- A win would...
- Snap a two-game losing streak for the Tigers, the first for the program since the 2012 season.
- Improve Mizzou to 5-2-1 all-time against Vanderbilt and improve head coach Gary Pinkel to 3-1 against the Commodores, with all meetings coming since Mizzou joined the SEC in 2012.
- Improve Mizzou to 14-9 against SEC East teams since joining the SEC for the 2012 season.
- Improve Mizzou to 2-0 all-time against Vanderbilt in Nashville.

### Pinkel Set To Coach Career Game #300

- When head coach *Gary Pinkel* takes the field Saturday at Vanderbilt, it will be his 300th career game as a head coach. Now in his 25th season as a head coach (15 at Mizzou, 10 at Toledo - he is the winningest coach at both schools), Pinkel joins Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer, Texas State's Dennis Franchione and Kansas State's Bill Snyder as the only active head coaches to coach at least 300 games at the FBS level.
- Pinkel is the second-winningest active head coach in college football with 190 career wins (tied with KSU's Snyder) and trailing only Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer. He is also the 19th-winningest head coach in college football history with his 190 career wins. He is the only active head coach to be the winningest head coach at two NCAA FBS schools (Mizzou, Toledo).
- The reigning SEC Coach of the Year, Pinkel enters the Vanderbilt game with a Mizzou record of 117-69 in 14 seasons, while he's 190-106-3 overall in 24 seasons.

### # MIZZOU STORYLINES

### MIZZOU LOOKS FOR WIN AT VANDY SATURDAY PRIOR TO BYE WEEK

- The Missouri Tigers (4-3 overall, 1-3 in Southeastern Conference play), look to regroup from a heartbreaker of a 9-6 loss last Saturday at Georgia, as they head to Music City, where they will take on the Vanderbilt Commodores (2-4, 0-3) in Nashville, Tenn. Kickoff for Saturday's game is set for 3 p.m. CT on the SEC Network.
- · Mizzou had numerous chances to escape between the hedges with a big road win last Saturday at Georgia, but a marvelous defensive outing wasn't enough, as the Tiger offense was held to just six points in the defeat. The Tigers nearly got a pick-six on the first play of the game, when senior S lan Simon grabbed a deflected pass at the Georgia 40-yardline and returned it just inches shy of the goalline. A big miscue on 1st and goal followed, however, with a fumbled C/QB exchange that lost two yards, which was followed by a pair of runs stopped short of the end zone by Georgia's defense. Mizzou had to settle for a 20-yard field goal and a 3-0 lead. Georgia would tie the game at 3-3 in the 2nd quarter, only a few plays after Mizzou dropped an interception that would have wiped that out. Mizzou forged a 6-3 halftime lead, but a pair of short fields, one thanks to a fumbled punt return by Mizzou, helped Georgia tie the game, and eventually, win it, with a pair of field goals. The game-winner came with just 1:44 to play, and MU's ensuing possession went four-and-out to end the game. That was indicative of the night MU would face on offense, as the Tigers were held to 164 yards of offense on just 48 plays. Mizzou held the ball for only 21:05 of clock time (UGA had it for 38:55), and struggled to keep drives alive, going just 2-of-13 on third down tries.
- Vanderbilt is coming off of a hard-fought 19-10 loss Saturday at South Carolina, a game in which the Commodores held a 10-6 lead until late in the third quarter. Vandy has split its last four games, defeating Austin Peay 47-7 on Sept. 19th for their first win of the season, followed by a close 27-16 loss at #3 Ole Miss. The Commodores rebounded with a 17-13 win at Middle Tennessee, which preceded Saturday's defeat at South Carolina.
- Mizzou and Vanderbilt have played two common opponents this season, in Georgia and South Carolina. Mizzou is 1-1 against those foes, while Vanderbilt is 0-2. The Tigers defeated South Carolina in Columbia, Mo. (24-10 on Oct. 3rd), and lost at Georgia, 9-6, last Saturday, while Vanderbilt lost at home to Georgia (31-14 on Sept. 12th) and lost last Saturday at South Carolina.

### MIZZOU'S DEFENSE WENT ANIMAL CONTROL ON BULLDOG OFFENSE

• Lost in the 9-6 defeat at Georgia Saturday was the absolutely stellar performance by the Tiger defense, which was on the field virtually all night. Mizzou held a potent Bulldog offense in check most all night, as UGA gained only 298 yards of offense - well below their season average of 451.3 coming into the game. The Bulldogs averaged 7.3 yards per snap coming into Saturday's game against Mizzou, but averaged only 3.9 vs. the Tiger defense, despite the fact that they held the ball for such an advantage in time of possession. Georgia ran 77 plays on the night, to only 48 for Mizzou. Georgia averaged just 2.7 yards per rush, after averaging 6.4 per rush coming in, and finished with a season-low of 120 yards on the ground (they averaged 231.5 coming in.



### **NOTES ON THE KICKERS**

- > Senior FG kicker Andrew Baggett is second on Mizzou's career scoring list and should break that mark this season along with the career FG and PAT records at Mizzou. He passed Jeff Wolfert (59 FGs from 2006-08) with two FGs last weekend at UGA, becoming Mizzou's all-time career FG leader with 60 in three-plus seasons.
- Freshman Corey Fatony won the battle for the starting punter job and also for kickoffs. He has 13 punts of 50+ yards this season and has placed 16 inside the 20-yard line.
- Fatony had a monster game vs. Florida, earning Ray Guy National Player of the Week. He averaged 47.8 yards per punt on nine punts and pinned the Gators inside their 20 four times, averaging 45.7 yards per punt.



### **NOTES ON THE RETURNERS**

- All three players are in their first year as starting kick returners, taking over for All-American return man *Marcus Murphy*, who is now with the New Orleans Saints and has an NFL punt-return TD in his rookie season.
- Penton scored a punt return TD on a blocked punt vs. SEMO it was the first punt blocked for a TD by Mizzou since 2003.
- Cam Hilton and John Gibson enter week 8 as the starters at punt returner/kick returner, respectively.

# **QUICK STRIKES...NOTABLES**

### **CURRENT TIGERS VS. VANDERBILT**

- ▶ Here's a quick look at some career numbers that current Tigers have put together against Vanderbilt over the previous three matchups:
- ▶ TB **Russell Hansbrough** has rushed for 137 yards on 32 carries (4.3 avg.) with a TD in three career matchups with the Commodores. In last year's 24-14 Mizzou victory at Faurot Field on Oct. 25, 2014, Hansbrough rushed for 87 yards on 19 attempts (4.6 avg.) with a 10-yard TD run to put the Tigers ahead 10-0 in the second quarter. He also added a 17-yard reception in that contest, which was his second-longest catch of the 2014 season.
- ▶ In the 51-28 win at Vanderbilt Stadium on Oct. 5, 2013, Hansbrough rushed for 44 yards on nine carries (4.9 avg.) to contribute to the Tigers' 245 total rushing yards on 43 attempts (5.7 avg.). Mizzou pulled ahead 20-0 in the first quarter during that contest and never looked back.
- LB **Kentrell Brothers** has 13 tackles (four solo) and an interception in three career contests against the Commodores. In each of the last two meetings, he has recorded six stops, including four solo tackles in the 2013 contest when he also returned his second career interception 15 yards.
- LB **Michael Scherer** notched five tackles (two solo) during last year's Homecoming win at Memorial Stadium.
- ▶ LB **Donavin Newsom** registered five tackles (one solo), a tackle for loss (-3 yards) and broke up a pass during the 2014 contest in Columbia.

- ▶ S *lan Simon* has seven career tackles against the Commodores, including four stops (three solo) during the 2013 contest at Vanderbilt Stadium. Simon notched two solo tackles against Vandy last year.
- ▶ CB **Kenya Dennis** finished with four tackles (three solo) and shared a tackle for loss (-1 yard) in last year's game.
- ▶ CB **John Gibson** amassed four tackles (two solo) in the last game between Mizzou and Vanderhilt
- ▶ DL **Josh Augusta** recorded three tackles (one solo) during the 2014 matchup.
- ▶ LB *Clarence Green* has three career tackles against Vandy, including two stops (one solo) in the 2014 victory.
- ▶ DE *Charles Harris* had one solo tackle for a loss of one yard in the 2014 contest
- ▶ PK **Andrew Baggett** is 7-for-8 in field goal attempts and 9-for-9 in PAT tries during his career against Vandy. In both the 2012 and 2013 games, he was a perfect 3-for-3 in field goal tries, including a long of 44 yards at Vanderbilt Stadium in 2013. He has 30 career points against the Commodores.
- ▶ During the last meeting between the Tigers and Commodores at Vanderbilt Stadium on Oct. 5, 2013, the Mizzou defense sacked Vandy QB and current Mizzou recruiting graduate assistant Austyn Carta-Samuels 7.0 times (-38 yards), including 3.0 (-13 yards) by DE *Michael Sam*, 2.0 (-13 yards) by DE *Kony Ealy* (now with Carolina Panthers) and 1.5 (-10 yards) by LB **Markus Golden** (now with Arizona Cardinals).

Mizzou went over 10 wins for the sixth time in program history last season. Five of those six have come under Gary Pinkel (all five since '07).

# LAST TIME OUT...

- Mizzou lost a defensive slugfest at Georgia last Saturday (Oct. 17) in Athens, dropping the Tigers to 4-3 on the season and 1-3 in SEC play. Mizzou's defense was very good in the game, limiting Georgia to just 298 yards and zero touchdowns, thanks in large part to eight tackles for loss, six pass break-ups and an interception.
- Senior captain S *lan Simon* picked off the opening pass of the game and ran it back 39 yards to the UGA 1-yard line, but the Tigers could not punch the ball in, settling for the first of two Andrew Baggett field goals. Baggett connected on his second FG right before the half as Mizzou took a 6-3 lead into the break.
- With his second FG, Baggett became Mizzou's all-time leader in career FGs Location made, with 60 in his three-plus seasons in Black & Gold. He passed former Tiger Jeff Wolfert (2006-08) who had 59 in his time as a Tiger.
- Georgia added a pair of FGs in the second half, including the game-winner with less than two minutes to play, to seal the win.
- Mizzou's stellar defensive outing was led by All-America candidate LB Kentrell Brothers who added to his nation-leading tackle total by tallying a career-best 17 stops on the night. That moves his season total to 91 (13.00 per game), both of which are national-bests.
- Junior LB Michael Scherer also had 12 tackles in the loss, one off of a career-high and RS FR DE Walter Brady tallied a career-high seven tackles (one TFL). RS SO DE Charles Harris added a season-high nine tackles with a sack.

# A LOOK AT THE OPPONENT... VANDERBILT

### SERIES VS. VANDERBILT

- Mizzou will play its eighth game all-time against Vanderbilt on Saturday with the Tigers holding a 4-2-1 advantage in the previous seven meetings. That record includes a 1-0 mark in Nashville as this will be just the second meeting ever between the two programs in the Music City.
- Mizzou and Vanderbilt last met back in the 1800s with a pair of meetings in 1985 and 1986. Mizzou won the first meeting, 16-0, in Columbia in 1895 before winning the next year in St. Louis, 26-6.
- Three consecutive meetings in Columbia followed for the two programs with Vanderbilt winning two meetings while the teams played to a 7-7 tie in the other meeting. The 7-7 tie came in 1957 and Vanderbilt claimed a 12-8 win the following season. The two teams didn't play again until Mizzou joined the SEC in 2012 as Vanderbilt won the inaugural meeting between the two programs as members of the SEC, 19-15, in 2012.
- Since then, Mizzou has won two consecutive games in the series, including a 51-28 win in Nashville in 2013 (detailed below). Mizzou also won last season's meeting, 24-14, in Columbia.

### LAST YEAR REWIND - MIZZOU 24. VANDERBILT 14

- On Mizzou's 103rd Homecoming in 2014, Gary Pinkel's team pulled away to a 24-14 win over Vanderbilt at Memorial Stadium last season. WR Bud Sasser pulled in a pair of TD grabs and the Tigers became bowl eligible for the 10th time under Pinkel.
- Marcus Murphy ran for 93 yards on 16 carries, and Russell Hansbrough nabbed 87 yards and a touchdown on 19 carries; per Mizzou historian Tom Orf, it was the first time in 15 years that the Tigers have had two running backs each with at least 85 rushing yards against an FBS opponent.
- Mizzou drew first blood on the game's first drive when Andrew Baggett hit a 37-yard field goal, then made it 10-0 in the second quarter on a 10-yard run by Hansbrough. Together, those two drives chewed up 9:17 off the clock.
- Twice Vanderbilt pulled within three points, and twice Sasser and QB **Maty Mauk** answered with TD passes.

### MIZZOU LOOKING TO KEEP MUSIC CITY MAGIC

- Senior QB James Franklin threw for four touchdowns and Missouri squashed any doubts about its early season schedule with a 51-28 victory at Vanderbilt en-route to its first ever SEC East Championship in 2013.
- The Tigers moved to 5-0 and opened conference play without missing a beat in the program's first trip to Nashville as a member of the SEC.
- The win moved **Gary Pinkel** to 5-0 for the fifth time at Mizzou (he was in his 13th season at Mizzou at the time)
- Franklin guided Missouri on scoring drives on the first six Tiger possessions, which resulted in three touchdowns and three field goals. Missouri out-gained the Commodores 285-97 in the first half in taking a 30-7 lead.
- Franklin finished 19-for-28 for 278 yards passing and added another 63 yards on the ground.



# QUICK STRIKES...NOTABLES

### 'LOCKED' IN

- ▶ Freshman QB *Drew Lock* has started each of the last three games for head coach *Gary Pinkel*, going 1-2 against SEC East foes South Carolina. Florida and Georgia.
- ▶ Lock dazzled in his debut vs. the Gamecocks, going 21-for-28 with 136 yards and a pair of touchdowns and no interceptions. He led three Mizzou TD drives which was more than enough to help Mizzou to the win. He was the first true freshman QB ever to start a game in *Gary Pinkel's* coaching tenure and was the first true freshman QB to start a game at Mizzou since 1995.
- ▶ Lock also continued the streak of every Pinkel QB getting a win in his first career start, joining Brad Smith (2002 vs. Illinois), Chase Daniel (2006 vs. Murray State), Blaine Gabbert (2009 vs. Illinois), James Franklin (2011 vs. Miami [OH]), Corbin Berkstresser (2012 vs. Arizona State), and Maty Mauk (2013 vs. Florida).
- ▶ Lock completed 21-of-28 passes for 136 yards and two touchdowns. His completion rate of 75.0-percent stands as the second-best debut start for a Pinkel era quarterback. Blaine Gabbert completed 25-of-33 passes (75.8%) vs. Illinois in 2009.

- ▶ Lock was the first QB to make his starting debut under Pinkel to throw for two TDs since Blaine Gabbert in 2009. His 21 completions were the most since *Corbin Berkstresser* had 21 against Arizona State. Only current NFL QBs *Chase Daniel* (23) and Gabbert (25) had more completions in their first start under Pinkel.
- ▶ Lock was challenged against a dominant Florida defense that limited him to just 16-for-39 passes and picked him off twice. He did set career-highs in pass attempts (39) and passing yards (151). He went 11-for-26 with 143 yards at UGA.

### INDIVIDUAL NOTABLES FROM GEORGIA

- ▶ QB *Drew Lock* completed 11 of 26 passes for 143 yards. His 33-yard pass to WR Nate Brown was the second-longest completion of his freshman season.
- ▶ RB *Russell Hansbrough* notched a career-long 24-yard catch-and-run in the second quarter.
- ▶ WR **Nate Brown** hauled in a career-long 33-yard reception in the first quarter. His previous long was a 25-yard catch vs. Southeast Missouri on Sept. 5.
- ▶ WR *Cam Hilton* made a career-long 29-yard reception in the second quarter.

### HANSBROUGH REACHES 2K MARK

- ▶ Senior RB *Russell Hansbrough* rushed for 43 yards against South Carolina, giving him exactly 2,000 in his career. Only 14 Tigers (and only 12 running backs) have ever rushed for more than 2,000 yards in a career. Hansbrough is the first Tiger to do so since *Henry Josey* in 2013. Hansbrough ran for 24 yards Saturday, moving him to 2.098.
- ▶ Hansbrough is the seventh player under head coach *Gary Pinkel* to accomplish that feat. Other 2,000-yard rushers under Pinkel include QB *Brad Smith* (4,289), *Zack Abron* (3,198), *Henry Josey* (2,771), *Tony Temple* (2,552), *Kendial Lawrence* (2,232) and *Derrick Washington* (2,085). Of course, all of those running backs were mentored by RB coach *Brian Jones*, who has been with Pinkel's coaching staff since 1992.
- ▶ Hansbrough is the first Mizzou player to rush for 1,000 yards and return for a season since Henry Josey in 2013. Hansbrough ran for 1,084 yards in 2014. Hansbrough's 205 rushes in 2014 were the most by a Tiger RB since 2003 when Zack Abron ran the ball 219 times. His 1,084 yards in 2014 rank 10th all-time at Mizzou. He has averaged 5.3 yards per carry over his career.

### HARRIS ADDED TO BEDNARIK AWARD WATCH LIST

- ▶ Redshirt sophomore DE *Charles Harris* has been wreacking havoc in opposing backfields all season and his play turned the heads of members of the Maxwell Club. In fact, Harris was one of 13 players nationally selected by the Maxwell Club to be added to the Chuck Bednarik Award Watch List earlier this month.
- ▶ Harris joins teammate Kentrell Brothers (Guthrie, Okla.) as Brothers was on the original Bednarik Award Watch List, which was released in July. Harris ranks fifth nationally and leads the Southeastern Conference with 11.5 tackles for loss in 2015. Harris is also ranked seventh in the SEC and among the nation's top 60 in quarterback sacks with 4.0. Harris recorded 2.0 sacks at Arkansas State, equaling his career total coming in. He also registered 4.5 tackles for loss (-24 yards) at A-State, which marked the first time a Mizzou defender recorded 4.5 or more tackles for loss in a game since Stryker Sulak had 5.0 TFLs vs. Illinois Aug. 30, 2008.
- ▶ Harris is fourth on the team and leads Mizzou defensive linemen with has 29 tackles (18 solo) with 11.5 tackles for loss (-46 yards), 4.0 sacks (-23 yards), four QB hurries and a forced fumble through six games. Harris is a big reason why Mizzou leads the SEC while ranking third nationally with 57 total tackles for loss with at least seven in each game. Harris has had multiple tackles for loss in five of Mizzou's six games this season and he is averaging -4 yards per TFL this season.

# **QUICK STRIKES...MORE NOTABLES**

### **BAGGETT 29 POINTS SHY OF MIZZOU CAREER RECORD**

- ▶ Heading into the weekend, Mizzou senior PK **Andrew Baggett** sits just 29 points shy of breaking **Jeff Wolfert's** career record for points scored. Baggett has 334 points in his career (60 field goals, 154 PATs).
- ▶ Last week at Georgia, Baggett connected on two of three FG attempts, moving his career total to 60. That passes former Tiger kicker Jeff Wolfert for the all-time career FG record at Mizzou. Wolfert (2006-08) had 59 in his years as the Tiger kicker.
- ▶ In his career, Baggett has turned in two of the best point-scoring season totals in Mizzou history. His 120 points in 2013 rank fourth all-time at Mizzou while his 97 total points a season ago rank 14th.

### **HOLDING ONTO THE ROCK**

- ▶ Mizzou is coming off of a school-record performance in 2014 when it comes to ball security. Mizzou lost just three fumbles in 2014, the fewest in program history.
- ▶ Mizzou ran 954 plays in 2014, meaning that the Tigers lost a fumble just once in every 318 plays a season ago.
- ▶ The lost fumbles were not a case of just getting 'the lucky bounce' either. Mizzou put the ball on the turf just 10 times in 2014 (once every 95 plays). To put how good the 10 fumbles were, Mizzou's opponents fumbled more than three times as much with 32 fumbles. In fact, Mizzou recovered more fumbles (13) than it committed as a team in 2014.
- ▶ The trend has continued in 2015 as Mizzou has lost just zero fumbles in 452 total plays over the first seven games with both fumbles on special teams. The first fumble was on a punt as the ball hit a player and was recovered by UConn in the third game of the season. The second came last week as PR *Cam Hilton* was hit immediately as he fielded the ball, fumbling it away to Georgia. Mizzou has yet to lose a fumble on an offensive play from scrimmage this season.
- ▶ Mizzou leads the SEC and is tied for 11th nationally in fumbles lost this season, a stat that head coach *Gary Pinkel* and his staff have done a great job reinforcing its importance with their team.

### IF IT GOES TO OVERTIME

- ▶ Grab your stomach acid medication and hold on tight, as a stellar defense and a knack for playing tight games can be a recipe for overtime. If it does go overtime, Mizzou fans can rest easy, as no program in NCAA history has won more overtime games than the Tigers. Mizzou has played 16 overtime games since the rule came into effect in 1996 (2nd-most behind Tennessee's 17), and the Tigers have come out victorious an NCAA-best 11 times...
- ▶ The most OT wins in NCAA history look like this: 1. Mizzou, Tennessee (11); 3. Arkansas, Michigan, Northwestern, Syracuse, Utah (9); 8. 10 teams tied (8)...
- ▶ Here's a listing of the most OT games played in NCAA history (thru games of Oct. 17) 1. Tennessee (17); 2. Mizzou, Fresno State, Syracuse, Utah (16); 6. Northwestern, Pittsburgh, (15); 8. 7 teams tied (14)...
- ▶ Interestingly enough, Mizzou Head Coach *Gary Pinkel* has the distinction of coaching in the first overtime game ever played at the FBS level. When Pinkel was skipper for Toledo, his Rockets won the MAC title and faced Nevada in the 1995 Las Vegas Bowl. For the 1995 bowl season, the current overtime rule was put into effect, and the game went to overtime, where Pinkel's Rockets claimed a 40-37 win in one extra period...
- ▶ Pinkel is 8-3 alltime at Mizzou in overtime, and he is 10-3 alltime, including a perfect 2-0 at Toledo

### IF IT'S A CLOSE GAME

- ▶ In *Gary Pinkel's* 15 years on the sideline at Mizzou, the Tigers have played in plenty of close games and the Tigers have a knack for winning those games, especially lately.
- ▶ Pinkel in his career at Mizzou is 27-23 in games decided by seven points or fewer, including a 6-3 mark since 2013 and a 5-2 mark in 2014 and 2015.
- ▶ Mizzou is 40-33 in games decided by 10 or fewer under Pinkel and 13-7 since joining the SEC, including a 6-2 mark in 2014 and a 10-4 mark since 2013.

### TURNOVER MARGIN IS KEY FOR PINKEL'S TIGERS

- ▶ Looking deeper into the turnover margin, since *Gary PinkeI* took over the Mizzou program in 2001, Mizzou owns a plus-84 advantage in turnover margin (186 games).
- ▶ Pinkel's teams have won the turnover margin in 87 games, going 71-17 in such contests. Remarkably, 11 of those 16 losses came in Pinkel's first five years as he was rebuilding the program. Starting in 2006, Mizzou is 51-5 when winning the turnover battle. It is no surprise that in that span, Mizzou has won five conference division championships.
- ▶ Since joining the SEC, Mizzou is 17-2 when winning the T0 battle including a current streak of 10 consecutive wins. While the 10 consecutive wins when winning the T0 battle may seem impressive, it is still just over a third of the way to the school record, which is 29 consecutive wins by Pinkel's crew from 2005-2010.
- ▶ In Pinkel's 184 games as a head coach, Mizzou has either won the TO battle or tied in 134 of those 184 games. Mizzou has won 101 of those 134 games.
- ▶ Below is a breakdown of games when Mizzou has won the TO battle under Pinkel:

### PINKEL'S RECORD BY POINTS SCORED

- ▶ The winningest coach in Mizzou history, *Gary Pinkel* has taken a once downtrodden program to one of the nation's most elite programs since 2007. Below is a look at his record base on points scored.
- ▶ It is worth noting when looking at this chart that when Mizzou scores at least 30 points, Pinkel is 93-10. What is even more remarkable is that Mizzou has scored more than 30 points in 103 of Pinkel's 186 games (55 percent).

▶ Let's breakdown the same list by points allowed. Some notables are that Mizzou is 64-4 when holding opponents to fewer than 20 points during Pinkel's career and even more amazing is Mizzou's 104-26 record when limiting opponents to fewer than 30 points (80 percent). Mizzou lost its first ever game under Pinkel when limiting opponents to fewer than 10 points last week at Georgia

# **JAILBREAK BLITZ...DEFENSE NOTABLES**

### **TEAM NOTABLES**

▶ Mizzou's defense is playing at arguably its highest level since the early 1980s having held opponents to 21 points or fewer in all seven games this season and eight consecutive games dating back to last season's Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl (more on that streak below, by the way). That being said, the defense is well-represented in the national and SEC rankings so far this season. Below is a look.

▶ Not only does the team defense rank very high among conference and national opponents, but plenty of Mizzou individuals are well-represented among the national and SEC rankings, highlighted by a trio of breakout stars in LB *Kentrell Brothers* and DEs *Walter Brady* and *Charles Harris*. - ▶ It is important to note that Brady leads all freshmen nationally with his six sacks through the first seven games. Looking deeper into the stats, Harris and Brady have combined to give Mizzou one of the most potent DE duos in the nation. In fact, the duo's combined 22 tackles for loss (12.5 for Harris, 9.5 for Brady) match the pace set by current NFL players **Shane Ray** and **Markus Golden**, who had 22.0 through seven games a season ago.
- ▶ Harris and Brady have also combined to give Mizzou's the nation's third-best TFL duos. Below is a breakdown.

▶ What is remarkable about the list above is that both Harris and Brady are underclassmen (Harris a RS sophomore, Brady a RS freshman). Every other player on the list above is either a junior or senior.

### TIGER DEFENSE STAYING AWAY FROM BIG PLAYS

- ▶ Mizzou's defense has done a solid job of keeping opponents in check all season long, as one might surmise, with the Tigers ranking highly in many defensive categories within the SEC and nationally. One area where MU has really excelled is limiting long plays from scrimmage.
- ▶ In 483 defensive snaps through seven games so far, Mizzou has allowed only 17 plays of 20 yards or more, which ranks 3rd in the SEC and 14th in the NCAA. Breaking that down further, the Tigers have allowed only three plays of 30 yards or more (1st in SEC / 3rd in NCAA), and they are one of only three teams to not allow a single play so far of 40 yards or more.
- ▶ The Tigers have been the best against the run on denying long plays, as they've allowed only two rushes of 20 yards or more (1st in SEC / 3rd in NCAA), and they are one of only 12 defenses so far nationally to not allow a single run this year of 30 yards or more.
- ▶ According to College Football Matrix, Mizzou is the only team in the nation yet to allow a score from outside of the red zone this season as well.

### 21 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

- ▶ Continuing the theme of Mizzou's solid defensive play, we offer the fact that the Tigers have allowed 21 points or less in all seven games so far in 2015, and Mizzou's scoring defense average of 12.9 is tops in the SEC (and ranks 6th nationally)...
- ▶ Dating back to the 2014 Citrus Bowl against Minnesota (a 33-17 Mizzou win), the Tigers have allowed 21 or fewer points now in 8 consecutive games overall, which is the longest such streak at Mizzou since Warren Powers' Tigers achieved that in 12 straight games spanning the 1981-82 seasons. That streak began on Oct. 24, 1981, with a 6-0 loss to #15 Nebraska, and continued through Oct. 16, 1982, with a 17-17 tie against lowa State. The 12-game string was broken, albeit barely, on Oct. 23, 1982, with a 23-19 loss at #5 Nebraska...

### **INDIVIDUAL NOTABLES**

- ▶ LB *Kentrell Brothers* had a career-high 17 tackles last weekend against Georgia. His 17 tackles broke his previous career-high of 16, set twice earlier this season. The 17 tackles are also tied for the second-most by a Tiger in the Pinkel era. Brothers now has four of the top-seven tackling performances in the Pinkel era with all four coming this season (17 at UGA, 16 vs. SEMO, Arkansas State, 15 vs. Florida).
- ▶ Brothers has 91 tackles (42 solo), 5.5 TFLs (-16 yards), 2 INTs (returned 9 yards), two blocked kicks and one pass broken up through six games. His 91 tackles lead the nation as do his 13.0 tackles per game. Mizzou's single season tackles record is 164 by Travis McDonald (1994). His 91 tackles this season are already the 25th-most by a Tiger during the Pinkel era with five regular season games remaining.
- ▶ Brothers has 121 tackles over his last 10 games (12.0 avg.).
- ▶ Brothers' 2-interception performance at Arkansas State was the first for Mizzou since S *Braylon Webb* picked off two passes at Florida on Oct. 18, 2014. It marked the 11th time a Mizzou defender has recorded two or more picks over the last 18 years. Brothers is just the third linebacker to gain that distinction, joining LB Sean Weatherspoon (2 vs. Illinois on Aug. 30, 2008) and LB Brandon Barnes (2 vs. Texas Tech on Oct. 25, 2003).
- ▶ Brothers is the first Mizzou player under *Gary Pinkel* to post four consecutive games with at least 10 tackles before seeing that streak snapped against South Carolina. It is worth noting that Brothers was nursing an injured ankle in that game, suffered the previous outing against Kentucky. Against Florida and Georgia over the last two weeks, he looked like the Brothers from the first four weeks, hauling in a team-high 32 tackles in that span. He has four games with 15+ tackles in 2015.
- ▶ DE **Charles Harris** recorded 2.0 sacks at Arkansas State, equaling his career total coming in He also registered 4.5 tackles for loss (-24 yards) at A-State, which marked the first time a Mizzou defender recorded 4.5 or more tackles for loss in a game since LB Stryker Sulak has 5.0 TFLs vs. Illinois Aug. 30, 2008 at the Edward Jones Dome in St. Louis.
- ▶ Harris has 38 tackles (20 solo), 12.5 tackles for loss (-56 yards), 5.0 sacks (-33 yards), four QB hurries and a forced fumble through seven games. He had a careerhigh nine tackles with a sack at Georgia last weekend.
- ▶ Harris is 9th nationally and 2nd in the SEC in tackles for loss through seven games.
- ▶ DE *Walter Brady* recorded his first 2.0 career sacks (-10 yards) vs. UConn. He has been on a tear over his last seven games, totalling 6.0 sacks (20th-most nationally) and tops among freshmen nationally.

### **NOTABLES FROM GEORGIA**

- ▶ Mizzou now has eight interceptions on the season, fourth in the SEC
- ▶ LB **Kentrell Brothers** set a career-high with 17 tackles (five solo), breaking his previous career-best mark of 16 stops that he recorded earlier this season vs. Southeast Missouri on Sept. 5 and at Arkansas State on Sept. 12.
- ▶ Brothers recorded a stop on fourth-and-short in the first quarter, marking the fourth time the Mizzou defense has forced a turnover on downs this season.
- ▶ LB *Michael Scherer* finished with 12 tackles (three solo), a season-high total.
- ▶ S *Ian Simon* recorded his second interception of the season off of a deflected pass by Scherer on the first play from scrimmage. He set a career-long with a 39-yard return down to the Georgia 1-yard line. It established a new career-high for a single season and marked the fourth pick of his career. The 39-yard return was the longest by a Mizzou player since LB Darvis Ruise returned a pick 46 yards for a touchdown at Florida on Oct. 18, 2014.
- ▶ Simon also set a career high with nine tackles (five solo). His previous career-best was eight stops at Florida on Oct. 18, 2014.
- ▶ DE Charles Harris recorded a career-high nine tackles (two solo) and notched his fifth sack (-10 yards) of the season.
- ▶ DT **Terry Beckner, Jr.**, set a career-high with six tackles and notched his second sack (-2 yards) in as many weeks.

# **JAILBREAK BLITZ...DEFENSE NOTABLES**

### **BALL-HAWKING**

- ▶ The key to Mizzou's solid defense so far this year has been its ability to slow the pass with eight interceptions. Mizzou has a pair of three-interception games this season, marking the ninth time in 15 seasons under *Gary Pinkel* that the Tigers have had at least two separate three-interception games in the same season.
- ▶ Mizzou has three picks in a road win at Arkansas State earlier this season, two coming from LB *Kentrell Brothers* and the other coming from CB *John Gibson.* Mizzou also hauled in three interceptions against South Carolina with *Ian Simon, Kenya Dennis* and *Walter Brady* each hauling in picks.
- ▶ Below is a breakdown of Mizzou's three-interception games under Pinkel, which has grown to 15 such games.

### **NO FLY ZONE**

- ▶ Staying on the topic of Mizzou's pass defense, the Tigers have been nothing short of sensational this season. Mizzou is fourth in the SEC with eight interceptions this season, including two separate games with at least three picks.
- ▶ Mizzou leads the SEC and is 11th nationally in pass defense, allowing just 165.3 yards through the air this season. Mizzou has held six of its opponents this season to fewer than 200 yards passing.

### **SACK MASTERS**

- ▶ Mizzou finished 2014 with a school-record and SEC-leading 44.0 total sacks, one year removed from tallying 41.5 in 2013, which at the time was a school record.
- ▶ Through seven games this season, Mizzou has 20 sacks, a top-25 mark nationally.
- ▶ Mizzou's 105.5 total sacks over the last two-plus seasons rank as the fourth-most in college football in that span. Below is a list:
  - 1. Ohio State 111 (42 in 2013, 45 in 2014, 24 in 2015)
  - 2. Utah 110 (39 in 2013, 55 in 2014, 16 in 2015)
  - **3.** Washington 108 (41 in 2013, 51 in 2014, 16 in 2015)
  - **4.** Mizzou 105.5 (41.5 in 2013, 44 in 2014, 20.0 in 2015)
  - 5. Virginia Tech 102 (39 in 2013, 48 in 2014, 15 in 2015)
- ▶ Mizzou is second in the nation with 65 total tackles for loss and the 9.3 per game average is fifth nationally. Keep in mind, Mizzou does not have a senior on #DLineZou this season and starts two freshmen and a sophomore.
- ▶ Looking deeper into that, 31.0 of Mizzou's 65 total tackles for loss this season have come from freshmen or sophomores (48-percent).

### **DEFENSE SCORES, TOO!**

- ▶ Since 2010, Mizzou's defense has done more than just limiting its opponents from scoring they have been scoring themselves. In fact, since 2010, Mizzou has scored 26 defensive TDs, fifth-most nationally in that span, just one behind Florida.
- ▶ Mizzou scored a defensive TD in the season-opener as **Kentrell Brothers** blew up a pooch-punt for a block that caromed into the hands of **Aarion Penton**, who took it 41 yards for the score.
- ▶ Last season, Mizzou scored three defensive touchdowns, including two in one game at Florida when DE **Markus Golden** (2nd-round pick by the Arizona Cardinals) returned a fumble and LB **Darvin Ruise** returned a pick-six in that game.

### TENNESSEE MOUNTAIN HOME

- ▶ Similar to last week when seven Mizzou players returned to their home state of Georgia, this Saturday's game at Vanderbilt will be a homecoming six current Mizzou players. With six players from the state of Tennessee, it proves that Mizzou has established itself as a major player in the SEC recruiting footprint. Each of the six players is either a freshman or redshirt freshman as well. OL *Paul Adams* is a Nashville native as well, playing at Christ Presbyterian.

### **DEFENSE, SPECIAL TEAMS SPECIAL UNDER PINKEL**

- ▶ Since head coach *Gary Pinkel* took over the program in 2001, Mizzou has scored 72 times on defense or special times (48 defensive scores, 24 special teams scores). To put that mark into perspective, Mizzou had just 28 defensive and special teams scores in the previous 15 seasons prior to Pinkel's arrival on campus.
- ▶ The 24 special team scores consist of 19 punt or kick return scores (12 punt, seven kick) and five blocked kick scores (including one this season for a safety against UConn).
- ▶ Mizzou's 48 defensive scores consist of 22 pick six plays, 14 fumble recoveries and 12 defensive safeties.

### **FATONY EARNS NATIONAL HONOR**

- ▶ Freshman punter *Corey Fatony* earned the Ray Guy Award National Player of the Week title after his stellar performance against Florida two weeks ago.
- ▶ Fatony punted nine times against the Gators, averaging 47.8 yards per punt while resetting his career-long with a 61-yard punt in the second quarter. He pinned the Gators inside their 20-yard line four times. On the year, Fatony, a true freshman, is averaging 44.0 yards per punt on 45 attempts. He has placed 16 punts inside the 20 this season and had 19 fair caught while just three have been touchbacks.
- ▶ Among freshmen nationally, Fatony is first in yards per punt with his 44.0 yard average while his 45 total punts lead the nation.

### **DEFENSE LIMITING YARDS**

- ▶ Through seven games, Mizzou has allowed just 1,953 total yards, good for an average of just 279.0 per contest. Mizzou has not been that stingy on defense through the first seven games since 2006 when limiting opponents to just 1,933 total yards through seven games (276.1 per contest).
- ▶ To put that mark into context, the 2006 team finished the season ranked among the top 35 nationally in both scoring defense and total defense, limiting opponents to just 17.9 points per game and just 309 yards per game.

# QUICK HITS...MISCELLANEOUS NOTABLES

### PINKEL ON DODD TROPHY WATCH LIST

- ▶ Mizzou football head coach *Gary Pinkel* was one of 23 head coaches to be named to the Dodd Trophy Preseason Watch List, announced July 10 by the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation and the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. Pinkel is one of eight SEC coaches to land on the list, which is designed to recognize the nation's top head coach.
- ▶ The list includes 23 of the nation's top college football coaches representing all Power 5 conferences, the Mountain West Conference and Notre Dame. The head coaches on the watch list represent programs with the highest ideals of leadership, scholarship and integrity on and off the field the three pillars of legendary coach Bobby Dodd's philosophy. Each coach sits at the helm of programs with winning records, superior Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores and graduation rates, along with a strong commitment to service within their respective communities.
- ▶ Pinkel is the reigning SEC Coach of the Year and has led Mizzou to five conference division titles in the last eight seasons (2007, 2008, 2010, 2013, 2014), which is tied for the best in the nation in that span. Mizzou has won 78 games since 2007, which ties Ohio State for the fifth-most wins nationally in that span. Pinkel is the winningest coach in Mizzou history (117-67) and is the 19th-winningest coach in FBS history.
- ▶ Not only have Pinkel's teams seen tremendous success on the field, but they have excelled in the classroom. In 2013 and 2014, Pinkel's teams have ranked in the NCAA top 10 in APR. The Tigers were third in the SEC in APR in 2015 and led the league in 2014.

### A 'BARRY' INTIMIDATING GROUP

- ▶ Mizzou's defense has become one of the most feared groups in the SEC and this year, the group will have a new leader as DC *Barry Odom* returns to Mizzou after a successful stint as the DC at Memphis. Odom, 38, as he takes over for *Dave Steckel*, who left to be head coach at Missouri State following the conclusion of Mizzou's 2014 season.
- ▶ Odom has been defensive coordinator and safeties coach at Memphis for the past three seasons, where he has orchestrated an impressive body of work by the Tiger defense. Memphis concluded a 10-3 season that was fueled largely by Odom's defense which ranked fifth nationally in scoring defense (17.1 ppg) and 22nd in total defense (343.3 ypg) heading into bowl season. That marked an astounding incremental improvement, as Memphis ranked 117th nationally in total defense in 2011 prior to Odom assuming the reins. In 2012, Odom's first year, the Tiger defense improved to 50th nationally in total defense (383.6 ypg), followed by a jump to 39th in 2013 (370.7 ypg). Memphis earned a share of the 2014 American Athletic Conference title, giving them a conference championship for the first time since 1971.
- ▶ It's a homecoming for Odom as he returns to his alma mater, where he starred as a linebacker for Mizzou from 1996-99 and later returned for a nine-year stint (2003-11) in a variety of roles for Pinkel's staff. He first came back in 2003 as an administrative graduate assistant, and after one year in that role, Odom moved to director of recruiting for the 2004 and 2005 seasons and then served three years (2006-08) as director of football operations.
- ▶ In 2009, Odom moved to the coaching side of the ledger, as Pinkel's safeties coach for three seasons where he developed *Kenji Jackson, Jarrell Harrison* and *Jasper Simmons* into All-Big 12 performers for Tiger teams which won 26 games in those three years. Odom also played a significant role in recruiting, as he was the lead on many highly-regarded prospects who chose to attend Mizzou.

### **BACK-TO-BACK**

- ▶ Mizzou has won the SEC East in back-to-back seasons and that accomplishment has put Mizzou in some pretty elite company. Since 2001, Mizzou joins Alabama, Georgia, Florida and Tennessee as the only SEC teams to win two consecutive SEC division titles. Four programs in the SEC (Kentucky, Ole Miss, Texas A&M and Vanderbilt) have never won an SEC Division Championship and Mizzou has done so twice in its first three seasons
- ▶ Mizzou's 23 wins over 2013 and 2014 are fifth nationally, trailing only Florida State (27), Ohio State (26), Michigan State (24) and Oregon (24).
- ▶ Since 2007, Mizzou has claimed five conference division titles (three Big 12 North titles and two SEC East titles), the most in the nation during that span.
- ▶ All of those division-winning seasons ended with at least 10 wins as five of Mizzou's six 10-win seasons in program history have come under the direction of *Gary Pinkel*.
- ▶ In each of the last two seasons, Mizzou has clinched the SEC East at home with wins over SEC West powers Texas A&M (2013) and Arkansas (2014). Each division title seemed equally as improbable to national pundits, but Mizzou defied the odds each year. In 2013.


Mizzou was coming off of a disappointing 2012 campaign in which it went 5-7. But the Tigers rebounded for a 12-2 season, ranking as high as No. 5 nationally and culminating in an AT&T Cotton Bowl Classic win over Oklahoma State. Last year, Mizzou won its final six regular season games despite being underdogs in four of those six games. The season ended with an 11-3 mark and a Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl Championship.

### "MO"VEMBER

▶ There is no question that in college football, teams that win in November often are destined for championships and Mizzou Football has been the perfect reflection of that over the last two years. Since 2013, Mizzou is a perfect 8-0 in the month of November

### **REMEMBERING 'AO' 10 YEARS LATER**

- ▶ The 2015 season marks the 10-year anniversary of the tragic passing of *Aaron O'Neal*, a linebacker on the 2005 Mizzou Football team who passed away at the age of 19 following a voluntary workout. O'Neal may be gone, but he has not been forgotten by anyone in the Mizzou community and his memory lives on with Gary Pinkel and the program 10 years later.
- ► Gary Pinkel has done his best to help the program remember O'Neal, the man with the 'million-dollar smile' as he was renowned. Every year, a linebacker from the St. Louis area where O'Neal called home will



don O'Neal's #25. Currently, that bestowment belongs to sophomore LB **Donavin Newsom;** he will wear it for the remainder of his career and pass along to another St. Louis LB. Newsom, just like O'neal, graduated from Parkway North High School in St. Louis, Mo.

### **BOEHM, DENNIS, HANSBROUGH, SIMON CAPTAINS**

- ▶ In its annual tradition, Mizzou Football and head coach Gary Pinkel announced the team's captains to coincide with the opening of training camp in early August. Earning this distinction as team captains this season were seniors C *Evan Boehm*, CB *Kenya Dennis*, RB *Russell Hansbrough* and S *Ian Simon*.
- ▶ The four seniors were selected by their teammates and have combined to play in 129 games, including a combined 77 starts. The seniors have helped Mizzou win 28 games over the last three seasons and were key cogs in Mizzou's back-to-back SEC East Championships over the last two seasons.



### 10 TIGERS PLAYING AFTER EARNING DEGREES

- ▶ When Mizzou hits the field for the first time in 2015, 10 Tiger seniors will be playing having already earned their degrees. That is the third-most graduates playing on any team in the nation in 2015. In addition, five of the seniors are scheduled to graduate in December while the remaining four are all on pace to graduate in May.

In 14 years at the University of Missouri, Gary Pinkel has meticulously built a previously downtrodden program 17. into one of the most successful in the nation, and after a 18. thrilling 2013 season, he very well might have performed 19. the best coaching job of his career in 2014.

Picked to finish a distant fourth in the SEC Eastern Division in the preseason, Pinkel guided his troops to an 11-3 record and a second-straight division championship 23. and subsequent bowl game victory.

The Tigers ended the magical 2014 season with a 25. New Year's Day 33-17 win over Minnesota in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl, giving the Tigers 23 wins in two seasons - a school record.

The job Pinkel did during the year went recognized by his coaching peers, as he was voted the SEC Coach of the Year by league coaches.

The well-deserved honor capped a season that saw the Tigers rebound from a pair of tough losses early in the year and close the regular season with six straight wins - including four games in which they entered as underdogs - to claim the East crown.

Under his watch, Mizzou has now won conference division titles five of the last eight seasons (2007, 2008, 2010, 2013, 2014), which is tied for most in the nation during that stretch (along with Alabama and Florida State), while the Tigers' 78 wins in that time is tied for 5th-best among FBS "power 5" conferences.

The winningest head coach in both Mizzou and Toledo histories (making him the only active coach to make that claim at the FBS level), Pinkel enters the Vanderbilt game with a Mizzou record of 117-69 in 14 seasons, while he's 190-106-3 overall in 24 seasons. His 190 wins is the 2nd-most among active FBS coaches.

Pinkel got his MU record-breaking win thanks to a thrilling 41-31 win over Oklahoma State in the 2014 AT&T Cotton Bowl Classic. The win was the 102nd at MU in his 13 years patrolling the sidelines, and that broke a tie he held going into the game with Tiger legend Don Faurot, who won 101 games in 19 seasons from 1935-42 and 1946-56. Pinkel has 113 wins at Mizzou following 2014.

- Ford (1996-2000) coached Toledo's receivers in his Rocket days, also serving as recruiting coordinator in 1996. He was a graduate assistant on Pinkel's first staff in 1991.
- Jones (1992-2000) began oversight of running backs in 1995 after coaching receivers from 1992-94.
- Kuligowski was Toledo's defensive line coach for the majority of his stint with the Rockets (1996-2000) after serving as recruiting coordinator, tight ends coach and assistant offensive line coach at Toledo from 1992-1995.

- 125 The 2015 season marks the 125th season of University of Missouri football. The Missouri football program began play in 1890. However, MU did not field a team in 1918 due to an influenza epidemic on campus
- Mizzou holds an all-time record of 659-**659** 538-52, which equates to a .548 winning percentage.
- The Tigers are 351-302-32 overall 351 in conference play (53.6 winning percentage). Head coach Gary Pinkel's squad is 17-10 in the SEC, including the outstanding 7-1 league mark from last

# AMONG THE NATION'S ELITE...

- Since 2007, Mizzou ranks in the Top 10 among BCS-AQ leagues in wins, while also ranking in the Top 10 in Academic Progress Rate (APR), as well as in the Top 5 since 2009 in most NFL First Round draft picks.
- Head coach Gary Pinkel's squad was atop of the Southeastern Conference in APR for both of the program's first two seasons in the league. The Tigers posted an APR score of 982 to lead the league for the 2011-12 academic year, followed by a 980 score for 2012-13. 

# FAUROT FIELD AT MEMORIAL STADIUM (71,168 CAPACITY)



### Mizzou's gameday home is Memorial Stadium/Faurot Field. Here are some facts associated with the stadium.

- Opened in 1926
- Built for a cost of \$350,000
- Initial seating capacity was 25,000
- Named Memorial Stadium in honor of the 112 Mizzou graduates and students who died in World War I
- The Rock M overlooking the North endzone debuted in 1927, and was assembled by the freshman class
- Seating capacity is 71,168 in 2015
- MU all-time record at Memorial Stadium is 279-176-20 (60.8%) in 89 seasons.
- Field was named Faurot Field in 1972 in honor of Hall of

Fame Coach Don Faurot (fuh-ROE)

- Approximately \$50 million of construction investment provided new amenities prior to 2014, including:
- East side addition which added a new upper deck (called the Tiger Deck), which added 4,500 seats
- A new club/lounge level (called the Columns Club) complete with outdoor loge seating and two suites
- New lighting towers
- Ribbon/message boards on both the east and west sides
