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SETTING THE STAGE...



For the third time in four years, Mizzou Baseball has qualified for the SEC Baseball Tournament after clinching the 11-seed for the annual week-long affair in Hoover, Ala. Mizzou will open tournament action Tuesday morning (May 24) at 9:30 a.m. with No. 6 seed Vanderbilt. Mizzou was swept by Vanderbilt in the second SEC weekend for both teams.

As mentioned above, Mizzou is making its third SEC Tournament appearance since joining the league for the 2013 season. Mizzou is 1-3 all-time in the SEC Tournament with its lone win coming last season when RHP **Reggie McClain** pitched Mizzou, the seven seed in last year's tournament, past 10th-seeded South Carolina. Mizzou won the game, 5-1. Mizzou then lost the next two games and was eliminated and likely just missed out on a regional berth because of the two losses. Mizzou had Vanderbilt on the ropes with a 6-2 lead after six innings in 2015, but Vanderbilt scored two in the seventh, one in the eighth and one in the ninth before Rhett Wiseman homered in the 10th to close the comeback. Mizzou then lost, 4-3, to Alabama with **Tanner Houck** on the mound as its season came to an end following that game. Mizzou led 3-1 after 5.5 innings, but a two-run sixth and a one-run seventh helped Alabama complete the comeback.

Vanderbilt has been a thorn in Mizzou's side since joining the SEC as Mizzou has never defeated the Commodores, losing all 13 meetings, including three earlier this season. Mizzou has not had much success in the 13 games against Vanderbilt as it has been outscored in that span, 108-34. Last season, Mizzou and Vanderbilt met in Nashville with first place in the SEC East on the line. Both teams entered the weekend at 12-6 in SEC play last year, but Vanderbilt won all three games from Mizzou and wound up winning the east with a 20-10 mark while Mizzou finished third at 15-15.

Mizzou led this year's Friday night game with Vanderbilt, 6-4, and retired the first two men in the ninth inning before Vanderbilt rallied for four runs in the frame, including a go-ahead two-run homer off of Mizzou reliever **Brian Sharp** on the first pitch he threw. Vanderbilt won, 8-6. **Tanner Houck** earned National Player of the Week honors from Louisville Slugger for his performance against Vanderbilt this season, allowing just two hits over 9.0 shutout innings while striking out a career-high 14 with just two walks. He was given no run support as Vanderbilt eventually won, 2-0, in 11 innings. Mizzou then lost 17-7 on Sunday as Vanderbilt completed the sweep.

Mizzou will send sophomore RHP **Tanner Houck** to the mound. As mentioned above, he was sensational this year against Vanderbilt. In his career, he is 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA in two starts vs. Vanderbilt with a 19-2 strikeout-to-walk ratio. Despite Vanderbilt tagging him for seven earned runs over 5.0 innings in 2015, Houck is limiting Vanderbilt to .196 hitting in his career.

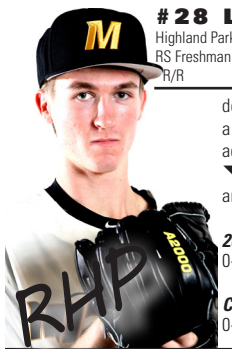

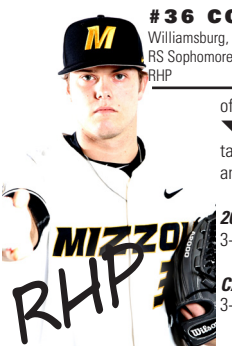

LAVY NAMED OLSON AWARD SEMIFINALIST

Mizzou senior 1B Zach Lavy (Auxvasse, Mo.) has been named a semifinalist for the 2016 Gregg Olson Award, which is given to the top amateur baseball player who elevates his game to an elite level throughout the season. He is one of 42 players to be named a semifinalist for the award, six from the SEC.

Lavy entered the season as a career .229 hitter with just 17 total extra-base hits in his first two seasons. As a senior, Lavy has exploded to lead Mizzou in virtually every offensive category while leading the SEC in extra-base hits (34), slugging (.610) and triples (eight) while ranking third in doubles (18) and third in total bases (128). His eight triples lead the nation and are the most at Mizzou since 1994 and his 18 doubles are the most at Mizzou since 2010 as are his 54 RBI. Nearly half of his team-leading 70 hits have gone for extra bases this season. Below is a look at where Lavy's numbers stack up following the regular season.

- **18 doubles** - Most since Senne's 22 in 2010
- **8 triples** - 4th in school history
- **34 extra-base hits** - Most since Cody Ehlers had 39 in 2004
- **54 RBI** - Most since current Major Leaguer Brett Nicholas had 64 in 2010
- **128 total bases** - Most since Senne's 154 in 2010

Of course there are other tremendous first basemen in the SEC, so let's see how Lavy stacks up against them:

- Mizzou's **Zach Lavy**: .333 // .392 // .610 // 18 2B // 8 3B // 8 HR // 54 RBI // 44 R
- Florida's Peter Alonso: .352 // .455 // .581 // 14 2B // 0 3B // 9 HR // 47 RBI // 40 R
- Texas A&M's Hunter Melton: .321 // .387 // .549 // 12 2B // 2 3B // 11 HR // 63 RBI // 47 R

Now let's look at Lavy, Melton and Alonso in SEC games:

- Lavy: .322 // .372 // .602 // 8 2B // 5 3B // 5 HR // 28 RBI // 19 R
- Melton: .290 // .343 // .524 // 6 2B // 1 3B // 7 HR // 33 RBI // 20 R
- Alonso: .319 // .431 // .549 // 3 2B // 0 3B // 6 HR // 17 RBI // 19 R

Looking at those numbers, Lavy's are arguably the best of any SEC first baseman in SEC play this season.

MISSOURI LIMITS WALKS



Heading into the SEC Tournament, Mizzou has been sensational at limiting walks this season. In fact, Mizzou averages just 2.61 walks per nine innings, a mark that ranks second in the SEC and 11th nationally. The only SEC team to have a better walks per nine average is No. 1 Florida, which averages just 2.35 per contest. Knowing that Mizzou has limited its walks this year, it is also not surprising to see that Mizzou ranks 13th nationally in strikeout-walk ratio (2.95). Remarkably, that mark ranks fifth in the SEC, which speaks to the quality and depth of the pitching in the SEC. Senior RHP **Reggie McClain** is a key reason for Mizzou's high national rank in both categories. He is fifth nationally and leads the SEC in both categories. He is walking less than one batter per nine innings at 0.80 and owns a 10.44 strikeout-walk ratio. In SEC games, Mizzou has walked just 68 batters in 30 games, by far the best mark in the SEC. Mizzou walked just 18 batters over the final 12 SEC games in which Mizzou went 5-7 overall to secure an SEC Tournament berth, averaging just 1.57 walks per nine innings in that span.

MISSOURI FORCED MOST GROUNDOUTS IN SEC

In addition to limiting walks this season, Mizzou's pitchers have been outstanding in inducing ground balls. Mizzou leads the SEC in flyout-groundout ratio at 0.7 and the 306 ground balls forced are the most in the SEC and nearly 100 more than the 208 flyouts that they have surrendered. Only Florida (200) had fewer fly ball outs than Mizzou this season. Only three of 15 Mizzou pitchers have more flyouts than groundouts this season. As a team, Mizzou averages nearly 18 combined flyouts and strikeouts per game.

Leading the way for the Mizzou pitching staff in that category is sophomore righty **Tanner Houck** who has allowed just 67 flyouts in 99.1 innings, an average of just six per game. He has also induced 119 ground balls to go along with his 100 strikeouts. Nearly 77 percent of his outs recorded have been via strikeout or groundout. Senior RHP **Reggie McClain** has also been outstanding limiting fly balls, surrendering just 72 this year. He leads the team with 122 ground ball outs as well. 75 percent of his outs recorded have come via strikeout or groundout.

COACH J APPROACHES MILESTONE



As Mizzou enters the tournament, Mizzou head coach **Tim Jamieson** is closing in a milestone. With 698 career wins (all at Mizzou), the Tiger skipper is just two away from reaching 700 career wins. Once Coach Jamieson reaches 700 career wins, he will be just 33 wins shy of tying legendary Mizzou head coach **Gene McArtor** for the most wins of any Mizzou Baseball head coach (McArtor had 733 wins from 1974-1994). Coach Jamieson succeeded McArtor in 1995 and has won 696. What is even more amazing about Mizzou's coaching history is that the Tigers have had just three coaches since 1937 as John 'Hi' Simmons - who Mizzou's field is named after - coached 35 years before McArtor took over in 1974.

MIZZOU QUICK HITS...



- Mizzou is second in the SEC and 11th nationally in walks allowed per nine innings, surrendering just 2.61 per nine. Since head coach **Tim Jamieson** took over as pitching coach prior to last season, Mizzou as a BB/9 average of just 2.55. Mizzou was in the top-10 nationally in BB/9 last season.
- Mizzou is sixth in the SEC with 232 walks this season, a mark that ranks 51st nationally. To put the mark into perspective, Mizzou walked just 182 times all of last season (58 games) and has blown that mark out of the water this season. The 232 walks are the most for a Mizzou team since 2011 when the Tigers drew 239 walks.
- RHP **Cole Bartlett** ranks second in the SEC and 11th nationally in pitching appearances this season (31 appearances, three starts). The 31 appearances are the 10th-most in a single season at Mizzou.
- Mizzou has five shutouts this season and had five a season ago giving them 10 in the last 113 games since **Tim Jamieson** took over as pitching coach. Mizzou had just seven shutouts from 2011-14 before Jamieson took over as pitching coach last season, a span of 223 games.
- Mizzou is fourth in the SEC with 64 stolen bases this season and is on pace to steal 65 bases. Mizzou has not stolen that many bags in a season since swiping 94 in 2011.
- Junior CF **Jake Ring** leads the SEC and is 23rd nationally in stolen bases with 25. He is the seventh Mizzou player to ever steal 20 bases in a season. He has the most stolen bases by any Tiger since Torre Tyson stole 37 in 1998.
- In two of the first three weeks of the season, Mizzou earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors as first-year players have continued to play a huge role for **Tim Jamieson's** club in 2016. OF **Connor Brumfield** earned the first honor for Mizzou following his performance in week two of the season. UTIL **Brian Sharp** then earned the award following week three.
- Mizzou has a pair of walk-off wins this season and had four last season, giving them six in the last 113 games. Mizzou had just five from 2012-14, a span of 164 games.

HOUCK IS TOP 2017 DRAFT PROSPECT... ♠ ♠ ♠

Mizzou Baseball sophomore righty **Tanner Houck** was tabbed as the No. 1 prospect for the 2017 Major League Baseball Draft according to PerfectGame.com, as the website released its annual rankings on Dec. 2. Houck, a consensus Freshman All-American in 2015, was also dubbed as the top-rated collegiate prospect in the 2017 draft by Baseball America earlier this season.

Houck put together one of the best freshman seasons in Mizzou baseball history. His eight wins are the most by a Tiger freshman since Kyle Gibson (a former first-round draft pick) in 2007 and his 100.2 innings are the most ever by a Tiger freshman under **Tim Jamieson**. At the end of the regular season, he had thrown more innings than any other freshman in the country. He compiled a 3.49 ERA on the season, striking out 91 batters over 100.2 innings while walking just 12 in 15 starts as a freshman.

HOUCK, HOWARD PLAY WITH TEAM USA... 🇺🇸 🇺🇸 🇺🇸

Mizzou Baseball's **Ryan Howard** and **Tanner Houck** wrapped up impressive stints with the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team (CNT) last summer. Overall, the team went 9-8 against some of the world's best competition and Howard and Houck were key in many of those nine wins. Below is a look:

SS Ryan Howard – Howard hit .310 in the 17-game tour with four doubles, a homer, six runs and three RBI. He started 16 of the 17 games at short and committed just three errors while playing some of the nation's top competition. He homered in Team USA's July 4, 11-1 win over Cuba, also notching a double in that win. Howard was incredibly consistent as well, hitting .313 against lefties and .310 against righties during the summer and hit a blistering .345 with runners on base and .286 with runners in scoring position. When leading off an inning he reached base at a .455 clip as well. Just as he did with Mizzou last spring, Howard was incredible with two outs, hitting .370 on the summer while ranking third on the team in two-out RBIs. Howard had five multi-hit games, second-best on the team, and at one point put together a 13-game streak in which he reached base safely, also second-best of the team.

SP Tanner Houck – Houck was one of the headliners on a loaded Team USA pitching staff and the Tiger sophomore-to-be led the CNT in inning pitched (16.2), strikeouts (14) and walked just one batter in four appearances (three starts) while compiling a 2.16 ERA, second-best on the team among players with multiple starts. He started a team-high three games and threw 4.0 perfect innings in a combined no-hitter against Cuba on July 1. Houck limited batters to .213 hitting and allowed just one double in 16.2 innings. His WHIP for the summer was a tremendous 0.96. He was also sensational against lefties, allowing just two hits all summer (.143 average) and allowed just five two-out hits all summer. His 0.54 walks per nine led the team as did his 14-1 strikeout-walk ratio. Houck earned USA Baseball's International Performance of the Year for his four perfect inning in the combined no-hitter vs. Cuba, as announced by USA Baseball on Feb. 3.

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HOUCK SET FOR TEAM USA AGAIN



RHP **Tanner Houck** has accepted an invitational to play with USA Baseball's Collegiate National Team for the second consecutive summer, as announced by Mizzou head coach Tim Jamieson and USA Baseball. Houck, a Preseason All-American and Preseason All-SEC pick, spent last summer with the Collegiate National Team and he is the first Mizzou player to earn a spot on the team twice. He was sensational with Team USA a year ago, earning USA Baseball's International Performance of the Year for starting and throwing four perfect innings in a combined no-hitter against Cuba. In all, he led Team USA starters in ERA (2.16) and led the team in innings pitched (16.2) and strikeouts (14) while limiting batters to just .213 hitting and owning a 14-1 strikeout-walk ratio.

HOWARD, RING AMONG TOP 300 PROSPECTS...

D1Baseball.com released its list of the top 300 prospects for the 2016 MLB Draft in college baseball prior to the start of the season. Two Mizzou players made their way to the list and those two players - **SS Ryan Howard** and **CF Jake Ring** - figure to be the cornerstone of Mizzou's offense. Howard checked in at No. 97 while Ring rated as No. 217 on the list. Howard hit a team-best .308 last season and led the team in hits (69), at-bats (224) and total bases (97). He will be looked at as one of the SEC's top shortstops this season. Ring had a breakout sophomore season in which he hit .282 while leading the team in doubles (15) and extra-base hits (22) and runs. He hit with tremendous power in the fall and will be a huge factor at the top of the lineup in 2016.

HOUCK PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN...



Mizzou Baseball sophomore righty **Tanner Houck** has been named a Preseason All-American by D1Baseball.com and PerfectGame.com as announced in January. Houck, who was a consensus Freshman All-American a year ago, landed on D1Baseball's and PerfectGame's All-America Third Team. Houck is Mizzou's first Preseason All-American since Kyle Gibson and Trevor Coleman earned the distinction in 2009.

McCLAIN, HOUCK HONORED BY PERFECTGAME...

Mizzou Baseball starting pitchers **Tanner Houck** and **Reggie McClain** were both honored by PerfectGame.com as the national baseball publication released its top collegiate players by class this week. Houck checked in as the No. 1 college sophomore nationally while McClain was rated as the eighth-best college senior. Mizzou joins just Florida, Kentucky and LSU as the only SEC schools to bring back both its 2015 Friday and Saturday starters.

SHANE BENES HEALTHY...

So far in 2016, Mizzou has gotten a hefty boost to its offense as slugger **Shane Benes** is fully healthy after recovering from a pair of ACL tears over his senior year of high school and during his freshman year fall at Mizzou. Benes missed the first 39 games of 2015 but made an impact when finally being inserted into the starting lineup. He hit a triple off the wall in his first at-bat and slugged seven extra-base hits in 71 at-bats last season (seven of his 16 hits were for extra bases) including two homers and four doubles. Benes is the son of former No. 1 overall draft pick Andy Benes, who had a long major league career, most notably with the St. Louis Cardinals. Benes is penciled in at third base and is one of the top prospects to watch for the 2017 draft. He has the most power potential of any player on the Mizzou roster.

DOHERTY, HUNT PLAY MULTIPLE SPORTS...

Mizzou Baseball will feature a pair of multiple-sport performers on its 2016 roster in OF **Marquise Doherty** and RHP **Tyler Hunt**. Both players also played football at Mizzou in the fall. Doherty, a freshman, redshirted in the fall with the football team while Hunt had a tremendous senior season, earning the nickname 'The Human First Down' from the Mizzou faithful. This is the first season with the baseball program for both players. Hunt had 185 yards on 42 carries with 203 yards on six catches and had Mizzou's three longest plays from scrimmage in the fall. He was a standout pitcher in high school as well. Doherty was the top overall recruit in the state of Missouri coming out of high school on the diamond and has scouts drooling over his five-tool skill set. He is a running back with Barry Odom's football team. Mizzou is the only team in the SEC with two baseball/football players. Alabama and South Carolina each have one.

HOWARD TABBED BEST INF ARM IN SEC...

Mizzou SS **Ryan Howard** is primed for a breakout season and should be one of the most talked-about players as he ushers in a new crop of talented SEC shortstops following last year's group that largely departed to the MLB Draft. *Baseball America* tabbed Howard as the best infield arm among infielders in the SEC, quite an honor considering the talent level in the league. Howard fielded at .972 last season at the infield's toughest position and committed just seven errors at short. The seven errors by Howard are the fewest by a Mizzou starting shortstop in the last decade.

MIZZOU TELEVISED...

Mizzou Baseball will have 10 of its games in 2016 featured on national television through the Southeastern Conference's television deal with ESPN, as announced by the SEC on Thursday (Jan. 14). In addition to Mizzou's 10 games on the ESPN family of networks, Mizzou's game at Florida on March 18 will be featured as part of a four-hour Bases Loaded special on SEC Network, a show that will feature a compilation of all seven SEC games taking place on opening night of league action. Seven of Mizzou's 10 televised games will air on SEC Network while the remaining three will air live on ESPNU. In addition to Mizzou's televised games through the ESPN deal, every game at Taylor Stadium will be streamed on SEC Network-Plus with the exception of Mizzou's March 5 doubleheader vs. UIC. All SEC games at opposing schools will be on SEC Network-Plus as well.

ON THE AIR...

Once again, KTGR ESPN Radio is the radio home of the Tigers, with all of the games being broadcast on 103.1-FM, 100.5-FM and 1580-AM. The games can also be heard online at KTGR.com. **Tex Little** is in his 26th season of calling Tiger Baseball and is joined in the booth by Mizzou graduate assistant coach **Trevor Coleman** as an analyst. Coleman is one of the most recognizable names and faces from some of the most winningest teams in program history as he was a standout for Tim Jamieson and the Tigers from 2007-09. Coleman was the team's catcher and one of the top hitters during his time with Mizzou, amassing a 116-66 overall record over his three seasons. He helped the 2007 team win 42 games and host the NCAA Regional round at Taylor Stadium. He again helped the Tigers to 39 wins and a Regional the following year in 2008.

Coleman was the 2007 Big 12 Freshman of the Year and a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American after hitting .282 in 49 games, tallying nine homers, 11 doubles and 42 RBI. He then hit .295 in 2008 and .260 in 2009 before being drafted by the Seattle Mariners in the ninth round of the 2009 First Year Player Draft.

MIZZOU HELPING PUPPIES...

The Mizzou Baseball team has partnered with the Puppies With Purpose program again for the 2016 season in an effort to help raise money for Columbia service dogs. The initiative, dubbed "K's for K9's," will allow fans to pledge a donation amount to be paid per strikeout during the 2016 season.

"I'm a dog lover," head coach Tim Jamieson said. "I've read more and more about dogs and actually researched whether or not there were places in Missouri that train dogs for this purpose and ironically find out that there's one in Columbia and one on Mizzou's campus. So it seemed like it was a really good fit and I introduced it to our players and they are really excited about it."

MIZZOU ADDS, JERRY ZULLI, JC FIELD...

Mizzou Baseball head coach **Tim Jamieson** has announced the hiring of **Jerry Zulli** and **J.C. Field**, a Mizzou standout from 2005-06, as the program's assistant coach and volunteer assistant coach, respectively.

Jerry Zulli is one of college baseball's rising coaching stars, and joins Mizzou as the program's new assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. Zulli (pronounced ZOO-lee) will come to Mizzou after an incredibly successful stint as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at South Alabama, where he was the key architect to three top-50 recruiting classes, one 40-win season and two Sun Belt Conference Championships. Zulli brings to Mizzou the reputation of being a tireless recruiter. In three of his four seasons at South Alabama, he put together top-50 recruiting classes, including a 2013 recruiting class that ranked 29th overall by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. That class was a key contributor to last season's South Alabama team that won 37 games and the Sun Belt Conference Championship, the program's second in three years. He has forged recruiting ties all across the SEC footprint after assistant coaching stints at South Alabama, Memphis and Middle Georgia College and routinely turned in top-rated recruiting classes despite battling SEC schools for the same prospects.

Field is an up-and-coming coach with a résumé that includes coaching stints at North Dakota and Southeast Missouri. He joins Mizzou after spending the last seven seasons at North Dakota, including the last two as the program's associate head coach. At UND, Field oversaw the team's hitters, catchers and outfielders while leading the team's west coast recruiting efforts.

MAX SCHERZER
2013 CY YOUNG WINNER

MAX SCHERZER // SP // WASHINGTON NATIONALS

► One could make the argument that **Max Scherzer** is the most successful professional athlete to ever come out of Mizzou, in any sport. A three-time MLB All-Star and 2013 AL Cy Young winner, Scherzer has led the American League in wins twice and is coming off of a season in which he threw two no-hitters for the Washington Nationals.

► Under **Tim Jamieson**, Scherzer was sensational at Mizzou, earning Big 12 Pitcher of the Year honors in 2005 while being inducted into the 2012 Mizzou Athletics Hall of Fame class. He was drafted 11th overall in 2005 (the first ever Tiger to be drafted in the first round) and began a long line of Mizzou hurlers taken in the first round.

► Scherzer debuted in the major leagues on April 29, 2008. He earned the American League Cy Young in 2013, opening the season with a 12-0 mark while starting the All-Star Game. He surpassed the 1,000-strikeout mark that season and finished the regular season with a 21-3 record and a 2.90 ERA with a 0.97 WHIP and a career-high 240 strikeouts. He was the league's only 20-game winner that season and received 28 of 30 first-place votes in the Cy Young balloting that year.

► Scherzer signed a seven-year deal worth \$210 million with the Washington Nationals prior to the 2015 season. He tossed two no-hitters (one batter shy of a perfect game against the Pirates in June) and had two game scores of 97 or better, becoming the first to do that twice in a season since Pedro Martinez in 2000 - Nolan Ryan in 1990 is the only other pitcher to do so.



IAN KINSLER
4-TIME ALL-STAR

IAN KINSLER // 2B // DETROIT TIGERS

► Despite spending just one season at Mizzou, **Ian Kinsler** made quite an impact and was a star that helped lay the foundation for a Mizzou team that went to NCAA Regionals from 2003-09. His 2003 team was the first regional team at Mizzou since 1996. He was inducted into the Mizzou Athletics Hall of Fame in 2013.

► Kinsler is a four-time MLB All-Star, has twice joined the 30-30 club and was the 2014 Wilson Defensive Player of the Year winner at second base in 2014.

► He first joined the 30-30 club in 2009 and hit for the cycle that season as well. While with the Rangers, he set club records for leadoff homers and times stealing third base. He again went for 30-30 in 2011, again for the Rangers. That year, he hit a leadoff homer in each of the first two games of the season, becoming the first player to ever accomplish that feat.

► Kinsler was an All-Star in 2008, 2010, 2012 and 2014, doing so most recently with the Detroit Tigers.

► He is a lifetime .276 hitter with 184 homers, 704 RBI, 324 doubles, 942 runs scored and 197 stolen bases.



KYLE GIBSON
2015 TWINS PITCHER OF THE YEAR

KYLE GIBSON // SP // MINNESOTA TWINS

► After a successful career at Mizzou, **Kyle Gibson** was a first round draft pick in 2009, going 22nd overall to the Minnesota Twins. He made his major league debut in 2013 as Tommy John surgery slowed his progress to the major leagues.

► Serving as the Twins No. 3 starter in 2014, he had a breakout season in 2015, earning the club's Pitcher of the Year Award, tallying 11 wins and a 3.84 ERA in a team-high 194.2 innings, striking out 145 batters.

► Gibson has been touted as a possible breakout star in 2016, so he is certainly a pitcher to watch as the Twins have hopes of getting back to the postseason with Gibson heading the pitching staff.

AARON CROW // RP // CHICAGO CUBS

► **Aaron Crow** was the heir apparent to Max Scherzer and he was outstanding in college, guiding Mizzou to host the 2007 Columbia Regional. He went 23-8 with a 3.27 ERA in his college career and the highlight of his career came in 2006 when he earned his first career victory in a complete game over Pepperdine, staving off elimination in the regional round as Mizzou became the first ever #4 seed to win a regional that season.

► In 2007, Crow went 13-0 with a 2.35 ERA and was named Big 12 Pitcher of the Year with four complete game shutouts. He had a 43.1 shutout inning streak that season.

► Crow was drafted in the first round twice, going as high as ninth before electing to not sign with the Nationals in 2008. In 2006, he was drafted 12th by the Royals and wound up becoming an All-Star in 2011 with the club. He is currently rehabbing after Tommy John surgery with the Cubs.

No head coach has been at Mizzou longer than Mizzou baseball's Tim Jamieson, who will enter his 22nd season at the helm of the program in 2016. Jamieson was tasked with transitioning a team that had rose to be one of the most consistent programs in the Big 12 to a program that can compete in the premier baseball conference in America - the SEC. In 2015, Jamieson led one of the nation's top turn-around stories as Mizzou finished third in a loaded SEC East while ranking as high as No. 14 nationally. He garnered plenty of SEC Coach of the Year consideration and Mizzou Director of Athletics Mack Rhoades rewarded Jamieson with a three-year contract as the Mizzou skipper once again has his Tigers poised for another successful run through the nation's best baseball conference.

In his 21 seasons at the helm of the program, Jamieson has compiled a 675-537-2 overall record as he is the second-winningest coach in program history, trailing only Gene McArtor's 733 career wins.

2015 may have been one of the top coaching jobs in Jamieson's career, and that came as he took over as pitching coach while also serving as the head coach. Picked to finish dead last in the SEC in the preseason by virtually every preseason publication, Jamieson's team used great pitching and defense to win six of 10 SEC series, including series wins over two top-10 programs, en-route to a third-place finish in the SEC East. A talented freshman class with key upperclassmen were paramount to the success. He coached RHP Tanner Houck to Unanimous Freshman All-America honors and closer Breckin Williams was a second-team All-SEC honoree under Jamieson's tutelage. Three of his pitchers from 2015 were drafted over the summer as well.

Winning with class and high-character have been trademarks of Jamieson's tenure at Mizzou and he has done a phenomenal job of upholding the school's and the athletic department's core values during his 21 years. And he has done it while producing some of the top talent that has ever come through Mizzou - in any sport. Coaching the likes of 2013 American League Cy Young winner Max Scherzer and four-time MLB All-Star Ian Kinsler, it can be argued that Jamieson has seen more of his athletes excel at the next level than any other coach in history at Mizzou, in any sport.

That is why Jamieson is the perfect coach to lead Mizzou into its fourth year in the Southeastern Conference. His body of work speaks for itself as does his ability to groom players for the next level. He took Max Scherzer, an unpolished power arm out of St. Louis, from a high school player that was drafted in the 43rd round to a first-round draft pick. Aaron Crow, now an All-Star pitcher for the Miami Marlins went undrafted out of high school and was twice a first-round pick by the time he was done at Mizzou. Most recently, Rob Zastryzny - undrafted out of high school - was selected with the second pick of the second round by the Chicago Cubs. At the helm of one of the last decade's most consistent programs, paired with the resources that are available in the SEC, look for Jamieson to get Mizzou rolling while playing aside the best competition in the country week-in and week-out.

2012 was a memorable season for the Tiger skipper as he won his 600th career game - a 5-0 decision over Texas in the first round of the Big 12 Tournament - all while winning his first ever Big 12 Championship and guiding Mizzou to its eighth NCAA Tournament in 10 seasons.

A native of Columbia, Jamieson grew up attending several Tigers' games. After his playing days at the University of New Orleans, he spent six seasons on the UNO coaching staff before returning to Columbia in 1988 where he was an assistant coach under McArtor for six seasons before becoming head coach following the 1994 season.

Mizzou tied the game in the ninth inning on a Jake Ring (Ingleside, Ill.) single and nearly took a lead on a ball smoked to deep center by Trey Harris (Powder Springs, Ga.) in the next at bat, but it was run down for the third out. Mizzou eventually fell in extras despite the heroics in the ninth. Senior Zach Lavy (Auxvasse, Mo.) turned in a three-hit night to lead the offense and that backed a masterful start from Reggie McClain (Duluth, Ga.).

MISSOURI 2, #1 Florida 6 March 19, 2016 -- Gainesville, Fla.

Mizzou Baseball dropped game two of its series at No. 1 Florida, 6-2, on Saturday night (March 19) at McKethan Stadium. In a battle between each team's ace – Mizzou's Tanner Houck (Collinsville, Ill.) and Florida's A.J. Puk – the Gators took advantage of an early lead and a quiet Mizzou offense for the win. Houck was tagged with the loss as he falls to 2-2 while Puk moves to 1-1. Mizzou fell to 14-8 (0-2 SEC) while Florida goes to 20-1 (2-0 SEC).

Florida then added an insurance run in the eighth to pull away for the win. Mizzou fell to 14-9 (0-3 SEC) while Florida goes to 21-1 (3-0 SEC).

Senior Austin Tribby (Springfield, Mo.) was tagged with the loss after allowing five runs on five hits over 3.0 innings. Florida's Alex Faedo earned the win, despite Mizzou tagging him for a career-worst five earned runs in the win. He had allowed just four earned runs all year prior to Sunday.

MISSOURI 6, #4 Vanderbilt 8 March 25, 2016 -- Columbia, Mo.

Mizzou Baseball dropped the first game of a three-game series against No. 4 Vanderbilt, 8-6, on Friday night (March 25) at Taylor Stadium. Mizzou led 6-4 with two outs and no one on in the ninth inning, but three consecutive two-out hits tied the game and Bryan Reynolds capped off the rally with a two-run homer to center to give Vanderbilt the win. Mizzou falls to 14-10 and 0-4 in SEC play while Vanderbilt goes to 18-4 and 2-2 in SEC play.

Despite pitching well, redshirt freshman righty Liam Carter (Highland Park, Ill.) was tagged with his first career loss while Evan Steele earned the win, his first of the year, for Vanderbilt. Ben Bowden got the save. The loss squandered another great start from RHP Reggie McClain (Duluth, Ga.), who scattered eight hits over 6.1 innings while allowing four runs (all earned) with nine strikeouts and just one walk. His nine strikeouts are just two off of his career-high. McClain had a streak of 20.2 innings without a walk snapped on Friday night but still owns a 43-2 strikeout-walk ratio. He struck out six of the first eight batters he faced.

MISSOURI 0, #4 Vanderbilt 2 (11) March 26, 2016 -- Columbia, Mo.

Sophomore RHP Tanner Houck (Collinsville, Ill.) was sensational as Mizzou Baseball dropped game two of its series with No. 4 Vanderbilt, 2-0, in 11 innings on Saturday night at Taylor Stadium. Houck worked a masterful 9.0 shutout innings, allowing just two hits while striking out 14 Commodore hitters, the most strikeouts by a Tiger hitter since Kyle Gibson fanned 15 on April 3, 2009, against Oklahoma. Houck had just one fly ball leave the infield as he had 11 groundouts, one flyout and a pop up to second to go along with his 14 strikeouts. The only two hits he gave up were ground balls off the bat of Ro Coleman and one of those two was an infield hit.

Mizzou's offense certainly had its chances and likely needed just one run to escape with the win, but Mizzou went 0-for-12 with runners in scoring position on Saturday and missed multiple chances to give Houck the win. The loss drops Mizzou to 14-11 on the year and 0-5 in SEC play.

MISSOURI 7, #4 Vanderbilt 17 March 27, 2016 -- Columbia, Mo.

Mizzou Baseball lost to No. 4 Vanderbilt, 17-7, on a wet and cold Sunday afternoon at Taylor Stadium. The Commodores scored six runs in the second inning (only one earned), capitalizing on two errors, a pair of walks and a three-run homer by CF Bryan Reynolds. The six runs were scored off of Mizzou starter Austin Tribby (Springfield, Mo.), who falls to 2-3 on the season. Junior SS Ryan Howard (St. Charles, Mo.) and junior OF Kirby McGuire (Round Rock, Texas) each had RBI singles in the loss, McGuire's being a two-run single for this first career Division I RBIs. Zach Lavy (Auxvasse, Mo.) also hit his third homer of the season, a three-run shot, in the ninth inning, giving him a team-high 20 RBI. Vanderbilt took advantage of two Mizzou errors, two walks and two hits – one hit being a three-run homer by Bryan Reynolds – to score six runs in the second inning, knocking Tribby from the game after just 1.2 innings. Only one of the six runs that Tribby allowed was earned as he left the game allowing three hits and two walks while striking out one.

MISSOURI 6, #15 Arkansas 7 April 1, 2016 -- Fayetteville, Ark.

A four-run, five-hit sixth inning helped No. 15 Arkansas rally to defeat Mizzou Baseball, 7-6, on Friday night (April 1) at Baum Stadium. The loss drops Mizzou to 15-13 on the year and 0-7 in SEC play while Arkansas goes to 19-7 and 4-3 in SEC play. Senior RHP Reggie McClain (Duluth, Ga.) took the loss after going 5.1 innings, allowing nine hits and six runs (all earned) with five strikeouts and one walk.

Mizzou opened a 3-0 lead in the second inning and had the bases loaded with no outs in the frame and failed to add more runs. Arkansas then rallied late with four runs in the sixth and one more in the seventh to stretch the lead to 7-3. Mizzou scored three in the ninth on a pair of homers, but Mizzou stranded the tying run on second in the ninth. Doug Willey earned the win for Arkansas, his first of the season, and Zach Jackson picked up his fourth save.

MISSOURI 8, #15 Arkansas 5 April 2, 2016 -- Fayetteville, Ark.

Mizzou Baseball hung on for an 8-5 win over No. 15 Arkansas on Saturday night (April 2) at Baum Stadium. Mizzou used a big four-run fourth inning and tremendous work out of the bullpen from senior LHP Austin Tribby (Springfield, Mo.) to improve to 16-13 (1-7 SEC) on the season. Junior SS Ryan Howard (St. Charles, Mo.) went 1-for-3 with three RBI, two walks and a run and had a big two-run double to open the scoring in the first inning to lead the offense. All of that backed a solid start by sophomore RHP Tanner Houck (Collinsville, Ill.), who earned his third win of the season.

In all, Mizzou's 2-through-5 hitters drove in seven of eight runs as LF Trey Harris (Powder Springs, Ga.) also drove in a pair. Jake Ring (Ingleside, Ill.) and Zach Lavy (Auxvasse, Mo.) each drove in runs and each added two hits. Mizzou hit four doubles, a triple and a homer on Saturday as six of its 11 hits went for extra bases.

Mizzou opened a 6-0 lead before Arkansas rallied for three to cut into the lead at 7-5. But Mizzou got a big insurance run in the eighth inning and Tribby was lights out, earning his first save after tossing 1.2 innings, allowing just one hit with three strikeouts.

MISSOURI 10, #15 Arkansas 1 April 3, 2016 -- Fayetteville, Ark.

Mizzou Baseball scored four runs in both the fourth and eighth innings to earn a 10-1 win over No. 15 Arkansas on Sunday afternoon (April 3) to claim its first SEC series win of the season. The series win is Mizzou's first road series win over a top-20 team since March 29, 2014, when Mizzou took two of three at Auburn. The Tigers improve to 17-13 overall and 2-7 in SEC play.

Mizzou scored four runs in the fourth inning, sending nine batters to the plate, to gain the early lead. Arkansas attempted to rally with one run in the seventh but it could have been more. With runners on second and third, Carson Shaddy roped a ball into right center, but Jake Ring (Ingleside, Ill.) made the catch of the season, diving and back-handing the ball inches above the grass for out No. 3. Mizzou then used that momentum to score four in the top of the eighth, highlighted by Kirby McGuire's (Round Rock, Texas) first Division I homer, a three-run shot to left, to put the game away.

The game was tied 4-4 going into the seventh, but LSU scored five runs in the frame with four coming on a grand slam by Beau Jordan to take a 9-4 lead. LSU tagged Mizzou starter Tanner Houck (Collinsville, Ill.) for a career-high eight runs and five walks as he took the loss, his third of the season. Mizzou falls to 20-17 and 4-10 in SEC play this season.

LSU's Alex Lange earned the win, his third of the season. LSU improves to 24-11 and 8-6 in SEC play. Senior 1B Zach Lavy (Auxvasse, Mo.) extended his hitting streak to a career-long nine games, the longest streak by a Tiger this season. MISSOURI 4, Georgia 7 May 14, 2016 -- Columbia, Mo.

Mizzou dropped game one, 7-4, despite leading 4-3 after five innings. Georgia scored four runs over the seventh, eighth and ninth innings as they came back for the win. Mizzou sophomore Cole Bartlett (Williamsburg, Ind.) took the loss, allowing three runs (two earned) on four hits as he falls to 3-5 on the year. UGA reliever Kevin Smith earned the win as he went to 5-1 on the year.

MISSOURI 5, Georgia 0 May 14, 2016 -- Columbia, Mo.

Mizzou got a complete game shutout from senior RHP Reggie McClain (Duluth, Ga.) and a grand slam from senior 1B Zach Lavy (Auxvasse, Mo.) in a 5-0 win to even the series on senior day. McClain pitched a gem in game two, allowing just three hits and a walk while matching a career-high with 12 strikeouts. It was his first complete game shutout against an SEC team and it came against the school with which he began his collegiate career. It was the second complete game shutout of his career and it was the first at Mizzou since Tanner Houck (Collinsville, Ill.) did so against Auburn on April 8, 2016. McClain clung to a 1-0 lead after a sixth inning homer from Jake Ring (Ingleside, Ill.), but Lavy gave him the insurance he needed in the eighth inning, launching a fastball over the fence for Mizzou's first grand slam since March 30, 2010, by Eric Garcia against Purdue.

MISSOURI 2, Georgia 5 May 15, 2016 -- Columbia, Mo.

Mizzou Baseball got a solo homer from senior 1B Zach Lavy (Auxvasse, Mo.) who continued his stellar season, but Mizzou fell, 5-2, in the rubber game against Georgia Sunday (May 15) at Taylor Stadium. Georgia starter Heath Holder was tremendous, earning his fourth win of the season after going 7.0 innings, allowing just four hits with nine strikeouts. He was also able to pitch around five walks. Mizzou starter Michael Plassmeyer (St. Louis, Mo.) picked up the loss after going 4.2 innings, allowing seven hits and two runs while walking none and striking out five.

Georgia got on the board in the top of the fourth on a no-doubt homer by catcher Micahel Curry, his third of the series and 11th of the season. UGA then tacked on another run in the fifth on a two-out RBI single by Skyler Weber, scoring Mitchell Webb, who had struck out to lead off the frame but reached on a wild pitch. That chased Plassmeyer from the game.

Mizzou Baseball used a barrage of two-out hits to defeat Kentucky, 9-3, in the series opener Thursday night (May 19) at Cliff Hagan Field. After going on top, 1-0, with a two-out RBI single in the fourth, Mizzou tallied five two-out hits to score four more runs in the fifth inning to break the game open. That was all the run support that Mizzou starter Tanner Houck (Collinsville, Ill.) needed as he tossed a complete game with eight hits and three earned runs while striking out nine with just one walk to earn his fifth win of the year. He did all of that on just four day's rest.

Kentucky's Zack Brown took the loss, his 11th of the season, as Mizzou tagged him for 12 hits over 7.0-plus innings with eight runs (all earned) while walking three and striking out four. The Tigers pounded out 14 hits, their most in SEC play as five players tallied multi-hit games. Mizzou moves to 26-27 on the year and moves closer to an SEC Tournament berth as its SEC record now stands at 9-19 on the year.

Two infield hits came around to score in the bottom of the sixth inning and that backed UK starter Dustin Beggs, who went 8.0 innings shutout innings, scattering just six hits with two walks and six strikeouts in his ninth win of the year.

MISSOURI 2, Kentucky 7

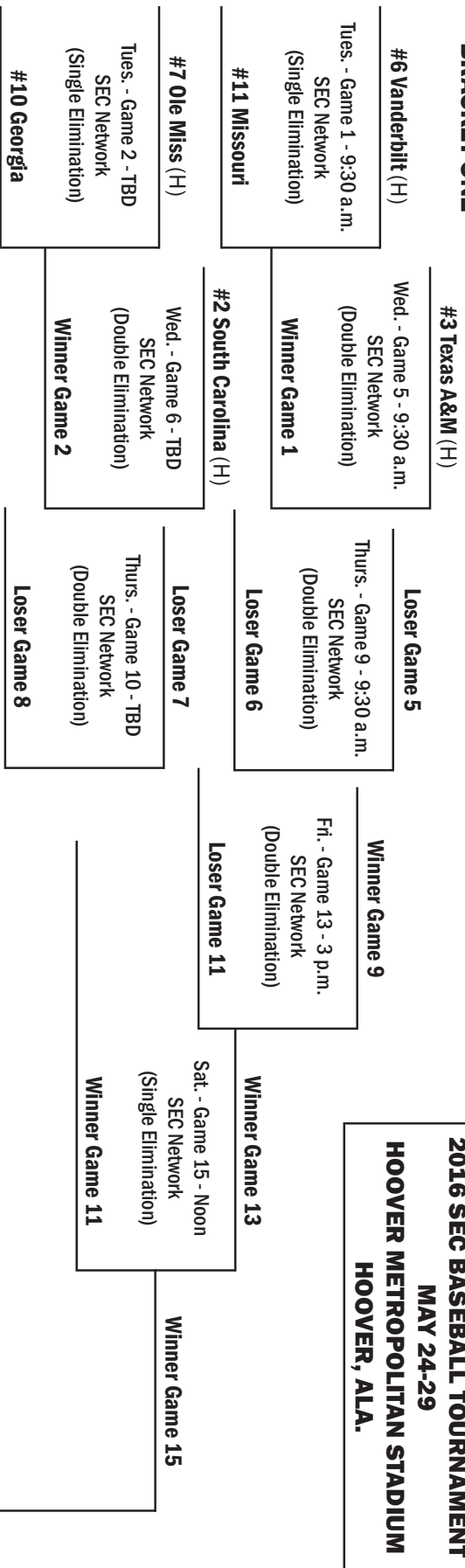
May 21, 2016 -- Lexington, Ky.
