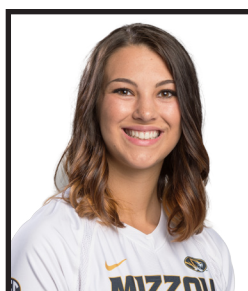

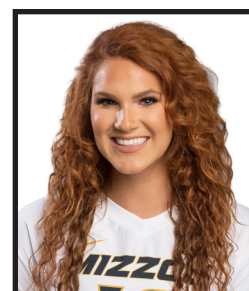

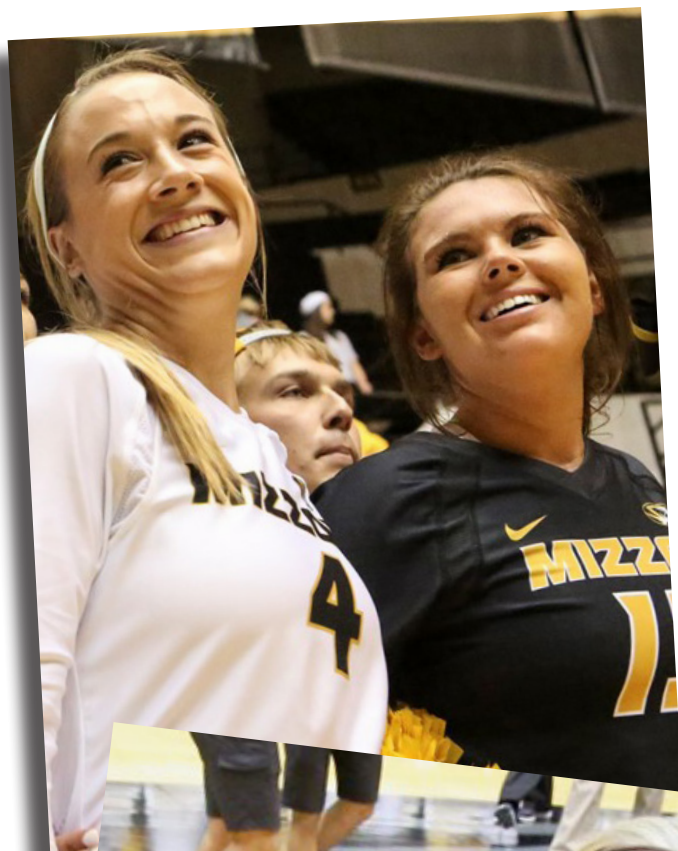

Since Wayne and Susan Kreklow took over the Mizzou volleyball program in 2000, the Tigers have reached the NCAA Tournament in 12 of the past 16 seasons. They are just one of 22 teams nationally to accomplish that feat.

From 2000-07, Mizzou volleyball saw its program rise to new heights and gain national prominence. Each season, the Tigers battled their way to the NCAA Tournament and saw unrivaled support from its fan base during home matches at the historic Hearnes Center.

The Tigers spent a program-record 78 weeks ranked among the nation's Top 25, have posted 340 wins in the past 16 seasons, averaging at least 20 wins per campaign. Mizzou has also seen 11 student-athletes honored as All-Americans and 39 All-Conference honorees, including 17 First Team members.

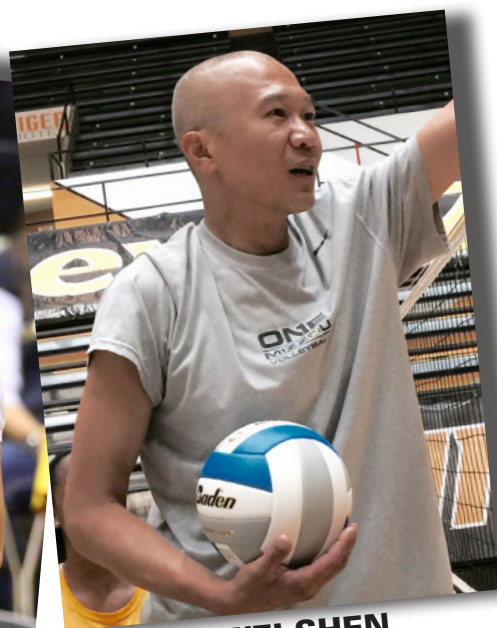

Matchdays at Hearnese have an excitement that is unmatched. From the first serve through the post-match autograph sessions, to the Point Mizzou Band, VolleyZou student section and the Kreklow Krazies, an electric atmosphere exists each night at the Hearnese Center.

For the past 14 seasons, Mizzou has finished in the Top 25 national attendance figures. In fact, the Tigers have 12 Top 20 national attendance numbers, and four Top 10 totals since 2002.

The program's most highly attended season came in 2013, as the team went 34-0 and claimed Mizzou's first ever SEC Championship. On Nov. 22, 2013 - the SEC clinching match - the Tigers took home the crown in front of a school-record 7,879 fans, the first of two 7,000+ crowds that magical season.



What They Are Saying ...

"I don't think the fans ever allowed us to get back in it. The fans were outstanding, and when we got down, they helped keep us down. We were not able to get back into the groove at all, and that's not to say what they were doing on the court wasn't terrific too, but we just didn't get our game faces on. The fans were outstanding keeping them motivated and keeping them into it. The most frustrating thing is to not be able to get control of things on our side of the net."

TIGERS' LIFE AT THE MATC

As part of Missouri's continued growth into the new millenium, the \$16 million expansion of the old training center gave way to the brand new Mizzou Athletics Training Complex (MATC), a state-of-the-art training facility that elevates Mizzou to one of the top programs in the nation.

With more than 1,000 square feet of total space, amenities can be found around each corner of the top-notch facility. Serving as an multi-purpose building, the MATC's main function is to cater to a student-athlete's every need. From expansive weight rooms to studying and tutoring areas, to dining halls and sports medicine facilities, the MATC meets the full individual needs of each student-athlete.

After its unveiling in 2006, the MATC was immediately heralded as one of the top facilities of its kind amongst major Division I programs across the nation. The MATC houses the strength & conditioning program in the Yeckel Training Center, the Sells Family Dining Hall for all student-athletes and it's home to the Total Person Program, Mizzou Athletics' very own academic and career advising department. The MATC also houses the Shelden Academic Resource Center. The next eight pages will take an in-depth look at each of the areas housed within the one-of-a-kind Mizzou Athletics Training Complex.



STRENGTH & CONDITIONING

Before the Tigers hit the court, they hit the weight room with the Mizzou Strength & Conditioning Staff. All student-athletes work out in the new Yeckel Training Center as part of the renovated MATC. The brand new facility boasts nearly 15,000 square feet of training space.

The facility features a 4,000 square-foot balcony covered with turf. Here the Mizzou staff conducts pre-workout warm-ups as well as some testing as the turf is lined in five-yard increments. The balcony also features a cardio theatre with 10 flat-screen LCD televisions that are suspended from the ceiling and sit directly in front of the cardio equipment at the edge of the balcony overlooking the main floor. Here athletes and staff can bring headphones to plug into receivers on the cardio equipment and listen to any of the 10 televisions or tune into one of 10 pre-programmed radio stations.

Another feature of the new Yeckel Training Center is the addition of the Nutrition Oasis located on the main floor. Here student-athletes are able to pick up their NCAA-compliant Gatorade post-workout nutrition shake as well as a variety of Balance Bars. Fluid replacement is also addressed with a Gatorade hydration station with three flavors of Gatorade and water. The area is also equipped with industrial use blenders and fruit / juice options for student-athletes to enjoy fresh smoothies. The weight room equipment has been upgraded with over \$300,000 in additions and replacements from Hammer Strength and Life Fitness.

The goal of the Missouri strength & conditioning program is to improve each team's athleticism, further developing the strength, speed and quickness while increasing their agility and explosiveness. Additionally, all staff members educate their athletes on proper recovery methods to maximize the intense work on the field and in the weight room. Each of the full-time staff members in the Missouri strength & conditioning program is a certified strength & conditioning coach.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Mizzou Athletics is committed to the success of student-athletes both on-and-off the court. Since 1986, Missouri has developed the Total Person Program (TPP), which focuses on the total development of a Tiger student-athlete. The program has been so successful that other universities across the country have created similar programs, using Mizzou's model. The TPP demonstrates Mizzou's dedication to developing the student-athlete intellectually, socially, emotionally, as well as physically. Mizzou cares about the pressures and special needs of student-athletes, and the TPP provides assistance and support.

The Sheldon Academic Resource Center underwent a recent renovation, nearly doubling academic space to more than 10,000 square feet, houses the TPP. The \$16 million expansion project, completed in Jan. 2007, includes staff offices for the academic coordinators, a quiet study area, more than 25 individual/group tutoring rooms, and the Miller Computer Lab. Sheldon provides a quiet, conducive atmosphere for student-athletes to study and meet with tutors and staff members.

The Miller Computer Lab houses 50 Dell computer workstations with flat screens and Microsoft Office XP, as well as ready access to the Internet, including wireless capability. Many courses at Mizzou provide notes and outlines online; the computer lab allows students to download and print notes and research materials. The lab is staffed with experienced, knowledgeable, and helpful monitors to assist with student-athletes' questions.

McElroy, M.D. Sports Medicine Center. The spacious 9,000-square foot center is located inside the new MATC. The MATC serves as the cornerstone of the four intercollegiate health care facilities at Mizzou, allowing the sports medicine staff to accomplish its mission statement: "To provide the best possible health care for all University of Missouri student-athletes while promoting an atmosphere conducive to the education of student-athletic trainers." Content to serve in a "behind the scenes" role, the sports medicine team is truly an integral part of the success of Missouri's intercollegiate athletic program.

The University of Missouri athletic health care staff is highly respected. The majority of Mizzou's staff has individually been involved in many local, state, and national athletic training activities, and represents athletic trainers in numerous leadership positions.

The MATC offers some of the most cutting-edge sports medicine facilities in the nation. Fully equipped with hot and cold baths, as well as water resistance therapy along with a staff that puts in countless hours, Mizzou is ahead of the curve in its sports medicine program. Also, a new sport psychology department has been started at Mizzou under the direction of Dr. Rick McGuire to help student-athletes prepare mentally.

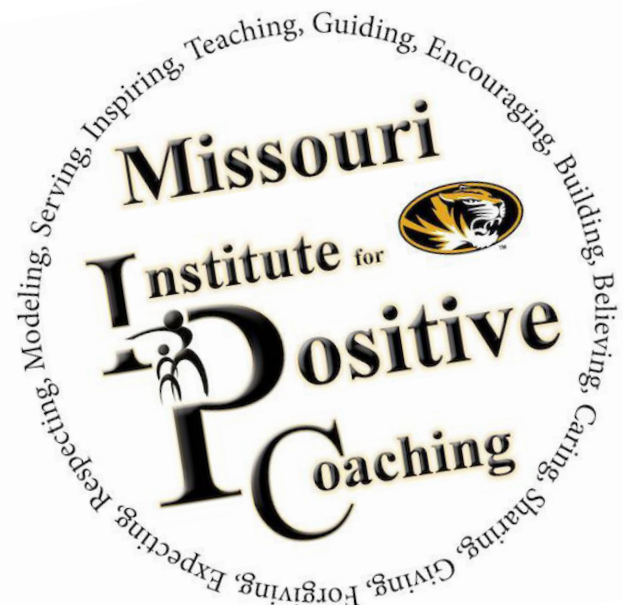
Recently, the University of Missouri introduced a new online master's degree in positive coaching, and was named as one of the best online programs in graduate education by U.S. News & World Report.

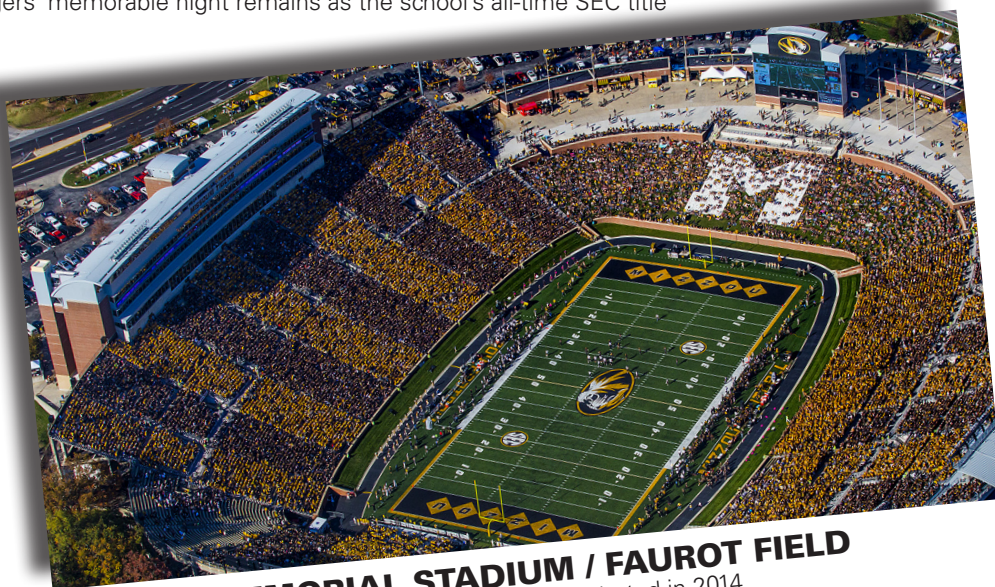

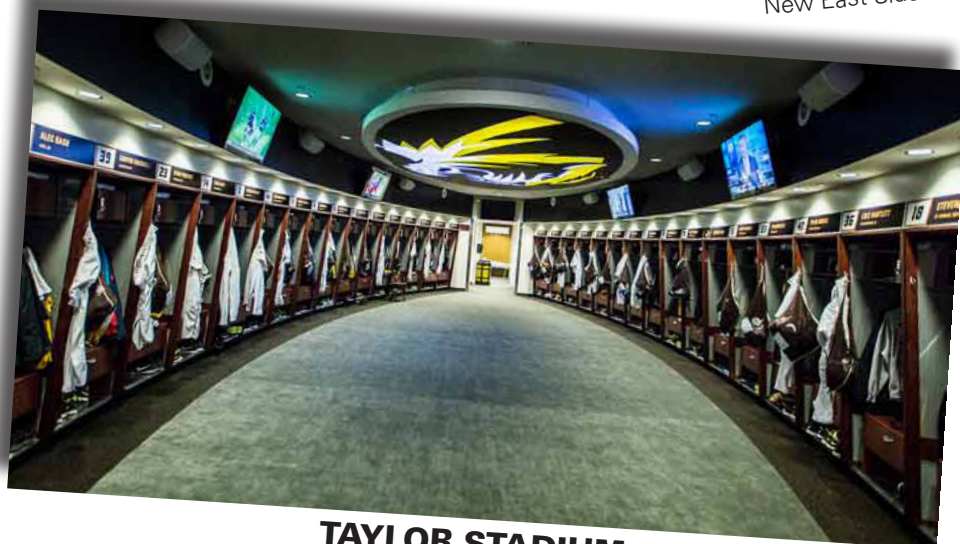

SUCCESS ACROSS THE BOARD

Mizzou Athletics embarked on a new challenge during the 2012-13 athletic year, beginning its first competitive season in the Southeastern Conference (SEC). Widely accepted as the premier athletic conference in the country, Mizzou has the coaches and leadership in place to ensure a successful future moving forward in the SEC.

In 2013, Mizzou volleyball and football highlighted what was a banner year for the Tigers in year two of the SEC. Volleyball claimed the school's first ever SEC Championship in any sport after going 18-0 in league play. Football, just weeks after volleyball clinched its title, won the SEC East and advanced to the SEC Championship game.

Aside from the trophies that Mizzou has lifted, Mizzou Athletics continues to show dedication to every program across the board as nearly every program expects to compete in the NCAA postseason year in and year out. Mizzou football has been to bowl games in nine of the last 10 seasons, including Cotton Bowl wins in 2007 and 2013. Mizzou softball has claimed seven NCAA Regional titles in the past eight seasons, and three trips to the Women's College World Series since 2009 under head coach Ehren Earleywine.



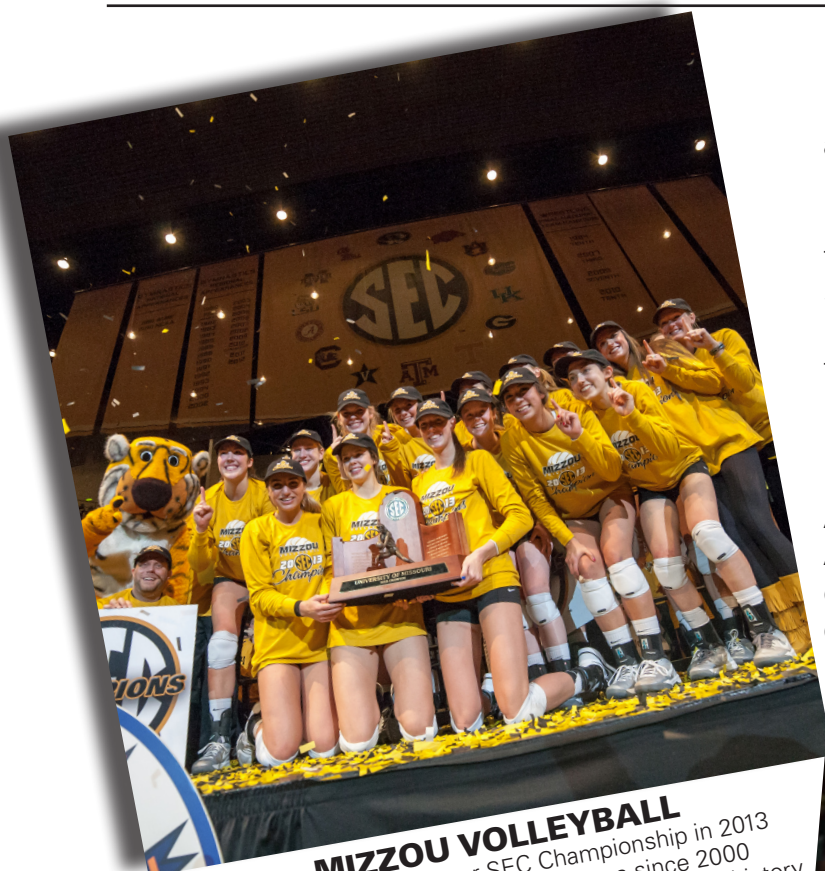

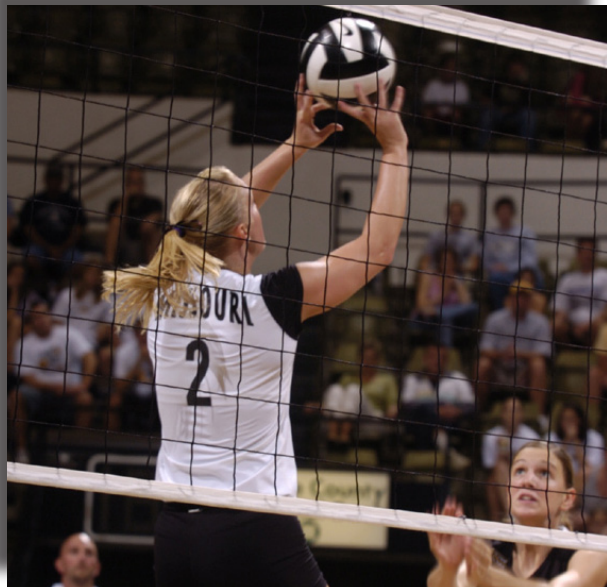

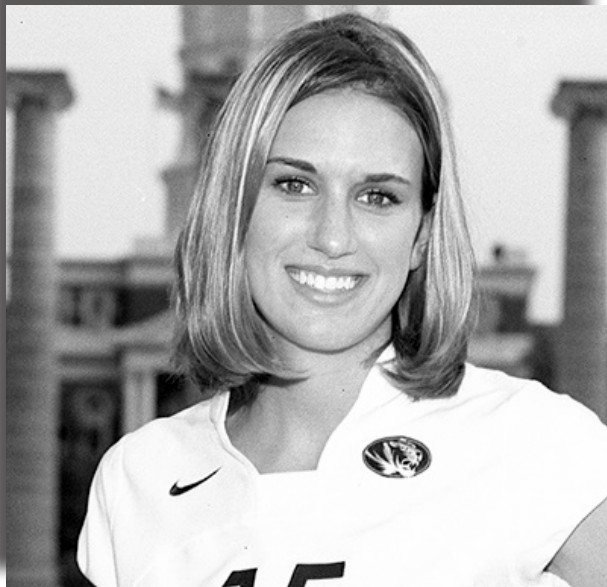

Mizzou offers endless options, from choice of academic majors and living arrangements to opportunities to gain professional experience, study abroad, conduct research, participate in sports, explore the arts and make a difference in the world. Mizzou students get a great education while having the time of their lives.

In a recent survey of Mizzou graduates, 87-percent who were in the job market found employment soon after graduation: 85-percent with bachelor's degrees, 90-percent with graduate degrees and 97-percent with professional school degrees. Of those employed, 90-percent were in jobs related to their field of study. Nearly 3,000 companies and organizations regularly recruit MU students, including about 200 Fortune 500 companies.

In today's knowledge-based economy, higher education is the key to success for both individuals and the nation as a whole.

According to a recent U.S. Census Bureau report, bachelor's degree graduates can expect on average to earn \$2.1 million over their lifetimes compared to the \$1.2 million earned by high school graduates. The report also indicates that the economic advantage of an education has increased over the past four decades. Individuals with bachelor's degrees were earning 1.5 times more than high school graduates in 1975. By 1999, that ratio had risen to 1.8.

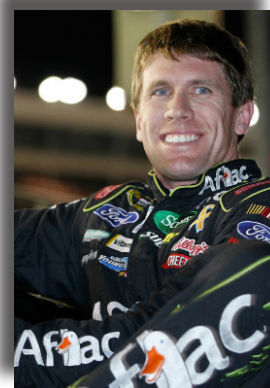

MISSOURI TRADITIONS

Mizzou, the oldest university west of the Mississippi River, is rich in tradition. Below is a list of the traditions pictured on this page.

- **Truman the Tiger:** Missouri's beloved mascot, was born in 1986. He's named after Harry S. Truman, 33rd president of the United States, who was from Independence, MO.

- **Tiger Walk:** Established in 1995, the Tiger Walk takes place each August before classes begin. To symbolize their entrance in Mizzou, the freshman class meets and walks through the Columns toward Jesse Hall. Conversely, upon graduation, the classmates reunite to walk back through the Columns to symbolize their departure from Mizzou.

- **The Missouri Waltz:** The official Missouri state song, is played at every Mizzou Athletics home event as a sign of state pride.

- **The Rock M:** The stone "M" guarding the north end zone of Faurot Field was actually created as a pre-game stunt by some zealous freshman following a Tiger win against Kansas State in 1927. The "M" still receives its traditional whitewash each year by MU student volunteers.

MEET THE 2016 TIGERS!



2016 SEASON PREVIEW

The Tigers were one of the nation's top surprises in 2015, accumulating a 27-6 overall record and 14-4 mark in SEC play. Mizzou was in the race for the SEC title all season long and finished T-2nd with Kentucky (Tigers held tiebreaker over Wildcats with 3-2 win in Lexington, Ky.). Head Coach **Wayne Kreklow** guided the Tigers to one of their top single-seasons in program history.

Mizzou's 27 victories were the fifth-most in a single season in program history and marked the 17th 20-plus win campaign in program history. Additionally, it marked the ninth 25-plus win season in Tiger history and the fourth 25-plus win season under Wayne and Susan Kreklow. The Tigers earned their 12th all-time NCAA Tournament bid as well. With their first round victory over Missouri State (Dec. 3), the Tigers advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the seventh time in school history (all coming under the Kreklows).

Mizzou filled up the stat sheet individually and collectively in 2015, etching its name in the program record books. The Tigers finished with an incredible 358.5 total blocks, marking the most total blocks in a single season in program history. Additionally, their 495 block assists were the most in a single season in program history.

Carly Kan, Kira Larson and **Alyssa Munlyn** were each named to the 2015 All-SEC Team. Munlyn was also named to the 2015 All-Freshman Team and tabbed 2015 SEC Freshman of the Year. Additionally, the trio was named to the 2015 AVCA All-Southeast Region Team. Larson and Munlyn concluded their impressive awards display in December, as they garnered 2015 AVCA Honorable Mention All-American accolades.



The Tigers lose only one senior from a season ago (Regan Peltier), while bringing back 11 players and welcoming three newcomers to the 2016 roster. Four of the top five kill leaders from a season ago return, in addition to the team's top setting duo (**Courtney Eckenrode** and **Ali Kreklow**), top two leaders in digs (**Alexa Ethridge** and Kan) and top three options in total blocks (Munlyn, **Emily Thater** and **Julia Towler**).

Mizzou looks to maintain its outstanding play at the Hearnest Center in 2016, as its coming off an impressive 11-1 record in Columbia, Mo., a season ago. The Tigers outscored their opponents in 2015 at the Hearnest Center by the tune of 35-14. Since 2009, Mizzou has recorded double-digit wins at home six times (2009, '10, '11, '12, '13 and '15). Last season's Tiger squad recorded the program's best home winning percentage (.917) since 2013 when that year's group went 19-1 (.950).



OUTSIDE HITTERS

On the outside, the Tigers will be led by two-time AVCA All-American, **Carly Kan**. The Honolulu native enters the final year in her historical Mizzou Volleyball career. Heading into 2016, Kan's 1,292 career kills ranks eighth-most in program history, 3.46 kills per set ranks seventh-highest in program history, 1,075 digs ranks 10th-most in program history and 1,461.5 points ranks ninth-most in Tiger history. As one of the most complete players in the SEC and NCAA, Kan will once again be a pivotal part into the Tigers' 2016 success.



Joining Kan on the outside will be junior **Sydney Deeken**, sophomore transfer **Paige Perego** and redshirt junior transfer **Melanie Crow**. Deeken only appeared in 12 matches a season ago, as she dealt with nagging injuries throughout the year. The California, Mo., native was effective despite limited action, tallying nearly a kill and point per match played. Deeken enjoyed a strong outing during the Tigers' 2016 Summer China Trip and will once again be one of the team's most athletically gifted players. Perego enters her first season in Mizzou black and gold, following her 2015 freshman campaign at Missouri State. The Ballwin, Mo., native tallied double-digit kills three times and double-digit points four times off the bench

for the Bears. Crow joins Mizzou after spending the last three years at Ole Miss. The Wildwood, Mo., native started in 67-of-68 matches for the Rebels and tallied 650-plus kills, 40-plus aces, 180-plus digs and 140-plus total blocks. Crow will serve as another talented hitter for this year's Tiger squad.



MIDDLE BLOCKERS / RIGHT SIDE

Mizzou possesses a slew of talented middle blocker and right side options in 2016, headlined by returning All-Americans in **Kira Larson** and **Alyssa Munlyn**. In her first year with the Tigers, Larson turned into one of the SEC's top threats on the right side. She recorded double-digit points in 24 of 33 matches, double-digit kills 14 times, hit .300 or better in a match 16 times and .400 or better in a match 10 times. Munlyn wowed Tigers fans all year long with her incredible athleticism and talent at the net. Her 149 total blocks and 124 block assists set new school records, while her 1.16 blocks per set were the eighth-most in a single season in program history. Munlyn ended the regular season on a terror, earning four of the final five SEC Freshman of the Week honors. Overall in SEC play, Munlyn tallied an incredible .431 hitting percentage with 1.25 blocks per set as well.



Two more seniors in **Emily Thater** and **Julia Towler** headline an experienced group of middle blockers. Thater continued her remarkable consistency as a Tiger last season, posting 150-plus kills, 90-plus blocks and 240-plus points for the third consecutive year. She was one of three Tigers to record 100-plus blocks (125) for the year. Towler, another Tiger to surpass the century mark in total blocks last season, established new single season career highs in kills (183), attacks (446), digs (39), solo blocks (12), total blocks (105) and points (241.5).



MIDDLE BLOCKERS / RIGHT SIDE

Sophomore **Hao Jin** and freshman **Kayla Caffey** round out the Tigers' deep rotation at middle blocker. Jin was effective the bench in 2015, including a breakout nine kill / six total blocks outing at the South Florida Invitational. Caffey is one of two freshmen this season and brings an outstanding high school



and club track record to the Tigers. The Chicago native was a 2015-16 Under Armour Honorable Mention All-American and the Chicago Tribune's 2015 Player of the Year. Caffey will give the Tigers another outstanding athlete at the net and the potential to make an immediate impact for Coach Kreklow.

SETTERS

Junior duo of **Courtney Eckenrode** and **Ali Kreklow** return this season, as the Tigers will once again run a 6-2 offense. The Mizzou setters turned in excellent 2015 campaigns with Eckenrode recording 742 assists (5.80 per set) and Kreklow tallying 655 assists (5.12 per set). Both Tigers surpassed 1,000 career assists last season and will provide consistency to the offense every match. Eckenrode and Kreklow also provide outstanding serving capabilities for the Tigers' offense. Six individuals tallied 20-plus aces last season, led by Eckenrode's 37.



BACK ROW

Senior **Alexa Ethridge**, redshirt freshman **Riley Sents** and freshman **Andie Hanus** make up this year's group of defensive specialists. Sents and Hanus will see their first action this season in Mizzou black and gold. Hanus joins teammate Kayla Caffey in the Freshmen Class of 2016. She was a three-year starter for Marian High School in Omaha, Neb., and brings more talent to the position. Hanus was named to PrepVolleyball's Defensive Dandy award list this past year and also garnered High School All-American Honorable Mention recognition by Under Armour.

Sents took a redshirt in 2015 and will be ready to step in the DS rotation this season for Coach Krek-low. Regarded as one of the most energetic and hard-working individuals on the Tigers, Sents will provide a spark off the bench each night out.

Ethridge stepped into the Tigers' everyday lineup last season after transferring from the University of Nebraska. The Lee's Summit, Mo., native tallied 493 digs, marking the seventh-highest single season dig total in program history. Ethridge paced the Tigers in single-match digs 26 times, including a season-high 27 digs vs. Appalachian State (Sept. 11).

Mizzou Volleyball's rise to national prominence since 2000 can be easily tied to its leadership at the helm of the program as Wayne and Susan Kreklow have built a national power. Heading into the 2013 season, the résumé was impressive enough: 10 NCAA Tournaments, one Elite Eight, two Sweet 16s, 12 winning seasons and an average of 20 wins per season.

But the Kreklows and the 2013 team rewrote the record books with the most successful season in program history. Not only did the Tigers become the first ever team at Mizzou to win a Southeastern Conference Championship and the program's first conference championship, but the team finished the regular season unblemished at 34-0. The team earned the No. 4 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament and saw four players earn AVCA All-America honors, including a pair of first team honorees in senior setter Molly Kreklow and senior right side Lisa Henning. Wayne Kreklow was named SEC Coach of the Year for engineering the whole thing. Below is just a snapshot of the achievements by the 2013 team.

- SEC Champions - School's first ever SEC title and program's first ever league championship
- First ever SEC team to finish a regular season unbeaten
- Reset school records in wins, conference wins, consecutive wins, sweeps and team hitting percentage
- Led the nation in hitting, kills, assists, wins and points per set while averaging the fewest errors per set
- Saw four players - Molly Kreklow, Lisa Henning, Carly Kan, Whitney Little - land on the All-SEC team
- Molly Kreklow was named SEC Player of the Year, Carly Kan was SEC Freshman of the Year and Wayne Kreklow was SEC coach of the Year
- Four Tigers were AVCA All-Americans - Molly Kreklow and Lisa Henning (First Team) and Carly Kan and Whitney Little (honorable mention)
- Wayne Kreklow was the SEC Coach of the Year and the AVCA Southeast Region Coach of the Year
- Carly Kan earned AVCA Southeast Region Freshman of the Year

Aside from all of the accomplishments for the 2013 team, Wayne and Susan Kreklow had built a power at Mizzou since arriving in 2000. In fact, now that the Tigers have reached the NCAA Tournament in 12 of the last 16 seasons, Mizzou is one of only 22 teams nationally to qualify for at least 12 NCAA Tournaments in the last 16 seasons. In the Kreklow's first eight seasons at the helm of the program, Mizzou qualified for the NCAA Tournament in each year, joining Nebraska as the only two programs to accomplish that feat during the span.

In their inaugural season as an SEC member, Wayne and Susan Kreklow guided Mizzou to a 19-win season while finishing fourth in the SEC East division. They also guided three players - Molly Kreklow, Lisa Henning and Whitney Little - to All-SEC honors. Henning was a unanimous All-SEC First Team pick while Kreklow and Little were second-team honorees. Henning also went on to garner AVCA All-America Third Team honors, becoming the second Tiger to earn AVCA All-America honors in two consecutive seasons.

The 2011 season may have showcased the Kreklow's coaching prowess unlike ever before. With just two seniors on the 2011 squad, the Kreklow's took a group comprised primarily of freshmen and sophomores to the NCAA Tournament for the 10th time in 12 seasons. In fact, the Tigers were the youngest team to qualify for the field of 64 as 11 of its 13 players were underclassmen. The Kreklow's also guided Henning to AVCA Third Team All-America honors, becoming the first Tiger underclassman to earn AVCA All-America honors.

In 2010, the Kreklow's took the Tigers back to the NCAA Sweet 16, marking the program's second-deepest run into the NCAA Tournament in history. The Tigers also pulled the biggest first-round upset in NCAA Tournament history in 2010, knocking off fifth-seeded Northern Iowa in Cedar Falls in a thrilling five-set match. The Tigers boasted four wins over ranked teams in 2010, including two in the NCAA Tournament, and took home 14 Big 12 Athlete of the Week honors, the most by any team in the league in 2010. The Tigers also ranked 16th nationally in average attendance last season.

Under the Kreklow's guidance in 2010, senior outside hitter Paola Ampudia was named honorable mention All-American by the AVCA was a member of the first team All-Central Region and All-Big 12 teams. She was a unanimous selection to the All-Big 12 team. The Kreklow's also saw freshman setter Molly Kreklow garner AVCA Central Region Freshman of the Year honors and honorable mention All-Big 12 status as well. She and classmate Lisa Henning also appeared on the All-Big 12 Freshman team. The idea of developing a family-like atmosphere has always been a key component of the Kreklow's coaching style. That rang true again in 2010 as Molly Kreklow, their niece, was the team's starting setter. Not only that, but the Kreklow's have teamed with current assistant coach Deng Yang for all 11 years at Mizzou and she played for Wayne and Susan during their time at Columbia College. Also, the Kreklow's have added one of their former Mizzou players to their coaching staff in former All-American setter Lindsey Hunter, now in her second season.



In 2009, the Kreklow's guided a group of talented underclassmen to an 18-14 overall record, likely just one win shy of qualifying the program for its ninth NCAA Tournament in the decade. Under the tutelage of the Kreklow's, Ampudia earned a spot on the All-Big 12 First Team and was dubbed the conference Newcomer of the Year as she thrived in the Kreklow's system. She anchored what was one of the league's most explosive attacks in 2009.

Under the direction of the Kreklow's, academics and community involvement continue to be a cornerstone of the program. In 2009, six Tigers earned a spot on the Academic All-Big 12 team while senior setter Lei Wang-Francisco became the program's first-ever four-time Academic All-Big 12 honoree. The volleyball program also spends countless hours in the community. In 2009, the team baked holiday cookies for the elderly, visited children's hospitals and raised more than \$1,000 for the American Red Cross and the Haitian Earthquake Relief Fund. Year in and year out, the volleyball program challenges for Mizzou's Tiger Cup, which is given to the Mizzou athletic program that is most involved in its community. The Kreklow's guided the volleyball team to a Tiger Cup Championship in 2009, despite having one of the smallest rosters across the board.

While the Kreklow's success at Missouri was immediate, the apex of their successes came at the end of the 2005 season. The Tigers were selected to host NCAA First and Second rounds for the second-consecutive year, achieving an overall No. 10 seed in the tournament. After defeating Missouri State in the first round, Mizzou swept Arkansas to advance to the team's first regional in school history. At the Penn State Regional, the Tigers took perennial power Hawaii head-on in the regional semifinal, defeating UH in four games. The Tigers accumulated a 25-5 record in 2005, the winningest season in school history, and were a step away from the Final Four.

Also in 2005, Wayne Kreklow was named College Volleyball Update's honorable mention National Coach of the Year as the team surged to the national top-10 for the first time in school history, sweeping three top-10 teams along the way. In all, the Kreklow's have amassed a 200-108 (.649) winning record in their Mizzou tenure with 117 wins coming in Big 12 play, averaging 12 conference wins per season. The Tigers have won 21 matches over Top-25 teams since 2000, toppling five during the magical 2005 season. Mizzou itself has spent 76 weeks in the national top 25 since 2000.

Upon arrival, the Kreklow's wasted no time in putting their winning mark on a program that had not experienced success since the early 1980's. In their first three years at Mizzou (2000, 2001 and 2002) they recorded the program's first back-to-back-to-back 20-win seasons since 1981-83. In fact, the Tigers won 70 matches in the first three years under the Kreklow's, more than the previous seven years combined. Missouri posted the first postseason victory in school history by defeating Northwestern in the first round of the 2002 NCAA Tournament. In 2004, Missouri had the honor of hosting first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history.

In 2000, the Kreklow's' first season at MU, the Tigers finished second in the Big 12 Conference after finishing ninth the previous year. For her efforts, Susan was named as the 2000 Big 12 Coach of the Year by her peers. The Kreklow's have made Mizzou Volleyball an exciting marketable entity, and the growth in attendance has been effected, as Missouri has ranked in the nation's top seven in the category in 2005 and 2006, averaging more than 2,600 fans per competition. On Oct. 5, 2005, 7,298 fans packed the Hearnes Center for the Tigers' match against Nebraska. Both teams entered the contest undefeated and ranked in the national top-10.

The Tigers face the best competition in the country night-in and night-out as they compete in one of the strongest conferences in the nation. They have experienced great success in the Big 12 Conference and proof of that success can be found in the fact that the Tigers were ranked in the USA Today/ AVCA Coaches Poll for the first of 12 consecutive weeks in 2000, for 11 weeks in 2001 and 11 weeks in 2002, finishing at No. 20, the then-best end of the year ranking by MU. In 2003, the Tigers opened the year ranked No. 21, the then-highest preseason ranking for MU, and climbed to No. 18 at one point in the season, marking the then-best ranking in Tiger Volleyball history. In 2004, the Tigers finished the season in the top 25 again, achieving a No. 24 postseason ranking.

In 2005, Missouri's No. 21 preseason ranking was the season-low as the team never exited the top 25. The Tigers progressed in defeating two top-10 teams in sweeps to open the season and soon soared to the top 10 themselves, peaking at a now-team, all-time high No. 7 in October. Their No. 8 final poll ranking in 2005 is the best in school history.

Before the 2005 season, Wayne and Susan officially switched titles within the University system to allow for more family flexibility. While the official coaching records of both are affected, their coaching philosophy is one built on a co-op instead of a one-headed system.

Before coming to Missouri, the Kreklows were co-head coaches of both the men's and women's volleyball teams at Columbia College. They enjoyed great success, taking their women's team to the NAIA National Tournament six times and winning consecutive national titles in 1998 and 1999.

The Cougars also won five regional championships and seven consecutive American Midwest Conference championships under their guidance. In 1998 and 1999, Columbia College achieved consecutive undefeated seasons with a combined record of 85-0. The Cougars' undefeated record included 78 consecutive wins at home and 227 consecutive game victories.

In 1997 and 1998, the Kreklows shared NAIA/AVCA National Coach of the Year and Midwest Region Coach of the Year honors. In 1999, the coaching tandem took home the regional award for the fifth consecutive year. In 1998 and 1999, the Kreklows also received the NAIA National Tournament Coach of the Year award.

Along with the success of the women's program, the Kreklows started the men's volleyball program at Columbia College in 1997. In 1999, the Cougars finished the season with a 19-5 overall record, enjoying their second consecutive undefeated run through the Midwest Intercollegiate Volleyball Association. They also took second place at the inaugural SSI Volleyball National Invitational Tournament in 1999.

Susan Kreklow played volleyball for Central Missouri State University and Missouri State. She received her bachelor's degree in physical education and a Master's of Science degree from Missouri State in 1984 and 1987, respectively. Kreklow began her coaching career at St. Clair (Mo.) High School. She began her collegiate coaching career at Columbia College in 1990. Susan was the founder of Columbia Juniors Volleyball Club and the Columbia Developmental Volleyball Leagues. She has served as a member of the USA Volleyball Board of Directors as the NAIA representative and was president-elect of the NAIA National Coaches Association.

Wayne Kreklow earned a bachelor's degree in social science in 1980 from Drake University. While at Drake, Wayne was a member of the men's basketball team, where he earned All-America, all-conference and all-district awards as a two-time team captain, and is fifth on Drake's career scoring list. He is also a member of Drake's All-Century basketball team and was a member of the NBA World Champion Boston Celtics in 1980-81. Wayne began coaching basketball for Central Decatur (Iowa) High School in 1986. He began coaching volleyball as an assistant under Craig Sherman at Missouri. He was with the Tigers from 1989 to 1994 before moving over to Columbia College to join his wife at the helm of the Cougar program.

Mizzou Volleyball assistant coach Deng Yang enters her 17th season with the Tigers in 2014. She has been extremely valuable to the Tigers in numerous ways, not only with her teaching on the court, but also in the Tigers continued relationship with the volleyball teams of China. She, along with Lindsey Hunter, were named Coach of the Year at the WIN Awards.

A do-it-all coach, Deng Yang works primarily with the hitters in practice and aids in the day-to-day operations of the volleyball office while also assisting in the coordination of recruiting. Prior to the program hiring former All-American Lindsey Hunter, Deng Yang focused on coaching the setters at Mizzou before turning her attention to the hitters. Her work with the Tiger setters has been one of the many reasons for the program's success over the past decade and a half. In fact, she is responsible for coaching former Tiger All-American (and current assistant coach) Lindsey Hunter, who was just recently voted Mizzou's Female Athlete of the Decade by Tiger fans and athletic department personnel.

Hunter is Mizzou's all-time leader in total assists with 6,907 during her four-year career and she also holds the school's single-season record with 1,690 helpers during the 2002 season; she also holds three of the top four single-season assist marks in program history. Hunter had 21 matches with 60 or more assists during her career - the next closest Tiger finished her career with nine such matches. Hunter was a First Team All-American in 2004, a three-time All-Big 12 First Team honoree and an honorable mention All-Big 12 selection in 2002.

Yang seems to be playing a vital role in coaching former Tiger setter Molly Kreklow as well. In 2010, she guided Kreklow to AVCA Central Region Freshman of the Year honors along with honorable mention status on the All-Central Region team. Kreklow also landed on the All-Big 12 honorable mention team and wound up highlighting the All-Big 12 Freshman team. She was also named Big 12 Newcomer of the Week four times and quarterbacked a Mizzou offense that ranked among the league's best nearly all season long.

Yang also worked closely with Lei Wang-Francisco during her years at Mizzou and helped her become one of the best all-around players in program history. Yang guided Wang-Francisco to finish her career ranked in the program's all-time top 10 in four different categories, highlighted by a third-place nod in career assists. She also played in more sets than any other Tiger during her time at Mizzou.

Deng Yang's relationship with China began in the summer of 2001 when the Tigers were able to visit the province for two weeks and train and travel around the countryside experiencing the Chinese culture to its fullest. The relationship continued to grow in the spring of 2002, when the Tigers welcomed the Southeast University squad from the Jiang Su Province for a week's stay in Columbia and returned back to China in May 2005, visiting Beijing and the surrounding provinces. In April 2006, the team welcomed Beihang University of Beijing to Columbia.

Yang came to Missouri from Columbia College where she was a member of the Kreklow's men's volleyball coaching staff. Prior to joining the coaching staff, Yang was part of the Cougar women's volleyball program. As a player, Yang was a two-time NAIA first team All-American (outside hitter in 1998 and setter in 1999) and was named 1999 NAIA National Player of the Year. She was also selected as the Most Valuable Player at the national tournament where the Cougars placed first.

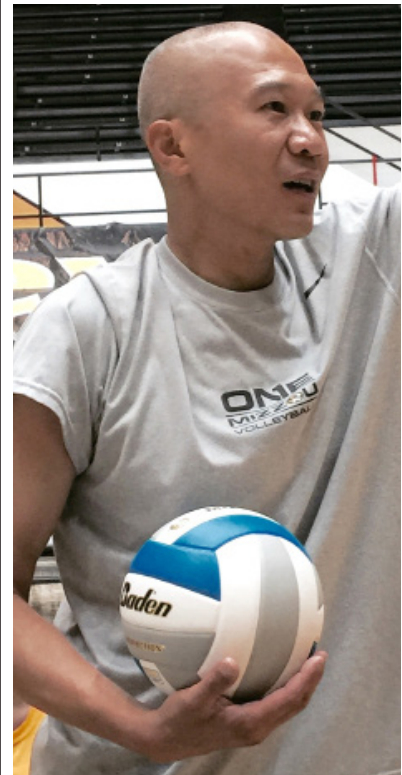

Prior to moving to the United States, Yang played for the Chinese Junior National team for three years and the Chinese National team for one year. **JILLIAN LAND**

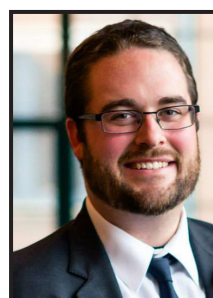
Marketing / 3rd Season

**MICHAEL GETT**

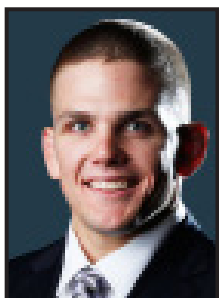

**CAMILLE HACKAMACK**

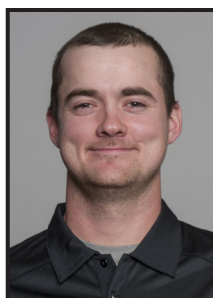
Total Person Program / 1st Season

The 2000 season was the first year in the turnaround of the Missouri volleyball program. The Tigers posted a 24-7 overall record and a 14-6 Big 12 Conference mark. MU traveled to Provo, Utah, for its first-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament.

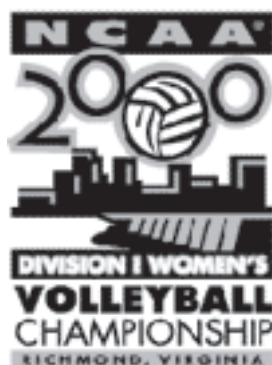
After being picked to finish ninth in the conference, Mizzou managed a second-place showing in the Big 12 and Susan Kreklow was named the league Coach of the Year.

Lisa Morris was named to the All-Big 12 first team and two Tigers - Christi Myers and Heather Gerber - were honorable mention selections. Those awards were the first conference recognition for MU since the Big 8 became the Big 12.

MU recorded its first-ever wins over Colorado, Texas and Texas Tech in 2000 and had season sweeps over Baylor, Texas, Kansas, Iowa State and Oklahoma.

The Tigers 10-0 start to the season was the best since 1983.

The 24 wins was the sixth-most wins in school history and included a 13-1 home-court record.

Year two under the Kreklows yielded a second trip to the NCAA Tournament as Missouri posted a 20-11 record. MU finished fifth in the Big 12 with a 10-10 conference record.

With the 20 wins, Mizzou recorded back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time in Tiger volleyball history. Mizzou opened the season by winning its first nine matches and won 12 of the first 14 matches of the year.

The Tigers again earned Big 12 honors as Christi Myers and Lisa Morris were All-Big 12 Honorable Mention selections and Katie Sowers was named the Big 12 Conference Defensive Specialist of the Year.

The 2002 season was a year of firsts for the Mizzou volleyball program as the Tigers recorded their first-ever NCAA Tournament win with a 3-1 victory over Northwestern.

Missouri finished the season with a 26-8 record, the fourth-most wins in school history and the third straight year with at least 20 wins. MU finished third in the Big 12 Conference with a 14-6 record.

Christi Myers added another first for MU by becoming the first All-American in school history. Myers and Lindsey Hunter were also selected to the All-Central Region team, the first selections in program history.

Hunter broke the school record for assists in a season with 1,690 and averaged 14.08 assists per set, which led the Big 12 Conference and ranked second in the nation.

Myers, Hunter, Mary Lauren Smith and Shen Danru were named to the All-Big 12 Conference teams and Smith earned national recognition by being named AVCA/ Sports Imports National Player of the Week on Sept. 30.

As a team, MU set school records for most kills (2,005) and most assists (1,889) in a season. Missouri also finished a program-best 16th in the nation in average attendance.

With the Tigers making their fifth-consecutive NCAA Tournament, Missouri in that time span went from the depths of the nation to a team that is part of the cream-of-the-crop. Missouri was tabbed as host of the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. The team knocked-off first-round opponent Arkansas before falling to Louisville in round two.

The team opened the season by stunning No. 23 Wisconsin on their home floor. The Badgers found their way to the Elite Eight later in the season. The Tigers went on to defeat four top-25 teams during the season.

For the fourth time in five years, the Tigers won 20 matches overall, including a 14-6 Big 12 season-record (tying a school-record in conference wins) that placed them tied for third with Texas A&M.

Setter Lindsey Hunter led the Big 12 for the third-straight season in assists and was a second-team AVCA All-American. Lisa Boyd led the conference in hitting percentage with a school-record .384. In her first season as a Tiger, Tatum Ailes crushed the school record in digs per set (4.19). Jessica Vander Kooi earned her first spot on the AVCA All-Central Region team.

A school-record seven Tigers earned Academic All-Big 12 honors.

The quest for the Tigers' sixth-straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament was the most productive and successful in the program's history. This Mizzou squad reached the NCAA Regional Final, or round-of-eight, after defeating Hawaii in the regional semifinal at Penn State. The Tigers reached the regional rounds for the first time in school history and scored the then winningest record in school history with a 25-5 mark.

The team set a school-record with 16 Big 12 Conference wins, placing third in a tight race with Nebraska and Texas.

Mizzou went 7-4 against teams in the top 25, knocking off four squads in the top 10 alone. With that type of play, people around the country and in Columbia started to notice more than before. Mizzou surged into the national top 10 for the first time in school history, peaking at No. 7. Missouri also placed sixth in the national attendance average landing around 2,600 fans per home match. On Oct 5, Mizzou hosted 7,298 fans in a match against No. 1 Nebraska.

Lindsey Hunter completed her senior campaign with more than 6,000 career assists, becoming only the 15th person in NCAA history to accomplish such a feat. She earned AVCA All-America honors for the second-consecutive year, becoming the first Tiger to ever be listed as a first-team member. In addition, Jessica Vander Kooi and Nicole Wilson earned honorable mention All-America honors.

Mizzou volleyball made its seventh-consecutive NCAA Tournament in 2006, again advancing to the second round for the third-straight year.

The season included many ups and downs, but proved to be an excellent learning experience for all involved. Redshirt freshman Lei Wang completed her first year at the setter position, garnering a good track record considering the difficulty of having to follow two-time All-American Lindsey Hunter.

The Tigers had a stretch of seven-consecutive wins in the first half of the conference season which included a dominate, 30-23, 30-23, 30-19, sweep of then-No. 5 Texas.

The trip to Palo Alto, Calif., for the first rounds of the NCAA Tournament proved treacherous with ice and snow delaying Mizzou's departure from St. Louis and the tournament by a day. The Tigers regrouped to sweep Santa Clara in the first round before facing NCAA runner-up Stanford in round two. Missouri reached NCAA Tournament play for the eighth-straight time in 2007 and became one of only 16 teams to have reached the tournament for each year since 2000.

The Tigers faced sixth-seeded and sixth-ranked Washington in the NCAA Tournament's first round in Seattle and came within four points of pulling the major upset, almost becoming the first unseeded team in tournament history to knock off a seeded team in the first round.

Mizzou juggled lineups and positions throughout the year because of an injury to sophomore outside hitter Julianna Klein, who was Mizzou's leading scorer at the time. The Tigers experimented with a 6-2 offense which had Lei Wang and transfer Luiza Jarocka share time in the setter role with Wang becoming an outside hitter when rotated to the front row.

After starting Big 12 play 0-4, Mizzou rebounded by winning its next five matches and nine of its next 13, losing to only one unranked team. For the balance of the season, MU pulled to a final conference record of 10-10 tying for sixth with Texas A&M in the standings.

The Tigers forced then-No. 2 Nebraska to a five-set showdown in Lincoln on Oct 31, handing the Huskers its first set-loss in Big 12 play at home since 2005.

The 2010 Mizzou volleyball team made its second-deepest run into the NCAA Tournament in 2010, advancing all the way to the Regional Semifinal Round before being topped by nationally-seeded Duke at the Penn State Regional. Mizzou won 11 of its final 15 matches to secure its spot in the Sweet 16. Mizzou is one of just 22 teams nationally to qualify for the tournament in nine of the last 11 seasons.

The NCAA Tournament appearance was the Tigers' ninth in 11 seasons under the direction of Wayne and Susan Kreklow and the 22 wins by the Tigers were their most since 2005. Also, Paola Ampudia became the program's fifth All-American and three Tigers - Ampudia, Molly Kreklow and Caitlyn Vann - were named to AVCA All-Central Region teams. Ampudia was a first team honoree while both Kreklow and Vann were honorable mention selection. Kreklow was also the AVCA Central Region Freshman of the Year.

Mizzou also took home a league-best 14 Big 12 Weekly honors in 2010, highlighted by six Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week awards for Vann and five Big 12 Newcomer of the Week awards for Kreklow.

With the goal of winning an SEC Championship, that Tigers did all that and more, resetting school records for wins, conference wins, consecutive wins, sweeps and hitting while leading the nation in hitting, kills, assists and win percentage. That led to the program's first ever conference championship and the school's first ever SEC Championship.

Mizzou finished the regular season with a perfect 34-0 record, becoming the first ever SEC team to run the table in the regular season. The Tigers also earned the No. 4 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament, hosting the first and second rounds at the Hearn Center.

In all, Mizzou saw four players earn All-America honors - Molly Kreklow, Lisa Henning (first team) and Carly Kan, Whitney Little (honorable mention). Wayne Kreklow earned SEC Coach of the Year and AVCA Southeast Region Coach of the Year honors while Molly Kreklow was dubbed SEC Player of the Year. Carly Kan earned SEC Freshman of the Year honors and AVCA Southeast Region Freshman of the Year.

After a rare subpar season in 2014, head coach Wayne Kreklow rallied the troops in 2015 in style and returned the Tigers to the NCAA Tournament. Mizzou finished its 2015 campaign with an outstanding 27-6 record, marking the fifth-most wins in a single season in program history.

The 27 wins also marked the 17th 20-plus win campaign in Mizzou Volleyball's 42-year history. Additionally, it set the ninth 25-plus win season in Tiger history and the fourth 25-plus win campaign under Wayne and Susan Kreklow.

The Tigers earned their 12th all-time NCAA Tournament bid in 2015. With their first round victory over Missouri State (Dec. 3), the Tigers advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the seventh time in school history (all coming under the Kreklows).

Mizzou's final .818 winning percentage (27-6) was the third-highest single season winning percentage in school history, trailing only the 2013 (.972) and 2005 (.833) Mizzou Volleyball squads.

Mizzou finished with an incredible 358.5 total blocks in 2015, marking the most total blocks in a single season in program history. Additionally, the Tigers' 495 block assists were the most in a single season in program history.

The Tigers' .259 season hitting percentage was the eighth-highest team hitting percentage in a single season in Tiger history. Carly Kan, Kira Larson and Alyssa Munlyn were each named to the 2015 All-SEC Team for their outstanding seasons. Munlyn was also named to the 2015 SEC All-Freshman Team and was tabbed the 2015 SEC Freshman of the Year.

Kan surpassed 1,000 career kills, digs and points this season, becoming just the fifth Tiger in program history to accomplish the feat. Kan's 491 kills in 2015 were the seventh-most in a single season in Tiger history.

Munlyn tallied the most total blocks (149) in a single season and the most block assists (124) in a single season.
