Since 1937, Mizzou Baseball has consistently established itself as a power among the landscape of college baseball. That consistency has fostered six College World Series berth and 15 NCAA Regional appearances and 15 conference championships. But as the wind blows atop the hill at Mizzou's storied Taylor Stadium, it brings with it change in the form of a new leader: first-year head coach Steve Bieser. Hired in June, Bieser becomes just the fourth head coach for Mizzou Baseball since 1937 and with a winning pedigree and a unique, analytical approach to the game, he looks primed for a tenure as long as his legendary predecessors as he looks to return Mizzou to national prominence while playing in the nation's premier college baseball conference, the SEC.

While taking on the challenge of posturing Mizzou, the northern-most school in the SEC, among the traditional southern powers of the SEC may seem like a daunting task to many, Bieser appears to be the perfect guy for the iob. An unheralded recruit out of Ste. Genevieve. Mo.. a town of fewer than 5,000 people nestled between St. Louis and Cape Girardeau along Interstate-55, Bieser kept proving the doubters wrong during his playing career. After a successful junior college career, Bieser finally earned a spot on Southeast Missouri's baseball team as a junior where he impresses professional scouts enough to be selected in the 32nd round of the MLB Draft in 1989. With the odds stacked against him - just seven percent of players selected in the

final 30 rounds of the MLB Draft ever reach the big leagues – Bieser used his versatility, playing a variety of positions, to earn a promotion as utility man with Bobby Valentine's New York Mets in 1997 and played 60 games in the majors.

For Bieser, an undersized player who was virtually an unknown coming out of high school, it took an incredible commitment for him to reach his dream of playing Major League Baseball. It took an everyday commitment to excellence; a mantra coined by Bieser that he hopes will come to define his program at Mizzou. Revolving around four key cornerstones - faith, family, education and service - Bieser's commitment to excellence is about getting the most out of every single player in the program, encouraging and motivating them to be the best that they can be. The commitment to excellence on the baseball field starts with being committed to excellence in every part of your life, every day. If that way of life can get an unheralded, undersized and often overlooked Bieser to Major League Baseball, than it can certainly help Mizzou navigate through the toughest conference on college baseball, and restore the program to its spot among the nation's elite.

Bieser has a proven track record of turning around programs, and doing it rather guickly with his commitment to excellence as the foundation. He spent the last four seasons at his alma mater: Southeast Missouri. Under Bieser, the Redhawks experienced a baseball renaissance of sorts. While struggling to a 26-33 mark in his first year as head skipper, Bieser stayed committed to the course and the results were staggering, offering one of the best turnaround stories in all of college baseball. SEMO won 35 games just once in its history before Bieser ran off three consecutive seasons with 35 or more wins with three consecutive Ohio Valley Conference Championships, going 112-64 over that span. He is the only coach ever to win three consecutive Ohio Valley Championships. It was the school's winningest three-year stretch in baseball, twice breaking the program's record for wins in a season. His tenure culminated with SEMO's 2016 team earning the school's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2002.

Moving to 2017, Bieser has his sights set on doing the same thing at Mizzou.

The first order of business for Coach Bieser when he took the job was to get to know his Mizzou players before hitting the ground looking to hire his coaching staff. It is no secret that pitching and defense are the name of the game in the SEC, which is why Bieser was immediately enticed by the credentials of Patrick Hallmark, a coach who helped engineer one of the most successful runs in college baseball at Rice. Bieser tabbed Hallmark as Mizzou's new pitching coach, but it was the versatility that Hallmark brought to the table that was most appealing to Mizzou's first-year coach.

Before serving as Rice's pitching coach, Hallmark also served as the team's hitting and defensive coach while also training the team's catchers. A jack-of-all-trades, Hallmark helped Rice to 11 consecutive NCAA Regionals and three College World Series appearances in multiple roles with the Owls.

"Pat has a reputation of both recruiting and developing successful pitching staffs and he has groomed many professional players from his days at Rice," Bieser said. "But what made Pat stand out was his background as a professional catcher and the versatility he has shown throughout his coaching career, having success coaching both position players and pitchers."

With Hallmark signed up and ready to go, it was time for Bieser to find a recruiting coordinator. That decision was easy as he looked at his SEMO staff and identified Lance Rhodes as a guy who could come in and help Mizzou reload its roster, year after year.

"Coach Rhodes was one of the main reasons why we were successful at Southeast," Bieser said. "He is one of the most organized coaches I have ever been around. He is a tireless recruiter and has a great eye for talent and never leaves a stone unturned. He is also a very accomplished pitching coach. Our staffs at Southeast improved every season under his guidance and he has produced three straight conference pitchers of the year."

After hiring the two full-time assistants, Bieser then rounded out his staff with a variety of impressive hires. First, he retained director of operations Evan Pratte, who has been with Mizzou for 20 years and brings a wealth of knowledge, a tireless work ethic and familiarity with the program that undoubtedly helped with a seamless transition for the new staff. It is also no secret that SEMO's offense was one of the nation's best under Bieser and he brought one of the key reasons for that success to Mizzou in hitting coach and volunteer assistant Dillon Lawson. Lawson's success with the Redhawks parlayed into a job with the Houston Astro's minor league system where he helped the organization become the top offensive organization in America according to the baseball pundits. Using a pitch recognition system and a variety of advanced metrics, Lawson brings a unique approach to hitting and will undoubtedly have a huge impact on Mizzou's hitters.

In another impressive addition, former big league standout Brian McRae joined Bieser's staff as a student manager as he returned to school to finish his college degree at Mizzou. It just so happens that McRae was traded from the Chicago Cubs to the New York Mets in 1997 where he played centerfield. Following the trade, the Mets of course had to send a player down to the minor leagues and that player just happened to be Steve Bieser himself. The two since formed a friendship and that led to their paths again crossing at Mizzou.

Bieser the rounded out his staff with the addition of graduate assistant Joe Migliaccio while retaining former Mizzou standout Brett Peel as a graduate manager.

The 2017 Tigers

Bieser inherits a Mizzou roster filled with talent and potential, highlighted by a dynamic class of juniors, headlined of course by RHP Tanner Houck, who is arguably the top amateur pitcher on the planet. Projected as one of the first 10 players to be taken in this summer's MLB Draft, Houck has electric stuff and incredible confidence on the mound. A preseason All-American by virtually every baseball publication, Houck's dynamic two-seam fastball sits in the mid-90s while featuring a devastating, wipeout slider and a change-up. He has been honored as SEC Pitcher of the Week three times in his career and has twice pitched with USA Baseball's Collegiate National Team. He has thrown more than 100 innings in each of his first two seasons at Mizzou and owns a career ERA of 3.23 and has limited batters to .220 hitting with 197 strikeouts against only 39 walks. While Mizzou has produced the likes of MLB standouts Max Scherzer, Kyle Gibson, Aaron Crow and Rob Zastryzny, Houck may have a higher ceiling than each of those guys. As he takes the mound once a week for Bieser, it will be must-see baseball for Mizzou fans and baseball fans.



While Houck headlines the pitching staff, 6-7, 260-pound righty Bryce Montes De Oca is a wildcard for Bieser and his staff heading into 2017. With a fastball that sits 97-99 while touching triple digits, Montes De Oca was bitten by the injury bug last year as an elbow injury forced him to miss the 2016 campaign. He recovered in time to pitch in the Cape Cod League over the summer and was electric during Mizzou's Fall World Series, limiting batters to .176 hitting in four fall starts. Bieser and Coach Hallmark had him throw as many as 75 pitches as he grew into the starting role. Should he continue his development, he has the potential to give Mizzou a dangerous 1-2 punch at the top of the rotation. Like Houck, Montes De Oca projects as a high draft pick in the summer as Baseball America rated him the No. 100 prospect in the draft.

Behind Houck and MDO, Bieser and Hallmark have plenty of options fighting for that third spot in the weekend rotation. RS junior RHP Cole Bartlett, who was Mizzou's bullpen ace a year ago, showed signs of brilliance in the fall and could factor into the rotation. Another bullpen arm from the 2016 team, RHP Liam Carter, saw improvement in his stuff from a year ago and earned tremendous trust from Mizzou's coaching staff during the fall. With a 6-7 frame, he also can handle the load of a starter and is expected to battle for a job in the rotation. Sophomore LHP Michael Plassmeyer earned last year's Sunday spot in the rotation during an impressive freshman season and will also be battling for that spot again. Look for newcomers junior RHP Andy Toelken and freshman LHP T.J. Sikkema to factor into the mix as well. Toelken has a proven track record of strike throwing and eating innings after a successful junior college career while Sikkema has been described by Bieser has having 'plus' and 'electric' stuff while catching the eye of the coaching staff during an impressive fall campaign.

The batting order, much like the pitching staff, is headlined by a pair of juniors — C Brett Bond and OF Trey Harris. Both players had breakout freshman seasons but took steps back last year. Despite the setbacks, both showed glimpses of being great hitters and both rebounded to have great falls, highlighted by Bond who hit .409 with



a team-high 11 RBI over six games. Harris, an All-SEC Tournament team selection in 2015, also rebounded to hit .300 during the fall and hit with tremendous pop.


While Bond and Harris will certainly steal most of the headlines heading into the season, the hitter primed for the biggest breakout is sophomore 1B Brian Sharp. He led all Mizzou batters with a .478 average during the Fall World Series while leading the team in homers, total bases, slugging, on-base percentage and walks. He reached base in 66 percent of his at-bats during the fall, drawing a team-high 12 walks; the next-best total on the team was seven. Bieser told the Columbia Daily Tribune that Sharp's approach is 'as good as anybody in the league, as good as anybody I've seen at the college level.'

Newcomer Alex Samples is projected as the team's starting third baseman as he can flat out hit and has middle-of-the-order power. He highlights a trio of newcomers who should factor into the infield, along with junior college standout SS Robbie Glendinning and freshman SS Chris Cornelius. Glendinning hit 42 homers over two seasons at Northern lowa Community College and projects as a high draft choice in the summer. Cornelius pushed Glendinning all fall for the starting SS gig and should see plenty of playing time as a freshman.

The outfield will feature returners Kirby McGuire, Connor Brumfield, Harris and freshman Kameron Misner battling for playing time. Misner has the most power potential on the team, an impressive feat considering Glendinning hit 42 homers in two seasons in junior college. Speedster Johnny Balsamo also figures into the mix in the outfield as a plus defender with elite speed.

So as Bieser and his Mizzou team head into spring practices, there is still a lot to be determined, but a young, talented group has the potential to surprise many across the landscape of college baseball this season.

Mizzou Baseball will face a competitive 2017 schedule that features 16 games against NCAA Tournament teams from a season ago and SEC home series against Arkansas, Florida, Kentucky, Texas A&M and South Carolina



For the second consecutive season, Mizzou will open the season at City of Palms Park in Fort Myers, Fla., hosting Eastern Michigan in a four-game series, beginning Feb. 17 at 2 p.m. The Tigers then head to Corpus Christi, Texas, for the second weekend of play, playing Texas A&M Corpus Christi, Houston and Illinois from Feb. 23-26. Mizzou last played in Corpus Christi during the 2015 season, going 3-1 during the second weekend that year, allowing just four runs over the four games.

Mizzou opens its home schedule with a nine-game homestand, beginning March 3 with a three-game set against Illinois-Chicago. Eastern Illinois visits Taylor Stadium midweek on March 7 before Mizzou hosts a three-game weekend series against Appalachian State (March 10-12) and a two-game midweek series with Chicago State (March 14-15).

Bieser's group will open SEC play at Alabama, playing in the Tide's recently renovated Sewell-Thomas Stadium on March 17-19. It marks Mizzou's first trip to Alabama since May of 2013. A midweek contest with UALR at Taylor Stadium awaits on March 21 before Mizzou hosts Arkansas in the SEC home opener on March 24-26. Mizzou defeated nationally-ranked Arkansas in a three-game series last season in Fayetteville.

Spring Break week opens as Mizzou will continue an eight-game homestand with Bieser welcoming his former team, Southeast Missouri, to Taylor Stadium on March 28 with a 3 p.m. first pitch. Florida then comes to Taylor Stadium that weekend (March 31-April 2) for another exciting SEC home series. Mizzou will then play Illinois for the second time during the 2017 season, doing so at GCS Ballpark in Sauget, Ill., for the third consecutive season. That game is scheduled for a 6:30 p.m. first pitch on April 4.

Mizzou is slated to play a Thursday-Saturday series at Georgia on April 6-8 before returning home for a six-game homsetand, beginning with a two-game series against Arkansas-Pine Bluff on April 11-12. Kentucky then comes to Taylor Stadium from April 14-16 and Mizzou renews its in-state rivalry with Missouri State on April 18 with a 6:30 p.m. first pitch at Taylor Stadium.

Mizzou will then make its second trip to Ole Miss since joining the SEC for a three-game series from April 21-23 before playing the return trip to Missouri State on April 25 at Hammons Field in Springfield. Texas A&M visits Taylor Stadium from April 28-30 and Mizzou opens May with a midweek home game against Murray State on May 2. A three-game series at Vanderbilt follows that weekend (May 5-7).

Finals week follows and Mizzou will be off during that midweek period before welcoming South Carolina to Taylor Stadium on May 12-14. A midweek contest against Eastern Kentucky on May 16 and a road series at Tennessee from May 18-20 round out the regular season slate before Mizzou heads to Hoover, Ala., for the SEC Tournament from May 23-28.

1nd Season at Mizzou - Head Coach Southeast Missouri, 1989 Career Record: 138-97 **♥** @biesersr

Mizzou will usher in a new era of baseball as Steve Bieser has been tabbed as the next head coach, announced June 30. Bieser (pronounced: Bee-zer) will be Mizzou's 14th head coach and just the fourth since 1937. Bieser comes to Mizzou after an extremely successful career at Southeast Missouri, where he became the only coach ever to win three consecutive Ohio Valley Conference Championships and guided the Redhawks to their first NCAA Regional last year since 2002.

A two-time OVC Coach of the Year, Bieser won 35 or more games in each of his last three seasons at SEMO, a feat that had been accomplished just once before he took over the program in 2013. Bieser turned in a .587 winning percentage in his time at SEMO, the best among any coach in program history.

Bieser turned in a banner year in 2016, as he earned his 100th career victory and opened OVC play with a perfect 12-0 record, the best start in program history. The season culminated in a regular season OVC Championship, an OVC Tournament title and the school's first NCAA Regional since 2002, qualifying for the Starkville Regional at SEC Champion Mississippi State.

Prior to serving as SEMO's head coach beginning in 2013, Bieser was the pitching coach for his alma mater from 2011-12 and he carried his prowess for developing hurlers into his head coaching tenure. His most notable pupil was LHP Joey Lucchesi, who became the only pitcher to ever win OVC Pitcher of the Year in back-to-back season. Lucchesi shattered the Southeast Missouri and Ohio Valley single-season strikeout records while also consistently leading the nation in 2016 in the category. He became the first Southeast pitcher to win 10 games in 13 years. He was on the watch lists for the prestigious Golden Spike Award, as well as the College Baseball Hall of Fame's National Pitcher of the Year award.

Following the season, Lucchesi became the highest draft pick ever out of Southeast Missouri when he was selected in the fourth round (114th overall pick) by the San Diego Padres. He was one of two Redhawks drafted in 2016, marking the first time since 2012 that Southeast had multiple draft picks.

"I am truly honored and humbled to have the opportunity to be a part of the University of Missouri community and serve as the head baseball coach," Bieser said. "I can't express enough the gratitude I have for Interim Chancellor Foley, Athletic Director Mack Rhoades and the search committee for having the confidence in me to lead this program. When I started my coaching career, I had always dreamed of the opportunity to lead this program. There is a strong tradition and rich history of Missouri Tiger baseball. I understand the responsibility and I am fully committed and ready to continue building the tradition. As life-long Missourians, my family and I feel truly blessed to be part of the University of Missouri and the Columbia community."

Aside from success on the field, academic success was a hallmark of Bieser's program at SEMO. He mentored three Academic All-Americans, 10 Academic All-District picks, one OVC Scholar-Athlete, six OVC Medal of Honor recipients and 48 OVC Commissioner's Honor Roll selections. SEMO had at least a 3.0 cumulative grade-point-average in all four years under Bieser, grabbing one OVC Team Academic Award along the way.

After a successful playing career at SEMO, Bieser was drafted in the 32nd round of the 1989 MLB Draft by the Philadelphia Phillies. He played 13 years as a professional with nine of those years coming at AAA or higher. He made his Major League debut on April 1, 1997, with the New York Mets and played 60 career MLB

Bieser made his Major League debut as a catcher, but his versatility led him to play a variety of positions over his career. He closed out his professional career with Memphis (AAA), where he guided the Redbirds to a AAA World Series in 2000. He played every position on the field during his professional career.

Bieser, a native of Saint Genevieve, Mo., went to Southeast after a very successful campaign as head coach at St. John Vianney High School in Kirkwood, Mo. In seven seasons leading the Griffins, his team won two state championships in 2004 and 2006. He compiled a record of 137-51.

Bieser and his wife, Diahann, have a son Cole and three daughters, Whitley, Briley and Carley.

PATRICK HALLMARK

1st Season at Mizzou Rice, 2002 Pitching Coach

Patrick Hallmark comes to Mizzou after an impressive run at Rice, where he helped build the team into a national power. Aside from reaching NCAA Regional play in all 11 seasons with Hallmark on staff, Rice made three trips to the College World Series (2006-2008) with five Super Regional appearances. A proven winner and a catcher by trade, Hallmark transitioned to the Owls pitching coach role prior to the 2013 season and the team saw immediate success under his guidance. In 2015, Rice pitching finished 12th in the NCAA in strikeouts per nine innings (8.8) and registered the fifth-highest single-season saves total in school history (18) while also finishing among the NCAA's top teams for ERA (3.16), hits allowed per 9.0 innings (8.2) and WHIP (1.27). A total of five Rice pitchers were selected in the 2015 Major League Draft.

In 2014, Rice pitching finished 13th in the NCAA with a new school record for ERA (2.56). The Owls were also 20th in the nation in both fewest hits allowed per game (7.7) and WHIP (1.19). Rice pitchers registered 18 saves while also finishing with the program's lowest number of walks since the mid-1980s (192 walks in 573.1 inn., 3.0 per game). He mentored LHP Blake Fox to consensus All-America honors and 2014 Conference USA Pitcher of the Year accolades that year as well.



In his first year as pitching coach at Rice in 2013, his Owls set a Rice single season record with 12 shutouts, ranking second in the NCAA that year. Hallmark's versatility as a coach was paramount to Rice's success and appealed to Bieser, who was the model of versatility during his major league playing career. Before coaching pitchers, Hallmark was the Owls hitting coach and trained catchers and outfielders defensively.

Hallmark was a successful player, earning All-Southwest Conference honors in 1995 while guiding Rice to its first 40-win season in 11 years. He played nine years of professional baseball after being drafted by the Royals in 1995. He played in two minor league All-Star games and was part of three consecutive minor league champion teams from 1997-99.

"I am super excited to join Mizzou and Coach Bieser's staff," Hallmark said. "I've heard nothing but great things about him. His offensive teams at Southeast were incredible and I look forward to seeing what we can do together at Mizzou. Being part of the SEC is what every good coach wants. It's the biggest challenge there is in our profession. It is going to be a step up. It's going to fun and exciting and we have a lot of work to do, but I am really excited."

Lance Rhodes was brought to Mizzou from Southeast Missouri by head coach Steve Bieser. Rhodes was a vital part of the success that Southeast Missouri had under Bieser's direction, serving as the program's pitching coach and recruiting coordinator. He brought in some of top talent that Southeast Missouri has ever had, including two OVC Pitchers of the Year. His recruits were a key reason why the Redhawks went from 26 wins in his first year to 37 in his second, 36 in his third and 39 in his fourth, including an NCAA Regional in 2016. His 2014 signing class was the cornerstone of the team's three consecutive regular season OVC Championships (2014-16). He recruited 16 players who went on to earn All-OVC honors over those three seasons.

Rhodes' impact as pitching coach was felt quickly as well. He inherited a pitching staff with a combined ERA of 6.37 and lowered it to 4.00 last season. In 2015, Rhodes guided Southeast Missouri to OVC-bests in ERA and opponent batting.

Rhodes was the primary position coach for a pair of OVC Pitcher of the Year winners – two-time winner Joey Lucchesi and Travis Hayes. Lucchesi was outstanding during his draft year in 2016, posting a 2.19 ERA with 149 strikeouts, averaging 12.08 per nine innings.

Rhodes, a former pitcher and volunteer assistant coach for the Redhawks returned to Southeast after serving as assistant coach for three seasons at Wabash Valley College in Illinois. He served as the pitching coach for the Warriors as they compiled 95 wins over a span of two seasons. While at Wabash Valley College he helped lead the Warriors to back-to-back Great Rivers Athletic Conference regular-season titles. The Warriors also won their first conference tournament championship in 14 years in 2010.

In 2012, Wabash Valley recorded a record of 48-13 as they ranked as high as third in the NJCAA Division I polls, their highest national ranking in school history. His pitching staff recorded an impressive ERA of 2.78.

He was also the pitching coach for the Quincy Gems of the Prospect League in the summer of 2009. He led the Gems to a Western Division Championship that season.

Rhodes graduated from Southeast Missouri in 2008 with a degree in general studies with an emphasis in physical education. He made 37 appearances for Southeast over two seasons with the Redhawks.

The Sikeston, Mo., native received his master's degree in physical education from Emporia State University. Rhodes and his wife Brittney have two sons, Max (2) and Cooper (1).

"Being a guy who is from the state of Missouri, having an opportunity to Mizzou, the state's flagship university, truly is a dream job for me," Rhodes said. "Being in the SEC is an opportunity to compete alongside the best programs in the country and it gives you a chance to work with the best talent in college baseball and that excites me. I am also really happy that I get the chance to coach at Mizzou with Coach Bieser. I know how much this job means to him and he is someone I am extremely comfortable with and that will allow for a smooth transition. We have a lot of work to do - it is going to be exciting and I can't wait to get started."

DILLON LAWSON

1st Season at Mizzou Transylvania, 2007 Hitting Coach

Dillon Lawson will serve as Mizzou's hitting coach and is coming off of a successful stint as the Houston Astros' Class A affiliate hitting coach. He was the hitting coach for two Ohio Valley Conference Champion teams at Southeast Missouri from 2013-15 for Bieser.

Lawson was a key contributor to Southeast Missouri's success under Bieser as he mentored an offense that ranked among the league's best over his three seasons. During his second season with the Redhawks, the offense ranked ninth in the nation in batting and eighth in the nation in runs per game (7.2). Only eight teams in the nation scored more runs than SEMO that season. His offense also swiped the 10th-most bases in the nation in 2014 with 97 total steals.

His Redhawk offense was even better in 2015, ranking third in the nation in scoring, fifth in runs, sixth in on-base percentage and seventh in home runs. His team also drew the third-most walks in the nation that season and ranked 12th nationally with a .303 team average and in hits. Southeast Missouri averaged 8.0 runs per game and slugged 66 total homers.

His contributions to the Redhawk offense caught the eye of the Houston Astros, who hired Lawson away from SEMO in January of 2016 and he has served as club's Class A affiliate in Tri-City (New York), a position he has held until taking the job on Bieser's staff at Mizzou.



Lawson received his master's degree in education with an emphasis in strength and conditioning from Lindenwood in 2008. He and his wife, Amanda, welcomed son, Asa "Ace" Dash, on April 29, 2014.



EVAN PRATTE

20th Season at Mizzou Southwest Missouri State, 1991 **Director of Operations**

Evan Pratte enters his 20th season as part of the Mizzou staff. He enters his sixth year as the Tigers' Director of Baseball Operations after spending the previous 13 years as an assistant coach, working with the hitters and infielders.

Serving as the Director of Baseball Operations, Pratte is still heavily involved in the success of the program. He handles a variety of responsibilities that ensure that the student-athletes at Mizzou get one of the best experiences possible while playing collegiate baseball. From arranging travel to handling a wide variety of daily activities, Pratte's contributions help the entire team and coaching staff succeed. He also brings with him a wealth of baseball experience after spending years as a player and coach.

One of the best hitters while at Southwest Missouri State (now Missouri State), Pratte helped 34 Mizzou hitters to All-Conference recognition as the Tigers' hitting coach from

of at least .400 since 1986. He ended his career at Mizzou as the school's all-time leader in career hits with 291 and earned All-America honors, along with being named the Big

Baseball Draft.

Tigers hit a school-record 110 home runs - a figure that ranked sixth nationally- and also posted a school record .572 slugging percentage. The 2001 squad tied a Mizzou record with 83 stolen bases, matching the mark set in 1979. In 2006, Mizzou scored 10 or more runs in 13 games and in 2005, the Tigers ranked 12th in the nation in scoring, averaging 8.1 runs per game.

Evan Frey's .348 batting Coleman tallied nine homers and earned Big 12 Freshman of the Year and Freshman All-America honors.

Missouri ranked fifth in the Big 12 with a .301 batting average in 2008, the best team average since posting a .307 mark in 2003. Six Tigers hit over .300 for the year, led by Senne (.347), Lollis (.339) and Priday (.332). Priday finished his four-year career at Mizzou as one of the best hitters in MU history, leaving as the school's record holder for

Pratte joined the Missouri coaching staff in 1998 via his alma mater, where he served as a volunteer assistant coach for two seasons. Pratte graduated from SMS (now Missouri State) following a four-year career with the Bears, in which he led the team to three conference crowns as a standout infielder from 1988-91. He was a first-team all-conference pick in 1990 and 1991 and added all-region honors in 1991.

Still a record holder in many categories in SMS history, he finished his career with 18 home runs, 152 runs batted in and a .335 batting average in 220 games. He held the records in games played, at-bats, hits, singles, total bases, sacrifice hits, assists and double plays when his college career ended.

He also ranks among the Bears' all-time leaders in nearly a dozen other categories. Between his collegiate playing days and his coaching career, Pratte played five seasons in the Detroit Tigers' organization, including stops in Niagara Falls, Fayetteville, London, Lakeland and Trenton. He led in several offensive categories during his time in Niagara Falls and Fayetteville.

Pratte's first coaching position came as the head coach of the National Baseball Congress' Nevada (Mo.) Griffons in 1997, where he led the team to a 46-15 record. The Griffons won the League by six games and placed second in the 32-team NBC World Series in his only season as the team's skipper.

Pratte's wife, Jill, works as a certified athletic trainer at Central Methodist University in Fayette, Mo. They have one son, Paul Evan (10).

1st Season at Mizzou Oral Roberts, 2013

Joe Migliaccio comes to Mizzou after serving as Bieser's volunteer assistant at Southeast Missouri last season, working on the defensive development of position players and assisting with the offense. Before Southeast Missouri, he was at Siena, where he guided the team to its thirdbest fielding percentage in program history in 2015. He implemented new catching a defensive development programs while at Siena. In 2015, the infield completed conference games with a .981 fielding percentage, committing only eight errors, which was an improvement from .958 (21 errors) in

Migliaccio played college baseball at FIU and Parkland College before transferring to Oral Roberts to finish his degree, graduating with Cum Laude distinction with a degree in recreation administration and a minor in humanities while playing shortstop for the Golden Eagles.



BRIAN McRAE

1st Season at Mizzou

Brian McRae will join the program as a student assistant as he will finish his undergraduate degree after a 10-year career in Major League Baseball, including stints with the Kansas City Royals, Chicago Cubs, New York Mets, Colorado Rockies and Toronto Blue Jays. In his nine years as a professional, McRae hit .261 with 103 home runs and 532 RBIs. He also stole 196 bases, including a career-high 37 with the Cubs in 1996. His best offensive season came in 1998 when he led the Mets in doubles, triples and steals while slugging 21 homers, 79 RBI and 80 walks, all career-bests. It was his first 20-homer, 20-steal season in the majors.

McRae is the son of former Major League All-Star and former Kansas City Royals manager Hal McRae. He was born in Bradenton, Fla., before moving to Blue Springs, Mo., where he was an All-State honoree in both baseball and football. He was selected in the first round of the 1985 MLB draft (17th overall) and bypassed a football scholarship at Kansas. He made his major league debut five years later in 1990 as the team's center fielder, replacing an injured Bo Jackson.

Brian then played for his father, Hal, as he took over managing duties in 1991. It was just the fourth instance of a player being managed by his father in MLB history. Brian went on to play until 1999 with his final game coming in a Blue Jays uniform in 1999.

He then spent time as an analyst for WGN-TV and did five years working radio for MLB.com and appeared on ESPN's Baseball Tonight as well.

STUDENT MANAGER 1ST SEASON

BRETT PEEL

2nd Season at Mizzou Mizzou, 2015

Former Mizzou standout Brett Peel, who played at Mizzou for the 2014 and 2015 seasons, joins the coaching staff in 2016 as a graduate manager for the second season. Peel was Mizzou's starting second baseman in 2015 and was one of the emotional leaders of the team, serving as captain. He brought a grinder and winning mentality to Mizzou's roster, traits that revered him to Mizzou's coaches.

Peel started 57 games in 2015, leading off in 46 of those contests while hitting .257 with a teamhigh 40 runs, which were the most by a Tiger since 2012. He also stole 22 bases on the season, which ranked fifth in the SEC and tops on the team. His 22 steals rank as the third-most in a single season at Mizzou and were the most by a Tiger since Torre Tyson stole 37 in 1998. He is just the seventh Tiger ever to steal more than 20 bags in a season.

Peel also just missed etching his name atop the school record list as he reached base in 30 consecutive games in 2015, falling just two short of the school record.



2016 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

TEAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Senior 1B **Zach Lavy** had a breakout senior season, finishing the year with team-best totals in batting (.332), RBI (54), doubles (18), triples (eight), homers (eight), slugging (.603), extra-base hits (34) and total bases (129). He came in a career .230 hitter and was Mizzou's best player. He was an Olson Award Semifinalist, an award that goes to college baseball's top breakout player. He led the SEC in extra-base hits and led the nation in triples at the end of the regular season.
- Mizzou sophomore righty Tanner Hocuk was twice named SEC Pitcher of the Week, earning Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week once. He finished the season by earning ABCA/Rawlings Division I All-Region honors after posting a 2.99 ERA in 15 satrts, winning five games. He struck out a team-best 106 against only 27 walks while limiting batters to .209 hitting.
- Mizzou had four players selected in the Major League Baseball First Year Player Draft in June. SS **Ryan Howard** led the group with a fifth-round selection by the San Francisco Giants. Senior RHP **Reggie McClain** was taken in the 13th round by the Mariners. Junior CF **Jake Ring** was a 31st-round selection by the Orioles and **Austin Tribby** was a 35th-round pick by the Twins.
- Mizzou will ushered in a new era of baseball as Steve Bieser was tabbed as the next head coach, announced by Mizzou in June. Bieser (pronounced: Bee-zer) will be Mizzou's 14th head coach and just the fourth since 1937. Bieser comes to Mizzou after an extremely successful career at Southeast Missouri, where he became the only coach ever to win three consecutive Ohio Valley Conference Championships and guided the Redhawks to their first NCAA Regional last year since 2002. A two-time OVC Coach of the Year, Bieser won 35 or more games in each of his last three seasons at SEMO, a feat that had been accomplished just once before he took over the program in 2013. Bieser turned in a .587 winning percentage in his time at SEMO, the best among any coach in program history.
- Bieser rounded out his coaching staff throughout the rest of the summer. He added Patrick Hallmark, formerly of Rice, as the team's pitching coach. Lance Rhodes, who was with Bieser at SEMO, joined the program as the recruiting coordinator and he tabbed Dillon Lawson, formerly of the Houston Astros, as the team's hitting coach. Director of Operations Evan Pratte was retained the in the same role and Bieser also added former big leaguer Brian McRae as a student manager and Joe Migliaccio as a graduate assistant.

TIGERS IN THE PROS

The presence of former Missouri Tiger Baseball players in professional baseball continues to grow each year. In 2010, five more players signed contracts. That brings the number of former MU players signing pro contracts to 159. Mizzou Head Coach Tim Jamieson has seen 69 players in his 20 years as head coach sign pro contracts.

As many as 20 former Mizzou greats have made it through the ranks and onto Major League rosters. Tim Laudner played for the 1987 World Champion Minnesota Twins. Phil Bradley played for several big league teams in 1980s and early '90s. Last year, three former Tigers spent times in the Major Leagues, including two-time All-Star selection lan Kinsler, who played in the 2012 World Series with the Texas Rangers.

Max Scherzer, became the highest ever draft pick in MU history when he was selected by Arizona with the 11th overall pick in 2006. In 2008, Aaron Crow replaced Scherzer as the highest ever Tiger draft pick, when the Washington Nationals drafted Crow with the ninth pick. Crow did not sign with Washington and re-entered the draft in 2009, where he was taken by the Kansas City Royals with the 12th pick Ten picks later Kyle Gibson was drafted by the Minnesota Twins, marking the first time in school history that two Tigers were selected in the first round of the draft.





MISSOURI INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

Herb Bunker • 1923

Class of 1990

A native of Nevada, Mo., Herb Bunker is one of only two four-sport letterwinners in Missouri athletic history. He lettered tour-sport letterwinners in Missouri athletic history. He lettered in football, basketball, baseball and track and field between 1920-23. In basketball, Bunker earned All-Missouri Valley Conference honors as a guard in 1921 and 1922, and was an All-American in 1921 and 1923. A tackle/center in football, he captained the Tigers in 1922. He was a catcher/outfielder in baseball, and threw the shot put on the track team. A Phi Beta Kappa student who earned a Ph.D. in sociology, Bunker headed Mizzou's department of physical education for many years before retiring in 1965. He spent nine years as football coach and athletics director at Culver-Stockton College in Canton. Mo., and also coached at Missouri Stockton College in Canton, Mo., and also coached at Missouri, Auburn and Florida and at Paseo High School in Kansas City, Mo.

Hubert Pruett • 1921

A pitcher from Malden, Mo., Hubert Pruett lettered just one year at Missouri, in 1921, but made his mark on the Major League Baseball world with his ability to strike out the great Babe Ruth. Pruett compiled a 29-48 record, pitching for the St. Louis Browns, New York Giants, Boston Braves and Philadelphia Phillies. Pruett perfected a "screwball" and used it to strike out Ruth 10 of the text 12 times be feed him leaf lub feed glath 20 times. The first 13 times he faced him. In all, he faced Ruth 30 times. The "Babe" got only four hits in those at bats (including one home run off a curveball), struck out 15 times, walked eight times, sacrificed once, and grounded out twice. He retired from baseball in 1932 and Pruett was a doctor in St. Louis for 40 years.

Norm Stewart • 1954-56 Class of 1990

A native of Shelbyville, Mo., Norm Stewart lettered at Missouri in basketball and baseball for three years. He was inducted as an athlete since his induction came during his tenure as Missouri's head basketball coach. He threw a no-hitter and won one game in the 1954 College World Series as the Tigers won the national title. Stewart led the 1955 and 1956 Tigers in victories, innings pitched, strikeouts, appearances, games started and complete games. He also led the 1955 team in earned-run average. Stewart's accomplishments on the basketball floor both as a player and coach at Missouri are legendary. He scored 1,112 points in three seasons and recorded 634 wins at Mizzou as head coach. When he retired after the 1998-99 season, Stewart ranked seventh all-time in the NCAA with 731 career wins.

Don Faurot • 1922-24 Class of 1990

While this name is more recognizable for Faurot's accomplishments on the football field, Faurot was an infielder for the Tigers for three seasons. Faurot left his legacy on the University as football coach and director of athletics. Aside from leading the Tigers out of debt and into football's elite, his tenure as reaching the figers out of teach and into football seller, his teriore as football coach and director of athletics — a job he relinquished in 1967 — left MU athletics with its greatest legacy, the imprint of his integrity. His prime contribution to football was his innovation of the Split-T formation at Mizzou in 1941.

Paul Christman • 1938-39, 41

Class of 1990
The legendary "Pitchin" Paul" Christman lettered three times each in football and baseball. A three-time all-conference quarterback, Christman finished third in the 1939 Heisman Trophy voting.

Chester Brewer • Coach Class of 1991

In addition to serving as athletic director from 1911-17 and 1924-34, Chester Brewer served as the school's football, basketball, baseball and track and field coach. In seven seasons, he led the Tiger Nine to a mark of 61-32-3.

Norm Wagner ● 1931-33 Class of 1991 Norm Wagner lettered at Missouri in basketball and baseball from 1931-33 and led the Tigers to conference titles in 1931 and 1932. He won 27 games in his career — a record that stood until 1980. He was a member of the St. Louis Cardinals organization after graduation. He also led the 1932-33 Tiger Basketball squad in scoring on his way to earning all-conference

Bob Schoonmaker • 1952-54

Class of 1991

A three-sport athlete, Bob Schoonmaker earned eight letters during his time at Missouri. An infielder from Lebanon, Mo., Schoonmaker was an all-conference performer in 1954 as the Tigers won the College World Series. He hit .307 that season with a team-high two triples and committed only one error in 171 chances. He also was on the 1952 national runner-up team, hitting a home run in the championship game. In football, he was a two-time captain and earned three letters on the gridiron. Schoonmaker also lettered on the basketball team for two years.

Don Boenker • 1951-53

Don Boenker ● 1951-53
Class of 1993
Missouri's first All-American pitcher in 1952, Don Boenke led the Tigers to the Big Seven Conference championship, the NCAA District V championship, and a second-place finish at the College World Series. A Tiger co-captain for Coach John "Hi" Simmons in 1953, he later signed with the Cleveland Indians and during his professional career, was coached by Whitey Kurowski, George Steinbrenner and Hub Kittle among others. He twice led MU in victories in addition to tossing a pair of one-hitters against Washington University in 1951 and Kansas State in 1952. He also authored a two-hitter against lowa State in 1952. A native of St. Louis, Boenker was inducted into the Mizzou QEBH Honorary Society as an undergraduate and holds three degrees from the Society as an undergraduate and holds three degrees from the University of Missouri.

1954 National Champions

Class of 1994

The 1954 squad captured MU's first national title at the College World Series. The Tigers posted a 22-4 record, won the Big Seven Conference title and came back through the losers bracket to capture the national championship. MU had a 12-game win streak during the season.

Lowe 'Junior' Wren • 1951-52
Class of 1994
One of several standout two-sport athletes, 'Junior' Wren was an All-American outfielder in 1952. He hit a team-high .408 to go with seven stolen bases in 1951 before hitting .359 in the 1952 regular season. Wren also pitched one game in the 1952 college World Series, striking out 11 batters while throwing a two-hitter against Penn State. A member of Missouri's 1952 national runner-up team, Wren also was an all-conference football player in 1951 after leading the team in rushing, total offense and punting.

Thornton Jenkins • 1946 Class of 1995

Thornton Jenkins, who also played basketball at Mizzou, lettered one year on the Missouri diamond. The leading scorer for the 1942-43 Tiger hoopsters, Jenkins lettered four times in basketball.

Dave Silvestri • 1986-88 Class of 1997

In a span of four months in 1988, Dave Silvestri was named an All-American shortstop, chosen in the second round by the Houston Astros in the Major League Baseball First-Year Draft and was a member of the 1988 Summer Olympics gold medal winning United States baseball team. Silvestri hit .406 in 1988 to go with 21 home runs and a school-record 89 runs scored. His marks that season for total bases, slugging percentage and extra-base hits are Missouri records. Called by many to be the greatest Missouri baseball player of the modern era, Silvestri could hit for average and power as well as field his position and run the bases. He was a two-time all-conference, all-district and All-America player. He played in the majors with the 1994 New York Yankees. He is still involved with baseball as he was featured in a Sports Illustrated article in 2001 managing the Great Falls Dodgers.

Keith Weber • 1963-64 Class of 1998

Keith Weber might well be the greatest pitcher in Missouri's long and glorious baseball history. In 1964, he set the MU record for earned run average (0.56), won 11 games and struck out 9 batters as the Tigers went 26-5-1 and advanced to the College World Series. Those 11 wins are still tied for the school singleseason record, and the strikeout total stood as the record for 26 years. His ERA contributed to a team figure of 0.65 that still stands as the NCAA record, and in this era of the aluminum bat, will probably never be broken. Weber, from Jefferson City, was All-Big Eight, All-District V and All-America in 1964, and signed with the New York Mets. He also was a quarterback in football, but injuries ended his career before he competed on the varsity level.

Greg Cypret • 1975-78 Class of 1998

One of the most prolific players of the Gene McArtor era in baseball at Ol' Mizzou, Greg Cypret earned All-America honors three times at shortstop. He was a third-team selection in 1975, received honorable mention in 1976 and was a first-team selection in 1978. He was the All-Big Eight shortstop in 1976-78. Cypret hit .356 for his career and held the school career marks for hits (253) and runs batted in (181). He signed with the Houston Astros in 1978. After his professional career, Cypret joined former MU assistant coach Bob Todd on the Kent State coaching staff. He is now on the staff at Ohio State.

Clair 'Butch' Houston • 1931-35 Class of 1999

Butch Houston earned nine letters at Ol' Mizzou — three each in football, baseball and track. He also played two years of basketball but did not letter. A native of Maywood, Ill., he was the captain of Coach Don Faurot's first team at MU in 1935, and earned honorable mention honors as a fullback. He was also the Tigers' starting fullback in 1932 and '33.

Gene McArtor • 1961-93 Class of 1999

Ray Uriarte • 1953, 1957-58 **Class of 2000**

A first-team all-American third baseman in 1958 who came to Mizzou from nearby Mexico, Mo, Ray Uriarte walked on at MU in 1952, but was cut by legendary Coach John "Hi" Simmons. He later returned to ask "Why?" and Simmons told him he could try again when the team began outdoor workouts. He did, made the team, and went on to play four games as a freshman. He lettered in 1953, but his career was interrupted by military service, and made 18 jumps but its career was interrupted by fillintary service, air intake to jurily as a paratrooper in two years. He returned to Mizzou and was elected team captain in 1957. Uriarte led the Tigers to the 1958 Big Seven championship, the District V title and to second place in the College World Series. He led the team with 17 stolen bases, 39 runs scored, 36 walks and an on-base percentage of .662, which still stands as the MU single-season record. In addition to his all-American recognition in 1958, Uriarte also received all-Big Eight and all-District V honors that season. Called by Coach Simmons "the best leadoff man I ever had at the University," Uriarte later served as an assistant coach for Simmons in 1959 and 1960.

Dave Otto • 1983-85 Class of 2000

A native of Elk Grove, Ill., Dave Otto was a standout pitcher and designated hitter from 1983-85. An All-American DH in 1985, Otto earned all-Big Eight and All-District V honors as he hit 16 home runs. He stood fifth on the MU career batting average chart home runs. He stood fifth on the MU career batting average chart (.366). An imposing figure on the mound, Otto stood third with 195 strikeouts. He shares the school record for games started in a season (14). A freshman All-American at Mizzou in 1983, Otto earned Verizon/CoSIDA Academic All-America honors in 1984 and 1985. He signed with the Oakland Athletics in 1985, and spent time in the major leagues with the As in 1988-90. Otto was traded to the Cleveland Indians in 1990 and was in their starting rotation in 1991 and 1992. He pitched with the Pittsburgh Pirates in 1993.



Sonny Siebert • 1956-58 Class of 2004

An impact player in two sports for Mizzou, the St. Louis, Mo. native Sonny Siebert, lettered in basketball three years (1956-58) and one year in baseball (1958). He earned third-team All-American honors in baseball, as a first baseman in 1958 and was also an All-District V and All-Big Eight selection that season, as he helped lead MU to the championship game of the College World Series, where MU lost in 12 innings to Southern Cal, 8-7. Siebert was named to the all-time College World Series team for the decade of the 1950s. He tied for the team lead in home runs, with eight in 1958 and later signed with the Cleveland Indians in 1958, and played at the major league level with several teams as a pitcher.

Ray Thorpe • 1965-67 Class of 2004

Ray Thorpe was a two-sport standout who was recruited to play football at Mizzou, but also later excelled in baseball, while also running indoor track for one season. The St. Louis, Mo. native was also the first African-American to play baseball for Mizzou and earned All-American honors in 1967 in baseball, after leading the Tigers in hits, triples, home runs, stolen bases and walks. He was named to the Missouri College Baseball Hall of Fame in 1967 and played on the USA's Pan-American baseball squad in 1966. Harvey was a game-breaker on the gridiron for Coach Dan Devine, playing a big role on the 1965 MU squad that eventually won the 1966 Sugar Bowl. He proved instrumental to the team during the year, as he provided numerous big plays, scoring touchdowns that won a game against Oklahoma State and forced a tie against UCLA. His TD against Oklahoma State was a 42-yard run on a lateral from Gary Kombrink, and accounted for the only score in a 7-0 MU win. Harvey's touchdown against UCLA was a scintillating 79-yard kick return that got MU back into the game after the Bruins had taken a 14-0 lead - the game ended in a 14-14 tie. After graduating from Mizzou in 1967, Thorpe coached high school football in the St. Louis area, and during his teaching and coaching tenure, he was influential in the decision of many students and athletes to attend Mizzou.

Ron Cox • 1960-61 Class of 2005

Ron Cox was the first superstar shortstop in Mizzou Baseball history, who earned first-team All-American honors as a sophomore in 1960 after hitting .407 that season (the highest ever at the time by an All-American shortstop) and driving in a then-school record 36 runs. He became the first-ever sophomore in school history to earn first-team All-American honors and was featured on the cover of the 1961 Official NCAA Baseball Guide. Cox earned First-Team All-Big Eight honors in 1960, as well as First-Team All-District V honors that same year. An outstanding all-around athlete who also lettered on MU's basketball team in 1960, Cox was a part-time starter who was regarded as one of the better defensive players in the conference. He was instrumental in holding Nebraska star Hershel Turner below his scoring average in one game which helped lead to a Tiger victory. He was also offered a scholarship to play quarterback at Mizzou by coaches Frank Broyles and Dan Devine, but declined the offer to focus on baseball. Cox went on to sign with the St. Louis Cardinals in 1962 and played for nine years in the Cardinals and Pittsburgh Pirates organizations.

Dave Harvey • 1962-64 Class of 2008

Dave Harvey was a highly-decorated and accomplished third basemen during one of the most successful stretches ever put together by Mizzou baseball. He was a first-team All-American as a third baseman in 1964, after being named a second-team All-American at third in 1963. Harvey was a driving force behind Tiger teams which advanced to three consecutive College World Series and won three straight Big Eight Conference championships in 1962, 1963 and 1964. He hit .312 as a senior in 1964 and tied for the team lead in home runs (3), while he led the team in hitting in 1963, at a .359 clip. Mizzou went 26-5-1 in 1964, winning the Big Eight and finishing as national runners-up at the College World Series, a year after going 25-8 in 1963 when they finished fourth at the CWS. Harvey was an All-Big Eight performer in both 1963 and 1964 while earning All-District honors in both 1962 and 1964.

Ryan Fry • 1995-98 Class of 2009

Among the top offensive players in school history who holds numerous school career and season records ... Named a 2nd-team All-American after his senior season of 1998 ... A prolific offensive weapon who in near the top of MU career records list for hits (265), doubles (56), RBI (222), runs (223), extra base hits (106) and total bases (463), home runs (42) and slugging percentage (589) ... His career batting average of .337 falls just shy of the MU career top-10 list. Hit .377 as a senior in 1998, with an MU-record 27 home runs, and drove in a career-high 78 runs ... Holds MU single-season records in hits (92 in 1996) and home runs (27 in 1998) ... Hit .387 as a sophomore, when he set the MU single-season record with 92 hits in 1996. Was named 1st-team All-Big Eight for his efforts, and was one of three outfielders ... A standout in the classroom who twice earned GTC o-SIDA Academic All-American honors (1997 & 1998). Was also a three-time Academic All-Big 12 selection, as well (1996, 1997 & 1998) ... Is younger brother to former MU All-American wrestler, Shaon Fry, who was a 1999 inductee into the MU Intercollegiate Athletics Hall of Fame.

1964 Team Class of 2009

One of the most dominant teams in Mizzou athletics in any sport, finished the year as national runners-up, falling in the national title game to Minnesota . . . Finished the year with a 27-5overall record, including a perfect 19-0 record to claim Mizzou's 4th-straight Big Eight Title . . . Led the nation in pitching, with a team earned run average of a miniscule 0.65 runs per game. This mark set the NCAA record at the time, and it still stands today as a record that might never be broken ... The Tiger pitching staff was so dominant, it allowed one or zero runs in 21-of-33 games, including nine shutouts. In two games against Minnesota in the College World Series, Minnesota scored a total of two earned runs (MU won the first meeting, 4-1, but lost the championship game, 5-1) ... In the College World Series, beat Arizona State (7-0), lost a one-run game to USC (3-2), then beat Seton Hall (3-1), Minnesota (4-1) and Maine (2-1) before falling to Minnesota in the title game (5-1) . . . Two members of the team - Dave Harvey and Keith Weber, were 1st-team All-Americans - both are individual inductees into the MU Hall of Fame ... Nine members of the team were All-Big Eight selections, including four on the first team Eleven members of the team went on to sign professional baseball contracts.

Tom Heckman Class of 2011

A dominant starter for some very good Mizzou baseball teams ... Was an honorable-mention All-American pitcher (1981) for the Tigers who set numerous records during his time on the mound ... Won 10 games in three consecutive seasons (1979-80-81) and helped lead Mizzou to a Big Eight Conference championship in 1980 ... Completed his playing days holding Mizzou and Big Eight Conference records for career victories (36), and his 11 complete games in 1981 is also an MU single-season record ... Led Mizzou in ERA in 1978 (1.94) and 1979 (2.33) ... Was an All-Big Eight selection his last two seasons (1980-81), and his 323.2 career innings pitched stood as the school record when he completed play ... Was also an outstanding student who was twice selected as an Academic All-American.

Max Scherzer Class of 2011

A St. Louis native who became one of the nation's most dominant pitchers in a stellar three-year career, helping elevate the Tiger program to elite status before moving onto the professional ranks where he is now among the best young pitchers in the American League ... Broke out as a sophomore in 2005 when he led the Big 12 Conference in ERA (1.86) and strikeouts (131) while breaking a 14-year old school record with his strikeouts ... Won nine games that season, and was part of a combined no-hitter against Texas Tech on April 1, 2005 ... Was named the Big 12 Pitcher of the Year in 2005, and also claimed 2nd-Team All-American honors while being named 1st-Team All-Big 12 as well ... Was a semifinalist in 2005 for the Clemens Award, which honors the top pitcher in the nation ... The 2005 Tiger team won 40 games for the first time since 1991, and finished 4th in the Big 12 Conference, the team's highest league finish since 1996.

lan Kinsler Class of 2012

Although he played only one season at Mizzou, Tiger Head Coach Tim Jamieson credits him with being a key figure in helping turn the program around, as he was instrumental in leading Mizzou back to the NCAA Tournament in 2003, after a six-year drought. That 2003 NCAA appearance started a string of seven-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances for the Tiger program. After transferring to Mizzou from Arizona State and junior college, Kinsler batted .335 for Mizzou in 2003, and was third on the team with six home runs and 45 RBI. He also went 16-of-17 in stolen bases during the season, and was named 2nd-Team All-Big 12 for his efforts.


Aaron Crow Class of 2013

Established himself as one of the most feared pitchers in the nation during the late 2000s in a time of great success for Tiger baseball under Head Coach Tim Jamieson. During his junior season of 2008, Crow was arguably the most dominant pitcher in the game, as he won the Roger Clemens Award, given annually to the top pitcher in college baseball, in addition to being named a consensus 1st-Team All-American. His stats in 2008 were stellar - a perfect 13-0 record, an earned run average of 2.35, four complete-game shutouts and 127 strikeouts (10.65 per nine innings). Had a 43-inning scoreless streak during the 2008 season. After sitting out a year, later was again drafted in the first round (#12 overall) in 2009 by the Kansas City Royals. Made the Royals' opening day roster in 2011, and has been with the club ever since, logging 186 appearances. Crow won seven games in 2013 for the Royals, and was the club's lone All-Star during his rookie season of 2011.

John Dettmer Class of 2014

Mizzou's all-time career strikeout leader who was durable in addition to his flame-throwing achievements for hall of fame Coach Gene McArtor...Won honorable mention All-American honors in 1991 when he turned in one of the top individual pitching seasons in MU history... Won nine games that year, and struck out 127 batters in 120.0 innings while leading the team with a 2.63 earned run average in an time where bats were very lively... Finished his Tiger career with 374 strikeouts, which stands still as the most in program history, while his 332.0 career innings pitched ranks second to this day, and his 23 career wins are also eighth-most... Won All-Big Eight first-team honors in 1990, 1991 and 1992, as he led the Tigers in strikeouts each year, with 99, 127 and 123, respectively... Turned in 15 complete games during his career as he was a durable and dependable presence on the mound... Went on to become an 11th-round draft pick in the 1992 Major League Baseball Draft by the Texas Rangers, and eventually pitched in 12 games in the Majors.

John 'Hi' Simmons 1937-73

A native of Lancaster in the northeast part of Missouri, Simmons had a long decorated career at Missouri, as head baseball coach and a trusty football assistant to Don Faurot. In baseball, he coached from 1937 to 1973, posting a record of 481-294-3. His teams won 11 conference championships and the first NCAA title in school history in 1954. In all, he led Missouri to six appearances in the NCAA College World Series in Omaha, Neb. He coached 19 All-Americans, including nine first-team choices, 25 all-district and 37 all-conference players. A former president of the American Baseball Coaches Association, Simmons was inducted into the State of Missouri Sports Hall of Fame in 1977, and is also a member of the ABCA Hall of Fame.



Gene McArtor 1961-93

As a player at Missouri, McArtor won allconference and all-district honors as a first baseman from 1961-63. He played on two Big Eight Conference championship teams and two squads which advanced to the College World Series. He served as team captain as a senior. He returned to MU as assistant baseball coach in 1969 after coaching and teaching at the high school level in his hometown, St. Louis. McArtor served in that role until 1974 when he succeeded John "Hi" Simmons as the Tigers' head coach. During his 21 years at the helm, McArtor compiled a 733-430-3 record and won Big Eight championships in 1976 and 1980. He guided six teams to the NCAA Tournament, coached 13 All-Americans and 41 all-conference players. McArtor served on the NCAA Baseball Committee from 1987-92, including two years as chairman, during a period of unprecedented growth for the CWS. Former president of the American Baseball Coaches Association, McArtor is a member of the ABCA Hall of Fame, the Webster Groves High School Hall of Fame and the St. Louis Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame. He was inducted into the MU Intercollegiate Athletics Hall of Fame in 1999 and will go into the Missouri State Sports Hall of Fame this winter. Since retiring as baseball coach, he continued to serve MU first at the Senior Associate Director of Athletics and then as director of project management. He also served as the interim director of athletics for several months in 1998. He currently is the NCAA National Coordinator for Baseball Umpires.

Phil Bradley 1979-81

One of the most decorated athletes in Missouri annals, Bradley lettered in football at Missouri from 1977-81, and in baseball from 1979-81. A native of Macomb, III., Bradley quarterbacked the Tigers to three bowl games (1978 and 1980 Liberties and the 1979 Hall of Fame). He was a three-time Big Eight Conference "Offensive Player of the Year" and set the conference total offense record with 6,459 yards. He holds Missouri records for passing and total offense, and played in two all-star games, the Hula and Japan Bowls, after his senior season. In baseball, he stared as an outfielder on Missouri teams which won the 1980 Big Eight championship and advanced to the 1980 and 1981 NCAA Tournaments. Bradley was All-Big Eight, All-District and All-America in 1981, when he hit .457. Bradley was also the 1980 Big Eight Tournament MVP when Mizzou won the championship. He held school records for career walks and on-base percentage and held five school records when he graduated. Bradley was drafted by the Seattle Mariners and played with them through 1987. He was named to the 1985 American League All-Star Team and hit a career-high 26 home runs that season. He also played with the Philadelphia Phillies, Baltimore Orioles and Chicago White Sox. He also played briefly in Japan.





Hank C. Foley Interim Chancellor University of Missouri

Dr. Henry C. "Hank" Foley, interim chancellor of the University of Missouri, has served as the MU senior vice chancellor for research and graduate studies and the UM System executive vice president for academic affairs, research and economic development.

Since his appointment with the UM System in July 2013, Foley has worked with a variety of campus leaders, including the campus chancellors, provosts and chief research and economic development officers. He has led the system's strategic planning efforts, provided systemwide leadership in academic programs, promoted economic development and advanced research collaborations and enhanced funding. He also has led institutional research, student access and success, academic program review and elearning functions of the system.

At University of Missouri (MU), Foley has served as the senior vice chancellor for research and graduate studies. He has had overall responsibility for research, graduate studies and entrepreneurship. In his role, he has overseen the operations of compliance activities, internal grants and programs, sponsored programs, technology management and industry relations, as well as various campus centers (i.e. MU Research Reactor (MURR), Christopher S. Bond Life Sciences Center, Dalton Cardiovascular Research Center, International Institute of Nano and Molecular Medicine, and the Interdisciplinary Center on Aging, as well as the Research Core Facilities).

Foley is a tenured professor of chemistry at MU and is a adjunct professor of chemical and biochemical engineering at the Missouri University of Science and Technology.

Foley is a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, a fellow of the Industrial and Engineering Division of the American Chemical Society and a fellow of the National Academy of Inventors. He is a member of the Cosmos Club in Washington, D.C., and of several honorary societies, including Sigma Xi, Phi Lambda Upsilon and Sigma Pi Sigma. For his scholarly work he has been recognized with the New York Metropolitan Catalysis Society's Excellence in Catalysis Award, the Philadelphia Catalysis Club's Annual Award, the Leo C. Friend Award from the I&EC Division of the American Chemical Society, the Research Innovation Recognition Award from Union Carbide Corporation, the Presidential Young Investigator Award from the National Science Foundation, the Thiele Lecture in Chemical Engineering at the University of Notre Dame, the Distinguished Departmental Lecture in Chemical Engineering at the University of Missouri. He has authored more than 120 refereed archival journal articles. He is an inventor with 16 patents and is the author of the textbook Introduction to Chemical Engineering Analysis Using Mathematica, published in 2003. Graduate and undergraduate students he has mentored have prospered in industry and in academia.

Jim Sterk
Director of
Athletics

University of Missouri officials announced MJim Sterk was named Mizzou's Director of Athletics in the fall of 2016 following an extremely successful tenure at San Diego State.

Sterk, who joined San Diego State University in 2010, has overseen the most successful five seasons in SDSU's athletic history with 32 team conference championships for the Aztecs since the beginning of the 2011-2012 academic year and the fourth-highest combined winning percentage in the country in football and men's basketball. In addition, SDSU is one of only four schools nationally to have appeared in six consecutive NCAA tournaments and have its

football team play in five straight bowl games.

"This is a wonderful day for Mizzou and Tiger fans everywhere," Foley said. "Jim's leadership in intercollegiate athletics is unparalleled, and we are thrilled he is going to bring his talents, energy and passion for working with student-athletes to Columbia. He is just what Mizzou needs at this time."

This past year SDSU set a school record with 13 programs setting multi-year highs in the Academic Progress Report released by the NCAA with 313 individuals honored for their academic achievements. The athletic department also is coming off a record fundraising year for scholarships and a new basketball facility. He was named the 2015-2016 Under Armour AD of the Year by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics, which highlights the efforts of athletic directors for their commitment and positive contributions to student-athletes, campuses and their surrounding communities. Sterk was also recently named to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee.

"My passion is building upon the successes of good athletic programs and helping to make them great," Sterk said. "Whether it is guiding and mentoring student-athletes, working with coaches to ensure they have the resources they need or cheering with the fans, I realize that athletics is one of the most visible programs at a university. Mizzou's recent entry into the SEC makes it highly visible, and I am excited about the opportunity to help continue to lead it on the national stage."

Foley says Sterk was chosen from a varied and impressive field of candidates with input from an advisory committee composed of faculty, staff, students and athletic supporters. Sterk's seven-year contract was approved by the Board of Curators earlier this evening. He will be paid a base and guaranteed salary of \$700,000 and will officially start on or before Sept. 1.

"Mizzou athletics—and all of Mizzou Nation—will benefit from having someone of Jim's caliber on board," Foley said. "He has a superb winning record, is committed to the importance of diversity and inclusion efforts and will help restore pride and confidence in an athletics program that is working to overcome a challenging year."

"Jim elevated SDSU to a respectable level both athletically and academically," said Marshall Faulk, a member of the Pro-Football Hall of Fame and former St. Louis Ram and SDSU Aztec. "His leadership was instrumental in the rise of SDSU success. How we cared for our student-athletes was his No. 1 concern. Before joining SDSU, Sterk was Athletic Director at Washington State University, where in his last three years, 13 Cougar teams competed in NCAA postseason tournaments, including back-to-back trips by the men's basketball team, while women's rowing earned five NCAA championship bids. Sterk began his AD career at Portland State University and also has held positions at North

Carolina, Maine, Seattle Pacific and Tulane.

"Simply put, Jim Sterk is a highly seasoned leader who has taken both of his previous institutions into rarefied air," said Dr. Kevin White, Director of Athletics at Duke University. "Those storied programs enjoyed unmatched success under Jim's uniquely gifted and talented mentoring. Sterk graduated from Western Washington University in 1980 where he earned four letters in football and one in basketball. He set a school record with 164 tackles during the 1977 season and was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame for his football success. He received his master's degree in sports administration from Ohio University. Sterk and his wife Debi have three grown daughters, Ashley, Amy and Abby.
