MIZZOU OPENS HOME SCHEDULE WITH EMU...

- ▶ The University of Missouri Football team (0-1 overall), returns to the friendly confines of Faurot Field/Memorial Stadium for its 2016 home opener, set for a 6:30 p.m. (central time) kickoff against the Eastern Michigan Eagles (1-0). The game will be televised on the SEC Network (alternate channel – fans are encouraged to check listings to find the broadcast). Saturday's game will represent the first home game for new Head Coach **Barry Odom**, who will look to guide his troops into the winner's circle after his Tigers showed flashes of encouraging play, but not enough to overcome a challenging road test at West Virginia, where they fell last Saturday by a 26-11 score.
- ▶ Mizou's youthful and new-look offense racked up 462 yards against the Mountaineers (more than any game in 2015, and the most by MU since going for 587 at Texas A&M in 2014), but just enough mistakes kept them from capitalizing, as they scored only twice in five redzone opportunities. Likewise, the defense held a potent WVU offense well below its typical output, but the Mountaineers took advantage of big plays, as they tallied nine plays from scrimmage of 20 yards or more, and kept Mizou's vaunted front seven from recording any quarterback sacks on the day. Even with all of that working against the Tigers, they had a first-and-goal at the WVU six-yardline with less than two minutes left with a chance to make it a one-score game.
- ▶ Eastern Michigan, from the Mid-American Conference, rolls into Columbia fresh off a 61-14 dismantling of Mississippi Valley State on Sept. 2nd, where the Eagles were dominant in most every aspect of the game. EMU rolled to a quick 21-0 first quarter lead, and never looked back, finishing with 479 yards of offense, while holding the Delta Devils of the Football Championship Subdivision to just 169 yards in the game. The Eagles were a perfect 9-of-9 on redzone scoring opportunities, converting nicely with eight touchdowns and a field goal, on the way to rushing for 281 yards and throwing for 198 more.

WEEK 2 STORYLINES...

- ▶ Mizou holds a 91-31-4 all-time record (.733) in 125 previous home openers. Included in that figure is a mark of 60-27-3 (.683) in home openers since 1926, the year that Memorial Stadium opened. Since the field was named Faurot Field in 1972, Mizou's home opener record is 33-11 (.750). The last time Mizou lost a home opener at Memorial Stadium was 2005, a 45-35 defeat at the hands of New Mexico.
- ▶ In Mizou's loss at West Virginia last Saturday, youth and newcomers were the theme. Mizou played 11 first-time starters in the game and 25 players saw their first game action in a Mizou uniform. Seven of the 11 first-year starters were on offense with the other

four coming on defense. The breakdown of the 25 players who saw their first action as Mizou Tigers is as follows: 14 on offense, nine on defense and two specialists.

▶ Mizou and Eastern Michigan have met just once in history, back in 1997 when Mizou opened the season with the Eagles. Headed into the game with EMU, Mizou had posted 13 consecutive losing seasons before the 44-24 win, season-opening win vaulted Mizou to a 7-5 record and its first bowl game since 1983. Mizou head coach **Barry Odom** was a sophomore on the 1997 team that defeated EMU. Odom finished second on the team with five tackles in that game, adding a pass deflection in the win.

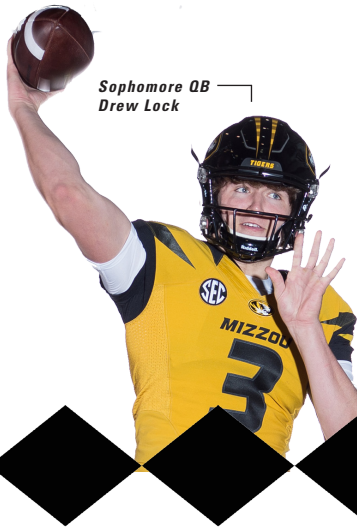

A CAREER GAME FOR QB DREW LOCK

- ▼ QB **Drew Lock** tallied career-highs in yards (280), attempts (51) and completions (23) with a TD last weekend at West Virginia
- ▼ Lock had his third-best QB rating in nine games as a starter.
- ▼ Lock's 51 pass attempts are the most by a Mizzou passer since James Franklin had 51 at Florida in 2012.



LOCK HAS CAREER OUTING

- ▼ Mizzou sophomore QB **Drew Lock** tallied career-highs in total passes (51), completions (23), yards (280) and it was his third-best game by passer rating in his nine career starts.
- ▼ While Lock's passing numbers may not catch the eye of most, to Mizzou fans they are a huge step in the right direction. In fact, Lock had more passing yards in the first half (152) than Mizzou had in eight games a season ago.
- ▼ Lock was thrown into the fire as a true freshman last season, starting eight games and playing in all 12. Under the direction of first-year offensive coordinator **Josh Heupel**, Lock has begun to unlock what many believe is NFL-type potential.

NOTABLES FROM LAST WEEK

- ▼ Mizzou's 462 total yards were the most by a Mizzou team since posting 587 total yards at Texas A&M on Nov. 15, 2014.
- ▼ QB **Drew Lock** threw for a career-high 280 yards and a touchdown on Saturday.
- ▼ WR **Dimetrious Mason** made his first career catch in the third quarter, picking up a first down on a third-down slant route for seven yards.

- ▼ QB **Marvin Zanders** scampered for a career-high 47 yards on seven rushes, including a 21-yard dash on his first attempt of the season. He averaged 6.7 yards per carry.
- ▼ Mizzou converted on 10-of-24 third down chances last Saturday, good for 41.7 percent. That is a vast improvement from an offense that averaged just 30.3 percent conversion rate a year ago.
- ▼ Mizzou picked off a pair of passes at West Virginia – one by SS **Anthony Sherrils** and the other by CB **Aarion Penton**. Mizzou now has three games with at least two picks in its last 13 games.
- ▼ Penton's interception was the sixth of his career and he now has interceptions in back-to-back games after hauling in a pick at Arkansas in the season finale a season ago.
- ▼ Sherrils' interception was the second of his career and first since first since Sept. 19 of last season when he clinched Mizzou's win over UConn with a 50-yard pick on a fake field goal.
- ▼ Mizzou forced three turnovers on Saturday, but failed to convert any of them into points.

"You always look back and wish you had some throws back, and this will be no different, but I think Drew looked more comfortable [Saturday] than he had in the past. I still think he has a tremendous future."

A DYNAMIC RECEIVING DUO

- Mizzou had a pair of wideouts go over the 100-yard mark in a single game for the first time since 2013 at Indiana when **Chris Black** and **J'Mon Moore** each broke the century mark.
- Each player reset career-highs in catches and yards while Alabama transfer Black hauled in his first career TD with Mizzou in the game at WVU.

DYNAMIC RECEIVING DUO

- Mizzou did not feature a wide receiver with a 100-yard game during the entirety of the 2015 season. Despite losing last week, the receiving duo of senior Chris Black and junior J'Mon Moore saw both receivers go over the 100-yard mark. Moore hauled in eight catches for 104 yards and Black caught six passes for 102 yards. Both of those totals are career-highs for both players.
- Mizzou had not had a pair of players go over 100 yards receiving in a single game since 2013 when Mizzou earned a 45-28 win over Indiana in the third game of the season on Sept. 21 that year. That was a span of 37 games.
- In that game against Indiana, Mizzou's duo of 100-yard wideouts was Marcus Lucas (101) and Dorial Green-Beckham (105), both of whom are playing in the NFL.
- Moore added a career-long 42-yard reception in the game and Black added his first touchdown as a Tiger in the fourth quarter - the first TD of the **Barry Odom** era.

HEUPEL PICKS UP THE TEMPO

- First-year offensive coordinator **Josh Heupel** picked up the pace last Saturday at West Virginia. In just 25:47 time of possession, Mizzou ran 100 plays. To put that mark into perspective, Mizzou ran just 111 total plays in its final two games of 2015 combined. Mizzou leads the nation in plays after week one.
- Last Saturday marked the first time since 2005 that Mizzou had run 100 plays in a game and it marks just the fifth time in the modern era (since 1958). Below is a look at the 100-play performances by a Mizzou team

IMPACT TRANSFERS ON OFFENSE

- In addition to adding Heupel as Mizzou's offensive coordinator, Mizzou brought in three graduate transfers who should make an immediate impact on offense in 2016. WR **Chris Black** joins Mizzou from Alabama, where he won two national titles with the Tide. He had 25 catches for 290 yards over his three years at Mizzou and is a former four-star recruit who was the No. 22 WR out of high school according to ESPN. RB **Alex Ross** comes to Mizzou from Oklahoma where he saw plenty of time at running back and was an All-American kick returner for

the Sooners. Lastly, Columbia native **Michael Stannard** joined Mizzou as a graduate transfer. He played 35 games at Memphis over his three seasons there.

SCHERER HAS SIGHTS ON ODOM'S MARK

- Senior LB **Michael Scherer** led Mizzou with 10 tackles last weekend at West Virginia, his first 10-tackle performance since posting 10 against Tennessee last November. It was his second 10-tackle game in his last three outings and moved his career total to 223. That number is important to Scherer as he set an individual goal at the beginning of the year to pass his head coach on Mizzou's all-time tackles list as Barry Odom is seventh in school history with 362. Scherer now needs 139 more tackles to catch his current head coach and former position coach.
- After posting 10 tackles in the season opener last Saturday, Scherer has now posted 10 or more tackles in eight games in his career.

JUGGERNAUT AT FULLBACK

- If you look at Mizzou's list of rushers from last weekend at West Virginia, there is one name that looks wildly out of place - senior, 355-pound DT **Josh Augusta**. But contrary to popular belief, that is not an error on the game's official stat crew as Augusta was used by Mizzou's coaching staff as a short-yardage fullback on a fourth down in the fourth quarter. In true Refrigerator Perry fashion, Augusta dove right up the middle for a one-yard gain to pick up the first down, extending Mizzou's lone touchdown drive. Look for Augusta to find his way into Mizzou's backfield again this season in short-yardage situations.
- Augusta was not the only defensive player to swap sides of the ball last weekend as former walk-on and now scholarship DT/TE **Tyler Hanneke** saw time with the Mizzou offense. Both are examples of Heupel getting creative with Mizzou's offense to create different looks for opposing defenses.

ZANDERS GIVES MIZZOU A DIFFERENT LOOK

- In addition to sophomore QB **Drew Lock** thriving in Heupel's offense, Mizzou also used sophomore QB **Marvin Zanders** last week to give the offense a different look. While he only attempted two passes in the game, Zanders was often times Mizzou's top rushing threat from the QB position, averaging a team-high 6.7 yards per carry on seven attempts last weekend. He also boasted Mizzou's longest rush from scrimmage in the game,

YOUNG WIDEOUTS MAKE IMPACT

- One area of Mizzou's offense that had its share of challenges last season was its wide receiver group. After one week, it appears that an influx of youth at that position may prove beneficial for the Tigers in 2016. In addition to Moore and Black having standout games, combining for 14 catches and 206 yards, the young receivers also got into the mix. In fact, eight of Mizzou's other 10 completions were made by Mizzou underclassmen or newcomers.

#DLINEZOU

- Mizzou has established a pedigree when it comes to producing elite defensive line talent. The 2016 group may be the deepest group that Mizzou has had in any single year.
- Mizzou will rotate four 300+ pounders on the interior of the line with DTs **Rickey Hatley**, **AJ Logan**, **Josh Augusta** and **Terry Beckner Jr.** with athletic ends on each side of the line.
- RS Junior DE **Charles Harris** has seen his name all over preseason watch lists and is primed for a breakout season after being virtually unblockable last season. He is projected as a first round NFL draft pick.

CHARLES IN CHARGE

- Mizzou RS junior DE **Charles Harris** will undoubtedly be the leader of #DLineZOU in 2016. While Harris has flown somewhat under the radar in comparison to some of the other recent Mizzou #DLineZOU standouts, he is primed for a breakout junior season, one that many scouts believe will have him slotted as a first-round draft pick in next year's NFL Draft. At 6-3, 260 pounds, Harris is an athletic freak, often running conditioning alongside the Mizzou secondary rather than with the defensive line. He was a tremendous basketball player in high school and was virtually unheard of when he signed with Mizzou on signing day in 2013. None of the major recruiting services even had a profile for Harris when his NLI came across the fax machine at Mizzou's Athletics Training Complex as he had only been playing organized football for a couple of years. But Mizzou recognized his potential and the rest is history.
- Last season, Harris earned second team All-SEC honors from the league's coaches and media and earned that distinction again the preseason. He led the SEC with 18.5 tackles for loss and added seven sacks while starting 12 games. He really turned heads in Mizzou's first road game at Arkansas State, tallying 4.5 tackles for loss, the most by a Tiger in a single game since 2008. Harris also added 10 QB hurries, a team-high, in 2015 to go along with his 18.5 tackles for loss and seven sacks.
- Harris has a tremendous blend of speed, power, size and agility that allows him to beat tackles with a variety of different moves. At SEC Media Days back in July, Harris said his individual goal for the season is breaking 2014 SEC Defensive Player of the Year **Shane Ray's** school record of 14.5 sacks. That goal of 15 sacks may seem lofty, but Mizzou's single season sacks record has been shattered in two of the last three seasons and Harris could be the next on that list to do so in 2016.

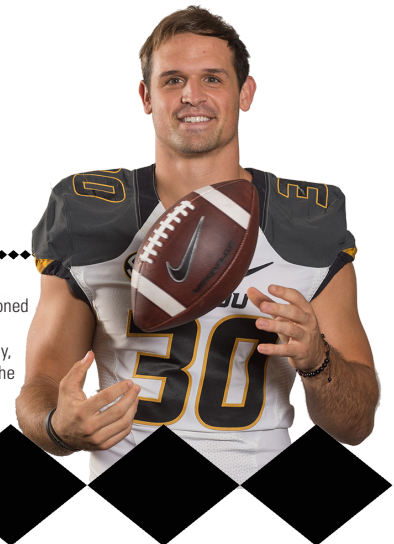
FROSH ALL-AMERICANS BACK FOR YEAR 2

- Mizzou has a pair of players coming back in 2016 who earned Freshman All-America status a season ago: DT **Terry Beckner, Jr.** and P **Corey Fatony**. Beckner tallied 8.5 tackles for loss with 27 tackles and was a vital cog in Mizzou's run and pass defense, earning the team's interior lineman of the year award despite tearing his ACL against BYU early in that game (10th game of the year). He was a First Team Freshman All-American by FWAA and *Sporting News* and was a member of the 2015 SEC All-Freshman team as voted by the coaches. Fatony earned the same distinction and was a Freshman All-American by *Sporting News* and *USA Today*. He set the Mizzou single season record with 81 punts, passing a record that had stood at Mizzou since 1995. He finished the season ranked first among freshman nationally in net punting, averaging 42.9 yards per punt. Beckner had three tackles in week on vs. West Virginia while Fatony punted eight times, averaging 39.2 yards per kick.

SHOW ME

A TACKLE MACHINE

- Mizzou senior LB **Michael Scherer** has been called the unquestioned leader of the Mizzou defense this season.
- Scherer tallied his eighth career game with 10+ tackles last Saturday, moving his career total to 223. He has had at least 90 tackles in each of the last two seasons.

ONE OF THE NATION'S YOUNGEST TEAMS

- ▼ Mizou has just 16 seniors on its roster
- ▼ Of the 16, only seven seniors are on offense
- ▼ Of the seven on offense, three are graduate transfers, three are walk-ons and Mizou has just one five-year senior on the offensive side of the ball (TE **Sean Culkin**)
- ▼ Only 18 schools have fewer seniors than Mizou this season.
- ▼ Mizou has 10 first-time starters and 18 first-year players on the depth, nine of which are true freshmen

MIZZOU HAS JUST 16 SENIORS

▼ When Mizou hit the field last Saturday at West Virginia, it did so as one of the youngest teams in the nation. In fact, Mizou has just 16 seniors on its roster with seven on offense and nine on defense. Only 18 schools in all of Division I have fewer seniors than Mizou and of those 18, only 12 are from power five conference. Only 14 schools (nine from power 5) have fewer seniors on offense. What is even more remarkable is that three of the seniors on offense are graduate transfers - WR **Chris Black** (Alabama), RB **Alex Ross** (Oklahoma) and OL **Michael Stannard** (Memphis). Three of the remaining four are walk-ons leaving TE **Sean Culkin** as the only five-year senior on Mizou's offense this season. Below in the table is a breakdown of the fewest seniors by school in the nation this season.

YOUTH ALONG O-LINE

▼ Staying on the topic of youth on offense, Mizou's O-Line may be its youngest position group on offense. In fact, the starting offensive line boasts three RS sophomores and a pair of juniors. The group had combined to make just three starts (all three by RG **Alec Abeln**) before last Saturday when four players made their first career O-line starts. That three starts at the beginning of the year were the fewest of any O-line group in the nation (Navy has 4, Iowa St. has 6). The two-deep on the offensive line features just three upperclassman and one lone senior: graduate transfer **Michael Stannard**. Mizou's starting offensive line played all 100 snaps last weekend at West Virginia

as not one of the five starters was subbed for during plays from scrimmage.

NEWCOMERS ON THE DEPTH

▼ In addition to not featuring many seniors as a team, Mizou's week two two-deep depth chart features 14 first-year players, including eight true freshmen. The depth also features nine players who are considered first-year starters, once again hinting at Mizou's youth at virtually every position.

FATONY PICKS UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF

▼ Freshman All-American punter Corey Fatony had a tremendous freshman year in 2015 and seems primed for an even better encore as a freshman. Fatony had eight punts last Saturday at West Virginia and averaged 39.2 yards per kick. His first kick went for 50 yards and five of his eight punts went for 45 yards or more. He also put three inside of WVU's 20 yard line. He had two punts in which he had a short field to work with as well, pinning WVU inside the 20 on both kicks. In his six punts on a long field, he averaged 41.2 yards per kick.

BULKING UP

- Under first year strength coach Rohrk Cutchlow, Mizzou Football made tremendous weight gains, specifically across the offensive line and the interior defensive line.
- From their last weight in until the end of fall camp, Mizzou collectively gained 1,343 pounds - an average of 12.55 per player
- Mizzou's offensive line added an average of 20 pounds each and now the line averages 312.18 pounds.
- The D-line added 12.1 pounds per player and averages 277.06.

BULKING UP

- Mizzou strength and conditioning coach **Rohrk Cutchlow** and his staff have made an immediate impact for Coach Odom's program since joining the staff during the winter. The entire team has seemingly bulked up under Cutchlow's watch.
- Since the spring, Mizzou has made considerable gains in the weight room, gaining an average of 12.55 pounds per player. At the end of spring, Mizzou's team checked in a 23,722 pounds. Since that time, Mizzou has gained the approximate equivalent of two adult male wild Tigers at 1,343 pounds, or 12.55 pounds per player. Mizzou's roster weighed in at a total of 25,065 total pounds and jumped from just eight 300-pounders to 14 with five more winging at least 290 pounds.
- The areas where Mizzou saw the biggest gains were the offensive line and the defensive line, in particular the interior. Mizzou's offensive line collectively added 300 total pounds, averaging 20 pounds per player. Mizzou's average weight among offensive linemen heading into the season was 312.18 pounds.
- On the defensive line, the group added a collective 195 pounds for an average of 12.1 per player. The average weight across #DLineZou heading into the season was 277.06 pounds.
- No player gained more mass from his initial weigh as senior . DT **Rickey Hatley** added 35 pounds to lead the defense. Below is a look at the biggest gainers on the team this year.

SCOUTING EASTERN MICHIGAN

- EMU is led by third-year head coach Chris Creighton, who came to the Eagles after a successful career at Drake, guiding the Bulldogs to a pair of PFL co-championships in 2011 and 2012. He has taken on the task of rebuilding the football program at EMU that has not won more than two games since a 6-6 campaign in 2011. Creighton is 4-21 in his time at EMU, including a 1-15 mark in MAC play.
- Eastern Michigan is coming off of a dominant 61-14 win in its season opener against Mississippi Valley State last Saturday in Ypsilanti, Mich., at Rynearson Stadium. EMU put up 21 points in the first quarter, seven in the second and 26 in the third while holding MVSU off the board until the fourth quarter, opening a 54-0 lead after three quarters.
- The Eagles used a stout running game to put MVSU away, netting 281 yards on 44 carries with five TDs coming on the ground. Eastern Michigan averaged 6.4 yards per carry with RB Shaq Vann leading the way with 156 yards on just 20 carries, scoring two TDs and averaging 7.8 yards per carry.
- On the flip side, EMU slowed Mississippi Valley's offense on the ground, allowing just 23 yards on 32 attempts, good for just 0.7 yards per carry. EMU tallied 9.0 tackles for loss and 4.0 sacks in its win.
- Eastern Michigan's passing game is anchored by QB Todd Porter, who went 15-for-22 with three touchdowns and one interceptions last week. He tossed for 171 yards.

SERIES VS. EASTERN MICHIGAN

- Mizzou and Eastern Michigan have met just once in history, back in 1997 when Mizzou opened the season with the Eagles. Headed into the game with EMU, Mizzou had posted 13 consecutive losing seasons before the 44-24 win, season-opening win vaulted Mizzou to a 7-5 record and its first bowl game since 1983.
- With just a three-point lead midway through the third quarter of the 1997 meeting, Mizzou scored on its final five possessions to clinch the 44-24 win. Two Tigers had 100-plus yard outings and two more had at least 68 as Mizzou hung 382 rushing yards on the Eagles to seal the win. FB Ernest Blackwell had 116 and Brock Olivo, who has his number retired at Mizzou, ran for 105.
- Mizzou gained 24 first downs in the game and 22 of the 24 came while rushing the football, showing Mizzou's ability to move the ball on the ground.
- On the flip side, Mizzou limited EMU to just 97 yards on the ground and the Tiger defense picked off a pair of passes. In maybe the craziest stat of the game, Mizzou's two interceptions on defense matched the total amount of catches by the Mizzou offense in the game as Mizzou completed just two passes for 58 yards in the game. Both went for first downs from QB Corby Jones.
- Future NFL quarterback Charlie Batch was the signal caller for the Eagles in that game and Mizzou picked him off twice in the win. Batch played 15 seasons in the NFL.
- Current Mizzou head coach **Barry Odom** was a linebacker on that team and totaled five tackles (two solo) with a pass break-up. He was second on the team in that game with his five tackles.

A longtime fixture at Mizzou, Odom, 39, takes over a program he has been immersed in at every level for some 14 years – including six in an administrative capacity (2003-08), four as a coach (2009-11, 2015) and four as a highly-successful student-athlete (1996-99). He has spent the past four seasons as a defensive coordinator, including three at Memphis (2012-14) and one at Missouri, where his units were considered among the best in the nation.

Odom recently finished up an outstanding season as first-year defensive coordinator for Mizzou and retired coach Gary Pinkel, as his Tigers ranked ninth in the nation in total defense, allowing just 302.0 yards per game. Since the NCAA began tracking defensive statistics in 1978, this marks the first time in MU history that Mizzou has had a top-10 defense. Odom's defense was also ranked seventh nationally in scoring defense (16.2 avg.), seventh in pass defense (169.2 avg.) and second in tackles for loss (8.8 avg.).

Prior to that, Odom became one of the more highly sought-after coordinators in the country due to three stellar years directing Memphis' defense from 2012-14. His 2014 defense was a key component of Memphis' 10-3 season, as his unit finished the regular season ranked fifth nationally in scoring defense (17.1 avg.) and 22nd in total defense (343.3 avg.). That marked an impressive incremental improvement under Odom's watch, as Memphis ranked 117th nationally in total defense the season prior to his arrival. In his first season at Memphis, the defense improved to 50th nationally (383.6 avg.), followed by a jump to 39th in 2013 (370.7 avg.). Memphis earned a share of the 2014 American Athletic Conference title, giving them a conference championship for the first time since 1971.

A true son of Mizzou, Odom, a Maysville, Okla. native, played under former Coach Larry Smith, and starred as a linebacker from 1996-99. He ended his playing career with 362 tackles, which still ranks as seventh-most in school history. Odom was a captain for his senior year of 1999, and was a key figure on the Missouri teams which reached bowl games in 1997 and 1998, ending a 14-year postseason drought for Tiger fans.

Success followed Odom's career path at each future stop after his playing days. After earning his undergraduate degree in December of 1999, he served as an intern with Mizzou's Tiger Scholarship Fund while he worked on his Master's in Education from the University of Missouri (which he would earn in May of 2004). He returned to his home state of Oklahoma in July of that year to serve as an assistant football coach for his alma mater Ada High School, which finished that season as runners-up for a state title.

Odom was quickly back in his adopted hometown of Columbia, Mo., the next spring, as he took over as head coach at Rock Bridge High School. He quickly built the Bruins into a power, as they went 6-4 in 2001, and won a conference championship. He followed with an 8-4 campaign in 2002 that saw Rock Bridge reach the semifinals of the state championship playoffs.

Running a college program became a focal point next, and Odom began that path by joining the Mizzou staff, first as an administrative graduate assistant for Gary Pinkel in 2003. He spent the 2004 and 2005 seasons as Pinkel's director of recruiting as the staff assembled a core group which would help lead Mizzou to consecutive Big 12 Conference North Division titles in 2007 and 2008 which consisted of 12-win and 10-win seasons, respectively. From 2006-08, Odom helped run Pinkel's program administratively as his director of operations. In that role, Odom oversaw coordination of the team's budget, travel plans (including bowl trips to the Sun, Cotton and Alamo bowls during that stretch), compliance issues, facilities operations and scheduling, as well as assisting with recruiting operations and managing the day-to-day overall operations of the program.

ASSISTANTS BOAST IMPRESSIVE CREDENTIALS

WR COACH ANDY HILL

▶ Andy Hill has coached 20 seasons at the University of Missouri, making him the longest-tenured coach on the Tiger football staff. In fact, only two other assistant coaches in MU football history have enjoyed longer tenures at Mizzou: Clay Cooper (29 seasons) and Chauncey Simpson (21), who Hill will match this season. ▶ In 2016, Hill will transition back to coaching the wide receivers, a role that gained him some well-deserved recognition from 1996-2012, coaching some of the best players in Mizzou history. He has spent 2013-15 coaching Mizzou's quarterbacks, including mentoring freshman starter Drew Lock in 2015.



• Associate Head Coach Andy Hill is Mizzou's longest-tenured assistant coach, entering his 20th year on the Mizzou sideline.

THE COORDINATORS

▶ **OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR JOSH HEUPEL:** Barry Odom recruited Josh Heupel to join Mizzou as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

▶ Heupel brings with him an impressive track record of success, including four national championship game appearances, seven BCS bowl games and coaching oversight of two Heisman Trophy winning quarterbacks. He has 13 years of coaching and recruiting experience at the highest level, including the last five seasons as offensive coordinator and play caller at Oklahoma and Utah State.

▶ **DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR DeMONTIE CROSS:** Barry Odom has added Mizzou alum and successful veteran coach DeMontie Cross to his staff. Cross will serve as Mizzou's defensive coordinator and linebackers coach.

▶ Cross comes home to Mizzou after spending the past 18 seasons with numerous programs, including 12 years with Power 5 programs and five more in the National Football League. In all, he has been part of eight bowl teams and three conference championship teams since beginning his coaching days as a graduate assistant/outside linebackers coach at Mizzou for Larry Smith (1998-99).

▶ **CO-DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR RYAN WALTERS:** Ryan Walters came to MU with Barry Odom in February of 2015 when Odom was announced as the defensive coordinator. Now Mizzou's head coach, Odom kept Walters on board for his second season coaching the safeties. Thanks to his outstanding work on the field, as well as in recruiting circles, Odom named Walters Co-Defensive Coordinator this off-season.

RB COACH CORNELL FORD

▶ Cornell Ford is in his 16th season at Mizzou but is entering his first working with the Tiger running backs. Before working with the running backs, Ford spent 12 years coaching the Tiger cornerbacks, after he focused on MU's outside safeties his first three years. Ford is also the Tigers' chief recruiter in St. Louis, where he has signed some of the very best players in the state who have been critical to Mizzou's success over the years. He was elevated to Assistant Head Coach in the offseason.

OFFENSIVE ASSISTANTS

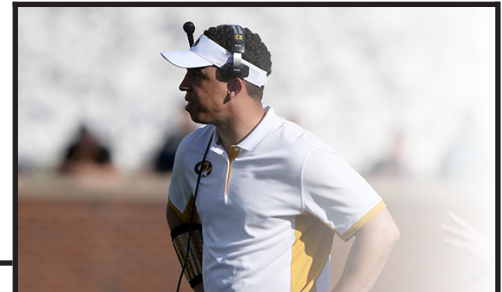
▶ **O-LINE COACH GLEN ELARBEE:** Elarbee will serve as Mizzou's offensive line coach, a position he has coached successfully for the past six seasons at several programs, including the last two while also serving as co-offensive coordinator at Arkansas State.

▶ **TE COACH JOE JON FINLEY:** Finley will serve as Mizzou's tight ends coach, a position in which he was an all-conference performer in his playing days for the Oklahoma Sooners and has helped coach for several seasons at the Power Five level. He spent the 2015 season on the coaching staff at Baylor, where he worked extensively with the tight ends as an offensive quality control specialist.

DEFENSIVE ASSISTANTS

▶ **CORNERBACKS COACH GREG BROWN:** Brown will serve as Mizzou's cornerbacks coach, and he comes to MU with a long resume of success coaching the secondary at both the collegiate and professional levels, including defensive coordinator stints at both Arizona and Colorado.

▶ **D-LINE COACH JACKIE SHIPP:** Jackie Shipp, who has coached defensive line for all but one year of his accomplished 25-year-career, has coached in four national championship games, including the 2001 Orange Bowl, where his alma mater Oklahoma won the BCS National Championship. Shipp comes to Mizzou after spending the last three seasons (2013-15) mentoring the defensive line at Arizona State

JEREMY MACLIN // WR // KANSAS CITY CHIEFS

- ▶ Seventh-year wide receiver enters his second season with Kansas City in 2016.
- ▶ Originally entered the NFL as the Eagles first round pick (19th overall) in the 2009 NFL Draft.
- ▶ Played under Andy Reid through his first four NFL seasons in Philadelphia (2009-12).
- ▶ Earned first Pro Bowl selection in 2014 after tallying 85 catches for 1,318 yards (15.5 avg.), with 10 TDs
- ▶ Owns 343 receptions for 4,771 yards (13.9 avg.) and 36 touchdown catches in 75 (73 starts) career games.
- ▶ Named the Eagles Ed Block Courage Award in 2014 by his teammates.
- ▶ Was part of the first trio of teammates age 24 years old or younger in NFL history to each post 50-plus receptions, 750-plus yards and four-plus touchdowns in a season in 2009.
- ▶ Has recorded 100 or more receiving yards in 14 contests, including one postseason game.
- ▶ Became the eighth receiver in NFL history to have at least 55 catches and 750 yards in each of his first four seasons (2009-12), joining Gary Clark, Larry Fitzgerald, Joey Galloway, Marvin Harrison, Keyshawn Johnson, Sterling Sharpe and Randy Moss.
- ▶ Named the NFC Offensive Player of the Week Nov. 2, 2014.

KONY EALY // DE // CAROLINA PANTHERS

- ▶ At Mizzou in 2013, Kony Ealy started all 14 games, setting a new career high in tackles with 43, tackles for loss with 14.5, and sacks with 9.5, while forcing three fumbles and intercepting one pass which he returned 49 yards for a TD against Indiana. For his play, Ealy was named to the first team All-SEC.
- ▶ Ealy was drafted with the 60th pick by the Carolina Panthers in the 2014 NFL Draft following a breakout junior season.
- ▶ On May 29, 2014, Ealy signed a four-year \$3.55 million deal. Per Pro Football Focus, Ealy was one of the highest-graded run defenders of the NFL in the preseason. He made his NFL debut performance in week 2 when the Panthers defeated the Detroit Lions in a 24-7 victory.
- ▶ During Super Bowl 50 against the Denver Broncos, Ealy tied the Super Bowl record of 3 sacks, needing only 23 total snaps. He also recorded an interception and forced fumble in the game. The Panthers would lose the Super Bowl 24-10. Ealy became the first player in Super Bowl history to have an interception and multiple sacks. He's also the first since 1993 to record multiple sacks, an interception and a forced fumble in a postseason game. He tied both Reggie White and Darnell Dockett for the most sacks in Super Bowl with three. He is expected to be a major contributor on a Panthers defense that is expected to be one of the best in the NFL this fall.

- ▶ Originally entered the NFL as the second-round pick (49th overall) by the Kansas City Chiefs in the 2015 NFL Draft. He is projected to be the Chiefs starting center for the second consecutive season.

BLAINE GABBERT // QB // SAN FRANCISCO 49ERS

- ▶ Gabbert was a highly-touted QB coming out of Mizzou following his junior season and was drafted in the first round with the 10th overall pick in 2010. After a rough start to his career in Jacksonville, Gabbert has revived his career in San Francisco.
- ▶ On March 10, 2015, the 49ers re-signed Gabbert to a two-year, \$2 million deal.
- ▶ On November 2, 2015, he was named starter for the 49ers after Colin Kaepernick was benched.
- ▶ He is currently battling for the starting QB nod and is expected to win the job as the season gets underway.

JACQUES SMITH // DE // TAMPA BAY BUCCANEERS

- ▶ Claimed by Tampa Bay off waivers from the Buffalo Bills on September 10, 2014. Originally entered the league as a college free agent with the Miami Dolphins on May 4 2012.
- ▶ Has played in 27 games in two years with Tampa Bay (2014-15), starting 18, and registering 39 tackles, 13.5 sacks, four forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries (one for touchdown), and three passes defended. Since recording the first sack of his career on 11/2/14, Smith's 13.5 sacks are tied for the 19th most in the NFL.

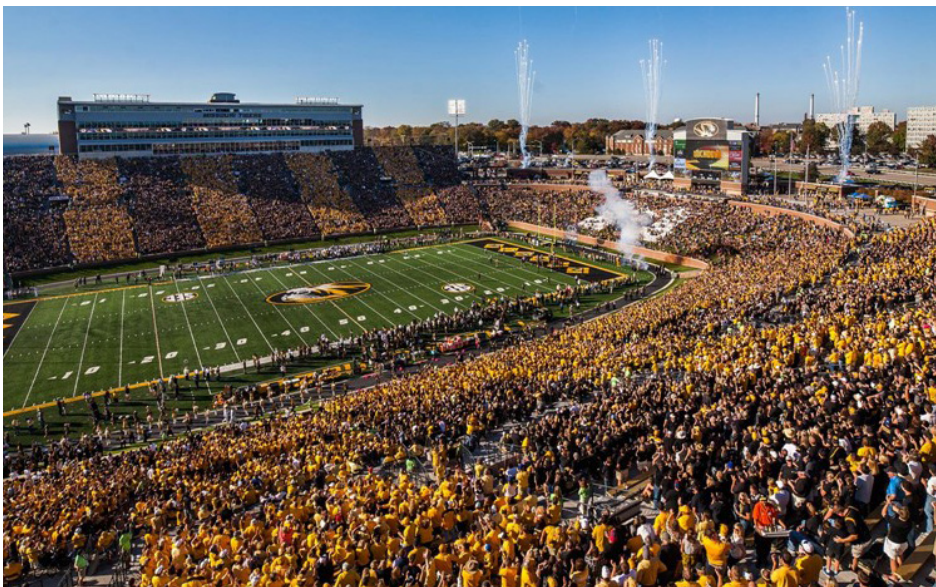
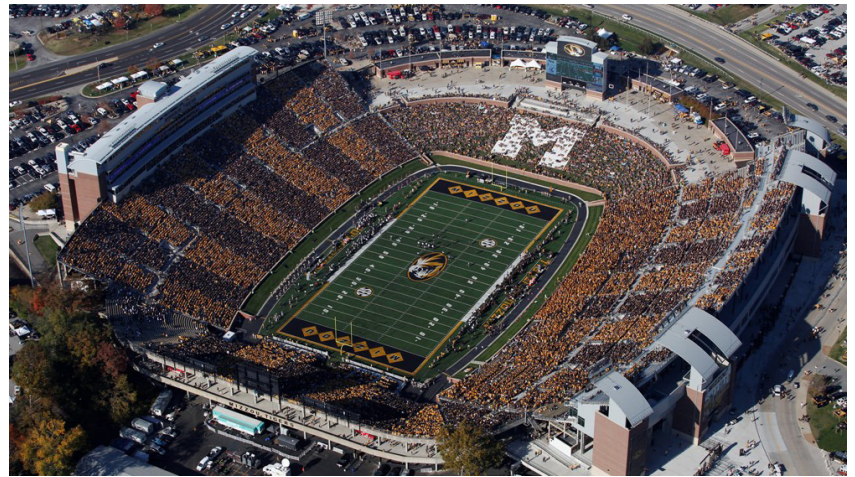

- ▼ Named Memorial Stadium in honor of the 112 Mizzou graduates and students who died in World War I
- ▼ The Rock M overlooking the North endzone debuted in 1927, and was assembled by the freshman class
- ▼ Seating capacity is 71,168 in 2016
- ▼ MU all-time record at Memorial Stadium is 279-178-20 (60.6%)
- ▼ Field was named in 1972 after Hall of Fame Coach Don Faurot
- ▼ Approximately \$50 million of construction investment provided new amenities prior to 2014, including:

 - ▼ A new club/lounge level (called the Columns Club) complete with outdoor loge seating and two suites
 - ▼ New lighting towers

 - ▼ Newly-created tailgating area beyond the southwest corner of the stadium called Truman's Terrace
