- Mizzou closed its 2015 regular season with a 3-0 (25-14, 25-20, 25-16) sweep over South Carolina on Friday, Nov. 27. The Tigers ended their regular season with an impressive 26-5 overall record and 14-4 mark in SEC contests.
- 2015 SEC Freshman of the Year, **Alyssa Munlyn**, posted another outstanding match against the Gamecocks as she finished with nine kills on .467 hitting and five total blocks. Munlyn's five blocks gave her 142 total blocks for the season, marking a new single-season total blocks record in Mizzou Volleyball
- The Tigers tallied 37 kills on .301 hitting as six different Tigers posted four-plus kills to form a balanced attack. Munlyn had a team-leading nine kills while junior Carly Kan posted eight kills and senior Regan Peltier had five kills.

#### #MIZZOU STORYLINES

- Mizzou's trip to the 2015 NCAA Tournament is its 12th all-time in program history. All 12 trips have come under Wayne Kreklow and Susan Kreklow's tenure since they took over the program beginning with the 2000 season.
- Alyssa Munlyn earned her third straight SEC Freshman of the Week honor on Monday, Nov. 30. The 2015 SEC Freshman of the Year racked up four total SEC Freshman of the Week awards this season.
- After totaling 31 total blocks last week, the Tigers' 341.5 total blocks this season are currently the most in a single-season in program history.
- Entering this week, Mizzou's .839 (26-5) overall winning percentage is first in the SEC and 18th in the NCAA.
- The Tigers have been carried by efficient hitting and strong defense at the net all season long. Currently, their .264 team hitting percentage ranks third in the SEC and 25th in the NCAA, their 341.5 total blocks ranks first in the SEC and fourth in the NCAA and their 2.82 blocks per set ranks second in the SEC and 20th in the NCAA.
- Mizzou currently stands with 26 wins this season, marking the 17th 20-plus win campaign in the program's 42-year history. Its .839 overall winning percentage currently ranks second-hightest in program history, trailing only the .972 winning percentage accomplished by the 2013 Mizzou Tigers.
- Under Wayne and Susan's tenure, Mizzou Volleyball has posted nine 20-plus win campaigns in their 16 seasons. In the 25 years prior to the Kreklows' arrival in Columbia, Mizzou Volleyball tallied just eight 20-plus win campaigns.
- The Tigers' win at Ole Miss (Nov. 22) marked their ninth 25-plus win season in program history and the fourth 25-plus win season under the Kreklows' tenure. Before the Kreklows took over in 2000, the Tigers' last 25-plus win season took place in 1983.

- ▶ The 339 wins also ranks Mizzou 16th nationally among teams from power conferences since 2000.

# TIGERS NCAA BOUND FOR 12TH TIME SINCE 2000

- After being picked seventh in the 2015 SEC Preseason polls, Mizzou surprised everyone and turned in an oustanding 26-5 (14-4 SEC) campaign. Mizzou's 14-4 record in SEC contests gave them a second place finish in the standings as it held the head-to-head tiebreaker over Kentucky.
- On Sunday, Nov. 29, the Tigers gathered and learned their fate for the 2015 NCAA Tournament. After falling just outside the top-16 NCAA RPI rankings, Mizzou knew they would have to travel for its first and second round matchups.
- On ESPNU's live selection show, it was announced that the Tigers would be a part of the San Diego Regional and travel west to Lawrence, Kan., for their first and second round matchups. Mizzou will face Missouri State in the first round on Thursday, Dec. 3, at 4 p.m. (CT). With a Tigers' win against the Bears, they would then face the winner of No. 9 Kansas and Furman on Friday, Dec. 4, at 6:30 p.m. (CT).
- This year's NCAA Tournament appearance is the 12th in 16 seasons for Mizzou under the direction of coaches Wayne and Susan Kreklow. The last appearance for Mizzou was in 2013 when Kreklow's team earned the No. 4 overall seed in the tournament.
- In the Kreklows' first eight seasons at Mizzou (2000-07), the Tigers made the NCAA Tournament in each of those years. Those eight trips included three second-round visits (2002, 2004, 2006) and a visit to the regional final in 2005. After a two-year hiatus, the Tigers returned to the big dance in 2010 and advanced to the regional semifinal.

# MUNLYN NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK (X3)

- ▶ Tiger middle blocker **Alyssa Munlyn** was named Southeastern Conference Volleyball Freshman of the Week, as announced Monday (Nov. 30) by the SEC office. Munlyn recorded 21 kills on .531 hitting with 13 total blocks against No. 19 Texas A&M and South Carolina during the week of Nov. 23-29.
- ▶ The award marked Munlyn's third consecutive Freshman of the Week honor from the SEC office (Nov. 9-15, Nov. 16-22 and Nov. 23-29). It's also her fourth total SEC Freshman of the Week recognition this season.
- Her four Freshman of the Week honors in 2015 are the most since former First-Team All-American and U.S. National Team setter **Molly Kreklow** tallied five Big 12 Newcomer of the Week awards in 2010.
- Munlyn kicked off the last week of the regular season with an outstanding match against No. 19 Texas A&M on Wednesday, Nov. 25., with 12 kills on .588 hitting and eight total blocks. It marked her ninth match hitting better than .500 this season.
- ▶ Two days later against South Carolina (Nov. 27), Munlyn added nine kills on .467 hitting and five total blocks to close out her impressive two-match stretch. It marked the 19th time this season that Munlyn led the Tigers in single-match total blocks.
- Munlyn took her game to another level in SEC play this season, recording 147 kills on .431 hitting with 89 total blocks (1.25 per set) in 18 total conference contests. In SEC matches, Munlyn's .431 hitting percentage ranked third-highest in the conference while her 1.25 blocks per set ranked fourth-best.
- In her first season in black and gold, Munlyn has already etched her name into Mizzou Volleyball history.

  Munlyn's 142 total blocks ranks first in a single-season in program history, her 119 block assists are tied for the most in a single season and her 1.17 blocks per set ranks eighth-highest in a single-season. Additionally, Munlyn's .374 season hitting percentage is the sixth-highest in a single-season in Tiger history.

# KAN, LARSON & MUNLYN EARN 2015 SEC HONORS

- Junior Carly Kan, redshirt sophomore Kira Larson and freshman Alyssa Munlyn were honored Wednesday (Nov. 25) by the Southeastern Conference for their exceptional 2015 campaigns. Kan, Larson and Munlyn were each named to the 2015 All-SEC Team. Munlyn was also named to the 2015 All-Freshman Team as well as garnering 2015 SEC Freshman of the Year honors.
- Wednesday's recognition is Kan's third career honor from the SEC. The Mizzou OH previously claimed All-SEC and Freshman of the Year honors in 2013. Larson and Munlyn both picked up their first career postseason honors by the league office.
- Munlyn's Freshman of the Year honor is the third individual in program history to garner Freshman of the Year accolades. The Suwanee, Ga., native joins Jessica Vander Kooi (2003 Big 12 Freshman of the Year) and Kan (2013 SEC Freshman of the Year) on the exclusive list.
- In 2015, Kan has been honored two other times by the SEC office while Munlyn has gained three accolades. Kan was named SEC Player of the Week on Sept. 14 and garnered SEC Co-Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 21. Munlyn has picked up three SEC Freshman of the Week honors (Nov. 2, 16, 23).

# KAN REACHES 1,000 CAREER KILLS, DIGS & POINTS

- In her 75th career match, junior outside hitter **Carly Kan** surpassed 1,000 points for her Mizzou Volleyball career. To cap her MVP performance at the USF Invite (Sept. 4-5), Kan tallied 22 kills on .340 hitting and led the Tigers to their second tournament title of the season.
- Kan's quick rise to 1,000 career points ranks her at the top of Mizzou Volleyball history. Former 3x All-American outside hitter Lisa Henning was previously the fastest to reach that mark, as both Kan and Henning tallied the historic number at 75 career matches.
- The talented Tiger also tallied her 1.000th career kill and 1.000th career dig. Kan becomes just one-of-five Tigers to ever record 1,000 career kills, digs and points. Currently on the list is Shen Danru (2002-05), Jessica Vander Kooi (2003-06), Yvette Buhlig (1988-92) and Naaron Branson (1998-01).

# MUNLYN HONORED YET AGAIN BY SEC OFFICE

- Freshman middle blocker Alvssa Munlyn was named Southeastern Conference Volleyball Freshman of the Week, as announced Monday, Nov. 23, by the SEC office. Munlyn recorded 11 kills on .370 hitting with 11 total blocks against Arkansas and Ole Miss through the week of Nov. 16-22.
- The award marked Munlyn's second consecutive Freshman of the Week honor from the SEC office. It's also Munlyn's third total SEC Freshman of the Week recognition this season.
- Her three Freshman of the Week honors in 2015 are the most since former First-Team All-American and U.S. National Team setter **Molly Kreklow** tallied five Big 12 Newcomer of the Week awards in 2010.
- Munlyn kicked off her award winning week with an outstanding match at Arkansas (Nov. 18) with eight kills on .500 hitting and four total blocks. It marked her eighth match hitting better than .500 this season.
- Four days later at Ole Miss (Nov. 22), Munlyn added eight total blocks to conclude her impressive two-match stretch. It marked the 18th time this season that Munlyn led the Tigers in single-match total blocks.

#### TIGERS TALLY STUNNING COMEBACK AT KENTUCKY

- Mizzou produced one of its most exciting wins of the season on Sunday, Nov. 15, after defeating No. 18 Kentucky 3-2 (25-27, 25-19, 23-25, 25-19, 16-14) in Lexington, Ky.
- Mizzou trailed by six points on three separate occassions in the fifth set (8-2, 12-6, 13-7) before tallying a thrilling 6-0 run to even the score. The Tigers' 14th block of the match wrapped up the afternoon and improved thier record to 23-4 (11-3 SEC) at that point of the season.
- Four Tigers recorded double-digit kills against the Wildcats, highlighted by junior Carly Kan's team-leading 16 kills. The Mizzou outside hitter also tacked on 18 digs, marking her team-leading 15th double-double of the
- Senior Regan Peltier had one of her top matches this season, producing 14 kills on .357 hitting and 10 digs. It marked her third double-double of the 2015 campaign.
- Sophomore Courtney Eckenrode also recorded her third double-double of the season after recording 35 assists (matching season-high) and 13 digs.

# MUNLYN NAMED SEC'S TOP FRESHMAN AGAIN

- For the the second time this season, freshman Alyssa Munlyn was recognized by the Southeastern Conference league office. On Monday, Nov. 16, the SEC named Munlyn the Freshman of the Week for her outstanding performances against Georgia (Nov. 13) and No. 18 Kentucky (Nov. 15).
- Munlyn tallied 17 kills on .516 hitting with seven total blocks against the Bulldogs and Wildcats. Last Friday vs. Georgia, she finished with nine kills on a career-high .727 hitting percentage. Two days later on the road at Kentucky, the Suwanee, Ga., native posted eight kills on .400 hitting and five total blocks.
- Following another strong week, Munlyn entered the week of Nov. 16-22 only two total blocks away from cracking the top-10 in Mizzou Volleyball single-season blocks.

# ETHRIDGE EARNS FIRST CAREER SEC HONOR

- First-year Tiger, Alexa Ethridge, has been a consistent force at libero all season long for Mizzou. For the week of Nov. 9-15, the Lee's Summit, Mo., native had banner matches as she posted 36 digs (4.50 per set), eight assists and three service aces in matches vs. Georgia and at No. 18 Kentucky.
- For the week, Ethridge posted 4.50 digs per set, 1.00 assists per set and 0.38 service aces per set, all of which placing above her season averages in those categories.
- Ethridge's 17 digs vs. Georgia and 19 digs at No. 18 Kentucky led Mizzou in the category in each match. She has placed the Tigers in digs in 22 of 27 matches up to that point of the season.

# MIZZOU FINISHES 11-1 AT HOME THIS SEASON

- Following its win on Friday, Nov. 27, against South Carolina, Mizzou concluded its 2015 home schedule with an outstanding 11-1 record. The Tigers outscored their opponents this season at the Hearnes Center by the tune of 35-14
- Since 2009, Mizzou Volleyball has recorded double-digit wins at home six times (2015, 2013, 2012, 2011, 2010, 2009). This year's Tiger squad recorded the program's best home winning percentage (.917) since 2013 when that year's squad went 19-1 (.950).

# MUNLYN TABBED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

- Freshman **Alyssa Munlyn** tallied 20 kills on .515 hitting and 14 total blocks against Alabama and Auburn (Oct. 26 Nov. 1) en route to winning the SEC Volleyball Freshman of the Week award.
- Munlyn kicked off her week vs. Alabama, recording a rare double-double with double-digit kills and blocks.
   Her 12 kills and 10 total blocks against the Crimson Tide marked the first kill-block double-double by a Tiger since 2014.
- Her team-leading 10 total blocks set a new career-high and led the Tigers to 23.0 total blocks vs. Alabama. The team's outstanding defensive match marked Mizzou's fourth-highest single-match block total in program history.
- ▶ The Tiger middle blocker closed her weekend with another strong match vs. Auburn, posting eight kills on .500 hitting with four total blocks.

#### TIGERS HAVE HISTORICAL BLOCKING NIGHT

- Mizzou returned home on Oct. 28 against Alabama and produced a big 3-2 (33-35, 25-20, 26-28, 25-19, 15-10) comeback victory. Highlighting the win was a historical blocking performance by the Tigers' defense. Freshman **Alyssa Munlyn** (10), junior **Emily Thater** (9), junior **Julia Towler** (9) and redshirt sophomore **Kira Larson** (7) each tallied seven plus blocks, leading to a new season-high of 23.0 total team blocks.
- ▶ The incredible blocking night marked the fourth-highest single-match block total in Mizzou Volleyball program history, including the highest block total since the 25-point set era's inception in 2008.
- Mizzou's block party particuarly launched in the second set as it finished with eight of its 23 total blocks. Munlyn tallied six of the eight blocks herself, leading to her new career-high of 10 total blocks. Towler chipped in with three of her own and finished with a new career-high of nine total blocks. Larson's seven total blocks and Thater's nine total blocks also set new personal career-highs.
- Munlyn had an outstanding overall night, recording 12 kills on .526 hitting plus her 10 total blocks. The Suwanee, Ga., native's first career double-double marked the first Tiger kill/block double-double since Whitney Little accomplished the feat in 2014 against UNC-Greensboro.
- Junior Carly Kan led the Tigers' offense with 16 kills and 10 digs, marking her team-leading 13th double-double of the season. Additionally, for the second time in a three-match span, Larson matched her career-high in kills with 15.

# BLOCK PARTY IN FULL FORCE VS. MISSISSIPPI STATE

- Mizzou kicked off its weekend (Oct. 23-25) with a 3-1 victory over Mississippi State inside the Hearnes Center. The Tigers' win was highlighted by a season-high 18.0 total blocks, cruising past their previous top mark of 14.0 total blocks. Five different Tigers finished with three or more total blocks on the evening.
- Freshman **Alyssa Munlyn** got off to a quick start against the Bulldogs, posting four solo and five total blocks in the first set alone. Overall, the Suwanee, Ga., native finished the night with nine total blocks, surpassing her previous career-high of eight total blocks in a match.
- Redshirt sophomore **Kira Larson** had arguably her best match in a Tiger uniform, matching her career-high with 15 kills on .636 hitting. It also marked the first time this season that she's led Mizzou in kills in a match.
- Junior Carly Kan recorded 14 kills and 14 digs overall for her team-leading 12th double-double of the season. Kan assisted on defense as well with two solo blocks for the third time in her career.
- Junior **Emily Thater** matched her season-high with seven total blocks, contributing to the Tigers' defense.

# MIZZOU EARNS TWO MORE SEC WINS

- After suffering its first Southeastern Conference match loss at Alabama (Oct. 11), Mizzou responded nicely with back-to-back wins on Oct. 16 (3-1 over Ole Miss) and Oct. 18 (3-0 over Georgia).
- The Tigers started things off with a convincing win at home vs. the Rebels. Mizzou held Ole Miss to under 20 points in each of its three set victories. The Tigers were led by an outstanding offensive evening, highlighted by a .324 team hitting percentage. Mizzou hit over .300 in each of the four sets.
- Senior Regan Peltier posted a season-high 16 kills on .536 hitting to lead the Tigers' attack. It marked her seventh double-digit kill match of the season. Junior Carly Kan finished with 17 kills while redshirt sophomore Kira Larson produced 11, giving the Tigers three players with double-digit kills overall.
- For the fifth consecutie match, all coming in SEC play, Mizzou recorded at least 11.0 total team blocks. Larson and freshman Alyssa Munlyn each tallied five total blocks to pace the Tigers' strong defense. Sophomore Ali Kreklow posted 18 assists and 13 digs on the night, marking her fifth double-double of the 2015 campaign.
- Two days later in Athens, Ga., the Tigers cruised to a 3-0 sweep over Georgia. Serving was the advantage of the day for Mizzou (season-high 10 service aces) and downfall for the Bulldogs (11 service errors). Leading the outstanding serving afternoon was sophomore **Courtney Eckenrode**, as she finished with a career-high six aces. At one point in the match, Eckenrode reeled off an incredible four straight aces against Georgia, pulling the Tigers away in the second set.

# TIGERS WIN SEC ROAD OPENER IN STARKVILLE

- After taking its first two conference matches of the season at home, Mizzou traveled to Starkville, Miss., on Friday, Oct. 9, for its first SEC matchup away from the Hearnes Center. In front of an loud and energetic crowd at Newell-Grissom Building, the Tigers produced a 3-1 (27-25, 26-28, 25-22, 25-17) victory against the Bulldogs.
- Junior **Carly Kan** recorded a team-leading 16 kills with 14 digs, marking her 10th double-double of the season at that point. Junior **Emily Thater** produced the Tigers' most efficient attack all night, finishing with nine kills on a team-best .562 hitting. The Springfield, Mo., native also paced Mizzou in total blocks with five.
- ▶ The win improves Mizzou's all-time record against Mississippi State to a perfect 7-0, including a 3-0 record in all-time matches in Starkville.

# MIZZOU TOPS TENNESSEE TO MOVE TO 2-0 IN SEC

- ▶ The Tigers maintained their early perfection in SEC play with a 3-1 (25-17, 20-25, 25-17, 25-17) win over Tennessee at the Hearnes Center. Sunday's triumph improved Mizzou's record to 14-1 overall and 2-0 in SEC competition.
- Sunday's win improved Mizzou's all-time record at home against Tennessee to 4-0. The Tigers have also won four consecutive matches in the all-time series vs. the Volunteers.
- Junior Carly Kan and sophomore Ali Kreklow each produced double-doubles for the Tigers. Kan's ninth double-double of the season included a team-leading 16 kills and 10 digs. Kreklow recorded a team-leading 28 assists and 10 digs, finishing with her fourth double-double of the year.

#### TIGERS KNOCK OFF NO. 9 FLORIDA IN SEC OPENER

- Mizzou fans witnessed one of the more thrilling matches in program history on Wednesday, Sept. 30, as the Tigers knocked off No. 9 Florida Gators, 3-2. Mizzou trailed the Gators 2-0 and faced a deficit as large as nine points in the third set. Coach Kreklow gathered the troops and sparked a thunderous comeback en route to three consecutive set victories and an overall match triumph.
- The Tigers are now 4-0 all-time in SEC season opener. Oddly enough, the last time Mizzou came from a 0-2 match disadvantage was in 2012 in that season's SEC opener vs. Tennessee. On Sept. 12, 2012 against the Volunteers, Mizzou reeled off three straight sets and stunned the 17th ranked team in the country.
- Mizzou's 3-2 win over No. 9 Florida marked its first victory over a top-10 opponent since its 3-0 triumph at No. 5 Florida on Nov. 15, 2013.
- ▶ Three Tigers finished with double-digit kills against Florida. Junior **Carly Kan** tallied 17, junior **Julia Towler** finished with 10 and senior **Regan Peltier** produced 12. Kan also finished with 13 digs, marking her eighth double-double of the season.





# MIZZOU 4-FOR-4 IN TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONSHIPS

- The Tigers concluded its early season tournament schedule from Sept. 18-19 in Indianapolis at the 2015 Butler Invitational. For the fourth straight tournament the Tigers produced three consecutive wins and improved its season record to 12-0. Mizzou saved its best performance for last in Indianapolis with a 3-0 sweep over Youngstown State. The Tigers collectively hit .371 against the Penguins, marking their second-highest team hitting percentage of the sesson (only trailing .411 hitting percentage vs. North Texas on Aug. 29).
- Junior Carly Kan (MVP), redshirt sophomore Kira Larson and junior Alexa Ethridge were all named to the Butler Invitational All-Tournament Team for their outstanding performances. Kan and Larson have been named to all four tournament All-Tournament Teams this season. The honor was Ethridge's first All-Tournament Team nod of the year.
- Larson totaled 28 kills on .348 hitting to increase her team-leading hitting percentage to .377. Ethridge had a team-best 51 digs (4.64 per set) along with 11 assists to lead Mizzou's back row defense.

## KAN HONORED BY SEC OFFICE YET AGAIN

- For the second straight week, junior **Carly Kan** was honored by the Southeastern Conference office. For the week of Sept. 14-20, the Honolulu native was named the SEC Volleyball Co-Offensive Player of the Week. Kan was named the Butler Invitational MVP after recording 55 kills on .307 hitting and two double-doubles. In her last two matches, she recorded 44 kills on .435 hitting to close out another impressive tournament. Kan upped her season double-double total and 20-plus kill outputs to seven each.
- ▶ The award was Kan's second honor from the SEC office this season. She was previously named SEC Player of the Week on Monday, Sept. 14, after tallying 72 kills on .299 hitting at the 2015 Appalachian State Invitational.
- Kan has been honored by the SEC office three times in her career. Her first came in 2013 when she was named SEC Freshman of the Week on Oct. 14, 2013.

#### TIGERS NET THIRD STRAIGHT TOURNAMENT TITLE

- Mizzou improved to 9-0 on the season following its three victories and championship at the 2015 Appalachian State Invitational. It marked the team's third consecutive tournament title to open the season.
- Junior Carly Kan (MVP), redshirt sophomore Kira Larson, and freshman Alyssa Munlyn were all named to the Appalachian State Invitational All-Tournament Team for their outstanding performances. Kan earned her third straight tournament MVP honors this season after tallying 72 kills on .299 hitting in three matches. The Honolulu, Hawaii, native finished with 20-plus kills in each of Mizzou's matches in Boone, North Carolina. She has six 20-plus kill outputs in the Tigers' nine matches so far this season.
- Larson joins Kan as being a three-time All-Tournament honoree this season. The Fargo, North Dakota, native produced 35 kills on .444 hitting and eight total blocks at the invite. Munlyn is now a two-time All-Tournament recipient, as she had 22 kills on .452 hitting and a team-leading 18 total blocks at the Appalachian State Invitational.
- Mizzou saw contributions up-and-down the lineup last weekend, as senior **Regan Peltier** (28 kills & 35 digs), junior **Emily Thater** (20 kills on .395 hitting, eight total blocks) and junior **Julia Towler** (17 kills and 13 total blocks) also turned in strong performances.

# KAN NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Junior Carly Kan was on a mission in Boone, North Carolina, at the 2015 Appalachian State Invitational, as she recorded three consecutive 20-plus kill matches. Overall that weekend, she tallied 72 kills on .299 hitting and twice had a career-high 26 kills in single matches.
- For her outstanding weekend, Kan was named the SEC Volleyball Week Three Player of the Week. (Sept. 7-13, 2015). It marked the second career SEC weekly honor for Kan, as she was also named Freshman of the Week on Oct. 14, 2013.

# MIZZOU WINS SECOND STRAIGHT TOURNAMENT

- ▶ Mizzou improved to 6-0 on the young season following its second consecutive tournament victory in many weeks. The Tigers defeated Florida Gulf Coast (3-0), Arkansas State (3-2), and South Florida (3-1) in the two day span.
- ▶ The Tigers continued their impressive combination of effective hitting and defense throughout their trip in Tampa, Florida. After hitting over .300 as a team in two of three matches, the Tigers' .328 hitting percentage for the season ranks second in the SEC. Defensively, Mizzou had double-digit blocks in each match at the USF Invite, adding onto their outstanding block totals for the season. In fact, the Tigers' 2.78 blocks per set through six matches ranks second best in the conference.
- Leading the blocking brigade in Tampa was junior middle blocker **Emily Thater**. The Springfield, Missouri, native had 12 total blocks in the tournament, including three in the solo fashion. Thater's greatest effort at the net came against Arkansas State, when she finished with six total blocks (two solo).
- In the tournament finale against South Florida, coach Kreklow was welcomed with an outstanding performance off the bench by freshman middle blocker **Hao Jin.** Heading into that match, Jin had not recorded a kill all season long, but she exploded against the Bulls with nine kills on .600 hitting and six total blocks.

# TIGERS IMPRESSIVE AT TIGER INVITATIONAL

- Mizzou Volleyball opened the season (Aug. 28-29) in the friendly confines of the Hearnes Center, recording three consecutive wins en route to a tournament title at the 20th annual Tiger Invitational.
- In each match of the tournament, the Tigers improved upon their previous team hitting percentage number. Mizzou began with 58 kills on .309 hitting against North Dakota State, followed by 42 kills on .343 hitting against Winthrop, and culminated with an outstanding 43 kills on .411 hitting versus North Texas.
- ▶ The Tigers used a balanced attack throughout the weekend, led by junior outside hitter Carly Kan (50 kills on .430 hitting). Also leading the offense was senior outside hitter Regan Peltier (26 kills, three aces, 12 digs), redshirt sophomore right side/middle blocker Kira Larson (24 kills on .392 hitting), freshman middle blocker Alyssa Munlyn (23 kills on .364 hitting, 16 total blocks), and junior right side/middle blocker Julia Towler (13 kills on .312 hitting, 10 total blocks).
- ▶ The Tigers' 6-2 offensive rotation saw consistent performances from sophomore setting duos of **Ali Kreklow** and **Courtney Eckenrode**. Both Tigers finished with over 5.00 assists per set, as Kreklow tallied 57 assists and Eckenrode finished with 60 assists in the three matches.

# KAN CONTINUES THE DOUBLE-DOUBLE MACHINE

- Junior outside hitter Carly Kan had a historical freshman campaign in 2013, where she was named SEC Freshman of the Year and an AVCA All-American. Kan didn't disappoint in her sophomore encore, as she once again earned AVCA All-American honors.
- Along with leading the nation in combined kills and digs a season ago, Kan put up historical double-double numbers on the court. Overall, the Honolulu, Hawaii, native tallied 19 double-doubles in 2014, matching the school record for most double-doubles in a season during the 25-point set era (since 2008). She is now tied at the top with former Tiger All-American setter, **Molly Kreklow**.
- ▶ In 2015, Kan has racked up 16 more double-doubles, totaling 43 for her standout Tiger career.

# KAN NAMED TO 2015 PRESEASON ALL-SEC TEAM

- Junior outside hitter **Carly Kan** was named to the 2015 Preseason Volleyball All-SEC Team in mid-August by the Southeastern Conference office. She was the lone outside hitter on this year's list.
- Kan was one of nine student-athletes to be named to this season's Preseason All-SEC Team, and it marked the second consecutive preseason recognition for the Honolulu, Hawaii, native.
- ▶ The talented Tiger proved to be one of the nation's top outside hitters in 2014, leading the SEC with 19 doubledoubles. That number matched the Mizzou Volleyball program record for double-doubles in a season during the 25-point set era.
- Overall, Kan tallied 418 kills, 394 digs, and 457.5 points in her sophomore campaign for Mizzou. She also led the nation in combined kills and digs in 2014.
- Joining Kan on the 2015 Preseason All-SEC Team were Krystal Rivers (OPP Alabama), Chanell Clark-Biggs (MB Arkansas), Rhamat Alhassan (MB Florida), Mackenzie Dagostino (S Florida), Alex Holston (RS Florida), Morgan Bergren (S Kentucky), Nakeyta Clair (MB Ole Miss) and Shelby Sullivan (MB Texas A&M).





# MIZZOU MAKING IMPACT WITH TEAM USA

- A pair of Tigers, former All-American setter **Molly Kreklow** and current star outside hitter **Carly Kan**, have enjoyed tremendous success recently with Team USA Volleyball.
- Kreklow played a huge role into the U.S. National Team's FIVB World Grand Prix Championship in July. Team USA finished the World Grand Prix a perfect 5-0, and the former Tiger was named the Grand Prix's Most Outstanding Setter.
- Kreklow started at setter for Team USA in all five matches of the FIVB World Grand Prix, as the team dropped just one set during the entire tournament.
- More great news for Kreklow came a month later when she was one of 14 players to make the final U.S. roster for the 2015 FIVB World Cup. Beginning in late August, the U.S. National Team will look to finish either first or second at the FIVB World Cup and guarantee qualification into the 2016 Rio Olympic Games.
- Also shining for Team USA this summer was Kan, who was selected to a USA Volleyball roster for the second conseuctive year. In July, Kan made her way to South Korea with Team USA at the World University Games.
- Kan was one of 12 players selected to the team that was part of USA Volleyball's High Performance program's Collegiate National Team.
- The Honolulu native had arguably her best match with Team USA on July 1 when she produced seven points on six kills (.545 hitting percentage).

# **FANS CONTINUE TO FILL THE HEARNES CENTER**

- Matchdays at the Hearnes Center have an excitement that is unmatched. Since 2000 and the arrival of Wayne and Susan Kreklow, the Tigers faithful have continued to come through the turnstiles in incredible fashion.
- For the past 14 seasons, Mizzou has finished in the top-25 national attendance rankings. In fact, the Tigers have 12 top-20 national attendance numbers, and four top-10 totals since 2002.
- The program's most highly attended season came in 2013, as the team went 34-0 and claimed Mizzou Athletics' first ever SEC Championship. On Nov. 22, 2013 the SEC Championship clinching match the Tigers took home the crown in front of a school-record 7,879 fans (the first of two 7,000 + crowds that season).

# TIGERS HONORED FOR ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

- Mizzou Volleyball has routinely excelled in the classroom, and the program was honored for its outstanding achievements for the 2014-15 academic year.
- ▶ Beginning in late May following the Spring 2015 semester at the University of Missouri, the Tigers finished with a 3.55 cumulative GPA and it was the team's highest GPA in more than a decade. In fact, according to Mizzou's Total Person Program (TPP), the 3.55 Spring 2015 semester GPA was the highest as a program since 2004.
- Individually, the Tigers swept up a slew of impressive academic awards in 2014-15. They included the following:
  - Alexa Armendariz (2014-15 First-Year SEC Academic Honor Roll)

Mizzou volleyball's rise to national prominence since 2000 can be easily tied to its leadership at the helm of the program as Wayne and Susan Kreklow have built a national power. Heading into the 2013 season, the résumé was impressive enough: 10 NCAA Tournaments, one Elite Eight, two Sweet 16s, 12 winning seasons and an average of 20 wins per season.

But the Kreklows and the 2013 team rewrote the record books with the most successful season in program history. Not only did the Tigers become the first ever team at Mizzou to win a Southeastern Conference Championship and the program's first conference championship, but the team finished the regular season unblemished at 34-0. The team earned the No. 4 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament and saw four players earn AVCA All-America honors, including a pair of first team honorees in senior setter Molly Kreklow and senior right side Lisa Henning. Wayne Kreklow was named SEC Coach of the Year for engineering the whole thing. Below is just a snapshot of the achievements by the 2013 team.

- SEC Champions School's first ever SEC title and program's first ever league championship
- First ever SEC team to finish a regular season unbeaten
- Reset school records in wins, conference wins, consecutive wins, sweeps and team hitting percentage
- Led the nation in hitting, kills, assists, wins and points per set while averaging the fewest errors per set
- Saw four players Molly Kreklow, Lisa Henning, Carly Kan, Whitney Little - land on the All-SEC team
- Molly Kreklow was named SEC Player of the Year, Carly Kan was SEC Freshman of the Year and Wayne Kreklow was SEC
- Four Tigers were AVCA All-Americans Molly Kreklow and Lisa Henning (First Team) and Carly Kan and Whitney Little (honorable
- Wayne Kreklow was the SEC Coach of the Year and the AVCA Southeast Region Coach of the Year
- Carly Kan earned AVCA Southeast Region Freshman of the Year

Aside from all of the accomplishments for the 2013 team, Wayne and Susan Kreklow had built a power at Mizzou since arriving in 2000. In fact, now that the Tigers have reached the NCAA Tournament in 11 of the last 15 seasons, Mizzou is one of only 22 teams nationally to qualify for at least 10 NCAA Tournaments in the last 15 seasons. In the Kreklow's first eight seasons at the helm of the program, Mizzou qualified for the NCAA Tournament in each year, joining Nebraska as the only two programs to accomplish that feat during the span.

In their inaugural season as an SEC member, the Kreklows guided Mizzou to a 19-win season while finishing fourth in the SEC East division. They also guided three players - Molly Kreklow, Lisa Henning and Whitney Little - to All-SEC honors. Henning was a unanimous All-SEC First Team pick while Kreklow and Little were second-team honorees. Henning also went on to garner AVCA All-America Third Team honors, becoming the second Tiger to earn AVCA All-America honors in two consecutive seasons.

The 2011 season may have showcased the Kreklow's coaching prowess unlike ever before. With just two seniors on the 2011 squad, the Kreklows took a group comprised primarily of freshmen and sophomores to the NCAA Tournament for the 10th time in 12 seasons. In fact, the Tigers were the youngest team to qualify for the field of 64 as 11 of its 13 players were underclassmen. The Kreklows also guided Henning to AVCA Third Team All-America honors, becoming the first Tiger underclassman to earn AVCA All-America honors.

In 2010, the Kreklows took the Tigers back to the NCAA Sweet 16, marking the program's second-deepest run into the NCAA Tournament in history. The Tigers also pulled the biggest first-round upset in NCAA Tournament history in 2010, knocking off fifth-seeded Northern Iowa in Cedar Falls in a thrilling five-set match. The Tigers boasted four wins over ranked teams in 2010, including two in the NCAA Tournament, and took home 14 Big 12 Athlete of the Week honors, the most by any team in the league in 2010. The Tigers also ranked 16th nationally in average attendance last season.

Under the Kreklow's guidance in 2010, senior outside hitter Paola Ampudia was named honorable mention All-American by the AVCA was a member of the first team All-Central Region and All-Big 12 teams. She was a unanimous selection to the All-Big 12 team. The Kreklows also saw freshman setter Molly Kreklow garner AVCA Central Region Freshman of the Year honors and honorable mention All-Big 12 status as well. She and classmate Lisa Henning also appeared on the All-Big 12 Freshman team.

Under the direction of the Kreklow's, academics and community involvement continue to be a cornerstone of the program. In 2009, six Tigers earned a spot on the Academic All-Big 12 team while senior setter Lei Wang-Francisco became the program's first-ever four-time Academic All-Big 12 honoree.

While the Kreklow's success at Missouri was immediate, the apex of their successes came at the end of the 2005 season. The Tigers were selected to host NCAA First and Second rounds for the second-consecutive year, achieving an overall No. 10 seed in the tournament. After defeating Missouri State in the first round, Mizzou swept Arkansas to advance to the team's first regional in school history. At the Penn State Regional, the Tigers took perennial power Hawaii head-on in the regional

semifinal, defeating UH in four games. The Tigers accumulated a 25-5 record in 2005, the winningest season in school history, and were a step away from the Final Four.

Also in 2005, Wayne Kreklow was named College Volleyball Update's honorable mention National Coach of the Year as the team surged to the national top-10 for the first time in school history, sweeping three top-10 teams along the way. In all, the Kreklows have amassed a 200-108 (.649) winning record in their Mizzou tenure with 117 wins coming in Big 12 play, averaging 12 conference wins per season. The Tigers have won 21 matches over Top-25 teams since 2000, toppling five during the magical 2005 season. Mizzou itself has spent 76 weeks in the national top 25 since 2000.

Upon arrival, the Kreklows wasted no time in putting their winning mark on a program that had not experienced success since the early 1980's. In their first three years at Mizzou (2000, 2001 and 2002) they recorded the program's first back-to-back 20-win seasons since 1981-83. In fact, the Tigers won 70 matches in the first three years under the Kreklows, more than the previous seven years combined. Missouri posted the first postseason victory in school history by defeating Northwestern in the first round of the 2002 NCAA Tournament. In 2004, Missouri had the honor of hosting first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history.

In 2000, the Kreklows' first season at MU, the Tigers finished second in the Big 12 Conference after finishing ninth the previous year. For her efforts, Susan was named as the 2000 Big 12 Coach of the Year by her peers. The Kreklows have made Mizzou Volleyball an exciting marketable entity, and the growth in attendance has been effected, as Missouri has ranked in the nation's top seven in the category in 2005 and 2006, averaging more than 2,600 fans per competition. On Oct. 5, 2005, 7,298 fans packed the Hearnes Center for the Tigers' match against Nebraska. Both teams entered the contest undefeated and ranked in the national top-10.

Before the 2005 season, Wayne and Susan officially switched titles within the University system to allow for more family flexibility. While the official coaching records of both are affected, their coaching philosophy is one built on a co-op instead of a one-headed system.

Before coming to Missouri, the Kreklows were co-head coaches of both the men's and women's volleyball teams at Columbia College. They enjoyed great success, taking their women's team to the NAIA National Tournament six times and winning consecutive national titles in 1998 and 1999.

The Cougars also won five regional championships and seven consecutive American Midwest Conference championships under their guidance. In 1998 and 1999, Columbia College achieved consecutive undefeated seasons with a combined record of 85-0. The Cougars' undefeated record included 78 consecutive wins at home and 227 consecutive game victories.


# **WAYNE & SUSAN KREKLOW AT MIZZOU**

In 1997 and 1998, the Kreklows shared NAIA/AVCA National Coach of the Year and Midwest Region Coach of the Year honors. In 1999, the coaching tandem took home the regional award for the fifth consecutive year. In 1998 and 1999, the Kreklows also received the NAIA National Tournament Coach of the Year award.

Along with the success of the women's program, the Kreklows started the men's volleyball program at Columbia College in 1997. In 1999, the Cougars finished the season with a 19-5 overall record, enjoying their second consecutive undefeated run through the Midwest Intercollegiate Volleyball Association. They also took second place at the inaugural SSI Volleyball National Invitational Tournament in 1999.

Susan Kreklow played volleyball for Central Missouri State University and Missouri State. She received her bachelor's degree in physical education and a Master's of Science degree from Missouri State in 1984 and 1987, respectively. Kreklow began her coaching career at St. Clair (Mo.) High School. She began her collegiate coaching career at Columbia College in 1990. Susan was the founder of Columbia Juniors Volleyball Club and the Columbia Developmental Volleyball Leagues. She has served as a member of the USA Volleyball Board of Directors as the NAIA representative and was president-elect of the NAIA National Coaches Association.

Wayne Kreklow earned a bachelor's degree in social science in 1980 from Drake University. While at Drake, Wayne was a member of the men's basketball team, where he earned All-America, all-conference and all-district awards as a two-time team captain, and is fifth on Drake's career scoring list. He is also a member of Drake's All-Century basketball team and was a member of the NBA World Champion Boston Celtics in 1980-81. Wayne began coaching basketball for Central Decatur (lowa) High School in 1986. He began coaching volleyball as an assistant under Craig Sherman at Missouri. He was with the Tigers from 1989 to 1994 before moving over to Columbia College to join his wife at the helm of the Cougar program.


