

DR. MUN Y. CHOI

PRESIDENT, UNIVERSITY OF MISSOURI
Third Year
Illinois, '87

Following a near year-long national search, the University of Missouri Board of Curators announced the appointment of Dr. Mun Y. Choi, 52, as the 24th president in the history of the University of Missouri System on November 2, 2016. The former provost and executive vice president of the University of Connecticut (UConn), Dr. Choi succeeded Interim President Michael Middleton on March 1, 2017.

Dr. Choi's 24-year career in higher education includes his previous position as provost and executive vice president at UConn, one of the nation's top 20 public universities in the latest U.S. News rankings. At UConn, he oversaw a budget of \$700 million while working with 1,500 full-time faculty, 31,000 students and 2,000 staff across 12 schools and colleges including Schools of Medicine, Dental Medicine and Law. Under his leadership, UConn developed several innovative new programs that have resulted in enrollment growth, increased faculty hiring, innovative research and new and expanded industry partnerships.

Born in South Korea, Dr. Choi came to the U.S. as a child. As a young man, he worked in his family's successful business in Chicago, and later graduated from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign with a bachelor's degree in general engineering in 1987. He later earned a master's degree and doctorate in mechanical and aerospace engineering from Princeton University.

Prior to serving as provost and executive vice president, Dr. Choi was dean of engineering at UConn from 2008 to 2012. Earlier, he was department head of mechanical engineering and mechanics at Drexel University (2000-2008) and assistant and associate professor at the University of Illinois at Chicago.

"Becoming president of the University of Missouri System is unquestionably the pinnacle of my professional career," said Dr. Choi. "As a product of and passionate champion for public higher education, I will advocate tirelessly on behalf of our exceptional institutions with state and national business, political and civic leaders to achieve excellence in all that we do, and make sure our great campuses realize their full potential."

DR. ALEXANDER N. CARTWRIGHT

CHANCELLOR, UNIVERSITY OF MISSOURI Third Year IOWA, '89

Chancellor Alexander N. Cartwright joined Missouri's flagship, land grant university in August 2017, and immediately noticed what makes MU so special: the people.

Since joining as the campus' CEO, he has worked with faculty, staff, students and the institution's more than 300,000 living alumni to let the world know the many impacts of MU. That commitment to collective impact is underscored by several major initiatives started during the past two years to benefit and honor the university's education, research and outreach missions.

Shortly after arriving on campus, Dr. Cartwright announced the Missouri Land Grant program, an institutional commitment to helping Pell Grant eligible students by covering their tuition and fees. The university has since launched new programs designed to improve retention and graduation rates, as well as post-graduation outcomes for students. Dr. Cartwright wants to see the workforce filled with talented people who are #MizzouMade and who share our values of respect, responsibility, discovery and excellence.

The Missouri Method plays an integral part of MU's success in 92% — and counting! — of graduates having successful outcomes within six months after graduation. Since joining MU, Dr. Cartwright has advocated for the campus' numerous hands-on learning efforts — from dairy farming, to textile and apparel management, to working in a laboratory. The hands-on learning emphasis of the Missouri Method has long been used by the School of Journalism and ensures Tigers are prepared for whatever's next.

As one of America's leading research universities, MU engages in preeminent scholarship for the greater good. Dr. Cartwright continues to highlight the positive societal impacts of the broad ranging scholarship at the university on the lives of Missourians and beyond. With that vision in mind, Dr. Cartwright announced a number of strategies to increase innovation, creative works and research, such as the Artist and Residence Program. He also announced a bold goal to double research expenditures by 2023 by growing scholarship across all disciplines. By the end of the Chancellor's second year in office, research awards increased by 20 percent.

These efforts have an effect on the communities MU serves, including a \$3.9 billion economic impact on Missouri alone. That impact is further magnified by the continued support of MU alumni and supporters who believe, like Dr. Cartwright, in the power of Missouri's flagship institution. In summer 2019, the institution announced a record fundraising year with more than \$200 million of philanthropic support for scholarships, academic programs and more.

Dr. Cartwright came to MU from the State University of New York (SUNY)

where he served as provost and executive vice chancellor from September 2014 to July 2017. At SUNY Dr. Cartwright oversaw a broad portfolio, including academic policy, enrollment management, and more.

Dr. Cartwright came to the role of SUNY's provost from the University at Buffalo, State University of New York (UB), where he served on faculty since 1995. At UB, he held several senior administrative positions, including vice president for research and economic development and acting executive director of the New York State Center of Excellence in Bioinformatics and Life Sciences. In these roles, he was responsible for campus/industry relations, research funding and compliance, and research support for UB and the Center.

An internationally recognized researcher and scholar in the area of optical sensors, he is a fellow of three professional societies: the American Association for the Advancement of Science, SPIE. the international society for optics and photonics, and the National Academy of Inventors. Dr. Cartwright is a prior winner of both the National Science Foundation CAREER Award and the Office of Naval Research Young Investigator Award. In addition, he earned the 2002 SUNY Chancellor's award for excellence in teaching.

A native of the Bahamas, Dr. Cartwright holds a Ph.D. in electrical and computer engineering from the University of Iowa. He and his wife Melinda have two children, Andrew and Alyssa.







JIM STERK

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS Fourth Year Western Washington, '80

Jim Sterk was named Mizzou's 20th Director of Athletics on Aug., 9, 2016, following highly successful tenures leading athletics programs at San Diego State, Washington State and Portland State.

"This is a wonderful day for Mizzou and Tiger fans everywhere," said then-University of Missouri Interim Chancellor Hank Foley, who selected Sterk following a nationwide search. "Jim's leadership in intercollegiate athletics is unparalleled, and we are thrilled he is going to bring his talents, energy and passion for working with student-athletes to Columbia. He is just what Mizzou needs at this time."

Sterk's Win It Right vision for Mizzou Athletics is built upon the core values of Respect, Integrity, Gratitude, Humility and Together, and his first three years in Columbia have produced unprecedented academic and athletic success under his leadership.

The classroom achievements of Mizzou's student-athletes continued in 2018-19, as they produced the top two semester grade-point averages in school history with an overall record 3.125 for the Fall 2018 semester and a record Spring term 3.11 mark. All-told, more than 60 percent of MU's nearly 550 student-athletes achieved a 3.00 mark in the classroom each semester. Some 357 student-athletes earned University Dean's List honors for at least one semester, 265 were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll, including 69 selected to the SEC First-Year Freshman Honor Roll, and 101 completed their Mizzou Made journey by earning their degrees.

Mizzou's NCAA academic metrics remain strong, as it produced a school-record tying Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 91 for the second-straight year to rank third in the SEC behind Vanderbilt (97) and South Carolina (94), as no other league school produced a mark higher than an 89. It marked the 12th-straight year Mizzou equaled or improved its GSR score as five teams produced SEC-leading marks of 100–Baseball, Women's Basketball, Women's Golf, Women's Tennis and Soccer.

After finishing a school-record 33rd in the Learfield IMG Directors' Cup standings in Sterk's first two years, Mizzou placed 51st in 2018-19, which was still a five-place improvement over its average finish of 56th in the award's first 25 years, and 15 of 20 programs were represented in the postseason either as teams or individuals. Mizzou Football, which played in back-to-back bowl games for the first time since the 2013 and 2014 seasons, was one of six Tiger programs to finish among the nation's Top 25 as it was 23rd in the final College Football Playoff rankings to join Wrestling (sixth-place NCAAs), Men's Swimming & Diving (11th-place, NCAAs), Women's Gymnastics (17th), Women's Swimming & Diving (23rd, NCAAs) and Volleyball (23rd). Mizzou Wrestling also swept the Mid-American Conference regular-season and tournament titles for the second-straight year.

Administratively, Sterk and his team continued to position Mizzou Athletics for future successes. Ground was broken in March 2018 on the largest campus construction project in school history, the \$98M South End Zone Facility, Mizzou Football's new den that will open ahead of the 2019 season. The Tiger Scholarship Fund (TSF) saw a \$17M increase over the previous year's productivity en route to its third-highest year ever in total cash and pledges of \$40.7M, which included a second-straight record-setting year in student-athlete scholarship support of \$11.4M. It marked the first time TSF produced top three marks in the same year for annual fund dollars raised (No. 1), cash donations (No. 3) and productivity (No. 3). A new 10-year multi-media rights agreement with Learfield was signed, and the department entered into a partnership with the City of Columbia to build a new championship cross country course that will open in August 2019. Mizzou Athletics also continued to build upon its successful partnership with MU Extension in outreach to the state's citizens.

Sterk's second year in Columbia saw Mizzou student-athletes post an overall then-record grade-point average of 3.04 for the 2017-18 academic year. In the 2017 Federal Graduation Rates survey, Mizzou ranked second in the SEC with its 72 percent mark, a performance which also matched the highest mark in program history (72 percent in 2014-15) and was three points higher than the University's average for all students during that same span.

Mizzou equaled its best finish ever in the 2017-18 Learfield Directors' Cup standings, as it totaled 660.75 points to finish 33rd nationally for the second-straight year. A record 17 of the Tigers' 20 programs were represented in postseason competition with a school-record 15 earning Directors' Cup points. Mizzou captured a pair of conference titles (Mizzou Wrestling won the MAC regular season and tournament crowns) while 11 teams ranked in the nation's Top 25 at some point in 2017-18.

The Tigers produced Top 25 2017-18 NCAA Championship finishes in Wrestling (sixth), Women's Indoor Track & Field (ninth), Women's Outdoor Track & Field (11th), Women's Swimming & Diving (15th), Volleyball (Sweet 16) and Men's Swimming & Diving (23rd). It also marked the first time since 1981-82 that Mizzou Football played in a bowl game and both Tiger Basketball teams reached the NCAA Tournament in the same academic year. Track & Field standout Karissa Schweizer (3,000m and 5,000m at the NCAA Indoor Championships; 5,000m at NCAA Outdoor Championships) captured three more NCAA individual titles as a senior to cap her fabulous collegiate career with six national championships.

Mizzou Athletics enjoyed academic, athletic and administrative success in Sterk's first year, too.

Academically, 269 Mizzou student-athletes received 2016-17 SEC Honor Roll recognition, 14 teams registered a 3.00 grade-point average for the Spring 2017 semester and four teams recorded perfect NCAA Academic Progress Rate marks of 1,000—Women's Golf, Women's Tennis, Soccer and Volleyball. Tiger student-athletes also spent over 4,800 hours volunteering with more than 50 organizations in Columbia and the surrounding communities.

Fueled by Top 16 NCAA Championship finishes in Wrestling (fifth), Women's Indoor Track & Field (eighth), Men's Swimming & Diving (ninth), Women's Swimming & Diving (13th), Women's Cross Country (16th) and Volleyball (Sweet 16), Mizzou ranked a program-best 33rd in the 2016-17 Learfield Directors' Cup standings with a school-record 662.75 points. The Tigers had not finished better than 36th prior to 2016-17.

Sixteen Mizzou teams were represented in 2016-17 NCAA postseason play, two teams won conference titles (Volleyball and Wrestling) and 10 squads ranked among the nation's Top 25 in their respective sports at season's end. In addition, two Tigers combined to win four NCAA individual titles as wrestler J'den Cox won his third national title at 197 lbs., and Schweizer became just the fourth runner in NCAA history to win the women's distance triple crown (cross country, indoor 5,000m and outdoor 5,000m national titles), and first since 2008.

The generosity, loyalty and passion of more than 7,000 donors allowed the Tiger Scholarship Fund (TSF) to raise a school-record \$50.4 million during the 2016-17 fiscal year, shattering the previous record by more than \$4.7 million. TSFs record-breaking total, which included new pledges and cash gifts, was aided by a school-record 11 gifts of \$1 million or more.

Sterk joined the Mizzou family from San Diego State, where he enjoyed a highly-successful six-year tenure that included arguably the most successful five-year run in Aztec history with 32 team conference championships from 2011-12 thru 2015-16, including a Mountain West Conference-leading 28 titles in that span, and the nation's fourth-highest combined winning percentage in football and men's basketball. In addition, SDSU was one of only four schools nationally to have appeared in six-consecutive NCAA Men's Basketball Tournaments and have its football team play in five-straight bowl games over that stretch.

"Jim elevated SDSU to a respectable level both athletically and academically," said Marshall Faulk, a member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame and former St. Louis Ram and SDSU Aztec. "His leadership was instrumental in the rise of SDSU success. How we cared for our student-athletes was his No. 1 concern. While I'm sad to see him go, I am equally happy for Jim and his family, and I told him he is going to love the people of Missouri. Mizzou, you hired a man with impeccable integrity."

SDSU set a school-record with 13 programs setting multi-year highs in the NCAA's 2016 Academic Progress Report with 313 student-athletes honored for their academic achievements. The athletic department also enjoyed a record fundraising year for scholarships and a new basketball facility.

Sterk was named the 2015-2016 Under Armour Athletic Director of the Year by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics, which highlights the efforts of athletic directors for their commitment and positive contributions to student-athletes, campuses and their surrounding communities. Hewas also appointed to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee as the Mountain West Conference's representative, however, he had to relinquish that prestigious position when he took over at Mizzou

"My passion is building upon the successes of good athletic programs and helping to make them great," Sterk said. "Whether it is guiding and mentoring student-athletes, working with coaches to ensure they have the resources they need or cheering with the fans, I realize that athletics is one of the most visible programs at a university, and I am excited to lead it on the national stage."

Sterk went to SDSU from Washington State, where he served as athletics director from 2000-10. Prior to his hiring at WSU, he was athletics director at Portland State from 1995 to 2000.

The NCAA recognized WSU and Sterk in 2006 as the Division IA Athletic Directors' "Program of Excellence." He oversaw a period of unparalleled success at WSU with historic academic and athletic accomplishments during his Pullman tenure.

In his last three years at WSU, 13 Cougar teams competed in NCAA Tournaments, including back-to-back trips by the Men's b=Basketball team (2007 and 2008), while Women's Rowing earned five NCAA championship bids, including a fourth-place finish in 2006, the highest finish ever by a WSU women's team in NCAA competition.

A 1980 graduate of Western Washington University, Sterk earned four letters for the Vikings in football and one in basketball. He was credited with a school-record 164 tackles during the 1977 season, garnering first-team NAIA District I all-star accolades. He was named team captain and MVP, helping the Vikings to the district championship game. In 2010, Sterk was inducted into Western Washington's Athletics Hall of Fame for his gridiron success.

He received his master's degree in sports administration from Ohio University. In addition to SDSU, Washington State and Portland State, he has served in athletic administrative positions at North Carolina, Maine, Seattle Pacific and Tulane.

Sterk and his wife Debi have three daughters: Ashley, Amy and Abby, and an infant granddaughter Kinsley Jane.

Mizzou Volleyball assistant coach Joshua Taylor was promoted to interim head coach for the 2019 season by Mizzou Director of Athletics Jim Sterk. Taylor takes over the reins of the Tiger program following the retirement announcement by Wayne and Susan Kreklow.

"Joshua Taylor enjoys tremendous respect among our student-athletes and staff, and is most-deserving of this opportunity to serve as Mizzou's Interim Head Volleyball Coach for the 2019 season," Sterk said. "He has played a critical role in Mizzou's academic, on-court and recruiting success and I look forward to watching his team compete this fall. I believe that Joshua and Molly (Taylor) are an excellent husband-wife coaching duo, and that they will build upon our program's proud tradition and successes."

"We're excited for the upcoming season and know this group is going to be great!" the Kreklows said. "We know that Joshua and his staff are going to do a great job with the program and we couldn't be more excited for everyone!"

Taylor enters his third overall season on the Mizzou Volleyball coaching staff in 2019. Prior to his newly appointed role as interim head coach, Taylor served as the Tigers' lead assistant coach and recruiting coordinator.

"I'm extremely humbled to be named the interim head coach for the 2019 season," Taylor said. "I want to thank Athletic Director Jim Sterk for having faith in my ability to lead this year's squad. I also want to thank Senior Deputy Athletics Director Sarah Reesman and Executive Associate Athletics Director Andy Humes for their support.

I want to thank Wayne and Susan for the amazing things they've done for this program and the example they've set for me over the years I've worked with them. I'm grateful for their guidance and support during this transition. This program and university means a great deal to me and I'm extremely grateful for this opportunity and I can't wait for the season ahead!"

The Honolulu native specializes in blocking and serve and receive instruction for the Tiger student-athletes. In his first-year coaching campaign, the 2017 Mizzou squad tallied 377.5 total blocks and 547 block assists, marking new program all-time single-season records. Additionally, the Tigers' 2.88 blocks per set (second) and 104 solo blocks (seventh) each cracked the program's all-time single-season top-10 record book.

This past season, Taylor played a pivotal role into middle blocker Alyssa Munlyn becoming the program's first-ever four-time AVCA All-American. She concluded her storied four-year career as the program's leader in hitting percentage, total blocks, block assists and blocks per set.

Prior to his coaching career at Mizzou, Taylor excelled in the collegiate and professional volleyball ranks as a player. In 2016, he competed with the U.S. National Team at the Pan AM Cup and Olympic Training Team. Before his outstanding collegiate playing career at Pepperdine University, Taylor competed with the U.S. Junior National Team and led the team to first place at the 2010 NORCECA Men's Junior Continental Championship.

Taylor starred collegiately at Pepperdine from 2012-15, earning two AVCA All-American honors and three All-MPSF accolades. During his 2014 junior campaign, Taylor became only the 18th player in program history to surpass 1,000 career kills. He concluded his four-year career in Malibu, California, with 1,433 career kills and 1,630 career points.

Taylor married current Mizzou Volleyball assistant coach, Molly, in Feb. 2017. The two reside in Columbia, Missouri.

Molly Taylor (Kreklow) enters her third season with the Mizzou Volleyball staff. She enters the 2019 campaign as an assistant coach, following a two-year stint as a volunteer assistant coach for the Tigers (2017-18). Taylor specializes in setting instruction for the Tiger student-athletes, while assisting with offensive game planning.

Taylor, a former U.S. National Team member and 2013 AVCA first team All-American, was named volunteer assistant coach for Mizzou Volleyball on Feb. 8, 2017, by then-head coach Wayne Kreklow.

In her first year as a Mizzou volunteer assistant coach, Taylor helped guide the 2017 Tigers to their second consecutive NCAA Sweet 16 appearance. Additionally, Mizzou concluded its campaign ranked Top 20 in the final AVCA Division I Coaches poll in back to back seasons for the first time in program history. The 2018 campaign in Mid-Missouri was another successful one, as the Tigers reached the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament for the fourth-straight year.

As one of the Tigers' leading offensive instructors, the 2017 squad finished 20th in the nation with 1,726 total kills. Leading the charge with the team's setters, Taylor helped guide Mizzou to 1,602 total assists, ranking 23rd in the NCAA.

Taylor excelled in both the collegiate and professional volleyball ranks from 2010-17. From 2014-16, the Delano, Minnesota, native competed with the U.S. National Team at the FIVB World Cup and Grand Prixs. She captured a pair of bronze medals at the 2014-15 World Cups and a championship at the 2015 FIVB World Grand Prix.

At the 2015 FIVB World Grand Prix, Taylor was sensational for Team USA, earning "Best Setter" honors. Led by her impressive performance, Team USA collectively recorded an outstanding .293 hitting percentage at the event. Later that year, Taylor received USA Volleyball's "Female Indoor Most Improved Player of the Year" award.

From 2014-16, Taylor gained further professional playing experience overseas. She performed at the highest level on the court with three organizations — Dresdner SC (Dresden, Germany), Eczacibasi Vitra (Istanbul, Turkey) and Liu Jo Nordmeccanica Modena (Modena, Italy) — highlighted by a 2015 Bundesliga Championship with Dresdner.

From 2010-13, Taylor solidified herself as one of the top players in Mizzou Volleyball history. During her 2013 senior campaign, Taylor led the Tigers to a perfect 34-0 regular season record and the program's first-ever SEC championship. She finished the memorable season with 1,480 assists, aiding the team's record setting .356 hitting percentage.

At the conclusion of the 2013 campaign, Taylor was awarded AVCA first team All-American and SEC Player of the Year honors. Over her four-year career in Mid-Missouri, Taylor accumulated 5,366 assists, ranking second all-time in program history.

Taylor received a Bachelor of Science in Nutritional Sciences in Dec. 2013 from the University of Missouri. She shined academically while in Columbia, receiving Missouri Dean's List recognition in each semester at the university.

In July 2019, Taylor was honored as one of the six newest members of the Mizzou Intercollegiate Athletics Hall of Fame.

Taylor married current Mizzou Volleyball interim head coach, Joshua Taylor, in Feb. 2017. The two reside in Columbia. Missouri.



CRAIG SHERMAN ASSISTANT COACH

First Season Independence, Mo. Ohio State, '82

Mizzou Volleyball added Craig Sherman to its coaching staff for the 2019 season, announced Aug. 1 by interim head coach Joshua Taylor. Sherman has 20 years of coaching experience across the Division I, NAIA and club levels, including an eight-year stint as the Mizzou head coach from 1986-93. He will join Molly Taylor as an assistant coach for the upcoming 2019 campaign.

"We're really looking forward to Craig being a part of our coaching staff this season," Taylor said. "He brings a wealth of knowledge as a former elite player and an experienced coach. He not only knows the game well, but also coaches it extremely well."

"I want to thank Joshua and Molly for bringing me on board," Sherman said. "I'm so excited to be a part of this new era of Mizzou Volleyball and can't wait for the new season to start!"

Recently, Sherman has served as the head coach for New Vision Volleyball Club in Columbia, Missouri. In 2017, New Vision placed fifth at the USAV 17U Girls' Junior National Championship. The year prior, Sherman led the squad to fifth-place honors at the 16U Girls' Junior Nationals.

In 2000, he was the head coach for Columbia College Men's Volleyball, leading the team to a NAIA championship. Sherman became Mizzou's third-ever head coach prior to the 1986 campaign. He accumulated 88 victories over an eight-year run at the helm, highlighted by a 22-win season in 1992.

Sherman opened his coaching career as an assistant with Ohio State Men's Volleyball in 1982. The following four years, he served as an assistant coach for Wichita State Women's Volleyball.

In August 2019, Sherman will be inducted into the Hearts of America (HOA) Volleyball Hall of Fame. Each year, the HOA honors outstanding players, coaches, officials and leaders who have made extraordinary contributions to its region of USA Volleyball. Sherman will become the group's 21st all-time Hall of Fame inductee, which originated in 2007.

Before transitioning into his coaching career, Sherman starred collegiately at Ohio State from 1981-82. He was named the 1981 Midwest Intercollegiate Volleyball Association (MIVA) MVP. Sherman earned back to back first team All-MIVA honors in his lone seasons in Columbus, Ohio.

The Buckeyes reached the Final Four in both campaigns as well, led by Sherman's outstanding performance on the court. Prior to his collegiate playing career, Sherman competed for the 1978 U.S. Sport Festival Team and 1980 U.S. World University Team.

Sherman, a native of Independence, Missouri, graduated with a Bachelor's in Political Science from Ohio State in 1982.

Sherman is married to his wife, Robin, and the two reside in Columbia, Missouri. They have three sons: Kyle, Eli and Wyatt.

Match days at Hearnes have an excitement that is unmatched. From the pre-match Kids Karnival, to Marching Mizzou and post-match autograph sessions, an electric atmosphere exists each match at the Hearnes Center.

In 17 of the past 19 seasons, Mizzou has finished in the Top 25 national attendance rankings. In fact, the Tigers have 13, Top 20 national attendance numbers and five, Top 10 totals since the 2000 campaign.

Since 2000, Mizzou ranks No. 2 in the country with 17, Top 25 average attendance rankings. Among Power Five conference programs, only five schools in the nation rate higher than the Tigers. Across that same time frame, Mizzou also places No. 2 nationally with 16, Top 25 total attendance rankings, trailing only six Power Five schools.

The program's most highly attended season came in 2013, as the team went 34-0 and claimed Mizzou's first-ever SEC championship. On Nov. 22, 2013 - the SEC clinching match - the Tigers took home the crown in front of a school-record 7,879 fans, the first of two 7,000+ crowds that magical season.









For nearly 30 years, the word "volleyball" in Columbia has been synonymous with one name: The Kreklows. When folks in Mid-Missouri thought of the sport, they thought of Kreklow. Even before they arrived at Mizzou, they developed cross-town Columbia College into an NAIA powerhouse, winning 85 straight matches and a pair of national titles before rolling the dice to come coach at Mizzou.

In Mid-Missouri, their name has resonated with fans of young and old, from the VolleyZOU to the Golden Tigers. They've lifted trophies. They've seen their children grow up in a community that embraced them as much as it embraced their parents and Mizzou Volleyball. They made such a profound impact on the lives of so many student-athletes, so many staff members, and last night they announced their retirement. Today, I am burdened with trying to encapsulate their impact on Mizzou, Columbia, countless student-athletes, and even myself, into a 2,500-word feature.

I've known the Kreklows personally for the last decade, but obviously known of them for much longer than that. My relationship with the Kreklows dates back to 2009 when I was returning to Mizzou from Michigan State for a graduate assistantship in the athletic communications office. My main job responsibility was to serve as Mizzou's Volleyball SID — an opportunity that I relished. Looking back a full decade later, I can't even begin to think of where my life would be if I hadn't taken that opportunity. Wayne and Susan invested so much in me, personally and professionally, since the day I stepped foot back on Mizzou's campus and in the Hearnes Center.

My knowledge of Mizzou Volleyball was a little deeper than most and certainly did not begin in 2009 when I was assigned to serve as the PR guy for the team. You see, as a Columbia native and Mizzou grad, I remember growing up and going to Mizzou Volleyball games. Back then, they were in the Big 12 and played every Wednesday and Saturday — a perfect schedule for anyone with kids looking to get out of the house and away from television or video game systems. Who knew, that while watching those Mizzou volleyball teams with my mom and dad in the early 2000s, I was getting an early glimpse of life lessons that I would see play out first-hand when I took over as the team's SID in 2009.

Watching those matches as a kid, I could see what made the Kreklows special enough to take a team that went 0-28 two seasons prior, and develop it into a national power. Their teams personified so much of what makes them so special, so unique. So, what were those traits that allowed them to lay the foundation for nearly two decades of success? What did they do to take one of the Big 12's basement dwellers and transform it into a national power? Well, here's how they did it (from my perspective at least):

YOU GET CREATIVE

If you need proof of that, look no farther than the likes of three-time All-American OH Carly Kan. A Hawaii native, many wondered how Kan made it all the way to Missouri, where the closest body of water resembling an ocean is the Redneck Riviera an hour-and-a-half south at Lake of the Ozarks. Trust me, it's nothing like an ocean. Anyway, the reason Kan ended up at Mizzou was because at 5-foot-9-inches, every team recruited her as a defensive specialist. She was far too small to play on the outside and at the net. But she wasn't too small for the Kreklows, who offered her as a hitter. Three All-America Awards and 491 kills later (seventh-most in program history), Kan still ranks as one of the program's best players ever — at the net. Not bad for a player who every Power 5 team thought should play libero.

YOU INVEST IN PEOPLE, NOT THINGS

I've been in college athletics long enough to know that resources are a big deal. Schools with more money tend to have more success. They can invest more bells and whistles in their student-athletes – the best technology, the finest facilities, the gawdy recruiting pitches – all the best that money can buy. But so many of those schools lose sight of the investment that really matters; the investment in the student-athletes themselves. No one did that better than Susan and Wayne. Everything they did was for their athletes. My first couple years traveling, the Kreklows would rent four minivans for the team during road trips because it was cheaper than taking a bus. The money they saved all went back into giving the athletes a better experience in areas that mattered. Whether it was abroad summer trips to China or a new team room, they always made the greatest investment, and that was in the lives of their student-athletes. They maximized everything they had and they got the most out of everyone and everything around them. That's something that any Missourian anywhere can be proud of and is something I know that the Kreklows are proud of.

YOU HUSTLE

As a kid, my mom and dad were season ticket holders for Mizzou Volleyball. I would tag along any opportunity that I got. We were especially hooked when the Kreklows took over. It was an affordable way for a family of four to spend a Wednesday night. And the matches were fun. I remember watching those games in the Hearnes Center as a kid and being impressed with the sprawling hustle displayed by the likes of defensive specialists Juliana Godoi and Rachel Taylor as they chased down every ball during the early 2000s. It wasn't until I started working with the Kreklows in 2009 that I realized the spirit that those two showed on the court was a direct correlation to the Kreklows' mentoring. It took me one practice to see where that hustle came from. The Kreklows approached coaching like that and it trickled down into how they ran the program. Susan's visionary approach to Olympic Sport marketing should be embraced by every athletic department in the country, all because she worked tirelessly to make sure that the Hearnes was full every time her players took the floor. And most of the time, it was. Almost everyone in Columbia has seen the volleyball 'yard signs' on gameday. In the beginning, who do you think put those up? It was the volleyball staff. That's hustle that any Mid-Missourian can be proud of.

YOU BECOME VERSATILE

Another memory I have as a kid watching the Kreklow-led Mizzou Volleyball teams was the versatility of OH Naaron Branson. She was a six-rotation player, a great passer, a great blocker, great defensively, and man could she swing. Her attacks were thunderous and had the opposition on alert every time she stepped into the gym. She could adapt to any type of set, any type of match, at any type of pace. Again, these were all traits passed down to her from Wayne and Susan. In college athletics, you could make the argument that it is exponentially harder to be consistently good year after year than to be occasionally great every couple years. Wayne and Susan were both. Year after year, roster after roster, they found a way to win matches and lift trophies and advance in the NCAA Tournament. If they had big physical kids at the net, they used them — much like the 2016 team that blocked its way to an SEC title. In 2013, with smaller, quicker kids, they ran the nation's fastest offense. The results were a 34-0 record, an SEC title and the nation's No. 4 overall seed in the tournament. It was the versatility of their athletes and their roster year after year that led to 15 NCAA Tournaments in 19 seasons — 10 of which made it out of the first round. In more than half of their years coaching at Mizzou, they were one of the last 32 teams playing volleyball every year. There are 330 Division I volleyball programs. That's consistently good and way more than occasionally great.





YOU SERVE

This one is very personal to me. When I took over as the team's SID in 2009 I was a young, brash, abrasive kid who thought he knew it all. Looking back over the last 10 years, so much of my growth, both personally and professionally, has been because of the Kreklows investing time in me. While many of our conversations were around a bon fire, or in Wayne's patented hour-long talks in my office on the third floor of Hearnes, I learned so much from them. But not just about college athletics — I learned about life. They taught me to take pride in my relationships with others, to value experiences over things, and to invest fully in the lives of those who matter to you. So many people think that wisdom just comes naturally with age, but for so many of us it is because we meet people who pass down their wisdom to us. For me, the Kreklows were those people. Thinking back on that now, as I write this, one thing becomes very clear: if they invested that much time in me, imagine how much they invested in their student-athletes! I, after all, was just their PR guy. I still see it to this day by how many of their former athletes stay in touch with them, come back to camps, or just reach out to say hello. I've witnessed firsthand so many selfless acts from the Kreklows, and they did none for headlines or attention. That's just who they are — true servants.

THE MEMORIES

I'll never forget 2005. Wayne and Susan spent their first five years building and transforming the program, and those around Columbia were beginning to wonder if they had some super-secret Volleyball serum after winning two national titles at Columbia College and then bringing that mojo to the Hearnes Center. The fans followed. The Boyz of Wolperz Hall followed. VolleyZOU followed. News stations were broadcasting live. Matches were on regional TV (which back then, was a huge deal). The Hearnes Center was full all the way to the C level for the first time since basketball moved next door to Mizzou Arena. Mizzou Volleyball was Columbia's hottest ticket.

It all came to a culmination on Oct. 5 that year. Ranked No. 7 nationally with a 12-0 record, volleyball blue blood Nebraska was scheduled to visit the Hearnes. The Huskers were also undefeated and ranked No. 1 nationally. While Mizzou lost a close four-set decision, it did so in front of a program-record 7,298 fans, many of which were standing nearly the entire match. The previous record was 2,632. The Kreklow's first match had just 227 fans in attendance. It was that night that everyone knew that Mizzou Volleyball, and the Kreklows, were here to stay. In fact, they made it all the way to the Elite Eight that year with a team that was stacked with players like Lindsey Hunter, Jess Vander Kooi, Tatum Ailes and Shen Danru.

Then came the 2010 season, my second with the team. My grandmother passed away that Halloween and to be with family, I missed our Nov. 6 trip to Ames to face No. 12 lowa State. The morning of the match, they reached out to me to see how I was doing. While they were fighting for their NCAA Tournament life at that point of the season, they took time to check in on me. That's the type of people they are. Later that night, I tuned into the match to listed to my friend Ross Taylor calling the match on an internet radio stream and two hours later, Paola Ampudia's 22 kills helped Mizzou to a four-set win in Ames. The Kreklow's team won seven of its final nine regular season matches to get into the tournament and then pulled off the NCAA Tournament's biggest upset ever, upending No. 5 overall seed Northern lowa on its home floor en route to the Sweet 16. That was a sweet ride that I'll never forget. And no matter how sweet that was, I always appreciated them reaching out after my grandma's funeral that morning before the lowa State match even more.

But of all the memories that are near and dear to me, none resonate quite like 2013. I've been to two SEC Football Championship Games, a Men's Final Four, Armageddon at Arrowhead and countless other events that so many would love to have been a part of. All of that pales in comparison to the run Mizzou Volleyball had in 2013. I had a chance to advance my career in 2012 and move on from working with the team, but I chose to stay with volleyball because I just knew something special was about to happen. What followed was a 34-0 regular season, the school's first ever SEC Championship in any sport, and countless memories. I'll never regret that decision. Mizzou was so dominant that year, it lost just seven sets. They were never taken to five sets. They broke school record after school record. I remember walking into No. 5 Florida's 0-Dome knowing that if the Tigers won that match, we were going to lift a trophy the following week. Winning at Florida wasn't easy, but that night, Mizzou made it look easy with another sweep. A week later we lifted that trophy. I'll never forget the round of applause that team got on Faurot Field during Football's 28-21 win over Texas A&M to clinch the SEC East that year. Mizzou pride had never been higher.

Over their final six years, Mizzou claimed two SEC titles, finished second once, third once and fourth last year. They made it to the NCAA Tournament second round four times with a pair of Sweet 16s sprinkled in. Over the last two decades, Volleyball has been right there with Wrestling as the school's top programs.

A HUMBLE GOODBYE

After spending six years in the trenches with the Kreklows as their SID, and then over the last four when our friendship never wavered, I always knew this day would come at some point. A point where Mizzou Volleyball would no longer be spearheaded by the husband-wife duo that captivated the town.

I'll share part of a conversation I had with them earlier this week.

Me on how we'd make this announcement: "I think we have a really good plan in place for you guys."

Wayne: "We don't need a big deal though. You know us!"

They may not have wanted a big deal, but it is a big deal. In this profession, you don't often get to ride off into the sunset the way you want to do it. But they get to do just that, and they are leaving the program in more than capable hands — with a roster comprised of maybe its best talent ever. They've approached this announcement with the same humility that they approached their life, but I wasn't going to let them go out with the humble whimper that they desired.

I'm so excited to see my friends flip to this specific chapter in their book. They poured their hearts and souls into Mizzou, and every volleyball player who walked into the Hearnes. Now it's their turn to enjoy what I know they love to do best — travel and be around their wonderful children, who have grown into people the entire Mid-Missouri community should be proud of. I know they'll have some trips to Mexico and some hikes to the waterfall in Yelapa. I know they'll have plenty of bike rides out the Big Tree and back — I'm sure I'll get dragged on a few as well. If they attack retirement the same way that they did coaching, I know their best years are ahead of them.

In closing, Mizzou is a better place because the Kreklows were here. Columbia is a better place because the Kreklows made it their home. I'm a better person because they are in my life. So let's take today to celebrate one of the finest coaching careers in the history of our great school.

To my friends: thanks for having me along for such a small part of the ride. Thanks for memories, the moments and the laughs. Through all the adversity, thanks for always being teachers and demanding the best from everyone around you. It's been SWWWWEEEEEEEEEETTTTT!!!!!



The 2000 season was the first year in the turnaround of the Missouri Volleyball program. The Tigers posted a 24-7 overall record and a 14-6 Big 12 Conference mark. MU traveled to Provo, Utah, for its first-ever NCAA Tournament.

After being picked to finish ninth in the conference, Mizzou managed a secondplace showing in the Big 12 and Susan Kreklow was named the league's Coach of the Year.

Lisa Morris was named to the All-Big 12 first team and two Tigers - Christi Myers and Heather Gerber - were honorable mention selections. Those awards were the first conference recognition for MU since the Big 8 became the Big 12.

MU recorded its first-ever wins over Colorado, Texas and Texas Tech in 2000 and had season sweeps over Baylor, Texas, Kansas, Iowa State and Oklahoma.

The Tigers' 10-0 start to the season was the best since 1983.

The 24 wins was the sixth-most wins in school history and included a 13-1 home-court record.

The Tigers again earned Big 12 honors as Christi Myers and Lisa Morris were All-Big 12 honorable mention selections and Katie Sowers was named the Big 12 Conference Defensive Specialist of the Year.

Morris, Sowers and Rachel Taylor were named to the Academic All-Big 12 first team and Naaron Branson earned second-team honors. Morris was also named to the Academic All-District team.

Also during the 2001 season, Head Coach Susan Kreklow recorded her 500th career victory as a head coach.

The 2002 season was a year of firsts for the Mizzou volleyball program as the Tigers recorded their first-ever NCAA Tournament win with a 3-1 victory over Northwestern.

Missouri finished the season with a 26-8 record, the fourth-most wins in school history and the third-straight year with at least 20 wins. MU finished third in the Big 12 Conference with a 14-6 record.

Christi Myers added another first for MU by becoming the first All-American in school history. Myers and Lindsey Hunter were also selected to the All-Central Region team, the first selections in program history.

Hunter broke the school record for assists in a season with 1,690 and averaged 14.08 assists per set, which led the Big 12 Conference and ranked second in the nation.

Myers, Hunter, Mary Lauren Smith and Shen Danru were named to the All-Big 12 Conference teams and Smith earned national recognition by being named AVCA/Sports Imports National Player of the Week on Sept. 30.

As a team, MU set school records for most kills (2,005) and most assists (1,889) in a season. Missouri also finished a program-best 16th in the nation in average attendance.

The Tigers made it four in a row by advancing to their fourth-consecutive NCAA Tournament in 2003. Mizzou was 19-11 on the year and finished sixth in the Big 12.

Mizzou began the season with a preseason ranking of No. 21, which was the best preseason ranking in school history. The Tigers opened the year by winning the Tiger Invitational and won their first eight home matches of the year.

On Oct. 15, MU ended a 44-match losing streak to Nebraska by taking a five-set victory over the Huskers in Lincoln.

Lindsey Hunter led the Big 12 Conference in assists per set for the second-straight season with a 12.29 average.

Hunter and Shen Danru were each named to the All-Big 12 first team and the Central Region honorable mention squad. Jessica Vander Kooi was selected as the Freshman of the Year for both the Big 12 Conference and the Central Region. Juliana Godoi was named the Big 12 Conference Defensive Specialist of the Year.

Danru was also named to the Academic All-District team and was joined by Hunter, Godoi, Lisa Boyd and Lindsey Noll on the Academic All-Big 12 team.

With the Tigers making their fifth-consecutive NCAA Tournament, Missouri in that time span went from the depths of the nation to a team that is part of the cream-of-the-crop. Missouri was tabbed as host of the first-and second-rounds of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. The team knocked-off first-round opponent Arkansas before falling to Louisville in Second-Round action.

The team opened the season by stunning No. 23 Wisconsin on its home floor. The Badgers found their way to the Elite Eight later in the season. The Tigers went on to defeat four top-25 teams during the season.

For the fourth time in five years, the Tigers won 20 matches overall, including a 14-6 Big 12 season-record (tying a school-record for conference wins) that placed them tied for third with Texas A&M.

Setter Lindsey Hunter led the Big 12 for the third-straight season in assists and was a second-team AVCA All-American. Lisa Boyd led the conference in hitting percentage with a school-record .384. In her first season as a Tiger, Tatum Ailes crushed the school-record in digs per set (4.19). Jessica Vander Kooi earned her first spot on the AVCA All-Central Region team.

A school-record seven Tigers earned Academic All-Big 12 honors.



The quest for the Tigers' sixth-straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament was the most productive and successful in the program's history to date. This Mizzou squad reached the NCAA Regional Final, or Round of Eight, after defeating Hawaii in the Regional Semifinal at Penn State. The Tigers reached the regional rounds for the first time in school history and posted the then-winningest record in school history with a 25-5 mark.

The team set a school-record with 16 Big 12 Conference wins, placing third in a tight race behind Nebraska and Texas.

Mizzou went 7-4 against teams in the Top 25, knocking off four squads in the Top 10 alone. With that type of play, people around the country and in Columbia started to notice more than before. Mizzou surged into the national Top 10 for the first time in school history, peaking at No. 7. Missouri also placed sixth in the national attendance average, landing nearly 2,600 fans per home match. On Oct 5, Mizzou hosted 7,298 fans in a match against No. 1 Nebraska.

Lindsey Hunter completed her senior campaign with more than 6,000 career assists, becoming only the 15th person in NCAA history to accomplish such a feat. She earned AVCA All-America honors for the second-consecutive year, becoming the first Tiger to ever be listed as a first-team member. In addition, Jessica Vander Kooi and Nicole Wilson earned honorable mention All-America honors.



Missouri reached NCAA Tournament play for the eighth-straight time in 2007 and became one of only 16 teams to have reached the tournament each year since 2000.

The Tigers faced sixth-seeded and sixth-ranked Washington in the NCAA Tournament's first round in Seattle and came within four points of pulling the major upset, almost becoming the first unseeded team in tournament history to knock off a seeded team in the first round.

Mizzou juggled lineups and positions throughout the year because of an injury to sophomore outside hitter Julianna Klein, who was Mizzou's leading scorer at the time. The Tigers experimented with a 6-2 offense which had Lei Wang and transfer Luiza Jarocka share time in the setter role with Wang becoming an outside hitter when rotated to the front row.

After starting Big 12 play 0-4, Mizzou rebounded by winning its next five matches and nine of its next 13, losing to only one unranked team. For the balance of the season, MU pulled to a final conference record of 10-10 tyng for sixth with Texas A&M in the standings.

The Tigers forced then-No. 2 Nebraska to a five-set showdown in Lincoln on Oct 31, handing the Huskers their first set-loss in Big 12 play at home since 2005.



After a two-year absence, the 2010 Mizzou volleyball team made its second-deepest run into the NCAA Tournament ever, advancing all the way to the Regional Semifinal before being topped by nationally-seeded Duke at the Penn State Regional. Mizzou won 11 of its final 15 matches to secure its spot in the Sweet 16. Mizzou became one of just 22 teams nationally to qualify for the tournament in nine of the last 11 seasons.

The NCAA Tournament appearance was the Tigers' ninth in 11 seasons under the direction of Wayne and Susan Kreklow and the 22 wins by the Tigers were their most since 2005. Also, Paola Ampudia became the program's fifth All-American and three Tigers - Ampudia, Molly Kreklow and Caitlyn Vann - were named to AVCA All-Central Region teams. Ampudia was a first-team honoree while both Kreklow and Vann were honorable mention selections. Kreklow was also the AVCA Central Region Freshman of the Year.

Mizzou also took home a league-best 14 Big 12 Weekly honors in 2010, highlighted by six Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week awards for Vann and five Big 12 Newcomer of the Week awards for Kreklow.

Mizzou also notched plenty of milestone wins in 2011 as Wayne Kreklow earned his 400th win as a head coach against Baylor on Nov. 5 while the coaching duo of Wayne and Susan Kreklow earned their 750th win against Kansas earlier in the season.

With the goal of winning an SEC championship, that Tigers did all that and more, resetting school records for wins, conference wins, consecutive wins, sweeps and hitting all while leading the nation in hitting, kills, assists and win percentage. That led to the program's first-ever conference championship and the school's first-ever SEC title in any sport.

Mizzou finished the regular season with a perfect 34-0 record, becoming the first-ever SEC team to run the table in the regular season. The Tigers also earned the No. 4 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament, hosting the first-and-second rounds at the Hearnes Center.

In all, Mizzou saw four players earn All-America honors - Molly Kreklow, Lisa Henning (first team) and Carly Kan, Whitney Little (honorable mention). Wayne Kreklow earned SEC Coach of the Year and AVCA Southeast Region Coach of the Year honors while Molly Kreklow was dubbed SEC Player of the Year. Carly Kan earned SEC Freshman of the Year honors and AVCA Southeast Region Freshman of the Year.

After a rare subpar season in 2014, head coach Wayne Kreklow rallied the troops in style and returned the Tigers to the NCAA Tournament. Mizzou finished its 2015 campaign with an outstanding 27-6 record, marking the fifth-most wins in a single-season in program history.

The Tigers earned their 12th all-time NCAA Tournament bid in 2015. With their first-round victory over Missouri State (Dec. 3), the Tigers advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the seventh time in school history (all coming under the Kreklows).

Mizzou's final .818 winning percentage (27-6) was the third-highest single-season winning percentage in school history, trailing only the 2013 (.972) and 2005 (.833) Mizzou Volleyball squads.

Mizzou finished with an incredible 358.5 total blocks in 2015, marking the most total blocks in a single-season in program history. Additionally, the Tigers' 495 block assists were the most in a single-season in program history.

The Tigers' .259 season hitting percentage was the eighth-highest team hitting percentage in a single season in Tiger history. Carly Kan, Kira Larson and Alyssa Munlyn were each named to the 2015 All-SEC team for their outstanding seasons. Munlyn was also named to the 2015 SEC All-Freshman team and was tabbed the 2015 SEC Freshman of the Year.

Kan surpassed 1,000 career kills, digs and points this season, becoming just the fifth Tiger in program history to accomplish the feat. Kan's 491 kills in 2015 were the seventh-most in a single-season in Tiger history.

Munlyn tallied the most total blocks (149) in a single season and the most block assists (124) in a single season.

For the second time in four years (joining the Tigers' first-ever SEC crown in 2013), Mizzou Volleyball claimed top honors in the Southeastern Conference with a stellar 16-2 record in league play.

The Tigers earned the No. 15 national seed in the big dance and hosted Northern Illinois and Purdue in their opening two rounds.

After a sweep over the Huskies in round one, Mizzou sought redemption against Purdue in the second round, as the Boilermakers ended the Tigers' magical 2013 campaign in the very same spot of NCAA Tournament play three years ago.

Mizzou came out firing against Purdue inside a loud Hearnes Center, dominating in its three-set triumph. The Tigers' victory secured the program's third all-time trip to the Sweet 16 and first visit since 2010.

Although Mizzou eventually fell to No. 2 national seed Minnesota in Sweet 16 play, the 2016 Tigers will go down as one of the top teams in program history. For the second-consecutive season, Mizzou finished with an exact 27-6 overall record, as the senior class of Alexa Ethridge, Carly Kan, Emily Thater and Julia Towler exited the program as the winningest class in program history (105 victories).

Individual accolades were aplenty this year, as three Tigers were named AVCA All-Americans (Melanie Crow, Alyssa Munlyn and Kan), four Tigers earned AVCA Southeast All-Region honors (Crow, Munlyn, Kan and Kira Larson) and three Tigers were represented on the All-SEC squad (Crow, Kan and Munlyn).

For the second time in his storied career in Mizzou black and gold, head coach Wayne Kreklow was tabbed the SEC Coach of the Year and AVCA Southeast Region Coach of the Year.

For the first time in program history, Mizzou Volleyball tallied back to back NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and a Top 20 finish in the AVCA Coaches Poll rankings.

Overall, the Tigers finished with another impressive mark in SEC play, compiling a 13-5 record and finishing among Top Three in the standings for the fourth time in the past five seasons.

With momentum on its side, Mizzou traveled to Wichita, Kansas, for first-and-second round action of the 2017 NCAA Tournament. The underdog Tigers left Charles Koch Arena with back to back upsets over No. 19 Kansas and No. 16 Wichita State en route to their fourth all-time bid to the NCAA Sweet 16. Mizzou's victory over the Shockers was even more special for Wayne Kreklow, as he tallied career victory No. 600 in his 18th year of collegiate coaching.

While the Tigers' season came to an end the following week at No. 1 Penn State, the team's memorable campaign will go down as one of the program's all-time greats. Coach Kreklow's 2017 Mizzou squad reset all-time single-season highs in total blocks (377.5) and block assists (547), while also placing top 10 in single-season blocks per set (second - 2.88), solo blocks (seventh - 104), points (T-9th - 2,243.5) and assists (10th - 1,602).

Individual accolades were led by junior MB Alyssa Munlyn, who became the program's third all-time recipient of three AVCA All-America honors. Munlyn and redshirt senior RS Kira Larson garnered AVCA Southeast All-Region honors, while the same duo and freshmen Kayla Caffey and Leketor Member-Meneh were recognized with All-SEC awards following their standout 2017 campaigns.

For the fourth-consecutive year, Mizzou Volleyball advanced to the NCAA Tournament following a trip to the second round in Lincoln, Nebraska. It was the Tigers' fourth-straight season with a visit to at least the second round and fifth occurrence in the past six years (2013, '15-18).

The 2018 campaign was the end of MB Alyssa Munlyn's historic career in Columbia, as she became Mizzou's first-ever four-time AVCA All-American. The Suwanee, Georgia, native left Mid-Missouri as the program's all-time leader in total blocks (634), block assists (516), blocks per set (1.27) and hitting percentage (.388).

OH Kylie Deberg made an instant impact for Mizzou after transferring from Illinois prior to the season. The Hudson, Iowa, native finished with 425 kills, 59 aces and 522.0 points, leading to AVCA All-America honors following the season.

In the offseason and weeks away from the start of 2019 official practice, Mizzou Volleyball legends Wayne Kreklow and Susan Kreklow announced their retirement following a historic 19-year career at the helm of the Tigers.

The duo turned Mizzou into a national powerhouse in women's volleyball, recording 413 wins and 15 trips to the NCAA Tournament over a nearly two-decade run. The Tigers' 2013 SEC championship was Mizzou Athletics' first-ever title after joining its new conference a season before. Three years later, Mizzou once again took top honors in the SEC, en route to its first of two consecutive trips to the Sweet 16.

The Kreklows tallied 12, 20-plus win campaigns over their 19-year run. In comparison, the program only had eight, 20-plus victory seasons in the 26 years prior to their tenure. Wayne and Susan oversaw 22 total AVCA All-Americans, 32 AVCA All-Region honorees and 51 All-Conference selections.
