MACHADO SANTOS SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- Mizzou Tennis junior **Beia Machado Santos** was selected as an at-large bid to the 2016 NCAA Division I Women's Tennis Championships, becoming **the first Mizzou player to qualify for the NCAA Tournament since 2003** when Urska Juric competed in the singles and doubles tournament (with Katka Sevcikova).
- The Tiger junior was named to the **Second-Team All-SEC** on April 27, joining Cierra Gayton-Leach (2014) as the only members of Mizzou Tennis to be named to an All-SEC team.
- The Lisbon, Portugal was awarded the **International Tennis Association/Arthur Ashe Leadership and Sportsmanship Award for the central region** on May 9. The award dates back to 1982, is awarded at each level of NCAA Tennis (Division I, II, III, NIAA, and JUCO) and is given to players to have "exhibited outstanding sportsmanship and leadership as well as scholastic, extracurricular and tennis achievements." Santos is one of 12 recipients to receive the award at the Division I level.
- Machado Santos has contributed solid production at the **No. 1 singles position, producing an 14-9 record** at the position and a 15-9 overall singles record in the spring season.
- **Six wins over ranked opponents and five SEC wins**, both team highs.
- Currently ranked **No. 53 in the Oracle/ITA Collegiate Tennis Singles Rankings**. Santos entered the rankings on March 8 and has remained ranked ever since, ranking as high as No. 53 in the April 26 and May 5 polls.
- Machado Santos **defeated now two-time SEC Player of the Year Brooke Austin (Florida) on March 5**, who is currently ranked No. 4 in the nation. The win was Austin's only SEC loss of the season.
- Has played a vital role in Mizzou Tennis' best season in over a decade, where the **Tigers reached 16 wins, the most wins in program history since 2004-05**. Mizzou also **started the season 7-0, the best start in program history since 2002-03**.

2015-16

- **Bea Machado Santos** was selected to compete in the NCAA Singles Championship following a 21-16 singles record.
- Machado Santos posted a 15-9 record in the dual season and a 14-9 record at the No. 1 position.
- The Tiger junior defeated six ranked opponents over the season.



SANTOS WINS ITA/ARTHUR ASHE LEADERSHIP AND SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD

Mizzou Tennis junior **Bea Machado Santos** is the recipient of the International Tennis Association/Arthur Ashe Leadership and Sportsmanship Award for the central region, it was announced by the conference office on Monday. Last week, Santos was selected to the 2016 NCAA Division I Women's Tennis Championships, becoming the first representative from Mizzou to compete in the National Tournament since 2003.

The award dates back to 1982, is awarded at each level of NCAA Tennis (Division I, II, III, NAIA, and JUCO) and is given to players to have "exhibited outstanding sportsmanship and leadership as well as scholastic, extracurricular and tennis achievements." Santos is one of 12 recipients to receive the award at the Division I level. National awards winners will be announced Tuesday, May 24.

The Portugal native has posted 97 wins in her career, including an impressive 52-28 mark in doubles play. Santos recorded six wins over opponents currently ranked in the ITA Collegiate Tennis Singles Rankings this season and was named to the Second Team All-SEC on April 27. Off the court, Santos is very active around the Columbia community, volunteering for the Susan G. Komen Race for the Cure, Girl Scouts Love Yourself Day, Mizzou Moves, the Food Bank, and Caleb's Pitch.




SANTOS NAMED TO SECOND-TEAM ALL-SEC

Mizzou Tennis junior **Bea Machado Santos** was named second-team All-SEC, announced by the conference office on Wednesday. Santos is the first Tiger to earn the honor since Cierra Gayton-Leach was named second-team All-SEC following the 2014 season.

Santos has flourished in her second year in black and gold, posting a 14-9 mark at the No. 1 position and a 15-9 mark overall in singles play over the dual season. Santos has been ranked in five of nine ITA Collegiate Tennis Singles Rankings polls, ranking as high as No. 53 on April 19. In doubles play, Santos has been ranked in five of nine polls, posting an 8-4 mark at the No. 1 position with senior Kelli Hine and a 10-11 mark overall at the position over the spring season.

The Portugal native has enjoyed success against the nation's best this season, owning six wins over opponents currently ranked in the ITA Top-125. Santos' highest ranked win of the season came on March 5 in a win over reigning SEC Player of the Year Brooke Austin (Florida), currently ranked No. 3 in the nation. Austin's only SEC loss of the dual season came to the hands of Santos, who also owns wins over Andie Dikosavljevic (Auburn, No. 20), Arianne Hartono (Ole Miss, No. 33), Sadie Hammond (Tennessee, No. 51), Justina Mikulskyte (Kentucky, No. 79) and Allison Miller (Notre Dame, No. 115).

The California native has had a very positive effect on the Columbia community since coming on campus prior to the 2013-14 school year, volunteering at the Thompson Center for Autism, Mid-Missouri Food Bank, and Susan G. Komen for the Cure. Spearman has also helped organize a blanket drive and teach at tennis clinics, along with being involved with Mizzou Moves, Tiger Treat, Starlight Reading, Caleb's Pitch, and Girl Scout Love Yourself Day.

Spearman was named team captain prior to the beginning of the season and has recorded 29 wins on the court this season, 18 in doubles play and 11 in singles play.

HINE SHINES ON SENIOR DAY AS MIZZOU DEFEATS OLE MISS

In her final match at the Mizzou Tennis Complex on senior day, senior **Kelli Hine** picked up two wins to help Mizzou defeat Ole Miss, 4-3, on April 16. Also securing two wins on the day was junior **Brittany Lashway**, who clinched the match on court five with a win over Tea Jandric in a marathon match which lasted nearly two hours. Mizzou now owns 16 wins on the season, which stands alone as the fourth most victories in season in program history. Mizzou also recorded its third SEC win of the season, the most wins in conference play since joining the league prior to the 2012-13 season.

Mizzou took the doubles point following wins on courts two and three. Brittany Lashway and junior Cassidy Spearman (Laguna Niguel, Calif.) earned the first win of the day at the No. 3 position with a commanding win, 6-2, over Zalina Khairudinova and Marija Milutinovic. In fitting fashion, Hine was serving when her and doubles partner sophomore Clare Raley (Atlanta, Ga.) clinched the doubles point for the Tigers, defeating Allie Sanford and Natalie Yuk, 6-4. After an Ole Miss return off the Hine serve, Raley snuck a shot past the Rebels on the right side of the court for the final point to give Mizzou the 1-0 lead.

Ole Miss took the lead in singles play, jumping out to a 3-1 lead after wins on courts three, four, and six. Hine notched her second win of the day with a straight sets win, 6-3, 7-6 (4), at the No. 2 position over No. 80 Natalie Yuk. Hine started the second set down 3-0, but worked her way back into the set to force the tiebreaker, then clinch the match, 7-4 in the tiebreaker. The win marked Hine's second win over a ranked opponent this season and 110th overall career victory. At the No. 1 position, junior Bea Machado Santos (Lisbon, Portugal) knotted the score at 3-3 following a 3-6, 6-3, 7-5, victory over No. 22 Arianna Hartono. Santos trailed 5-3 in the final set, but came back to win the final four games to take the match. The win was Santos' sixth win over a ranked opponent this season. The match came down to court five, with Brittany Lashway pitted against Jandric. Lashway dropped the first set, 7-5, then needed extra time to take the second set, winning the tiebreaker, 7-4, to take the second set, 7-6. With momentum on her side, Lashway cruised to the third set victory, 6-2, to clinch the match for Mizzou.

MIZZOU COMPLETES COMEBACK, DEFEATS TENNESSEE TO REACH 15 WINS

Mizzou rallied to win the last three singles matches of the day to defeat Tennessee, 4-3, on March 31 in Knoxville, Tenn. After falling behind, 3-1, Mizzou picked up wins from junior **Cassidy Spearman**, sophomore **Clare Raley**, and junior **Bea Machado Santos** in singles play to secure the comeback. Santos (ranked No. 72 in singles) clinched the match for the Tigers, defeating No. 42 ranked Sadie Hammond, 6-4, 6-7, 6-1.

The win marks the first time since the 2004-05 season Mizzou has posted 15 wins and is tied for the fourth most wins all-time in program history. Santos defeated her third ranked opponent this season with the win over Hammond, improving to 3-4 against ranked opponents.

Mizzou fell behind early, surrendering the doubles points following Tennessee wins at the No. 1 and 3 positions. All three matches were tightly contested, as Tennessee won 7-5 on court one and three, while the score on court two was 6-5 when play was stopped. Tennessee picked up wins at the No. 2 and 4 positions early in singles play to gain a 3-1 lead. Mizzou first got on the scoreboard following a 6-4, 7-5, win at the No. 3 position from sophomore **Brianna Lashway**. Lashway improved to 7-4 at the No. 3 position in spring play with the victory. The final three matches, which Mizzou need to win each match to ensure the victory, all went to the decisive third set. After dropping the first set, Raley fought back to take the last two sets, defeating Ashley Bongart, 3-6, 6-4, 6-4 at the No. 6 position. Spearman won set one, 6-4, before dropping the second set, 5-7, to Tiffany Tavares at the No. 5 position. Spearman was not to be outdone in the third set, winning, 6-4, leaving the match to be decided by the winner at the No. 1 position. In a battle between two ranked competitors, Santos took the first set, 6-4, before Hammond took the second set following a tiebreaker, 6-7 (3-7). Santos decided against a nail-biting third set, dominating Hammond, 6-1, in the final set to take the match and clinch the victory for Mizzou.



MIZZOU EARNS FIRST SEC WIN OF THE SEASON OVER ALABAMA

Mizzou Tennis won its first Southeastern conference match of the season over Alabama, 4-3 in a fiercely competitive match on March 20 at the Mizzou Tennis Complex. Sophomore **Clare Raley** clinched the match in the final match to finish on the day, 7-6, 6-3, over Aryn Greene at the No. 6 position. Junior **Cassidy Spearman** and junior **Brittany Lashway** earned the first doubles victory of the match at the No. 3 position, winning 6-2 over Alabama's Danielle Spielmann and Joanna Nene Savva. Junior **Bea Machado Santos** and sophomore **Brianna Lashway** clinched the doubles point at the No. 1 position, defeating the No. 32-ranked doubles pair in the country, Erin Routliffe and Andie Daniell, 6-4. Senior **Kelli Hine** earned the first singles point of the day for Mizzou out of the No. 2 position, defeating No. 31-ranked Andie Daniell. Hine won the first set 6-2 before a competitive second set where Hine saw her work her way back from a 1-5 deficit to force a tiebreaker. After losing the tiebreaker, she managed to win the third set, 6-3, to take the set and the match. Spearman won her match in straight sets, 6-1, 7-5, over Spielmann at the No. 5 position. With the score tied 3-3, all eyes fell on the deciding match of the day between sophomore Raley and Greene. The Tiger sophomore won the hotly contested opening set, 7-6 (7-5), then took the next set, 6-3, to clinch the victory for Mizzou.

SANTOS ENTERS ORACLE/ITA COLLEGIATE SINGLES RANKINGS AT NO. 98

Following a win over the No. 12-ranked singles player in the nation, junior **Bea Machado Santos** was ranked in the Oracle/ITA Collegiate Tennis Singles Rankings, coming in at No. 98, announced on March 8. After not previously being ranked, Santos jumped 27 spots (ITATennis.com ranks the top-125 singles players) to the No. 98 slot, the first ranking of her career. The Tiger junior has posted a 17-9 record in singles play this season, including an 11-2 mark during the spring season and a 10-2 mark at the No. 1 position. On March 5, Santos recorded her first win over a ranked opponent this season, defeating Florida's No. 12-ranked Brooke Austin, 6-4, 4-6, 1-0 (8). Santos outlasted the reigning SEC Player of the Year in a thrilling three-set match, winning the tiebreaker third set, 10-8.

MIZZOU ENTERS ORACLE/ITA COLLEGIATE TENNIS RANKINGS AT NO. 57

Mizzou Tennis (12-1) entered the national rankings for the first time in two years, coming in at No. 57 of the Oracle/ITA Collegiate Tennis Rankings, announced by the publication on March 1. The ranking is the first time the Tigers have been ranked in the nation's top-75 since Feb. 11, 2014, when Mizzou was ranked No. 74 and is the highest ranking since the Tigers were ranked No. 56 on April 16, 2013. The Tigers will begin Southeastern Conference play with a record of 12-1, the highest win total in program history since 2005 when Mizzou won 15 matches.

OF NOTE

HINE GETS WIN NO. 100

Senior Kelli Hine recorded her 100th career victory on Feb. 19 in a 6-1, 6-0, singles win over Mercer's Xandra Fougner at the No. 2 position. The Tigers' lone senior maintains an overall career record of 103-82, posting a 56-46 mark in singles play and 47-36 in doubles action. Of Hine's 103 wins, 90 have come at Mizzou (87.3 percent), with 13 coming in 2012-13 at Texas Tech.

HINE & SANTOS RANKED NO. 46 IN ITA DOUBLES RANKINGS

For the second time this season, the Mizzou Tennis doubles team of senior **Kelli Hine** and junior **Bea Machado Santos** is ranked in the Oracle/ITA Division I Women's Doubles Rankings by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association, announced on Feb. 23. Hine and Santos enter the rankings at No. 46 with a record of 15-5, including an 8-2 mark at the No. 1 position in spring play. The duo was ranked No. 56 in the Jan. 5 edition of the rankings before falling out of the Feb. 10 edition. The team is also ranked No. 4 in the central region rankings announced on Jan. 5.

DOUBLE SHUTOUT

Mizzou Tennis picked up two nonconference wins on Feb. 19, defeating Savannah State, 7-0, and Mercer, 4-0.

Mizzou picked up the doubles point over Savannah State after wins at the No. 2 and 3 positions, both by a score of 6-0. Sophomore **Brianna Lashway** and junior **Cassidy Spearman** picked the win at the No. 2 position and junior **Brittany Lashway** and sophomore **Clare Raley** at the No. 3 position. The Tigers finished off the sweep of Savannah State in singles play, taking each match in straight sets. Senior **Kelli Hine** played a close match with Elizabeth Geronimo at No. 2, but narrowly pulled out the 6-3, 7-5 win. Newly added walk-on **Kadi Fauble** played in her first match as a Tiger at No. 6 singles, defeating Tiffany Williams, 6-1, 6-0. Mizzou's No. 2 and 3 doubles team each earned their second victories of the day in doubles play against Mercer to win the doubles point. Brianna Lashway and Spearman won 6-1, yielding only one game on the day in their two doubles victories. In singles play, the Tigers picked up three wins to clinch the match. Hine, Brianna Lashway, and Brittany Lashway won matches at No. 2, 3, and 5, respectively. Hine made quick work of Xandra Fougner, 6-1, 6-0, to remain perfect on the spring season in singles play, improving to 11-0.

TIGERS MATCH BEST START IN PROGRAM HISTORY WITH WIN OVER KANSAS STATE

Mizzou Tennis defeated Kansas State, 5-2, on Feb. 10. The victory improved the team's record to 7-0, tied for the best start in program history (2002-03). The Tigers won the doubles point for the match without taking a defeat. The No. 2 pair, junior **Cassidy Spearman** and sophomore **Brianna Lashway**, teamed up for a 6-4 victory. At the No. 3 position, junior **Brittany Lashway** and sophomore **Clare Raley** won their match, 6-3. In singles, junior **Bea Machado Santos** and senior **Kelli Hine** both won in straight sets. Santos took her match 6-4, 6-3, over Sara Castellano while Hine dominated Carolina Costamagna for a 6-1, 6-1 victory. After losing her opening set, Brianna Lashway won the next two sets to clinch the match for the Tigers, defeating Anna Garcia Navas, 4-6, 6-3, 6-2. At the No. 4 position, playing in her first singles match of the dual season, Spearman defeated Iva Bago, 6-3, 2-6, 6-2.

2016 RECRUITING CLASS RANKED NO. 22 BY TENNISRECRUITING.NET

Mizzou Tennis' fall signing class of **Tate Schroeder** (Denver, Colo.) and **Mackenzey Middlebrooks** (Fort Lauderdale, Fla.) was selected as the No. 22-ranked recruiting class in the nation in the 2016 Winter Rankings by TennisRecruiting.net, as announced on Feb. 1. Both of Mizzou's recruits are ranked top-50 individually among high school seniors and have received a five-star ranking by the top recruiting website. The Tigers were one of five SEC teams to be ranked in the 2016 Winter Rankings, with LSU, Alabama, Florida and Auburn also appearing in the top-25. Schroeder, ranked No. 32 among seniors by TennisRecruiting.net, captured the 2014 5A State Championship in Colorado before joining the IMG Academy in Florida. The Tiger-commit recently competed in the USTA National Winter Championships in Scottsdale, Ariz., where she posted a 7-2 record. Schroeder is currently 24-13 in prep competition with a 6-2 record against fellow five-star recruits. Middlebrooks, ranked No. 41 among seniors by TennisRecruiting.net, won the Florida State Double Tournament in September and is currently playing for the Blackman Tennis Academy. Middlebrooks owns a 21-15 record this season, including a 9-0 record against four-star recruits. The two Mizzou Tennis commits will join current Tigers sophomore **Clare Raley** (Atlanta, Ga.) and freshman **Turner Yates** (Jackson, Miss.) as top-50 recruits to sign with the Tigers. Raley was Mizzou's first ever top-50 recruit. Schroeder and Middlebrooks will begin their careers in black and gold for the 2016 fall semester and will look to contribute immediately.

Entering her fifth year at the helm for Mizzou Tennis, Sasha Schmid continues to build success for the Tigers program both on-and-off the court. The Tigers have posted a 38-63 overall record in Schmid's first four years in Columbia. Now inside one of the top collegiate tennis conferences in the SEC, which featured 12 NCAA Tournament teams and the eventual NCAA Champion (Vanderbilt) in 2015, the Tigers continue to face fierce competition each fall and spring season.

The 2014-15 season started off hot as Mizzou won seven of its first nine matches to begin the spring season. The Tigers didn't lose a single team point in five of those seven victories. Mizzou's campaign ended on a high note as Schmid's squad knocked off Arkansas in the opening round of the SEC Tournament. The Tigers toppled the Razorbacks 4-3 in a dramatic comeback. Down 3-1, freshman Clare Raley, sophomore Bea Machado Santos and junior Madison Rhyner won three consecutive singles matches to deliver the win. After the season, the Tigers were named an ITA All-American Team for having a combined GPA of 3.2 or above.

This past 2013-14 campaign, Mizzou had a pair of program firsts inside the Southeastern Conference (SEC), including their first conference win over Mississippi State on April 11, 2014 and their first SEC Tournament win over Arkansas on April 16, 2014. Under Schmid's guidance, Cierra Gaytan-Leach was named to the 2014 All-SEC second team, marking the first time a Tigers tennis player earned All-Conference honors since 2005.

Heading in to the 2012-13 season, Mizzou was ranked in the preseason polls to start the year for the first time since 2005. The Tigers would go on to defeat four ranked squads during that year, including a 4-3 win over No. 23 Tennessee on Mar. 31, 2013. Of the team's 12 losses that season, 11 came against ranked opponents, including four to top-10 squads and six to programs ranked within the top-25.

The 2011-12 Tigers posted an 11-12 record and narrowly missed the NCAA Tournament, while facing a difficult schedule that included 15 matches against ranked teams. Over the course of the spring season, Mizzou reached as high as 42nd in the national rankings, the program's highest recognition since 2003. The Tigers earned five wins over ranked foes and earned their first-ever appearance in the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) Kick-Off Weekend. Additionally, the doubles duo of Tigers' Jamie Mera and Nina Pantic finished the season ranked as the 50th-best doubles team in the nation.

Schmid was named Mizzou's tennis coach on April 26, 2011, following a highly successful 10-year run as head coach at Stetson University. During her tenure at Stetson, Schmid posted an 132-101 overall record, including an impressive 35 combined wins over her last two seasons in DeLand, Fla. The Hatters tennis program tied the school season win total in 2010 with 18 victories, and followed with another impressive 2011 campaign which saw them claim 17 more wins. Stetson went 49-21 overall under Schmid's guidance the last three seasons (2009-11).

In 2009, Schmid earned her third overall and second consecutive Atlantic Sun Conference Coach of the Year award after her Hatters went 14-8 overall and 8-1 in Atlantic Sun conference play. The impressive campaign earned the team a share of the regular season championship and the top seed heading into that year's conference tournament. Stetson advanced to the tournament finals for the third time in their last five years.

Also while at Stetson, Schmid served as the chairperson of both the ITA Southeast Regional Committee and Atlantic Sun Women's Tennis Coaches Committee, and a member of the ITA National Coaches Committee. In 2007, she received the USTA Florida Section Community Service Award, and coached the Florida Section 18U Girls Team at the Federation Cup in Summer 2007.

Overall, Schmid coached 42 Atlantic Sun All-Academic honorees, 19 ITA All-America Academic Award winners, 20 Atlantic Sun All-Conference performers, and 11 Atlantic Sun All-Freshmen Team selections, including 2007 and 2010 Atlantic-Sun Freshmen of the Year Valentina Galbarini and Carolina de los Santos, respectively.

From 1998-2000, Schmid served as an assistant coach for the Iowa women's tennis team. She was responsible for recruiting, team travel, booster correspondence, and organizing free tennis clinics sponsored by the women's tennis team. During the 1999 Hawkeyes season, Schmid helped the team reach the Sweet 16 in their first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance. Iowa also returned to NCAA's the following year in 2000.

In 1996-97, Schmid served as the assistant women's tennis coach at Northwestern University. She was responsible for recruiting, organizing team travel and maintaining the program's budget. A 1996 graduate of the University of Iowa, Schmid was a four-year letterwinner on the Hawkeyes tennis team. A mainstay at the team's No. 1 and No. 2 singles spot, Schmid earned the team's Most Valuable Player Award her senior year.

Schmid earned her Juris Doctorate degree from the University of Iowa in Dec. 1999, and gained her Bar Admission from the State of Iowa in Feb. 2000. In addition to her coaching, Schmid teaches Sport Law in the Applied Sport Psychology Master's Program at the University of Missouri.

Schmid's husband, Jeff, is a teaching professional at Perche Creek Golf Club and was a volunteer assistant coach for the Mizzou men's golf team for the 2012-13 season. Sasha and Jeff have two daughters, Lucy and Lily.
