#MIZZOU Musings

- ▶ A win would...
 - Improve Mizzou to 3-0 for the third consecutive season.
 - Give Gary Pinkel his eighth 2-0 start at Mizzou.
 - Improve Mizzou to 13-3 at Memorial Stadium since the start of the 2013 season.
 - Give Mizzou its first ever win over UConn in the first meeting between the two programs.
 - Give Mizzou its ninth consecutive regular season win
 - Give Mizzou a 31-4 record at Memorial Stadium against nonconference opponents in the Gary Pinkel era.


- ▶ Through two weeks, Mizzou leads the SEC in scoring defense, allowing only 23 points (11.5 per game).
- ▶ Mizzou also leads the SEC in total defense, yielding only 418 total yards, good for an average of 209 yards per game and 3.0 yards per play. The next closest team in the SEC is Arkansas at 261 yards per game and 4.5 yards per play.
- ▶ Mizzou leads the SEC in passing defense by a wide margin, giving up only 180 yards through the air over the first two weeks. Second-place Texas A&M has yielded 160 passing yards per game while the Tigers are only giving up 90 passing yards per contest.
- ▶ Mizzou is tied for second in the SEC in opponent first downs, having allowed only 28 thus far. LSU leads the league with 27 while Arkansas and Florida have also only given up 28.
- ▶ Mizzou held Arkansas St. to only 217 total yards on Saturday and just 37 total yards after halftime.
- ▶ The 15 tackles for loss by Mizzou last Saturday at Arkansas State are the most in a single game since 2002 (16 vs. Texas A&M that year).
- ▶ Mizzou leads the nation in tackles for loss with 25 on the year - highlighted by **Charles Harris'** 6.0 this season. Harris is second in the nation in TFLs. Harris had the most TFLs by a Tiger since 2007 last Saturday vs. Arkansas State.

#MIZZOU STORYLINES

- The #22/#20 Missouri Tigers (2-0 overall) return to the friendly confines of The Zou this Saturday, where they will host the Connecticut Huskies (2-0) in a nationally-televised game on ESPN set for an 11 a.m. (central time) kickoff. Saturday will mark the first-ever meeting in football between the schools.
- Saturday will mark the renewal of the tradition at Memorial Stadium known as the Tiger Stripe Game, where fans are asked to wear either black or gold, in order to "stripe" the stadium. Less than 1,000 tickets remain available for the contest, as athletic officials are anticipating a capacity or near-capacity crowd.
- Mizzou is coming off of a gritty 27-20 comeback road win at upset-minded Arkansas State Saturday evening. The Tigers won their program-best 11th-straight road game, as they overcame a 17-10 3rd-quarter deficit thanks to a stifling performance by its defense, combined with a resilient offense which posted consecutive TD drives in the 3rd quarter to give MU a lead it wouldn't relinquish the rest of the way.
- UConn makes its first-ever appearance in Columbia fresh off a 22-17 win Saturday against Army. The Huskies trailed 10-3 midway through the 2nd quarter, but scored 19 unanswered points to take a 22-10 lead as they held on for the victory. UConn opened its 2015 season with a 20-15 home win over Villanova.
- We'll detail the many exploits of the Mizzou defense and its effort which keyed MU's road win at Arkansas State Saturday night, but one stat line just jumps out in a major way. Mizzou allowed only 37 yards of total offense to the Red Wolves in the second half, on 29 snaps – an average of just 1.3 yards per play.
- To put that in perspective, 37 yards equals 111 feet, and that means if this was baseball, the Tiger defense allowed Arkansas State to reach just 21 feet beyond first base (bases are 90 feet apart) in the entire second half combined!
- Arkansas State ended the night with just 217 yards of total offense in all, one week after the Red Wolves put up over 400 yards at Southern Cal (ranked sixth in this week's AP poll). ASU had just one offensive snap of 20 yards or more (a 23-yard pass), and the Tiger defense was spending all game in the backfield, as it registered 15 tackles for loss (the most by MU since 2002) and 2.0 QB sacks.
- As Mizzou prepares to play its third of four nonconference games on the schedule in 2014, it's time to take a look at how RS junior QB **Maty Mauk** has fared in his career against nonconference foes. In 11 career nonconference games, Mauk has completed 137 of 243 passes for 1,726 yards (7.1 yards per attempt) with 23 TDs, good for a 139.9 rating. He has also added 291 rushing yards on 70 carries (4.2 avg.) with two TDs.
- Saturday's game also marks the final nonconference home game of the season for Mizzou (only a neutral site clash with BYU in November remains following Saturday). Under head coach **Gary Pinkel**, Mizzou has compiled a 30-4 overall record in nonconference games played at Memorial Stadium.
- Mizzou senior LB **Kentrell Brothers** was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week following his outing at Arkansas State. He leads the nation in tackling, matching a career-high with 16 tackles in each of Mizzou's first two games. He also had a pair of 4th-quarter INTs last week and blocked a punt in the opener vs. SEMO.

NOTES ON BACKFIELD

- **Maty Mauk** threw three TD passes on Saturday at Arkansas State and now has 41 TD passes in his career. He moved into sole possession of fourth place in program history, passing QB Blaine Gabbert (40, 2008-10) and QB Jeff Hardy (39, 1991-94). Mauk trails QB Chase Daniel (101, 2005-08), QB Brad Smith (56, 2002-05) and QB James Franklin (51, 2010-13) for the most passing TDs in Mizzou history.
- Mauk now has six career games with at least 3 TD passes in his 20 career starts after tossing for three at Arkansas State last weekend.
- **Russell Hansbrough** needs just 54 rushing yards to become the seventh Mizzou running back ever under **Gary Pinkel** to rush for 2,000 career yards.





NOTES ON BACKFIELD RESERVES

- ▶ Mizzou's backup running backs will be key in 2015 as they will look to lighten the workload of 1,000-yard rusher **Russell Hansbrough**. **Tyler Hunt** and **Morgan Steward** have both seen game action as Tigers.
- ▶ Mizzou has not had a running back with more than 215 carries since Zack Abron in 2003, so the back-up running backs will obviously be important in the Tigers' running attack.
- ▶ True freshman **Drew Lock** enters week three as the backup to **Maty Mauk**. He went 6-for-10 for 138 yards and a TD against SEMO and threw just one pass last weekend at Arkansas State.

#GOINGDEEP - THE PASS CATCHER RESERVES

Mizzou went over 10 wins for the sixth time in program history last season. Five of those six have come under Gary Pinkel (all five since '07).

LAST TIME OUT...

- No. 21 Mizzou Football (2-0) earned a hard-fought 27-20 victory at Arkansas State (0-2) on Saturday evening at Centennial Bank Stadium. Mizzou was paced by LB Kentrell Brothers, who tied a career-high with 16 tackles for the second straight week to go along with two fourth-quarter interceptions. QB Maty Mauk threw three touchdown passes in the win.
- The Tigers extended a school-record regular season road victory streak to 11 games, dating back to Sept. 21, 2013. Mizzou's defense limited A-State to 217 total yards and outscored the Red Wolves 17-3 in the second half. The Tigers picked off three passes on the evening and recorded 15.0 tackles for loss (-60 yards).
- Mauk completed 16 of 36 passes for 148 yards and added another 75 yards on the ground as the team's leading rusher. For the sixth time in his career, Mauk threw at least three TD passes and also moved into sole possession of fourth place in program history with 41 career TD throws.
- Mizzou rushed for 140 yards on 34 attempts, averaging 4.1 yards per carry as a team. RB Ish Witter added 50 yards on 12 carries.
- Arkansas State pulled ahead 10-3 in the second quarter on a 7-yard TD pass from QB Fredi Knighten to WR Tres Houston and a 20-yard field goal by PK J.D. Houston.
- On the play following CB John Gibson's second career interception that he returned 35 yards to the Arkansas State 11-yard line, Mauk connected with WR Nate Brown on a TD pass for the second consecutive week. Baggett's PAT tied the game 10-10 with 4:08 left before halftime.
- The Red Wolves answered with a second TD pass from Knighten to Houston from five yards out with eight seconds remaining in the second quarter.
- In the third quarter, Mauk threw a 32-yard TD pass to WR Wesley Leftwich to tie the score at 17-17 with 5:25 on the clock and then gave Mizzou a 24-17 lead with a 21-yard scoring strike to TE Sean Culkin with 44 seconds left in the quarter. With five receptions for 46 yards on the evening, Culkin set new career-highs.
- A-State PK Drew White cut the deficit to 24-20 on a 40-yard field with 11:30 remaining. Baggett gave Mizzou a 27-20 advantage with a 41-yard field goal with 7:10 left. Brothers' second pick with 1:17 remaining sealed the victory.
- LB Michael Scherer added 10 tackles (six solo), including 3.0 tackles for loss (-9 yards). DE Charles Harris recorded six tackles (five solo), 2.0 sacks (-17 yards), 4.5 tackles for loss (-24 yards) and two QB hurries.

A LOOK AT THE OPPONENT... UCONN

- UConn has started the season 2-0 after winning close home games in consecutive weeks over Villanova and Army. On Saturday, the Huskies defeated Army 22-17, and in the season opener on Sept. 3, UConn beat Villanova 20-15.
- In Saturday's contest, UConn was led by QB Bryant Shirreffs, who passed for 270 yards and rushed for 31 more. RB Arkeel Newsome added 73 rushing yards on 13 carries (5.6 avg.) with a TD.
- Through two games, Shirreffs has passed for 472 yards and two TDs. His main target has been WR Noel Thomas, who has seven receptions for 122 yards (17.4 avg.). Newsome is the team's second-leading receiver with five catches for 52 yards (10.4 avg.) and a TD. RB Ron Johnson leads the squad in rushing with 108 yards on 41 carries (2.6 avg.) with two TDs in the season opener.
- Defensively, LB Junior Joseph leads the team with 14 tackles (six solo) while S Andrew Adams has contributed 11 tackles (six solo), two interceptions and three passes defensed.
- Kicker Bobby Puyol has converted 3-of-5 field goal attempts and is a perfect 3-for-3 in PATs.
- Last season, UConn was 2-10 overall, 1-7 in the American Athletic Conference and 0-5 away from home. The last road victory for the Huskies was on Nov. 23, 2013 at Temple.

TEAM NOTES

► Mizzou is tied for first in the SEC in red zone offense, going 4-for-4 with a TD and three field goals through the first two weeks. Ole Miss (11-for-11), Kentucky (4-for-4) and LSU (2-for-2) are also perfect in red zone scoring opportunities.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

► QB **Maty Mauk** threw three TD passes on Saturday at Arkansas State and now has 41 TD passes in his career. He moved into sole possession of fourth place in program history, passing QB Blaine Gabbert (40, 2008-10) and QB Jeff Hardy (39, 1991-94). Mauk trails QB Chase Daniel (101, 2005-08), QB Brad Smith (56, 2002-05) and QB James Franklin (51, 2010-13) for the most passing TDs in Mizzou history.

► Mauk has led Mizzou to a 16-4 record as the starting quarterback.

► Mauk's three TD passes on Saturday marked his sixth career 3-plus TD pass performance and the 12th multi-TD pass contest of his career.

► Mauk has thrown at least one TD in nine consecutive games, dating back to Oct. 25, 2014 vs. Vanderbilt.

► Dating back to Oct. 25, 2014 vs. Vanderbilt, Mauk has led Mizzou to an 8-1 record and has 16 TDs passes against seven INTs. He has rushed for 308 yards on 68 carries (4.5 avg.) with a TD during that stretch.

► In the second half of games during his career, Mauk has passed for 19 TDs with only five INTs. In the fourth quarter alone, Mauk has thrown 10 TDs with just one pick.

► In 11 career nonconference games, Mauk has completed 137 of 243 passes for 1,726 yards (7.1 yards per attempt) with 23 TDs, good for a 139.9 rating. He has also added 291 rushing yards on 70 carries (4.2 avg.) with two TDs.

► On third down during Mauk's career, he has completed 77 of 163 passes for 1,286 yards (7.9 yards per attempt) with 14 TDs. He has added 214 rushing yards on 52 third-down carries (4.1 avg.).

► On first down during Mauk's career, he has completed 127 of 233 passes for 1,585 yards with 18 TDs against only four INTs.

► Mauk's career TD passes by quarter – 1st (10), 2nd (12), 3rd (9), 4th (10).

► Mauk has completed 62 career passes of 20 yards or more, including 21 that have gone for TDs.

► WR **Nate Brown** is averaging 57.5 receiving yards per game and 16.4 yards per catch. He has seven receptions for 115 yards with a team-leading two TDs.

► RB **Ish Witter** rushed for a career-high 50 yards on 12 carries (4.2 avg.) at Arkansas State with a career-long 27-yard run.

► TE **Sean Culkin** set career-highs with five catches for 46 yards (9.2 avg.) to go along with his second career TD reception (21 yards) at A-State, the second-longest reception of his career.

NEW RECEIVERS, NO PROBLEM

► A major storyline for Mizzou heading into the season was the lack of experience at the WR position. Those questions have been answered through two weeks this season. In fact, 12 different players have caught passes this season, including eight WRs. Sophomores **Nate Brown**, **Wesley Leftwich** and **J'Mon Moore** have each hauled in TD passes of 20 or more yards this season.

► The production for Mizzou's wide receivers should come as no surprise to those who have followed the program closely. Every year it has seemed that Mizzou has been tasked with refilling production at the WR spot, and each year Mizzou has answered the bell. There is no more telling of that than the fact that RS junior QB **Maty Mauk** has tossed TDs to 11 different WRs in his 20 starts with Mizzou.

BOEHM NAMED ALL-SEC, TO MULTIPLE WATCH LISTS

► Senior C **Evan Boehm** is one of the nation's top returning offensive linemen and the team captain reaped the benefits in the preseason, earning multiple awards.

► Boehm was selected as a Preseason All-SEC Third Team member by the media following SEC Media Days in Hoover, Alabama, in July, and the coaches in August.

► Boehm was also named to a pair of preseason award watch lists over the summer. He is up for the Outland Trophy and the Rimington Trophy. The Outland Trophy honors the nation's top interior lineman while the Rimington Trophy is given annually to the nation's top center.

► Boehm has started 42 career games for Mizzou (including the last 30 at center) and is the unquestioned leader of a very talented and experienced offensive line.

HANSBROUGH APPROACHING 2K MARK

► When senior RB **Russell Hansbrough** next takes the field, he will need just 54 yards to break 2,000 for his career. Only 14 Tigers (and only 12 running backs) have ever rushed for more than 2,000 yards in a career. Should he eclipse the 2,000-yard mark, Hansbrough will be the first Tiger to do so since **Henry Josey** in 2013.

► Should Hansbrough go over 2,000 yards, he will be the seventh player under head coach **Gary Pinkel** to accomplish that feat. Other 2,000-yard rushers under Pinkel include QB **Brad Smith** (4,289), **Zack Abron** (3,198), **Henry Josey** (2,771), **Tony Temple** (2,552), **Kendial Lawrence** (2,232) and **Derrick Washington** (2,085). Of course, all of those running backs were mentored by RB coach **Brian Jones**, who has been with Pinkel's coaching staff since 1992.

► Hansbrough is the first Mizzou player to rush for 1,000 yards and return for a season since Henry Josey in 2013. Hansbrough ran for 1,084 yards in 2014. Hansbrough's 205 rushes in 2014 were the most by a Tiger RB since 2003 when Zack Abron ran the ball 219 times. His 1,084 yards in 2014 rank 10th all-time at Mizzou. He has averaged 5.5 yards per carry over the last two seasons.

MAUK A PROVEN WINNER

► In 20 career games as a starting quarterback, redshirt junior **Maty Mauk** is 16-4 and has been a key cog in Mizzou's back-to-back SEC East Championships. Couple his 16-4 mark as a collegiate QB with his 42-8 mark as a starting signal caller for Kenton High School, Mauk is 58-12 as a starting quarterback since 2008.

► Needing to win their final six games to claim an SEC East Championship, a much-scrutinized Mauk was sensational. In his last seven games in 2014, Mauk had a QB rating over 100 and boasted an 11-4 touchdown-interception rate in that span.

► Mauk threw for 2,648 passing yards in 2014, the seventh-best mark in program history. His 3,021 total yards last season mark the 10th-best single season output in school history.

► Mauk enters the week with 4,048 career passing yards, a mark that ranks ninth in program history.

► At Mizzou, Coach Pinkel and his staff preach finishing in the fourth quarter and there has been no better 'finisher' than Maty Mauk. In fact, in his career the junior QB is 60-for-108 with 808 yards (7.5 per attempt) with 10 TDs and just one interception in the 4th quarter. He has also rushed for 207 yards on 30 carries (6.9 per rush) with another TD.

BAGGETT 52 POINTS SHY OF MIZZOU CAREER RECORD

► Heading into the weekend, Mizzou senior PK **Andrew Baggett** sits just 52 points shy of breaking **Jeff Wolfert's** career record for points scored. Baggett has 311 points in his career (54 field goals, 149 PATs).

► Baggett is also just six FGs and 37 PATs from passing Wolfert.

► In his career, Baggett has turned in two of the best point-scoring season totals in Mizzou history. His 120 points in 2013 rank fourth all-time at Mizzou while his 97 total points a season ago rank 14th.

HOLDING ONTO THE ROCK

► Mizzou is coming off of a school-record performance in 2014 when it comes to ball security. Mizzou lost just three fumbles in 2014, the fewest in program history.

► Mizzou ran 954 plays in 2014, meaning that the Tigers lost a fumble just once in every 318 plays a season ago.

► The lost fumbles was not a case of just getting 'the lucky bounce' either. Mizzou put the ball on the turf just 10 times in 2014 (once every 95 plays). To put how good the 10 fumbles were, Mizzou's opponents fumbled more than three times as much with 32 fumbles. In fact, Mizzou recovered more fumbles (13) than it committed as a team in 2014.

► The trend has continued in 2015 as Mizzou has not lost a fumble in 136 total plays over the first two games.

JAILBREAK BLITZ...DEFENSE NOTABLES

TEAM NOTABLES

- Through two weeks, Mizzou leads the SEC in scoring defense, having allowed only 23 points (11.5 per game).
- Mizzou also leads the SEC in total defense, yielding only 418 total yards, good for an average of 209 yards per game and 3.0 yards per play. The next closest team in the SEC is Arkansas at 261 yards per game and 4.5 yards per play.
- Mizzou leads the SEC in passing defense by a wide margin, giving up only 180 yards through the air over the first two weeks. Second-place Texas A&M has yielded 160 passing yards per game while the Tigers are only giving up 90 passing yards per contest. The Tigers are third nationally in passing defense and second among teams from power five conferences.
- Mizzou is tied for second in the SEC in opponent first downs, having allowed only 28 thus far. LSU leads the league with 27 while Arkansas and Florida have also only given up 28.
- Mizzou held Arkansas State to only 217 total yards on Saturday and a minuscule 37 total yards in the second half.
- The 15 tackles for loss by Mizzou at Arkansas State are the most in a single game since 2002 when it had 16 against Texas A&M.
- Mizzou is averaging 9.33 TFLs per game over its last six contests, dating back to last season's win at Tennessee on Nov. 22. To put that mark into perspective, only one team in the nation averaged more than 8.6 tackles for loss last season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTABLES

- LB **Kentrell Brothers** tied a career-high with 16 tackles for the second straight week to go along with a career-best two interceptions. His tackle total ties for the fourth-best performance during the Gary Pinkel era.
- Brothers has 62 tackles over his last five games (12.4 avg.).
- Brothers picked off a pass for the first time since Oct. 12, 2013 at Georgia and now has five picks for his career.
- His two-interception performance was the first for Mizzou since S Braylon Webb picked off two passes at Florida on Oct. 18, 2014. It marked the 11th time a Mizzou defender has recorded two or more picks over the last 18 years. Brothers is just the third linebacker to gain that distinction, joining LB Sean Weatherspoon (2 vs. Illinois on Aug. 30, 2008) and LB Brandon Barnes (2 vs. Texas Tech on Oct. 25, 2003).

- DE **Charles Harris** recorded 2.0 sacks at Arkansas State, equaling his career total coming in. He also registered six tackles (five solo), 4.5 tackles for loss (-24 yards) and two QB hurries. The last time a Mizzou defender recorded 4.5 tackles for loss in a game was S Cornelius 'Pig' Brown with 4.5 TFLs (-9 yards) on Oct. 20, 2007 as No. 15 Mizzou defeated No. 22 Texas Tech 41-10 at Faurot Field.

LIMITING BIG PLAYS

- Through two weeks of play, Mizzou has been outstanding on defense and one of the best stats to back that up is Mizzou's limiting of big plays. In fact, Mizzou has allowed just two plays of 20+ yards this season. One of them came last weekend against Arkansas State - a 23-yard catch by J.D. McKissic. The other was a 21-yard catch by SEMO's Paul McRoberts.

SACK MASTERS

- Mizzou finished 2014 with a school-record and SEC-leading 44.0 total sacks, one year removed from tallying 41.5 in 2013, which at the time was a school record.
- Mizzou's 89.5 total sacks over the last two-plus seasons rank as the sixth-most in college football in that span. Below is a list:
 1. Utah - 96 (39 in 2013, 55 in 2014, 2 in 2015)
 2. Washington - 95 (41 in 2013, 51 in 2014, 3 in 2015)
 - Ohio State - 95 (42 in 2013, 45 in 2014, 8 in 2015)
 - Stanford - 92 (44 in 2013, 46 in 2014, 2 in 2015)
 - Virginia Tech - 90 (39 in 2013, 48 in 2014, 3 in 2015)
 - Mizzou - 89.5 (41.5 in 2013, 44 in 2014, 4.0 in 2015)
- Mizzou leads the nation this season with 1.25 TFLs per game.

HARD TO SCORE

- Mizzou allowed just 36 touchdowns to opponents a season ago (2.6 per game) as the 36 total TDs allowed were the fewest by a Tiger team since 2010 when the team allowed just 26. It was the fifth-fewest TDs that the team has allowed under **Gary Pinkel**, who is in his 15th season in 2015.
- In fact, Mizzou had a streak of 103:54 of game time without a TD before allowing a TD with 1:18 remaining in the second quarter at Arkansas State. Prior to that, the last TD Mizzou allowed was the Maxx Williams of Minnesota in the third quarter of the Citrus Bowl.
- Mizzou and Ole Miss were the only SEC teams to not allow a TD in week one while Mizzou continues to pace the SEC in scoring defense (11.5 points per game).
- Looking deeper, Mizzou ranked 19th nationally in scoring defense a season ago, allowing only 21.07 points per contest. That is the best by a Mizzou team since the 2010 team allowed just 15.17 points per game.

DEFENSE SCORES, TOO!

- Since 2010, Mizzou's defense has done more than just limiting its opponents from scoring - they have been scoring themselves. In fact, since 2010, Mizzou has scored 26 defensive TDs, tied with Florida for the fourth-most nationally in that span.
- Mizzou scored a defensive TD in the season-opener as **Kentrell Brothers** blew up a pooch-punt for a block that caromed into the hands of **Arion Penton**, who took it 41 yards for the score.
- Last season, Mizzou scored three defensive touchdowns, including two in one game at Florida when DE **Markus Golden** (2nd-round pick by the Arizona Cardinals) returned a fumble and LB **Darvin Ruise** returned a pick-six in that game.

HARDWARE BECOMING A THEME

- Over the past two seasons, a Mizzou Football standout has earned SEC Defensive Player of the Year. That puts Mizzou in rarified air as one of four SEC schools to have two SEC Defensive Player of the Year awards (award began in 2003). Mizzou and LSU are also the only two SEC schools to have back-to-back SEC Defensive Player of the Year award winners.
- In 2013, senior DE **Michael Sam** took home the award after compiling a then-school record 11.5 sacks.
- Last season, it was Sam's backup in 2013 who took home the award as DE **Shane Ray** went on to break Sam's school sack record with 14.5.

NO FLY ZONE

- Mizzou's pass defense was outstanding in the opener against SEMO and again last weekend vs. Arkansas State. Mizzou limited the Redhawks to just 56 yards through the air, the sixth-best mark in program history since 1996, in the season opener. Mizzou currently ranks third in the nation and second among schools from power conference in pass defense. Below is a look at the top five.

QUICK HITS...MISCELLANEOUS NOTABLES

PINKEL ON DODD TROPHY WATCH LIST

► Mizzou football head coach **Gary Pinkel** was one of 23 head coaches to be named to the Dodd Trophy Preseason Watch List, announced July 10 by the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation and the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. Pinkel is one of eight SEC coaches to land on the list, which is designed to recognize the nation's top head coach.

► The list includes 23 of the nation's top college football coaches representing all Power 5 conferences, the Mountain West Conference and Notre Dame. The head coaches on the watch list represent programs with the highest ideals of leadership, scholarship and integrity on and off the field – the three pillars of legendary coach Bobby Dodd's philosophy. Each coach sits at the helm of programs with winning records, superior Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores and graduation rates, along with a strong commitment to service within their respective communities.

► Pinkel is the reigning SEC Coach of the Year and has led Mizzou to five conference division titles in the last eight seasons (2007, 2008, 2010, 2013, 2014), which is tied for the best in the nation in that span. Mizzou has won 78 games since 2007, which ties Ohio State for the fifth-most wins nationally in that span. Pinkel is the winningest coach in Mizzou history (115-66) and is the 25th-winningest coach in FBS history.

► Not only have Pinkel's teams seen tremendous success on the field, but they have excelled in the classroom. In 2013 and 2014, Pinkel's teams have ranked in the NCAA top 10 in APR. The Tigers were third in the SEC in APR in 2015 and led the league in 2014.

A 'BARRY' INTIMIDATING GROUP

► Mizzou's defense has become one of the most feared groups in the SEC and this year, the group will have a new leader as DC **Barry Odom** returns to Mizzou after a successful stint as the DC at Memphis. Odom, 38, as he takes over for **Dave Steckel**, who left to be head coach at Missouri State following the conclusion of Mizzou's 2014 season.

► Odom has been defensive coordinator and safeties coach at Memphis for the past three seasons, where he has orchestrated an impressive body of work by the Tiger defense. Memphis concluded a 10-3 season that was fueled largely by Odom's defense which ranked fifth nationally in scoring defense (17.1 ppg) and 22nd in total defense (343.3 ypg) heading into bowl season. That marked an astounding incremental improvement, as Memphis ranked 117th nationally in total defense in 2011 prior to Odom assuming the reins. In 2012, Odom's first year, the Tiger defense improved to 50th nationally in total defense (383.6 ypg), followed by a jump to 39th in 2013 (370.7 ypg). Memphis earned a share of the 2014 American Athletic Conference title, giving them a conference championship for the first time since 1971.

► It's a homecoming for Odom as he returns to his alma mater, where he starred as a linebacker for Mizzou from 1996-99 and later returned for a nine-year stint (2003-11) in a variety of roles for Pinkel's staff. He first came back in 2003 as an administrative graduate assistant, and after one year in that role, Odom moved to director of recruiting for the 2004 and 2005 seasons and then served three years (2006-08) as director of football operations.

► In 2009, Odom moved to the coaching side of the ledger, as Pinkel's safeties coach for three seasons where he developed **Kenji Jackson**, **Jarrell Harrison** and **Jasper Simmons** into All-Big 12 performers for Tiger teams which won 26 games in those three years. Odom also played a significant role in recruiting, as he was the lead on many highly-regarded prospects who chose to attend Mizzou.

BACK-TO-BACK

► Mizzou has won the SEC East in back-to-back seasons and that accomplishment has put Mizzou in some pretty elite company. Since 2001, Mizzou joins Alabama, Georgia, Florida and Tennessee as the only SEC teams to win two consecutive SEC division titles. Four programs in the SEC (Kentucky, Ole Miss, Texas A&M and Vanderbilt) have never won an SEC Division Championship and Mizzou has done so twice in its first three seasons.

► Mizzou's 23 wins over 2013 and 2014 are fifth nationally, trailing only Florida State (27), Ohio State (26), Michigan State (24) and Oregon (24).

► Since 2007, Mizzou has claimed five conference division titles (three Big 12 North titles and two SEC East titles), the most in the nation during that span.

► All of those division-winning seasons ended with at least 10 wins as five of Mizzou's six 10-win seasons in program history have come under the direction of **Gary Pinkel**.

► In each of the last two seasons, Mizzou has clinched the SEC East at home with wins over SEC West powers Texas A&M (2013) and Arkansas (2014). Each division title seemed equally as improbable to national pundits, but Mizzou defied the odds each year. In 2013,

Mizzou was coming off of a disappointing 2012 campaign in which it went 5-7. But the Tigers rebounded for a 12-2 season, ranking as high as No. 5 nationally and culminating in an AT&T Cotton Bowl Classic win over Oklahoma State. Last year, Mizzou won its final six regular season games despite being underdogs in four of those six games. The season ended with an 11-3 mark and a Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl Championship.


"MO" VEMBER

► There is no question that in college football, teams that win in November often are destined for championships and Mizzou Football has been the perfect reflection of that over the last two years. Since 2013, Mizzou is a perfect 8-0 in the month of November.

REMEMBERING 'AO' 10 YEARS LATER

► The 2015 season marks the 10-year anniversary of the tragic passing of **Aaron O'Neal**, a linebacker on the 2005 Mizzou Football team who passed away at the age of 19 following a voluntary workout. O'Neal may be gone, but he has not been forgotten by anyone in the Mizzou community and his memory lives on with Gary Pinkel and the program 10 years later.

► Gary Pinkel has done his best to help the program remember O'Neal, the man with the 'million-dollar smile' as he was renowned. Every year, a linebacker from the St. Louis area - where O'Neal called home - will don O'Neal's #25. Currently, that bestowment belongs to sophomore LB **Donavin Newsom**; he will wear it for the remainder of his career and pass along to another St. Louis LB. Newsom, just like O'Neal, graduated from Parkway North High School in St. Louis, Mo.



BOEHM, DENNIS, HANSBROUGH, SIMON CAPTAINS

► In its annual tradition, Mizzou Football and head coach Gary Pinkel announced the team's captains to coincide with the opening of training camp in early August. Earning this distinction as team captains this season were seniors C **Evan Boehm**, CB **Kenya Dennis**, RB **Russell Hansbrough** and S **Ian Simon**.

► The four seniors were selected by their teammates and have combined to play in 129 games, including a combined 77 starts. The seniors have helped Mizzou win 28 games over the last three seasons and were key cogs in Mizzou's back-to-back SEC East Championships over the last two seasons.



10 TIGERS PLAYING AFTER EARNING DEGREES

► When Mizzou hits the field for the first time in 2015, 10 Tiger seniors will be playing having already earned their degrees. That is the third-most graduates playing on any team in the nation in 2015. In addition, five of the seniors are scheduled to graduate in December while the remaining four are all on pace to graduate in May.

BECOME A CHAMPION



In 14 years at the University of Missouri, Gary Pinkel has meticulously built a previously downtrodden program into one of the most successful in the nation, and after a thrilling 2013 season, he very well might have performed the best coaching job of his career in 2014.

Picked to finish a distant fourth in the SEC Eastern Division in the preseason, Pinkel guided his troops to an 11-3 record and a second-straight division championship and subsequent bowl game victory.

The Tigers ended the magical 2014 season with a New Year's Day 33-17 win over Minnesota in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl, giving the Tigers 23 wins in two seasons - a school record.

The job Pinkel did during the year went recognized by his coaching peers, as he was voted the SEC Coach of the Year by league coaches.

The well-deserved honor capped a season that saw the Tigers rebound from a pair of tough losses early in the year and close the regular season with six straight wins - including four games in which they entered as underdogs - to claim the East crown.

Under his watch, Mizzou has now won conference division titles five of the last eight seasons (2007, 2008, 2010, 2013, 2014), which is tied for most in the nation during that stretch (along with Alabama and Florida State), while the Tigers' 78 wins in that time is tied for 5th-best among FBS "power 5" conferences.

The winningest head coach in both Mizzou and Toledo histories (making him one of only two active coaches to make that claim at the FBS level - Steve Spurrier being the other), Pinkel enters the 2015 season with a Mizzou record of 113-66 in 14 seasons, while he's 186-103-3 overall in 24 seasons. His 186 wins is the 4th-most among active FBS coaches.

Pinkel got his MU record-breaking win thanks to a thrilling 41-31 win over Oklahoma State in the 2014 AT&T Cotton Bowl Classic. The win was the 102nd at MU in his 13 years patrolling the sidelines, and that broke a tie he held going into the game with Tiger legend Don Faurot, who won 101 games in 19 seasons from 1935-42 and 1946-56. Pinkel has 113 wins at Mizzou following 2014.

- Opened in 1926
- Built for a cost of \$350,000
- Initial seating capacity was 25,000
- Named Memorial Stadium in honor of the 112 Mizzou graduates and students who died in World War I
- The Rock M overlooking the North endzone debuted in 1927, and was assembled by the freshman class
- Seating capacity is 71,168 in 2015
- MU all-time record at Memorial Stadium is 277-175-20 (61% %) in 89 seasons.
- Field was named Faurot Field in 1972 in honor of Hall of Fame Coach Don Faurot (fuh-ROE)

Fame Coach Don Faurot (fuh-ROE)

- Approximately \$50 million of construction investment provided new amenities prior to 2014, including:
 - East side addition which added a new upper deck (called the Tiger Deck), which added 4,500 seats
 - A new club/lounge level (called the Columns Club) complete with outdoor loge seating and two suites
 - New lighting towers
 - Ribbon/message boards on both the east and west sides
 - Newly-created tailgating area beyond the southwest corner of the stadium called Truman's Terrace
