DR. MUN Y. CHOI

PRESIDENT, UNIVERSITY OF MISSOURI Second Year Illinois, '87

Following a near year-long national search, the University of Missouri Board of Curators announced the appointment of Dr. Mun Y. Choi, 52, as the 24th president in the history of the University of Missouri System on November 2, 2016. The former provost and executive vice president of the University of Connecticut (UConn), Dr. Choi succeeded Interim President Michael Middleton on March 1, 2017.

Dr. Choi's 24-year career in higher education includes his previous position as provost and executive vice president at UConn, one of the nation's top 20 public universities in the latest U.S. News rankings. At UConn, he oversaw a budget of \$700 million while working with 1,500 full-time faculty, 31,000 students and 2,000 staff across 12 schools and colleges including Schools of Medicine, Dental Medicine and Law. Under his leadership, UConn developed several innovative new programs that have resulted in enrollment growth, increased faculty hiring, innovative research and new and expanded industry partnerships.

Born in South Korea, Dr. Choi came to the U.S. as a child. As a young man, he worked in his family's successful business in Chicago, and later graduated from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign with a bachelor's degree in general engineering in 1987. He later earned a master's degree and doctorate in mechanical and aerospace engineering from Princeton University.

Prior to serving as provost and executive vice president, Dr. Choi was dean of engineering at UConn from 2008 to 2012. Earlier, he was department head of mechanical engineering and mechanics at Drexel University (2000-2008) and assistant and associate professor at the University of Illinois at Chicago.

"Becoming president of the University of Missouri System is unquestionably the pinnacle of my professional career," said Dr. Choi. "As a product of and passionate champion for public higher education, I will advocate tirelessly on behalf of our exceptional institutions with state and national business, political and civic leaders to achieve excellence in all that we do, and make sure our great campuses realize their full potential."

DR. ALEXANDER N. CARTWRIGHT

CHANCELLOR, UNIVERSITY OF MISSOURI Second Year IOWA, '89

Dr. Alexander N. Cartwright has served as Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor of the State University of New York (SUNY) since September 2014. As Provost, Dr. Cartwright supports the Chancellor and Board of Trustees in carrying out their oversight responsibilities of the 64-campus system. He drives academic policy and oversees a broad portfolio including: access and inclusion; academic program planning and assessment; enrollment management; student success; global affairs; information technology; and, SUNY's broad research enterprise.

Dr. Cartwright has refocused SUNY's academic agenda around the overarching areas of: student success and completion; diversity, equity and inclusion; and, through research growth in emerging areas, increasing SUNY's impact on state and global challenges.

Dr. Cartwright introduced and saw adopted a sweeping diversity, equity and inclusion policy which applies to all campuses and SUNY's System Administration. A native of the Bahamas, Dr. Cartwright believes in inclusive excellence wherein an institution cannot achieve excellence if it is not inclusive. He developed a comprehensive completion model to meet SUNY's ambitious goal of ensuring that more New Yorkers earn the credentials they need to succeed. He launched a system-wide Educational Effectiveness and Strategic Enrollment process designed to support each campus in meeting improvement goals. He established and oversees the Applied Learning Steering Committee to ensure faculty oversight of SUNY's goal of a rigorous, meaningful, applied learning experience for every student.

During his tenure as Provost, Dr. Cartwright also served as Acting President of the Research Foundation for SUNY from January 2015 – June 2016, overseeing the Foundation's management of over \$1 billion dollars in annual sponsored research activity and recommitting the organization to focus on creation of a culture of compliance, transparent administration of sponsored research; and supporting campus efforts to commercialize intellectual property created on campuses. At the same time, he established the position of Vice Chancellor for Research and Economic Development to support research efforts of SUNY faculty, grow business and industry partnerships, and foster both undergraduate and graduate research opportunities for SUNY students. Dr. Cartwright also served as Officer-in-Charge of two SUNY campuses undergoing leadership transition, SUNY's Downstate Medical Center and SUNY Polytechnic Institute. In each case he worked with campus faculty governance, faculty at large, students, staff and administrators to meet time-sensitive needs and to identify, and see through to appointment, interim leadership.

Dr. Cartwright represents SUNY in Congressional, Federal Agency, White House, and State Legislative audiences to share SUNY's input on key academic and research issues.

Dr. Cartwright came to the role of Provost already a member of the SUNY community. He joined the University at Buffalo, State University of New York (UB) in 1995 serving on the faculty and holding increasingly senior administrative positions at the AAU research university. His immediate past positionwasthatofVicePresidentforResearchandEconomicDevelopmentandActing Executive Director of the New York State Center of Excellence in Bioinformatics and Life Sciences. In these roles, he was responsible for campus/industry

relations, research funding and compliance, research communications and research support for UB and the Center.

An internationally recognized researcher and scholar in the area of optical sensors, Dr. Cartwright previously served as the Chair of both the Electrical Engineering and Biomedical Engineering Departments at UB. Before beginning these concurrent chairmanships, Dr. Cartwright led UB's efforts to synergize research across disciplines as the Vice Provost for Strategic Initiatives. In this position he oversaw infrastructure and scholarship in eight areas of strategic strength that spanned departments from Visual Studies to Medicine. He has served as a professor in Electrical Engineering and Biomedical Engineering and an adjunct full professor in Physics at UB. In the first years of his professorship, Dr. Cartwright received both the National Science Foundation CAREER Award and the Office of Naval Research Young Investigator Award. He earned the SUNY Chancellor's award for Excellence in Teaching in 2002. Dr. Cartwright retains his rank as full professor while serving as System Provost, he continues to run the Laboratory for Applied Spectroscopic Evaluation (LASE), oversee doctoral students and one post-doc student, and remains active in research, receiving his latest NSF award in 2016.

Dr. Cartwright's research is generally in the area of optical materials and sensors. Currently, he is engaged in engineering optical "metamaterials," artificial materials that provide optical properties not readily available in nature. His technology for fabricating a rainbow-colored polymer using a one-step, low-cost holographic lithography method was one of just five inventions worldwide to be named to the Society of Manufacturing Engineers (SME)'s 2013 list of Innovations that Could Change the Way You Manufacture.

Dr. Cartwright is a prolific and highly influential scholar, producing more than 150 peer reviewed journal publications and conference proceedings. He has received considerable funding from numerous organizations including the National Institutes of Health, National Science Foundation, Air Force Office of Scientific Research, Department of Defense, and the Office of Naval Research, and various industrial sponsors. Dr. Cartwright holds four patents.

In November 2016, Dr. Cartwright was named a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS). Dr. Cartwright was recognized for, "outstanding research, teaching and mentorship in optics, for advancing science in New York, nationally, and internationally, and for strengthening diversity and inclusion in science." In February 2016, Dr. Cartwright was named to the Carnegie Math Pathways Advisory Board by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching. In September of 2015, Dr. Cartwright was appointed by NYS Governor Andrew Cuomo to the Photonics Institute Board of Officers. In December of 2014, Dr. Cartwright earned appointment as a Fellow of the National Academy of Inventors. Dr. Cartwright is a Fellow of SPIE — The International Society for Optical Engineering; a senior member of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE); a member of the American Society for Engineering Education (ASEE), Eta Kappa Nu, and the Materials Research Society (MRS).

Dr. Cartwright holds a Ph.D. in Electrical and Computer Engineering from the University of Iowa. He and his wife Melinda have two children, both now in college, Andrew and Alyssa.

Jim Sterk was named Mizzou's 20th Director of Athletics on Aug., 9, 2016, following highly successful tenures leading intercollegiate athletics programs at San Diego State, Washington State and Portland State.

Sterk's vision for Mizzou Athletics, Win It Right, is built upon the core values of Respect, Integrity, Gratitude, Humility and Together, and in his first two years in Columbia, the department has achieved unprecedented academic and athletic success under his leadership.

In the classroom, 265 Mizzou student-athletes received 2017-18 SEC Honor Roll recognition, 332 garnered University Dean's List status for at least one semester and 13 teams registered a 3.00 grade-point average for the 2018 Spring term. Tiger student-athletes also spent over 4,400 hours volunteering with more than 50 organizations in Columbia and the surrounding communities. The student-athlete body posted an overall record GPA of 3.04 in 2017-18 and 103 student-athletes earned their MU degrees.

The department also scored well in the NCAA's academic metrics, as MU registered a school-record Graduation Success Rate (GSR) score of 91, which ranked third in the SEC, and marked a three-point improvement over the previous record mark. Mizzou, which has either equaled or improved its GSR score for 11-consecutive years, posted SEC-leading GSR scores in baseball (97), women's basketball (100), women's golf (100), women's gymnastics (100), women's tennis (100) and volleyball (100).

In the 2017 Federal Graduation Rates survey, Mizzou ranked second in the SEC with its 72 percent mark, a performance which also matched the highest mark in program history (72 percent in 2014-15) and was three points higher than the University's average for all students during that same period.

Mizzou equaled its best finish ever in the Learfield Directors' Cup standings in 2017-18, as it totaled 660.75 points, just two shy of its record total from a season ago, to finish 33rd nationally for the second-straight year. A record 17 of the Tigers' 20 programs were represented in postseason competition with a school-record 15 earning Directors' Cup points. Mizzou captured a pair of conference championships (Mizzou Wrestling won the MAC regular season and tournament crowns) while 11 teams ranked in the nation's Top 25 of their respective sports (or finished in the Top 25) at some point in 2017-18.

Ranking 33rd in back-to-back years marked Mizzou's best two-year finish since the Directors' Cup was established in 1993-94. Prior to this two-year stretch, Mizzou had averaged a finish of 58th in the annual competition as the school's 20 programs have shined since Sterk took the department's helm.

Mizzou had Top 25 2017-18 NCAA Championship finishes in wrestling (sixth), women's indoor track & field (ninth), women's outdoor track & field (11th), women's swimming and diving (15th), volleyball (Sweet 16) and men's swimming and diving (23rd). It also marked the first time since 1981-82 that Mizzou Football played in a bowl game and both Tiger Basketball teams reached the NCAA Tournament in the same academic year.

Track & Field standout Karissa Schweizer (3,000m and 5,000m at the NCAA Indoor Championships; 5,000m at NCAA Outdoor Championships) captured three more NCAA individual titles as a senior and finished her collegiate career with six national championships. Mizzou also produced five season-ending conference award winners, 14 individual conference champions, 53 All-Conference award winners and 40 All-America honors in 10 different sports.

In his first year in Columbia, Mizzou Athletics achieved academic, athletic and administrative success, too.

Academically, 269 Mizzou student-athletes received 2016-17 SEC Honor Roll recognition, 303 earned University Dean's List status for at least one semester, 14 teams registered a 3.00 grade-point average for the Spring 2017 semester and four teams recorded perfect NCAA Academic Progress Rate marks of 1,000—women's golf, women's tennis, soccer and volleyball. Tiger student-athletes also spent over 4,800 hours volunteering with more than 50 organizations in Columbia and the surrounding communities.

Fueled by Top 16 NCAA Championship finishes in wrestling (fifth), women's indoor track & field (eighth), men's swimming & diving (ninth), women's swimming & diving (13th), women's cross

country (16th) and volleyball (Sweet 16), Mizzou ranked a program-best 33rd in the 2016-17 Learfield Directors' Cup standings with a school-record 662.75 points. The Tigers had not finished better than 36th prior to 2016-17

In 2016-17, 16 Mizzou teams were represented in NCAA postseason play, two teams won conference championships (volleyball and wrestling) and 10 squads ranked among the nation's Top 25 in their respective sports at season's end (either at their respective NCAA Championship or season-ending ranking).

In addition, two Tigers combined to win four NCAA individual championships as wrestler J'den Cox won his third national title at 197 lbs., and Schweizer became just the fourth female in NCAA history to win the distance triple crown (cross country, indoor 5,000m and outdoor 5,000m national titles), and first since 2008. Mizzou also produced 13 individual conference champions and had 31 student-athletes earn 69 All-America certificates in 11 different sports.

The generosity, loyalty and passion of more than 7,000 donors allowed the Tiger Scholarship Fund (TSF) to raise a school-record \$50.4 million during the 2016-17 fiscal year, shattering the previous record by more than \$4.7 million. TSF's record-breaking total, which included new pledges and cash gifts, was aided by a school-record 11 gifts of \$1 million or more, and marked just the second time in school history that the TSF surpassed the \$40 million threshold in philanthropic support and just the fifth time it topped the \$30 million plateau.

Working with the Missouri Board of Curators, Sterk secured approval for Kansas City-based Populous to design the Memorial Stadium South End Zone facility which is scheduled to come on-line in 2019. This game-changing project for Tiger Football will include coaches offices, a locker room, training room, weight room and team meeting rooms as well as new premium seating opportunities for Mizzou fans.

Sterk joined the Mizzou family from San Diego State, where he enjoyed a six-year tenure that was highlighted by the most successful five-year run in Aztec history with 32 team conference championships from 2011-12 thru 2015-16, including a Mountain West Conference-leading 28 titles in that span, and the nation's fourth-highest combined winning percentage in football and men's basketball. In addition, SDSU was one of only four schools nationally to have appeared in six consecutive NCAA tournaments and have its football team play in five straight bowl games over that stretch.

SDSU set a school-record with 13 programs setting multi-year highs in the 2016 Academic Progress Report released by the NCAA with 313 student-athletes honored for their academic achievements. The athletic department also enjoyed a record fundraising year for scholarships and a new basketball facility.

For his efforts, Sterk was named the 2015-2016 Under Armour Athletic Director of the Year by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics, which highlights the efforts of athletic directors for their commitment and positive contributions to student-athletes, campuses and their surrounding communities. Sterk was also appointed to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee as the Mountain West Conference's representative, however, he had to relinquish that prestigious position when he took over at Mizzou.

Sterk went to SDSU from Washington State University, where he served as athletics director from 2000-10. Prior to his hiring at WSU, he was athletics director at Portland State University from 1995 to 2000

Sterk enjoys a solid reputation and the respect of his peers across the country. The NCAA recognized him and WSU in 2006 as the Division IA Athletic Directors' "Program of Excellence." He oversaw a period of unparalleled success at Washington State with historic accomplishments both on and off the field during his tenure in Pullman.

In his last three years at WSU, 13 Cougar teams competed in NCAA postseason tournaments, including back-to-back trips by the men's basketball team (2007 and 2008), while women's rowing earned five NCAA championship bids, including a fourth-place finish in 2006, the highest finish ever by a WSU women's team in NCAA competition.

A 1980 graduate of Western Washington University, Sterk earned four letters for the Vikings in football and one in basketball. He was credited with a school-record 164 tackles during the 1977 season, garnering first-team NAIA District I all-star accolades. He was named team captain and MVP, helping the Vikings to the district championship game. On Feb. 6, 2010, Sterk was inducted into Western Washington's Athletics Hall of Fame for his gridiron success.

He received his master's degree in sports administration from Ohio University. In addition to SDSU, Washington State and Portland State, his professional career has included administrative positions at North Carolina, Maine, Seattle Pacific and Tulane.

Sterk and his wife Debi have three daughters: Ashley, Amy and Abby.

WAYNE KREKLOW

HEAD COACH 19th Season Neenah, Wis. Drake, '80

Wayne and Susan Kreklow enter their 19th season at the helm of Mizzou Volleyball, as they've taken the program to unparalleled heights over their nearly two-decade run in Columbia, Mo.

Since taking over the reins in 2000, the Kreklow's have tallied 389 wins (average of 21 per year) with an incredible .677 winning percentage. In comparison, in Mizzou Volleyball's 26 years prior to their arrival, the Tigers recorded 416 victories (average of 16 per year) and a .474 winning percentage.

Wayne and Susan have brought a bevy of "firsts" for the Mizzou Volleyball program, including its first-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament (2000) and AVCA All-American (2002). Overall, the Tigers have amassed 14 trips to NCAA Tournament play and 20 AVCA All-Americans since 2000.

Susan Kreklow led the Tigers as head coach from 2000-04 and accumulated 109 wins with a superb .703 winning percentage. She made a splash in her first season in Mizzou black and gold, leading the team to a 24-7 overall record (14-6 Big 12) and a trip to the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament. For her outstanding guidance on the court, Susan tallied 2000 Big 12 Coach of the Year honors.

Mizzou cracked NCAA postseason play in all five seasons under Susan, including a personalbest second round appearance in 2002. That season, Christi Myers became the Tigers' firstever AVCA All-American, as she posted 468 kills on .380 hitting with 121 total blocks.

Additionally under Susan's five years as Mizzou head coach, the Tigers garnered two total AVCA All-Americans, six total AVCA Central All-Region honorees, 13 total All-Big 12 selections, a Big 12 Freshman of the Year, two Big 12 Defensive Specialists of the Year, six Big 12 Players of the Week, four CoSIDA Academic All-District representatives and 25 Big 12 Academic Honor Roll awards.

Beginning with the 2005 campaign, Wayne Kreklow shifted from assistant coach to head coaching duties and began another incredible run at the top for Mizzou Volleyball.

The 2005 Tigers once again reached the NCAA Tournament, marking the program's sixth-consecutive trip to postseason play. Following a 22-4 regular season record (16-4 Big 12), expectations were high for the Tigers entering the month of December. Behind First Team AVCA All-American Lindsey Hunter and Honorable Mention AVCA All-Americans Jessica Vander Kooi and Nicole Wilson; the Tigers posted a pair of dominant sweeps in the first and second round of the NCAA Tournament inside the Hearnes Center.

Mizzou had reached its first-ever NCAA Sweet 16 and headed to State College, Pennsylvania, for a tall task against national power Hawaii. The Tigers were up for the challenge, as they claimed a 3-1 victory over the Rainbow Warriors. Mizzou had now clinched its first all-time visit to the NCAA Tournament Elite 8, but ultimately fell to Tennessee in its final matchup of the season.

The Tigers once again visited the NCAA Tournament in both 2006 and 2007, marking its seventh and eighth-straight trip to postseason play. Following a two-year hiatus, Mizzou returned to the national scene in 2010 with its second trip to the NCAA Sweet 16. Mizzou recorded big wins against Northern Iowa and Northwestern to secure its second-longest journey ever in the NCAA Tournament.

Individual accolades were aplenty again in 2010, as Paola Ampudia earned the program's seventh all-time AVCA All-American honor, while three Tigers garnered AVCA Central All-Region recognition and setter Molly Kreklow was named AVCA Central Region Freshman of the Year.

A 2011 bid to the NCAA Tournament was followed by a strong 19-12 season in 2012, but the Tigers fell just short of back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances. With two-time AVCA All-American Lisa Henning leading the way, the 2013 Tigers had high expectations entering the season, but little did they know that they'd put together one of the most storied seasons in program history. Overall, the 2013 squad set new all-time single-season team highs in overall wins (35), conference victories (18), consecutive wins (34), sweeps (27) and hitting percentage (.356).

Mizzou's perfect 34-0 regular season (18-0 SEC) earned the program and Mizzou Athletics' first-ever SEC Championship. The Tigers earned a single-season-best four AVCA All-Americans, four AVCA Southeast All-Region honorees, an AVCA Southeast Region Freshman of the Year, an AVCA Southeast Region Coach of the Year, four All-SEC accolades, an SEC Player of the Year, SEC Freshman of the Year and SEC Coach of the Year.

After a rare missed trip to the NCAA Tournament in 2014, the Tigers roared back with vengeance over the 2015 campaign. Mizzou finished with an outstanding 27-6 overall record (14-4 SEC) and advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The Tigers tallied two additional AVCA All-Americans, three AVCA Southeast All-Region recipients and three All-SEC honorees. That year's Mizzou squad will be remembered for its outstanding defense at the net, as its 358.5 total blocks and 495 total block assists rank first all-time in program history. Additionally, the Tigers' 27 overall wins ranks sixth-most in program history.

In 2016, Wayne guided Mizzou Volleyball to its second SEC Championship in the past four seasons. The Tigers produced an identical 27-6 overall record like their season before, but improved with an outstanding 16-2 mark in SEC matches. Mizzou hosted NCAA first and second round action at the Hearnes Center, capped off by a thrilling redemption victory over Purdue to send the Tigers to its third Sweet 16 in program history. Similar to its magical 2013 season, Mizzou cleaned up again in postseason honors, including three AVCA All-Americans, four AVCA Southeast All-Region honorees, the AVCA Southeast Region Coach of the Year, three All-SEC accolades and the SEC Coach of the Year.

In 2017, Coach Kreklow guided the Tigers to their 14th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance and advanced to their second-straight Sweet 16 after upsetting No. 19 Kansas and No. 16 Wichita State in NCAA First and Second Round action. Mizzou's defensive efforts at the net were crucial all year long, as its 377.5 total blocks and 547 block assists marked new all-time single-season records in program history.

Individually, three-time AVCA All-American Alyssa Munlyn's 189 total blocks, 159 block assists and 1.44 blocks per set each reset all-time records in Tiger history. Four Tigers (Munlyn, Kira Larson, Kayla Caffey and Leketor Member-Meneh) earned 2017 All-SEC honors, while Munlyn and Larson garnered AVCA All-Region accolades.

Before coming to Missouri, the Kreklows were co-head coaches of both the men's and women's volleyball teams at Columbia College. They enjoyed great success, taking their women's team to the NAIA National Tournament six times and winning consecutive national titles in 1998 and 1999.

The Cougars also won five regional championships and seven consecutive American Midwest Conference championships under their guidance. In 1998 and 1999, Columbia College achieved consecutive undefeated seasons with a combined record of 85-0. The Cougars' undefeated record included 78 consecutive wins at home and 227 consecutive game victories.

In 1997 and 1998, the Kreklows shared NAIA/AVCA National Coach of the Year and Midwest Region Coach of the Year honors. In 1999, the coaching tandem took home the regional award for the fifth consecutive year. In 1998 and 1999, the Kreklows also received the NAIA National Tournament Coach of the Year award.

Along with the success of the women's program, the Kreklows started the men's volleyball program at Columbia College in 1997. In 1999, the Cougars finished the season with a 19-5 overall record, enjoying their second consecutive undefeated run through the Midwest Intercollegiate Volleyball Association. They also took second place at the inaugural SSI Volleyball National Invitational Tournament in 1999.

Susan Kreklow played volleyball for Central Missouri State University and Missouri State. She received her bachelor's degree in physical education and a Master's of Science degree from Missouri State in 1984 and 1987, respectively. Kreklow began her coaching career at St. Clair (Mo.) High School. She began her collegiate coaching career at Columbia College in 1990. Susan was the founder of Columbia Juniors Volleyball Club and the Columbia Developmental Volleyball Leagues. She has served as a member of the USA Volleyball Board of Directors as the NAIA representative and was president-elect of the NAIA National Coaches Association.

Wayne Kreklow earned a bachelor's degree in social science in 1980 from Drake University. While at Drake, Wayne was a member of the men's basketball team, where he earned All-America, all-conference and all-district awards as a two-time team captain, and is fifth on Drake's career scoring list. He is also a member of Drake's All-Century basketball team and was a member of the NBA World Champion Boston Celtics in 1980-81. Wayne began coaching basketball for Central Decatur (lowa) High School in 1986. He began coaching volleyball as an assistant under Craig Sherman at Missouri. He was with the Tigers from 1989 to 1994 before moving over to Columbia College to join his wife at the helm of the Cougar program.

The Kreklows have three children: sons Rick and Ryan and daughter Ali, and reside in Columbia, Mo.

Joshua Taylor enters his second season as an assistant coach on the Mizzou Volleyball staff. Taylor also serves as the team's recruiting coordinator, while specializing in blocking and serve and receive instruction for the Tiger student-athletes.

The former U.S. National Team member and Pepperdine Men's Volleyball two-time AVCA All-American was named the new assistant coach for Mizzou Volleyball on Feb. 6, 2017, by head coach Wayne Kreklow.

In his first year as a Mizzou assistant coach, Taylor helped guide the 2017 Tigers to their second consecutive Sweet 16 appearance in the NCAA Tournament. Additionally, Mizzou concluded its campaign ranked among the nation's top 20 in the final AVCA Division I Coaches poll in back to back seasons for the first time in program history.

As the Tigers' leading blocking instructor, the team tallied 377.5 total blocks and 547 block assists, marking new all-time single-season records in program history. Mizzou's 2.88 blocks per set (second) and 104 solo blocks (seventh) each cracked the program's all-time single-season top 10 record book.

Within the NCAA team statistical rankings, Mizzou's 377.5 total blocks ranked second and 2.88 blocks per set ranked 12th-best nationally.

Taylor's guidance played a pivotal role into Alyssa Munlyn's 2017 AVCA All-American campaign, as her 189 total blocks, 159 block assists and 1.44 blocks per set each reset all-time records in Tiger history. Her impressive season secured her third-straight AVCA All-America honor, as she became only Mizzou's third all-time three-time All-America recipient.

From 2010-17, Taylor excelled in the collegiate and professional volleyball ranks. In 2016, the Honolulu, Hawaii, native competed with the U.S. National Team at the Pan AM Cup and Olympic training team.

Prior to his outstanding collegiate career at Pepperdine University, Taylor began his playing experience with the U.S. Junior National Team. He played a pivotal role in to Team USA's triumph at the 2010 NORCECA Men's Junior Continental Championship, resulting in a qualifying bid for the 2011 FIVB Men's Junior World Championships.

In 2016, Taylor played professionally overseas with Leka Volley in Finland and Al Sadd Sports Club in Qatar. During the Spring 2016 campaign, Leka Volley finished third overall, while Taylor received four individual match MVP honors.

Collegiately, Taylor was a standout performer at Pepperdine from 2012-15, earning two AVCA All-American honors and three All-MPSF accolades. During his 2014 junior campaign, Taylor became only the 18th player in program history to surpass 1,000 career kills. He concluded his four-year career in Malibu, Calif., with 1,433 career kills and 1,630 career points.

While starring at Punahou High School in Hawaii, Taylor first represented Team USA in 2009 with the U.S. Boys' Youth National Team. Additionally, he reached the FIVB Men's Youth World Championships later that year.

Before pursuing professional volleyball opportunities overseas in early Fall 2016, Taylor served as a graduate assistant for the Mizzou Volleyball program. He also assisted the Tigers as a lead instructor during 2016 individual and positional summer camps.

Taylor received a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from Pepperdine University in 2015 and is currently pursuing a Master of Arts in Sport Psychology through John F. Kennedy University. Taylor married current Mizzou Volleyball volunteer assistant coach, Molly Taylor, in Feb. 2017. The two reside in Columbia, Mo.

Molly Taylor (Kreklow) enters her second season as a volunteer assistant coach on the Mizzou Volleyball staff. Taylor specializes in setting instruction for the Tiger student-athletes, while assisting with offensive game planning.

Taylor, a former U.S. National Team member and 2013 AVCA first team All-American, was named the new volunteer assistant coach for Mizzou Volleyball on Feb. 8, 2017, by head coach Wayne Kreklow.

In her first year as a Mizzou volunteer assistant coach, Taylor helped guide the 2017 Tigers to their second consecutive Sweet 16 appearance in the NCAA Tournament. Additionally, Mizzou concluded its campaign ranked among the nation's top 20 in the final AVCA Division I Coaches poll in back to back seasons for the first time in program history.

As one of the Tigers' leading offensive instructors, the team finished 20th nationally with 1,726 total kills. Leading the charge with the team's setters, Taylor helped guide Mizzou to 1,602 total assists, ranking 23rd in the NCAA.

Taylor excelled in both the collegiate and professional volleyball ranks from 2010-17. From 2014-16, the Delano, Minn., native competed with the U.S. National Team at the FIVB World Cup and Grand Prixs. She captured a pair of bronze medals at the 2014-15 World Cups and a championship at the 2015 FIVB World Grand Prix.

At the 2015 FIVB World Grand Prix, Taylor was sensational for Team USA, earning "Best Setter" honors. Led by her impressive performance, Team USA collectively recorded an outstanding .293 hitting percentage at the event. Later that year, Taylor received USA Volleyball's "Female Indoor Most Improved Player of the Year" award.

From 2014-16, Taylor gained further professional playing experience overseas. She performed at the highest level on the court with three organizations — Dresdner SC (Dresden, Germany), Eczacibasi Vitra (Istanbul, Turkey) and Liu Jo Nordmeccanica Modena (Modena, Italy) — highlighted by a 2015 Bundesliga Championship with Dresdner.

From 2010-13, Taylor solidified herself as one of the top players in Mizzou Volleyball history. During her 2013 senior campaign, Taylor led the Tigers to a perfect 34-0 regular season record and the program's first-ever SEC Championship. She finished the memorable season with 1,480 assists, aiding the team's record setting .356 hitting percentage.

At the conclusion of the 2013 campaign, Taylor was awarded AVCA first team All-American and SEC Player of the Year honors. Over her four-year career in Mid-Missouri, Taylor accumulated 5,366 assists, ranking second all-time in program history.

Taylor received a Bachelor of Science in Nutritional Sciences in Dec. 2014 from the University of Missouri. She shined academically while in Columbia, Mo., receiving Dean's List recognition in each semester at the university.

Taylor married current Mizzou Volleyball assistant coach, Joshua Taylor, in Feb. 2017. The two reside in Columbia, Mo.

In the past six years, Mizzou has ranked top 25 nationally in average and total attendance five times. Additionally, the Tigers have placed top 10 in the country in average attendance over that same time span.

In 16 of the past 17 seasons, Mizzou has finished in the top 25 national attendance rankings. In fact, the Tigers have 13, top 20 national attendance numbers and five, top 10 totals since the 2002 campaign.

Since 2000, Mizzou ranks T-2nd in the country with 17, top 25 average attendance rankings. Among Power Five conference programs, only five schools in the nation rate higher than the Tigers. Across that same time frame, Mizzou also places T-2nd nationally with 16, top 25 total attendance rankings, trailing only six Power Five schools.

The program's most highly attended season came in 2013, as the team went 34-0 and claimed Mizzou's first-ever SEC Championship. On Nov. 22, 2013 - the SEC clinching match - the Tigers took home the crown in front of a school-record 7,879 fans, the first of two 7,000+ crowds that magical season.

Mizzou fans have particuarly traveled to Hearnes in droves the past four years, including three Top-10 average national attendance finishes. In fact, in each of the past two seasons (2015-16) over 30,000 loud and passionate Tigers fans have entered Hearnes. Entering 2015, Mizzou had eclipsed 30,000 total fans in a season twice (2005, '13) previously.





The 2000 season was the first year in the turnaround of the Missouri Volleyball program. The Tigers posted a 24-7 overall record and a 14-6 Big 12 Conference mark. MU traveled to Provo, Utah, for its first-ever NCAA Tournament.


After being picked to finish ninth in the conference, Mizzou managed a secondplace showing in the Big 12 and Susan Kreklow was named the league's Coach of the Year.

Lisa Morris was named to the All-Big 12 first team and two Tigers - Christi Myers and Heather Gerber - were honorable mention selections. Those awards were the first conference recognition for MU since the Big 8 became the Big 12.

MU recorded its first-ever wins over Colorado, Texas and Texas Tech in 2000 and had season sweeps over Baylor, Texas, Kansas, Iowa State and Oklahoma.

The Tigers' 10-0 start to the season was the best since 1983.

The 24 wins was the sixth-most wins in school history and included a 13-1 home-court record.

Year two under the Kreklows yielded a second trip to the NCAA Tournament as Missouri posted a 20-11 record. MU finished fifth in the Big 12 with a 10-10 conference record.

With the 20 wins, Mizzou recorded back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time in program history. Mizzou opened the season by winning its first nine matches and 12 of its first 14 matches.

The Tigers again earned Big 12 honors as Christi Myers and Lisa Morris were All-Big 12 honorable mention selections and Katie Sowers was named the Big 12 Conference Defensive Specialist of the Year.

The 2002 season was a year of firsts for the Mizzou volleyball program as the Tigers recorded their first-ever NCAA Tournament win with a 3-1 victory over Northwestern.

Missouri finished the season with a 26-8 record, the fourth-most wins in school history and the third-straight year with at least 20 wins. MU finished third in the Big 12 Conference with a 14-6 record.

Christi Myers added another first for MU by becoming the first All-American in school history. Myers and Lindsey Hunter were also selected to the All-Central Region team, the first selections in program history.

Hunter broke the school record for assists in a season with 1,690 and averaged 14.08 assists per set, which led the Big 12 Conference and ranked second in the nation.

Myers, Hunter, Mary Lauren Smith and Shen Danru were named to the All-Big 12 Conference teams and Smith earned national recognition by being named AVCA/Sports Imports National Player of the Week on Sept. 30.

As a team, MU set school records for most kills (2,005) and most assists (1,889) in a season. Missouri also finished a program-best 16th in the nation in average attendance.

The Tigers made it four in a row by advancing to their fourth-consecutive NCAA Tournament in 2003. Mizzou was 19-11 on the year and finished sixth in the Big 12.

Mizzou began the season with a preseason ranking of No. 21, which was the best preseason ranking in school history. The Tigers opened the year by winning the Tiger Invitational and won their first eight home matches of the year.

On Oct. 15, MU ended a 44-match losing streak to Nebraska by taking a five-set victory over the Huskers in Lincoln.

Lindsey Hunter led the Big 12 Conference in assists per set for the second-straight season with a 12.29 average.

Hunter and Shen Danru were each named to the All-Big 12 first team and the Central Region honorable mention squad. Jessica Vander Kooi was selected as the Freshman of the Year for both the Big 12 Conference and the Central Region. Juliana Godoi was named the Big 12 Conference Defensive Specialist of the Year.

With the Tigers making their fifth-consecutive NCAA Tournament, Missouri in that time span went from the depths of the nation to a team that is part of the cream-of-the-crop. Missouri was tabbed as host of the first-and second-rounds of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. The team knocked-off first-round opponent Arkansas before falling to Louisville in round two.

The team opened the season by stunning No. 23 Wisconsin on its home floor. The Badgers found their way to the Elite Eight later in the season. The Tigers went on to defeat four top-25 teams during the season.

For the fourth time in five years, the Tigers won 20 matches overall, including a 14-6 Big 12 season-record (tying a school-record for conference wins) that placed them tied for third with Texas A&M.

Setter Lindsey Hunter led the Big 12 for the third-straight season in assists and was a second-team AVCA All-American. Lisa Boyd led the conference in hitting percentage with a school-record .384. In her first season as a Tiger, Tatum Ailes crushed the school-record in digs per set (4.19). Jessica Vander Kooi earned her first spot on the AVCA All-Central Region team.

A school-record seven Tigers earned Academic All-Big 12 honors.



The quest for the Tigers' sixth-straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament was the most productive and successful in the program's history. This Mizzou squad reached the NCAA Regional Final, or Round of Eight, after defeating Hawaii in the Regional Semifinal at Penn State. The Tigers reached the regional rounds for the first time in school history and posted the then-winningest record in school history with a 25-5 mark.

The team set a school-record with 16 Big 12 Conference wins, placing third in a tight race behind Nebraska and Texas.

Mizzou went 7-4 against teams in the top 25, knocking off four squads in the top 10 alone. With that type of play, people around the country and in Columbia started to notice more than before. Mizzou surged into the national Top-10 for the first time in school history, peaking at No. 7. Missouri also placed sixth in the national attendance average, landing around 2,600 fans per home match. On Oct 5, Mizzou hosted 7,298 fans in a match against No. 1 Nebraska.

Lindsey Hunter completed her senior campaign with more than 6,000 career assists, becoming only the 15th person in NCAA history to accomplish such a feat. She earned AVCA All-America honors for the second-consecutive year, becoming the first Tiger to ever be listed as a first-team member. In addition, Jessica Vander Kooi and Nicole Wilson earned honorable mention All-America honors.



The Tigers had a stretch of seven-consecutive wins in the first half of the conference season which included a dominate 30-23, 30-23, 30-19, sweep of then-No. 5 Texas.

The trip to Palo Alto, Calif., for the first rounds of the NCAA Tournament proved treacherous with ice and snow delaying Mizzou's departure from St. Louis and the tournament by a day. The Tigers regrouped to sweep Santa Clara in the first round before facing NCAA runner-up Stanford in round two. The Tigers nearly pulled off a five-set thriller that included a massive set-four comeback.

Seniors Nicole Wilson and Jessica Vander Kooi were named to AVCA's honorable mention All-America list.

Missouri reached NCAA Tournament play for the eighth-straight time in 2007 and became one of only 16 teams to have reached the tournament each year since 2000.

The Tigers faced sixth-seeded and sixth-ranked Washington in the NCAA Tournament's first round in Seattle and came within four points of pulling the major upset, almost becoming the first unseeded team in tournament history to knock off a seeded team in the first round.

Mizzou juggled lineups and positions throughout the year because of an injury to sophomore outside hitter Julianna Klein, who was Mizzou's leading scorer at the time. The Tigers experimented with a 6-2 offense which had Lei Wang and transfer Luiza Jarocka share time in the setter role with Wang becoming an outside hitter when rotated to the front row.

After starting Big 12 play 0-4, Mizzou rebounded by winning its next five matches and nine of its next 13, losing to only one unranked team. For the balance of the season, MU pulled to a final conference record of 10-10 tyng for sixth with Texas A&M in the standings.

The Tigers forced then-No. 2 Nebraska to a five-set showdown in Lincoln on Oct 31, handing the Huskers their first set-loss in Big 12 play at home since 2005.



The 2010 Mizzou volleyball team made its second-deepest run into the NCAA Tournament ever, advancing all the way to the Regional Semifinal Round before being topped by nationally-seeded Duke at the Penn State Regional. Mizzou won 11 of its final 15 matches to secure its spot in the Sweet 16. Mizzou became one of just 22 teams nationally to qualify for the tournament in nine of the last 11 seasons.

The NCAA Tournament appearance was the Tigers' ninth in 11 seasons under the direction of Wayne and Susan Kreklow and the 22 wins by the Tigers were their most since 2005. Also, Paola Ampudia became the program's fifth All-American and three Tigers - Ampudia, Molly Kreklow and Caitlyn Vann - were named to AVCA All-Central Region teams. Ampudia was a first-team honoree while both Kreklow and Vann were honorable mention selections. Kreklow was also the AVCA Central Region Freshman of the Year.

Mizzou also took home a league-best 14 Big 12 Weekly honors in 2010, highlighted by six Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week awards for Vann and five Big 12 Newcomer of the Week awards for Kreklow.

The 2011 Mizzou volleyball team will be remembered as the youngest team in program history to qualify for that year's NCAA Tournament as nine of 11 players were underclassmen on a team that lost to No. 17 Florida in the first round.

Despite the youth, the Tigers finished with more than 20 wins for the secondconsecutive season, marking the first time that that has been accomplished since 2004 and 2005 at Mizzou. The NCAA Tournament berth was also the Tigers' secondconsecutive trip to the Big Dance and their 10th in 12 seasons under the direction of Wayne and Susan Kreklow.

Mizzou also notched plenty of milestone wins in 2011 as head coach Wayne Kreklow earned his 400th win as a head coach against Baylor on Nov. 5 while the coaching duo of Wayne and Susan Kreklow earned their 750th win against Kansas earlier in the season.

Something to Prove. That was the 2013 team's mantra and did the Tigers ever live up to that. With the goal of winning an SEC championship, that Tigers did all that and more, resetting school records for wins, conference wins, consecutive wins, sweeps and hitting while leading the nation in hitting, kills, assists and win percentage. That led to the program's first-ever conference championship and the school's first-ever SEC title in any sport.

Mizzou finished the regular season with a perfect 34-0 record, becoming the first-ever SEC team to run the table in the regular season. The Tigers also earned the No. 4 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament, hosting the first and second rounds at the Hearnes Center.

In all, Mizzou saw four players earn All-America honors - Molly Kreklow, Lisa Henning (first team) and Carly Kan, Whitney Little (honorable mention). Wayne Kreklow earned SEC Coach of the Year and AVCA Southeast Region Coach of the Year honors while Molly Kreklow was dubbed SEC Player of the Year. Carly Kan earned SEC Freshman of the Year honors and AVCA Southeast Region Freshman of the Year.

After a rare subpar season in 2014, head coach Wayne Kreklow rallied the troops in 2015 in style and returned the Tigers to the NCAA Tournament. Mizzou finished its 2015 campaign with an outstanding 27-6 record, marking the fifth-most wins in a single-season in program history.

The 27 wins also marked the 17th, 20-plus win campaign in Mizzou Volleyball's 42-year history. Additionally, it registered the ninth 25-plus win season in Tiger history and the fourth 25-plus win campaign under Wayne and Susan Kreklow.

The Tigers earned their 12th all-time NCAA Tournament bid in 2015. With their first-round victory over Missouri State (Dec. 3), the Tigers advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the seventh time in school history (all coming under the Kreklows).

Mizzou's final .818 winning percentage (27-6) was the third-highest single-season winning percentage in school history, trailing only the 2013 (.972) and 2005 (.833) Mizzou Volleyball squads.

Mizzou finished with an incredible 358.5 total blocks in 2015, marking the most total blocks in a single-season in program history. Additionally, the Tigers' 495 block assists were the most in a single-season in program history.

The Tigers' .259 season hitting percentage was the eighth-highest team hitting percentage in a single season in Tiger history. Carly Kan, Kira Larson and Alyssa Munlyn were each named to the 2015 All-SEC team for their outstanding seasons. Munlyn was also named to the 2015 SEC All-Freshman team and was tabbed the 2015 SEC Freshman of the Year.

Kan surpassed 1,000 career kills, digs and points this season, becoming just the fifth Tiger in program history to accomplish the feat. Kan's 491 kills in 2015 were the seventh-most in a single-season in Tiger history.

Munlyn tallied the most total blocks (149) in a single season and the most block assists (124) in a single season.

For the second time in four years (joining the Tigers' first-ever SEC crown in 2013), Mizzou Volleyball claimed top honors in the Southeastern Conference after a stellar 16-2 record in league play.

Mizzou carried its SEC title-winning momentum into its 13th trip to the NCAA Tournament under Wayne and Susan Kreklow (2000-present). The Tigers earned the No. 15 national seed in the big dance and hosted Northern Illinois and Purdue in their opening two rounds.

After a sweep over the Huskies in round one, Mizzou sought redemption against Purdue in the second round, as the Boilermakers ended the Tigers' magical 2013 campaign in the very same spot of NCAA Tournament play three years ago.

Mizzou came out firing against Purdue inside a loud Hearnes Center, dominating in its three-set triumph. The Tigers' victory secured the program's third all-time trip to the Sweet 16 and first visit since 2010.

Although Mizzou eventually fell to No. 2 national seed Minnesota in Sweet 16 play, the 2016 Tigers will go down as one of the top teams in program history. For the second-consecutive season, Mizzou finished with an exact 27-6 overall record, as the senior class of Alexa Ethridge, Carly Kan, Emily Thater and Julia Towler exited the program as the winningest class in program history (105 victories).

Individual accolades were aplenty this year, as three Tigers were named AVCA All-Americans (Melanie Crow, Alyssa Munlyn and Kan), four Tigers earned AVCA Southeast All-Region honors (Crow, Munlyn, Kan and Kira Larson) and three Tigers were represented on the All-SEC squad (Crow, Kan and Munlyn).

For the second time in his storied career in Mizzou black and gold, head coach Wayne Kreklow was tabbed the SEC Coach of the Year and AVCA Southeast Region Coach of the Year.

For the first time in program history, Mizzou Volleyball tallied back to back Sweet 16 appearances in the NCAA Tournament and a top 20 finish in the AVCA Coaches Poll rankings.

Following an up and down opening three weeks of the season, the Tigers closed out their nonconference tournament schedule with three consecutive wins at the Nevada Tournament. It was a sign of things to come leading into Southeastern Conference action, as Mizzou was victorious in five of its opening six matches in league play.

Overall, the Tigers finished with another impressive mark in SEC play, compiling a 13-5 record and finishing top 3 in the standings for the fourth time in the past five seasons.

With momentum on its side, Mizzou traveled to Wichita, Kansas, for First and Second Round action of the 2017 NCAA Tournament. The underdog Tigers left Charles Koch Arena with back to back upsets over No. 19 Kansas and No. 16 Wichita State en route to their fourth all-time bid to the NCAA Sweet 16. Mizzou's victory over the Shockers was even more special for Wayne Kreklow, as he tallied career victory No. 600 in his 18th year of collegiate coaching.

While the Tigers' season came to an end the following week at No. 1 Penn State, the team's memorable campaign will go down as one of the program's all-time greats. Coach Kreklow's 2017 Mizzou squad reset all-time single-season highs in total blocks (377.5) and block assists (547), while also placing top 10 in single-season blocks per set (second - 2.88), solo blocks (seventh - 104), points (T-9th - 2,243.5) and assists (10th - 1,602).

Individual accolades were led by junior MB Alyssa Munlyn, who became the program's third all-time recipient of three AVCA All-America honors. Munlyn and redshirt senior RS Kira Larson garnered AVCA Southeast All-Region honors, while the same duo and freshmen Kayla Caffey and Leketor Member-Meneh

were recognized with All-SEC awards following their standout
