GAME DAY STORYLINES

➔ The Racers open their 100th season of collegiate basketball and their 27th in the CFSB

➔ The Racers are 86-13 all-time in season openers and 25-1 in CFSB Center openers with the only loss coming to the Houston Cougars in 2014.



➔ After being predicted for eighth and seventh place finishes, the Racers were picked third in the MVC Preseason Poll and saw seniors Nick Ellington and JaCobi Wood each receive All-MVC honors.

➔ The Racers have added experience to their 2024-25 roster in Terence Harcum (App State), Kylen Milton (Pine Bluff), AJ Ferguson (Southern Illinois) and KyeRon Lindsay (Texas Tech).

➔ It's season three for MSU in the Missouri Valley Conference. The Racers have two second-month MVC games against Evansville (Dec. 3) at home and on the road (Dec. 18) against Indiana State.

➔ Coach Steve Prohm begins his seventh season in his career with the Racers and the 2024-25 season marks third season in his second era in Murray and it's his 14th season as a head coach, that began at Murray State in 2011.

➔ Prohm is 8-4 as a head coach in season openers and is 5-1 in openers at the CFSB Center.

➔ The recently announced renovation of MSU's home, the CFSB Center, will transform the arena that opened under Coach Tevester Anderson in the fall of 1998.

➔ MSU welcomes new assistant coaches Brendan Mullins (SIU) and Bryan Sherrer (Pine Bluff) as both very familiar with the Murray State program.

- His 3.4 blocks per game ranked third in the NJCAA ranks in 2021-22.
- In 2022-23, played in all 31 games at Eastern Illinois with 21 starts.
- Nine double-figure scoring games - season high 21 points vs SIUE.

- Vs Tenn. Tech, became the first Racer to debut with back to back double-doubles since 2000 Antoine Whelchel.
- Tied his career-high with five blocked shots at Little Rock.
- Scored a career-high 29 points in MSU's win at UIC on 13-of-16 from the field with seven rebounds.
- Ellington's 13 is tied for sixth all-time at MSU for a single game.

GAME DAY & SEASON NOTES

The Bethel Series

The Murray State Racers first played the Bethel Wildcats in their first season in 1926, but after playing 17 times until 1934, they went 44 years until they played again in 1977.

Bethel's head coach Jeff Britt is a veteran basketball lifer who is in his 25th season in McKenzie, Tennessee and 30th in his career with 521 wins at the NAIA level. Bethel was 14-15 in 2023-24 and went 3-9 in the Mid-South Conference.

New MSU Coaches

Murray State Coach Steve Prohm has two new assistant coaches joining the Racers this season. Brendan Mullins and Bryan Sherrer are each very familiar with the Murray State program. Sherrer was a GA with the Racers from 2011-14 when Prohm was in his first era with the Racers and returns after coaching at Pine Bluff from 2021-24. Mullins has coached against the Racers for many seasons, most recently with his head coach brother Brian at Southern Illinois from 2019-24. He has also coached in The Valley at Illinois State (2017-19) and UIC (2015-17) as the Flames are now in the MVC, but were in the Horizon League at the time.

100 Seasons of Murray State Basketball

With a winning percentage that is among the top-50 all-time in NCAA D-I for teams that have played 25 or more seasons at this level, the Murray State Racers began playing the game at Wilson Hall in 1925 under MSU Hall of Fame Coach Carlisle Cutchin. At that time it was know as Murray State Teachers College. As a founding member of the Ohio Valley Conference in 1948, the Racers were part of the league moving into NCAA D-I in the 1950s. The Racers played Southwest Missouri for the NAIB National Championship in 1952 under Hall of Fame Coach Harlan Hodges. MSU lost to the Bears 73-64 in Kansas City. After 74 seasons in the OVC and winners of 28 regular season championships and 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, the Racers joined the Missouri Valley Conference in the 2022-23 season.

Racers Remember Two Wonderful People

Murray State Basketball lost two long standing friends and colleagues just before the season started and mourn the passing of former assistant Coach Amir Abdur-Rahim and supporter Larry Suiter. Abdur-Rahim was the head coach at South Florida when he died at age 43 Oct. 24. Amir played for Billy Kennedy and Steve Prohm at Southeastern Louisiana and led the Lions to their first NCAA appearance in 2004. He followed Kennedy and Prohm to Murray State in 2006 and started his coaching career with the Racers. Larry Suiter was 65 when he passed on Oct. 26. From the Suiter family that lived Racer Basketball by his father, Gerl. Larry Suiter was an always positive and supportive fan of the program. Racer Basketball shares its thoughts and prayers to both families.

Ja Morant Inducted Into Murray State Hall of Fame



From small town to Murray, Kentucky, and to NBA stardom, Ja Morant's career arrived at the next milestone on July 29, 2024 when he was inducted into the Murray State Hall of Fame. On Murray State men's basketball Hoopalooza weekend, when this great collegiate program invites its alumni back to campus for fellowship, fun and memories of the playing years, Morant was honored as part of the 42nd class to the MSU Hall of Fame.


From 2017-19, the 65 games of Morant's two-year career with the Racers are remembered greatly as the Dalzell, South Carolina phenom was part of an amazing run in which the Racers won a pair of Ohio Valley Conference regular season and tournament championships and made two NCAA Tournament appearances while racking up 56 victories.

After a successful freshman season in which Morant was named All-OVC, he came back even better in the 2018-19 season. Morant earned OVC Player of the Year honors and became the first consensus All-America selection in Murray State history. Morant led the nation with 10.0 assists per game and became the first player since assists became official in 1983-84 to average 20 points and 10 assists per game.

In his two seasons at Murray State, Morant set the Racers' career record for assists (532) in 46 fewer games than when Don Mann became the record holder (531) in 1989.

CFSB Center To Get New Look

Murray State Athletics unveiled its conceptual vision to uniquely re-imagine the CFSB Center to the Murray State Board of Regents on Thursday, Sept. 12, 2024.



The home of Racer men's and women's basketball is anticipated to receive its first major renovation since the facility was opened in 1998. The significant eight-figure project is focused on two key priorities of the department, recruiting and revenue generation, and will be funded through private donor contributions.

A primary vision of the entire project is on the enhancement of the overall fan experience and entertainment through new premium areas. Patrons will see a total overhaul in the seating structure in the lower level of the arena, including seating enhancements and the lower bowl becoming permanent seating in the shape of a horseshoe.

For the first time in Murray State history, Racer fans will have the ability to watch a game from the comfort of the anticipated 1,000 premium seats that will be installed. The conceptual plans also include premium loge boxes throughout the top of the seating bowl that would create a world-class game day experience while providing luxurious, private spaces for entertainment, while additional ledge seating and new courtside opportunities will bring the fans closer to the action.

Last year, Drake beat Indiana State in the title game 84-80. The tournament featured all 12 MVC teams. The State Farm MVC Tournament, also known uniquely as "Arch Madness" to Valley fans, will be played at Enterprise Center for the 30th time. Arch Madness is the second-longest neutral site tenured collegiate tourney in the nation (following only the Big East in New York City).

COACH STEVE PROHM



Coach Steve Prohm returned to Murray State for a second era as head coach in the 2022-23 season when the Racers entered the Missouri Valley Conference. With his legacy with the Racers already secure after a almost a decade in Murray as assistant and then head coach from 2005-12, Prohm is back for the challenge of a new conference. Introduced as the Racers' 17th head coach on March 28, 2022. The 2024-25 season is Prohm's 26th overall in college basketball and 13th as a head coach.

Prohm Iowa State Notes

- o Left Murray State to become the 20th head coach at Iowa State on June 8, 2015.
- o Coached the Cyclones six seasons from 2015-21.
- o Had a 97-95 mark at ISU with three NCAA Tournaments appearances in his six seasons. He was sixth all-time at ISU with 97 wins and 40 Big 12 wins.
- o Cyclones won the 2017 and 2019 Big 12 Tournament titles and advanced as far as the Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament in 2016.
- o Prohm was second all-time at ISU with seven wins against AP Top-10 teams. His 17 wins against the top-25 are the third-most in school history.
- o During Prohm's time in Ames, he had six NBA draft picks.

Prohm Murray State

- o In 2022-23, led the Racers to a winning season at 17-15 and 11-9 in the MVC.
- o MSU won their first Arch Madness game against Valparaiso before bowing out against champion Drake in the second game.
- o Prohm's first run as Racer head coach produced an amazing 104-29 record in four seasons from 2011-15.
- o MSU teams won two Ohio Valley Conference regular season titles in 2012 and 2015 and a game in the 2012 NCAA Tournament.
- o 2011-12 team established the Racers as the final undefeated team in the nation at 23-0 with a top-10 national ranking and set the OVC record with 31 wins.
- o 2013-14 team won the CollegelInsider.com Tournament (CIT).
- o 2014-15 team went undefeated in the OVC play, won a conference record 25 consecutive games, and advanced to NIT quarters.
