DOUBLE DUAL TUESDAY

- No. 5 Mizzou Wrestling will host two duals at the Hearnes Center on Tuesday, Dec. 20. First, Mizzou will wrestle Kent State at Noon (CT), followed by a top-25 matchup with No. 21 Appalachian State at 2 p.m. (CT).
- Mizzou is coming off a 35-7 win over Ohio on Dec. 11, in which six wrestlers scored bonus points, including a fall from redshirt freshman 133-pounder Jaydin Eierman and technical falls from redshirt sophomore 165-pounder Daniel Lewis and senior 197-pounder J'den Cox.
- The Tigers have dominated the all-time series with the Golden Flashes and Mountaineers, winning 11 of 12 duals between the two programs. Mizzou is 8-1 against Kent State (2-0 in Columbia) and 3-0 against Appalachian State.

19th Season at Mizzou 240-90-3 (18 years) 7 National Champions 42 All-Americans 36 Conference Champions 5 Conference Championships 2 Dan Hodge Trophies

Over the past 18 years, **Brian Smith** and the men that have gone through his Mizzou Wrestling program have claimed individual Big 12 and MAC Conference Champions, improved grade-point averages, record-setting attendances, a No. 1 national ranking and Missouri's first-ever NCAA National Champion. His unique "#TigerStyle" training program has molded today's team into a national powerhouse that looks to contend for the program's first team NCAA title.

Since being introduced as Missouri's Head Wrestling Coach May 5, 1998, Smith has demanded nothing but the best from himself, his coaches and his wrestlers. Owning 15 consecutive seasons with a dual record at or above .500, beginning with the 2001-02 season, Smith has coached 22 All-Americans to 42 top-eight performances and five Tigers to seven national championships.

The winningest coach in program history, Smith has compiled a 240-90-3 record at Missouri over his 18 season tenure. On Nov. 15, 2014 in the team's season opener, Smith and his Tigers claimed a 54-0 victory over Truman State and gave the legendary coach his 200th career win at Mizzou. Smith's 100th career victory came on Dec. 9, 2006 in Mount Pleasant, Mich., as the team bested then-No. 11 Central Michigan, 31-9. The win made Smith just the second Tiger wrestling coach to reach the 100-win plateau.

With a .718 career winning percentage, Smith holds the highest winning percentage in Mizzou wrestling history. Smith has taken home five consecutive conference Coach of the Year honors dating back to 2012, including four straight awards by the MAC league office. Additionally, in May 2007, Smith was honored with the Dan Gable Coach of the Year Award, presented by W.I.N. Magazine.

Five Tiger wrestlers have reached the pinnacle of collegiate wrestling, collecting seven NCAA Championships under Smith's tenure, beginning with Ben Askren. During Askren's Tiger career. Smith guided the 174-pound grappler Askren to the program's first back-to-back National Championship titles (2006 and 2007). On March 21, 2009, Mark Ellis became the second Missouri wrestler in program history to collect top honors. Wrestling at heavyweight, Ellis bested his opponent, 3-2, in overtime with Smith coaching from the corner. In March 2010, Max Askren became the third national champion in the history of the program, as he dominated the No. 1 seed in the 184-pound weight class by a 10-3 score. After a four-year drought, true freshman **J'den Cox** claimed the program's fifth national title in 2013-14 after defeating Ohio State's Nick Heflin, 2-1. A year later, redshirt senior Drake Houdashelt concluded his historical Tiger Style career with a 149 pound National Championship at 2015 NCAA's. On March 19, 2016, Cox returned to the top of the podium at Madison Square Garden, becoming the second two-time NCAA Champ in program history. Cox defeated No. 1 seed Morgan McIntosh (Penn State), 4-2, to capture the title at 197 pounds.

Additionally, Smith has helped guide two wrestlers to the Olympics. Ben Askren was the first wrestler in program history to compete in the summer games with an appearance in the 2008 Beijing Summer Olympics, followed by J'den Cox, who won bronze at the 2016 Rio Summer Olympics this past summer. The whirlwind summer for Cox included trips to lowa City, New York City, Los Angeles, Mongolia and Germany, all serving as qualifying or tune-up tournaments leading up to Rio. In four Olympic matches, Cox was not taken down once, an incredible feat for a wrestler who had under five months to prepare for freestyle competition after the completion of the folkstyle wrestling season. Cox narrowly missed out on the opportunity to wrestle for gold, falling 2-1 in the semifinals before defeating Cuba's Reineris Salas Perez in the bronze medal match. Cox was awarded a two-point takedown in the closing seconds of the match after a video review. The match concluded after Perez failed to return to the mat after the video review, resulting in a disgualification.

COX NAMED TO WIN MAGAZINE'S DON HODGE TROPHY PRESEASON CANDIDATE LIST

- ▶ Senior 197-pounder **J'den Cox** was named to the **Dan Hodge Trophy Preseason Candidate List**, announced by *WIN Magazine* on Dec. 9. Cox was one of eight wrestlers
 named to the list for the Hodge, which is equivalent to
 the Heisman Trophy in college football, and is the most
 prestigious award in college wrestling.
- ▶ Cox has opened the 2016-17 season with a 7-0 record, including a 4-0 mark in dual competitions. In three of his dual wins, Cox has beaten top-10 opponents, knocking off No. 9 Kevin Beazley (Old Dominion) on Nov. 13, No. 3 Jared Haught (Virginia Tech) on Nov. 20 and No. 6 Kollin Moore (Ohio State) on Dec. 8.
- ▶ The Tiger senior captured the UNI Open championship at 197 pounds on Dec. 3, scoring three falls in three matches en route to the title. In his most recent bout, Cox defeated Devin King (Ohio) by way of a 20-4 technical fall, the **15th technical fall of his career**, tying him with Ben Askren for the **third-most technical falls in program history**.
- Cox also ranks 11th in program history in career wins with 114, first in winning percentage among wrestlers with over 100 wins at .958 (114-5) and seventh in career major decisions with 24. Cox is one of two Tiger wrestlers (Askren) to win two NCAA Titles and one of four (Ben Askren, Max Askren, Drake Houdashelt) to earn All-America honors three times.

LAVALLEE'S HOT START

- ▶ After taking a redshirt last season, redshirt junior 157-pounder **Joey Lavallee** has roared back onto the scene in 2016-17, recording bonus points in six of nine wins (four major decisions, one technical fall, one fall) and capturing the UNI championship at 157 pounds on Dec. 3.
- ▶ Lavallee is a perfect 9-0 on the season, 4-0 in duals, and is second on the team in dual points with 15. The Tiger junior owns two ranked wins so far this season, defeating No. 17 Sal Mastriani (Virginia Tech) via major decision, 15-5 on Nov. 20 and No. 19 Jake Ryan by way of a 12-5 decision on Dec. 8.

LEMANOWICZ BACK ON THE ROSTER

- ▶ Following the 2015-16 season, redshirt senior 184-pounder **Matt Lemanowicz** decided to walk away from wrestling and join strength & conditioning coach **Mike Larson's** staff as an intern. Lemanowicz, who won strength and conditioning awards following the 2013-14 and 2015-16 seasons, was assisting with the day-to-day operations of the wrestling and volleyball program's routine workouts over the summer and fall.
- ▶ When Mizzou suffered numerous injuries to some of its heavier wrestlers, Lemanowicz approached Coach Smith about coming out of retirement and helping the team at 184 pounds. After competing at mostly 165 and 174 pounds over his collegiate career, Lemanowicz was inserted at 184 pounds for the Tigers at the UNI Open and in duals against Ohio State and Ohio.
- Lemanowicz picked up his first dual win of the year over Ohio's Nate Hall on Dec. 11, winning 3-1 in Mizzou's 35-7 rout of the Robcats

THREE TIGERS CAPTURE TITLES AT THE UNI OPEN

Mizzou registered nine top-three finishes on Dec. 3, at the UNI Open. Mizzou had 28 wrestlers compete in the open tournament and three claim first-place finishes. Senior

- 197-pounder **J'den Cox**, redshirt junior 157-pounder **Joey Lavallee** and redshirt freshman 133-pounder **Jaydin Eierman** all finished atop their respective weight classes.
- ► Cox won each of his three bouts by fall, registering his first three falls of the season. Cox began the day by pinning Wes Kibler (Illinois) at the 3:59 mark, followed by a pin over Vince Dietz (St. Cloud State) at 3:17, and finally at 5:19 over Tyler Hoffman (Northern Iowa), to claim the title
- ▶ Redshirt sophomore 165-pounder **Daniel Lewis** and sophomore 157-pounder **Luke Fortuna** each recorded second-place finishes for the Tigers.
- ▶ Recording third-place finishes on the day for Mizzou was redshirt junior 125-pounder **Aaron Assad**, redshirt sophomore 133-pounder **John Erneste**, sophomore 165-pounder **Connor Flynn** and redshirt freshman heavyweight **Austin Myers**.

EIERMAN LEADS MIZZOU TO VICTORY OVER VIRGINIA TECH

- Mizzou's other Jaydin, redshirt freshman 133-pounder **Jaydin Eierman** earned a fall in his Tiger debut against No. 6 Virginia Tech on Nov. 20, helping Mizzou knock off the Hokies, 23-19. After a VT win at 125 pounds, Mizzou rattled off five straight victories to jump out to a 20-3 lead over the Hokies. Redshirt junior 157-pounder **Joey Lavallee** and redshirt sophomore 165-pounder **Daniel Lewis** scored major decisions to assist in the Tiger victory.
- ▶ Last season, as an unattached wrestler, Eierman went 22-2, claimed three open titles, and recorded eight falls, six technical falls and six major decisions.

100 WINS FOR MAYES

- ▶ Redshirt senior 149-pounder **Lavion Mayes** recorded his 100th career victory in Mizzou's season-opening dual against Old Dominion. Mayes defeated Michael Hayes by way of a 9-4 decision to reach the century milestone.
- Mayes becomes the **25th member of Mizzou's** exclusive **100-win club** and first to reach the mark since senior 197-pounder **J'den Cox** reached the mark last season in a 16-7 major decision win over Aaron Studebaker (Nebraska) on Feb. 21, 2016.
- Mayes currently owns a record of 101-21 and is ranked tied for fifth in program history in career major decisions with 25 and seventh in winning percentage for wrestlers with over 100 wins with a winning percentage of .828.
- ▶ In a breakout sophomore campaign (2014-15), Mayes went 38-4 at 141 pounds, finishing as an All-American with a seventh-place performance at the NCAA Championships. Mayes went 20-1 in dual competion throughout the year (6-1 in MAC duals) and recorded nine major decisions.
- Last year, Mayes went 32-3 en route to his second straight year on the podium, this time at 149 pounds. Mayes finished third at the weight class in New York City, defeating Anthony Collica (Oklahoma State) in the third place bout after falling to the Cowboy in the quarterfinals.

NOTABLE NOTES

OPPONENT - KENT STATE

- ▶ Kent State has stuggled through the first part of its 2016-17 schedule, dropping four of its first five duals. The Golden Flashes opened the dual season with a tri-meet with No. 4 Ohio State and Cleveland State on Nov. 22, dropping the dual to the Buckeyes, 36-13, before defeating Cleveland State, 40-3.
- ▶ Led by head coach **Jim Andrassay**, who is in his 14th year with the Golden Flashes, Kent State enters the Hearnes Center on a three-dual losing streak, losing to Buffalo (23-12) on Dec. 11, Gardner-Webb (22-17) on Dec. 16 and Chattanooga (22-19) on Dec. 18.
- ▶ Kent State will have one ranked wrestler in the lineup on Tuesday, sophomore 133-pounder **Anthony Tutolo**, who is ranked as high as No. 19 by *The Open Mat*. Tutolo is 16-4 on the season (4-1 in duals) and finished sixth at the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational on Dec. 3. Among his wins at CKLV, the most notable was over two-time All-American Earl Hall (lowa State), who Tutolo defeated, 9-8, in an opening round bout.
- ▶ Mizzou leads the all-time series against Kent State, 8-1. The Tigers are a perfect 2-0 against the Golden Flashes in duals in Columbia.
- ▶ Last year, on Dec. 20, 2015, Mizzou used pins from **Daniel Lewis, Willie Miklus, J'den Cox** and **James Romero** to propel to a 35-12 win over Kent State in Kent, Ohio.

OPPONENT - APPALACHIAN STATE

- ▶ Appalachian State enters the dual in Columbia on Tuesday with a record of 7-1, its best start since beginning the 2002-03 season with an 11-1 record. Two of the Mountaineers seven wins were over ranked opponents, then-No. 15 Oregon State (25-15) on Nov. 12 and then-No. 25 North Caroline (18-16) on Nov. 27.
- ▶ Led by head coach **Johnmark Bentley**, who is in his 9th year with the Mountaineers, Appalachian State enters the Hearnes Center as the No. 21-ranked team in nation in the USA Today/NWCA Coaches Poll and No. 20 in the Intermat Tournament Rankings, both a program-best.
- ▶ Appalachian State will have four ranked wrestlers featured in their lineup on Tuesday, led by redshirt senior heavyweight **Denzel Dejournette**, who is ranked as high as No. 7 by *TrackWrestling*. Dejournette is 13-2 on the season (6-0 in duals) and is currently ranked third in program history in wins with 116. At 149 pounds, sophomore **Matt Zovistoski** is ranked as high as No. 15 (*TrackWrestling*), redshirt junior 165-pounder **Forrest Przybysz** is ranked No. 23 (*TrackWrestling*) and redshirt junior 165-pounder **Nick Kee** is ranked No. 20 (*WIN Magazine*). Kee, Dejournette and Przybysz are all returning NCAA qualifiers from a season ago.
- ▶ Mizzou leads the all-time series against Appalachian State, 3-1. The Tigers have never hosted the Mountaineers in Columbia.
- ▶ Last year, on Feb. 12, 2016, four Tigers scored falls and five posted bonus points as Mizzou routed Appalachian State, 41-6, in Boone, N.C.

DAZZLING DEBUTS

- ► Two Tigers, redshirt freshman 174-pounder **Dylan Wisman** and redshirt freshman heavyweight **Austin Myers**, made their debut in the Black & Gold against Old Dominion. Wisman defeated Antonio Agee, 12-5, while Myers recorded a fall over Will Hillard at 3:19.
- ▶ Both ranked in the top-40 in the Class of 2015 by FloWrestling, Wisman won the 2015 FloNationals at 183 pounds while Myers was a three-time National High School Coaches Association (NHSCA) National Champion at 220 pounds.

MIZZOU SIGNS FIVE TO RECRUITING CLASS

- Mizzou added five recruits to its program during the early signing period on Nov. 10. All five recruits have won either a state championship or national high school championship.
- ▶ Jared Campbell (Burbank, Ohio) captured two National Championships in the spring of 2016 following his junior campaign. The projected heavyweight stood atop the 220-pound podium at FloNationals and the NHSCA National Wrestling Championships. A two-time Ohio State runner-up, Campbell is currently the No. 4-ranked heavyweight recruit by FloWrestling (No. 34 overall) and chose Mizzou over Ohio State and Virginia Tech.
- ▶ Allan Hart (Uniontown, Ohio) captured a National Championship of his own at 126 pounds at the 2016 NHSCA National Wrestling Championships. Hart won a 113-pound Ohio State Championship as a sophomore and finished third as a junior at 126 pounds. Hart chose Mizzou over Pittsburgh, Ohio, Old Dominion and Virginia.
- ▶ A Fargo Junior Greco National Champion, **Dack Punke** (Washington, III.) joins Mizzou with three top-three finishes at the Illinois High School Association State Tournament. Punke improved each year, placing third as a freshman, second as a sophomore and finally a state championship at 113 pounds as a junior.
- Pollowing a Wisconsin State Championship at 195 pounds last season, **Jake Raschka** (Peawaukee, Wis.) heads into his senior season at Pewaukee High School with a 155-11 record. Raschka earned All-America status at the Fargo Junior Cadet Nationals in 2014 and 2015, capturing the National Championship in 2015. At 195 pounds, Raschka finished fifth at the 2016 FloNationals and is the No. 58-ranked recruit by FloWrestling.
- A two-time state champion and three-time state finalist, **Lane Stigall** (Aurora, Ore.) joins Mizzou as Coach Smith's first recruit from the state of Oregon. After winning state at 152 pounds, Stigall went on to finish fourth at 138 pounds at the 2016 FloNationals. Stigall chose Mizzou over Stanford and Oregon State.

OLYMPIC BRONZE MEDALIST

- Senior **J'den Cox** earned an Olympic bronze medal in men's freestyle wrestling at 86 kg at the 2016 Rio Summer Olympics on Aug. 20. Coc defeated Cuba's Reineris Salas Perez to earn bronze, capping a highly impressive day where he didn't give up a single takedown.
- ▶ With the medal, Cox becomes the **seventh University of Missouri athlete to win a medal at the Olympics** and the first since 2008 joining Brutus Hamilton, Jackson Scholz, Dan Pippin, Dick Cochran, Natasha Kaiser (Brown) and Christian Cantwell in the exclusive club.


