SETTING THE STAGE...

- Mizzou Baseball is in the midst of playing seven consecutive games against top-20 teams and that stretch resumes this weekend as No. 9 LSU comes to Taylor Stadium for a three-game set beginning Friday (April 15) at 6 p.m. Saturday's games will begin at 2 p.m. and Sunday's finale will feature a 1 p.m. first pitch. All three games will air live on SEC Network+ with Ben Arnet and Colin McElroy on the call. Pitching matchups are below:
 - Game One: Mizzou RHP **Reggie McClain** (3-1, 3.30 ERA) vs. LSU LHP Jared Poche' (4-2, 2.03 ERA)
 - Game Two: Mizzou RHP **Tanner Houck** (4-2, 2.33 ERA) vs. LSU RHP Alex Lange (3-2, 4.74 ERA)
 - Game Three: Mizzou LHP **Michael Plassmeyer** (3-2, 4.22 ERA) vs. LSU LHP John Valek III (5-1, 3.48 ERA)
- Junior CF **Jake Ring** stole five bases last week and now leads the SEC with 20 steals this season. He is just the seventh Tiger to steal 20 bags in a season. It is the second consecutive season Mizzou has had a 20-base stealer after Brett Peel stole 22 in 2015.
- Senior 1B **Zach Lavy** leads the SEC and is second nationally with six triples after slugging two last week. His six triples rank seventh in Mizzou history in a single season and they are the most by a Tiger hitter since 1994. Lavy's 21 XBHs lead the SEC.
- Mizzou leads the SEC with 181 walks this season – Vanderbilt is the next-best in the conference with 171. Mizzou is batting just .252 on the year but boasts an OBP of .369, which is the largest jump in batting average to OBP in the SEC at 117 points.
- **Tanner Houck** earned SEC Pitcher of the Week for the second time this season and third time in his career following his dominant outing vs. Auburn last Friday. He is now seventh in the SEC in ERA, fourth in opponent batting average, first in innings pitched, fifth in strikeouts and seventh in strikeouts looking. He also leads the SEC in shutouts and complete games (two).
- Mizzou has seemed to find a Sunday starter with the emergence of freshman LHP **Michael Plassmeyer** who has been sensational in his first two SEC weekend starts. He is 2-0 with a perfect 0.00 ERA in 9.1 innings, allowing just seven hits with a 10-2 strikeout-to-walk ratio. Batters are hitting just .206 against him and he tossed 5.2 stellar innings last Saturday vs. Auburn on short rest, striking out a career-best five while allowing just three hits and a walk to on of the SEC's top offenses in Auburn.
- Mizzou has been sensational at getting to the opposing team's starting pitcher over the last 10 games. In fact, opposing starters have thrown just 36 innings against Mizzou in those 10 games (average of nearly 3.2 IP) while only three starters in that span have gone more than 4.0 innings. Mizzou has scored 33 runs off of those starters in 36.0 IP. Mizzou has scored in the first inning in seven of those 10 games, four straight games and five of the last six SEC games.

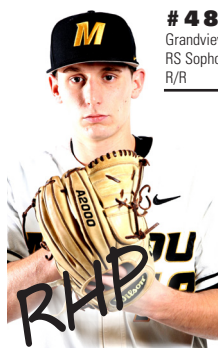

HOUCK PITCHER OF THE WEEK, AGAIN ♠ ♠ ♠

Mizzou Baseball sophomore RHP **Tanner Houck** was named SEC Pitcher of the Week, as announced by the league office on Monday (April 11). This is the second SEC Pitcher of the Week honor for Houck this season and the third of his career. The honor comes on the heels of a dominating performance against the SEC's top offense Auburn. Houck tossed a complete game shutout, allowing just four hits in a 2-0 Mizzou win on Friday night. It was his second complete game shutout this season. Houck was absolutely dominant on one day short rest as two of the four hits he allowed were infield hits and only one runner advanced into scoring position through the 9.0 shutout innings as Houck needed just 105 pitches to get the complete game shutout. His 10 strikeouts were the second-most of his career and he also induced 14 ground balls to go along with his 10 strikeouts and just four balls all day were hit out of the infield against Houck. Four of the groundouts were 1-3 putouts on slow dribblers hit back to him as Auburn struggled to square up Houck all day. In the ninth inning, Houck retired the side on just five pitches, displaying his dominance throughout the game. Houck faced just four batters over the minimum in his start and earned an 88 game score, his second-best of the season. As of Sunday, only four pitchers in the nation had posted a better game score than Houck and only one of those games came against a team from a power conference while Houck's came against the SEC's top offense. The next-best game score by an SEC pitcher through Saturday was Mississippi's Brady Bramlett, who tallied an 82 against Arkansas. Batters are now hitting just .176 against Houck in SEC play and he has 30 Ks in 30.0 IP with just eight walks while pitching against elite offenses like Florida, Vanderbilt, Auburn and Arkansas. It was the first time Auburn has been shutout in SEC play since May of 2014.

EYE ON BASERUNNERS



A storyline to keep an eye on this weekend will be base stealers when each team gets runners on. LSU leads the SEC with 58 stolen bases this season while Mizzou is third with 51 steals. Mizzou has actually been much better this season in throwing out base stealers, getting 17 of 40, good for just a .575 clip against (meaning Mizzou has thrown out 42.5 percent of base stealers), a mark that ranks fourth in the SEC. LSU has gunned 38.5 percent of base stealers against, which is fifth in the SEC this season. Mizzou's **Jake Ring** leads the SEC with 20 steals while LSU's Jake Fraley and Cole Freeman each have 17.

MIZZOU HAS TWO FRESHMEN OF THE WEEK 🍪 🍼 🍷

In two of the first three weeks of the season, Mizzou earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors as first-year players have continued to play a huge role for **Tim Jamieson's** club in 2016. OF **Connor Brumfield** earned the first honor for Mizzou following his performance in week two of the season. Brumfield led Mizzou in batting (.476), on-base percentage (.577), slugging (.619), RBI (10), doubles (three) and total bases (13) while going 7-for-10 with runners in scoring position and driving in three game-winning RBIs in five wins that week (four over Hofstra, one at FIU). UTIL **Brian Sharp** then earned the award following week three. Sharp was sensational that week, guiding Mizzou to a 4-1 record over five games. He picked up his second career win and second career save on the mound while hitting .333 with three runs and two RBI in the Mizzou lineup that week. Add Houck's two SEC Pitcher of the Week honors and Mizzou has earned four SEC weekly honors this season.

DYNAMIC DUO...



Mizzou's top two pitchers - **Reggie McClain** and **Tanner Houck** are arguably the top 1-2 punch in any pitching rotation in the SEC, which makes them one of most feared in the nation. So far this season, the duo is a combined 7-3 with a combined 2.81 ERA in 115.1 innings, allowing just 100 hits and 17 walks with 113 strikeouts. Since each came to Mizzou last season, they have pitched more innings than any duo in the SEC (317.0 IP) and have a combined 3.15 ERA and a combined 284-48 strikeout-walk ratio. They are a combined 23-15 in wins and losses as well.

LAVY ON FIRE 🔥 🔥 🔥



Over the last 24 games, the leader of Mizzou's offense has been senior 1B **Zach Lavy**, who is batting a team-best .348 with eight doubles, three homers, five triples and 29 RBI while scoring 19 runs. He has also walked seven times in those 24 games and leads Mizzou in batting, slugging, OBP, hits, doubles and homers in that span. He has also been exceptional defensively, fielding at a .996 clip despite leading the team in chances. His resurgence in the Mizzou offense comes after he hit just .231 with two RBI in the first 10 games of the season. In that span, he had a five-RBI game vs. YSU on that Friday, becoming the first Mizzou player with five RBI in a game since Josh Lester drove in five against Truman State on March 10, 2015. On the year, Lavy leads the team in runs (29), doubles (11), extra-base hits (20), slugging and hits (41).

HOUCK SET FOR TEAM USA AGAIN 🇺🇸 🇺🇸 🇺🇸

RHP **Tanner Houck** has accepted an invitational to play with USA Baseball's Collegiate National Team for the second consecutive summer, as announced Monday by Mizzou head coach Tim Jamieson and USA Baseball. Houck, a Preseason All-American and Preseason All-SEC pick, spent last summer with the Collegiate National Team and he is the first Mizzou player to earn a spot on the team twice. He was sensational with Team USA a year ago, earning USA Baseball's International Performance of the Year for starting and throwing four perfect innings in a combined no-hitter against Cuba. In all, he Houck Team USA starters in ERA (2.16) and led the team in innings pitched (16.2) and strikeouts (14) while limiting batters to just .213 hitting and owning a 14-1 strikeout-walk ratio.

MIZZOU QUICK HITS...



- Mizzou is second in the SEC and 14th nationally in walks allowed per nine innings, surrendering just 2.80 per nine. Since head coach **Tim Jamieson** took over as pitching coach prior to last season, Mizzou as a BB/9 average of just 2.66. Mizzou was in the top-10 nationally in BB/9 last season.
- Mizzou leads the SEC with 181 walks this season, a mark that ranks seventh nationally. Florida State and Wake Forest are the only teams from a power five conference to rank ahead of Mizzou in walks drawn this season (186 and 182, respectively). To put the mark into perspective, Mizzou walks just 182 times all of last season (58 games) and is just one walk shy of breaking that mark this season.
- With four shutouts this season, only 15 teams in the nation and two SEC teams have thrown more shutouts this season than Mizzou.
- Mizzou has four shutouts this season and had five a season ago giving them nine in the last 93 games since **Tim Jamieson** took over as pitching coach. Mizzou had just seven shutouts from 2011-14 before Jamieson took over as pitching coach last season, a span of 223 games.
- Mizzou is third in the SEC with 51 stolen bases this season and is on pace to steal 82 bases. Mizzou has not stolen that many bags in a season since swiping 94 in 2011. Mizzou is 31st nationally in stolen bases.
- Junior CF **Jake Ring** leads the SEC and is 12th nationally in stolen bases with 20. He is the seventh Mizzou player to ever steal 20 bases in a season. Brett Peel stole 22 a season ago and should Ring pass that mark, he will steal more bases than any Tiger since Torre Tyson stole 37 in 1998.
- Mizzou hit four homers the Sunday game against UIC, marking the first time Mizzou has done that since May 2, 2015, in an 18-1 romp of Ole Miss. The 13 runs scored that game are a season-high and also the most for a Mizzou team since that Ole Miss game. Mizzou also hit two homers in the fourth inning of that game, marking the first time Mizzou had a multi-homer inning since that Ole Miss game as well.
- Mizzou has a pair of walk-off wins this season and had four last season, giving them six in the last 93 games. Mizzou had just five from 2012-14, a span of 164 games.

HOUCK IS TOP 2017 DRAFT PROSPECT...

Mizzou Baseball sophomore righty **Tanner Houck** was tabbed as the No. 1 prospect for the 2017 Major League Baseball Draft according to PerfectGame.com, as the website released its annual rankings on Dec. 2. Houck, a consensus Freshman All-American in 2015, was also dubbed as the top-rated collegiate prospect in the 2017 draft by Baseball America earlier this season.

Houck put together one of the best freshman seasons in Mizzou baseball history. His eight wins are the most by a Tiger freshman since Kyle Gibson (a former first-round draft pick) in 2007 and his 100.2 innings are the most ever by a Tiger freshman under **Tim Jamieson**. At the end of the regular season, he had thrown more innings than any other freshman in the country. He compiled a 3.49 ERA on the season, striking out 91 batters over 100.2 innings while walking just 12 in 15 starts as a freshman.

HOUCK, HOWARD PLAY WITH TEAM USA...

Mizzou Baseball's **Ryan Howard** and **Tanner Houck** wrapped up impressive stints with the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team (CNT) last summer. Overall, the team went 9-8 against some of the world's best competition and Howard and Houck were key in many of those nine wins. Below is a look:

SS Ryan Howard – Howard hit .310 in the 17-game tour with four doubles, a homer, six runs and three RBI. He started 16 of the 17 games at short and committed just three errors while playing some of the nation's top competition. He homered in Team USA's July 4, 11-1 win over Cuba, also notching a double in that win. Howard was incredibly consistent as well, hitting .313 against lefties and .310 against righties during the summer and hit a blistering .345 with runners on base and .286 with runners in scoring position. When leading off an inning he reached base at a .455 clip as well. Just as he did with Mizzou last spring, Howard was incredible with two outs, hitting .370 on the summer while ranking third on the team in two-out RBIs. Howard had five multi-hit games, second-best on the team, and at one point put together a 13-game streak in which he reached base safely, also second-best of the team.

SP Tanner Houck – Houck was one of the headliners on a loaded Team USA pitching staff and the Tiger sophomore-to-be led the CNT in inning pitched (16.2), strikeouts (14) and walked just one batter in four appearances (three starts) while compiling a 2.16 ERA, second-best on the team among players with multiple starts. He started a team-high three games and threw 4.0 perfect innings in a combined no-hitter against Cuba on July 1. Houck limited batters to .213 hitting and allowed just one double in 16.2 innings. His WHIP for the summer was a tremendous 0.96. He was also sensational against lefties, allowing just two hits all summer (.143 average) and allowed just five two-out hits all summer. His 0.54 walks per nine led the team as did his 14-1 strikeout-walk ratio. Houck earned USA Baseball's International Performance of the Year for his four perfect inning in the combined no-hitter vs. Cuba, as announced by USA Baseball on Feb. 3.

HOWARD, RING AMONG TOP 300 PROSPECTS...

D1Baseball.com released its list of the top 300 prospects for the 2016 MLB Draft in college baseball prior to the start of the season. Two Mizzou players made their way to the list and those two players - **SS Ryan Howard** and **CF Jake Ring** - figure to be the cornerstone of Mizzou's offense. Howard checked in at No. 97 while Ring rated as No. 217 on the list. Howard hit a team-best .308 last season and led the team in hits (69), at-bats (224) and total bases (97). He will be looked at as one of the SEC's top shortstops this season. Ring had a breakout sophomore season in which he hit .282 while leading the team in doubles (15) and extra-base hits (22) and runs. He hit with tremendous power in the fall and will be a huge factor at the top of the lineup in 2016.

HOUCK PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN...

Mizzou Baseball sophomore righty **Tanner Houck** has been named a Preseason All-American by D1Baseball.com and PerfectGame.com as announced in January. Houck, who was a consensus Freshman All-American a year ago, landed on D1Baseball's and PerfectGame's All-America Third Team. Houck is Mizzou's first Preseason All-American since Kyle Gibson and Trevor Coleman earned the distinction in 2009.

McCLAIN, HOUCK HONORED BY PERFECTGAME...

Mizzou Baseball starting pitchers **Tanner Houck** and **Reggie McClain** were both honored by PerfectGame.com as the national baseball publication released its top collegiate players by class this week. Houck checked in as the No. 1 college sophomore nationally while McClain was rated as the eighth-best college senior. Mizzou joins just Florida, Kentucky and LSU as the only SEC schools to bring back both its 2015 Friday and Saturday starters.

SHANE BENES HEALTHY...

So far in 2016, Mizzou has gotten a hefty boost to its offense as slugger **Shane Benes** is fully healthy after recovering from a pair of ACL tears over his senior year of high school and during his freshman year fall at Mizzou. Benes missed the first 39 games of 2015 but made an impact when finally being inserted into the starting lineup. He hit a triple off the wall in his first at-bat and slugged seven extra-base hits in 71 at-bats last season (seven of his 16 hits were for extra bases) including two homers and four doubles. Benes is the son of former No. 1 overall draft pick Andy Benes, who had a long major league career, most notably with the St. Louis Cardinals. Benes is penciled in at third base and is one of the top prospects to watch for the 2017 draft. He has the most power potential of any player on the Mizzou roster.

DOHERTY, HUNT PLAY MULTIPLE SPORTS...

Mizzou Baseball will feature a pair of multiple-sport performers on its 2016 roster in OF **Marquise Doherty** and RHP **Tyler Hunt**. Both players also played football at Mizzou in the fall. Doherty, a freshman, redshirted in the fall with the football team while Hunt had a tremendous senior season, earning the nickname 'The Human First Down' from the Mizzou faithful. This is the first season with the baseball program for both players. Hunt had 185 yards on 42 carries with 203 yards on six catches and had Mizzou's three longest plays from scrimmage in the fall. He was a standout pitcher in high school as well. Doherty was the top overall recruit in the state of Missouri coming out of high school on the diamond and has scouts drooling over his five-tool skill set. He is a running back with Barry Odom's football team. Mizzou is the only team in the SEC with two baseball/football players. Alabama and South Carolina each have one.

HOWARD TABBED BEST INF ARM IN SEC...

Mizzou SS **Ryan Howard** is primed for a breakout season and should be one of the most talked-about players as he ushers in a new crop of talented SEC shortstops following last year's group that largely departed to the MLB Draft. *Baseball America* tabbed Howard as the best infield arm among infielders in the SEC, quite an honor considering the talent level in the league. Howard fielded at .972 last season at the infield's toughest position and committed just seven errors at short. The seven errors by Howard are the fewest by a Mizzou starting shortstop in the last decade.

MIZZOU TELEVISED...

Mizzou Baseball will have 10 of its games in 2016 featured on national television through the Southeastern Conference's television deal with ESPN, as announced by the SEC on Thursday (Jan. 14). In addition to Mizzou's 10 games on the ESPN family of networks, Mizzou's game at Florida on March 18 will be featured as part of a four-hour Bases Loaded special on SEC Network, a show that will feature a compilation of all seven SEC games taking place on opening night of league action. Seven of Mizzou's 10 televised games will air on SEC Network while the remaining three will air live on ESPNU. In addition to Mizzou's televised games through the ESPN deal, every game at Taylor Stadium will be streamed on SEC Network-Plus with the exception of Mizzou's March 5 doubleheader vs. UIC. All SEC games at opposing schools will be on SEC Network-Plus as well.

ON THE AIR...

Once again, KTGR ESPN Radio is the radio home of the Tigers, with all of the games being broadcast on 103.1-FM, 100.5-FM and 1580-AM. The games can also be heard online at KTGR.com. **Tex Little** is in his 26th season of calling Tiger Baseball and is joined in the booth by Mizzou graduate assistant coach **Trevor Coleman** as an analyst. Coleman is one of the most recognizable names and faces from some of the most winningest teams in program history as he was a standout for Tim Jamieson and the Tigers from 2007-09. Coleman was the team's catcher and one of the top hitters during his time with Mizzou, amassing a 116-66 overall record over his three seasons. He helped the 2007 team win 42 games and host the NCAA Regional round at Taylor Stadium. He again helped the Tigers to 39 wins and a Regional the following year in 2008.

Coleman was the 2007 Big 12 Freshman of the Year and a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American after hitting .282 in 49 games, tallying nine homers, 11 doubles and 42 RBI. He then hit .295 in 2008 and .260 in 2009 before being drafted by the Seattle Mariners in the ninth round of the 2009 First Year Player Draft.

MIZZOU HELPING PUPPIES...

The Mizzou Baseball team has partnered with the Puppies With Purpose program again for the 2016 season in an effort to help raise money for Columbia service dogs. The initiative, dubbed "K's for K9's," will allow fans to pledge a donation amount to be paid per strikeout during the 2016 season.

"I'm a dog lover," head coach Tim Jamieson said. "I've read more and more about dogs and actually researched whether or not there were places in Missouri that train dogs for this purpose and ironically find out that there's one in Columbia and one on Mizzou's campus. So it seemed like it was a really good fit and I introduced it to our players and they are really excited about it."

MIZZOU ADDS, JERRY ZULLI, JC FIELD...

Mizzou Baseball head coach **Tim Jamieson** has announced the hiring of **Jerry Zulli** and **J.C. Field**, a Mizzou standout from 2005-06, as the program's assistant coach and volunteer assistant coach, respectively.

Jerry Zulli is one of college baseball's rising coaching stars, and joins Mizzou as the program's new assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. Zulli (pronounced ZOO-lee) will come to Mizzou after an incredibly successful stint as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at South Alabama, where he was the key architect to three top-50 recruiting classes, one 40-win season and two Sun Belt Conference Championships. Zulli brings to Mizzou the reputation of being a tireless recruiter. In three of his four seasons at South Alabama, he put together top-50 recruiting classes, including a 2013 recruiting class that ranked 29th overall by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. That class was a key contributor to last season's South Alabama team that won 37 games and the Sun Belt Conference Championship, the program's second in three years. He has forged recruiting ties all across the SEC footprint after assistant coaching stints at South Alabama, Memphis and Middle Georgia College and routinely turned in top-rated recruiting classes despite battling SEC schools for the same prospects.

Field is an up-and-coming coach with a résumé that includes coaching stints at North Dakota and Southeast Missouri. He joins Mizzou after spending the last seven seasons at North Dakota, including the last two as the program's associate head coach. At UND, Field oversaw the team's hitters, catchers and outfielders while leading the team's west coast recruiting efforts.

Mizzou will not have a midweek game next week as it will shift its focus towards a road series at SEC East rival South Carolina, beginning Friday (April 22). **Tex Little** and **Trevor Coleman** will have the call on KTGR. MAX SCHERZER
2013 CY YOUNG WINNER

MAX SCHERZER // SP // WASHINGTON NATIONALS

► One could make the argument that **Max Scherzer** is the most successful professional athlete to ever come out of Mizzou, in any sport. A three-time MLB All-Star and 2013 AL Cy Young winner, Scherzer has led the American League in wins twice and is coming off of a season in which he threw two no-hitters for the Washington Nationals.

► Under **Tim Jamieson**, Scherzer was sensational at Mizzou, earning Big 12 Pitcher of the Year honors in 2005 while being inducted into the 2012 Mizzou Athletics Hall of Fame class. He was drafted 11th overall in 2005 (the first ever Tiger to be drafted in the first round) and began a long line of Mizzou hurlers taken in the first round.

► Scherzer debuted in the major leagues on April 29, 2008. He earned the American League Cy Young in 2013, opening the season with a 12-0 mark while starting the All-Star Game. He surpassed the 1,000-strikeout mark that season and finished the regular season with a 21-3 record and a 2.90 ERA with a 0.97 WHIP and a career-high 240 strikeouts. He was the league's only 20-game winner that season and received 28 of 30 first-place votes in the Cy Young balloting that year.

► Scherzer signed a seven-year deal worth \$210 million with the Washington Nationals prior to the 2015 season. He tossed two no-hitters (one batter shy of a perfect game against the Pirates in June) and had two game scores of 97 or better, becoming the first to do that twice in a season since Pedro Martinez in 2000 - Nolan Ryan in 1990 is the only other pitcher to do so.



IAN KINSLER
4-TIME ALL-STAR

IAN KINSLER // 2B // DETROIT TIGERS

► Despite spending just one season at Mizzou, **Ian Kinsler** made quite an impact and was a star that helped lay the foundation for a Mizzou team that went to NCAA Regionals from 2003-09. His 2003 team was the first regional team at Mizzou since 1996. He was inducted into the Mizzou Athletics Hall of Fame in 2013.

► Kinsler is a four-time MLB All-Star, has twice joined the 30-30 club and was the 2014 Wilson Defensive Player of the Year winner at second base in 2014.

► He first joined the 30-30 club in 2009 and hit for the cycle that season as well. While with the Rangers, he set club records for leadoff homers and times stealing third base. He again went for 30-30 in 2011, again for the Rangers. That year, he hit a leadoff homer in each of the first two games of the season, becoming the first player to ever accomplish that feat.

► Kinsler was an All-Star in 2008, 2010, 2012 and 2014, doing so most recently with the Detroit Tigers.

► He is a lifetime .276 hitter with 184 homers, 704 RBI, 324 doubles, 942 runs scored and 197 stolen bases.

2015 TWINS PITCHER OF THE YEAR

KYLE GIBSON // SP // MINNESOTA TWINS

► After a successful career at Mizzou, **Kyle Gibson** was a first round draft pick in 2009, going 22nd overall to the Minnesota Twins. He made his major league debut in 2013 as Tommy John surgery slowed his progress to the major leagues.

► Serving as the Twins No. 3 starter in 2014, he had a breakout season in 2015, earning the club's Pitcher of the Year Award, tallying 11 wins and a 3.84 ERA in a team-high 194.2 innings, striking out 145 batters.

► Gibson has been touted as a possible breakout star in 2016, so he is certainly a pitcher to watch as the Twins have hopes of getting back to the postseason with Gibson heading the pitching staff.

AARON CROW // RP // MIAMI MARLINS

► **Aaron Crow** was the heir apparent to Max Scherzer and he was outstanding in college, guiding Mizzou to host the 2007 Columbia Regional. He went 23-8 with a 3.27 ERA in his college career and the highlight of his career came in 2006 when he earned his first career victory in a complete game over Pepperdine, staving off elimination in the regional round as Mizzou became the first ever #4 seed to win a regional that season.

► In 2007, Crow went 13-0 with a 2.35 ERA and was named Big 12 Pitcher of the Year with four complete game shutouts. He had a 43.1 shutout inning streak that season.

► Crow was drafted in the first round twice, going as high as ninth before electing to not sign with the Nationals in 2008. In 2006, he was drafted 12th by the Royals and wound up becoming an All-Star in 2011 with the club. He was moved to Miami but missed the 2014 season with Tommy John surgery.

No head coach has been at Mizzou longer than Mizzou baseball's Tim Jamieson, who will enter his 22nd season at the helm of the program in 2016. Jamieson was tasked with transitioning a team that had rose to be one of the most consistent programs in the Big 12 to a program that can compete in the premier baseball conference in America - the SEC. In 2015, Jamieson led one of the nation's top turn-around stories as Mizzou finished third in a loaded SEC East while ranking as high as No. 14 nationally. He garnered plenty of SEC Coach of the Year consideration and Mizzou Director of Athletics Mack Rhoades rewarded Jamieson with a three-year contract as the Mizzou skipper once again has his Tigers poised for another successful run through the nation's best baseball conference.

In his 21 seasons at the helm of the program, Jamieson has compiled a 675-537-2 overall record as he is the second-winningest coach in program history, trailing only Gene McArtor's 733 career wins.

2015 may have been one of the top coaching jobs in Jamieson's career, and that came as he took over as pitching coach while also serving as the head coach. Picked to finish dead last in the SEC in the preseason by virtually every preseason publication, Jamieson's team used great pitching and defense to win six of 10 SEC series, including series wins over two top-10 programs, en-route to a third-place finish in the SEC East. A talented freshman class with key upperclassmen were paramount to the success. He coached RHP Tanner Houck to Unanimous Freshman All-America honors and closer Breckin Williams was a second-team All-SEC honoree under Jamieson's tutelage. Three of his pitchers from 2015 were drafted over the summer as well.

Winning with class and high-character have been trademarks of Jamieson's tenure at Mizzou and he has done a phenomenal job of upholding the school's and the athletic department's core values during his 21 years. And he has done it while producing some of the top talent that has ever come through Mizzou - in any sport. Coaching the likes of 2013 American League Cy Young winner Max Scherzer and four-time MLB All-Star Ian Kinsler, it can be argued that Jamieson has seen more of his athletes excel at the next level than any other coach in history at Mizzou, in any sport.

That is why Jamieson is the perfect coach to lead Mizzou into its fourth year in the Southeastern Conference. His body of work speaks for itself as does his ability to groom players for the next level. He took Max Scherzer, an unpolished power arm out of St. Louis, from a high school player that was drafted in the 43rd round to a first-round draft pick. Aaron Crow, now an All-Star pitcher for the Miami Marlins went undrafted out of high school and was twice a first-round pick by the time he was done at Mizzou. Most recently, Rob Zastryzny - undrafted out of high school - was selected with the second pick of the second round by the Chicago Cubs. At the helm of one of the last decade's most consistent programs, paired with the resources that are available in the SEC, look for Jamieson to get Mizzou rolling while playing aside the best competition in the country week-in and week-out.

2012 was a memorable season for the Tiger skipper as he won his 600th career game - a 5-0 decision over Texas in the first round of the Big 12 Tournament - all while winning his first ever Big 12 Championship and guiding Mizzou to its eighth NCAA Tournament in 10 seasons.

A native of Columbia, Jamieson grew up attending several Tigers' games. After his playing days at the University of New Orleans, he spent six seasons on the UNO coaching staff before returning to Columbia in 1988 where he was an assistant coach under McArtor for six seasons before becoming head coach following the 1994 season.
