Weekend Recap-Taking on the Best

The Racers gave #1 Arkansas all they could handle the first two games of the series, taking a one-run lead into the eighth inning on Friday night and jumping out to a 4-0 lead early on Saturday, but ultimately fell 7-6 and 11-6. Murray State outhit the Razorbacks in series finale, 6-5, but they were unable to push any runs across.

Call 'Em Butter Because They're On a Roll

Four Racers currently hold multi-game hitting streaks. Jake Slunder extended his hit streak to a team-high eight games, collecting singles in each of the games against Arkansas. Trey Woosley is right behind Slunder with a sevengame streak, tagging his first two home runs of the season over the season. Tanner Booth and Ryan Perkins each hold four game streaks. Perkins knocked in two runs for the Racers first run with a double and two singles and Booth added a double and single against the Hogs.

You Get on, I Get On

Despite just getting one hit in the Arkansas series, Jordan Cozart extended his on-base streak to ten games. Jake Slunder and Trey Woosley's on-base streaks are concurrent with their hitting streaks at eight and seven. Ryan Perkins and Tanner Booth on-base streaks also follow their hitting streak at four games.

Can I Get a Comeback?

The opposing team has scored first in seven of Murray State's eleven games. The Racers jumped on the board early in two of three games against top-ranked Arkansas and have three come-back victories on the season, including one walk-off win, 5-4 against Purdue Fort Wayne.

Stepping Up to the Plate

As a team Murray State's leadoff hitters are batting .409. Tanner Booth is 4-for-6 (.667) when leading off an inning. Jordan Cozart is .615 (8-for-13). Leadoff batter, Jake Slunder, is hitting .467 (7-for-15).

Mr. Clutch

With runners in scoring position, David Hudleson is 3-for-4, with four RBIs, including knocking in the Racers winning runs against Purdue Fort Wayne and Arkansas State. Ryan Perkins is 6-for-11 (.545) with six RBIs and Alex Crump is .500 (2-4) with two RBIs. As a team, the Racers are .295

Scouting #9 Louisville

Louisville falls to ninth in the collegiate baseball rankings after dropping two of three against Georgia Tech and losing a mid-week game vs Morehead State.

The Cardinals found their offense last weekend at Georgia Tech, scoring 28 runs on 40 hits in three games. Louisville currently leads the ACC in stolen bases, ranks second in the ACC in runs, hit by pitch and on-base percentage, third in base on balls and hits, and fourth in batting average.

The Cardinals have been the best in the country on the basepaths this season with 32 stolen bases, 15 more than anyone in the ACC. Levi Usher is third nationally and tops in the ACC with eight, while Henry Davis and Luke Brown are tied for second in the ACC with five

Henry Davis has been the most consistent hitter for the Cardinals through 11 games, picking up at least one hit in every game so far. Davis is currently hitting .395 and ranks sixth in the ACC with 13 RBIs.

Free Passes

Walks and hit-by-pitches have haunted the Racers all season, none more so than this weekend, when the Razorbacks used 29 free passes (25 BBs and four HBPs) to score 12 of their 23 runs, including five of six runs on Sunday due to the freebies.

Strikeout Woes

The Racers strike out woes continued against top-ranked Arkansas, punching out 37 times over the weekend, including a season-high 18 in the series opener. On the season, Murray State has struck out 103 times at the plate.

Home Field Advantage

The Racers went undefeated (7-0) at Johnny Reagan Field in 2020. So far this season, Murray State has won four of five home contests, only dropping the homeopener to Purdue Fort Wayne, 10-6.

Streaks

Murray State was on a four-game win streak prior to their three-game series with Arkansas. This was their longest since sweeping Saint Peter's Feb. 21-23, 2020, taking all four games of the series.

OVC Honors

Collegiate Baseball News Preseason Third Team All-American pick Jordan Cozart is off to a fast start in 2021. Cozart went 11-for-27 with seven runs, four doubles, two home runs, five RBI, .778 slg %, and a .448 OB% en route to being named the OVC Player of the Week .

Opening Week Sluggers

Brock Anderson cracked two home runs on Opening Day against Lipscomb. The dingers accounted for the Racers first four RBIs of the season. Five total Racers popped long balls in the first week of the 2021 season. Cozart leads the team with three homers.

Ranked Opponents

The Racers will face two ranked teams this season. Arkansas is ranked No. 1 in this week's poll by D1Baseball, Collegiate Baseball, Baseball America. Arkansas is ranked first for the first time in the history of the Baseball America rankings, which dates to 1981. Following the series in Fayetteville, the Racers travel to No.9 Louisvile to face the Cardinals.

Familiar Look

The Racers lineup has a familiar feel to it with MSU returning eight of its position player starters from last year. 5th year senior Ryan Perkins leads the team with 194 games of experience.

Racer Debuts

Three juco transfers made their Murray State debuts on Opening Day against Lipscomb. Brennan McCullough started at DH in game one with Seth Gardner starting at DH in game two. Nathaniel Gorczyca pitched two innings, allowing two hits and two runs while striking out one. True freshman RHP Cade Vernon got his first collegiate start against Arkansas State, pitching 3.0 innings, only allowing two hits, one run, zero earned runs, striking out one.

Bats Come Alive

After being shutout at Lipscomb until the final innings, the Racers bats got off to a hot start against Middle Tennessee, putting up six runs through the first three innings. Bryson Bloomer and Ryan Perkins each tallied four hits and four RBIs with Brennan McCullough driving in two runs.

New Faces

The Racers welcome 15 new players to the team this year, including seven freshman and eight JUCO transfers.

All-American Honors

Senior Jordan Cozart was named a 2020 Collegiate Baseball News Third-Team All-American and a 2021 Collegiate Baseball News Preseason Third-Team All-American.

BrockStar

Senior Brock Anderson was a repeat selection to the preseason All-OVC team. A year ago, Anderson led the team with 8 home runs and 23 runs batted in while hitting .274.

Trio of Racers

MSU landed three on the preseason All-OVC team for the first time since 2017. Senior outfielder Brock Anderson, senior second baseman Jordan Cozart and sophomore left-hand pitcher Shane Burns.

Racers Picked Third

Murray State was picked third in the Ohio Valley Conference preseason poll as voted on by head coaches and SIDs. Belmont was selected to claim the top spot after receiving 14 first-place votes.

Home Sweet Home

The Racers will play a total of 25 contests inside the friendly confines of Reagan Field in 2021 including closing the season at home for five of six series.

Murray State Head Coach

- Enters his second season as head coach at Murray State in 2020
- In his first season, he led the Racers to a 24-30 overall record and 16-14 OVC record, their best record in conference play since 2010. He led MSU to a 10-7 overall record and 2-1 in OVC play before the 2020 season was canceled.
- He returns to MSU after serving as an assistant for the Racers from 2009-14 under former coach Rob McDonald.

Walters State Community College Assistant Coach

- Had four successful seasons at Walters State Community College (Morristown, Tennessee) where he was recruiting coordinator.
- Helped Walters to the National Junior College Athletics Association (NJCAA) World Series championship game in 2018 and finished with a record of 60-8.
- With Skirka on staff, the Walters State Senators enjoyed tremendous success in four seasons with an amazing record of 208-48 for a winning percentage of .812.
- In 2018, Walters produced an offense that was top-10 nationally in 13 categories which pushed the team to first in three different national polls. In 2017, the Senators were 44-12 and placed second nationally and produced a pitching staff that ranked among the top-3 in several categories in NJCAA. The 2016 team produced a record of 47-16 and the NJCAA Pitcher of the Year and 2015 saw Walters go 57-12 and place third nationally with seven NJCAA All-America selections including the NJCAA Player of the Year.
