Mizzou Baseball head coach Steve Bieser enters his third season at the helm of the program. In his first two years in Mid-Missouri (2017-18), Bieser's 70 wins were the most-ever by any Mizzou Baseball coach in his first two campaigns. Additionally, the 70 victories marked the winningest two-year stretch by the Tigers since 2008-09. Bieser has produced 26 victories in Southeastern Conference play since taking over the program, marking Mizzou's top two-year stretch in league play since joining its new conference in 2013.

In 2018, the Tigers competed against some of the nation's top talent and recorded 14 wins versus top 50 RPI teams, ranking seventh-most in the NCAA. Mizzou tallied a trio of impressive SEC series triumphs, highlighted by taking two of three at Taylor Stadium against eventual College World Series qualifier, Mississippi State (March 23-25). The Tigers also took two of three versus NCAA Tournament qualifiers Auburn (March 30 - April 1) and Vanderbilt (April 19-21).

In two seasons thus far at Mizzou, Bieser has helped guide 11 players to the MLB Draft with six Tigers taken in the 2018 draft and five Tigers selected in the 2017 draft. LHP Michael Plassmeyer was selected in the fourth round (No. 118 overall) in 2018, marking the third-highest drafted lefty hurler in program history.

Bieser's 2017 inaugural campaign inherited a Tiger squad that went 26-30 (9-20 SEC) a season before. Bieser and his staff engineered one of college baseball's top turnarounds, winning 35-plus games for his fourth consecutive season, guiding Mizzou to a 36-23 campaign, including 14 wins in SEC play. The Tigers put together the school's second-longest winning streak ever, claiming 20 consecutive games during February and March. Mizzou leaped into the national rankings in all seven of the major media services, peaking at No. 5 in the country at one point.

After winning 36 games in 2017, marking his fourth consecutive season reaching that total, Bieser was one of just 13 Division I coaches to accomplish that feat over that time span, dating back to his time at Southeast Missouri. The 36 wins for Mizzou were its most since winning 39 in 2008 and made Bieser the winningest first-year coach in program history.

Bieser was named Mizzou's 14th head coach and just the fourth since 1937 on June 30, 2016. Bieser came to Mizzou after an extremely successful career at Southeast Missouri, where he became the only coach ever to win three consecutive Ohio Valley Conference championships and guided the Redhawks to a 2016 NCAA Regional appearance, their first NCAA bid since 2002.

A two-time OVC Coach of the Year, Bieser won 35 or more games in each of his last three seasons at Southeast Missouri, a feat that had been accomplished just once before he took over the program in 2013. Bieser turned in a .587 winning percentage in his time with the Redhawks, marking the best total among any coach in program history.

Bieser turned in a banner year in 2016, as he earned his 100th career victory and opened OVC play with a perfect 12-0 record, the best start in program history. The season culminated in a regular season OVC championship, an OVC Tournament title and the school's first NCAA Regional since 2002, qualifying for the Starkville Regional at SEC champion Mississippi State.

Aside from success on the field, academic success was a hallmark of Bieser's program at Southeast Missouri. He mentored three Academic All-Americans, 10 Academic All-District picks, one OVC Scholar-Athlete, six OVC Medal of Honor recipients and 48 OVC Commissioner's Honor Roll selections. The Redhawks had at least a 3.0 cumulative grade-point average in all four years under Bieser, grabbing one OVC Team Academic Award along the way.

After a successful playing career at Southeast Missouri, Bieser was drafted in the 32nd round of the 1989 MLB Draft by the Philadelphia Phillies. He played 13 years as a professional with nine of those years coming at Triple-A or higher. He made his Major League debut on April 1, 1997, with the New York Mets and played 60 career MLB games between the Mets and the Pittsburgh Pirates, compiling a .250 career average and a .351 career on-base percentage. Bieser made his Major League debut as a catcher, but his versatility led him to play a variety of positions over his career. He closed out his professional career with the Memphis Redbirds (St. Louis Cardinals Triple-A affiliate), where he guided the team to a Triple-A World Series in 2000. He played every position on the field during his professional career.

Bieser, a native of Saint Genevieve, Missouri, went to Southeast Missouri after a very successful tenure as head coach at St. John Vianney High School in Kirkwood, Missouri. In seven seasons leading the Griffins, his team won two state championships in 2004 and 2006, as he compiled a career record of 137-51 (.729).

Bieser and his wife, Diahann, have a son Cole and three daughters, Whitley, Briley and Carley.

SEASON NOTABLES

- TIGER RUNNING GAME FLOURISHING EARLY ON IN 2019:** Head Coach Steve Bieser has team speed up and down the lineup this season and he's certainly not afraid of utilizing it. Through nine games played, Mizzou paces the Southeastern Conference with 24 stolen bases (2.67 per game). The Tigers have stolen multiples bases in six games, while producing four-plus stolen bases four times. Individually, junior OF/1B **Kameron Misner** leads the SEC with 7 swipes. Not far behind is sophomore C **Chad McDaniel**, who's 5 SB ranks T-3rd in the league. Senior OF **Connor Brumfield** (3), junior SS **Chris Cornelius** (2), sophomore OF **Clayton Peterson** (2), sophomore OF **Alex Peterson** (2) and junior INF **Austin James** (2) have also chipped in with multiple stolen bases apiece. Entering play this week (Feb. 26), the Tigers' 20 team SB ranked 9th in the NCAA and the team only added onto it with four more swipes Tuesday against Alabama A&M.
- MIZZOU DEFEATS ALABAMA A&M IN 2019 HOME OPENER:** Mizzou opened its 2019 home schedule in style Tuesday (Feb. 26) evening at Taylor Stadium, posting a comfortable 13-5 victory over Alabama A&M. The Tigers saw production up and down the lineup, as eight individuals tallied a hit and seven individuals posted an RBI. Mizzou certainly took advantage of a shaky Alabama A&M pitching staff, as it drew 12 walks at the plate. Four errors by the visiting Bulldogs also proved to be beneficial for the Tigers, highlighted by a three-run fourth inning, four-run fifth inning and six-run seventh inning. The Tigers improved to 4-0 all-time against Alabama A&M with their win. Mizzou's 13 runs marked a new season-high, surpassing the previous top mark of 12 set on Feb. 23 vs. Rhode Island. At the plate, senior OF **Connor Brumfield's** 4 RBI marked a new single-game career-high.
- TIGERS END FLORIDA ROAD TRIP ON HIGH NOTE, EARN SERIES WIN VS. RHODE ISLAND:** Mizzou wrapped up its season-high eight-game road trip Sunday (Feb. 24) at City of Palms Park with a convincing 7-0 shutout victory over Rhode Island. It marked the Tigers' first series win of the 2019 season, as they won back to back games Saturday-Sunday (Feb. 23-24) after dropping Friday (Feb. 22) evening's series opener. Mizzou's offense enjoyed a nice resurgence in its three games against Rhode Island, hitting .324 (33-for-102) with 25 runs scored, four doubles, one triple and four home runs. Three Tiger regular eclipsed .500 hitting for the series, as **Mark Vierling** (.545), **Chris Cornelius** (.500) and **Chad McDaniel** (.500) all hit the ball extremely well. **Luke Mann** hammered a pinch hit home run in the series opener and was rewarded with back to back starts Saturday-Sunday. Overall on the weekend, he hit .500 (2-for-4) with five runs scored, two home runs, three RBI and seven walks. The Tigers' starting pitching against Rhode Island was simply sensational, as **Jacob Cantleberry**, **Art Joven** and **TJ Sikkema** threw a combined 15.0 shutout innings with 25 strikeouts. Cantleberry posted 10 strikeouts for the second straight start Sunday. He becomes the first Tiger with consecutive double digit strikeouts in a start since Bryce Montes De Oca accomplished the same feat in early 2018.
- MISNER & BULLPEN SHINE IN TIGERS' FIRST WIN OF 2019 SEASON:** Following a tough 5-4 season-opening loss at North Florida (Feb. 15), Mizzou escaped the next day (Feb. 16) with a 5-4 triumph over the Ospreys. Junior 1B/OF **Kameron Misner** produced the second multi-home run game of his career, leading the Tiger offense. Following a shaky start by the Mizzou pitching staff, sophomore RHP **Konnor Ash**, senior RHP **Cameron Dulle** and junior LHP **TJ Sikkema** tallied six consecutive scoreless innings out of the bullpen to help secure the victory. In the win, Misner also matched his single-game career-high in hits (three). He now has three hits 10 times over his three-year Mizzou career. Ash was outstanding out of the bullpen, tossing scoreless fourth, fifth and sixth innings. His three frames of work matched his single-game career-high, as he earned the first win of his career.
- CANTLEBERRY FLOURISHES IN MIZZOU DEBUT AT NORTH FLORIDA:** Transfer junior LHP **Jacob Cantleberry** was the star of Mizzou and North Florida's series finale (Feb. 17), as he tossed 6.0 shutout innings with 10 strikeouts in his Tiger debut. It marked the most strikeouts by a Mizzou pitcher in his debut since Reggie McClain also tallied 10 punch outs versus Iona on Feb. 13, 2015. Cantleberry consistently had North Florida's offense off-balance, as he held its batters to three hits and multiple strikeouts in four innings.
- MISNER & SIKKEMA LEAD TALENTED RETURNERS:** Mizzou will be well represented on both sides of the ball this season, led by junior OF **Kameron Misner** in the field and junior LHP **TJ Sikkema** on the bump. Misner was tabbed a Preseason Second-Team All-American by both *Baseball America* and *Perfect Game* /Rawlings, announced on Jan. 28 and Jan. 8, respectively. Following the honor, Mizzou has now been represented in PerfectGame's Preseason All-American list in each of the past four seasons. Misner joined Sikkema (2017) and former RHP **Tanner Houck** (2015-16) as players to be honored in recent years by the respective media outlet. Despite missing the final 22 games of the 2018 campaign due to injury, Misner produced a breakout sophomore season at the plate. He paced the Tigers in average (.360), doubles (nine), triples (three), on-base percentage (.497), slugging percentage (.576) and stolen bases (13). Over his two-year career thus far as a Tiger, which included 2017 Freshman All-America honors, Misner is a career .311 hitter with 75 runs scored, 21 doubles, four triples, 11 home runs, 59 RBI, 30 stolen bases and .908 OPS. Sikkema, also a 2017 Freshman All-American, was Mizzou's primary Friday night starter in 2018. He tallied over a strikeout an inning (76 K in 70.0 IP) while finishing with a 3.34 ERA. Sikkema was dynamite down the stretch last year, allowing only three earned runs over his final three starts.
- MIZZOU HAULS IN ONE OF NATION'S BEST 2019 FRESHMEN CLASSES:** The Tigers' current freshmen class was routinely recognized this offseason by national baseball media outlets, including a No. 17 recognition by Collegiate Baseball News, No. 20 ranking by D1Baseball and top 35 ranking by Baseball America. Headlining the 10-man freshmen class of 2019 are INF/RHP **Seth Halvorsen** (North Plymouth, Minn.), INF/RHP **Luke Mann** (St. Louis, Mo.) and LHP **Trae Robertson** (Columbia, Mo.). Halvorsen, a 30th round pick by the Minnesota Twins in the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft, was named the Gatorade Minnesota Player of the Year. Rated as the No. 32 overall recruit in the country according to Prep Baseball Report, Halvorsen hit .405 with 10 doubles, 21 RBI and 29 stolen bases at the plate, while going 7-1 with an 0.94 ERA and 117 Ks on the bump. Mann, the 2018 Missouri Gatorade Player of the Year and USA Today Second-Team All-American, hit .513 with 12 home runs and 61 RBI while going 10-0 with a 1.09 ERA and 102 Ks in 70.1 IP in his senior campaign. Robertson, a 38th round pick by the Kansas City Royals in the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft, was tabbed a top 40 LHP prospect in the country according to Perfect Game. He went 6-2 with a 1.38 ERA and 77 Ks in 45.1 IP in his 2017 junior campaign before dealing with injuries in his 2018 senior season.
- TIGERS WELCOME SLEW OF TRANSFERS TO 2019 ROSTER:** The 2019 Mizzou Baseball roster will have plenty of new faces, including a whopping 11 transfers across the Junior College and Division I landscape. Perhaps the biggest eye-catcher is five transfers alone from San Jacinto JC in Pasadena, Texas. Junior C **Jake Matheny**, junior LHP **Jacob Cantleberry**, junior RHP **Lukas Veinbergs**, junior INF **Peter Zimmerman** and sophomore RHP **Trey Dillard** are all set for their first season in Tigers black & gold following successful stints with the Gators. In 2018, San Jacinto went 52-15 and reached the Junior College World Series for the fourth consecutive season. Dillard, a hard-throwing righty out of the bullpen, is perhaps the most highly touted newcomer from San Jacinto, as he was selected in the 16th Round of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft by the Los Angeles Dodgers. *Baseball America* tabbed him as the No. 2 Junior College prospect in the country this past offseason. Cantleberry, a 2017 NJCAA All-American in his first-year campaign at San Jacinto, was fantastic over a two-year stint in Pasadena, Texas. He compiled an 11-1 record with a 1.73 ERA in 2017, while ending his Gators career with a 12-3 record and 3.32 ERA in his 2018 sophomore campaign.

SEASON NOTABLES

- ▼ **HISTORICAL SUCCESS TO OPEN BIESER'S MIZZOU CAREER:** Over his opening two years as the new leader of Mizzou Baseball, head coach **Steve Bieser** has produced an overall record of 70-45 (.609). The 70 wins are the most-ever by any Mizzou Baseball coach in his first two campaigns. Additionally, the 70 victories marked the winningest two-year stretch by the Tigers since 2008-09. Bieser has produced 26 victories in Southeastern Conference play since taking over the program, marking Mizzou's top two-year stretch in league play since joining its new conference in 2013.
- ▼ **MORE COACHING ACCOLADES IN THE MIZZOU BIESER ERA:** In 2018, the Tigers competed against some of the nation's top talent and recorded 14 wins versus top 50 RPI teams, ranking seventh-most in the NCAA. Mizzou tallied a trio of impressive SEC series triumphs, highlighted by taking two of three at Taylor Stadium against eventual College World Series qualifier, Mississippi State (March 23-25). The Tigers also took two of three versus NCAA Tournament qualifiers Auburn (March 30 - April 1) and Vanderbilt (April 19-21). In Bieser's 2017 inaugural campaign, the team engineered one of the nation's top turnarounds with 36 total wins and 14 victories in SEC play. The Tigers strung together the school's second-longest winning streak ever, claiming 20 consecutive games during February and March. Mizzou leapt into the national ranking in all seven of the major media services, peaking at No. 5 in the land at one point.
- ▼ **SIX TIGERS SELECTED IN 2018 MLB FIRST-YEAR PLAYER DRAFT:** Mizzou was well represented in last summer's Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, as six individuals had their childhood dream come true. LHP **Michael Plassmeyer** (4th Round - Seattle Mariners), RHP **Bryce Montes de Oca** (9th Round - New York Mets), RHP **Andy Toelken** (19th Round - Arizona Diamondbacks), RHP **Giovanni Lopez** (23rd Round - Miami Marlins), INF/RHP **Brian Sharp** (26th Round - New York Mets) and OF **Trey Harris** (32nd Round - Atlanta Braves) were each selected across the two-day MLB Draft, giving head coach Steve Bieser 11 total draftees under his tutelage at the helm of Mizzou. Plassmeyer's fourth round selection (No. 118 overall) marked the third-highest drafted lefty hurler in program history.
