#MIZZOU STORYLINES

- Mizzou took 2-of-3 last weekend at the Idaho State Invitational (Sept. 9-10) with 3-1 victories over Idaho State and Boise State.
- The Tigers started off strong in Pocatello, Idaho, defeating the host Bengals, 3-1. Redshirt junior **Melanie Crow**, redshirt junior **Kira Larson** and junior **Sydney Deeken** each tallied double-digit kills to lead Mizzou's offense. Crow paced the Tigers in single-match kills for the fifth consecutive time, following a 17 kills output. Larson exploded for 11 of her 13 kills in the final two sets. Overall, she tallied an impressive .385 hitting percentage against Idaho State. Deeken was unstoppable in the early going, producing 11 kills on .348 hitting through two sets.
- Following a tough match against BYU, Mizzou responded nicely with a 3-1 tournament finale victory over Boise State. Crow and senior **Carly Kan** were awarded All-Tournament Team honors for their outstanding weekends on the court. Crow led the Tigers in kills (48) and points (58.0), while Kan paced the team in aces (5) and finished second in digs per set (2.18) and points (32.0).
- Last Saturday's honors marked Crow's third consecutive All-Tournament Team recognition to begin the 2016 season and Kan's second All-Tournament Team nod of the year.
- Deeken and senior Emily Thater also shined on offense as a whole last weekend. Deeken's 27 kills were second-most on the team, while producing a solid .311 hitting percentage. Thater contributed 19 kills on .308 hitting with eight total blocks. Additionally, senior **Alexa Ethridge** was a mainstay at libero, recording a team-high 36 digs over the Tigers' three matches.
- Crow's exciting jump serve as wowed Tigers fans and has been even more effective to her opponents. So far this season, her 0.51 aces per set ranks 3rd in the SEC and 30th in the NCAA. Additionally, Crow's 19 total aces ranks 1st in the SEC and 9th in the NCAA.
- The Wildwood, Mo., native has also shined at outside hitter each and every match. Crow's 3.86 kills per set ranks 3rd in the SEC, 143 total kills ranks 4th in the SEC and Top 50 in NCAA, 174.0 points ranks 4th in the SEC and 27th in the NCAA and 4.70 points per set ranks 2nd in the SEC.

MIZZOU AMONG NATION'S BEST SINCE 2000

- ▶ Since Wayne and Susan Kreklow took over at Mizzou in 2000, the Tigers have won 346 matches (.669 winning percentage). Over that 17 season span, the Tigers have averaged over 21 wins a year, been to the NCAA Tournament 12 times, and produced 16 All-Americans.
- ▶ The 346 wins also ranks Mizzou 16th nationally among teams from power conferences since 2000.

TIGER ALL-AMERICANS UNDER THE KREKLOWS

- ▶ Since 2000 and the beginning of the Kreklows tenure at Mizzou, the Tigers have tallied an impressive 16 total All-American accolades.
- ▶ In fact, Mizzou has garnered at least one All-American in each of the past six years (2010-present).
- ▶ Last year (2015), sophomore **Alyssa Munlyn** and **Kira Larson** were each tabbed AVCA Honorable Mention All-Americans. The two outstanding Tigers cemented Mizzou as only 1-of-23 schools in the country with multiple All-Americans in 2015.
- ▶ In 2013, **Molly Kreklow** and **Lisa Henning** each produced AVCA First Team All-American honors. The two First Team All-American members were tied for the most in the country that season (joining USC, Penn State and Stanford).
- ▶ Overall in 2013, Mizzou accumulated four total All-Americans, ranking T-2nd most from a single team in the NCAA.
- ▶ Additionally, the four total All-Americans in 2013 marked the most single-season All-Americans in Mizzou Volleyball history.
- ▶ Since 2013, Mizzou has tallied seven total All-Americans, ranking T-4th most among all SEC programs.
- ▶ Since 2013, Mizzou is only 1-of-18 schools in the country with seven-plus overall All-Americans.
- ▶ Since 2010, Mizzou is only 1-of-28 schools in the NCAA with 10-plus overall All-Americans.
- ▶ Since 2010, Mizzou joins Florida, Kentucky, Texas A&M, Alabama and Tennessee as the only SEC schools with double-digit All-Americans.

HOME SWEET HEARNES

- ▶ Matchdays at the Hearn Center have an excitement that is unmatched. Since 2000 and the arrival of Wayne and Susan Kreklow, the Tigers faithful have continued to come through the turnstiles in incredible fashion.
- ▶ For the past 14 seasons, Mizzou has finished in the top-25 national attendance rankings. In fact, the Tigers have 12 top-20 national attendance numbers, and four top-10 totals since 2002.
- ▶ The program's most highly attended season came in 2013, as the team went 34-0 and claimed Mizzou Athletics' first ever SEC Championship. On Nov. 22, 2013 - the SEC Championship clinching match - the Tigers took home the crown in front of a school-record 7,879 fans (the first of two 7,000 + crowds that season).

TIGERS PICKED 4TH IN PRESEASON SEC POLL

- ▶ The Tigers finished T-2nd in the SEC Conference Championship race in 2015. Mizzou was recognized as one of the top tier teams heading into 2016 as well, earning a 4th place predicted finish according to the SEC Coaches' Preseason Poll. The Tigers were only one of three teams to garner a first place vote (one) and one of four teams to accumulate 100-plus points in the preseason poll.
- ▶ Defending SEC Champions, Texas A&M (7), and Florida (5) join Mizzou as the other three teams to receive a first place vote.
- ▶ The fourth-place projected finish is the Tigers' highest slot in the Preseason SEC Coaches' Poll since 2014. That year's squad entered the campaign projected to finish in third place. Mizzou's other Top-4 projected finish according to the league's Preseason Coaches' Poll occurred in 2005, when it was picked to finish second in the Big 12.

CROW TALLIES RARE 20-20 MATCH FOR TIGERS



REDSHIRT JUNIOR // OH // MELANIE CROW

- ▶ Redshirt junior transfer **Melanie Crow** has made quite the impact for the Tigers in only six matches played so far. Crow currently leads Mizzou in overall kills (95) and has paced the team in single-match kills five times.
- ▶ In only her fifth career match in Mizzou black and gold, Crow etched her name in the team record books. Against Miami (Ohio) on Sept. 3, at the Tiger Invitational, she tallied a rare 20-20 match (22 Kills, 20 Digs).
- ▶ Crow's outstanding night on the court marked only Mizzou Volleyball's 20th all-time 20-20 match. In fact, only 10 Tiger individuals in the rally scoring era (2001-pres.) have had 20-20 matches.
- ▶ Additionally, Crow and teammate **Carly Kan** (20 Kills, 25 Digs at Ole Miss on Nov. 22, 2015) are the only two Tigers to tally a 20-20 match since 2008.

KAN NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-SEC TEAM

- ▶ Senior outside hitter **Carly Kan** (Honolulu) was named to the 2016 Preseason All-SEC Team, announced on Wednesday, Aug. 17 by the Southeastern Conference (SEC) league office.
- ▶ The recognition marked Kan's third consecutive season with Preseason All-SEC accolades. Kan enjoyed another standout season in 2015, en route to American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) All-Southeast Region and All-SEC honors.
- ▶ The Honolulu native continued to etch her name within the Mizzou Volleyball record books last season. Kan became just the fifth Tiger in program history to record 1,000 career kills, digs and points. Her 491 kills were the seventh-most in a single season in program history and she paced the SEC with 18 double-doubles.
- ▶ Kan is a two-time AVCA All-American, as she was honored after an outstanding 2013 freshman season (383 kills on .364 hitting, 315 digs, 440.5 points) and 2014 campaign (418 kills, 394 digs, 457.5 points).

MUNLYN LOOKS FOR BIG SOPHOMORE REPEAT

- ▶ Heading into the 2015 campaign, **Alyssa Munlyn** was a highly regarded freshman following a standout prep and club career in Suwanee, Ga. Munlyn skyrocketed onto the national recruit scene following sensational junior and senior seasons at North Gwinnett High School. PrepVolleyball.com rated her as the No. 36 overall recruit in the Class of 2015.
- ▶ Beginning with the first day of practice last year, Munlyn quickly showed her incredible athleticism and skill set to her teammates and coaches. Tiger fans immediately saw the talent on display, as Munlyn was named to the 2015 Tiger Invitational All-Tournament Team.
- ▶ The rest of Munlyn's first-year campaign only got better, as she went on to earn SEC Freshman of the Week honors a league-high four times, All-SEC, SEC Freshman of the Year, AVCA All-Southeast Region, AVCA Southeast Region Freshman of the Year and AVCA All-America Honorable Mention accolades.
- ▶ Munlyn was an absolute force at the net for the Tigers in 2015, setting new Mizzou Volleyball single season records with 149 total blocks and 124 block assists. Additionally, her 1.16 blocks per set were the eighth-most in a single season in Tiger history.

LARSON ROUNDS OUT TIGER ALL-AMERICANS

- ▶ Redshirt Junior **Kira Larson**, along with senior Alexa Ethridge, joined the Mizzou Volleyball squad last season after transferring from the University of Nebraska. Both Tigers made an instant impact for Coach Kreklow and Larson's outstanding first-year campaign in Columbia, Mo., resulted in 2015 AVCA Honorable Mention All-American accolades.
- ▶ In addition to AVCA All-American honors, Larson earned AVCA All-Southeast Region and All-SEC Team recognition for her sensational year as a right side / middle blocker.
- ▶ Larson's Mizzou debut came on Aug. 28-29 at the Tiger Invitational. She hit better than .300 in all three matches, contributing towards the Tigers' 3-0 weekend schedule.
- ▶ Overall, Larson recorded double-digit points in 24-of-33 matches a season ago and posted double-digit kills 14 times. Additionally, she hit .300 or better in a match 16 times and .400 or better in a match 10 times.
- ▶ Mizzou had a chance at a 2015 SEC Championship when it met Texas A&M on Nov. 25, 2015. While the Tigers came up just short in the match, Larson stepped up in arguably her team's biggest match of the year, racking up a career high 17 kills on .424 hitting and 19.0 points.

Mizzou volleyball's rise to national prominence since 2000 can be easily tied to its leadership at the helm of the program as Wayne and Susan Kreklow have built a national power. Heading into the 2013 season, the résumé was impressive enough: 10 NCAA Tournaments, one Elite Eight, two Sweet 16s, 12 winning seasons and an average of 20 wins per season.

But the Kreklows and the 2013 team rewrote the record books with the most successful season in program history. Not only did the Tigers become the first ever team at Mizzou to win a Southeastern Conference Championship and the program's first conference championship, but the team finished the regular season unblemished at 34-0. The team earned the No. 4 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament and saw four players earn AVCA All-America honors, including a pair of first team honorees in senior setter Molly Kreklow and senior right side Lisa Henning. Wayne Kreklow was named SEC Coach of the Year for engineering the whole thing. Below is just a snapshot of the achievements by the 2013 team.

- SEC Champions - School's first ever SEC title and program's first ever league championship
- First ever SEC team to finish a regular season unbeaten
- Reset school records in wins, conference wins, consecutive wins, sweeps and team hitting percentage
- Led the nation in hitting, kills, assists, wins and points per set while averaging the fewest errors per set
- Saw four players - Molly Kreklow, Lisa Henning, Carly Kan, Whitney Little - land on the All-SEC team
- Molly Kreklow was named SEC Player of the Year, Carly Kan was SEC Freshman of the Year and Wayne Kreklow was SEC coach of the Year
- Four Tigers were AVCA All-Americans - Molly Kreklow and Lisa Henning (First Team) and Carly Kan and Whitney Little (honorable mention)
- Wayne Kreklow was the SEC Coach of the Year and the AVCA Southeast Region Coach of the Year
- Carly Kan earned AVCA Southeast Region Freshman of the Year

Aside from all of the accomplishments for the 2013 team, Wayne and Susan Kreklow had built a power at Mizzou since arriving in 2000. In fact, now that the Tigers have reached the NCAA Tournament in 11 of the last 15 seasons, Mizzou is one of only 22 teams nationally to qualify for at least 10 NCAA Tournaments in the last 15 seasons. In the Kreklow's first eight seasons at the helm of the program, Mizzou qualified for the NCAA Tournament in each year, joining Nebraska as the only two programs to accomplish that feat during the span.

In their inaugural season as an SEC member, the Kreklows guided Mizzou to a 19-win season while finishing fourth in the SEC East division. They also guided three players - Molly Kreklow, Lisa Henning and Whitney Little - to All-SEC honors. Henning was a unanimous All-SEC First Team pick while Kreklow and Little were second-team honorees. Henning also went on to garner AVCA All-America Third Team honors, becoming the second Tiger to earn AVCA All-America honors in two consecutive seasons.

The 2011 season may have showcased the Kreklow's coaching prowess unlike ever before. With just two seniors on the 2011 squad, the Kreklows took a group comprised primarily of freshmen and sophomores to the NCAA Tournament for the 10th time in 12 seasons. In fact, the Tigers were the youngest team to qualify for the field of 64 as 11 of its 13 players were underclassmen. The Kreklows also guided Henning to AVCA Third Team All-America honors, becoming the first Tiger underclassman to earn AVCA All-America honors.

In 2010, the Kreklows took the Tigers back to the NCAA Sweet 16, marking the program's second-deepest run into the NCAA Tournament in history. The Tigers also pulled the biggest first-round upset in NCAA Tournament history in 2010, knocking off fifth-seeded Northern Iowa in Cedar Falls in a thrilling five-set match. The Tigers boasted four wins over ranked teams in 2010, including two in the NCAA Tournament, and took home 14 Big 12 Athlete of the Week honors, the most by any team in the league in 2010. The Tigers also ranked 16th nationally in average attendance last season.

Under the Kreklow's guidance in 2010, senior outside hitter Paola Ampudia was named honorable mention All-American by the AVCA was a member of the first team All-Central Region and All-Big 12 teams. She was a unanimous selection to the All-Big 12 team. The Kreklows also saw freshman setter Molly Kreklow garner AVCA Central Region Freshman of the Year honors and honorable mention All-Big 12 status as well. She and classmate Lisa Henning also appeared on the All-Big 12 Freshman team.

Under the direction of the Kreklow's, academics and community involvement continue to be a cornerstone of the program. In 2009, six Tigers earned a spot on the Academic All-Big 12 team while senior setter Lei Wang-Francisco became the program's first-ever four-time Academic All-Big 12 honoree.

While the Kreklow's success at Missouri was immediate, the apex of their successes came at the end of the 2005 season. The Tigers were selected to host NCAA First and Second rounds for the second-consecutive year, achieving an overall No. 10 seed in the tournament. After defeating Missouri State in the first round, Mizzou swept Arkansas to advance to the team's first regional in school history. At the Penn State Regional, the Tigers took perennial power Hawaii head-on in the regional

semifinal, defeating UH in four games. The Tigers accumulated a 25-5 record in 2005, the winningest season in school history, and were a step away from the Final Four.

Also in 2005, Wayne Kreklow was named College Volleyball Update's honorable mention National Coach of the Year as the team surged to the national top-10 for the first time in school history, sweeping three top-10 teams along the way. In all, the Kreklows have amassed a 200-108 (.649) winning record in their Mizzou tenure with 117 wins coming in Big 12 play, averaging 12 conference wins per season. The Tigers have won 21 matches over Top-25 teams since 2000, toppling five during the magical 2005 season. Mizzou itself has spent 76 weeks in the national top 25 since 2000.

Upon arrival, the Kreklows wasted no time in putting their winning mark on a program that had not experienced success since the early 1980's. In their first three years at Mizzou (2000, 2001 and 2002) they recorded the program's first back-to-back-to-back 20-win seasons since 1981-83. In fact, the Tigers won 70 matches in the first three years under the Kreklows, more than the previous seven years combined. Missouri posted the first postseason victory in school history by defeating Northwestern in the first round of the 2002 NCAA Tournament. In 2004, Missouri had the honor of hosting first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history.

In 2000, the Kreklows' first season at MU, the Tigers finished second in the Big 12 Conference after finishing ninth the previous year. For her efforts, Susan was named as the 2000 Big 12 Coach of the Year by her peers. The Kreklows have made Mizzou Volleyball an exciting marketable entity, and the growth in attendance has been effected, as Missouri has ranked in the nation's top seven in the category in 2005 and 2006, averaging more than 2,600 fans per competition. On Oct. 5, 2005, 7,298 fans packed the Hearn Center for the Tigers' match against Nebraska. Both teams entered the contest undefeated and ranked in the national top-10.

Before the 2005 season, Wayne and Susan officially switched titles within the University system to allow for more family flexibility. While the official coaching records of both are affected, their coaching philosophy is one built on a co-op instead of a one-headed system.

Before coming to Missouri, the Kreklows were co-head coaches of both the men's and women's volleyball teams at Columbia College. They enjoyed great success, taking their women's team to the NAIA National Tournament six times and winning consecutive national titles in 1998 and 1999.

The Cougars also won five regional championships and seven consecutive American Midwest Conference championships under their guidance. In 1998 and 1999, Columbia College achieved consecutive undefeated seasons with a combined record of 85-0. The Cougars' undefeated record included 78 consecutive wins at home and 227 consecutive game victories.

WAYNE & SUSAN KREKLOW AT MIZZOU

In 1997 and 1998, the Kreklows shared NAIA/AVCA National Coach of the Year and Midwest Region Coach of the Year honors. In 1999, the coaching tandem took home the regional award for the fifth consecutive year. In 1998 and 1999, the Kreklows also received the NAIA National Tournament Coach of the Year award.

Along with the success of the women's program, the Kreklows started the men's volleyball program at Columbia College in 1997. In 1999, the Cougars finished the season with a 19-5 overall record, enjoying their second consecutive undefeated run through the Midwest Intercollegiate Volleyball Association. They also took second place at the inaugural SSI Volleyball National Invitational Tournament in 1999.

Susan Kreklow played volleyball for Central Missouri State University and Missouri State. She received her bachelor's degree in physical education and a Master's of Science degree from Missouri State in 1984 and 1987, respectively. Kreklow began her coaching career at St. Clair (Mo.) High School. She began her collegiate coaching career at Columbia College in 1990. Susan was the founder of Columbia Juniors Volleyball Club and the Columbia Developmental Volleyball Leagues. She has served as a member of the USA Volleyball Board of Directors as the NAIA representative and was president-elect of the NAIA National Coaches Association.

Wayne Kreklow earned a bachelor's degree in social science in 1980 from Drake University. While at Drake, Wayne was a member of the men's basketball team, where he earned All-America, all-conference and all-district awards as a two-time team captain, and is fifth on Drake's career scoring list. He is also a member of Drake's All-Century basketball team and was a member of the NBA World Champion Boston Celtics in 1980-81. Wayne began coaching basketball for Central Decatur (Iowa) High School in 1986. He began coaching volleyball as an assistant under Craig Sherman at Missouri. He was with the Tigers from 1989 to 1994 before moving over to Columbia College to join his wife at the helm of the Cougar program.

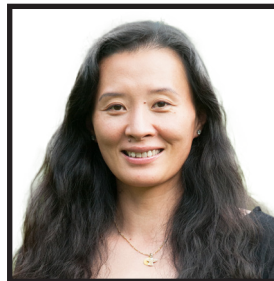
