The Hearnes Center Fieldhouse is home to Mizzou's indoor track and field facility. The Fieldhouse contains a Martin encapsulated surface, 200-meter track with an eight-lane sprint straightaway and multiple runways for the pole vault and horizontal jumps. The Fieldhouse opened in 1972 and was host to the Big 8 Indoor Championships in 1991. It is named for Missouri's 46th governor and a 1952 MU graduate, Warren E. Hearnes.

The Tigers typically host two to three collegiate meets during the indoor season, as well as the Big River High School Series, which began in 2012. The Missouri Invitational and Missouri Collegiate Challenge draws top-flight competition from across the Midwest, and the Big River HS Series has grown to be one of the country's top high school indoor meets.
