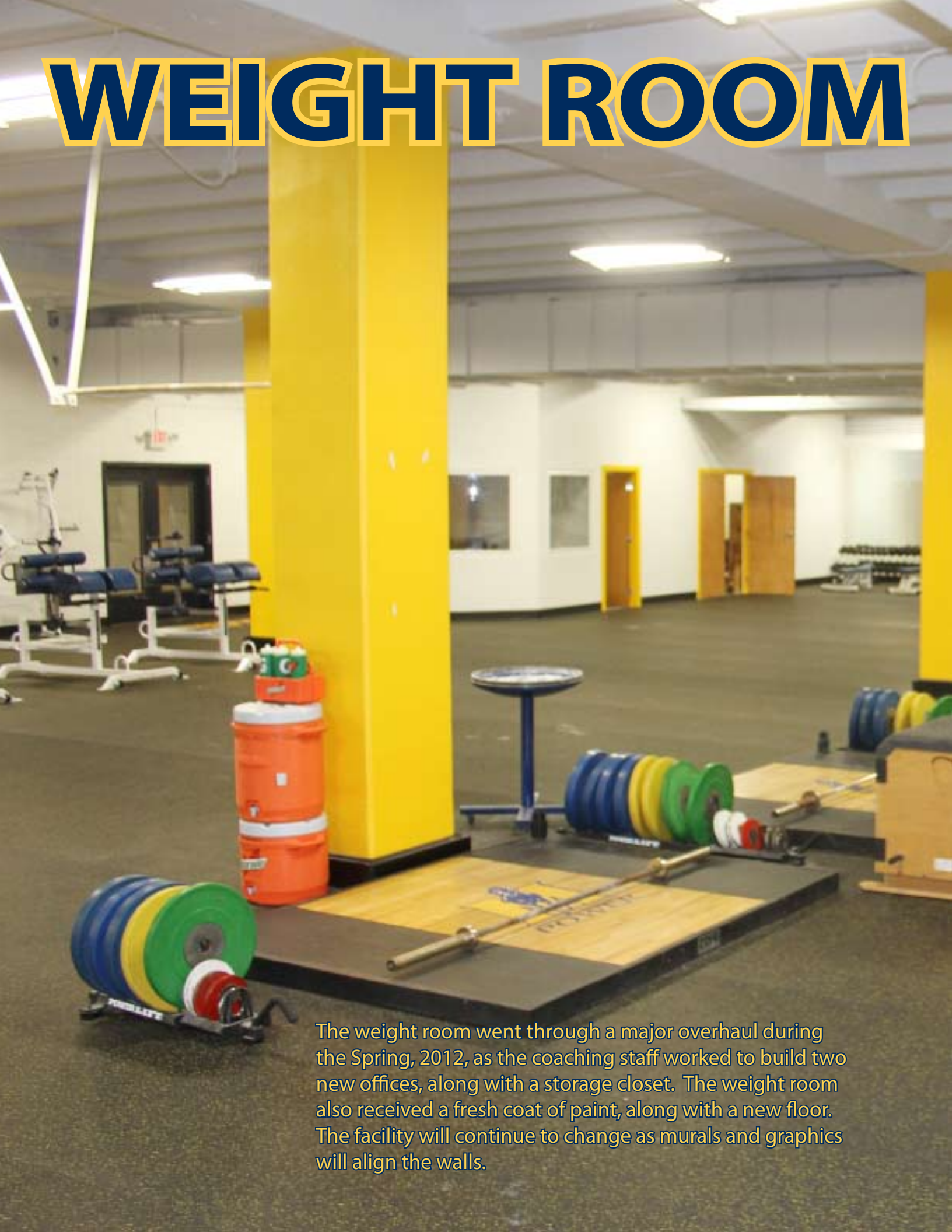
The Paddock give the Racers the opportunity to meet as a team, or as a smaller unit. The room consists of four rows of stadium seating, along with two large projectors. The room also includes four small separate meeting rooms for position meetings. The rooms include a big screen TV, as well as two rows of stadium seating.

The weight room went through a major overhaul during the Spring, 2012, as the coaching staff worked to build two new offices, along with a storage closet. The weight room also received a fresh coat of paint, along with a new floor. The facility will continue to change as murals and graphics will align the walls.



RACER I

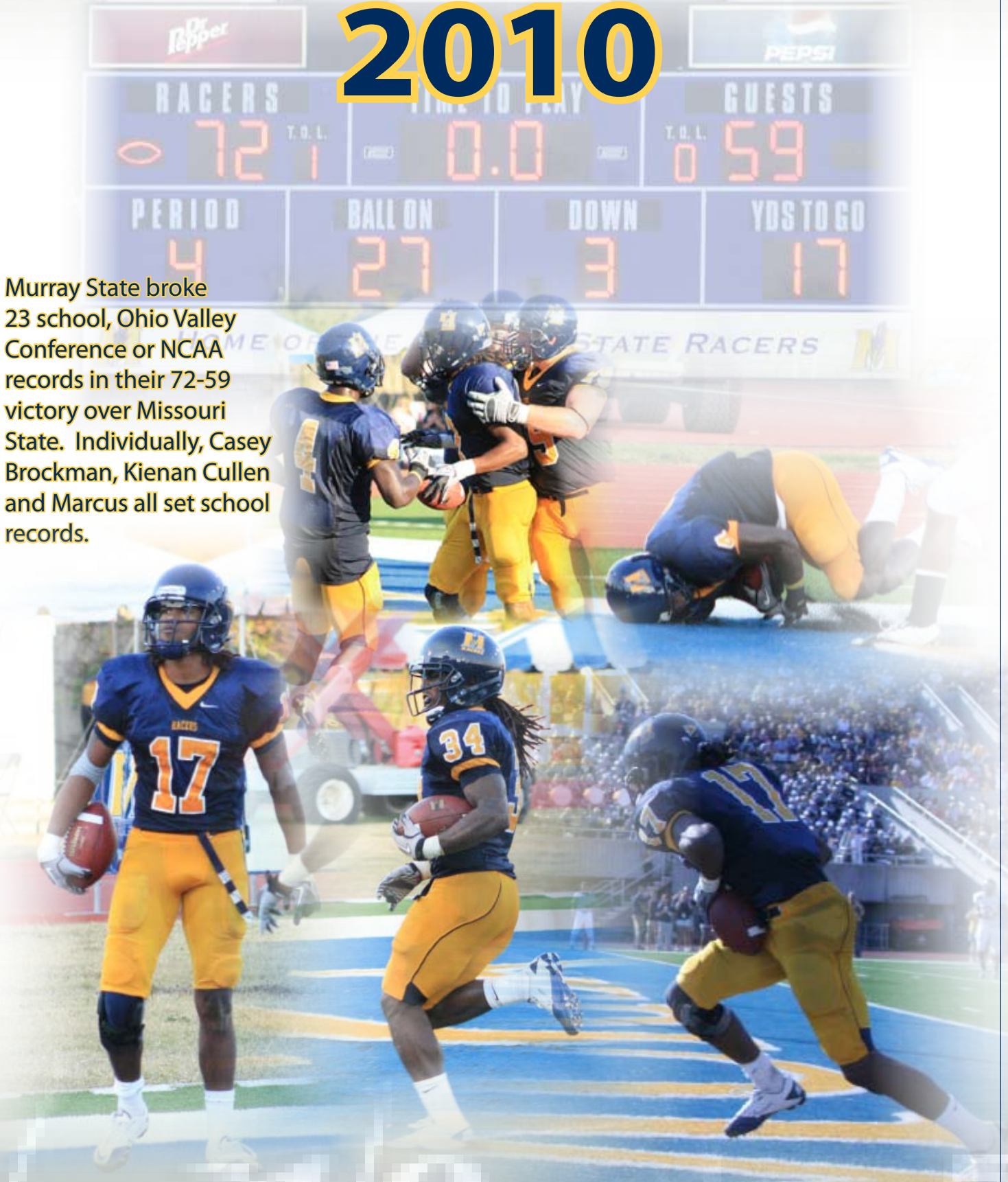




A tradition that dates back to 1976, a thoroughbred horse runs a lap around the Stewart Stadium track following every Racer touchdown. The original horse, Violet Cactus, is buried inside the stadium where the horse begins its run. Since 1985, each horse has carried the name Racer I.

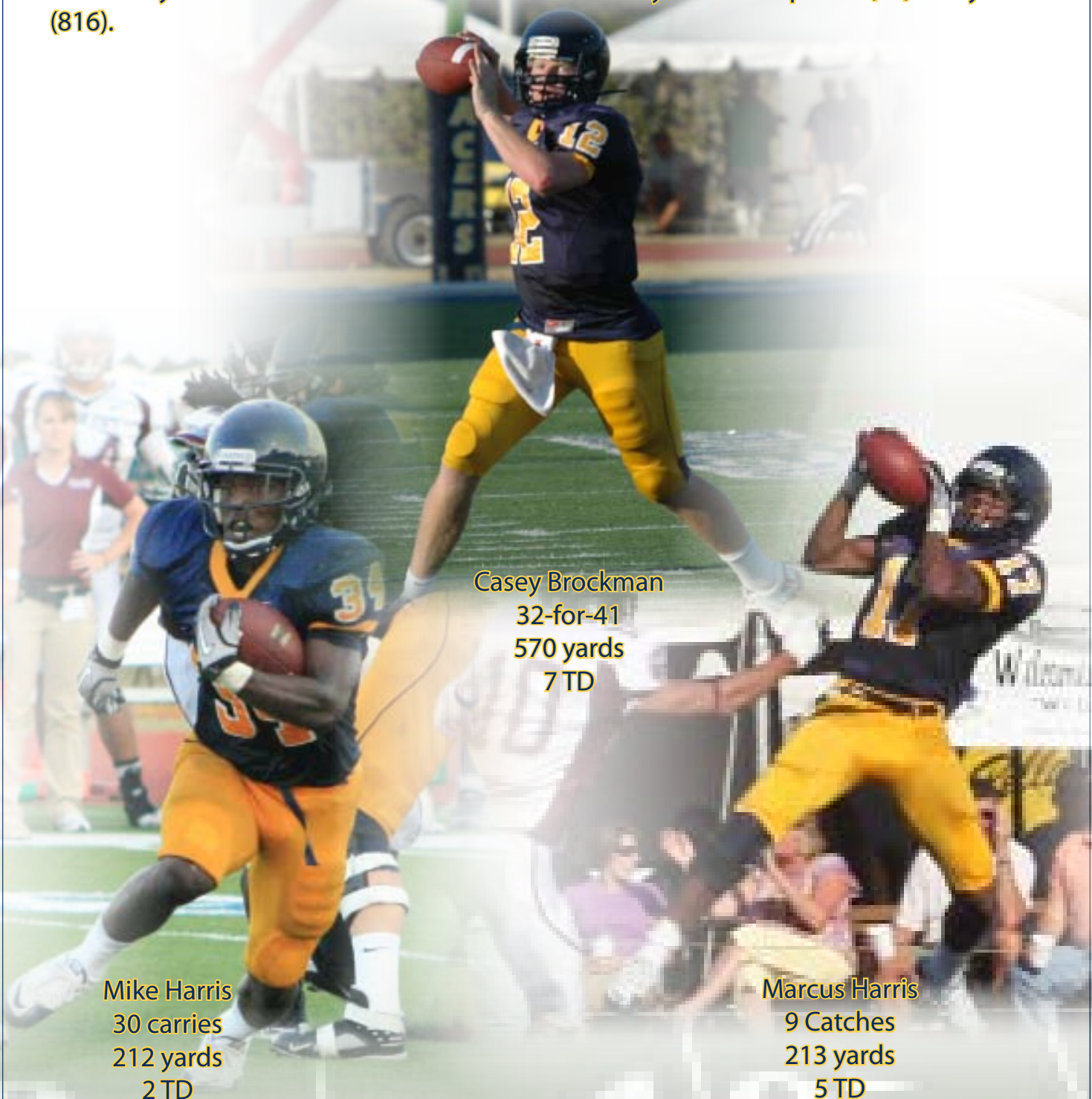
HOMECOMING 2010

Murray State broke 23 school, Ohio Valley Conference or NCAA records in their 72-59 victory over Missouri State. Individually, Casey Brockman, Kienan Cullen and Marcus all set school records.



500-200-200

Murray State made history against Missouri State as the Racers became the first FCS program to have a 500-yard passer, 200-yard receiver and a 200-yard rusher in the same game. The Racers accomplished the feat in front of a rowdy Homecoming crowd as Casey Brockman threw for a school-record 570 yards, Marcus Harris had 213 yards receiving and Mike Harris rushed for 212 yards. Their performances were all part of a record day that saw the Racers set a new modern-day record for points (72) and yards (816).

Media Information

Welcome

The Murray State University Athletics Media Relations Department is pleased to assist you with the coverage of Racer football. John Brush, media relations assistant, will serve as the media relations contact for MSU football. Brush can be reached at 270-809-7044, via fax at 270-809-6814, or via email at jbrush@murraystate.edu.

Credentials

Credentials for all Murray State University football games are for working media only. Requests for media credentials should be made at least five days prior to the game. All credential requests should be directed to John Brush, Media Relations Assistant.

Credential Pick-Up

Media members can pick-up their credentials at the Media Will Call entrance located at Gate 3 of Stewart Stadium. Photo identification is required for pick up.

Game Procedures

Press Box - Seating in the press box is limited to WORKING MEDIA ONLY. Space is limited and members of the media will be assigned seats. Spouses, dates, children and other non-workers are not permitted in working media areas in compliance with the working code of the Football Writers Association of America.

Photographers - Print and television photographers are allowed to shoot from both sidelines and both end zones, but are not allowed in the team bench areas unless authorized by the MSU media relations staff.

Parking - A limited number of parking spaces are available for each home game. The media parking area is located on the east side of the Regional Special Events Center behind Stewart Stadium. Members of the media who cover MSU regularly will be issued parking passes prior to the start of the season. Visiting media members need to contact the MSU media relations office to request parking.

Press Box Services - Complete individual and team statistics, play-by-play and scoring summary will be available to members of the media following each game. Prior to the game, stats, rosters, notes and other information will be made available. Additionally, a limited number of phone lines for media members are available in the press box upon request.

Visiting Radio - A courtesy line is available for the official radio network of each visiting team. Anyone intending to use remote pick-up equipment must contact Neal Bradley of the Racer Sports Network at (270) 753-2400.

Pre-Game Meal - A light meal will be served in the press box prior to each home game. Drinks are available throughout the game.



Daily Media Availability

Monday: **Chris Hatcher** and select players will be available at the media luncheon at 11:30 a.m. at the Racer Room inside Stewart Stadium.

Tuesday: Head Coach **Chris Hatcher**, assistant coaches and players will be available at the conclusion of practice.

Wednesday: Head Coach **Chris Hatcher**, assistant coaches and players will be available at the conclusion of practice.

Thursday: Head Coach **Chris Hatcher** available to the media.

Friday and Sunday: No Availability.

Saturday: Post-game availability only. Members of the MSU Athletics Media Relations staff will escort media representatives to the appropriate areas following the conclusion of the game. The Murray State locker room, home and away, is closed to the media at all times.

Head Coach Chris Hatcher and selected Racer players will be brought to the designated interview area. At home games, that area is the Racer Room, located in Stewart Stadium (first floor).

At the midway point of the fourth quarter, interview requests will be collected.

For games in Murray, the opposing head coach will meet with the media inside the opponent interview room. A representative from the MSU Media Relations Office will be on hand to assist the media in finding this area. Interviews with the head coach and players from the visiting team will be based on the post-game policy of that institution.

Practice Procedures

Covering Practice: Practices are generally open to the media and public. Head coach Chris Hatcher reserves the right to close practice at any time.

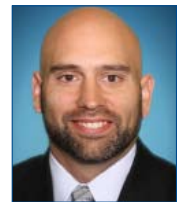

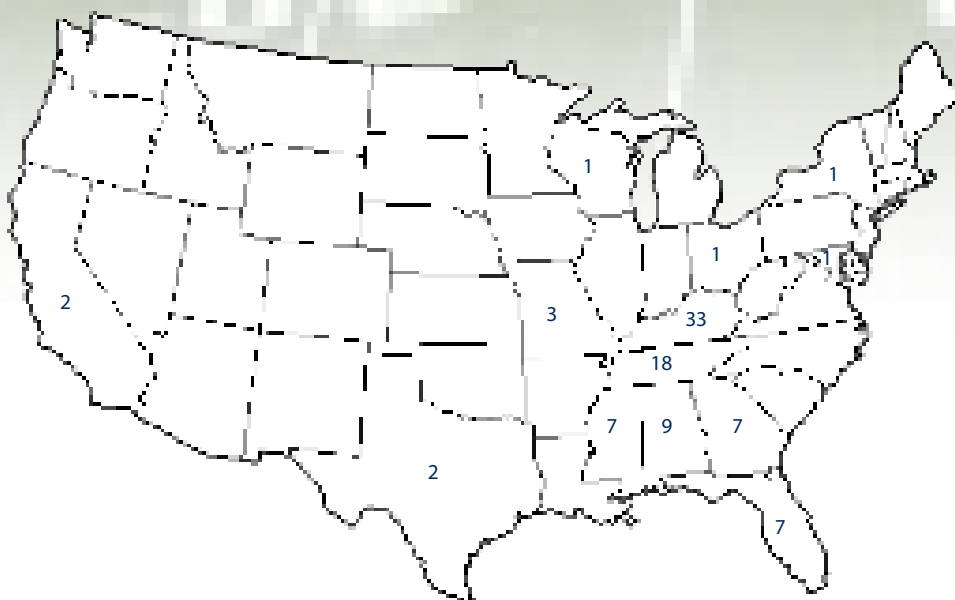

Quarterbacks

The biggest question mark entering the 2013 season: how will the Racers replace record-setting All-America quarterback Casey Brockman under center? Brockman re-wrote the single-season and career passing records after starting the final 28 games of his career.

Sophomore **KD Humphries** is the leading candidate to take over the signal calling. Humphries won the back-up job coming out of camp as a true freshman in 2012.

Humphries appeared in five games in his freshman campaign. He finished the year going 8-for-11 for 81 yards and a touchdown. He also rushed for 33 yards on seven carries. He threw his first collegiate touchdown against Austin Peay, as he completed a pair of passes for 30 yard, including a nine-yard touchdown.

Junior **Parks Frazier** emerged from spring practice as the back-up to Humphries. Frazier spent the 2012 season as the scout team quarterback after transferring at semester from Northeast Mississippi Community College.

Frazier threw for 973 yards and 12 touchdowns, helping the Tigers reach the playoffs in his lone season at NMCC. He began his career by red-shirting his freshman season at Mississippi.

Junior **CJ Bennett** transferred from South Alabama in January and was part of the three-way battle during spring practice.

Bennett spent the last three seasons as the starter at South Alabama. He threw for 3,409 yards and 21 touchdowns as the first starting quarterback in the programs history.

Incoming freshman **Mitch Stults** will join the race this season. Stults comes to MSU after earning Alabama 3A Player of the Year honors at Hamilton High School. He ended his prep career as Alabama's all-time leader in total offense with 11,620 yards, while amassing 139 total touchdowns.

Running Backs

The Racers entered the 2012 season with question marks in the backfield. When the dust settled, MSU possessed one of the top running-back tandems in the FCS.

This season, the duo of **Jaamal Berry** and **Duane Brady** looked to improve on the impressive numbers from a season ago.

Berry was selected to the Ohio Valley Conference Newcomer Team after rushing for 675 yards and seven touchdowns on 95 carries. He added 29 catches for 234 yards and a score.

Berry recorded a pair of 100-yard performances, including a season-best 163 yards and three touchdowns in a victory over Tennessee State. He also rushed for 142 yards and a score against Tennessee Tech.

Brady continued his solid career by rushing for 589 yards and eight touchdowns on 118 carries. He also had 35 catches for 269 yards and a touchdown.

Brady recorded his second career 100-yard rushing performance when he ran for 112 yards against UT Martin. Just two games prior, Brady rushed for three scores against Tennessee Tech.

Freshman **Marcus Holliday** will add depth to the backfield after red-shirting in 2012.

Holliday was selected as the District 16-AAA Offensive Player of the Year as a senior at Fairley High School. He finished the season 1,350 yards and 19 touchdowns despite missing three games.

Freshman **Demetric Johnson** joins the Racer backfield after completing a standout prep career at South Pittsburg High School.

Johnson finished up as the runner-up as Mr. Football in Tennessee after rushing for 1,974 yards and 32 touchdowns as a senior. His 14.6 yards per carry is the highest ever in the Chattanooga area.

Wide Receivers

The heart of the Racers offense will once again be the receiving corps. The group returns six of its top nine pass catchers from a season ago.

Leading the way is All-American **Walter Powell**. The senior set new school records last season by catching 94 passes for 1,213 yards and 10 touchdowns.

The speedster also set a new record with six 100-yard receiving records. All 10 of his touchdown receptions came over the final seven games, including a game against UT Martin, where he finished with 14 catches for 196 yards and three scores.

Senior **Jordan Morrow** made the switch from running back to wide receiver in the middle of last season, and went on to catch 31 passes for 157 yards and two touchdowns.

Morrow may be small in stature, but he uses his speed and elusiveness to find holes over the middle. He also knows what to do with the football once he gets it in his hands.

Junior **Nevar Griffin** will move to outside this season, and play opposite of Powell.

Griffin spent the last two seasons playing in the slot, where he caught 23 passes for 294 yards and two touchdowns a season ago. In his two years as a Racer, the former walk-on has caught 54 passes for 550 yards and five touchdowns.

Sophomore **Janawski Davis** showed his toughness to go over the middle last season. This season, Davis will move inside and take over the spot formerly occupied by Griffin.

Serving as Powell's backup last season, Davis caught 16 passes for 188 yards.

Sophomore **Jeremy Harness** adapted quickly to playing receiver in 2012, after playing running back in high school.

Harness finished his freshman season with 13 catches for 154 yards and a touchdown. He did get one carry out of the backfield, and turned it into a seven-yard touchdown.

Fellow sophomore **Pokey Harris** made the transition to wide receiver in the spring, after spending his freshman season in the backfield. He spent the spring learning the new position, while splitting his time as a member of the baseball team.

Harris was a key contributor on special teams all season, and rushed for 74 yards on 18 carries.

Paul Rice is another sophomore that will push for playing time at one of the slot positions. Rice appeared in nine games as a freshman, catching just one pass.

Season Outlook

Senior **Josh Brown** may not catch many passes, but he plays a vital role in the Racers running game as a blocking tight end.

Brown gets used in various packages, and has even thrown a pass in each of his two seasons. Last season, Brown caught a pair of passes for eight yards.

A pair of freshman will look to push for playing time at the outside and slot receiver positions.

Marqavius King will play on the outside after closing out his prep career as a quarterback at Abbeville High School.

As a senior, King threw for 1,583 yards and 31 touchdowns, while also rushing for 964 yards and 15 scores in earning conference MVP honors.

Jesse Blackburn brings size to the slot receiver position. He is the prototypical slot receiver at 6-3, 240.

As a senior at Gardendale high school last season, Blackburn caught 34 passes for 502 yards and five touchdowns. He was named honorable mention all-state by the Alabama Sports Writers Association.

Offensive Line

No offense can be successful with the five guys up front opening holes and protecting the quarterback. In the Racers fast-paced offense, it is the these guys who are the unsung heroes.

Over the last two seasons, the Racers are the only team in the FCS that ranks in the top five in total offense both seasons.

The offensive line will be anchored in the middle by three-year starter **Harris Bivin** at center.

Bivin has started the last 16 games at center, and is considered one of the most underrated lineman in the Ohio Valley Conference.

The left side of the offensive line remains in tact from last season with the return of juniors **Drew Kelly** and **Zach Littlefield**. The duo combined to start all but one game a season ago.

Kelly anchored down the left tackle spot in all 11 games last season. Littlefield started the first 10 games, before missing the season finale with an injury.

Senior **Hunter Hogan** will take over at right guard this season. Hogan joined the Racers last season after playing at Tyler Junior College.

Hogan made three starts at right guard in 2012, and then filled in for the injured Littlefield at left guard in the finale.

The only major hole along the front is who will replace four-year starter Roderick Tomlin at right tackle.

Sophomore **Hunter Holloway** appeared in three games last season and will battle for the starting spot.

Junior **Kamalie Matthews** made the switch from the defensive line and will battle Holloway for the starting spot.

Sophomore **Robert Olive** made one start at right guard last season and will serve as the backup to Hogan to start the season.

Fellow sophomore **Corey Gammon** returns for his second season to add depth behind Bivin at center.

The Racers added plenty of size during the signing period with the addition of four freshman offensive lineman.

Arbre Jones is the biggest of the group at 6-6, 310. Jones earned all-state honors at Memphis University School last season and helped the Owls reach the state championship game.

Koty Hix joins the Racers after earning first-team all-state honors at Fort Campbell High School. Hix averaged six pancake blocks per game, and allowed only two sacks his junior and senior seasons.

Jedediah Vivio will play tackle for the Racers after being selected to the Dandy Dozen Prospects in Middle Tennessee by the The Tennessean while playing at Goodpasture Christian School.

Eli Wilson will also play tackle after completing a standout career at Graves County High School. H earned first-team all-state honors as a senior after helping the Eagles to a district championship.

Defensive Line

The success of the defense starts up front with the defensive line. The Racers return three starters from a season ago, and have added plenty of depth in the offseason.

The defensive line will be playing for its third defensive line coach in the past three seasons. More so, the unit learned a new system in the spring that should help them to make a bigger impact.

Senior **Ayo Ojolola** is entering his third year as a starter and is the anchor of the line. He led all defensive linemen last season with 42 tackles and two sacks. He added five tackles for loss and a fumble recovery.

Fellow senior **Zac Ross** is coming off a strong first season in a Racer uniform. He finished with 32 tackles and led the linemen with six tackles for loss. He also added a fumble recovery.

Jeremy Brackett will anchor the middle of line this season. Brackett finished last season with 28 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and a pair of sacks.

The Racers added depth last January with the addition of three junior college defensive ends.

Junior **Travis Taylor** combines speed and strength that will allow him to be a versatile asset on the right side. Taylor earned all-conference honors at Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College last season, after posting 45 tackles and 4.5 sacks.

Junior **Chavez Sims** also went through spring practice and will battle for playing time on the right side. Sims posted 62 tackles and six sacks last season at Jones County Junior College.

Sims' junior college teammate, **Felton Collins**, also joined the Racers at semester and will battle on the left side. The converted tight end is coming off a season where he had 27 tackles and 2.5 sacks.

Sophomore **Jerrold Frazier** joined the Racers this summer after spending the previous two years at Middle Tennessee. Frazier will battle for playing time at nose tackle and is coming off a season where he had 12 tackles, including 4.5 for loss.

Sophomore **Demetrius Mason** signed with the Racers after playing at Iowa Central Community College.



Freshman **LaBront Scott** is no stranger to the local fans after closing out a standout career at Murray and Mayfield High Schools. He recorded 45 tackles as a senior at Murray, despite playing just four games. He earned first-team all-state honors as a junior while playing at Mayfield.

Linebackers

The strength of the defense will again lie with the linebackers. The Racers will take full advantage of their depth in defensive coordinator Dennis Therrell's new system.

One of the biggest additions to the group is the return of senior **Sam Small** in the middle. He missed last season, but led the team with 115 tackles in 2011.

Senior **Blake Salter** took over in the middle last season and ranked second on the team with 69 tackles. He will add depth with Small this season, and also have the ability to play alongside at the other inside spot.

Senior **Qua Huzzie** will move to the inside this season after playing on the outside the past two seasons. He finished last season with 58 tackles and a team-best 10 tackles for loss.

Junior college transfer **Kadeem Willis** will add quality depth in the middle this season. Willis posted 66 tackles and eight tackles-for-loss last season at ASA College.

There is also plenty of talent on the outside, led by senior **Corey Addison**. Addison has the rare combination of size and speed and should have a breakout senior season. He posted 38 tackles in his first season as a Racer.

Sophomore **T-Ray Malone** had a breakout freshman campaign and will look to continue to improve this season. He ranked fourth on the team in tackles with 51.

Senior **Anthony Hayes** made the switch from wide receiver midway through last season and made an immediate impact. He started the final three games at linebacker and had three tackles in the season finale.

Sophomore **Chris Dansby** returns after red-shirting a season ago. He posted 15 tackles and an interception in seven games as a true-freshman in 2011.

Freshman **Jonathan Jackson** joins the Racers after a record setting career at Mayfield High School. He finished his senior season with 166 tackles and closed out his career with 601.

Corners

The Racers return three players that started a handful of games at corner last season.

Senior **Darrian Skinner** enters his third year as a potential starter. He ranked third on the team last season with 40 solo tackles. He also returned a fumble 50 yards against Tennessee Tech.

Junior **Cadarious Sanders** enters his second season after transferring from South Carolina. Last season, he played in eight games and recorded 11 tackles.

Senior **Josh Manning** missed a pair of games with injury, but still finished with 28 tackles and tied for the team lead with six pass break-ups. He intercepted Florida State's EJ Manuel in his first collegiate game.

Senior **Darian Yahyavi** will move to corner this season after playing safety a season ago. He registered 39 tackles and six pass break-ups in his first season as a Racer.

Freshman **Cedric Jones** will add depth on the outside. He earned all-state honors at Memphis East High School after recording 63 tackles, four interceptions and 12 pass break-ups as a senior.

Safeties

The Racers will be led in the defensive backfield by four-year starting strong safety **Brandon Wicks**. Wicks led the team with 73 tackles and added an interception. He closed out last season with a career-best 16 tackles against Southeast Missouri.

Senior **Darrell Smith** returns for his second season as a Racer and will back up Wicks. Smith appeared in nine games last season and finished with 36 tackles, a pair of pass break-ups and a forced fumble.

Sophomore **Brandon Hathway** returns at free safety after a very strong freshman campaign. He posted 39 tackles and led the team with three fumble recoveries.

John Therrell transferred in from UNLV and will battle for a starting spot at free safety. Therrell missed the 2012 season with an injury and played mainly on special teams for the Rebels in 2011.

Special Teams

The Racers will be very strong on special teams in 2013, as they return their kicker, punter, holder and long snapper. They entered last season looking for starters at all four spots.

Junior **Jordan Benton** will handle the kicking duties for the second-straight year. Benton went 11-for-14 on field goals and was 53-of-54 on extra points. He ended the season by making 52-straight extra points.

Senior **Steven Mix** will handle the punting duties for the second year in a row. Mix averaged 41.1 yards on 50 punts last season. He had nine punts over 50 yards and 18 punts downed inside the 20-yard line.

Junior **Carson Beyer** will serve as the team's holder. Beyer held on every kick attempt last season.

Sophomore **Christian Duncan** returns for his second year as the long snapper. Duncan snapped on all field goals and punts in his first season as a Racer.

The return game will be anchored by All-American punt returner **Walter Powell**. He is considered the top punt returner in the FCS, according to *Phil Steele*.

Powell averaged 15.8 yards on 19 punt returns. He returned two punts for touchdowns, including an FCS-record 100-yard return against SEMO.

As a kickoff returner, Powell returned 23 kickoffs and averaged 26.3 yards per return.

Senior **Jaamal Berry** will join Powell on kickoff returns. Berry returned kicks in just one game last season, averaging 18 yards on two returns.

Very few schools in the country can boast the kind of coaching tradition that has taken up residence at Murray State University, especially in the last 25 years. Consider the men who in recent history have guided the Racers on the football field:

- **Mike Gottfried** left Murray State to coach at Kansas and Pittsburgh before becoming one of the top college football television analysts in the country while working for ESPN.

- **Frank Beamer** left Murray State for his alma mater, Virginia Tech, where he guided the Hokies to a spot in the national championship game against Florida State in 2000, earning several national coach of the year awards.

- **Houston Nutt** took the Racers to unprecedented heights before leaving to restore the winning tradition at Arkansas and Ole Miss.

Now the torch is carried by a coach who has proven to be a winner and has all the makings of becoming the next Murray State football head coaching legend....**Chris Hatcher**.

The Chris Hatcher era officially began at Murray State, Dec. 21, 2009, when Director of Athletics Allen Ward introduced Hatcher as the 17th head coach in front of a standing-room only crowd inside the Murray Room.

Since arriving on campus, Hatcher has returned the Racer program back to its winning tradition, while also transforming Stewart Stadium into one of the premiere facilities in the country.

Hatcher and his coaching staff have been busy renovating the locker room, film room and weight room, while also building a new players lounge, equipped with all the top gaming devices, pool table and computers for school work and watching film.

Success has followed Hatcher throughout his career, as the former Division II National Player of the Year has garnered an overall record of 112-42 in his 13 years as a head coach. Included in those 13 seasons are six trips to the postseason, two appearances in the National Championship game and the 2004 Division II National Championship.

Hatcher's wide-open style of offense, known as the 'Hatch Attack,' quickly won the hearts of the Murray community, while giving opposing defensive coordinators nightmares.

In his first three years at MSU, the Racer offense has rewritten the record books. Powered by the first All-American quarterback in school history, Casey Brockman, the Racers have set 21 single-game records and have bolstered three of the top five passing offenses in school history.

For the third-straight season, the 2012 Racer offense was tops in the Ohio Valley Conference. MSU averaged a school record 484.4 yards of offense per game, while also setting a new single-season record by averaging 348.9 yards through the air.

The victory over Tennessee State in the season finale was the 100th in the career for Hatcher. The victory made Hatcher the fifth youngest coach, youngest in the 21st century, to record 100 coaching victories. At 37 years and 274 days at the time of the victory, Hatcher ranks just behind Pop Warner and ahead of Amos Alonso Staqq.

Hatcher came to MSU after a three-year stint at Georgia Southern, where he led the

Head Coach

Eagles to an 18-15 record and a 12-11 mark in the competitive Southern Conference.

In his first season with the Eagles in 2007, Hatcher led GSU to the second-best regular season turnaround in program history, a plus-4 improvement from 2006. The Eagles ranked among the national leaders in various categories on offense, defense and special teams. He also coached five All-America players, including quarterback Jayson Foster, the second Walter Payton award winner at GSU.

The Eagles returned to the national rankings after a 14-week hiatus as the Hatcher era got off to a 4-1 start. GSU climbed as high as No. 11, after the Eagles recorded three-straight victories at No. 5 Appalachian State, ending the Mountaineers 30-game home winning streak, at home against No. 25 The Citadel and at No. 10 Wofford.

The prolific offense ranked first in rushing, eighth in total offense, eighth in scoring offense and 23rd in sacks allowed. The defense was 14th in turnover margin and 17th in fumbles recovered, while the special teams ranked 25th in net punting.

The 2008 season saw Hatcher guide the Eagles to the program's 25th winning season in 27 years.

In late October, the Eagles set an NCAA record for the largest fourth-quarter comeback as GSU erased a 31-3 deficit for a thrilling 38-31 overtime victory at Western Carolina. The OT contest was just the first of an NCAA record four overtime games played by the Eagles in 2008.

The 'Hatch Attack' provided impressive numbers in all three phases. The offense ranked 20th nationally in passing and scoring, while the defense ranked 26th in sacks and 22nd in tackles-for-loss. The special teams units finished 14th in punt returns and 36th in kickoff returns.

All of this was done as Hatcher and his staff were forced to play in upwards of 30 freshman on a consistent basis throughout the season. In all, five Eagles received all-league honors and seven freshman representing offense, defense and special teams were named to the inaugural SoCon All-Freshman Team.

Prior to his time at GSU, Hatcher molded Valdosta State into one of the most dominant teams in Division II.

The winningest coach in Blazers' history, Hatcher was 76-12 at his alma mater. When Hatcher took over as head coach in 2000, he wasted no time molding the Valdosta State program into the 'Hatch Attack'. In his first year back at VSU, Hatcher took a 4-7 squad the previous year and turned it around to a 10-2 record (8-1 in GSC action) and a berth in the Division II playoffs. He coached quarterback Dusty Bonner, who was a two-time winner of the Harlon Hill Trophy as the NCAA Division II Player of the Year, an award Hatcher won himself in 1994.

His 2001 and 2002 teams posted back-to-back undefeated records during the regular season, part of a Gulf South Conference record 35 straight victories during the regular season.

During the 2004 championship season, the Blazers lost their season-opener before rattling off 13 consecutive victories, capped by a 36-31 victory over Pittsburg State in the title game. Hatcher was named 'National Coach of the Year' by the American Football Coaches Association and was the offensive coordinator for the East squad at the Hula Bowl.

In 2005, Valdosta opened the season ranked No. 1 for four-straight weeks and saw the season culminate with a sixth-straight NCAA postseason appearance. Despite an 8-2 record in 2006, the 10th-ranked Blazers did not receive an invitation to the playoffs, marking the first time that occurred in the Hatcher era.

The 2006 team finished sixth nationally in passing offense (283 yards per game), 12th in scoring offense (34.9 ppg) and 19th in total offense (389.9 yards). However, Hatcher's teams have been successful in all three facets. The 2006 defense ranked 27th nationally in scoring defense (15.7 points allowed) while the special teams ranked third in punt returns (17.3 yards) and blocked seven kicks.

The Macon (Ga.) native spent one year as quarterbacks/tight ends coach at the University of Central Florida where he worked with Miami Dolphins quarterback

Daunte Culpepper. He then spent three years working with the quarterbacks at the University of Kentucky where he worked under former VSU head coach Hal Mumme. During his time with the Wildcats, he coached the No. 1 NFL draft pick, All-America quarterback Tim Couch.

While at UK, Hatcher and the Wildcats played in the 1999 Outback Bowl, the program's first New Year's Day Bowl in 47 years, then followed that the following year with a berth in the '99 Music City Bowl. It marked the first time the Wildcats had consecutive bowl appearances in 15 years.

Hatcher carried his success on the playing field to help him develop into one of the nation's winningest coaches. A two-time All-American quarterback at VSU (1993 and 1994), Hatcher threw for 11,363 yards and 121 touchdowns during his stellar career. During his senior year in 1994, he led the Blazers to their first postseason berth, advancing to the quarterfinals, and when it was all said and done set 29 VSU passing and total offense records.

Among the national records he once set were a 68.5 career completion percentage and streak of 20-straight completions in a game against New Haven. Hatcher held 14 Valdosta State, 13 Gulf South Conference and 17 Division II national records. He also started 41 consecutive games, posting a 29-10-2 record.

Not only did Hatcher excel on the field, he was just as successful in the classroom. Twice he received the Gulf South Conference's Commissioner's Trophy which is awarded to the league's Most Outstanding Student-Athlete. He finished his senior year by winning several national honors including: the NCAA Top Eight Award, the CoSIDA Academic All-America National Player of the Year and a postgraduate scholarship from the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame.

At the time when Hatcher won the Harlon Hill Trophy, he won by the second-largest voting margin in the then-19-year history of the award. Hatcher was also voted the GSC Football team of the 1990s.

The honors continued to add up even after his playing days. Hatcher was named to the Valdosta State University Athletic Hall of Fame in 2001, in his first year of eligibility. The personable head coach was also elected into the Macon Sports Hall of Fame the same year.

In 2005, Hatcher was inducted into the Division II Hall of Fame.

Hatcher graduated from Valdosta State in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in health and physical education.

He and his wife, Lori, also a graduate of VSU, are the parents of a son, Ty, and daughter, Talley.

Shawn Bostick enters his fourth season as the assistant head coach and offensive line coach at Murray State.

Bostick has been alongside Chris Hatcher since their playing days at Valdosta State.

Under Bostick's guidance, the MSU offensive line has paved the way for the top offense in the Ohio Valley Conference each of the past three seasons.

The 2012 offensive line was anchored by all-conference right tackle Roderick Tomlin. The free-agent signee by the Jacksonville Jaguars was one of three players to start every game. Center Harris Bivin and left tackle Drew Kelley also started all 11 games, while left guard Zach Littlefield made 10 starts.

As a unit, they paved the way for an offense that amassed 5,328 yards of total offense, including 3,838 through the air.

The Racer offense went over 500 yards in six of the 11 games, including 747 yards of offense against UT Martin. More know for its aerial assault, the offense rushed for over 200 yards three times, including a 284-yard effort against Tennessee State, and a six touchdown game against Tennessee Tech.

The 2011 offensive line also had four players start at least 10 games.

As a unit, they helped the Racer offense amass 5,070 yards of total offense, marking just the fourth time it has happened in school history.

On the ground, the offensive line paved the way for the first 1,000-yard rusher since 2002. The offense averaged 152.3 yards a game on the ground, and had eight 100-yard rushing performances.

Senior left tackle Raymond Hopson became the first Racer offensive lineman to earn All-OVC honors when he was selected to the second team.

In his first season with the Racers, Bostick took an offensive line that was considered a work in progress, and turned them into one of the top offensive lines in the OVC.

In fact, one national FCS blog tabbed the Racer offensive line as the best in the OVC, and one of the top five offensive fronts in all of the FCS.

The right side of the line, guard Andy Mahoney and tackle Roderick Tomlin, started all 11 games in 2010, while center Rydecki started the final 10 games of the season. On the left side, tackle Raymond Hopson made 10 starts, while Elbert Ojendis took over at guard the final three games of the season.

The Racer offensive line, which did not feature a senior, allowed just 16 sacks in 515 pass attempts. The unit helped the Racers to rank in the top five nationally in passing offense, total offense and scoring offense.

Bostick came to MSU after serving as the offensive line coach at Georgia Southern the previous three seasons.

The 2009 offensive line featured three underclassmen on a unit that gained 279.4 yards a game of total offense, including 96.5 yards a game on the ground.

In 2008, the GSU offensive line had the formidable task of replacing all five starters, including two All-Americans. Despite not having a single lineman receive All-Southern Conference honors, the offense

still ranked 20th nationally in passing offense, 20th in scoring offense and 37th in total offense.

During his first year on staff, Bostick inherited a talented and experienced offensive line, and built on that. Two linemen earned First-Team All-America honors, guard Marcelo Estrada and tackle Russell Orr. Both were named All-Southern Conference, along with tackle Brad Williams. They paved the way for the backs as once again Georgia Southern led the nation in rushing offense.

In fact, the Eagles ranked eighth nationally in total offense and scoring offense. When the offense needed a clutch play, the linemen helped pave the way as GSU finished first nationally in fourth down conversions. The linemen played a big role in fewest sacks allowed, finishing 23rd nationally.

His arrival in Statesboro, Ga. ended an 18-year affiliation with Valdosta State, from his playing days to then assistant coach.

Bostick served as assistant head coach in charge of the offensive line for eight years at VSU. His O-Line was part of one of the most productive offensive units in Division II.

In 2006, the Blazers ranked 20th nationally in total offense (390 yards/game), sixth in passing offense (283 yards), ninth in scoring offense (35 points) and 21st in team passing efficiency (145.38).

Bostick was part of the 2004 National Championship team and the national runner-up in 2002. During his tenure, Bostick coached three All-America selections (Jason King, Tully Payne and Torrey Howard) and eight who were named All-Gulf South Conference. Over the previous seven years, the offense scored 50 or more points 17 times.

The offensive line played a vital role in the success at Valdosta State. During Coach Hatcher's seven year stint in charge, the offense averaged more than 32 points per game in six seasons. Every year the offense totaled at least 380 yards per game.

As a former walk-on who eventually earned a scholarship, Bostick was a three-year letterwinner from 1991-93. During the 1993 campaign in which the Blazers finished 8-3, Bostick was the starting center on an offensive line that allowed only 10 sacks of Chris Hatcher.

From 1994-95 he worked as a student assistant coach under Hal Mumme. Bostick was part of the 1994 coaching staff, leading Valdosta State to its first-ever playoff appearance.

In 1996 he worked with the running backs, as the Blazers won their first conference championship. During the 1997 campaign, he served as a graduate assistant coach under Mike Kelley, returning to the offensive line. The next season, he moved into his first full-time coaching position and worked with the offensive line every year since.

One of Bostick's players, two-year starter Richard Collier, went to the NFL and was with the Jacksonville Jaguars until he was tragically injured.

A 1997 graduate of Valdosta State, Bostick received his bachelor's degree in Education.

He and his wife, Sheila, have a daughter, Emma, and a son, Walker.

Mitch Stewart enters his fourth season at Murray State, and the third as the team's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Despite being one of the youngest coordinators in the FCS, Stewart was being groomed for this role since his playing days at Valdosta State.

In his first two seasons as offensive coordinator, Stewart has spearheaded an offense that has ranked among the tops in the FCS in passing offense, total offense and scoring offense. In fact, the Racers are the only team in the FCS to rank in the top five in total offense each of the past two seasons.

The 2012 season saw the Racers lead the OVC and rank fifth nationally in passing offense, total offense and scoring offense.

The offense set new school records by averaging 484.4 yards a game, and 348.9 passing yards per game.

Despite all the attention the offense gets through the air, the Racers also rushed for 135.5 yards a game and scored 23 touchdowns.

Quarterback Casey Brockman earned All-America honors for the second-straight season after setting new school records for attempts, completions yards and touchdowns.

Brockman got the ball in the hands of his playmaker, Walter Powell, as he set new records for receptions and receiving yards.

In his first season calling plays, the Racer offense accumulate 5,070 yards of offense, marking just the fourth time in school history the team surpassed the 5,000-yard mark in a season. The 460.9 yards per game also ranked fourth all-time.

The offense put up over 450 yards in six of the 11 contests, including a 707-yard effort against Tennessee State. In fact, the Racers put up at least 400 yards of offense in all but one conference game.

Brockman set then-school records for attempts and completions, while throwing for the second-most yards and touchdowns in a season. For his efforts, Brockman became the first MSU signal caller to earn All-America honors.

Brockman made history in the final game of the 2011 season as he threw for a pair of touchdowns, rushed for one and caught another in the victory over Southeast Missouri.

Known as a pass-happy offense, Stewart implemented a balanced attack that saw Mike Harris become just the 10th 1,000-yard rusher in school history. The numbers show the Racers threw the ball 493 times, while attempting 391 rushing attempts.

Stewart spent the 2010 season as the wide receivers coach for the Racers.

Under his guidance, two Racer receivers re-wrote the single-season record books.

Senior Marcus Harris missed two games with injury, but still manage to catch 84 passes for 1,057 yards and seven touchdowns. He ranked second on the single-season list for receptions, tied for second

in yards and tied for eighth in touchdowns. Harris also left MSU as the all-time leader in receptions (216) and yards (2,471), while tying fourth in touchdowns (19).

Harris ended his career with four-straight 100-yard performances on his way to earning Second-Team All-America honors from the *Associated Press* and *The Sports Network*.

Freshman Arthur Brackett was the compliment to Harris, as he established a new freshman record with 62 catches for 617 yards and three touchdowns. He caught a touchdown pass in each of his first two games, and later added 13 catches against Jacksonville State. The 13 receptions falls just two shy of the FCS freshman record.

Stewart came to Murray after spending the previous three seasons as a member of the Georgia Southern coaching staff. While at GSU, Stewart worked with the wide receivers and handled team travel.

In 2009, a pair of true freshman made immediate impacts as Jamere Valentine caught 51 passes and Patrick Barker added 40, ranking second and third, respectively, on the school's single-season receptions list.

In his second season, the Eagles offense led the SoCon and ranked 20th nationally in passing offense. That also helped GSU finish 20th nationally in scoring offense and 37th in total offense.

The speedy receiver corps accounted for the majority of the team's 42 receptions of 30-plus yards. Wide receiver Raja Andrews shattered three season records, one single-game mark and the career receptions record.

From 2001-05, Stewart played quarterback at Valdosta State. He was part of the 2002 national runner-up squad and 2004 National Championship team. Stewart earned the start in the first round playoff game his senior year.

After his playing days (Spring 2006), Stewart served as a graduate assistant coach for the Blazers, working with the quarterbacks.

In the summer of 2006, he took a job at Newnan High School, assisting the offensive coordinator in implementing the Blazers' offense. That fall, Newnan won its first region title in 14 years and qualified for the state playoffs.

A standout quarterback at Northgate High School in Newnan, Ga., Stewart helped instrument one of the biggest turnarounds in the state. Following a 1-9 sophomore year, Northgate went 7-3 his junior year, earning the title as most improved team in Georgia, and qualified for the playoffs. In his final year, Stewart led Northgate to an 11-2 record.

Stewart received his bachelor's degree in business education from Valdosta State in 2005 and began work on a master's degree.

He and his wife, Rikki, are the proud parents of daughter, Stella, born July 4, 2011.

Dennis Therrell enters his first season as the Racers defensive coordinator, working with the safeties.

No stranger to Stewart Stadium, Therrell returns for his second stint leading the Racer defense.

Just like in 2004, Therrell will be in charge of restoring order to a defense that ranked near the bottom in yards and points allowed.

He joins Chris Hatcher's staff after spending the previous three seasons as assistant coach with the Las Vegas Locos of the United Football League.

Therrell served as the defensive backs coach in 2012, after spending the previous two seasons working with the linebackers. He helped guide the Locos to the 2010 UFL championship, as well as a runner-up finish in 2011.

The Locos secondary was responsible for four of the team's seven interceptions in just four games.

Therrell joined the Locos staff after spending the previous three seasons on the staff at UNLV. He joined the running rebels in 2007 as the linebackers coach, before taking over as the team's defensive coordinator in 2008 and 2009.

In his first year with the Rebels, Therrell tutored linebacker Beau Bell on his way to being named the Mountain West Conference Defensive Player of the Year. Bell would go on to be selected by the Cleveland Browns in the 4th round of the 2008 NFL Draft.

Therrell continued to work with the linebackers in 2008, guiding Jason Beauchamp to second-team all-conference accolades.

Prior to his time at UNLV, Therrell spent the 2006 season as a volunteer assistant at Auburn.

Therrell first arrived at MSU in 2004 when he was named the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach.

In his first season, Therrell led the Racers to the top scoring defense in the OVC, allowing just 20 points per game. It was an improvement from a season ago when MSU ranked 6th in scoring defense, allowing 118 more points. Even more impressive, the Racers allowed just 32 points in the fourth quarter all season.

The Pikeville, Tenn., native began his coaching career at the high school level, serving for one year at Campbell County High School and three seasons at Rhea County High School in Tennessee. His Rhea County team reached the state championship in 1981.

Therrell jumped into the collegiate ranks in 1983, serving as a graduate assistant at Tennessee. While at UT, he helped the Vols to the 1983 Citrus Bowl and 1984 Sun Bowl.

Therrell moved on to Middle Tennessee following the 1984 campaign, spending two seasons on the Blur Raiders' coaching staff. During that time, MTSU ranked among the top teams in Division I-AA and closed out the 1985 season ranked No. 1 nationally.

He moved on to Lock Haven University where he served as the defensive coordinator from 1987-89, before being elevated to head coach in 1990.

In just his second season, Therrell guided the Bald Eagles to their highest victory total in more than two decades. His six-year tenure was marked by an overall program upgrade that included a dramatic improvement in the football program's facilities.

Therrell left Lock Haven following the 1995 season to join head coach Todd Berry's staff at Illinois State. Therrell spent four seasons with the Redbirds as the assistant head coach, defensive coordinator and secondary coach.

During his final season at ISU, the Redbirds topped the Gateway Conference in rushing defense (136.5), opponent yards per pass attempt (6.4) and quarterback sacks (32), while ranking 21st nationally in turnover margin.

Following the 1999 campaign, Therrell followed Berry to Army, where he served as the defensive coordinator for four seasons.

A letterwinner as a linebacker during his playing days at Tennessee Tech, Therrell helped the Golden Eagles capture the Ohio Valley Conference championship in 1975.

He later enjoyed a brief stay in the NFL with the St. Louis Cardinals.

He earned his bachelors degree in education from TTU in 1978, and his master's from Tennessee in 1985.

Therrell and his wife, Dawn, have two sons, John and Cody, and a daughter, Abby. Both John and Cody are members of the Racer football team.

Harris became the first 1,000-yard rusher since 2002, and just the 10th all-time in school history.

Sean Dawkins begins his fourth season as the running backs coach at Murray State. Dawkins also added the title of run-game coordinator prior to the 2011 season.

The 2012 season saw the Racers enter camp with only one player with collegiate experience, and end the season with one of the deadliest two-back tandems in the FCS.

The tandem of juniors Jaamal Berry and Duane Brady combined to rush for 1,264 yards and 15 touchdowns, while also catching 64 passes for 503 yards and a pair of scores.

Berry led the group by averaging 7.1 yards per carry, while Brady averaged 5.0 yards per carry.

Both players had their moments during the season as Brady rushed for three touchdowns in a victory over Tennessee Tech, and Berry ran for 163 yards and three touchdowns in a victory over Tennessee State.

The Racers had to replace their leading rusher the past two seasons with the graduation of Mike Harris following the 2011 season. Harris rushed for 1,922 yards and 23 touchdowns in his two years as a Racer.

In 2011, Harris became just the 10th 1,000-yard rusher in school history when he rushed for 1,018 yards and 13 touchdowns. He recorded seven 100-yard rushing games, including a 206-yard performance against Eastern Kentucky. Harris ranks third all-time with 11 100-yard rushing games, and is tied with Derrick Cullors with three 200-yard rushing games.

Harris was honored as a first-team all-OVC selection for the second-straight season.

Dawkins' first season with the Racers saw him mentor one of the best running backs to come through the program in recent history.

Despite missing, or the majority, of four games, Harris rushed for 904 yards and 10 touchdowns. He was named to the all-OVC first team, and ranked 21st nationally at 100.44 yards per game. Harris went over the century mark four times, including collecting a pair of 200-yard games. His 242-yard effort against Tennessee Tech ranked as the fifth-best single-game performance in school history.

Harris was not the only back to shine for the Racers in 2010, as true-freshman, Brady, rushed for 288 yards and seven touchdowns. He had his best game when the team needed him most as he rushed for 114 yards and two touchdowns against Austin Peay.

Dawkins came to MSU after spending the 2009 season as the running backs coach at West Texas A&M. He helped the Buffs to their fifth-straight winning season and guided running back Keithon Flemming to All-Lone Star Conference honors, despite missing the first six games of the season.

Prior to his time at WTAMU, Dawkins spent one season at Huntingdon College. He tutored

running back Jamal Gardner to a 1,000-yard rushing campaign.

Dawkins spent five years as a member of the Troy football team and helped the Trojans capture a pair of Sun Belt Conference championships.

He was twice named a team captain and was a three-year starter at fullback.

Dawkins finished his career with 507 yards and four touchdowns on 126 carries. He also added 32 receptions for 300 yards.

His most effective season came in 2005 when he rushed for 285 yards on 76 attempts.

After missing the 2006 season with an injury, Dawkins returned in 2007 to rush for 100 yards and three touchdowns in leading the Trojans to a Sun Belt championship and a bid to the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl.

Dawkins played his prep ball at Parkview High School, where he was a two-time all-state selection at running back and linebacker, as well as being named the 5A Defensive Player of the Year by the *Atlanta-Journal Constitution*. He helped the Panthers to three-straight Georgia 5A state championships and finished his career as the all-time leading rusher in Georgia state championships.

He finished his high school career with 3,238 yards and 43 touchdowns, to go along with 283 tackles and nine sacks.

Dawkins graduated from Troy in 2007 with a degree in social science.

UA limited Georgia to 113 yards rushing in capturing in the 2012 SEC Championship.

Callaway assisted in the development of All-America linebacker C.J. Mosley. Mosley was named a Butkus Award finalist after posting 107 tackles, eight tackles-for-loss, four sacks and two interceptions in 2012.

The Crimson Tide defense was even more impressive in 2011 as they led the country in rush defense (72.15), pass defense (111.46), total defense (183.62) and scoring defense (8.15).

The unit was anchored by First-Team All-America linebackers Donte Hightower and Courtney Upshaw.

Like Hatcher and Stewart, Callaway played collegiately as a quarterback at Valdosta State. He was a two-time captain and had his most productive season in 2009 when he went 26-for-45 for 350 yards and three touchdowns.

He joined the Blazers in 2007, helping the team to the school's second National Championship.

Callaway's collegiate career was but short due to injury. He took the time to transition into coaching as he spent his final year working with the quarterbacks as a student assistant.

Callaway joined the Blazers after a standout career at Oconee County High School.

As a junior, Callaway was selected an honorable mention all-state selection by the *Atlanta Journal Constitution*.

He followed that up his senior season by earning honorable mention all-state accolades from the *AJC* and the *Associated Press*, as well as first-team all-state honors from Georgia Athletic Coaches Association North.

He graduated from VSU in 2010 with a degree in business management.

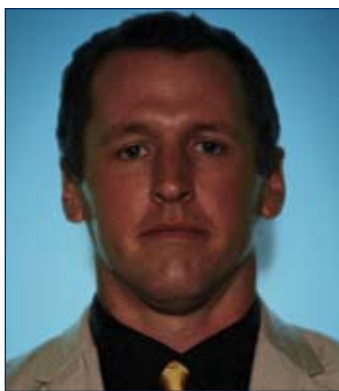

One of the greatest quarterbacks in Murray State history changes in his helmet for a whistle as Casey Brockman enters his first season working with the quarterbacks.

Brockman served as the team's signal caller the last three seasons and ended his career as the all-time leader in passing attempts, completions, yards and touchdowns. He finished 938-for-1,405 for 9,990 yards and 71 touchdowns.

The hometown product saved his best for last as he tossed for 3,729 yards and 28 touchdowns as a senior. His efforts did not go unnoticed on the national level as he was named an All-American for the second-straight season and finished sixth in the voting for the Walter Payton Award.

Brockman threw for 3,276 yards and 25 touchdowns as a junior. He became the first Racer quarterback to earn All-America honors when he was selected to the Third Team by *The Sports Network* and *Associated Press*.

Brockman entered his sophomore season in a quarterback battle in the first season under Chris Hatcher. He did not win the job out of camp, but made the most of his first start.

Brockman went 32-for-41 for 570 yards and seven touchdowns in a thrilling 72-58 victory over Missouri State on Homecoming.

He would go on to set the school record for passing yards in a game by throwing for 600 yards against Tennessee State in 2011. After twice throwing for seven touchdowns in a game, Brockman set a new mark against UT Martin by throwing for eight scores as a senior on Homecoming.

Prior to his time as a Racer, Brockman earned all-state honors as a senior at Calloway County High School after throwing for 3,417 yards and 41 touchdowns. He was also tabbed a Second-Team All-America by *USA Today* on the diamond.

Brockman is currently pursuing his bachelor's degree in journalism and is expected to graduate in December.

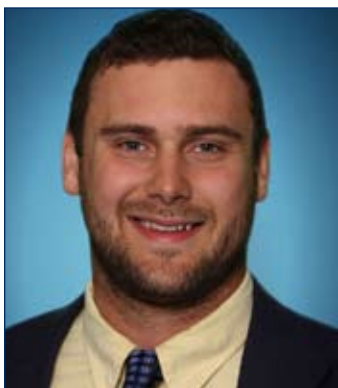

TANGERINE BOWL

The Murray State Thoroughbreds took their 9-1 record into their first and only bowl game appearance. MSU traveled to Orlando, Fla., for a Tangerine Bowl encounter with Sul Ross State of Alpine, Texas.

Murray State entered the game having outscored its opponents 259-65 during the regular season. MSU was led by halfbacks Winfred Dill and Joe Bronson, and end Bob Sanders, who doubled as the team's kicker and booted a school-record 27 extra points.

Sul Ross featured a massive lineman, Dan Blocker. The 6-4, 270-pound Blocker would later achieve fame in the role of Hoss Cartwright on the TV series "Bonanza."

Though Murray State stopped the Lobos when John Hackney recovered a fumble on the 1-yard line in the game's opening drive, Sul Ross returned the favor by recovering a Murray fumble on the Thoroughbreds' 2-yard line later in the quarter. Three plays later, Sul Ross took a 7-0 lead.

The Lobos upped the lead to 14-0 early in the second quarter on a 29-yard pass, but Murray State answered quickly. Receiving the ensuing kickoff on his 15-yard line, Bronson scampered 85 yards for MSU's first score. Sanders added the extra point, cutting the Sul Ross lead to 14-7.

Later in the quarter, another Murray State fumble gave Sul Ross good field position, as the Lobos drove 26 yards in seven plays to take a 21-7 lead by halftime.

The second half was all Murray State. Held to just six yards net rushing in the first half, MSU began moving the ball on the ground in the third quarter, and scored on a 7-yard touchdown run by Dale McDaniel to cut the lead to 21-14. After forcing Sul Ross to punt on its next possession, Murray State moved the ball to the Lobo 37, when McDaniel zipped 37 yards to paydirt. Sanders provided the extra point, tying the score at 21-all.

MSU's momentum was team-wide, as the Thoroughbred defense again held on the next possession and blocked the Lobos' punt. With time running out, Murray State moved the ball to the Lobo 15-yard line, setting up Sanders for a fourth-down field goal attempt. The reeling Lobo defense was able to rise one last time, blocking the kick, and forcing the game to end in a tie.

NCAA SEMIFINAL

Murray State made its first NCAA Division I-AA playoff appearance at home and entered the game ranked No. 2 in the nation, having won its last eight regular season games.

In his second year guiding the Racers, head coach Mike Gottfried assembled a team which emphasized defense. Led by All-America safety Terry Love, the team rolled through the Ohio Valley Conference season with an unblemished 6-0 record, outscoring league foes 162-55.

Overall, the Racer defense ranked fifth in the country in total defense and second in stopping the run, holding opponents to a mere 64.1 yards rushing per game. Future head coach Mike Mahoney was making his debut on the Racer coaching staff that season, in charge of the defensive line.

Playing before the cameras of ABC Sports, Murray State's playoff opponent was the No. 4 ranked Lehigh Engineers (the I-AA playoffs consisted of just four teams in 1979), who provided a stern test on a 38-degree day at Stewart Stadium.

After the Racers failed to move the ball in their first possession, Lehigh marched 42 yards to the Racer 4-yard line. Three running plays netted but three yards, setting up a fourth down chip-shot field goal, but Love blasted through the line to block the kick, keeping the game scoreless.

The game remained deadlocked until Lehigh "engineered" a 10-play, 63-yard touchdown drive in the second quarter, plunging over with 11:32 remaining in the half.

Lehigh went ahead 14-0 later in the quarter, driving 57 yards in six plays. By halftime, Lehigh had outgained Murray State 223-85, and held a 154-55 rushing yardage advantage.

The second half saw the Racers show signs of life, as David Tuck's 24-yard field goal midway through the third quarter cut the lead to 14-3.

The Racers closed the gap in the fourth to 14-9 on a 23-yard scoring pass from Ricky Ray to Greg King, set up by a 21-yard run off a fake punt by Kenny Davis.

However, Lehigh answered by scoring two fourth quarter touchdowns to seal the contest.

Unlike their previous playoff appearance, the 1986 Racers were the underdogs against Eastern Illinois, as Murray State had to win its last six conference games to finish the season as Ohio Valley Conference co-champions and achieve a No. 18 ranking in the NCAA Division I-AA poll with a 7-3-1 record.

Homestanding Eastern Illinois (10-1) entered the game ranked No. 3, and featured one of I-AA's most-feared passing attacks, leading the nation with 326 yards per game.

The Racers countered with a strong ground game, which had produced seven individual 100-yard rushing games, led by tailback Rodney Payne's 838 yards. Through the air, freshman quarterback Michael Proctor threw for 1,508 yards and nine touchdowns.

After the Racer defense stopped EIU on two drives, the Racers opened the scoring late in the first quarter, as Proctor found back Frank Thigpen open for a 2-yard touchdown pass, capping a nine-play, 79-yard drive.

The Racers went ahead 14-0 early in the second quarter after recovering a fumble at the EIU 9-yard line. Proctor hit tight end Bob Jacob for Murray State's second touchdown.

But EIU's offense heated up, scoring on two long scoring drives and tying the game 14-all by halftime.

In the third quarter, MSU's defense stopped EIU twice inside the 10-yard line, forcing the Panthers to settle for two field goals and a 20-14 lead.

The Racers answered late in the quarter. Led by tailback Bill Bird, who opened the drive with a 12-yard blast, the Racers drove 74 yards in 10-plays. Proctor capped the drive with his third touchdown pass of the afternoon, a 32-yard strike to speedy wideout Stanley Howard. Paul Hickert's extra point gave the Racers a 21-20 lead with 11:26 remaining in the game.

But after both teams traded punts, EIU took the lead for good, driving 72 yards in four quick plays. With the Racer defense loosened for the pass – EIU threw 54 times – the Panthers scored on a 9-yard run with 7:24 remaining. The two-point conversion gave EIU its final 28-21 margin, as Murray State's comeback hopes were dashed by a late interception.

In 1995, not one Racer was tabbed as a preseason All-Ohio Valley Conference selection, and although MSU finished fourth the previous two seasons after being picked to place ninth and seventh respectively, MSU was picked to finish sixth in the league's preseason poll.

The Racers didn't let any of that stop them on their way to an unblemished 11-0 regular season in 1995. MSU began what would grow over three seasons to 19 straight OVC victories.

Murray State entered the playoffs ranked fourth and seeded fourth.

MSU hosted a determined Northern Iowa team in the first round, and the Panthers came ready to play.

UNI jumped out in front 14-0 after a pair of touchdown passes from Chris Berg to Alonzo Clayton.

A Derrick Cullors 10-yard scoring run got the Racers on the board, but Northern Iowa came right back with another Berg-to-Clayton scoring pass, this time from 31 yards out. It would not be the last the Racers would hear from Berg or Clayton.

Mike Cherry connected with Kwabe Idelette for a 22-yard touchdown pass with eight seconds left in the first half to make it 21-14.

A two-yard touchdown run by Cherry in the third quarter tied the score at 21-all. Berg gave UNI another 7-point cushion when he connected on a 60-yard touchdown pass in the closing seconds of the third quarter.

MSU tied it again with another touchdown pass from Cherry, but Berg came right back and put the Panthers in front, 35-28, with a 12-yard scoring toss.

The Racers were stopped on downs on their next drive, but they forced a Northern Iowa punt and had the ball back with 3:12 left in the game.

Cherry orchestrated a 10-play, 73-yard scoring drive capped off by a 7-yard touchdown run by David McCann. MSU only needed to convert the extra point to tie the game with 1:26 left on the clock.

Chris Dill's kick was blocked by Clayton, and Northern Iowa held on for the 35-34 upset.

Murray State attempted an onside kick with hopes of getting the ball back, but the Panthers recovered the ball.

Murray State continued its Ohio Valley Conference dominance in 1996. The Racers went undefeated in the OVC for the second straight season.

After an overtime loss to Western Kentucky in the first game of the season, MSU rolled to 10 straight victories to close out the regular season.

The Racers out-scored their opponents in 1996 by an average score of 39-15. The balanced offensive attack averaged 233 yards through the air and 208 on the ground.

The Murray State defense limited foes to just 259 yards per game.

Promising they were more prepared than the year before when they were knocked off at home by Northern Iowa in the first round, the Racers blew open a close game against Western Illinois and won 34-6 in a steady rain.

The victory was the first playoff win in program history.

Neither team scored until Anthony Downs broke loose for a 45-yard touchdown run with 7:13 left in the second quarter. Murray State took that 7-0 lead into the locker room at halftime.

A punt return by Western Illinois to the MSU 3-yard line set up a scoring run by Brian Knuckles. The Leathernecks couldn't convert the extra point and Murray State led 7-6.

Rob Hart connected on a 23-yard field goal with 7:42 left in the third quarter to extend the Racer advantage to 10-6.

Another Hart field goal early in the fourth quarter opened up a 24-point final frame explosion by the offense, and the Racer defense continued to keep WIU out of the end zone.

David McCann had a pair of 1-yard touchdown runs, and Donald Hitson capped the scoring with a 20-yard touchdown run with 1:30 left in the game.

William Hampton's 44-yard interception return set the Racers up at the WIU 14-yard line. After a penalty pushed MSU back to the 28, McCann ripped off a 27-yard run to set up his second touchdown.

Murray State outgained Western Illinois 232-45 on the ground, led by Downs and his 131 yards on 22 carries.

McCann finished with 54 yards on 12 carries to go along with his two touchdowns.

With the first-ever playoff win under their belts, the Racers flew to Troy, Ala., to meet Troy.

Though the defense played better than the score indicated, MSU was outmatched physically and couldn't overcome five turnovers and a stingy Trojan defense.

More was lost than a game on that day. Head coach Houston Nutt, who led MSU to national prominence in four short years, left for Boise State, and MSU lost one of its finest senior classes ever.

Transfers such as Mike Cherry, Mathias Vavao, Donald Hitson, Deon Smith and Jesse Jones played just two years at MSU, but never lost an OVC game. The four-year seniors, what Nutt called "the core" - Terry Anthony, Willie Corbin, Elliott Dunn, Renardo Hampton, William Hampton, Anthony Hutch, David McCann, Carlos Ransey, Tim Scarborough and Tony Turner - suffered through lean times and emerged on the other side as champions.

Troy scored a touchdown in the first and second quarters to carry a 14-0 advantage into the locker room at halftime.

A 42-yard field goal by Rob Hart midway through the third quarter got the Racers on the board, but they still trailed 14-3 heading into the final quarter of play.

Less than a minute into the fourth quarter the Trojans extended their lead to 17-3 on Matt Huerkamp's 27-yard field goal.

Joe Jackson's second 1-yard touchdown run of the game capped an 8-play, 61-yard Troy drive and gave the home team a 24-3 lead with 4:55 left on the clock.

Terrell Smith's touchdown run from one yard out and 29 seconds remaining in the game set the final score at 31-3.

Murray State finished with more first downs than the Trojans, 16 to 15, but the Troy State defense limited the Racers to only 15 net rushing yards, while the Troy offense ran for 253 yards.

Troy's balanced rushing attack left Arrid Gregory with 89 yards, Jackson with 72 and Stan Davis with 66.

Cherry had a tough day, throwing four interceptions and completing just 18-of-40 pass attempts.

The 2002 Racers were not expected to be playoff contenders. It took a last-second field goal in the final game of the regular season to give Murray State a share of the Ohio Valley Championship and the league's automatic bid to the playoffs.

Billy Blanchard, MSU's last 1,000-yard rusher, led an MSU running game that averaged 249.6 yards per game in 2002.

Unfortunately the Racers drew a first round match-up with a Western Kentucky team destined to win the national championship.

The Hilltoppers used a potent running game of their own to dispatch MSU in the first round.

WKU left little doubt after scoring on four of its first five possessions and putting up 24 unanswered points in the first quarter. A missed field goal attempt from 54 yards out was the only time the Hilltoppers didn't put points on the board the first five times they got the ball.

Western scored three times on the ground in the opening frame.

Deandre Green's 18-yard touchdown reception early in the second period drew the visitors to within 24-7, but the Hilltoppers kept scoring.

Western's fourth rushing touchdown made it 38-14 at halftime.

Less than two minutes into the second half Western made it seven scores in nine chances. The Hilltoppers would be forced to punt just twice in the entire game.

Murray State managed just one touchdown in the second half as Western Kentucky rolled to a 59-20 win and moved one step closer on its path to the national title.

WKU outgained the Racers 350 to 103 on the ground for the game. Three Hilltoppers had 80 or more yards on the ground led by Jeremi Johnson's 160. Maurice Bradley had three of WKU's five scoring runs.

Ron Lane led Murray State with 66 yards. Blanchard scored MSU's only rushing touchdown.

Stewart Childress completed 12 of 24 passes for Murray State and totaled 149 yards through the air. He tossed a pair of scoring passes.

Green finished with 127 yards on eight catches to go along with his touchdown reception. Jimmy St. Louis capped an 8-play, 58-yard scoring drive in the fourth quarter with a 1-yard touchdown catch.
