# #HonoringSlive

- ▶ The 14 Athletics Directors of the SEC voted unanimously in May at the SEC Spring Meetings to recognize former SEC Commissioner Mike Slive by dedicating a game on each campus to prostate cancer awareness. Mizzou chose Saturday's game with SEMO to raise awareness
- ▶ Prostate cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death in American men. Although the disease is serious, most men diagnosed with prostate cancer can successfully fight the disease with early detection. Men over the age of 50 are highly encouraged to get regular prostate cancer screenings.
- ▶ Slive was originally diagnosed with prostate cancer in the late 1990s. He served as commissioner of the SEC from 2002 until his retirement in 2015.

# #TigerTracks - Individual Notes

- ▶ Mizzou is one of eight SEC schools to return its top QB and top RB from a season ago and the duo of *Maty Mauk* and *Russell* **Hansbrough** are the most productive of the eight duos. The two combined for 4,105 total yards and 37 TDs in 2015.
- ▶ The linebacking duo of All-SEC Second Teamer Kentrell Brothers and Michael Scherer is the nation's third-best returning tackling duo and the top tandem in the SEC. The two combined for 236 tackles in 2014.
- ▶ Senior K *Andrew Baggett* enters 2015 just 71 points shy of breaking the school record for points in a career by a Tiger.
- Mizzou's Evan Boehm and Kentrell Brothers were each tabbed as third team All-SEC honorees in the preseason by the media. The SEC coaches tabbed Mizzou's Brothers and Mauk second team All-SEC while Boehm and Hansbrough were third team.

# Program Talking Points

- ▶ Mizzou has won five conference division titles since 2007, tied for the most among any school from a power five with Alabama and Florida St.
- ▶ Mizzou has won 76 games since 2007, tied with defending national champion Ohio State, Wisconsin and USC for the fifthmost in the country (power five) in that span. Below is a list:

# #*MIZZOU* STORYLINES

- No. 24/23 Mizzou Football will kick off its season against in-state rival SEMO of the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) on Saturday (Sept. 5). Kickoff for the game is slated for 3 p.m. and it will be broadcast nationwide on SEC Network (alternate) and SEC Network+ on the WatchESPN app. Beth Mowins, Anthony Becht and Paul Carcaterra are on the call.
- Mizzou begins its 125th season of football with an all-time record of 655-535-52. The last 15 of those 125 seasons have arguably been Mizzou's finest under the direction of head coach Gary Pinkel. In that span, Mizzou is 113-66 with five seasons of 10 or more wins, five conference division titles and 10 bowl games (six wins).
- ▶ Saturday's game marks the third meeting all-time between Mizzou and Southeast Missouri as the in-state schools will play for the first time since 2008. In 2008, Gary Pinkel's squad, led by reigning Heisman Trophy Finalist Chase Daniel, defeated SEMO, 52-3. Daniel went 16-for-17 in that game, the school record for completion percentage (94.1) with more than 10 attempts. He added three TD passes to set the school record for passing efficiency in a game (273.4) in the win.
- Mizzou is 3-0 all-time against teams from the state of Missouri, winning both games with Southeast Missouri and a single game against Missouri State (formerly Southwest Missouri State). Below is a guick look at the all-time meetings against in-state schools, which includes a pair of shutouts and a combined score of 82-3 over the three meetings:
  - 1923 Mizzou vs. Missouri State W, 10-0 Columbia, Mo.
  - 1936 Mizzou vs. Southeast Missouri W, 20-0
  - 2008 Mizzou vs. Southeast Missouri W. 52-3
- Gary Pinkel has played just one game against in-state foes since taking the reigns in 2001 and that came in 2008 in the aforementioned 52-3 win over SEMO. Mizzou is set to play Missouri State coached by former Mizzou defensive coordinator Dave Steckel - in 2017 and will again play SEMO in 2019.
- ▶ In its previous 124 seasons, Mizzou stands at 80-39-5 in season-opening games (.665). Mizzou has won 13 consecutive season-openers and 17-of-18 dating back to 1997.
- Mizzou holds an 89-31-4 all-time record (.733) in 124 previous home openers. Included in that figure is a mark of 59-27-3 (.678) in home openers since 1926, the year that Memorial Stadium opened. Since the field was named Faurot Field in 1972, Mizzou's home opener record is 32-11 (.744).
- ▶ Mizzou is a pristine 14-0 all-time against opponents from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Head Coach Gary Pinkel is 11-0 against FCS foes in his 14 previous years at Mizzou, with the average score being 49.4-to-8.5 (543-to-93 overall combined score).
- ▶ When Mizzou takes the field on Saturday, 10 football student-athletes on the Mizzou roster will be playing having already earned degrees from Mizzou. That is the third-most for any program in college football this season, trailing only Virginia (13) and South Carolina (11). The Tigers are tied for third with Louisana-Monroe and USC. Additionally, Mizzou has five more seniors set to graduate in December with four more slated to walk across the stage in May of 2016.





# A LOOK AT THE OPPONENT... SEMO

▶ Southeast Missouri is coming off an impressive first year under head coach *Tom Matukewicz* who installed his Brick-by-Brick philosophy and led the Redhawks to five victories, marking the program's highest total since 2010. For the first time in program history, SEMO defeated two ranked opponents in the same season, including a 24-23 upset of No. 3 Southeastern Louisiana on Sept. 20, 2014 at Houck Stadium in Cape Girardeau.

SEMO is led by Preseason All-American and two-time first-team All-Ohio Valley Conference WR *Paul McRoberts* (St. Louis, Mo./Soldan), a senior, who is rewriting the Southeast record book and is one of the top pass catchers in the Football Championship Subdivision. McRoberts has caught 99 passes for 1,495 yards (15.1 avg.) and 20 TDs during his 3-year career. He has notched 44 receptions and nine TDs in consecutive seasons. He was limited to seven games in 2014, but still amassed 711 receiving yards (101.6 per game), including three 100-yard performances. He is tied for second in

school history in TD receptions and has recorded 16 scoring catches over his last 13 games, including at least one TD in 11 of those contests. McRoberts also played basketball for the Redhawks in 2013-14, seeing action in 13 games and averaging 5.9 points on the hardwood.

Southeast also returns starting senior RB **DeMichael Jackson** (Louisville, Ky./Jeffersontown), who averaged 91.8 rushing yards per game in 2014 to rank fourth in the OVC. He finished with 734 rushing yards on 137 carries (5.4 avg.) with five TDs a year ago when he earned second-team All-OVC honors. Jackson has also been named a Preseason All-American. He has rushed for 1,731 yards with nine TDs during his 3-year career.

# **BACK-TO-BACK...**

- ▶ Mizzou has won the SEC East in back-to-back seasons and that accomplishment has put Mizzou in some pretty elite company. Since 2001, Mizzou joins Alabama, Georgia, Florida and Tennessee as the only SEC teams to win two consecutive SEC division titles. Four programs in the SEC (Kentucky, Ole Miss, Texas A&M and Vanderbilt) have never won an SEC Division Championship and Mizzou has done so twice in its first three seasons in the league.
- ▶ Mizzou's 23 wins over the last two seasons are fifth nationally, trailing only Florida State (27), Ohio State (26), Michigan State (24) and Oregon (24).
- ▶ Since 2007, Mizzou has claimed five conference division titles (three Big 12 North titles and two SEC East titles), the most in the nation during that span.
- ▶ All of those division-winning seasons ended with at least 10 wins as five of Mizzou's six 10-win seasons in program history have come under the direction of *Gary Pinkel*.
- ▶ In each of the last two seasons, Mizzou has clinched the SEC East at home with wins over SEC West powers Texas A&M (2013) and Arkansas (2014). Each division title seemed equally as improbable to national pundits, but Mizzou defied the odds each year. In 2013, Mizzou was coming off of a disappointing 2012 campaign in which it went 5-7. But the Tigers rebounded for a 12-2 season, ranking as high as No. 5 nationally and culminating in an AT&T Cotton Bowl Classic win over Oklahoma State. Last year, Mizzou won its final six regular season games despite being underdogs in four of those six games. The season ended with an 11-3 mark and a Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl Championship.

# **QUICK STRIKES...OFFENSE NOTABLES**

# HANSBROUGH APPROACHING 2K MARK

- ▶ When senior RB *Russell Hansbrough* takes the field on Saturday vs. SEMO, he will need just 92 yards to break 2,000 for his career. Only 14 Tigers (and only 12 running backs) have ever rushed for more than 2,000 yards in a career. Should he eclipse the 2,000-yard mark, Hansbrough will be the first Tiger to do so since *Henry Josey* in 2013.
- ▶ Should Hansbrough go over 2,000 yards, he will be the seventh player under head coach *Gary Pinkel* to accomplish that feat. Other 2,000-yard rushers under Pinkel include QB *Brad Smith* (4,289), *Zack Abron* (3,198), *Henry Josey* (2,771), *Tony Temple* (2,552), *Kendial Lawrence* (2,232) and *Derrick Washington* (2,085). Of course, all of those running backs were mentored by RB coach *Brian Jones*, who has been with Pinkel's coaching staff since 1992.
- ▶ Hansbrough is the first Mizzou player to rush for 1,000 yards and return for a season since Henry Josey in 2013. Hansbrough ran for 1,084 yards in 2014. Hansbrough's 205 rushes in 2014 were the most by a Tiger RB since 2003 when Zack Abron ran the ball 219 times. His 1,084 yards in 2014 rank 10th all-time at Mizzou. He has averaged 5.5 yards per carry over the last two seasons.

# TOP RETURNING BACKFIELD DUO IN SEC

- ▶ Sticking with the theme of productive backfield production returning to Mizzou in 2015, the Tiger backfield combination of junior QB **Maty Mauk** and senior RB **Russell Hansbrough** is actually the most productive returning backfield in the SEC this season.
- ▶ When combining QB and RB production, the duo accounted for 4,105 total yards of offense and 37 touchdowns a season ago, more than any other QB/RB duo in the SEC.
- ▶ In 2014, Mauk accounted for 3,021 yards of offense and 27 TDs and the aforementioned Hansbrough accounted for 1,084 yards and 10 TDs.
- ▶ The 37 TDs were challenged only by Arkansas' Brandon Allen and Jonathan Williams, who finished with 34 combined TDs. After that, the next-best mark is just 25 TDs. Allen and Williams also finished 630 yards off the pace of Mauk and Hansbrough in 2014.

# **BOEHM NAMED ALL-SEC, TO MULTIPLE WATCH LISTS**

- ▶ Senior C *Evan Boehm* is one of the nation's top returning offensive lineman and the team captain reaped the benefits in the preseason, earning multiple awards.
- ▶ Boehm was selected as a Preseason All-SEC Third Team member by the media following SEC Media Days in Hoover, Alabama, in July, and the coaches in August.
- ▶ Boehm was also named to a pair of preseason award watch lists over the summer. He is up for the Outland Trophy and the Rimington Trophy. The Outland Trophy honors the nation's top interior lineman while the Rimington Trophy is given annually to the nation's top center.
- ▶ Boehm has started 40 career games for Mizzou (including the last 28 at center) and is the unquestioned leader of a very talented and experienced offensive line.

# YOUTH MOVEMENT AT WIDEOUT

▶ Of Mizzou's 221 catches a season ago, only 43 of those return for 2015, including just 10 from true wideouts (5 for *Nate Brown*, 3 for *Wesley Leftwich* and 2 for *J'Mon Moore*). That trio, along with TEs *Sean Culkin* and *Jason Reese* will be looked to step into starting roles this year and take on a bigger role in the pass game.

# THE BEASTIE BOYS (OFFENSIVE LINE)

- ▶ In what is a pretty remarkable coincidence this season, Mizzou returns five seniors across the offensive line this season as the group is the most experienced of any position group for Mizzou heading into 2015.
- ▶ Of the five seniors, four are atop the depth chart in starting roles heading into the season, anchored by senior C *Evan Boehm*, who has started 40 games across the Mizzou O-line in his career, including the last 28 at center. In all, the five seniors have combined for 96 career starts since 2012, giving Mizzou one of the most experienced groups in the SEC.

# **MORE ON THE O-LINE**

- ▶ Mizzou allowed just 1.64 sacks per game last season, a mark that ranked 35th nationally. It was also Mizzou's best single season mark in that category since 2011 (1.38). The Tigers have five offensive lineman with starting experience coming back in 2015, including four starters, so the Tigers' pass protection once again looks to be a strength in 2015.
- ▶ Looking deeper into the line, the Tiger run game got stronger as games went along in 2014. Mizzou ran for 733 yards in the 4th quarter (5.1 per attempt) which was 102 more than it gained in any other quarter last season. The Tigers also lost just 60 yards rushing in the fourth quarter a season ago, 33 fewer than any other quarter.
- ▶ In close games in the fourth quarter (+/- 3 points), the Tigers averaged 6.8 yards per carry last season. Conversely, Mizzou's opponents averaged just 3.8 yards per carry in those situations a season ago.

# **MAUK A PROVEN WINNER**

- ▶ In 18 career games as a starting quarterback, redshirt junior *Maty Mauk* is 14-4 and has been a key cog in Mizzou's back-to-back SEC East Championships. Couple his 14-4 mark as a collegiate QB with his 42-8 mark as a starting signal caller for Kenton High School, Mauk is 56-12 as a starting quarterback since 2008.
- ▶ Needing to win their final six games to claim an SEC East Championship, a much-scrutinized Mauk was sensational. In his last seven games in 2014, Mauk had a QB rating over 100 and boasted an 11-4 touchdown-interception rate in that span.
- ▶ Mauk threw for 2,648 passing yards in 2014, the seventh-best mark in program history. His 3,021 total yards last season mark the 10th-best single season output in school history.
- ▶ Mauk enters the season with 3,719 career passing yards, a mark that ranks ninth in program history.
- ▶ At Mizzou, Coach Pinkel and his staff preach finishing in the fourth quarter and there has been no better 'finisher' than Maty Mauk. In fact, in his career the junior QB is 55-for-95 with 765 yards (8.05 per attempt) with 10 TDs and zero interceptions in the 4th quarter. He has also rushed for 166 yards on 26 carries (6.4 per rush) with another TD.

# **BAGGETT 71 POINTS SHY OF MIZZOU CAREER RECORD**

- ▶ Heading into the season, Mizzou senior PK *Andrew Baggett* sits just 71 points shy of breaking *Jeff Wolfert's* career record for points scored. Baggett has 292 points in his career (50 field goals, 142 PATs).
- ▶ Baggett is also just nine FGs and 43 PATs from passing Wolfert.
- ▶ In his career, Baggett has turned in two of the best point-scoring season totals in Mizzou history. His 120 points in 2013 rank fourth all-time at Mizzou while his 97 total points a season ago rank 14th.

# HOLDING ONTO THE ROCK

- ▶ Mizzou is coming off of a school-record performance in 2014 when it comes to ball security. Mizzou lost just three fumbles in 2014, the fewest in program history.
- ▶ Mizzou ran 954 plays in 2014, meaning that the Tigers lost a fumble just once in every 318 plays a season ago.
- ▶ The lost fumbles was not a case of just getting 'the lucky bounce' either. Mizzou put the ball on the turf just 10 times in 2014 (once every 95 plays). To put how good the 10 fumbles were, Mizzou's opponents fumbled more than three times as much with 32 fumbles. In fact, Mizzou recovered more fumbles (13) than it committed as a team in 2014.

# **JAILBREAK BLITZ...DEFENSE NOTABLES**

# THE BASH BROTHERS

- ▶ Kentrell Brothers and Michael Scherer are the top returning tackling duo in the SEC (236 tackles in 2014). The 236 combined tackles returning make them the third-best returning tackling duo in the nation (UMass's Jovan Santos-Knox and Joe Cotton 241 // Duke's DeVon Edwards and Jeremy Cash 244).
- ▶ Brothers' 122 tackles last season were the most by a Tiger in a single season since former first round NFL Draft pick **Sean Weatherspoon** had 155 in 2008. He is the SEC's top returning tackler from a season ago.
- ▶ Brothers was named to the Butkus Award, Nagurski Award and Bednarik Award Watch Lists this summer and was also dubbed a third-team All-SEC pick by the media following media days in Hoover.
- ▶ Brothers needs just 76 tackles to crack the all-time career top-20 in tackles at Mizzou
- ▶ With new DC *Barry Odom* now at the helm of the Tiger defense, look for strongside linebacker *Donavin Newsom* to have an expanded role in the defense this season as well. He had 24 tackles and 3.5 TFLs a season ago.

# **RELOADING #DLINEZOU**

- ▶ A staple of Mizzou's defense has been its defensive line, or better known as #DLineZOU, a term coined by last year's phenoms **Shane Ray** and **Markus Golden**. This season, DL coach **Craig Kuligowski** will rely on rising sophomore and Kansas City native **Charles Harris** to anchor a young but talented group. Harris spent last season backing up Ray and Golden and tallied 2.0 sacks, 4.0 tackles for loss and 19 total tackles while playing in 13 games. Three of his four TFLs came against SEC opponents a season ago as did 11 of his 19 tackles.
- ▶ The interior of the line could also be a strength for the Tigers in 2015, highlighted by returners *Josh Augusta* and *Rickey Hatley*. Checking in at nearly 350 pounds with unlimited potential, Augusta tallied 23 tackles with 4.5 tackles for loss and a sack while backing up *Harold Brantley* and *Matt Hoch* a season ago. Hatley, a RS sophomore, also played in 14 games last season and totaled 11 tackles and a sack and was dubbed the team's Most Improved Defensive Lineman during spring practice.
- ▶ Kuligowski also has great depth along the defensive line once again. Freshman *Terry Beckner, Jr.* and RS sophomore *A.J. Logan* provide great depth on the interior while junior college transfer *Marcel Frazier* and RS freshman *Walter Brady* give Kuligowski two solid options opposite from Harris on the other end opposite Harris.

# **SACK MASTERS**

- ▶ Mizzou finished 2014 with a school-record and SEC-leading 44.0 total sacks, one year removed from tallying 41.5 in 2013, which at the time was a school record.
- ▶ Mizzou's 85.5 total sacks over the last two seasons rank as the sixth-most in college football in that span. Below is a list:
  - 1. Utah 94 (39 in 2013, 55 in 2014)
  - 2. Washington 92 (41 in 2013, 51 in 2014)
  - 3. Stanford 90 (44 in 2013, 46 in 2014)
  - **4.** Virginia Tech 87 (39 in 2013, 48 in 2014) Ohio State - 87 (42 in 2013, 45 in 2014)
  - **6.** Mizzou 85.5 (41.5 in 2013, 44 in 2014)
- ▶ Mizzou finished ninth nationally in sacks with a program-best 3.14 per game.
- ▶ The Tigers were also 10th nationally in TFLs. That is the second-best season pergame average in program history (7.50), trailing only the 2013 team (7.70).

# **PUTTING OPPONENTS IN A 'CORNER'**

- ▶ Mizzou may possibly have the best corner duo that it has ever had under Gary Pinkel heading into the 2015 campaign in *Aarion Penton* and *Kenya Dennis*.
- ▶ Dennis, who represented Mizzou at SEC Media Day back in July, led Mizzou CBs with 61 tackles a season ago, 48 being unassisted. Dennis was a lightly-recruited, full academic qualifier out of high school who received only junior college offers. He has since blossomed into a Junior College All-American at Hinds (Miss.) Community College and is expected to be one of the top CBs in the SEC this season. He had a pick and was second on the team with nine pass breakups in 2014.
- ▶ While Dennis is a menace tackling and making plays, Penton is a perfect complement as a cover corner opposite Dennis. Penton racked up 36 tackles a season ago and led the team with 10 pass breakups and was second on the team with three picks.

# A 'BARRY' INTIMIDATING GROUP

- ▶ Mizzou's defense has become one of the most feared groups in the SEC and this year, the group will have a new leader as DC *Barry Odom* returns to Mizzou after a successful stint as the DC at Memphis. Odom, 38, as he takes over for *Dave Steckel*, who left to be head coach at Missouri State following the conclusion of Mizzou's 2014 season.
- ▶ Odom has been defensive coordinator and safeties coach at Memphis for the past three seasons, where he has orchestrated an impressive body of work by the Tiger defense. Memphis concluded a 10-3 season that was fueled largely by Odom's defense which ranked fifth nationally in scoring defense (17.1 ppg) and 22nd in total defense (343.3 ypg) heading into bowl season. That marked an astounding incremental improvement, as Memphis ranked 117th nationally in total defense in 2011 prior to Odom assuming the reins. In 2012, Odom's first year, the Tiger defense improved to 50th nationally in total defense (383.6 ypg), followed by a jump to 39th in 2013 (370.7 ypg). Memphis earned a share of the 2014 American Athletic Conference title, giving them a conference championship for the first time since 1971.
- ▶ It's a homecoming for Odom as he returns to his alma mater, where he starred as a linebacker for Mizzou from 1996-99 and later returned for a nine-year stint (2003-11) in a variety of roles for Pinkel's staff. He first came back in 2003 as an administrative graduate assistant, and after one year in that role, Odom moved to director of recruiting for the 2004 and 2005 seasons and then served three years (2006-08) as director of football operations.
- ▶ In 2009, Odom moved to the coaching side of the ledger, as Pinkel's safeties coach for three seasons where he developed *Kenji Jackson, Jarrell Harrison* and *Jasper Simmons* into All-Big 12 performers for Tiger teams which won 26 games in those three years. Odom also played a significant role in recruiting, as he was the lead on many highly-regarded prospects who chose to attend Mizzou.

# HARD TO SCORE

- ▶ Mizzou allowed just 36 touchdowns to opponents a season ago (2.6 per game) as the 36 total TDs allowed were the fewest by a Tiger team since 2010 when the team allowed just 26. It was the fifth-fewest TDs that the team has allowed under *Gary Pinkel*, who enters his 15th season in 2015.
- ▶ Looking deeper, Mizzou ranked 19th nationally in scoring defense a season ago, allowing only 21.07 points per contest. That is the best by a Mizzou team since the 2010 team allowed just 15.17 points per game.
- ▶ Down the stretch, Mizzou was very good defensively. Over the last eight games, only Alabama scored more than 27 points on the Tiger defense and if you discount that SEC Championship Game, Mizzou held seven of its final eight opponents to an average of 16.6 points per game. In its six-game win streak to clinch the SEC East, Mizzou allowed just 99 points (16.5 per game).

# **DEFENSE SCORES, TOO!**

- ▶ Since 2010, Mizzou's defense has done more than just limiting its opponents from scoring they have been scoring themselves. In fact, since 2010, Mizzou has scored 25 defensive touchdowns, tied with Toledo for the fifth-most nationally in that span.
- ▶ Last season, Mizzou scored three defensive touchdowns, including two in one game at Florida when DE **Markus Golden** (2nd-round pick by the Arizona Cardinals) returned a fumble and LB **Darvin Ruise** returned a pick-six in that game.

# **HARDWARE BECOMING A THEME**

- ▶ Over the past two seasons, a Mizzou Football standout has earned SEC Defensive Player of the Year. That puts Mizzou in rarified air as one of four SEC schools to have two SEC Defensive Player of the Year awards (award began in 2003). Mizzou and LSU are also the only two SEC schools to have back-to-back SEC Defensive Player of the Year award winners.
- ▶ In 2013, senior DE *Michael Sam* took home the award after compiling a thenschool record 11.5 sacks.
- ▶ Last season, it was Sam's backup in 2013 who took home the award as DE **Shane Ray** went on to break Sam's school sack record with 14.5.

# QUICK HITS...MISCELLANEOUS NOTABLES

# PINKEL ON DODD TROPHY WATCH LIST

- ▶ Mizzou football head coach *Gary Pinkel* was one of 23 head coaches to be named to the Dodd Trophy Preseason Watch List, announced July 10 by the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation and the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. Pinkel is one of eight SEC coaches to land on the list, which is designed to recognize the nation's top head coach.
- ▶ The list includes 23 of the nation's top college football coaches representing all Power 5 conferences, the Mountain West Conference and Notre Dame. The head coaches on the watch list represent programs with the highest ideals of leadership, scholarship and integrity on and off the field the three pillars of legendary coach Bobby Dodd's philosophy. Each coach sits at the helm of programs with winning records, superior Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores and graduation rates, along with a strong commitment to service within their respective communities.
- ▶ Pinkel is the reigning SEC Coach of the Year and has led Mizzou to five conference division titles in the last eight seasons (2007, 2008, 2010, 2013, 2014), which is tied for the best in the nation in that span. Mizzou has won 76 games since 2007, which ties Ohio State for the fifth-most wins nationally in that span. Pinkel is the winningest coach in Mizzou history (113-66) and is the 25th-winningest coach in FBS history.
- ▶ Not only have Pinkel's teams seen tremendous success on the field, but they have excelled in the classroom. In 2013 and 2014, Pinkel's teams have ranked in the NCAA top 10 in APR. The Tigers were third in the SEC in APR in 2015 and led the league in 2014.

# **ROAD WARRIORS**

- ▶ Mizzou is currently riding a school record 10-game road winning streak, dating back to Sept. 21, 2013, at Indiana. It is the third-longest streak in the nation, trailing only Ohio State and Florida State. In fact, the next-longest streak among SEC teams is Alabama at three.
- ▶ When looking at the stats, it is easy to see why Mizzou has been so successful on the road over the last two seasons. Streak notables are below:
- Mizzou has 39 sacks over the last 10 road games and at least 1.0 sacks in nine straight
  - Mizzou has 13 interceptions and has recovered eight fumbles (21 total TOs)
  - The defense is allowing just 21.4 points per game during the streak  $\,$
  - Opponents are converting third downs at just a 36.4 percent clip
  - Mizzou is averaging 38.4 points per game in the streak with just 10 turnovers
- Mizzou is averaging 5.0 yards per rush during the streak, gaining 175 yards or better on the ground in seven of the 10 games.
- Mizzou has scored 24 rushing TDs during the streak opponents have just 26 total TDs during the streak

# **MIZZOU WELCOMES RYAN WALTERS**

- ▶ Mizzou Football hired *Ryan Walters* as its safeties coach, as announced back in February. Walters, 29, comes to Mizzou after spending the past season as cornerbacks coach at Memphis, where he worked as cornerbacks coach with new Mizzou Defensive Coordinator Barry Odom. At Memphis, the pair oversaw a defense that was among the most improved in the nation. Memphis went 10-3 in 2014, thanks in large part to its defense which ranked fifth nationally in points allowed (17.1 ppg) and 22nd in total defense (343.3 ypg) in the regular season.
- ▶ Walters, a Los Angeles, Calif. native, played collegiality at Colorado, where he was a standout safety for the Buffaloes (2004-08). He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Colorado working with the secondary in 2009, and then spent two years on staff at Arizona, where he was a graduate assistant in 2010, before being promoted to defensive backs coach for the 2011 season.
- ▶ From there, Walters moved to the Oklahoma staff as a graduate assistant cornerbacks coach in 2012, as the Sooners went 10-3 and played in the 2013 Cotton Bowl. He moved to North Texas for the 2013 season, where he coached corners and helped lead UNT to a 9-4 record in its first year in Conference USA and a win in the 2013 Heart of Dallas Bowl. The Mean Green defense that season ranked fourth in the nation in turnovers gained (34), eighth in points allowed (17.8 ppg), 13th in interceptions (18) and 17th in total defense (348.3 ypg).

# "MO"VEMBER

- ▶ There is no question that in college football, teams that win in November often are destined for championships and Mizzou Football has been the perfect reflection of that over the last two years. Since 2013, Mizzou is a perfect 8-0 in the month of November
- ▶ The 8-0 mark over the last two seasons of course includes Mizzou's 4-0 record last season, winning road games at Tennessee and Texas A&M and home games against Kentucky and Arkansas.

# **REMEMBERING 'AO' 10 YEARS LATER**

- ▶ The 2015 season marks the 10-year anniversary of the tragic passing of *Aaron*
- **O'Neal**, a linebacker on the 2005 Mizzou Football team who passed away at the age of 19 following a voluntary workout. O'Neal may be gone, but he has not been forgotten by anyone in the Mizzou community and his memory lives on with Gary Pinkel and the program 10 years later.
- ▶ Gary Pinkel has done his best to help the program remember O'Neal, the man with the 'million-dollar smile' as he was renowned. Every year, a linebacker from the St. Louis area where O'Neal called home will don O'Neal's #25. Currently, that bestowment belongs to sophomore LB **Donavin Newsom**; he will wear it for



the remainder of his career and pass along to another St. Louis LB. Newsom, just like O'neal, graduated from Parkway North High School in St. Louis, Mo.

# **BOEHM, DENNIS, HANSBROUGH, SIMON CAPTAINS**

- ▶ In its annual tradition, Mizzou Football and head coach Gary Pinkel announced the team's captains to coincide with the opening of training camp in early August. Earning this distinction as team captains this season were seniors C *Evan Boehm*, CB *Kenya Dennis*, RB *Russell Hansbrough* and S *Ian Simon*.
- ▶ The four seniors were selected by their teammates and have combined to play in 129 games, including a combined 77 starts. The seniors have helped Mizzou win 28 games over the last three seasons and were key cogs in Mizzou's back-to-back SEC East Championships over the last two seasons.



# 10 TIGERS PLAYING AFTER EARNING DEGREES

- ▶ When Mizzou hits the field for the first time in 2015, 10 Tiger seniors will be playing having already earned their degrees. That is the third-most graduates playing on any team in the nation in 2015. In addition, five of the seniors are scheduled to graduate in December while the remaining four are all on pace to graduate in May.

In 14 years at the University of Missouri, Gary Pinkel has meticulously built a previously downtrodden program into one of the most successful in the nation, and after a 18. thrilling 2013 season, he very well might have performed 19. the best coaching job of his career in 2014.

Picked to finish a distant fourth in the SEC Eastern Division in the preseason, Pinkel guided his troops to an 22. 11-3 record and a second-straight division championship 23. and subsequent bowl game victory.

The Tigers ended the magical 2014 season with a 25. New Year's Day 33-17 win over Minnesota in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl, giving the Tigers 23 wins in two seasons - a school record.

The job Pinkel did during the year went recognized by his coaching peers, as he was voted the SEC Coach of the Year by league coaches.

The well-deserved honor capped a season that saw the Tigers rebound from a pair of tough losses early in the year and close the regular season with six straight wins - including four games in which they entered as underdogs - to claim the East crown.

Under his watch, Mizzou has now won conference division titles five of the last eight seasons (2007, 2008, 2010, 2013, 2014), which is tied for most in the nation during that stretch (along with Alabama and Florida State), while the Tigers' 76 wins in that time is tied for 5th-best among FBS "power 5" conferences.

The winningest head coach in both Mizzou and Toledo histories (making him one of only two active coaches to make that claim at the FBS level - Steve Spurrier being the other), Pinkel enters the 2015 season with a Mizzou record of 113-66 in 14 seasons, while he's 186-103-3 overall in 24 seasons. His 186 wins is the 4th-most among active FBS coaches.

Pinkel got his MU record-breaking win thanks to a thrilling 41-31 win over Oklahoma State in the 2014 AT&T Cotton Bowl Classic. The win was the 102nd at MU in his 13 years patrolling the sidelines, and that broke a tie he held going into the game with Tiger legend Don Faurot, who won 101 games in 19 seasons from 1935-42 and 1946-56. Pinkel has 113 wins at Mizzou following 2014.

- 125 The 2015 season marks the 125th season of University of Missouri football. The Missouri football program began play in 1890. However, MU did not field a team in 1918 due to an influenza epidemic on campus
- 655 Mizzou holds an all-time record of 655-535-52, which equates to a .548 winning percentage.
- **350** The Tigers are 350-299-32 overall in conference play (62.9 winning percentage). Head coach Gary Pinkel's squad is 16-8 in the SEC, including the outstanding 7-1 league mark from last season.
- Mizzou has won 12 conference 12 championships. Those titles have come in: 1909, 1913, 1919, 1924, 1925, 1927, 1939, 1941, 1942, 1945, 1960 and 1969.
- The Tigers have won five conference divisional championships, with all four crowns coming during the Pinkel era (2007, 2008, 2010, 2013, 2014).
- Mizzou has played in 31 bowl games, all-31 time, and has gone 15-16 in those games. Pinkel has led the Tigers to 10 bowl appearances, a program-record. Mizzou has gone 6-4 in bowls under Pinkel.

- Since 2007, Mizzou ranks in the Top 10 among BCS-AQ leagues in wins, while also ranking in the Top 10 in Academic Progress Rate (APR), as well as in the Top 5 since 2009 in most NFL First Round draft picks.
- Head coach Gary Pinkel's squad was atop of the Southeastern Conference in APR for both of the program's first two seasons in the league. The Tigers posted an APR score of 982 to lead the league for the 2011-12 academic year, followed by a 980 score for 2012-13. # Mizzou's gameday home is Memorial Stadium/Faurot Field. Here are some facts associated with the stadium.

- Opened in 1926
- Built for a cost of \$350,000
- Initial seating capacity was 25,000
- Named Memorial Stadium in honor of the 112 Mizzou graduates and students who died in World War I
- The Rock M overlooking the North endzone debuted in 1927, and was assembled by the freshman class
- Seating capacity is 71,168 in 2015
- MU all-time record at Memorial Stadium is 276-175-20 (61%%) in 89 seasons.
- Field was named Faurot Field in 1972 in honor of Hall of

Fame Coach Don Faurot (fuh-ROE)

- Approximately \$50 million of construction investment provided new amenities prior to 2014, including:
- East side addition which added a new upper deck (called the Tiger Deck), which added 4,500 seats
- A new club/lounge level (called the Columns Club) complete with outdoor loge seating and two suites
- New lighting towers
- Ribbon/message boards on both the east and west sides
- Newly-created tailgating area beyond the southwest corner of the stadium called Truman's Terrace
